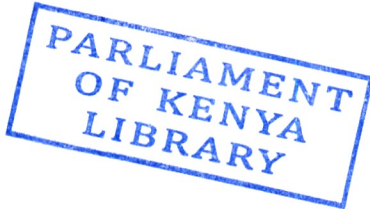

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Select Committee on Implementation was constituted on 16th May 2013 and draws its mandate from Standing Order no. 209. The committee is mandated to scrutinize the resolutions of the House including adopted committee reports, petitions and the undertakings given by the executive on the floor of the House and to examine:

- a) Whether or not such decisions and undertakings have been implemented and where implemented; the extent to which they have been implemented and whether such implementation has taken place within minimum time necessary; and
- b) Whether or not legislation passed by the House has been operationalized and where operationalized the extent to which such operationalization has taken place within the minimum time necessary.

This mandate is further enhanced by the provision of Article 153(4) (b) of the constitution which requires that Cabinet Secretaries provide Parliament with full and regular reports concerning matters under their control.

The operations of the Committee are further guided by the provision of Standing Order 201 which sets the time frame within which the relevant Cabinet Secretaries must provide reports to the House upon adoption of resolutions of the House:

“Within sixty days of a resolution of the House or adoption of report of a select Committee ,the relevant Cabinet Secretary under whose portfolio the implementation of the resolution falls, shall provide a report in accordance with article 153(4)(b) of the Constitution.”

Mr. Speaker sir, the Ministry of Energy is yet to submit its report to this Committee on the implementation status of the following resolutions:

- a. Compensation of people who have been affected by Kenya Electricity Generation Company (KENGEN) and Tana and Athi River Development Authority (TARDA)
- b. Liberalization of power distribution.

The Committee has raised concern with the Ministry's failure and expressed its displeasure with the Ministry in accordance with the National Assembly Powers and

Privileges Act (cap 6) Section 14 and awaits responses, failure to which the Committee will recommend to the House sanctions as provided for in Standing Order 209(3).



3.0. STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION OF HOUSE RESOLUTIONS BY MINISTRIES

1. Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government

i. Resolution on review of terms and conditions for recruitment, remuneration and deployment of KPR in arid and semi-arid areas.

The Committee notes that the concerns of the resolution have been addressed through the enactment of the National Police Service (Amendment) Act 2014. The Committee will however visit a sample of ASAL counties to verify actual implementation on the ground.

ii. Resolution of the House on establishment of the National Unified Identification System.

The Committee notes that towards this end the Ministry is implementing an Integrated Population Registration System (IPRS) whose key components include the creation of an electronic national register and the generation and assigning of the Fourteen-digit Unique Identifier based on peculiar circumstances of each individual. The System has already been launched and the Committee will make periodic inquires on its implementation.

iii. Resolution on Establishment of Disaster Management Authority

The Committee notes that a draft policy and a Cabinet Memorandum have been developed towards the establishment of the National Disaster Management Authority (NADIMA) but delay has been occasioned by the proposal to merge the policy with that on National Drought Management (NDMA). The Committee has written to the Ministry to avail the current status.

2. Ministry of Devolution and Planning.

Resolution of the House on release of Funds to the National Youth Council

The Committee notes that Kshs.34.2 million has been released to the council both in 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 financial years. While noting that this amount is not adequate to fully operationalize the Council, the Committee has advised the Ministry to pursue additional allocation from the Treasury.

3. Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Trade

Resolution of the House on Economic Partnership Agreement

The Committee noted that efforts towards ratification of the agreement has been ongoing but further noted contentious issues raised in the resolution have not been conclusively exhausted. These issues include clauses on The Most Favored Nation and the Implication of delay in ratifying the agreement given that Kenyan goods have been attracting higher import taxes. The Committee has scheduled a meeting with the Cabinet Secretary to seek clarification on the status of the resolution especially the two outstanding issues cited above.

4. Ministry of Education, Science and Technology

i) Resolution on establishment of Girls' Boarding Schools for both Primary and Secondary Schools in ASAL areas.

The Committee noted that eight boarding primary schools were established in these areas in 2013/2014. Further three Secondary schools namely; North Eastern Girls, Isiolo Girls and Moi Girls Marsabit each received Kshs.25 million for infrastructure upgrading. Each girl boarding in the ASAL areas also benefited with Ksh.190, 476 to mitigate the effects of drought during the 2013/2014 financial year.

The Committee however noted that the coverage is inadequate and the funding levels low. Consequently the Committee has scheduled a meeting with the Cabinet Secretary to seek clarification on how the program can be expanded to cover more ASAL areas thereby targeting more pupils.

ii) The resolution of the House on establishment of a Public Data Bank of all bright and needy students

The Committee notes that the Ministry has not established a data bank on bright and needy students. Its main source of data on pupils is the KCPE and KCSE performance index, which the Committee found inadequate as it does not give an indication of financial need. The Committee further noted that in the absence of such a data bank, Scholarship schemes targeting such pupils may be awarded to undeserving cases.

The Committee has scheduled a meeting with the Cabinet Secretary to address the gap.

iii) Resolution of the House on Financing of Training in Applied Sciences in Village Polytechnics and Institutes of Technology.

The Committee notes that the Ministry is supporting vocational skills training through Youth Polytechnics by providing Subsidized Youth Polytechnics Tuition Fund (SYPTF). However the Committee found the information provided on specific

locations of project being undertaken and the actual levels of funding inadequate and has scheduled a meeting with the Cabinet Secretary to seek clarification.

5 The National Treasury

i) Resolution of the House on Measures to Curb Irregular Payments

The Committee notes a number of measures put in place by the Treasury to curb wastage in public expenditure such as the enactment of Public Procurement and Disposal Act 2005, Public Officer Ethics Act, Public Finance Management Act and the introduction of Integrated Financial Management Systems (IFMIS). The Committee however noted that measures touching on wastage in public expenditure were not included in the Treasury Report to the Committee especially the Report on Judicial Commission of Inquiry on the Goldenberg saga and the status of Anglo leasing cases.

The Committee is currently following up with the Treasury on the status of implementation of these reports.

ii) Resolution on Foreign Travel on State and Public Officers.

The Committee notes that Treasury issued a circular on 17th December 2013 providing guidelines to be used by Ministries in reducing wastage on foreign travel. The circular gave directives on the size of delegations and class of air travel by various cadres of State and Public officers, among others. The Committee found the response inadequate and has written to Treasury to provide status of compliance from a sample of two Ministries and two state corporations.

6. Ministry of Health

i) Resolution on Emergency Medical Care to Victims of Accidents and those in Emergency Medical Conditions. The Committee notes that the Ministry proposes to address the concerns of the resolutions thought the proposed Health Bill 2014. The Committee further notes that the Ministry has developed the emergency medical services policy to be finalized in the first quarter of 2015. The Committee awaits the tabling of the proposed Bill before the House.

ii) Resolution on the reduction of NHIF penalty surcharged for late payments from the current 500% to 25%

The Committee notes that NHIF has effected reduction of the surcharge to 25% administratively hence the need for amendment to the NHIF Act to regularize the change. The Committee further notes that the reduction has already been effected

administratively. The Committee is following up with the Cabinet Secretary on the status of the proposed amendments.

i) **The Resolution on Expansion of Cash Transfer System and Provision of NHIF cover to all elderly persons currently persons receiving cash transfer.**

The Committee notes that Kshs.290.6 million was approved for release to NHIF for this program as at March 2014.

The Committee is currently undertaking inspection visits to select counties such as Narok, Tharaka Nithi, Isiolo, Laikipia, Tana River, and Kilifi to appraise itself on the implementation status of the resolution at the grass root level. A report on the above visits will be tabled in due course.

ii) **Upgrading of at least One Hospital in each County**

The Committee notes that the Ministry carried out a needs analysis and identified one level 4 and one level 5 hospitals for upgrading in each County. The Ministry further started the process of providing key equipment to the identified hospitals. The Committee further notes that with the devolution of the health services to counties the Ministry plays only policy level roles while actual implementation remains with the Counties.

The Committee is currently visiting a few select counties during the first quarter of this year to establish the actual implementation status of this resolution and a report on the said inspection visit will be tabled on the floor of the House once the exercise is concluded.

iii) **Resolution on Recruitment and Deployment of Medical staff**

Committee notes that the Ministry carried out a human resource audit on county staff needs. The Committee further notes that when the reemployment and deployment function was fully devolved, the funds were transferred to counties to carry out the recruitment.

The Committee is currently visiting select counties to verify the situation on the ground and a report will be tabled on the floor of the House once the exercise is concluded.

7. Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure

i) The resolution on Tarmacking of 20 kilometres of Roads in every Constituency

The Committee notes that the Ministry provided a plan of tarmacking 10,000 km of roads across the country by 2017. The Committee has written to the Cabinet Secretary to provide actual roads done so far and the benefiting constituencies as per the plan provided. The Committee is following up on the response.

8. Ministry of Environment Water and Natural resources

i) Resolution on Friendly Waste Disposal and Recycling.

The Committee notes that the Ministry developed a Ten- Point plan to be used by counties in setting up dumpsites and developing recycling plants in order to manage waste more effectively. The Committee made inspection visits to Kiambu, Nairobi, Mombasa, Kisumu and Nakuru counties to appraise itself with the actual implementation on the ground.

The Committee found that the waste management regime in the country is haphazardly managed without the financial intervention by the Government especially in recycling. Consequently, the Committee made study tours to Japan and Austria to learn how developed countries have turned waste into money through recycling. The Committee has shared the findings of this visit with the Ministry of the Environment and awaits a report on the recommendation contained therein from the Cabinet secretary prior to holding a stakeholder forum to chart the way forward.

ii) Resolution of the House on Enhancement of claims for persons killed and crops destroyed by wild animals

The Committee notes that the enactment of Wildlife Conservation and Management Act 2013, has addressed the concerns of the resolution. The Committee further notes that the Act provides a generous compensation scheme much higher than the amount sought by the resolution of the House. The Committee further notes that the Act sets compensation for persons killed by wildlife at Five Million Shillings against the proposed one million. The Committee will seek periodic reports from the relevant agencies to verify compliance.

iii) Resolution on Measures taken to Curb Poaching

Committee notes that the concerns of the resolution have been adequately addressed through the enactment of the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act,

2013. The Committee will seek periodic reports on compliance from the relevant agencies.

9. Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries

i) Resolution setting up a Fertilizer Board

The committee notes that the House passed the Fertilizer and Animal Food Stuffs Bill on 18th June 2014 which provides for the setting up of a Fertilizer Board. The Bill is currently before the Senate.

ii) Review of Farm Gate Prices of Milk to Ksh.45 per litre

The Committee notes that the Ministry commissioned a study to help set profitable prices of milk but the outcome has not been communicated to it yet. The Committee has now scheduled a meeting with the Cabinet Secretary to seek the current status on the resolution.

iii) Resolution of the House on Establishment of a Livestock Insurance Fund.

The Committee notes that the Department of Livestock already operates the Livestock Restocking and Enterprise Development Fund, established through legal notice no.58 of 28th May 2009. The State Department of Livestock is currently pursuing the option of expanding the Fund to include livestock insurance.

A Program on livestock insurance has been rolled out in the counties of Wajir and Turkana during the current financial year. The Committee has written to the Ministry to seek information on how farmers can access the funding and the plans of rolling out the same in other counties.

iv) Resolution on the Establishment of grant for Fishermen

The Committee notes that the concerns of the resolution have been factored into the Fisheries Management and Development Bill, 2014, currently before the House.

10. Ministry of Sports Culture and the Arts

The Committee considered the Report and noted that:

There are four categories of athletes who participate in international championships as follows:

- (i) Those selected by the Ministry or their respective associations to represent the Country in international championships

- (ii) Those with special invitations by organizers of events and are recommended by the government or their federations
- (iii) Those who make their own arrangements and leave the country to participate in events organized in different parts of the globe and
- (iv) Those in the Diaspora

The Committee further noted that the Ministry has established a register for tracking and accounting for the first two categories of athletes who are normally entered and accompanied by Federations and Ministry officials. The Ministry has further requested the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and international trade to establish a register for tracking and accounting for athletes who leave the country to participate in international events.

The Committee will seek periodic reports from the Ministry on full implementation of the resolutions of the House.

4.0 PENDING REPORTS FROM CABINET SECRETARY

Two reports are pending from the Cabinet Secretary for Energy and Petroleum as follows:

- (i) Report on the status of implementation of the resolution of the House compensation of people who have been affected by KENGEN and TARDA as a result of artificial flooding of Riven Tana.
- (ii) Report on the status of implementation of the resolution of the House on liberalization of power distribution.

The Committee has notified the Ministry to provide pending status on reports pursuant to the provisions of National Assembly Powers and Privileges Act (Cap 6) section 14 which states that:

- i. The Assembly or any standing Committee thereof may, subject to the provisions of sections 18 and 20, orders any person to attend before it and to give evidence or to produce any paper, book, record or document in the possession or under the control of that person.
- ii. The powers conferred by Section (i) on a standing Committee may be exercised by any other Committee which is specially authorized by a resolution of the Assembly to exercise those powers in respect of any matter or question specified in the resolution.

5.0 RESOLUTIONS AWAITING CONSIDERATION

During the second quarter of 2015, the Committee will endeavor to follow up on the implementation status of the resolutions aforementioned along with the following resolutions:

- Resolution on measures to ensure all eligible Kenyans are duly registered and issued with national identity cards.
- Resolution that the Government upgrades Kitale Technical Training Institute to a full University and further rename the institution to, Wamalwa Kijana University of Science and Technology.
- Resolution of the House on development of a policy on Boda Boda.
- Resolution on measures by the Government to liberalize air fares including awarding of licenses to operators.
- Resolution of the House urging the Government to acquire land for the expansion of Jogoo and Landhies Roads, creation of CBD parking and building of an overpass

6.0 REPORTS PENDING BEFORE THE COMMITTEE

The Committee will follow up on the implementation of the following Reports adopted by the House:

- Report on San Marco Space Application Centre.
- Report by the Departmental Committee on Health on Devolution of Health services.
- Report by the Departmental Committee on Transport on consideration of Bilateral Air Services between the Government of Kenya and the Governments of Angola, Mozambique, Canada and Kuwait.
- PIC Special Report on the Procurement and Financing of Construction of the Standard Gauge Railway (Phase 1).
- Report of the Select Committee on production and Trading in khat.
- Report of the Departmental Committee on National Security on the matter of inquiry into the proposed National Surveillance System for the Police Service.
- Report by the Departmental Committee on Regional Integration on the Protocol for the establishment of the EAC monetary Union.
 - 17th and 18th Report of Public Investment Committee.

7.0 CHALLENGES

In the execution of its mandate, the Committee experienced challenges especially where Cabinet Secretaries failed to report within stipulated time frames. In addition there were instances where Cabinet Secretaries did not honour invitations from the Committee, citing other commitments. This has hampered the Committee's effectiveness in following up on the implementation status of House resolutions

8.0 WAY FORWARD

In July 2014, the Committee in conjunction with the Office of the Deputy President organized a successful forum where Members interacted and shared ideas with Principal Secretaries on effective responses to Parliamentary Business. The Committee will continue to build on such positive initiatives to enhance speedy implementation of House resolutions.
