Col (Rtd) Dido Ali Rasso, MBS, MP on behalf of residents of Dakabaricha Location, Saku Constituency and the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government. The meetings were aimed at responding to issues raised in the petition

The Committee is thankful to the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during its sittings. The Committee is also thankful to the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government, Hon. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to consider and respond to prayers sought by residents of Dakabaricha Location in a petition regarding the removal and revocation of the appointment of Mr. David Mulato Donche as the chief of Dakabaricha Location, Saku Constituency, Marsabit County. The Committee established that Mr. Omar Jillo Sage was ranked first in the interviews for the position of Chief Dakabaricha Location followed by Mr. David Mulato Donche, Ms. Amina Aila Ote and Mr. Yohana Hirbo Baqe in that order. However Mr. Omar Jillo Sage was not appointed to the position on account of a past track record of incitement to violence that led to the loss of both Government and private property in Marsabit. He was suspended and charged in a court of law for the offence of incitement to violence. He was acquitted by the court and later reinstated to his current position of Assistant Chief. The next qualified candidate was Mr. David Mulato Donche, who was appointed as Chief of the Location and has subsequently taken up the position.

Evidence submitted to the Committee by the Senior Assistant Registrar (Examinations) University of Nairobi indicates that a Bachelor of Science in Food and Nutrition and Dietetics degree certificate from University of Nairobi is not authentic. Therefore Mr. David Mulato Donche fraudulently secured the position of Chief, Dakabaricha location if allegations that he presented the same certificate to the recruitment panel are true.

The Committee recommends that the Directorate of Criminal Investigation should within three(3) months investigate the allegations that Mr. David Mulato Donche fraudulently secured the position of Chief, Dakabaricha location by presenting a forged degree certificate to the recruitment panel with a view to prosecuting the officer if found culpable.

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 On Thursday 30th September, 2015, a petition was tabled before the House pursuant to Article 119 (1) of the Constitution, 2010 and Standing Order No. 225 (2) (a) by the Hon. Col (Rtd) Dido Ali Rasso, MP on behalf of residents of Dakabaricha Location regarding the removal and revocation of the appointment of Mr. David Mulato Donche as the chief of Dakabaricha Location, Saku Constituency, Marsabit County;

1.2 The House, pursuant to Standing Order 227, referred the petition to the Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security for preparation of the Report;

1.3 The Committee received the petition on Thursday 30th September, 2015 and set out a procedure for its consideration and to report to the House as set out in Standing Order No 227(2).

1.1 Mandate of the Committee

1.5 Recommendations

In response to the prayers by the petitioners, the Committee recommends that:-

1. The Directorate of Criminal Investigation should within three(3) months of tabling this report investigate the allegations that Mr. David Mulato Donche fraudulently secured the position of Chief, Dakabaricha location by presenting a forged degree certificate to the recruitment panel with a view to prosecuting the officer if found culpable;
2. The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission should pursue the matter of presentation of false documents as a criminal offence with the view of prosecuting the concerned; and
3. If found culpable, the appointment of Mr. David Mulato Donche as Chief of Dakabaricha Location be revoked for violating Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The petition by residents of Dakabaricha Location regarding the removal and revocation of the appointment of Mr. David Mulato Donche as the chief of Dakabaricha Location, Saku Constituency, Marsabit County was tabled in the House pursuant to Standing Order 225 (2) (a) by the Hon. Col (Rtd) Dido Ali Rasso, MBS, MP on Thursday 30th September, 2015.
- 2.2 Pursuant to the House rules, the petition was referred to the Committee on Thursday 30th September, 2015 for consideration and preparation of a report. The Committee considered the petition pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 227.
- 3.3 The petitioners wished to draw the attention of the House to the following, that:-
- i. Administrative units in particular the office of a Chief, are very important in the grassroots as they facilitate various services required by residents, such as the issuance of National Identity Cards;
 - ii. Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs appointed to represent a Location or Sub – Location ought to be residents of that particular area;
 - iii. In July 2015, a Mr. David Mulato Donche was recruited as the new Chief of Dakabaricha Location;
 - iv. The appointment appeared to have been mismanaged and the person appointed was not the best candidate, given the lack of experience and qualification;
 - v. The appointment was highly irregular as the right criteria for appointment was not followed;
 - vi. The majority of the populace of Dakabaricha have serious reservations regarding the appointment which might result in ethnic conflict in the area;
 - vii. There have been silent demonstration by residents of Dakabaricha showing their displeasure on the appointment; and
 - viii. The issues in respect of the petition is made were not pending before any court of law, constitutional or legal body.

3.4 The Petitioners prayed that the National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security intervenes to cause expeditious resolution of the matter and ensure that the appointment of Mr. David Mulato Donche as the Chief of Dakabaricha Location is revoked and a qualified Chief is recruited.

3.0 EVIDENCE

3.1 Evidence from Hon. Col (Rtd) Dido Ali Rasso, MP on behalf of the petitioners

The Committee held a meeting with Hon. Col (Rtd) Dido Ali Rasso, MP on Thursday 12th November 2015. During the meeting the Committee was informed that a new chief had been appointed in Dakabaricha location and the area residents were not happy with the choice of the appointee. He explained that the appointee allegedly finished in third position during the interview process but could not substantiate this position due to confidentiality in the recruitment process. He however stated that the Committee could access the documents from the interview process if necessary.

The Member explained that he had discussed the matter with the Cabinet Secretary and Principal Secretary for Interior without success. He also stated that the existing government policy is that a serving Assistant Chief is usually given preference when appointing a new chief within a given Location. He also expressed his opinion that as the area Member of Parliament he should have should have a say when a Chief is being appointed.

The Member alleged that bribery had occurred for the current appointee to get the job. He noted that the appointee was a political campaigner of one of the candidates for Member of Parliament position in the 2013 election in Saku Constituency. He stated that the appointment would create a conflict of interest and lead to poor working relations with the area Member of Parliament and residents.

The Committee held a second meeting with the Hon. Col (Rtd) Dido Ali Rasso, MP on Tuesday 29th March, 2016. During the meeting he alleged that Mr. David Mulato Donche presented forged degree certificate from University of Nairobi for the award of Bachelor of Science in Food and Nutrition and Dietetics. The Member tabled copies of the said degree certificate and a letter that he had written to the university seeking the authentication of the certificate. He added that Mr. David Mulato Donche also lacked experience in the field of public administration. The Committee resolved to write to the University of Nairobi to confirm the authenticity of the degree awarded to Mr. David Mulato Donche.

3.2 Evidence from the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government

The Committee held a meeting with the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government on Thursday 12th November, 2015. During the meeting the Committee was informed that:-

- i. The Deputy County Commissioner (DCC) Marsabit Central Sub County chaired a panel that conducted interviews for the position of the Chief Dakabaricha Location on 26th January, 2015.
- ii. The best four candidates, Mr. Omar Jillo Sage, Mr. David Mulato Donche, Ms. Amina Aila Ote and Mr. Yohana Hirbo Baqe in that order, are all residents of the location and members of the predominantly Burji ethnic community.
- iii. Before the appointments could be finalized, the Hon. Dido Ali Rasso, MP allegedly objected to the appointment of Mr. Omar Jillo Sage on account of a past track record of incitement to violence that led to the loss of both government and private property in Marsabit.
- iv. The person that the MP proposed Mr. Halkano Dambi, was not shortlisted for appointment. Mr. Omar Jillo Sage has worked as an assistant chief in Dakabaricha Sub County from 1997 to the present day. However, at one time during his employment he was suspended and charged in a court of law for the offence of incitement to violence. He was acquitted by the court and later reinstated to his current position of Assistant Chief.
- v. In view of the past record of Mr. Sage and Mr. Dambi had not been shortlisted, the next qualified candidate was Mr. David Mulato Donche, who was appointed as Chief of the Location and has subsequently taken up the position.
- vi. The recruitment and selection process was well managed and urged Committee to recommend that the Ministry upholds the appointment of Mr. David Mulato Donche to the position of Chief, Dakabaricha location.

3.3 Evidence from Mr. David Mulato Donche

The Committee received written Submissions from Mr. David Mulato Donche on Thursday 12th November, 2015. The Submission contained the following documents:-

- i. A Curriculum Vitae indicating that he was born in 1974 in Marsabit and held a Bachelor of Science in Food and Nutrition and Dietetics degree certificate

from University of Nairobi and a Diploma in Bible and Theology from Ephatha of Africa, School of Bible;

- ii. A sworn affidavit indicating that he was born in Dakabaricha Location and that his parents are residents of the same Location. The affidavit also affirmed that he applied for the position of Chief grade II in Dakabaricha Location and was shorty listed and invited for interviews;
- iii. Records of Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs who had served in Dakabaricha Location;
- iv. A recommendation from clan elders confirming that Mr. David Mulato Donche was a resident of Dakabaricha Location; and
- v. A certificate of good conduct for Mr. David Mulato Donche.

3.4 Evidence from the Registrar (Examinations) University of Nairobi

The Senior Assistant Registrar (Examinations) University of Nairobi in a letter dated August 12th, 2016 indicated that a Bachelor of Science in Food and Nutrition and Dietetics degree certificate from University of Nairobi allegedly presented by Mr. David Mulato Donche to secure the position of Chief, Dakabaricha location is not authentic. The name of Mr. David Mulato Donche does not appear in any of the university's graduation booklets.

4.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

The Committee made the following observations from evidence adduced in the meetings, that:-


1. Article 73(2) (a) of the Constitution stipulates that recruitment and selection to public office should be based on personal integrity, competence and suitability.
2. Evidence submitted to the Committee by the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government indicated that Mr. Omar Jillo Sage was ranked first in the interviews for the position of Chief Dakabaricha Location followed by Mr. David Mulato Donche, Ms. Amina Aila Ote and Mr. Yohana Hirbo Baqe in that order. However Mr. Omar Jillo Sage was not appointed to the position on account of a past track record of incitement to violence that led to the loss of both government and private property in Marsabit. He was suspended and charged in a court of law for the offence of incitement to violence. He was acquitted by the court and later reinstated to his current position of Assistant Chief. The next qualified candidate, Mr. David Mulato Donche, who was appointed as Chief of the Location and has subsequently taken up his position.
3. Documents submitted to the Committee by Mr. David Mulato Donche contained a Curriculum Vitae indicating that he was born in 1974 in Marsabit and held a Bachelor of Science in Food and Nutrition and Dietetics degree certificate from University of Nairobi and Diploma in Bible and Theology from Ephatha of Africa, School of Bible. He also submitted copies of the said certificates.
4. Evidence submitted to the Committee by the Senior Assistant Registrar (Examinations) University of Nairobi indicates that copy of a Bachelor of Science in Food and Nutrition and Dietetics degree certificate from University of Nairobi submitted to the Committee by both the petitioners and Mr. David Mulato Donche and subsequently forwarded to the university for authentication is not genuine. The name of Mr. David Mulato Donche does not appear in any of the university's graduation booklets. Therefore Mr. David Mulato Donche fraudulently secured the position of position of Chief, Dakabaricha location if

allegations that he presented the same certificate to the recruitment panel are true.

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

In response to the prayers by the petitioners, the Committee recommends that:-

1. The Directorate of Criminal Investigation should within three(3) months of tabling this report investigate the allegations that Mr. David MulatoDonche fraudulently secured the position of Chief, Dakabaricha location by presenting a forged degree certificate to the recruitment panel with a view to prosecuting the officer if found culpable;
2. The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission should pursue the matter of presentation of false documents as a criminal offence with the view of prosecuting the concerned; and
3. If found culpable, the appointment of Mr. David MulatoDoncheas Chief of Dakabaricha Location be revoked for violating Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010

He also submitted copies of the said certificates.

- iii. Evidence submitted to the Committee by the Senior Assistant Registrar (Examinations) University of Nairobi indicates that copy of a Bachelor of Science in Food and Nutrition and Dietetics degree certificate from University of Nairobi submitted to the Committee by both the petitioners and Mr. David Mulato Donche and subsequently forwarded to the university for authentication is not genuine. The name of Mr. David Mulato Donche does not appear in any of the university's graduation booklets. Therefore Mr. David Mulato Donche fraudulently secured the position of position of Chief, Dakabaricha location if allegations that he presented the same certificate to the recruitment panel are true.

In response to the prayers by the petitioners, the Committee recommended that:-

- i. The Directorate of Criminal Investigation should within two (2) months investigate allegations that Mr. David Mulato Donche fraudulently secured the position of Chief, Dakabaricha location by presenting a forged degree certificate to the recruitment panel with a view to prosecuting the officer if found culpable.
- ii. The Ethics and Anti - Corruption Commission should investigate and if found culpable prosecute Mr. David Mulato Donche for violating the Constitutional provisions on integrity of public officers.
- iii. The position of the Chief Dakabaricha location should be declared vacant if Mr. David Mulato Donche is found culpable

MIN.NO.305 ANS/2016: CONSIDERATION OF THE COUNTY GOVERNMENTS (AMENDMENT) LEGISLATIVE PROPOSAL, 2015

The Committee was briefed that the proposed County Governments (Amendment) 2015 seeks to amend Section 138 of No. 17 of 2012

- a) in subsection (1)-
 - i. By inserting, at the beginning, the words" for the purposes of transition," and
 - ii. By deleting the words" on secondment";
- b) In subsection (3) by deleting the words "redeployment, transfers and secondment" and substituting therefore" redeployment and transfers"; and
- c) By deleting subsection (5)

Submissions by the Attorney General's office and the Kenya Law Reforms Commission
The Attorney General's office and the Kenya Law Reforms Commission recommended as follows:

- i) Section 138 of the County Government Act which the proposed legislation seeks to amend is a transitional provision. An addition of the words "*for purposes of transition*" under clause 2 (a) (i) is therefore redundant.

-
- ii) Deletion of the words “*on secondment*” under clause 138 (ii) of the proposed legislation would affect the terms and conditions of employment of the seconded staff.
-

Submissions by the Ministry of Public Service, Youth and Gender Affairs

The Ministry of Public Service, Youth and Gender Affairs stated that the proposed amendment to the County Government Act, 2012 is not likely to address the issue of haphazard re - deployment, release or appointment of seconded staff by the County Public Service Boards.

To address the issue, there is need for the development of standards, norms and regulations that are binding to both the national and county governments to guide the process.

The word “deemed seconded” was purposely used to provide for continuity of service delivery as the transfer of functions were being concluded. It was also meant to protect benefits, pension rights, gratuities and other terminal benefits of the public servants from the national government who are performing devolved functions.

The issue of secondment, redeployment and transfers is also provided for in sections 73 and 132 of the County Government Act, 2012. Therefore a comprehensive analysis of the Act would be required before the any proposal to amend section 138 is made. Any amendment to the Act when undertaken should strive to address all emerging issues on the management of human resources in the public service.

Committee observations

The Committee observed that–

- a) The effect of the legislative proposal was to do away with the secondment of officers from the national government to the county governments;
 - b) There was currently an ongoing exercise being undertaken by the Public Service Commission titled ‘Capacity Assessment Rationalization of Public Service’ (CARPS) which seeks to rationalize staff secondment from national to county governments. The exercise would address the problems that arose out of the secondment of staff;
-
- c) The provisions on secondment of staff by the Public Service Commission were already contained in the Public Service Commission Bill, 2016 which had already undergone First Reading. The Member could therefore propose amendments to the said Bill at the appropriate time;

Committee recommendation

The Committee therefore recommended that the proposed Bill should not proceed for publication.

MIN.NO.306 ANS/2016: ANY OTHER BUSINESS

The Committee deliberated and resolved that the Cabinet Secretary, Interior and Coordination of National Government issue a statement on the chain of command in government in terms of the Presidency of the Republic of Kenya. This is in light of the recent incidences of persons claiming to be acting president with no basis in the constitution.

University of Nairobi for the award of Bachelor of Science in Food and Nutrition and Dietetics. He added that Mr. Mulato lacked experience in the field of public administration.



The Chairperson called the meeting to order at 10.20 am. A prayer was said.

MIN.NO.208 /ANS/2015 - CONSIDERATION OF PETITION BY RESIDENTS OF KASIKEU WARD

The petitioners informed the Committee that they came up with the petition to highlight the plight of village managers (elders) who work voluntarily with chiefs in the village. They stated that tough economic conditions and the demanding nature of the job strenuous and they would like to be considered for compensation by the government.

The village managers explained how sometimes they had to work at night and in difficult terrain. They also stated that they had difficulty moving from one place to another due to transport costs which they could not meet. They also noted how they had difficulty communicating due to lack of airtime.

The petitioners noted that most village managers were elderly people who had the ability to settle disputes. Some of the petitioners stated that they had worked as village managers for over fifteen years.

The petitioners requested for a minimum of Kshs. 5000 per month as compensation for village managers. They stated that they had been asked to provide their bank details a few years back and nothing had come out of that. They confirmed that they would like this to be implemented in all villages in Kenya.

The Committee commended the petitioners for the good job they have been doing on behalf of their country. The Members noted that there was a need to establish the total number of village managers in the country if any compensation was to be paid to them by the government.

The Members explained that paying village managers all across the country would be a huge expense on the government. They noted that village managers work with representatives of the national government at the lowest level and appreciated their importance. The Committee stated that it would look into the prayers of the petitioners and respond accordingly

The Committee raised objections to the conduct of The Hon. Regina Nthambi Muia, MP during the hearing of submissions by the petitioners. They noted that her conduct was unbecoming and stated that she should have been ejected from the sitting.

RESIDENTS OF DAKABARICHA LOCATION

The Hon. Dido Rasso, MP appeared on behalf of the petitioners from Dakabaricha location, having submitted the petition.

The Hon. Member informed the Committee that a new chief had been appointed in Dakabaricha location and the area residents were not happy with the choice of the appointee. He explained that the appointee allegedly finished in third position during the interview process but could not substantiate this position due to confidentiality in the recruitment process. He however stated that the Committee could access the documents from the interview process if it so wished.

The Member explained that he had picked up the matter with the Cabinet Secretary and Principal Secretary for Interior without success.

The Hon. Member stated that the existing policy is that the sitting Assistant Chief has to be given preference when appointing a new chief. He also expressed his opinion that the area Member of Parliament should have a say when a Chief was being appointed.

The Hon. Member alleged that bribery had occurred for the current appointee to get the job. He noted that the appointee was a political campaigner of one of the candidates for Member of Parliament position in the 2013 election. He stated that this would create a conflict of interest and lead to poor working relations with the area MP.

The Committee noted that there were lots of similarities between this petition and a petition presented to the Committee by The Hon. Joseph Nkaisery when he was the Member for Kajiado North in 2013. The Committee concurred with the Hon. Dido Rasso, MP that the policy for promotion should give preference to the sitting Assistant Chief.

The Committee resolved to invite the Cabinet Secretary for Interior on 24th November, 2015 to respond to the matters raised in the petition.

It has come to my attention that the appointed individual is politically aligned and had been fronted by a group of people who in 2013 divided the Marsabit communities along REGABU (Rendille, Gabra, and Burji) vis-a-vis the Borana community.

Accordingly, I want to go on record to confirm that Mr. Mulato cannot make a good chief especially for the harmonious co-existence of our communities where the Burjis and the Borans are the majority in the location; moreover he is reported to be bragging having paid Ksh. 500,000 to have corruptly secured the position. Therefore, for the greater good of the communities and for the image of the national government that we all wish to protect, I want to urge you to cancel this appointment which your office gave executive orders to be effected ignoring our wise counsel. Thank you.

SUBMISSIONS BY THE CABINET SECRETARY, MINISTRY OF INTERIOR AND COORDINATION OF NATIONAL GOVERNMENT

PETITION ON THE REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF THE CHIEF DAKABARICHA LOCATION

Mr. Chairman, on 30th September 2015, Hon. Col. (Rtd) Dido Ali Rasso, Member of Parliament for Saku Constituency, petitioned the House regarding the removal and revocation of appointment of Mr. David Mulato Ndonche as the Chief of Dakabaricha Location. The Honourable Member stated that;

- i. Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs appointed to represent a location or sub location ought to be residents of that particular area.
- ii. In July 2015, Mr. David Mulato Ndonche was recruited as Chief of the Dakabaricha Location.
- iii. The appointment appeared to have been mismanaged and the person appointed was not the best candidate in terms of experience and qualification.
- iv. The appointment was highly irregular as the right criteria for appointment was not followed.
- v. The majority of the populace in Dakabaricha has serious reservations regarding the appointment which might result to ethnic conflicts in the area.
- vi. There have been ongoing silent demonstrations by the locals showing their displeasure against the appointment.

I wish to state as follows:

Mr. Chairman, the Deputy County Commissioner (DCC) Marsabit Central Sub County chaired a panel that conducted interviews to fill the position of the Chief Dakabaricha Location on 26th January, 2015. Based on the interview results, the best four (4) candidates

~~who are residents of Dakabaricha Location and members of Burji ethnic community that predominantly resides in the Location were recommended for consideration for appointment. The names of the following four candidates were subsequently forwarded to the Principal Secretary's office by the Regional Coordinator (RC), Eastern Region:~~

CANDIDATE	QUALIFICATION
1. Omar Jillo Sage	KCSE D (Plain)
2. David Mulato Ndonche	KSCE C- (Minus)
3. Amina Aila Ote	KCE DIV II
4. Yohana Hirbo Baqe	KCSE C- (Minus)

Mr. Chairman, before receipt of these indents, the Hon. Col (Rtd) Dido Ali Rasso, MP Saku Constituency had raised objection against the appointment of Mr. Omar Jillo Sage on account of a past track record of incitement to violence that led to loss of both government and private property in Marsabit. The Hon. MP stated that the appointment of Mr. Sage will not augur well with the residents of the Location. Therefore, he preferred the appointment of Mr. Halkano Dambi to the position of Chief Dakabaricha Location. However, this preferred person wasn't short listed for appointment.

Mr. Chairman, from our records Mr. Omar Jillo Sage P/No. 1987019292 was first employed as a Forest Guard on 2nd February, 1987 by the then Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources

where he worked for ten (10) years. He was later appointed Assistant Chief for Dakabaricha Sub Location with effect from 21st May, 1997. However, Mr. Sage was suspended with effect from 16th September, 2010 after he was charged in the Court of Law with the offence of incitement to violence contrary to Section 96(6) of the Penal Code.

He was however acquitted by the Court under the provisions of Section 215 of the Criminal Procedure Code (CPC). The Ministerial Human Resource Management Advisory Committee (MHRMAC) meeting of 13th April, 2011 recommended lifting of suspension and recommended that he be re-designated to a Cleaning Supervisor. He however appealed against the decision to re-designate him. The Authorized Officer considered and re-designated him to the position of Assistant Chief with effect from 20th June, 2012.

Mr. Chairman, in view of the past record of Mr. Sage and considering that person proposed by the Hon. MP was not shortlisted, Mr. David Mulato Ndonche who was ranked second was appointed as Chief Dakabaricha Location vide letter Ref. No. PA.2/21A dated 20th April, 2015. He has since taken up this appointment.


Mr. Chairman, Mr. David Mulato Ndonche had attained C- (Minus) in KCSE, though the minimum academic requirement as per the Scheme of Service is C+ (plus). However, the Public Service Commission granted a temporary waiver on academic requirements to facilitate appointment of applicants who have minimum of Kenya

Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE) to the existing vacancies in
the grade of Assistant Chief and Chief in Marsabit County.

Mr. Chairman, it is not true that the populace of Dakabaricha has serious reservations that can lead to ethnic conflicts with respect to the appointment of Mr. Ndonche. This Location is predominantly occupied by the Burji community and Mr. Ndonche is a member of the same community. Similarly, the Chief started working from 20th July, 2015 and there has been no single reported incident of ongoing silent demonstrations by the locals showing their displeasure against him.

Mr. Chairman, due diligence was conducted in the appointment of the Chief Dakabaricha Location. The recruitment and selection process was well managed, as the correct criterion for appointment was duly followed. The Ministry upholds the appointment of Mr. David Mulato Ndonche as the Chief of Dakabaricha Location because there are no substantial grounds to cause revocation of the same.
