EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In line with the provisions of Section 15 of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015, Sections 3 and 5(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury and Economic Planning vide a letter reference TNTP/SDP/4/52/(39) dated 12th October, 2023 submitted the name of Hon. Gabriel Kago Mukuha for appointment as a member of the Board of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund.

The Speaker conveyed the Message to the House on Thursday 12th October, 2023 and subsequently, committed the name of the nominee to the Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund for consideration.

The Committee carried out approval hearings in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015 and the National Assembly Standing Orders.

In compliance with Article 118 (1) (b) of the Constitution and Section 6 (4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary approval) Act, 2011, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the Nation and Standard newspapers on Wednesday, 18th October, 2023.

In the advertisement, the general public was notified of the nomination, submission of memoranda on the suitability of the nominee pursuant to Section 6 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. Further the advert notified the public on the date, place and time for the approval hearing that was undertaken on Tuesday, 31st October, 2023 in Committee Room on 5th Floor, Continental House, Parliament Buildings starting from 10.00 a.m.

The nominee was also notified through the same advertisement to submit clearance certificates from the following agencies: the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Kenya Revenue Authority, the Higher Educations Loans Board, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations and Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.

By close of business on Thursday, 26th October 2023, the Committee had not received any memoranda contesting or in support of the suitability of the nominee.

The Committee undertook the approval hearing for the nominee on Tuesday, 31st October, 2023 and observed that he met the threshold for appointment as a director to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board as stipulated in Section 15 (1) (e) of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015 and Section 8(2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

The Committee therefore recommends that the House **APPROVES** the nomination of Hon. Gabriel Kago Mukuha for appointment as a Director to the Board of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund.

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

- 1. The Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) is a statutory Committee established in accordance with the provisions of Section 50 of NG-CDF Act, 2015 whose functions include:
- (i) Overseeing the implementation of the NG-CDF Act, 2015 and in this respect, shall after every two years submit a report to the National Assembly and where necessary, propose any amendments to the Act with respect to the quantum of funds repayable into the Fund in accordance with Section 4 of the Act;
- (ii) Overseeing the policy framework and legislative matters that may arise in relation to the Fund:
- (iii)Reviewing the framework set out for the efficient delivery of development programmes financed through the Fund;
- (iv)Considering and reporting to the National Assembly, with recommendations, names of persons required to be approved by the National Assembly under this Act; and
- (v) Carrying out any other functions relevant to the work of the Fund.

2.0 BACKGROUND

4. The National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") is established pursuant to Section 14 of NG-CDF Act, 2015 as a body corporate.

2.1 Composition of the Board

- 5. The Board of Directors consists of the following, as provided in Section 15 of the NG-CDF Act, 2015–
- (a) the Principal Secretary in the Ministry for the time being responsible for matters relating to national economic policy and planning or a designated alternate, not being below the level of Director of Planning;
- (b) the Principal Secretary in the Ministry for the time being responsible for matters relating to finance or a designated alternate not being below the level of Deputy Director of Budget;
- (c) the Attorney-General or a designated alternate not being below the level of Senior State Counsel;
- (d) the Principal Secretary in the Ministry responsible for matters relating to education or a designated alternate not being below the level of Director;
- (e) seven other persons, three of whom shall be of the opposite gender and at least one shall be a person with disability, qualified in matters relating to finance, accounting, engineering, economics, community development, public affairs, project management, education, security or law appointed by the Cabinet Secretary with the approval of the National Assembly; and
- (f) the Chief Executive Officer who shall be an ex-officio member without a right to vote.

2.3 Functions of the Board

- 6. The functions of the Board are provided for under section 16 of the NG-CDF Act, 2015 as follows:
 - (a) to consider project proposals submitted by various constituencies in accordance with the Act, approve for funding those project proposals that are consistent with the Act and disburse funds to the respective constituency operations account with respect to the approved projects;
 - (b) to ensure timely and efficient disbursements of funds to every Constituency;
 - (c) to ensure efficient management of the Fund;
 - (d) to co-ordinate the implementation of inter-constituency projects;
 - (e) to receive and address complaints that may arise from the implementation of the Fund;
 - (f) to encourage best practices in the implementation of projects;
 - (g) to administer the funds and assets of the Board in such a manner and for such purpose as shall promote the best interest of the Board in accordance with the Act to ensure efficient management of the fund; and
 - (h) to perform such other duties as the Board may deem necessary from time to time for the proper management of the Fund.
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3.0 LEGAL FRAMEWORK OF THE APPROVAL HEARING

In considering the nominee for appointment as a Board Director of NG-CDF the Committee considered the provisions of the Constitution, the NG-CDF Act, 2015, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012.

3.1 Constitutional and statutory requirements in Parliamentary Approval of Public Appointments

4 Chapter 6, Article 10, Article 118, and Article 124(4) of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 and the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015 provide a framework for the conduct of parliamentary approval of public appointments

3.1.2 The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011

- 5 Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides for issues which the National Assembly is supposed to consider in relation to any nomination. These include:
 - (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
 - (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
 - (c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.
- 6 In addition, Section 6 of the same Act provides direction on the conduct of approval hearings. These include:
 - a) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background as per Section 6(7).
 - b) The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate as per Section 6(8).
 - c) Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath (affidavit), provide the Clerk(s) with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated as per Section 6(9).
 - d) A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall lapse as per Section 6(10).
- The period for consideration of nomination is prescribed in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. Section 8(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides that the Committee shall consider the nomination and table the report to the House for debate and decision within twenty-eight (28) days from the date on which the notification of nomination was given.

- 8 Section 9 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 stipulates that where the House does not meet the prescribed timelines, the nominees shall be deemed to have been approved.
- 9 Pursuant to Section 6(8) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 the criteria for vetting is comprehensively contained in the Questionnaire in the Schedule to the Act. The Questionnaire allows the Committee to obtain information on, among other things:
 - a) Name of the nominee to enable the Committee to ascertain the regional background and ethnicity of the nominee.
 - b) Gender of the nominee to enable the Committee to ascertain the gender of the nominee. This is to ensure compliance with Article 27(8) that requires the State to take measures to ensure that no more than two-thirds of members of appointive bodies shall be of the same gender.
 - c) Age of the nominee to enable the Committee to ascertain compliance with the provisions of Article 55 of the Constitution on the inclusion of the youth in public appointments.
 - d) Nationality of the nominee to enable the Committee to ascertain the nationality of the nominee. This is to ensure compliance with Article 78 of the Constitution which requires certain State officers to be Kenyan Citizens. However, it is worth noting that members to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board are not State officers under Article 260 of the Constitution.
 - e) Educational background of the nominee.
 - f) The employment record of the nominee.
 - g) Honours or awards given to the nominee.
 - h) Membership of the nominee to professional bodies.
 - i) Public office and political affiliations held by the nominee —to enable the Committee to ascertain whether the nominee holds office in a political party. This is to ensure compliance with Article 77(2) of the Constitution which precludes appointed State officers from holding office in a political party.
 - j) Information on whether the nominee has been removed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution which prohibits a State officer who has been removed from office under Article 75 (3) of the Constitution from holding any other State office.
 - k) Nominee's finances.
 - 1) Outside commitments that the nominee intends to undertake while in office (if appointed). Article 77(1) of the Constitution prohibits a full-time State officer from participating in any other gainful employment.
 - m) Tax compliance status of the nominee.
 - n) Potential conflict of interest—Article 75(1) of the Constitution bars State officers from engagements or associations that may give rise to conflict between official or public duties and personal interests.
 - o) Whether a nominee has been charged in a court of law in the past three years; and
 - p) Whether a nominee has been adversely mentioned in a report of Parliament or a Commission of Inquiry in the past three years.

q) The Questionnaire is largely formulated based on Constitutional and statutory requirements for State officers and other considerations that are of importance to enable determination on the suitability of a nominee.

3.1.3 Chapter Six on Leadership and Integrity

- 10 The Committee, in determining the suitability of the nominees, took into consideration the provisions on leadership and integrity outlined under Chapter Six of the Constitution. In particular, the Committee took cognizance of the following provisions-
 - 1) Article 73(2) of the Constitution provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include-
 - (a) Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections.
 - (b) Objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices.
 - (c) Selfless service based solely on the public interest demonstrated by—
 - (i) Honesty in the execution of public duties;
 - (ii) The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;
 - (iii) Accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
 - (iv) Discipline and commitment to service to the people.
 - 2) Article 75(1) of the Constitution requires a state officer, whether in public or private life, to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties. Article 75(3) of the Constitution prohibits a state officer who has been removed from office under that Article from holding any other State office.
 - 3) Article 77(1) of the Constitution prohibits a full-time State officer from participating in any other gainful employment.
 - 4) Article 77(2) of the Constitution prohibits an appointed State officer from holding office in a political party.
 - 5) Article 78 (1) of the Constitution disqualifies persons who are not Kenyan citizens and persons holding dual citizenship from appointment as State officers.

3.1.4 Article 10(2) of the Constitution on national values and principles of governance

11 Article 10 (2) of the Constitution provides for the national values and principles of governance which include patriotism, national unity, sharing and devolution of power, the rule of law, democracy and participation of the people; human dignity, equity, social justice, inclusiveness, equality, human rights, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalised; good governance, integrity, transparency and accountability; and sustainable development.

3.1.5 Article 118 of the Constitution

12 Article 118 of the Constitution obligates Parliament to conduct its business in an open manner, and that its sittings and those of its committees shall be in public; and that Parliament shall facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of Parliament and its committees. It also provides that Parliament may not exclude the public, or any media, from any sitting unless in exceptional circumstances the relevant Speaker has determined that there are justifiable reasons for the exclusion

3.1.6 Article 124(4) of the Constitution on parliamentary approval of public appointments

13 Article 124(4) of the Constitution provides that when a House of Parliament considers any appointment for which its approval is required under the Constitution or an Act of Parliament, the appointment shall be considered by a committee of the relevant House; the committee's recommendation shall be tabled in the House for approval; and the proceedings of the committee and the House shall be in public.

3.1.7 The Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012

- 14 Article 73 (2) of the Constitution provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include
 - (a) selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;
 - (b) objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
 - (c) selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by
 - (i) Honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - (ii) The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties.
 - (d) Accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
 - (e) Discipline and commitment in service to the people.
- 15 In addition, Section 10 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 provides that a State officer shall, to the best of their ability:
 - (a) carry out the duties of the office efficiently and honestly;
 - (b) carry out the duties in a transparent and accountable manner;
 - (c) keep accurate records and documents relating to the functions of the office; and
 - (d) report truthfully on all matters of the organization which they represent.

3.1.8 National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015

- 16 Section 15 (1) (e) of the NG-CDF Act, 2015 provides that the NG-CDF Board shall consist of seven other persons, three of whom shall be of the opposite gender and at least one shall be a person with disability, qualified in matters relating to finance, accounting, engineering, economics, community development, public affairs, project management, education, security or law
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4.0 THE APPROVAL HEARING

17 The Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund of the National Assembly conducted an approval hearing of the nominee to ascertain his suitability for the position proposed and made an appropriate recommendation to the House. The following activities preceded the approval hearing;

4.1 Notification to the Nominee

- 61. By a letter dated 18th October, 2023 *Ref: NA/DAA&OSC/NG-CDF/2023(40)* the Clerk of the National Assembly, pursuant to Section 6 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval), Act 2011, notified the nominee of the date, time and venue for the approval hearing. The nominee was further required to -
 - (a) present his original identity card, academic and professional certificates and other relevant testimonials. Additionally, the nominee was requested to bring clearance certificates from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, Kenya Revenue Authority, Higher Education Loans Board, Directorate of Criminal Investigations and the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.
 - (b) fill and present to the Committee the questionnaire in the Schedule of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

4.2 Notification of the Public

- 18 Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, provides that any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated.
- 19 On 18th October, 2023, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the Nation and Standard newspapers inviting members of the public to present written statements on oath referred to in Section 6 (9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The written statements were to be submitted on or before Thursday, 26th October ,2023 at 5:00 p.m.
- 20 Pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution, Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the National Assembly Standing Orders, the same advertisement notified the public that the Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund would conduct approval hearings on Tuesday,31st October,2023.

4.3 Clearance and Compliance Requirements

21 Following the referral of the nomination to the Committee, the Clerk of the National Assembly requested information on the nominee from the following statutory agencies:

- 22 The Clerk of the National Assembly received responses from various State agencies as follows-
 - (a) by a letter dated **25**th **October, 2023**, Ref: *KRA/5/1002/5(9869)*, the Kenya Revenue Authority indicated that the nominee was tax compliant;
 - (b) by a letter dated **25th October,2023**, Ref: *DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL XIII/110*, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations indicated that the nominee applied for police clearance certificate and the same was genuinely issued;
 - (c) by a letter dated **30**th **October 2023**, Ref: *HELB/RR/112009/280*, the Higher Education Loans Board indicated that the nominee was not a beneficiary of HELB.
 - (d) by a letter dated **25th October 2023**, Ref: *EACC*.7/10/5 *VOL XXV (211)*, the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission indicated that the nominee were not under any investigation, nor have they been recommended for any prosecution; and
 - (e) by a letter dated **24**th **October, 2023**, Ref: *RPP/ORG/34 VOL VII (39)*, the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties indicated that the nominee was not an official of any registered political party.
- 23 Additionally, during approval hearing, the nominee also presented before the Committee his clearance certificates from the aforementioned institutions.

4.4 Approval hearing of the Nominee

- 24 In conducting the approval hearing, the Committee was guided by the Constitution, the NG-CDF Act, 2015, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 and the National Assembly Standing Orders.
- 25 The Committee considered the nominee's academic qualifications, employment record and work experience, membership to relevant professional associations, public office, political activities and affiliations, potential conflict of interest, suitability to the position, tax
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- compliance, integrity and other thematic areas relevant to the duties and responsibilities of Board Directors of NG-CDF.
- 26 Hon. Gabriel Kago Mukuha appeared before the Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund on Tuesday 31st October, 2023 at 10.30 a.m for the approval hearing. He informed the Committee that:

4.4.1 Nominee background

27 He is a Kenyan citizen by birth with ID No 13843754, born in 1975 in Githunguri ;Kiambu County and does not hold any dual citizenship.

4.4.2 Academic and Professional qualifications

- 28 He holds a Bachelor degree in Business Administration from Presbyterian University and a Diploma in General Agriculture from Pwani University.
- 29 Employment Record and Work Experience.
- 30 He is an immediate former Member of Parliament of Githunguri Constituency, Kiambu County having served from 2017- 2022.
- 31 His experience as a former Member of Parliament gives him a better understanding on the role of the Board and interpreting the NG-CDF Act, 2015 and its relevant regulations to perform duties of the NG-CDF Board better.

4.4.3 Integrity and Leadership

75. He has never been adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of Inquiry in the last three years. He further submitted before the Committee hard copies of clearance certificates from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Higher Education Loans Board, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations, the Kenya Revenue Authority and the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.

4.4.4 Financial Net Worth

76. His net worth was estimated at one hundred million Kenya shillings (Kshs. 100M).

4.4.5 Professional Associations

77. He is not a member of any professional association

4.4.6 Conflict of Interest

78. He does not intend to vie for any political seat in the future and as such does not foresee any situation that could cause a conflict of interest in the execution of his duties.

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4.5 Key Issues Arising from the Vetting Process

79 The Committee posed several questions to the nominee on his knowledge of the NG-CDF and other cross-cutting issues that would affect the performance of the Board.

4.5.1 Functional assignment as provided in the Constitution

32 The nominee underscored the importance of understanding the provisions of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution on distribution of functions and where such functions are not expressly provided then they are treated as National Government functions and eligible for funding from the NG-CDF. He further informed on the need for a framework for determining such functions to avoid duplication of functions with the County Governments.

4.5.2 Current allocation to the NG-CDF

33 The nominee appreciated the current Fund allocation of 2.5% of the National Government share of revenue as allocated by the Division of Revenue Act annually. He noted that the societal impact attributed to the Fund in various sectors including education, security and environment and that there is need to increase the allocation to at least 5% to improve socio-economic development across the country.

4.5.3 Supreme Court Judgment on the constitutionality of the Fund

- 34 The nominee reiterated that the Fund is a National Government Fund that is utilized to support implementation of National Government functions and there is need to protect its existence. He noted that there is an apparent need to entrench the Fund into the Constitution to protect it from further litigation.
- 35 Further, he regretted that Members of parliament have always been tainted negatively in relation to the Fund by media, a matter that he attributed to lack of accurate information on how the Fund is run. He called for responsible reporting by the media and promised that given chance to serve in the Board, he will ensure that Board will hold seminars with media to apprise them on the NGCDF Act.
- 36 He emphasised on the need to operate within the provisions of the NGCDF Act and respect the provided structures to ensure seamless operations with no audit queries.

5.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

37 Having conducted an approval hearing pursuant to Section 6(7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Committee made the following specific observations regarding the suitability of the nominee for appointment as a member of the NG-CDF Board. That;

5.1 SPECIFIC OBSERVATIONS

- 38 The Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury and Economic Planning vide a letter reference *TNTP/SDP/4/52/(39)* dated 12th October, 2023 submitted the name of Hon Gabriel Kago Mukuha for appointment as a director of the Board of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund as provided in section 15(1)(e) of the NG-CDF Act, 2015.
- 39 He is a Kenyan citizen, born in Githunguri, Kiambu County on 2nd September, 1975, and is married with children.
- 40 On matters relating to professional training and experience, Hon. Gabriel Kago Mukuha is a trained Agriculturalist and worked as an educator with vast knowledge and competence in public affairs as evidenced by his stint as a member of Parliament for Githunguri Constituency demonstrating that the he is qualified in matters relating to finance, community development, public affairs, project management and education in accordance with section 15(1)(e) of the NG-CDF Act , 2015.
- 41 On matters relating to personal integrity, he meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity. He tabled clearance certificates from Ethics and Anti-corruption Commission (EACC), the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Directorate of Criminal Investigation (DCI), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP). The Committee also received written communication from each Agency verifying each clearance certificate.
- 42 He is a former Member of the National Assembly having served for one term. His experience as a Member of Parliament gives him an edge in understanding the role of the Board and interpreting the NG-CDF Act, 2015 and its relevant regulations to perform duties of the NG-CDF Board in compliance with section 6(7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and section 15(1) (e) of the NG-CDF Act, 2015.
- 43 The nominee demonstrated knowledge on topical, policy and technical issues touching on the NG-CDF Fund and has the requisite abilities, qualification and experience to serve as a director in the NG-CDF Board.
- 44 The nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Article 75(1) relating to conflict of interest, Article 76 relating to financial probity, and Article 77 relating to restriction on activities of State officers.

5.2 GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

- 45 The process of nomination of Hon Gabriel Kago Mukuha was in line with the Constitution, and the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015.
- 46 No memoranda were received from the public in contest of the nomination of Hon Gabriel Kago Mukuha for appointment as a member of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board.

6.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

47 Having complied with the requirements under the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015, and the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012, the Committee recommends that pursuant to section 8(2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the National Assembly **APPROVES** the appointment of Hon. Gabriel Kago Mukuha as a director of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board.

- (3) The Cabinet Secretary shall appoint the chairperson of the Board from among the seven persons appointed in accordance with paragraph (e) of subsection (1).
- (4) The names and curriculum vitae of the persons nominated to be appointed as members of the Board pursuant to paragraph (e) of subsection (1) shall, before appointments are made, be submitted to the National Assembly for approval.







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- (a) present his original identity card, academic and professional certificates and other relevant testimonials. Additionally, the nominee was requested to bring clearance certificates from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, Kenya Revenue Authority, Higher Education Loans Board, Directorate of Criminal Investigations and the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.
- (b) fill and present to the Committee the questionnaire in the Schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

Notification of the Public

Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, provides that any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath,

provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated.

On 18th October, 2023, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the Nation and Standard newspapers inviting members of the public to present written statements on oath referred to in Section 6 (9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The written statements were to be submitted on or before Thursday, 26th October ,2023 at 5:00 p.m.

Pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution, Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the National Assembly Standing Orders, the same advertisement notified the public that the Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund would conduct approval hearings on Tuesday,31st October,2023.

Clearance and Compliance Requirements

Following the referral of the nomination to the Committee, the Clerk of the National Assembly requested information on the nominee from the following statutory agencies:

The Clerk of the National Assembly received responses from various State agencies as follows-

- (a) by a letter dated **25**th **October**, **2023**, Ref: *KRA/5/1002/5(9869)*, the Kenya Revenue Authority indicated that the nominee was tax compliant;
- (b) by a letter dated 25th October,2023, Ref: DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL XIII/110, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations indicated that the nominee applied for police clearance certificate and the same was genuinely issued;

- (c) by a letter dated **30**th **October 2023**, Ref: *HELB/RR/112009/280*, the Higher Education Loans Board indicated that the nominee was not a beneficiary of HELB.
- (d) by a letter dated **25**th **October 2023**, Ref: *EACC.7/10/5 VOL XXV* (211), the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission indicated that the nominees were not under any investigation, nor have they been recommended for any prosecution;
- (e) by a letter dated **24**th **October**, **2023**, Ref: *RPP/ORG/34 VOL VII* (39), the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties indicated that the nominee was not an official of any registered political party.

The Committee considered the nominee's academic qualifications, employment record and work experience, membership to relevant professional associations, public office, political activities and affiliations, potential conflict of interest, suitability to the position, tax compliance, integrity and other thematic areas relevant to the duties and responsibilities of Board Directors of NG-CDF.

Hon. Gabriel Kago Mukuha appeared before the Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund on Tuesday 31st October, 2023 at 10.30 a.m for the approval hearing. He informed the Committee that:

- 1. He is a Kenyan citizen by birth with ID No 13843754, born in 1975 in Githunguri ;Kiambu County and does not hold any dual citizenship.
- 2. He holds a Bachelor degree in Business Administration from Presbyterian University and a Diploma in General Agriculture from Pwani University.
- 3. Employment Record and Work Experience.
- 4. He is an immediate former Member of Parliament of Githunguri Constituency, Kiambu County having served from 2017- 2022.
- 5. His experience as a former Member of Parliament gives him a better understanding on the role of the Board and interpreting the NG-CDF Act, 2015 and its relevant regulations to perform duties of the NG-CDF Board better.

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- 2. He holds a Bachelor degree in Business Administration from Presbyterian University and a Diploma in General Agriculture from Pwani University.
- 3. Employment Record and Work Experience.
- 4. He is an immediate former Member of Parliament of Githunguri Constituency, Kiambu County having served from 2017- 2022.
- 5. His experience as a former Member of Parliament gives him a better understanding on the role of the Board and interpreting the NG-CDF Act, 2015 and its relevant regulations to perform duties of the NG-CDF Board better.

- 6. He has never been adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of Inquiry in the last three years. He further submitted before the Committee hard copies of clearance certificates from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Higher Education Loans Board, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations, the Kenya Revenue Authority and the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.
- 7. His net worth was estimated at one hundred million Kenya shillings (Kshs. 100M).
- 8. He is not a member of any professional association
- He does not intend to vie for any political seat in the future and as such does not
 foresee any situation that could cause a conflict of interest in the execution of his
 duties.
- 10. The Committee posed several questions to the nominee on his knowledge of the NG-CDF and other cross-cutting issues that would affect the performance of the Board.
- 11. Functional assignment as provided in the Constitution
- 12. The nominee underscored the importance of understanding the provisions of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution on distribution of functions and where such functions are not expressly provided then they are treated as National Government functions and eligible for funding from the NG-CDF. He further informed on the need for a framework for determining such functions to avoid duplication of functions with the County Governments.
- 13. Current allocation to the NG-CDF
- 14. The nominee appreciated the current Fund allocation of 2.5% of the National Government share of revenue as allocated by the Division of Revenue Act annually. He noted that the societal impact attributed to the Fund in various sectors including education, security and environment and that there is need to increase the allocation to at least 5% to improve socio-economic development across the country.
- 15. Supreme Court Judgment on the constitutionality of the Fund
- 16. The nominee reiterated that the Fund is a National Government Fund that is utilized to support implementation of National Government functions and there is need to protect its existence. He noted that there is an apparent need to entrench the Fund into the Constitution to protect it from further litigation.

- 17. Further, he regretted that Members of parliament have always been tainted negatively in relation to the Fund by media, a matter that he attributed to lack of accurate information on how the Fund is run. He called for responsible reporting by the media and promised that given chance to serve in the Board, he will ensure that Board will hold seminars with media to apprise them on the NGCDF Act.

- 20. He is a Kenyan citizen, born in Githunguri, Kiambu County on 2nd September, 1975, and is married with children.
- 21. On matters relating to professional training and experience, Hon. Gabriel Kago Mukuha is a trained Agriculturalist and worked as an educator with vast knowledge and competence in public affairs as evidenced by his stint as a member of Parliament for Githunguri Constituency demonstrating that the he is qualified in matters relating to finance, community development, public affairs, project management and education in accordance with section 15(1)(e) of the NGCDF Act, 2015.
- 22. On matters relating to personal integrity, he meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity. He tabled clearance certificates from Ethics and Anti-corruption Commission (EACC), the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Directorate of Criminal Investigation (DCI), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP).
