1.0 PREFACE

1.1 MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

- x) To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
- xi) To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.
- 2. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the State Department for National Treasury, State Department for Economic Planning, Commission on Revenue Allocation and Office of the Controller of Budget

2.0 INTRODUCTION OF THE STATUTE LAW (MISCELLANEOUS AMENDMENTS) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILLS NO. 67 OF 2023)

2.1 BACKGROUND

5. The Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 67 of 2023) was read a first time on 15th November, 2023 and was subsequently committed to various Departmental Committees for consideration and facilitation of public participation pursuant to Standing Order 127. The Bill proposes amendments to various pieces of legislation including those relating to the Proposed Amendments to the Public Private Partnerships Act, 2021 (No. 14 of 2021). The Bill proposes to amend the Public Private Partnerships Act, 2021 to correct typographical and cross-referencing errors contained in the Bill, and to align provisions with each other to ensure consistency.

2.2 OVERVIEW OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The Committee considered the proposed amendments to the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) National Assembly Bill No. 67 of 2023 on the Public Private Partnerships Act, 2021 (No. 14 of 2021) as follows:

- 6. Amend section 29(3) to insert the word "development" immediately after the words "recoverable project".
- 7. Amend section 48(2) to delete the word "appraisal" appearing immediately after the word "project" and substitute therefor the word "implementation".
- 8. Amend Section 55(4) to delete the words "than an" and substitute therefor the word "the".
- 9. Amend Section 73(7) Delete the expression "section 71" wherever it appears and substitute therefor the expression "section 72".
- 10. Amend Section 75(5) to delete the word "seven" and substitute therefor the word "fourteen".

PART III

14. Amend Section 55(4) to delete the words "than an" and substitute therefor the word "the".

Committee Observation

The Committee agreed to the proposed amendment as the amendment is a clean-up for consistency of use of terms.

15. Amend Section 73(7) Delete the expression "section 71" wherever it appears and substitute therefor the expression "section 72".

Committee Observation

The Committee agreed to the proposed amendment as it will ensure that the correct reference is provided.

16. Amend Section 75(5) to delete the word "seven" and substitute therefor the word "fourteen". Committee Observation

The Committee agreed to the proposed amendment.

Committee justification

The proposed amendments seeks to correct typographical errors which lends clarity to legislative interpretation.

4.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

17. Having considered the Bill the Committee recommends that the House approves the Second reading of the proposed amendments to the Public Private Partnerships Act, 2021 (No. 14 of 2021) as contained in Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 67 of 2023).
