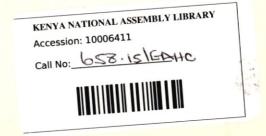

The expenditure approved in the Estimates for the year 1955/56 was £4,922,017. Up to date supplementary provision of £136,649 has been approved on the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Finance as follows:—

Although the approved estimate of expenditure on the Desert Locust Campaign was included in the Estimates at £1,500,000, revenue contributions amounted to only £786,700. To finance the campaign up to the revised estimated cost of £1,328,000, the sum of £375,875 was revoted from savings on previous years and an additional contribution of £165,425 was made by the Government of Kenya. Apart from this special contribution, the additional cost falling to be met by the East African Governments out of the total of £136,649 set out above amounted to £85,911, as follows:—

Revised Estimates for the year 1955/56 total £4,702,304, which is £356,362 less than the total approved provision for the year of £5,058,666. This saving is mainly accounted for as follows:—

#### HEAD 5—EAST AFRICA HIGH COMMISSION AND CENTRAL ASSEMBLY—£5,000

The reduced expenditure has resulted from the difficulty in recruiting a suitable Public Relations Officer.

#### HEAD 4—DESERT LOCUST SURVEY—£189,000

£172,000 of this sum is accounted for by the difference between the approved provision of £1,500,000 and the revised estimate of £1,328,000 for the cost of the campaign.

Due to essential control measures, the work of the Locust Survey Teams has been restricted and officers have been employed on control duties. A saving of £17,000 is anticipated.

#### HEAD 7—EAST AFRICAN INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH ORGANIZATION—£45,000

As the construction of the new laboratories cannot be completed within the financial year, about £32,500 of Extraordinary provision will remain unspent. Until the laboratories are nearer completion, the recruitment of staff has been postponed, resulting in a saving of £12,500.

#### HEAD 9—EAST AFRICAN MARINE FISHERIES RESEARCH ORGANIZATION—£40,000

It is unlikely that the new vessel will be delivered during the present financial year.

#### HEAD 12—EAST AFRICAN LITERATURE BUREAU—£5,000

The whole provision for Extraordinary Expenditure for the magazine *Tunalira* is unlikely to be spent during the present financial year,

HEAD 20—EAST AFRICAN STATISTICAL DEPARTMENT—£7,000

The reduced expenditure has resulted from the difficulty in recruiting professional staff.

HEAD 21—EAST AFRICAN TRYPANOSOMIASIS RESEARCH ORGANIZATION—£6,300

The reduced expenditure has resulted from the winding up of the pilot schemes.

HEAD 24—EAST AFRICAN DIRECTORATE OF CIVIL AVIATION—£8,000

Recruiting difficulties and the delay in shipping of technical equipment accounts for the reduced expenditure.

HEAD 27—MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES—£20,000

Although the construction of the Headquarters building is proceeding satisfactorily, it is unlikely that the full provision voted will be required during the present financial year.

HEAD 29—EAST AFRICAN INCOME TAX DEPARTMENT—£20,000

The reduced expenditure is occasioned by difficulty in recruitment and delays in shipping of accounting machinery.

#### ESTIMATES—GENERAL STATEMENT, 1956/57

The Estimates for 1956/57 have been framed on the basis that, having regard to the financial position of the East African Governments, they must be kept at the minimum consistent with the provision of an adequate and efficient service to the public, taking into consideration the need to contribute to the development of the wealth of East Africa and to collect the revenues upon which the Governments depend.

The preparation of the Estimates has been substantially influenced by the following important considerations:—

- (1) The decrease in the purchasing power of the East African shilling continues and there are no certain indications that this process is likely to be halted either in East Africa or outside during the coming financial year. The inevitable result is that as compared with the previous year, costs of essential services have increased and if services to the public are to be maintained at the existing level, the cost must be higher. This is reflected in the increases which are proposed in such items as Transport, Rents and Housing Allowances, Equipment and Supplies, and so on. There is, therefore, a small general percentage increase throughout the Estimates in this respect.
- (2) The existing schemes for departments and organizations financed partly by grants under the Colonial Development and Welfare Acts terminate at 30th June, 1956, after which date new schemes are being made under the 1955 Act for the period up to 31st March, 1960. Whereas the existing schemes provided for 50 per cent or more of the expenditure to be covered by grants from Her Majesty's Government, the moneys available for the new period are barely sufficient to provide grants on a sliding scale of 45 per cent for 1956/57, 40 per cent 1957/58, 30 per cent 1958/59 and 25 per cent 1959/60. The East African Governments have accepted the reductions for 1956/57 and 1957/58, after which the position of the departments and organizations affected will receive further consideration. A reduction of 5 per cent in a Colonial Development and Welfare grant has the effect of increasing a territorial government's one-sixth share by 10 per cent.

The preparation of new schemes for the period up to 31st March, 1960, has enabled a review of the programmes of the Research Organizations to be

undertaken by the East African Agricultural and Fisheries Research Council and the East African Council for Medical Research, and a number of proposals recommended by these councils have been included in the Estimates.

Overall, therefore, there are increases in the cost of Research Organizations which are explained in the detailed memorandum under the appropriate Head of the Estimates, together with the increases in the contributions which the Governments are invited to approve.

- (3) The continued increase in the volume of imports into East Africa and of the number of income tax taxpayers has again necessitated increases in the cost of revenue collecting departments, the East African Customs and Excise Department and the East African Income Tax Department. This additional cost is, however, unavoidable if the greater yields of revenue are to be gathered in.
- (4) The cost of the East African Statistical Department has been entered provisionally at its existing level. All the Governments are agreed that the Department must be reorganized and expanded, but final proposals were not available at the time these Estimates were put into print. Detailed proposals will, therefore, be submitted to the Estimates Committee.
- (5) The essential requirements of both the East African Directorate of Civil Aviation and the East African Meteorological Department have been subjected to detailed examination during the current year; in the former case by Messrs. Urwick, Orr and Partners Ltd., Management Consultants. In both cases the Standing Committee on Finance has recommended increases in establishments and in Other Charges for the current year. It is, however, likely that further expenditure will be necessary if these Departments are to be put on to an efficient long-term basis.

Apart from these considerations, the Office of the East African Council for Medical Research, previously dealt with under a separate Head of the Estimates, has been abolished and the staff brought under Head I—The Office of the Administrator. Three new Services which were approved during the current year by recommendation of the Standing Committee on Finance have been included:—

#### Physiological and Biochemical Research

A scheme to provide for investigations to be carried out on the causes and effects of malnutrition in its many aspects.

#### Schistosomiasis Research

This project provides for research into the ecology and taxonomy of African schistosome snails. These snails are the vectors of schistosomiasis, particularly bilharzia.

#### Ædes ægypti Investigations

Ædes ægypti is the classical vector of yellow fever and dengue. Whereas the outdoor mosquito can seldom carry a disease effectively enough from man to man to cause an epidemic, a domestic species such as Ædes ægypti can readily create an explosive epidemic situation. The relative safety of the population of Africa as far as yellow fever is concerned, almost certainly depends on this key species.

These schemes are financed wholly by grants under the Colonial Development and Welfare Acts and have been accepted on the clear understanding that no expenditure will fall on the East African Governments.

#### **REVENUE, 1956/57**

The total estimated revenue for the year 1956/57 is £4,836,022, of which £705,420 is derived from contributions from Her Majesty's Government, £3,366,874 from the East African Governments and the balance from miscellaneous sources. £21,129 is derived from moneys provided by the Governments in earlier years in respect of revotes of Extraordinary Expenditure already sanctioned. The contributions proposed for the year 1956/57, as compared with those for the previous year (including Supplementary provision), are as follows:—

The reduction in grants under the Colonial Development Acts to 45 per cent has increased the contributions to be made by the East African Governments to the Research Organizations.

#### EXPENDITURE, 1956/57

The total expenditure proposed for the year at £4,836,022 shows a decrease of £222,644 as compared with the approved provision for the year 1955/56. At the end of this memorandum there is a table prepared on the same basis as in previous years, setting out the expenditure for the year as compared with the year 1955/56, and subdivided between Personal Emoluments, Other Charges and Extraordinary expenditure.

As regards Personal Emoluments, approximately £62,000 of the increase is for the East African Meteorological Department and the East African Directorate of Civil Aviation. The increases for the East African Customs and Excise Department and the East African Income Tax Department and the Accountant General's Department

account for a further £81,500. In the East African Agriculture and Forestry Research Organization and the East African Veterinary Research Organization it is proposed to fill posts which have had to be held in abeyance in the past to enable the expenditure to be contained within the scheme provision. The filling of these posts, together with the increased provision to meet the increases in salaries of officers in the Colonial Research Services, accounts for a further £30,000 of the increase. There is, however, a decrease of approximately £24,000 due to the winding up of the East African Trypanosomiasis Research Pilot Schemes. The balance of the increase of approximately £15,000 is accounted for by normal increments, salary adjustments and the provision for gratuities payable to temporary staff.

The increase in provision for Other Charges expenditure would have been of the order of £250,000 but for a reduction of £14,000 due to the winding up of the Pilot Schemes. Approximately £62,000 of the increase is for the East African Meteorological Department and the East African Directorate of Civil Aviation. Increased provision for the East African Customs and Excise Department and the East African Income Tax Department amount to some £112,000. £7,000 is for the Accountant General's Department and £37,000 for the East African Veterinary Research Organization, of which £20,000 is shown as a reimbursement to the Research Head. Increased provision for Expenses of Conferences, which were previously met directly by the Governments concerned, provision for passages and pensions and reimbursements to the Office of the Accountant General account largely for the remainder of the increase.

The large reduction in provision for Extraordinary expenditure is mainly accounted for by reduction in the provision for the Desert Locust campaign.

#### HEAD 1—EAST AFRICA HIGH COMMISSION AND CENTRAL ASSEMBLY (1) Office of the Administrator

Of the net increase in the provision for recurrent expenditure of £9,178, £4,232 is accounted for by the inclusion of the Public Relations Officer as approved by the Central Legislative Assembly in September, 1955. Provision has been made for the payment of acting allowances in accordance with the revised terms of service.

Item 2—Transport and Travelling

The increased provision is for the essential travelling of the Information Officer and is in accordance with the proposal approved by Central Legislative Assembly in September, 1955.

Item 32-Exhibitions

Provision has been made under this Head instead of under Head 27 as in previous years.

Item 13—Expenses of Conferences

Provision has been made under this Head instead of under Head 27 as in previous years.

Item 21—Publications

This is for publicity publications and is in accordance with the proposals approved by the Central Legislative Assembly.

Extraordinary

Provision has been made for a dictaphone and office equipment for the Information Officer.

#### (2) Public Service Commission

In September, 1955, the Central Legislative Assembly approved additional provision of £1,000 for the portion of the year to enable a Public Service Commission for the Non-self-contained Services of the East Africa High Commission to be established. Provision of £2,000 has been included in these Estimates for the full year.

#### (3) Legal Secretary

The increase in provision for the Office of the Legal Secretary is accounted for by the appointment of an additional Assistant Legal Secretary, as approved by the Central Legislative Assembly in September, 1955.

### HEAD 2—EAST AFRICAN AGRICULTURE AND FORESTRY RESEARCH ORGANIZATION

The original scheme for the East African Agriculture and Forestry Research Organization, which was prepared in 1946, envisaged a gradual expansion of the Research programme which, by 1955, would require an establishment of 45 Research Officers and ancillary staff. Owing to rising costs, the programme was fully reviewed in 1950, when it was substantially reduced to what was regarded as the minimum upon which it could be operated efficiently. Even from this point some posts have been held in abeyance while the programme was slowly developed.

The East African Agricultural and Fisheries Research Council has recently reviewed the programme further in the course of the preparation of the new Colonial Development and Welfare Scheme for the period up to 31st March, 1960, and has recommended the addition of a further 4 Research Officer posts with ancillary staff. Upon this basis the total estimated cost would have been £191,929 for the year. Apart from the heavy additional burden on the East African Governments, the Secretary of State has been unable to allocate sufficient moneys from Colonial Development and Welfare sources to meet the cost of the additional staff and the scheme proposals have therefore been revised to provide for the existing approved posts only, with the result that the total cost in 1956/57 is reduced to £164,869.

This reduction will necessitate a further rearrangement of the research programme which will be submitted to the East African Agricultural and Fisheries Research Council for consideration at a meeting to be held in March, 1956. Authority has already been given by the Legislative Assembly to the Research Council to revise the amounts expended from individual items provided the total provision is not exceeded. The estimate is therefore confined to Personal Emoluments, Other Charges and Extraordinary expenditure only. The revised research programme will be available to the Estimates Committee.

#### HEAD 4—DESERT LOCUST SURVEY

### (1) Administrative Headquarters

### (2) Locust Survey Teams

#### (3) General

The Estimates have been prepared on the same basis as for previous years and it has been possible to effect an overall reduction of approximately £5,000 in the cost.

#### (4) Control Measures

As control measures in the Arabian Peninsula are now undertaken by the Food and Agricultural Organization, and substantial progress is being made by the Ethiopian Government on the establishment of an efficient control organization, it has been possible to reduce the area in which operations must be carried out by the Desert Locust Control, with the result that the estimated cost in 1956/57 shows a substantial reduction. It must, however, be emphasized that it is impossible to make an accurate estimate so far ahead of the campaign year, and the actual expenditure may well be very different from the estimate, although this has been carefully prepared in the light of present information.

The contributions to be made by the East African Governments have not yet been agreed, but will be the subject of interterritorial discussions during February, 1956. Particular attention is drawn to the fact that the figures shown as revenue contributions, which do not include anything from Uganda, do not represent any commitment whatever on the Governments at the present stage.

# HEAD 5—EAST AFRICAN FISHERY RESEARCH ORGANIZATION

This Organization is under the ægis of the East African Agricultural and Fisheries Research Council. The Council has now completed a full review of the scope of the research work undertaken by the Organization with the object of directing the research into channels most likely to prove of economic value to East Africa. This includes investigation into the fish population in areas farther from the shores of the lake which will require a small addition to the establishment. The cost of the Organization is to be met by a Colonial Development and Welfare scheme which has been submitted to the East African Governments and the Secretary of State, under which the new tapering of Colonial Development and Welfare grants will be applied.

#### Item 8-Maintenance of M/V and Boats

Provision has been made for the employment of an additional Artisan and a reduction made under the Item—Maintenance of Motor Vehicles and Boats, as it has been found preferable to carry out minor maintenance work at the station.

### Item 2—Transport and Travelling

Increased provision for this item has become necessary due to the increase in the rate of subsistence allowance. Further, additional travelling is necessary to prevent illegal fishing around the lake shores.

#### Item 4-Motor Vehicles

It is proposed to obtain three 12-ft. fibre-glass dinghies and to fit them with the engines from the worn-out dinghies.

#### HEAD 12—EAST AFRICAN LITERATURE BUREAU

#### (1) Bureau

In previous years the Headquarters and Libraries Service were shown separately, but as they have been amalgamated in the new scheme proposals, they are shown combined in these Estimates and for ease of comparison the separate provisions for 1955/56 have also been amalgamated.

Item 1 (1)—Director

The salary for this post was revised under the Lidbury Report after the 1955/56 Estimates were printed.

Item 1 (2)-Deputy Director.

Item 1 (6)—Branch Officers Assistants

To meet the growth in work the Branch Offices have been strengthened by the inclusion of Branch Officers Assistants and the Headquarters establishment reduced by the abolition of the post of Deputy Director.

Item 1 (9)-4 Translators | Readers.

Item 1 (10)-Clerks

Provision has been made for an additional Translator/Reader and one Clerk, Scale E, to meet the increase in work.

Item 1 (11)-Motor Driver

Provision has been made for a Driver for the Dar es Salaam Branch vehicle.

Item 5-Common Services

The increase is largely due to posts which were previously held by officers serving on contract now being filled by officers on pensionable terms of service. A large part of this increase is offset by the reduction in provision for Gratuities.

Item 18-Rents

The increased provision is necessary to meet the rental charges for the Branch offices.

Item 24-Purchase and Maintenance of Books

The initial capital provision of £15,000 for the setting up of the Library is now exhausted and all expenditure falls to be met from the Recurrent vote, which has been increased by £1,000 to cover the necessary expenditure.

Item 29-Posts and Telegraphs Service

The increase is due to the expansion of the Libraries Postal Service.

#### (2) Periodicals Section

The whole cost of this section is met from a Colonial Development and Welfare grant and will be utilized in launching and publishing the magazine *Tunalira*.

### HEAD 13—EAST AFRICAN INSTITUTE OF MALARIA AND VECTOR-BORNE DISEASES

#### (1) Institute

The proposed scheme for the continuation of the work of the Institute contains only minor variations in establishment. It is proposed to appoint one additional Assistant Scientific Officer, reduce the number of graded Artisans and increase the provision for subordinate staff.

#### Item 1 (15)—Personal Allowances

The increase in provision is accounted for by the revision of salaries of officers serving in the Colonial Research Service.

### Other Charges

The Other Charges expenditure for this department has, in the past, been curtailed as some of the posts were held in abeyance to enable the expenditure to be contained within the scheme provision. With a full complement of staff engaged on the Research programme, the provision for Other Charges expenditure has become inadequate and the increase proposed in the Estimates are considered the essential minimum to enable the Institute to fulfil its functions.

#### Item 2—Transport and Travelling

The increase in provision is necessitated by wider touring, greater demands being made on the Institute, and increases in transport costs.

### Item 6—Equipment and Supplies

As the work of the Institute has necessitated the appointment of a Research Chemist, increased provision is required for this item to meet the cost of chemicals and special equipment.

### Item 13—Expenses of Conferences

As it has now been decided that the East Africa High Commission will meet the cost of territorial representatives attending meetings convened by the High Commission, it has been necessary to make provision for this item.

#### Extraordinary

Item 1-Water Supply

Item 2-Re-roofing Laboratories and Houses

#### Item 3-Plant and Equipment

Provision has been made for essential renewals and replacements to be carried out at Amani.

#### Item 4-Motor Vehicles

The provision is required for the replacement of three worn-out motor vehicles.

#### Item 5—Library

Provision has been made for essential textbooks on Research Chemistry.

#### (2) Malaria Control

The expenditure proposed for the year 1956/57 is in accordance with the scheme provision. The period of the scheme is for four years from 1953 to 1957.

#### Item 1 (5)—Health Visitor (Part-time)

This post has been found essential for the satisfactory liaison with the local population and the acquisition of data of infant morbidity and mortality. The cost is covered by savings in other items of Personal Emoluments.

## HEAD 14—EAST AFRICAN MEDICAL SURVEY AND RESEARCH INSTITUTE

#### (1) Institute

The proposed Colonial Development and Welfare scheme for the continuation of the Medical Survey and Research Institute includes the cost of the physiological and biochemical research scheme, all of which will be met from a 100 per cent Colonial Development and Welfare grant. The increases in establishment are all accounted for by this amalgamation. The net effect is that the recurrent expenditure of the Medical Survey has been reduced by approximately £1,500 compared with the provision for the year 1955/56.

Item 20-Fees, Rewards and Contributions

Statistician

Provision has been made for necessary statistical work to be undertaken against payment and the post of Statistician has been abolished.

(51)—Extraordinary

Item 1-Motor Vehicles

Provision has been made for the replacement of a worn-out motor vehicle.

Item 2-Guest House

The East African Council for Medical Research has recommended that accommodation should be made available for eminent visiting research workers and, in view of the uncertainty of hotel accommodation at Mwanza, it is proposed to provide a small guest house.

Item 3-Gas Plant

Item 5-Metabolic Ward

The cost of these items is met in full from Colonial Development and Welfare funds, and are essential for the establishment of the physiological and biochemical research at Mwanza.

#### HEAD 15—EAST AFRICAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT

In December, 1955, the Standing Committee on Finance recommended to the Legislative Assembly approval of supplementary Estimates for 1955/56 providing for an expansion of the East African Meteorological Department which will be completed gradually over the years 1956/57 and 1957/58. Due to the increase in air travel, the meteorological data required to provide reliable forecasts cannot be obtained with the present establishment and the expansion is to provide for more stations to operate for longer periods, the establishment of a training school, the setting up of ten further observing stations and proper routine inspections.

The Estimates for 1956/57 have been prepared on the basis of the existing establishment, together with the increases already approved.

## Item 1 (11)—Meteorological Assistants

Provision has been made for the regrading in accordance with the Grading Team report.

#### Item 2—Transport and Travelling

The increase is accounted for by the additional staff, routine inspection and training.

Item 4-Staff Housing and Allowances

#### Item 5-Common Services

The increase is mainly accounted for by the additional staff.

#### Item 6-Equipment and Supplies

The increased use of Radio Sonde balloons and the fact that reserve stocks, which had been accumulated while the department was under the control of the Air Ministry, have now been exhausted, has necessitated a considerabl increas in the provision for this item.

#### Item 29-Posts and Telegraphs Service

The increase in provision is to provide for the rental of teleprinter circuits and lines for facsimile transmissions.

#### (2) Research Section

In recent years the Department had developed a series of research experiments likely to be of economic value to East Africa. For 1954/55 a lump sum provision of £2,500 was made, and as the experiments progressed, a Colonial Development and Welfare Scheme widening the scope of the work was approved by the Secretary of State in the sum of £2,500. For the period up to 31st March, 1960, a further scheme has been prepared for the consideration of the East African Governments and the Secretary of State to cover research into such subjects as artificial control of rainfall; reduction of evaporation losses; prediction of seasonal rainfall, analysis of rainfall records and the application of meteorological data to irrigation projects. The scheme provides for an establishment of officers who will be able to devote their whole time to research projects.

# HEAD 18—DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC CO-ORDINATION

## (1) Main Division

No new proposals are made for this Service for the year 1956/57 but a review of the establishment in the Department will be necessary, if proposals contained in the Royal Commission Report are to be implemented, as it is unlikely that further work can be undertaken by this Department without increasing the establishment.

#### Item 5—Common Services

The increased provision for this sub-head is to meet the cost of passages required during the year and minor increases in the cost of pensions, audit and accounting services.

## Item 13-Expenses of Conferences

As it has now been decided that the High Commission will meet the expenses of Territorial representatives, which were previously borne by the Territorial Governments, it has been necessary to increase considerably the provision for this item, as this Department convenes meetings of the East African Industrial Council, the East African Timber Advisory Board, Interterritorial Economic Officers, and the Committee for Economic Co-ordination.

# (2) Hides, Tanning and Allied Industries Bureau

At the twenty-seventh meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance the Committee approved the proposal to introduce a Port Examination Service, and noted that proposals for the full implementation of this Service would be submitted with the draft Estimates. These proposals include the abolition of the post of Leather Chemist, the employment of two Leather Technologists and a suitably qualified Senior Hides Examiner to co-ordinate the work of the Hides Examiners. The establishment of Hides Examiners has been reduced from five to four. The provision for labour has been reduced and the establishment amended to provide for two additional Clerks and two Assistant Hides Inspectors.

## Item 5-Common Services

The increase is almost entirely due to the provision for passages as during the year 1955/56 provision was not required for this item.

As requested by the Standing Committee on Finance, a report is being prepared setting out fully the duties and responsibilities of each post in the Department, together with recommendations for a more suitable type of title for the Department now that its functions have changed. As the Port Inspection Service was only introduced in January, it was not practicable to carry out the review almost immediately after its introduction, to enable the report to be included in the Memorandum on these Estimates. It will, therefore, be submitted to the Estimates Committee.

#### HEAD 20—EAST AFRICAN STATISTICAL DEPARTMENT

At the time these Estimates were prepared, the future organization of this Department was under consideration by the East African Governments. Proposals have not reached a stage of finality to enable them to be included in these draft Estimates, although all three governments have agreed to the recruitment of a Deputy Government Statistician for each Territory and authority for these appointments was given by the Standing Committee on Finance in December, 1955. Proposals for each Territory will be submitted to the Estimates Committee.

The Estimates have, therefore, been prepared on the same basis as for 1955/56 except for the inclusion of the Kenya service—Retail Price Collection, additional provision for which was approved by the Central Legislative Assembly in September, 1955.

## HEAD 21—EAST AFRICAN TRYPANOSOMIASIS RESEARCH ORGANIZATION

During the current year this organization has been substantially reorganized. Briefly, the reorganization consists of the removal of the Headquarters from Nairobi to Sukulu and the reorientation of the functions of the organization, including the scaling down of the reclamation work and its transfer to territorial departments, so that in future the emphasis will be on research work. Steps are being taken to set up a suitable co-ordinating committee on which interterritorial interests will be represented.

The organization has been financed under a Colonial Development and Welfare Scheme which expires on 30th June, 1956, and which includes pilot reclamation schemes, the cost of which was met fully by a Colonial Development and Welfare grant. In preparing the new Colonial Development and Welfare Scheme for the period up to 31st March, 1960, a reduction in the number of staff has been made but with the cessation of the pilot reclamation schemes part of the general overhead expenditure previously borne by them must be met in future by the organization.

The new Colonial Development and Welfare Scheme contemplated a total recurrent expenditure of £158,593 for the current year, but the scope of the work of the new organization has not yet been the subject of examination by the co-ordinating committee. The expenditure for 1956/57 has, therefore, been reviewed with the object of reducing it to a minimum pending the advice of the committee. As a result, the total of the proposed recurrent expenditure has been brought down to £147,941.

The increased provision for personal emoluments due to the revision of salaries of officers in the Colonial Research Service has more than been offset by the reduction in establishment, making a net decrease in provision of approximately £1,800.

#### Other Charges

#### Item 5-Common Services

The increase is accounted for by passage requirements, and increased costs of pensions and accounting services.

## Item 6-Equipment and Supplies

With the emphasis on research as opposed to reclamation work, far more equipment and chemicals will be required.

## Item 7-Maintenance of Buildings and Estate

Previously only a nominal figure was included in the Estimates pending the completion of the main laboratories. Provision is now made at 2 per cent of the capital cost.

#### Item 10-Essential Services

The increase is to meet the cost of electricity supply to the Sukulu laboratories.

#### Item 17-Purchase and Upkeep of Animals

Increase in the number of animals required for laboratory experiments and increase in the cost of foodstuffs accounts for the increased provision.

#### HEAD 22—EAST AFRICAN VETERINARY RESEARCH ORGANIZATION

This Organization is operated under the ægis of the East African Agricultural and Fisheries Research Council and the provision is stated in a three-line Vote, leaving the detailed allocation of expenditure in the hands of the Council. Under a Colonal Development and Welfare Scheme part of the cost of the research work is met by Her Majesty's Government.

In previous years the Organization was being built up in its new Headquarters at Muguga in accordance with the then existing Colonal Development and Welfare scheme and a number of approved posts were kept in abeyance or were not filled owing to recruiting difficulties. For the year 1956/57 the Council proposes to fill all approved posts and to increase the number of Laboratory Assistants by seven. The cost of this increase is about £800 only. The increased provision for 1956/57 for recurrent expenditure is therefore almost entirely due to the filling of vacant posts and increases in the cost of Supplies and Services.

Under Extraordinary expenditure provision is made for the replacement of vehicles and other machinery; the improvement of access roads, and the erection of experimental animal buildings which are required for research work in highly infectious animal diseases.

In addition to the production of rinderpest vaccine, steps are being taken to commence the production of bovine-pluropneumonia vaccine. The Assembly has already agreed in principle that the cost of these biologicals must either be met from sales or if at the wish of the Governments the sale price is kept below cost, the balance should be met by them. In order therefore to enable expenditure on biologicals to be kept distinct from moneys made available for research, separate sub-heads have been included. The estimated total cost of the staff employed on biologicals has been reimbursed to the research sub-head and provision made for the total cost of production to be met from sales. The Council will consider how the revenue for this purpose is to be secured at a meeting to be held in March, 1956.

#### HEAD 23-EAST AFRICAN VIRUS RESEARCH INSTITUTE

The proposals for the Institute have been restricted to continuing the research on the existing basis and the increase of £1,945 in the recurrent expenditure is largely accounted for by the revision of salaries of officers in the Colonial Research Service.

Item 1 (1)—Director

Item 1 (11)—Personal Allowances

Item 1 (13)-Temporary Allowances

The increases and decreases under these Items are accounted for by the revision of salaries of officers in the Colonial Research Service.

Item 6-Equipment and Supplies

The provision for this item has been increased by £290 to meet the cost of equipment and chemicals required for tissue culture.

Item 10-Essential Services

With the introduction of a revised tariff of charges for electricity, the cost of current consumed by the Institute has considerably increased.

Item 13-Expenses of Conferences

This is in accordance with the decision that the High Commission should meet the expenses of Territorial representatives which were previously borne by the Territorial Governments.

Item 17-Purchase and Upkeep of Animals

The provision for this item in previous years has proved totally inadequate and as the work of the Institute depends upon the use of animals, the provision for this Item has been increased by £340.

#### Extraordinary

Item 1-Dinghy

Provision has been made for the purchase of a small metal dinghy with an outboard motor to enable important research work to be carried out around the shores of Lake Victoria in the vicinity of the Institute.

Item 2-Staff Housing

Provision has been made for essential work on some of the old Institute houses.

Item 3-Equipment

£1,200 is required for tissue culture equipment and installation. £1,000 for mouse boxes (the mouse colony of the Institute must be maintained at approximately 25,000 mice) and £1,000 for general equipment.

Item 4—Library

£300 is required for essential textbooks.

#### (2) Ædes Ægypti Investigation

The whole cost of this research investigation is met from a Colonial Development and Welfare grant. The provision for the year is in accordance with the scheme.

#### HEAD 24—EAST AFRICAN DIRECTORATE OF CIVIL AVIATION

During the year 1955/56 the Directorate was fully reorganized on the basis of a detailed report made by Messrs. Urwick, Orr and Partners Ltd., management consultants, and at the September, 1955, meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance a substantial revision of establishment was approved. It was recognized that some further modifications would be required in the light of experience of the new set-up and that a further examination would be carried out by Messrs. Urwick, Orr and Partners in February, 1956. The proposed changes set out in these Estimates will therefore be subjected to further examination and a report made to the Estimates Committee. Estimates normally show the establishment and financial provision approved in the original Estimates of the preceding year. In view of the substantial revision of establishments approved for 1955/56 the revised numbers have been set out in the second column of the Estimates so that the proposed changes for 1956/57 can be explained below.

#### (1) Headquarters

Item 1 (7)—Operations Officer

Item 1 (12)—Air Traffic Control Officers

One post of Air Traffic Control Officer has been redesignated Operations Officer to carry out operations duties at Headquarters and will be gazetted as Chief Inspector of Accidents.

Item 1 (24)-Technician (Diesel)

This post was previously provided for under Air Navigational Services but as the duties are as assistant to the Inspecting Technician on the Headquarters staff, to regularize the position the assistant is now established at Headquarters.

Item 1 (26)—Housing—Overseer

This Overseer is required to supervise the staff quarters at Rifle Range Camp.

Item 1 (27)—Motor Driver

Provision has been made for a Driver for the additional departmental vehicle.

Item 16-Operation of Aircraft

This item is increased to cover the extra flying which will be undertaken and the maintenance of the new aircraft.

Item 30-Printing and Stationery

The increase is to cover the reprint of legal ordinances.

#### (2) Air Navigational Services

Item 1 (6)-Radio Officers

By agreement with the consultants, provision has been made for two Radio Officers instead of one, to be stationed at Entebbe, Kisumu, Mbeya and Dar es Salaam. Two additional Radio Officers have been provided for to man the Flight Information Centres, Air-to-Ground Communications during darkness.

Item 1 (9)-Technicians

The installation by the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation of a radio teletype station serving the trunk route and V.H.F. Beacons at Nairobi and Entebbe has necessitated the increase in establishment for the maintenance of the equipment.

Item 1 (10)—Air Traffic Control Assistants

Provision has been made for one additional Air Traffic Control Assistant for control duties at Eastleigh.

Item 1 (12)—Control Assistants

Provision has been made to include in the establishment 23 Control Assistants who are, at present, employed by the Tanganyika Government. This will regularize the position within the territories.

Item 1 (13)-Radio Operators

To comply with Electrical Safety Regulations it is necessary to have a minimum of two people on duty at transmitting stations. There will always be a technician on duty and an Assistant must be provided in case of accidents. It is proposed to recruit and train 10 Radio Operators as the most economical method of meeting this inescapable commitment. A further four Radio Operators are required to man the radio teletype circuits provided by Her Majesty's Government.

Item 2—Transport and travelling

The increase is to cover the additional cost of increases in establishment.

Item 29-Posts and Telegraphic Services

The increase in provision is to meet the cost of renting teleprinter circuits.

Item 30-Printing and Stationery

Standardization of all air traffic control self-briefing rooms, the increased use of telegraph typewriters and teleprinters, and provision of perforator tapes for morse perforator equipment accounts for the increased provision.

Extraordinary

A detailed examination of the capital equipment by the Director of Overseas Navigational Services of the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation has shown that a substantial proportion of it is obsolete and that provision will have to be made for considerable renewals if the Air Navigational Services requirements of civil aviation are to be met. Steps are being taken to prepare a comprehensive programme for implementation in the course of the next year or so, and it will be submitted for consideration by the Assembly in due course. In the meanwhile, provision has been made in the Estimates for a number of items which are certainly required during the year 1956/57. The Secretary of State has been invited to make a Colonal Development and Welfare Scheme to meet 50 per cent of the share of the cost of those items which may appropriately be met from this source and which would otherwise fall on the East African Governments.

#### (2) Accountant General

When the 1955/56 Estimates were prepared provision for salaries was made on the basis of shadow conversions, pending the regrading of posts as recommended in the Lidbury Report. The subsequent regrading of posts for this office (which includes the accounting staff of most departments) has increased the provision required since the full cost of the salaries revision was not reflected in the 1955/56 Estimates.

Provision has been made for the Accounting Assistant of the East African Leprosy Research Centre to be transferred to the staff of the Accountant General.

The additional post of Accounts Officer for pensions work was sanctioned by the Central Legislative Assembly in December, 1955.

In order to meet the growth of work, provision has been included in these Estimates for four additional posts:—

- 1 Personal Secretary, Grade II.
- 1 Machine Operator.
- 2 Clerks.

#### Item 1 (2)—Assistant Accountant General

This post was approved by the 1955/56 Estimates Committee.

#### Item 2—Transport and Travelling

The provision for the year 1955/56 has proved insufficient to allow for proper inspections and supervision of out-stations. The appointment of the Stores Verifier has also increased the amount of travelling.

#### Item 4—Staff Housing and Allowances

#### Item 5—Common Services

The increase is necessitated by increased staff and increased costs.

#### Extraordinary

Provision has been made for a duplicator, steel filing cabinets, typewriter and office shelving.

Extraordinary

The estimated total cost of the Headquarters has been itemized in accordance with the contracts and provision made for the estimated requirements for the year.

#### HEAD 28—EAST AFRICAN CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT

During the year 1955/56 the Standing Committee on Finance was asked on a number of occasions to approve additional staff to man Customs stations and alleviate bottle-necks caused through shortage of staff. The Committee was advised that detailed proposals for the efficient running of the Customs and Excise Department would be contained in these draft Estimates. The proposed increases in establishment, the duties and stations are explained below.

Item 1 (4)—Senior Collectors (B1)

Item 1 (5)—Collectors (B4—2)

The upgrading of one post of Collector to Senior Collector for the Long Room in Mombasa was approved by the Standing Committee on Finance in September, 1955. The creation of an additional post of Collector is necessitated by the new deepwater berths at Dar es Salaam which will come into operation during the next financial year.

Item 1 (8)—Accountant (Statistics) (B4—2)

An upgrading to this post was recommended by the Grading Team.

Item 1 (11)—Preventive Officers (C5-4)

Two additional officers are required for increased rummage and baggage duties at Kilindini Port. The increased scale of rummage introduced during the past year has shown practical results in the conviction of smugglers and it is desirable to intensify these preventive activities.

Item 1 (14)—Examining Officers (C5—4) and Junior Examining Officers (E1—C5)

Two additional Examing Officers are required for the lighterage sheds at Kilindini Harbour for the examination of cargo. One additional Junior Examining Officer is required for general excise duties at the three Nairobi breweries. A Junior Examining Officer is required for duties at the new wharf at Dar es Salaam.

Item 1 (15)-4 Customs Officers, Special Grade

Item 1 (16)-29 Customs Officers, Grade I

Item 1 (17)—1 Personal Secretary, Grade II

Item 1 (18)—7 Stenographers | Secretaries

Item 1 (19)—613 Customs Officers and Clerks

The revised grading is in accordance with the Grading Team's Report and the overall increase of 92 is accounted for as follows:—

Eleven posts for various duties were approved by the Standing Committee on Finance during the year 1955/56. Twenty-one additional Clerks and Key Punch Operators are required for the Accounts and Statistics Branch. The staff in the Accounts and Statistics Branch has not been increased since 1950, but the number of documents to be dealt with has increased since then by 90 per cent. The statistics published by this Department at present do not include—

- (a) trade (total imports and exports) and revenue by ports;
- (b) commodities analysed by chief countries (i.e. break-down into principal commodities of the annual trade with each country);
- (c) principal commodities imported and exported analysed by principal countries for the monthly trade report (Part I Tables I and IV); and
- (d) the statistics of parcel post imports, now estimated to be valued at £10,000,000 per annum.

Until the middle of 1955 the highest monthly total of duty entries dealt with in the Long Room at Mombasa was under 7,500 but this has now increased to between 10,000 and 11,000 duty entries per month. This increase in work, which must be regarded as permanent, has been met for the time being by the diversion of staff from other duties in the Mombasa area and by staff continually working overtime. To remedy this position there is no alternative but to engage this additional staff.

Ten additional Customs Officers and Clerks are required for the Dar es Salaam Long Room. In this Long Room the increase in the number of entries presented monthly has increased from a total of 5,000 at the end of 1954 to a current monthly total of 7,000 and to enable this work to be completed in normal working hours, the additional staff is required.

Three additional Customs Officers are required for the Kampala office and for the Customs Post at Butiaba.

Five additional Customs Officers are also required for the new wharf at Dat es Salaam. The remainder are required for miscellaneous duties such as Outdoor Bonds, the Kilindini Senior Collector's Office, Central Distribution Office—two for excise duties, one typist for the Customs Preventive Force and two for post parcels work.

Item 1 (25)—Preventive Staff

One sergeant, two corporals and 39 preventivemen are required for new sheds and breakage sheds at Kilindini, for ship control at the new berths, for Mombasa Old Port area where there is increased coastal schooner activity and for patrols in the Mbaraki jetty area where recent smuggling detections have been made.

Eight additional preventivemen are also required for the new wharf at Dar es Salaam.

Three additional preventivemen are required for duties at the Entebbe Airport owing to the expansion of traffic.

Industriansport and Travelling

The increase is largely on account of the proposed additional staff and to provide for adequate inspections of stations.

Item 4—Staff Housing and Allowances

Item 5—Common Services

The increases are accounted for by the additional staff and increased costs.

Item 6—Equipment and Supplies

The increase is to meet the increased rentals charged for Hollerith equipment and to meet the cost of rental charges for further equipment which will be required to meet the expansion.

Item 29—Posts and Telegraphs Services

The increase is to meet the charge now raised by the Posts and Telecommunications Administration for the cost of collection of duty on post parcels.

When the 1955/6 Estimates were prepared, provision was made for an estimated increase of 9 per cent, but this has already been exceeded.

Increases in staff actually accelerates the rate of increase in the number of taxpayers as it uncovers new liabilities among the existing population.

For the year 1956/7 it is anticipated that there will be a further rise of 10 per cent and provision has been made to meet the increased work by the inclusion of the following additional posts:—

- 2 Assistant Commissioners.
- 5 Assessors.
- 13 Tax Officers.
- 37 Clerks and Key Punch Operators.

#### Item 1 (10)—Clerks

#### Item 1 (12)—Clerks and Key Punch Operators

In accordance with the Grading Team Report these posts have now been amalgamated under the heading Clerks.

#### Item 4—Staff Housing and Allowances

The increase in provision is to meet the increase in establishment and the increased cost of housing.

#### Item 5—Common Services

The increase is accounted for by additional staff, passage requirements and increased cost of pensions.

#### Item 6—Equipment and Supplies

The increase in provision is for the hire of a Powers Samas tabulator as it is anticipated that the machinery, which is on order, will not be available for nearly two years.

#### Item 18-Rents

Additional office accommodation has been acquired at Mombasa, Dar es Salaam and Nairobi, a new Branch Office was opened at Nakuru in December, 1955, and, further, the rent of the existing premises in Nairobi is being increased. At the request of the Uganda Government the Kampala office will shortly be moved from the present accommodation in a Uganda Government building to rented accommodation in a commercial building.

#### Item 29-Posts and Telegraphs Services

#### Item 30-Printing and Stationery

The increase is required to meet the anticipated growth in the number of taxpayers.

#### (2) Investigation Branch

Considerable expansion of the activities of this Branch is expected in the next 18 months, particularly in Tanganyika and Uganda. In Kenya it is proposed to open a Branch Office of this Department in Mombasa, while the work in Nairobi continues to expand. It is proposed, therefore, that the establishment be increased by three Investigation Officers and for the future to designate both Investigation Officers and Tax Officers as Investigation Officers.

In the past it has been the practice to allocate the cost in the Estimates as one-half to Kenya and one-quarter each to Tanganyika and Uganda, and allocate the actual expenditure at the end of the year. Owing to the present fairly even spread of work, for the purpose of these Estimates, the cost has been allocated equally between the three Territories but, as in the past, the allocation of actual expenditure will be made at the end of the year.

#### Item 5-Common Services

The increase in provision is necessitated by additional staff, passage provision and increase in the cost of pensions.

#### Item 18-Rents

The increased cost of office accommodation in Kampala, and additional premises in Dar es Salaam and Mombasa, account for the increased provision.
