Chairperson's foreword



Section 6 (1) (a) of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Abuse Act, 2012 provides that the Chairperson of the Board of the Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the National Assembly. Such person shall be a person with experience in public affairs either in judicial service, public service or the private or voluntary sector.

On Tuesday 18th October, 2016, pursuant to Standing Order 42, the Speaker of the National Assembly conveyed a message to the House from H.E. the President that Lt. Col Rtd Julius Ayub Githiri had been nominated for appointment to serve in the position of Chairperson of the Board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA). The Committee made several observations including that the nominee has significant experience in public service having served for two decades in the military and nineteen (19) years in the corporate security sector. He has no integrity concerns. He is tax compliant and has received clearance from Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti - Corruption Commission (EACC), Criminal Investigation Department and the Credit Reference Bureau. His experience in the private sector as the chairperson Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) sub - committee on security where he participated in the development of secure Kenya concept would be valuable in enhancing the participation of the business community in the campaign against alcohol and drug abuse.

Therefore the Committee recommends that the National Assembly approves the nomination of Lt. Col Rtd Julius Ayub Githiri for appointment to the position of Chairperson of the Board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA).





1.5 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

The Committee, having considered the nominee's curriculum vitae and heard oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations and findings: -

- 1. The nominee has significant experience in public service having served for two decades in the military and nineteen (19) years in the corporate security sector.
- The nominee has good working knowledge of the public service as exhibited by his service in the
 military and the private sector where he worked in close coordination, cooperation and
 collaboration with the government security agencies.
- 3. The nominee has the requisite leadership experience having facilitated major security conferences, forums and workshops including Crisis/Disaster management programs. In 2007/8, as a representative of the Oil Industry, he was part of the inter-ministerial security coordination team. He is also the founder and Executive Director of Institute of Professional Security Studies (IPSS).
- 4. The nominee exhibited excellent communication and interpersonal skills. He came across as an eloquent and articulate individual.
- 5. The nominee has no integrity concerns. He is tax compliant and has received clearance from Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Criminal Investigation Department and the Credit Reference Bureau.
- 6. The nominee's experience in the private sector as the chairperson Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) sub committee on security where he participated in the development of secure Kenya concept would be valuable in enhancing the participation of the business community in the campaign against alcohol and drug.



1.6 Recommendation

The Committee having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee, and pursuant to section 6(1) (a) of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse Act, 2016 and Section 8 (2) of the Schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, recommends that the National Assembly approves the nomination of Lt. Col (Rtd) Julius Ayub Githiri for appointment to the position of Chairperson of the Board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA).

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Legal provisions

Section 6 (1) (a) of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Abuse Act, 2012 provides that the Chairperson of the Board of the Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the National Assembly. Such person shall be a person with experience in public affairs either in judicial service, public service or the private or voluntary sector.

Qualification for appointment as Chairperson of the Board of the Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse

Section 6 (2) of the Act provides that a person shall not be appointed as the Chairperson of the Board unless such person-

- a) Is of impeccable character and high moral standing in relation to drugs and chemical substances of abuse; and
- b) has the capacity to inspire and achieve the objectives of the Authority.

2.2 Message from H.E. the President

On Tuesday 18th October, 2016, pursuant to Standing Order 42, the Speaker of the National Assembly conveyed a message to the House from H.E. the President that Lt. Col Rtd Julius Ayub Githiri had been nominated for appointment to serve in the position of Chairperson of the Board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA). The name of the nominee and his curriculum vitae was thereafter forwarded to the Committee to conduct approval hearings.

2.3 Clearance requirements

On Friday 21st October, 2016 the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) seeking information on the integrity of the nominee. Two (2) other letters were written to the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) and the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), requesting for information on whether the nominee was tax compliant and whether he owed any loan. Another letter was written to the Criminal Investigation Department on the conduct of the nominee. The nominee was also required to present his certificates/letters of clearance/compliance from the above organizations.



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2.4 Notification to the nominee

On Thursday 20th October, 2016, the Clerk of the National Assembly, pursuant to Section 6(3) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), notified the nominee of the time and place for holding the approval hearing.

2.5 Notification to the public

Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, provides that "any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".


On Thursday 20th October, 2016 the Committee, through the Clerk placed a notification in the print media informing the public of its intention to conduct an approval hearing, as provided for by Article 118 (1) (a) (b) and (2) of the Constitution and Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, which allow public participation in Committee proceedings. The notification gave provision for the submission of memoranda, on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee, by Thursday 27th October, 2016, at 5.00pm.

2.6 Submission of memoranda

At the close of business day on Thursday 27th October, 2016, the Office of the Clerk, National Assembly had not received any submission touching on the suitability or otherwise of Lt. Col Rtd Julius Ayub Githiri for appointment to serve in the position of Chairperson of the Board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA).

2.7 Clearance letters

The Committee received letters from the Kenya Revenue Authority, indicating that the nominee was tax compliant and the Higher Education Loans Board, stating that the nominee was not a beneficiary of any loan from the Board.



The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, in response to the Clerk's letter, wrote to the Committee, indicating that the nominee had no integrity issues. The Committee deliberated on the contents of the letter and noted that the nominee met the requirements.

The nominee also presented the following documents:-

- i. Kenya Revenue Authority Tax compliance Certificate;
- ii. Higher Education Loans Board Certificate of clearance;
- iii. Certificate of Good Conduct from the Criminal Investigations Department;
- iv. Certificate of clearance from a Credit Reference Bureau; and
- v. Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission Self Declaration Form.

3. 0 APPROVAL HEARING

On Friday 28th October, 2016, the Committee held an approval hearing with the nominee to the position of Chairperson of the Board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA). In conducting the hearing, the Committee was guided by, among other documents, the Constitution, the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse Act, 2012, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011 and the Standing Orders.

The Committee examined the suitability of the nominee using the guidelines provided for in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011. The Committee also considered the following:-

- a. Academic qualifications
- b. Employment record and work experience
- c. Professional association
- d. Public office, political activities and affiliations
- e. Potential conflict of interest
- f. Suitability to the position
- g. Tax compliance
- h. Integrity

Personal Background


The nominee informed the Members that he was born in 1957. He is married with three children.

Educational Background

He holds a Diploma in staff planning and execution from the Command and staff College Quetta, Pakistan. Having joined the military after secondary school where he attained division two in the Kenya Certificate of Education.

Professional Experience

- 1. He has thirty nine years cumulative work experience, twenty (20) years' experience in the military and nineteen (19) years in the corporate security sector.
- 2. He is currently serving as the Executive Director of the Institute of Professional Security Studies.



- 3. He served as the Hub Security Manager with Ericsson (k) Ltd between February, 2009 and April, 2009 and 2012.
- 4. He served as the Area Security Advisor at Chevron Kenya Ltd between October, 2004 and February, 2009.
- 5. He also served at Lynx Security as a Security Consultant between July, 1996 and October, 2004.
- 6. In the military he served as a Battalion Commander in the United Nations Peacekeeping Operations in the former Yugoslavia between May, 1994 and June, 1995. Between July, 1992 and April, 1994, he served in the Kenya Defence Forces as a Battalion Commander, Nanyuki Barracks. He also served as a Sub Unit Commander, Staff Officer based in the Department of Defence between 1977 and 1992.

Special training attended

- 1. Attended a one year training in staff planning and execution at the Command and staff College Ouetta, Pakistan between 1991 and 1992
- 2. He also attended Officers Advanced Course training in field operations, middle level management, leadership, decision making process, crisis coordination and management and contingency planning in the U.S.A.

Issues arising from the approval hearing

The nominee explained to the Committee how his experience and professional background would be useful in the role of Chairperson of the Board. He noted that he would utilize his understanding of the linkage between illicit drugs and crime to initiate a multi sector approach in the campaign against alcohol and illicit drugs. Having previously worked as a volunteer with the Authority where he provided security consultancy and conducted research.

Potential Conflict of interest

The nominee stated that he would have no conflict of interest between his private interests and his position as a public officer if his appointment was to be confirmed.

Integrity


The nominee stated that he had never been mentioned adversely in any report by a parliamentary committee or an independent commission. He also confirmed that he had no previous conviction or an ongoing case in court.

The nominee further confirmed that he had clearance from the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Criminal Investigation Department and the Credit Reference Bureau.

Personal Vision for the Authority

The nominee explained his understanding of the opportunities and challenges at the Board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) as follows:-

- a) Unregulated licensing of alcoholic outlets The nominee acknowledged the challenge of unregulated licensing of alcoholic outlets and stated that he would collaborate with the county governments to ensure that community interests, particularly on security are considered in the issuance of licenses to the outlets.
- b) Corruption To address corruption, the nominee promised to build strong structures, checks and balances in the Authority by ensuring that no single officer would initiate and complete any process single handedly. He informed the committee that he was familiar with fraud examination



and how to deal with cartels, having worked in the corporate sector with similar assignments, particularly during his tenure as the Area Security Advisor at Chevron Kenya Ltd between October 2004 and February 2009 where he was in charge of the company's anti - fraud unit.

- c) Participation of the business community in the campaign against alcohol and drug abuse The nominee stated that he would use his experience in the private sector as the chairperson Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) sub committee on security where he participated in the development of secure Kenya concept to enhance the participation of the business community in the campaign against alcohol and drug abuse. He also informed the Committee that he would employ a multi-agency approach in the campaign and enhance the coordination of all agencies involved in the exercise.
- d) Service Delivery- The nominee stated that he would revive the participation of community based structures to strengthen the multiplier effect in the campaign against alcohol and drug abuse and roll out a vibrant social media campaign targeting the youth noting that current antialcohol and drug campaigns have not been effective in reaching out to the youth.
- e) Leadership -The nominee promised to use his experience in the military to provide transformational leadership to the board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) and enhance synergy between the board and the secretariat.

Further alcohol and drugs were destroying and killing many citizens and NACADA appeared to be losing the ability to contain the problem.

The Committee also observed that the Authority was not visible in many parts of the Country and impact of its civic education and public awareness campaigns was minimal. Members further noted that there was need for the new Chairperson, once he settles in office, to brief the Committee on his strategic plan to deal with the problem of alcohol and illicit drugs.

The Committee also noted a recent trend where former military officers have be appointed to key positions in the Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government as well as various Commissions under its mandate. Members raised concern that the Ministry could be militarized if the trend continued.

The Committee also resolved to hold a workshop with NACADA and other stakeholders on the Authority's strategic plan to deal with the alcohol and drug menace in Kenya, once the new Chairperson settles in office.

Personal Background

He informed the Members that he was born in 1957. He is married with three children.

Educational Background

He holds a Diploma in staff planning and execution from the Command and Staff College Quetta, Pakistan. Having joined the military after secondary school where he attained division two in the Kenya Certificate of Education.

Professional experience

The nominee stated that he has 20 years work experience in the military and an additional 19 years in corporate security. He was currently serving as the Executive Director of the Institute of Professional Security Studies. He also served as a Battalion Commander in the United Nations peacekeeping mission in former Yugoslavia, where he acquired experience and exposure in conflict resolution, international relations, negotiation skills, interpersonal skills in a multicultural environment and coordination of humanitarian assistance. Other appointments held, while in the military related to field operations, military intelligence, training and security.

He also has hands-on experience in business security risk management, retail security, investigations, crisis management, counter terrorism, developing security process and procedures.

Potential Conflict of interest

The nominee stated that he would have no conflict of interest between his private interests and his position as a public officer if his appointment was to be confirmed.

Integrity

The nominee informed the Committee that he had never been mentioned adversely in any report by a parliamentary committee or an independent Commission. He also confirmed that she had no previous conviction or an ongoing case in court.

The nominee also confirmed that he had clearance from the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Criminal Investigation Department and the Credit Reference Bureau and produced certificates to verify the same.

Personal Vision for the Authority

The nominee explained his understanding of the opportunities and challenges at the Board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) as follows:

- a) Unregulated licensing of alcoholic outlets The nominee acknowledged the challenge of unregulated licensing of alcoholic outlets and stated that he would collaborate with the county governments to ensure that community interests, particularly on security are considered in the issuance of licenses to the outlets.
- b) Corruption To address corruption, the nominee promised to build strong structures with checks and balances in the Authority by ensuring that no single officer would initiate and complete any process single handedly. He informed the Committee that he is familiar with fraud examination and how to deal with its cartels, having worked in the corporate sector with similar assignments, particularly during his tenure as the Area Security Advisor at Chevron Kenya Ltd between October 2004 and February 2009 where he was in charge of the company's anti fraud unit.
- c) The participation of the business community in the campaign against alcohol and drug abuse The nominee stated that he would use his experience in the private sector as the chairperson Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) sub committee on security to enhance the participation of the business community in the campaign against alcohol and drug abuse. He also informed the Committee that he would employ a multi-agency approach in the campaign by enhancing the coordination of all agencies involved in the exercise.
- d) Service Delivery- The nominee stated that he would revive the participation of community based structures to strengthen the multiplier effect in the campaign against alcohol and drug abuse and roll out a vibrant social media campaign targeting the youth. He noted that current anti-alcohol and drug campaigns have not been effective in reaching out to the youth.

- e) Leadership: The nominee promised to use his experience in the military to provide transformational leadership to the board of the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) and enhance synergy between the board and the secretariat.
- f) Experience: He explained to the Committee how his experience and professional background would be useful in the role of Chairperson of the Board. He noted that he would utilize his understanding of the leakage between illicit drugs and crime to initiate a multi sector approach in the campaign against alcohol and illicit drugs. Having previously worked as a volunteer with the Authority where he provided security consultancy and conducted research.

- i. Section 6(1) of the NACADA Act provides that the Chairperson of the NACADA Board shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the National Assembly. The nominee should be a person with experience in public affairs either in judicial service, public service or voluntary sector. The Act does not stipulate the requirements of academic qualifications.
- ii. Section 6(5) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides that all Committee proceedings on public appointments shall be open and transparent. Section 6(6) however provides that the Committee may, on its own motion or on the application of a candidate or any other concerned person, determine that the whole or part of its sittings shall be held in camera.
- iii. Section 6(7) of the Actprovides that an approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background. The candidate should therefore present his original identification documents, academic certificates and any other relevant documents at the approval hearing.
- iv. Section 6(8)of the Act provides that the criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate. The schedule contains the information which a candidate must disclose to the Committee at the approval hearing.
- v. Section of the Act 6(9) provides that any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated.
- vi. Section 6(2) of the Act provides that a person shall not be appointed as the Chairperson of the Board unless such person:
 - a) is of impeccable character and high moral standing in relation to drugs and chemical substances of abuse; and
 - b) has the capacity to inspire and achieve the objectives of the Authority.

Section 7 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant House of Parliament in relation to any nomination shall be:-

- a) The procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
- b) Any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- c) The suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.
