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PREFACE

Honorable Speaker,

The Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security was constituted on 14th December 2017 pursuant to provisions of Standing Orders 216(1).

The Committee executes its mandate in accordance with the provisions of Standing Order 216 (5), from which it draws its mandate to, inter alia;

- a) investigate, inquire into and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned Ministries and departments; and
- b) To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204.

2. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the following Ministries and Departments:

- i) The Ministry of Interior & Coordination of National Government
 - a) State Department of Interior
 - b) State Department of Border Control, Immigration and Registration of Persons.

Honorable Speaker,

5. Article 155(1) of the Constitution of Kenya provides that there is established the Office of the Principal Secretary, which is an office in the public service. Further, Article 155 (3) provides that the President shall nominate a person for appointment as Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission; and with approval of the National Assembly, appoint the Principal Secretaries. The duties of Principal Secretaries shall be the administration of a State department.
6. On Thursday 15th, March, 2018, Pursuant to Standing Order 42(2) of the National Assembly in your communication, you informed the House that in a message from, H. E. the President and Commander in Chief of the Kenya Defence Forces of the Republic of Kenya with respect to appointment of the persons to the various offices

of Principal Secretaries and of High Commissioners/ Ambassadors of the Republic of Kenya for approval by the House pursuant to Article 155 (3) (b) of the Constitution

Subsequently, you referred the Message from H. E. The President containing the names of the nominees together with their curriculum vitae to the relevant Departmental Committees of the House to conduct the vetting of the nominees. Further, you directed that the Committees deliberate on the nominees and table their reports on or before Wednesday, 28th March, 2018.

Mr. Alfred Cheruiyot nominee, Principal Secretary, Correctional Services was referred to the Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security;

7. The Committee held its first sitting on Tuesday 20th March, 2018 to familiarize themselves with the curriculum vitae of the nominee and to consider memoranda received thereof. On Monday 26th March, 2018 the committee held a preparatory meeting at 8.30 am before the approval hearing meeting at 9.30 during which the nominee appeared and was vetted. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee made reference to the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, and the Standing Orders. During the exercise, the nominee made submissions on why he should be appointed to the position of Principal Secretary for Correctional Services.
8. The Committee, in compliance with the Constitutional and other legal requirements and established procedures for vetting, ensured its meetings were open to the public and covered by the media. The Committee also placed a memorandum in the mainstream print media pursuant to provisions of Article 118 of the Constitution and section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 on Friday 16th March 2018 inviting the public to submit memoranda, in tandem with the law.

Honorable Speaker,

9. The Committee takes this opportunity to thank the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical support accorded to it during the vetting exercise. The Committee is also grateful to the media for their coverage of the proceedings of the Committee, thus enhancing accountability and transparency of the vetting exercise.

Honorable Speaker,

10. The Committee deliberated on the nominee biodata, curriculum vitae submissions, made by the nominee including and his oral submissions during the vetting at the sitting held on Monday 26th March, 2018.

The Committee came up with several findings during the vetting exercise. The observations, findings and conclusions guided the Committee in making its final recommendations. The recommendations of the Committee were unanimously agreed upon by the Members during the adoption of the Report on Tuesday 27th March, 2018.

On behalf of the Committee, and pursuant to Article 155(3)(b) of the Constitution, Section 8(1) and (2) of the Schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, and Standing Order no. 199(6), it is my pleasant duty to Table the Report of the Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security , on the vetting of nominee, Mr. Alfred Cheruiyot for appointment to the Office of Principal Secretary for Correctional Services.

1.0 BACKGROUND

Establishment of the Office of Principal Secretary and nomination

a) Article 155 of the Constitution provides that;

(1) There is established the office of Principal Secretary, which is an office in the public service.

(2) Each State department shall be under the administration of a Principal Secretary.

(3) The President shall—

(a) Nominate a person for appointment as Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the public service commission

(b) With the approval of the National Assembly, appoint Principal Secretaries.

Issues for consideration in conducting the Approval hearing

c) In conducting the Approval hearing, the Committee was guided by Article 73(2)(a) (b)(c) and (e) of the Constitution, and the provisions of Sections 6 (7) and 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011.

11. Article 73 (2) of the Constitution provides that:

(2) The guiding principles of leadership and integrity include— (a) selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;

(b) Objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;

(c) Selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by—

(i) Honesty in the execution of public duties; and,

(ii) The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;

(d) accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and

(e) Discipline and commitment in service to the people.

Message from H.E. the President

12. On Thursday 15th March 2018, pursuant to Standing Order 42 (2), the Speaker of the National Assembly conveyed a message to the House from H.E. the President that Mr. Alfred Cheruiyot was among the candidates nominated to serve as Principal Secretaries.

Article 155(3)(a)(b) of the Constitution confers upon the President the power to nominate, and subject to approval by the National Assembly, appoint Principal Secretaries.

13. After conveying the message from H. E. the President on the nomination, the Speaker of the National Assembly forwarded the name of the nominee and his curriculum vitae to the Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security to conduct Approval hearings.

Clearance Requirements

14. On Friday 16th March, 2018 the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote a letter to

- 1) the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission
- 2) the Directorate of Criminal Investigations
- 3) the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA)
- 4) the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB)
- 5) the Office of the Registrar Political Parties

Seeking information on the nominee with respect to matters relating to integrity, status of a pending criminal record, tax compliance, an unpaid loan and whether they are officials of a registered political party.

Notification to the Nominee

15. On Friday 16th March, 2018, the Clerk of the National Assembly, pursuant to Section 6(3) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, notified the nominee in writing that the approval hearing was scheduled to take place on Monday 26th March 2018, in Committee room 2nd Floor, Continental House Parliament Buildings, at 9.30 am.

16. Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, provides that “any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated”.

17. On Friday 16th March, 2018, the Office of the Clerk published an advertisement via print media inviting the public to present submission and memoranda touching on suitability of the nomination of Mr. Alfred Cheruiyot as Principal Secretary for Correctional Services, Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government, by Friday 23rd March 2018 at 5.00 pm, no memoranda were received. Further, the advert notified the public that the Departmental Committee of Administration and National Security would conduct an Approval hearing, pursuant to Article 118 (1)(a)(b) and (2) of the Constitution, Standing Order 198 (1) and Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

Committee Meetings

18. The Committee carried out the vetting exercise on Monday 26th March, 2018. The committee held two preparatory meeting to familiarize themselves with the curriculum vitae of the nominee, formulate questions for the approval pursuant to the provisions of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No.33 2011.

Clearance Letters

20. Further, the Committee received letters from the Kenya Revenue Authority, indicating that the nominee was tax compliant, and the Higher Education Loans Board, stating that the Board was not owed any loans by the nominee

The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission and the Directorate of Criminal Investigation confirmed that there were no outstanding issues or ongoing investigations against the nominee. The Office of the Registrar of Political Parties confirmed that the nominee was not an official of a registered political party. The nominee also presented before the Committee his Certificates of Good Conduct.

The Vetting Process

20. On Monday 26th March, 2018 the Committee held a session with the Principal Secretary nominee. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by, among other documents, the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011 and the National Assembly Standing Orders.

2.0. VETTING OF MR. ALFRED CHERUIYOY - PRINCIPAL SECRETARY NOMINEE, CORRECTONAL SERVICES

21. The Committee examined the nominee using the guidelines provided for in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011. The Committee also followed the following criteria in vetting the nominee: -

- i) Academic qualifications
- ii) Employment record and work experience
- iii) Professional Experience
- iv) Integrity
- v) Potential Conflict of Interest
- vi) Suitability for the position

22. Mr. Alfred Cheruiyot appeared before the Committee on 26th March, 2018, the Committee having heard his submissions during the meeting, made the following observations on his nomination to the position of Principal Secretary, Correctional Services, Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government.

Personal Background

He was born in Kericho County, Married and blessed with three children.

Academic Background

23. Masters in Business Administration (Strategic Management), Moi University 2005-2006, Bachelor of Science, Kenyatta University, 1988 – 1991. Diploma in regulatory and privatization in telecommunications, USTTI, USA 1998 – 1999

Attended Extensive training in Information Communication Technologies (ICT)

Professional Experience

24. Executive Director, Cerberus Solutions Limited an Information Technology Consulting firm focusing on enabling organizations in Africa to adopt ICT solutions. Cerberus is a Certified SAS Partner and an Oracle Certified Gold Partner formed by group of consultants who have over 10 years of experience in Oracle & SAS solutions. Our solutions and services cut across various industries such as Finance, Insurance, Telco, Health, Retail, Education, Airline, Media, and Energy with in-depth industry knowledge. Cerberus brings a winning edge to our customers at lower Total Cost of Ownership.

Senior ICT Manager, Communications Authority of Kenya (CA) formerly CCK from 2005 to 2007

Key Achievements:

- a) Registered CCK domain Name Service (DNS) – cck.go.ke
- b) Created a website for the then Communications Commission of Kenya (CCK).
- c) Designed and implemented a software system for billing frequency users.
- d) Installing a Finance and HR management system.
- e) Installing a Library System.

My main duties and as the Head of Information Technology include:

- a) Leadership - Heading the team, this formulated the regulatory policies aimed at promoting the development of ICT in the country.
- b) Licensing - Member of the telecommunications licensing committee which comprised members of the Commission and those from Security and Intelligent agencies and whose role was to analyze impact of the various license on the country's economy and security.
- c) Responsible for the development and promotion of ICT projects in the country through Private Public Partnership (PPP). Among the projects accomplished through PPP was the setup of the Kenya Network Information Center (KENIC), Kenya Education Network (KENET). Establishment of 16 school-based ICT Centers spanning the eight provinces of the country, four Tele-centers and eight centers for persons with disabilities.
- d) Responsible for the collation, management and production of licensed operator's data on a continuous basis for the purposes of monitoring their performance and enforcement of license conditions to ensure that they discharge the obligations as stipulated in their respective licenses.
- e) Strategic Management - development of IT strategic plan and implementation for the Commission

Integrity

25. The nominee informed the Committee that he had never been mentioned adversely in any report by a parliamentary committee or an independent Commission. He also confirmed that he had no previous conviction or an ongoing case in court.

The nominee further confirmed that he had clearance from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Criminal Investigation Department, the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB and the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties.

Potential Conflict of Interest

26. The nominee stated that, he would relinquish his position as an Executive Directive Cerberus Solutions Limited once his appointment is confirmed in order to avoid any conflict of interest

On the suitability of the nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, Correctional Services

27. He is currently the Executive Director of Cerberus Solutions Limited an Information Technology Consulting firm focusing on enabling organizations in Africa to adopt ICT solutions and he has vast experience on information Communication Technology which he will use to digitalize the systems in the State Department of Correctional Services.

The nominee informed the committee that, if given the chance to serve as Principal Secretary State Department of Correctional Services he will digitalize all the systems in the department to address the authenticity of pending bills, show the true records of inmates and eliminate the double entry of bills brought by the manual record keeping system.

With regard to decongestion in the prisons

28. The nominee informed the committee that, he will consult the Office of the Director of Public Prosecution and the Judiciary on the other ways of correcting offenders instead of holding them in prisons to ease congestion.

Further he will take up the matter on congestion in the Prisons with the National Treasury through Parliament to appropriate more funds for the construction of Prison facilities and come up with a policy on Public Private Partnership to supplement the government effort to provide adequate and affordable housing.

On the Big Four Agenda

29. Mr. Cheruiyot informed the committee that on food security, he will make use of the unutilized Prison land to undertake farming to provide food for the Department and the surplus to supplement the government effort in the provision of adequate food.

On manufacturing the department will purchase machineries and equipment to revive the collapsed industries.

On housing the nominee informed the committee that, the department will utilize the free labour from inmates to build affordable houses in the achievement of the big four agenda.

On cyber bullying and extortion in the prisons

30. The nominee informed the Committee that; he will deploy technique to intercept and corrupt any call emanating from the inmates.

On marketing the products made by the Prisons

31. The nominee informed the Committee that; he will ensure that all the products from the prisons are available in the market i.e. supermarket and shopping malls.

On correcting the inmates

32. The nominee informed the Committee that he will train and undertake enormous capacity building on staff to equip them with proper rehabilitation skills to correct the inmates.

3.0 COMMITTEE FINDINGS

Having considered the curriculum vitae of the nominee and oral submissions during the vetting exercise, the Committee in its sitting held on Monday 26th March, 2018 made the following observations; That: -

- (1) The nominee complied and submitted all the clearance certificate and letters from all the relevant institutions as required.
- (2) No affidavit was received from the public against him.
- (3) In accordance with Article 78(1) (2) of the Constitution , the nominee is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship hence meets the requirement to hold the office of Principal Secretary
- (4) The nominee satisfies the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity. He had been issued with compliance and clearance letter from all the relevant institution such as the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission and the Registrar of Political parties (RPP).
- (5) In accordance with the provisions of Article 75(1) of the Constitution, the nominee has no potential conflict of interest and has made pledge to avoid any situation that will compromise his position as a Principal Secretary.

- (6) The Nominee has not been charged in a court of law nor convicted, neither was he adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of a Parliamentary Committee or Commission.
- (7) The nominee depicted a wide scope of management skills that makes him suitable to serve as a principal in different state department including state department of correctional services.
- (8) The nominee will use his information communication skills (ICT) to address cyberbullying which emanates from the inmates.
- (9) The nominee is flexible and willing to learn.

4.0 RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMITTEE

Having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee, and pursuant to Article 155(3)(a) of the Constitution and Section 8 (2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, the Committee therefore recommends that this House approves the nomination and subsequent appointment of Mr. Alfred Cheruiyot to serve as Principal Secretary for Correctional Services, Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government.

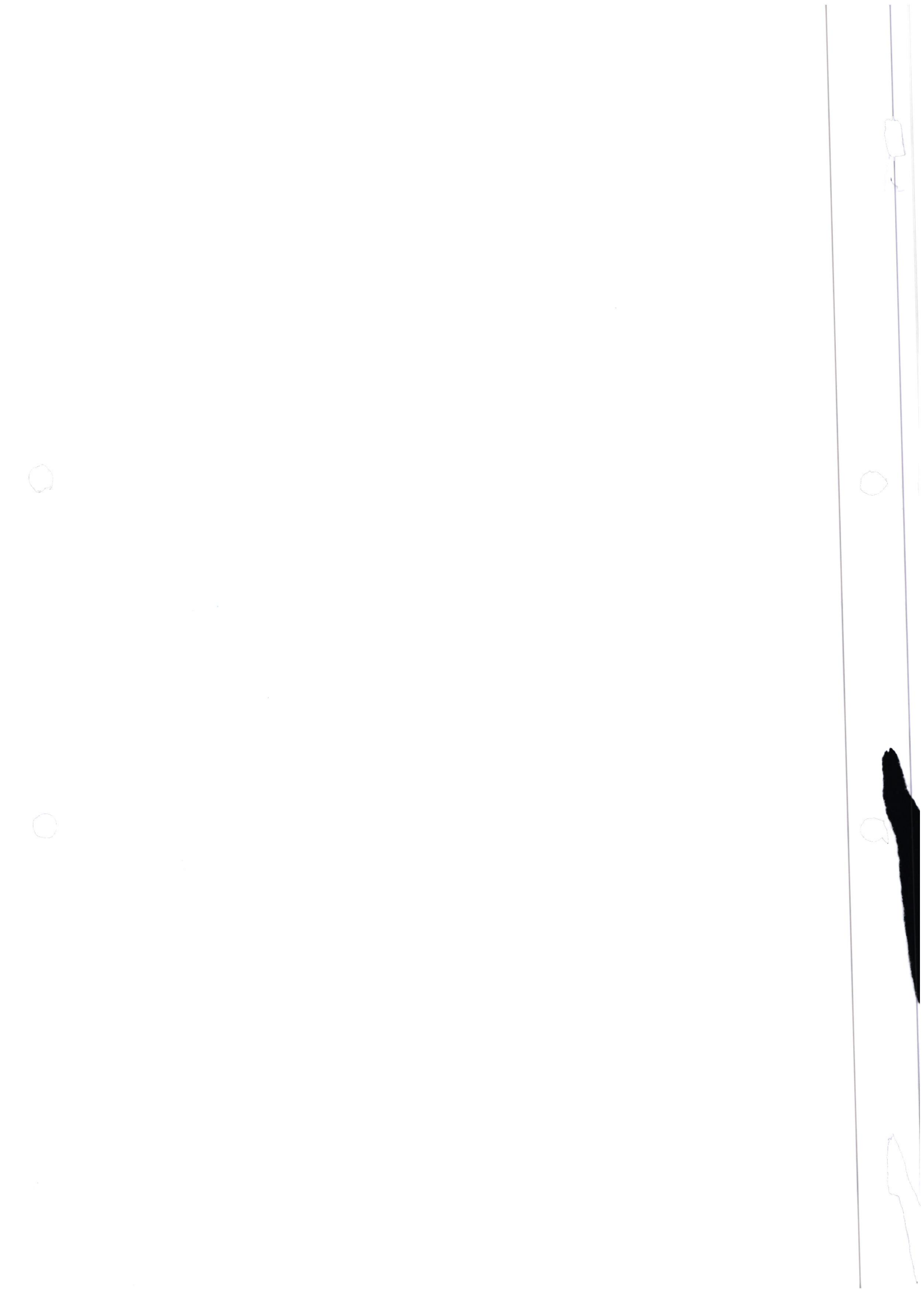



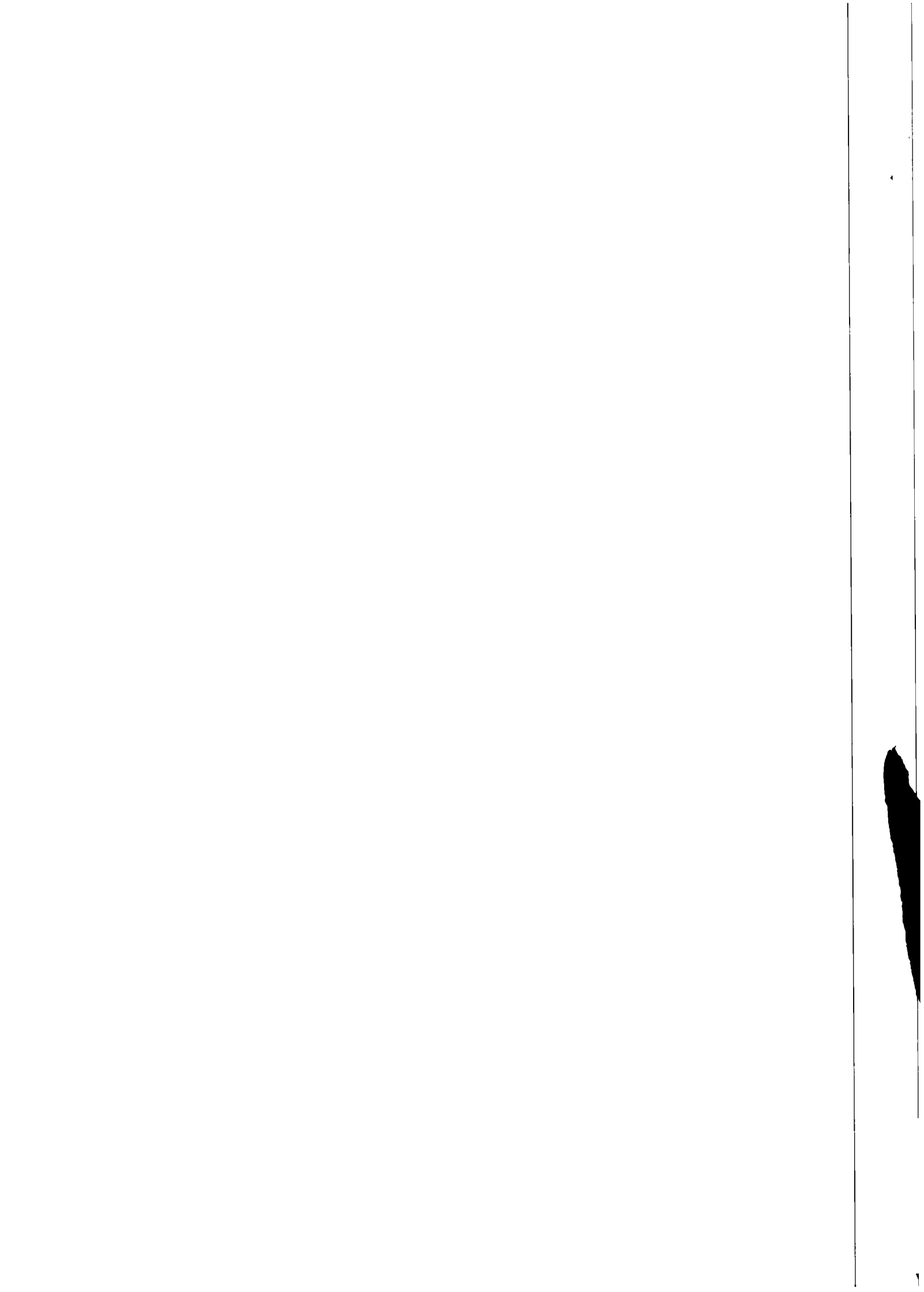

Mr. Alfred Kipkorir Cheruiyot appeared before the Committee and informed the Committee as follows:- That:-

- a) He was born in 1965 in Kericho County;
- b) He holds a Masters in Business Administration (Strategic Management) from Moi University which he attained in 2006; Bachelor of Science, Kenyatta University, 1988 – 1991. Diploma in regulatory and privatization in telecommunications, USTTI, USA 1998 – 1999;
- c) Attended Extensive training in Information Communication Technologies (ICT);
- d) He is currently the Executive Director of Cerberus Solutions Limited an Information Technology Consulting firm focusing on enabling organizations in Africa to adopt ICT solutions and he has vast experience on information Communication Technology which he will use to digitalize the systems in the State Department of Correctional Services;
- e) He would relinquish his position as an Executive Directive Cerberus Solutions Limited once his appointment is confirmed in order to avoid any conflict of interest;
- f) If given the chance to serve as Principal Secretary State Department of Correctional Services he will digitalize all the systems in the department to address the authenticity of pending bills, show the true records of inmates and eliminate the double entry brought by the manual record keeping system;
- g) He will consult the Office of the Director of Public Prosecution and the Judiciary on the other ways of correcting offenders instead of holding them in prisons to ease congestion;
- h) Further he will take up the matter on congestion in the Prisons with the National Treasury through Parliament to appropriate more funds for the construction of Prison facilities and come up with a policy on Public Private Partnership to supplement the government effort to provide adequate and affordable housing;
- i) On food security, he will make use of the unutilized Prison land to undertake farming to provide food for the Department and the surplus to supplement the government effort on the provision of adequate food;

- j) On manufacturing the department, he will purchase machineries and equipment to revive the collapsed industries.
- k) On housing, the department will utilize the free labour from inmates to build affordable houses in the achievement of the big four agenda.
- l) He will deploy techniques to detect and intercept any call emanating from the inmates.
- m) He will ensure that all the products from the prisons are available in the market i.e. supermarket and shopping malls.
- n) He will train and undertake enormous capacity building on staff to equip them with proper rehabilitation skills to correct the inmates.

Committee Observations

The Committee observed as follows; That:-

- (1) The nominee complied and submitted all the clearance certificate and letters from all the relevant institutions as required.
- (2) No affidavit was received from the public against him.
- (3) In accordance with Article 78(1) (2) of the Constitution , the nominee is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship hence meets the requirement to hold the office of Principal Secretary
- (4) The nominee satisfies the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity. He had been issued with compliance and clearance letter from all the relevant institution such as the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission and the Registrar of Political parties (RPP).
- (5) In accordance with the provisions of Article 75(1) of the Constitution, the nominee has no potential conflict of interest and has made pledge to avoid any situation that will compromise his position as a Principal Secretary.
- (6) The Nominee has not been charged in a court of law nor convicted, neither was he adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of a Parliamentary Committee or Commission.
- (7) The nominee depicted a wide scope of management skills that makes him suitable to serve as a principal in different state department including state department of correctional services.

- (8) The nominee will use his information communication skills (ICT) to address cyberbullying which emanates from the inmates.
- (9) The nominee is flexible and willing to learn.
