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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

The Petition by Petition by Mr. Edward Kamande regarding settlement of over 25,000 shareholders of Mutukanio Gwataniro Company land in Nakuru and Laikipia was presented to the House through the Speaker on behalf of Mr. Edward Kamande on 20th June 2019.

In considering the Petition, the Committee held a meeting with the Mr. Peter Kairanga on 18th July 2019 The Committee is thankful to the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during its sittings. The Committee is also thankful to the Petitioner, for the submissions he made to the Committee.

On behalf of the Committee, and pursuant to Standing Order, 227 it is my pleasant duty to table the Report of the Departmental Committee on Lands on its consideration of the Petition by Mr. Edward Kamande (Peter Kairang'a) regarding settlement of over 25,000 shareholders of the Mutukanio Gwataniro company land in Nakuru and Laikipia.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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The purpose of this report is to respond to prayers in a Petition by Mr. Edward Kamande regarding settlement of over 25,000 shareholders of Mutukanio Gwataniro Company land in Nakuru and Laikipia. The Petitioner prayers are that the National Assembly through the Departmental Committee on Lands does;

- i. Investigates the affairs of Mutukanio Gwataniro Company with view to attaining the recovery of the irregularly allocated plots of lands and other lost properties;
- Urges the Ministry of Lands and Physical Planning or the National Land Commission to conduct a fresh survey of Mutukanio Gwataniro land to ensure that all shareholders acquire ballots that corresponds to actual land; and
- iii. Makes any other order or direction that it deems fit in the circumstances of the petition.

The Committee observed that the Peter Kairang'a Nyagah submitted a copy of his national identification card No. 0150340 that indicated his name as being Peter Kairang'a Nyagah. The same national identification card number was indicated in the petition but under the name Edward Kamande (Peter Kairang'a). The identity of the actual petitioner is therefore suspicious. The Committee was also not able to determine whether the said Edward Kamande existed or if he was fictitious.

Further none of the documents submitted by Peter Kairang'a to the Committee including share certificates and receipts to demonstrate he was a shareholder in Mutukanio Gwataniro Company had his name as he alleged. The committee noted that a copy of a share certificate No. 4247 dated 11th September 1981 purportedly issued in the name of Peter Kairanga was altered through a visible insertion of letter "i" between letters a and r in the name Peter Karanga.

The Committee also observed that although the petitioner indicated in the petition that the Mutukanio Gwataniro Company had over 50,0000 shareholders , none of the said shareholders signed the petition despite the fact that the petitioner alleges that over 25,000 shareholders were issued with ballots but had not been allocated any land by the company

Section 3(n) of the Petition to Parliament (Procedure Act)2012 and Standing Order 223 (m) of the National Assembly Standing Orders provides that a petition shall be signed by the petitioner, or if the petitioner is unable to sign by a witness in whose presence the petitioner shall make his or mark on the petition.

In response to the prayers by the Petitioner, the Committee recommends that pursuant to Standing Order 223 (m) the committee was not able to identify the petitioner, who signed

the petition under the name Edward Kamande and resolved not proceed with the consideration of the petition.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 7. The Petition by Mr. Edward Kamande (Peter Kairang'a) regarding settlement of over 25,000 shareholders of Mutukanio Gwataniro Company land in Nakuru and Laikipia was presented to the House by the Speaker on behalf of Mr. Edward Kamande.
- 8. The Petitioner wished to draw the attention of the House to the following, that:
 - i. The petitioner, Mr. Edward Kamande is a Kenya citizen and a shareholder of the Mutukanio Gwataniro Company in which his family owns eight shares;
 - ii. The Mutukanio Gwataniro Company was registered in the 1960s and its main objective at registration was to collect money from its shareholders, who currently number over 50,0000 shareholders, and invest the same in buying land for them to settle in;
 - iii. Currently, the company owns a total of 82,000 acres of land in Nakuru and Laikipia, as well as the Amigos house, Oyster Shell Building in Nakuru town, farmhouses in Bahati, various building in Laikipia and Rumuruti, andthree plots in Nakuru town among other proprieties;
 - iv. In 1983, balloting of land was undertaken in a bid to ensure that each shareholder got a piece of the Mutukanio Gwataniro land, but this initiative ended being a flawed process since the majority of the shareholders got ballots with no land, there were instances of double allocation of land, and in areas such as Ngarua balloting was done on un surveyed land;
 - v. Some of the company properties including Amigo House, Oyster Shell and other properties were grabbed or illegally sold without the consent of the shareholders under the watch of the company directors and provincial administration and as a result the petitioner's rightfully owned land is currently occupied by a shareholder by the name Malan Ngarua;
 - vi. Many plots in Bahati farms were left unnumbered after balloting was done and plots given out;
 - vii. Plots in Ndungiri in Solai were never placed in the ballot box but were nevertheless issued out;
 - viii. Efforts by the petitioner and other stakeholders to resolve the issue by way of complaints to the then provincial administration, lands offices in, Nairobi,

Nakuru and Laikipia, the Attorney General and the National land Commission have not been responded to by the said offices;

- ix. The issues in respect of which the petition is made are not pending before any court, or constitutional or legal body
- 9. Therefore, the petitioners pray that the National Assembly through the Departmental Committee on Lands;
 - i. Investigates the affairs of Mutukanio Gwataniro Company with view to attaining the recovery of the irregularly allocated plots of lands and other lost properties;
 - ii. Urges the Ministry of Lands and Physical Planning or the National Land Commission to conduct a fresh survey of Mutukanio Gwataniro land so as to ensure that all shareholders acquire ballots that corresponds to actual land; and
 - iii. Makes any other order or direction that it deems fit in the circumstances of the petition.

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3.0SUBMISSIONS

Submissions by Mr. Peter Kairang'a

- 10. The Committee held a meeting with the Mr. Peter Kairanga on 18th July 2019. During the meeting Mr. Peter Kairang'a, indicated that he was the Petitioner who presented the Petition to the National Assembly. The Committee noted that the petition was signed by one Edward Kamande (Peter Kairang'a) who indicated in paragraph one of the petition that his name was Edward Kamande, who is a Kenyan citizen and a shareholder in Mutukanio Gwataniro Company in which his family owns eight shares.
- 11. The Committee further noted that the petition is signed by Mr. Edward Kamande (Peter Kairanga) of PO Box 7183 -2011 Nakuru and the petitioner's national identification card number was indicated as 0150340. The petitioner had also written to the Clerk of the National Assembly vide a letter dated 25th March 2019 and signed the letter under the name Edward Kamande.
- 12. Upon inquiry regarding the identity of Mr. Edward Kamande, Mr. Peter Kairang'a could not expound on the identity of said Mr. Edward Kamande.
- 13. The Committee put Mr. Peter Kairang'a under oath and upon the oath being administered, he stated that Mr. Edward Kamande was a fictitious name that he created to register and acquire shares in Mutukanio Gwataniro Company.
- 14. Mr. Peter Kairang'a also submitted copies of documents to the Committee including share certificates and receipts to demonstrate that he was a shareholder in the Mutukanio Gwataniro Company. The said documents had the following names: Edward Kamande (Certificate No. 4249 dated 11th September 1981, receipts dated 11th September 1981), Wambui Nyaga (Share certificate No. 9780 dated 14th July 1984 and a receipt dated 21st July 1989), Isaac Nyaga (receipts dated 11th, September 1981), M. Nyaga Kairanga (a receipt dated 11th, September 1981), Stephen Kuhora Nyaga (a receipt dated 27th, September 1991), Nyaga Kuhora (receipt dated 27th, September 1991), Peter Kairanga (a share certificate No. 4247 dated 11th September 1981).

4.0 OBSERVATIONS

The Committee made the following observations:

- 1. The Petitioner submitted a copy of his national identification card No. 0150340 that indicated his name as being Peter Kairang'a Nyagah. The same national identification card number was indicated in the Petition but under the name Edward Kamande (Peter Kairang'a). The identity of the actual petitioner is therefore suspicious. The Committee was also not able to determine whether the said Edward Kamande existed or if he was fictitious.
- 2. None of the documents submitted by Peter Kairang'a to the Committee including share certificates and receipts to demonstrate that he was a shareholder in the Mutukanio Gwataniro Company had his name as he alleged. The committee noted that a copy of a share certificate No. 4247 dated 11th September 1981 purportedly issued in the name of Peter Kairanga was altered through a visible insertion of letter "i" between letters "a and r" in the name Peter Karanga (Annex II).
- 3. Although the petitioner indicated in the Petition that Mutukanio Gwataniro Company had over 50,0000 shareholders, none of the said shareholders signed the Petition despite the fact that the petitioner alleges that over 25,000 shareholders were issued with ballots but had not been allocated any land by the company.
- Section 3(n) of the Petition to Parliament (Procedure Act)2012 and Standing Order 223 (m) of the National Assembly Standing Orders provides that a Petition shall be signed by the petitioner, or if the petitioner is unable to sign by a witness in whose presence the petitioner shall make his or mark on the petition.

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Pursuant to Standing Order 223 (m), the committee was not able to identify the Petitioner who signed the petition under the name Edward Kamande and resolved not proceed with the consideration of the petition.

MIN. NO. NA/DCS/LANDS/2019/298: SUBMISSIONS BY THE MANAGING DIRECTOR, NAKURU INDUSTRIES LIMITED ON THE PETITION REGARDING PUBLIC ACCESS AND USE OF PUBLIC UTILITY PLOTS IN NAKURU WEST WARD, NAKURU COUNTY

Mr. Andrew Mukite Musangi while acting for the Managing Director, Nakuru Industries Limited submitted the following before the Committee in response to the above petition;

- I. The proposed consolidation and subdivision of the Nakuru Industries Limited wider plot (LR No. 11264) were carried out in 1983 vide letter 19068/111/33 of 1st February 1983 with subdivision conditions being stipulated in the Commissioner's letter and the deed plan.
- II. Negotiations were carried out between the Commissioner for Lands and their surveyors and subsequently deed plans surrendered and new allotment letters issued for residential purposes and later titles were issued in the name Nakuru Industries Limited.
- III. In return, Nakuru Industries Limited was to build a primary school, reserve a site for the National Museums of Kenya, develop religious sites and medical centre. The Company had complied with all the requirements on its part.
- IV. While under oath, the Managing Director, Nakuru Industries Limited informed the Committee that the Company is in possession of the titles of all the surrendered parcels of land apart from parcels LR. No. 12570/187 (Hyrax Primary School) and LR. No. 12570/188 (Service Station).

Committee Observations

While interacting with the witnesses, the Committee noted the following;

- I. Seven parcels of land with LR. Nos. 12570/183, 12570/184, 12570/185, 12570/186, 12570/187, 12570/188 and 12570/189 were surrendered for the subdivision of plot LR No. 11264.
- II. Under unclear circumstances, titles of five parcels of the surrendered land (LR NOs. 12570/183, 12570/184, 12570/185, 12570/186, and 12570/189) were reverted back to Nakuru Industries Limited (the original owner).
- III. The witnesses could not satisfactorily apprise the Committee the circumstances under which the titles were reverted back to the original owners before the surrender and the acreage of the land before subdivision and how much land was surrendered for public utility.

- iii. Mr. Mr. Peter Kairanga was put under oath and he stated that Mr. Edward Kamande was a fictitious character that he created to register shares in the company under the fictitious name.
- iv. The Committee advised the petitioner to present a fresh petition under his name and stood him down from presenting further submissions on the petition.

MIN. NO. NA/DCS/LANDS/2019/192: PRESENTATION BY THE PETITIONERS ON THE PETITION REGARDING COMPENSATION OF LAND OWNED BY THE MATISI COMMUNITY ALONG KITALE – ENDEBES – SUAM ROAD

Hon. Caleb Amisi, MP on behalf of the petitioners informed the Committee of the following in respect of the above petition;

- i. The Petitioners operate businesses and own property and land along the Kitale Endebess Suam Road.
- ii. The road has been scheduled for construction and expansion and as a result owner of property within the range of 40 meters of the said road were required to vacate.
- iii. The road was initially a "C" class of 40 meters but was later upgraded to "B" class of 60 meters.
- iv. Residents comprising of 205 families are affected by the intended acquisition of an extra 20 meters for the expansion of the road.
- v. The Matisi residents had been assured of compensation by the relevant government agencies through a public participation exercise that was held on 12th June,2018.
- vi. Through a gazette notice No. 4496 dated 10th May, 2019, a list of owners of registered property and parcels of land along the road that was intended for compulsory acquisition was gazzetted, however the residents of Matisi area were excluded from the list.

vii. Efforts to seek redress from relevant government authorities have been futile.

- viii. The Petitioners prayed that the National Assembly through the Departmental Committee on Lands;
 - a. Investigates into the status of compensation of land occupied by Matisi Community that is earmarked for compulsory acquisition for expansion of Kitale Endebes Suam road.
 - b. Intervenes through the Ministry of Lands and the National Lands Commission to establish measures taken to ensure that residents of Matisi Community not listed in the gazette notice are also considered for compensation for their land and property that are earmarked for acquisition and or demolition.

c. Make any other recommendations that it deems fit in the circumstances of this petition.

Committee Observations

The Committee noted the concerns raised in the petition and undertook to follow up with the relevant stakeholders and government agencies with a view of responding to the prayers in the petition.

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Mr. Godfrey Sang, on behalf on the Petitioners, informed the Committee of the following in respect of the above petition;


- i. On 1st August 1951 Kimulot Tea Company was awarded a 999 year lease on as LR No. 8804 in Kimulot of Bomet County, measuring 4,500 acres. Mr. Tapsimate Araap Browo and Mr. Kipsoi Araap Chemorore were original owners of the land. The said Tea Company currently operates under the name of "James Finlay (Kenya Limited)", a division of the Swire Group of the United Kingdom.
- ii. In October 1951, the two owners of the land in question were prosecuted under criminal cases no. 346 of 1951 (Rex vs. Tapsimate Araap Borowo) and no. 461 of 1951 (Rex vs. Kipsoi Araap Chemorore), but they won the cases and the subsequent appeal.
- iii. They were prosecuted in a third case in Kisumu where the Colonial Administration won the case and as a result, they lost 4,500 acres of their prime land.
- iv. The other evictees accepted an offer for alternative land, but the petitioners declined hence rendering them and their descendants landless up to date.
- v. The Petitioners prayed that the National Assembly through the Departmental Committee on lands;
 - a. Investigates the matter of dispossession without compensation of the two families and the larger circumstances of "Kimolot affair".
 - b. Ensure that the victims are compensated for loss of property, unlawful prosecution and detention.
 - c. The two families be allowed to manage the said land henceforth or be paid an equivalent of the same at the prevailing market rate.
 - d. Makes any other recommendations in the circumstances of this petition.

Committee Observations

The Committee noted the concerns raised in the petition and undertook to follow up with the relevant stakeholders and government agencies with a view of responding to the prayers in the petition.

The Company, according to the Petitioner, owns a total of 82,000 acres in Nakuru and Laikipia, as well as the Amigos House, Oyster Shell building and three plots in Nakuru Town, Farm Houses in Bahati, various buildings in Laikipia and Rumuruti, among other properties. Honourable Members, balloting of land is said to have been undertaken in 1983 in a bid to ensure that each shareholder got a piece of the Company's land, but the initiative was extremely flawed and as a result over 25,000 shareholders did not obtain any land. Further, in areas such as Malan-Ngarua balloting was done on nonsurveyed land, and several Company properties including Amigo House, Oyster Shell and other properties were grabbed or illegally sold without the consent of the shareholders under the direction of Company directors and the then provincial administration.

Honourable Members, it is on account of these misgivings that the Petitioner seeks the intervention of this House primarily in spearheading investigations into the affairs of Mutukanio Gwataniro Company with a view to attaining the recovery of the irregularly allocated plots of land and other lost properties and for the conduct of a fresh survey of the Mutukanio Gwataniro land.

Honourable Members, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 227, this Petition therefore stands committed to the Departmental Committee on Lands. The Committee is requested to consider the Petition and report its findings to the House and the petitioner in accordance with Standing Order 227(2).

THAT,** in 1983, balloting of land was undertaken in a bid to ensure that each shareholder got a piece of the Mutukanio Gwataniro land, but this initiative ended up being a flawed process since the majority of the shareholders (over 25,000) got ballots with no land, there were instances of double allocation of land, and in areas such as Ngarua balloting was done on non-surveyed land;
- **5. THAT,** some of the Company properties including Amigo House, Oyster Shell and other properties grabbed or illegally sold without the consent of the shareholders under the

The land office in Nanyuki has different in register to Kinamba and none is in my name. The D.O. Kinamba asked me to file a case to rescue my land.

be Mutukanio Gwataniro land buying company has over 50,000 shareholders and since they settled shareholders as land became available, less than 25,000 shareholders are settled on their 82,000 acres land at Bahati 2 acres, Mau Narok and other farms $2^{1}/_{2}$ acres and Malan in Ngarua 3 acres. Simple arithmetic shows that to settle all shareholders, each share had to get 1 acre Bahati $1^{1}/_{4}$ acre Mau Narok and $1^{1}/_{2}$ acre Malan which is arid land of over 52,000 acres.

All the properties of the land buying company are grabbed including prime (KANU House) Amigos House. The Nakuru CBD had five developed plots including Amigos House (KANU House) Oyster Shell building next to KCB main branch, and other three plots. There is a building in Nyahururu town and another in Rumuruti Town. There were many developed Farm Houses in Bahati Nakuru all occupied who has been collecting rent from all these buildings. How did KPLC get involved with Amigos House that they wanted to sell the building to recover power bills?

I would remind the Hon. House of chaos, intimidation and bare force during the one week balloting in 1983. Mr. Muhoro of Media Max Limited has institutional memory where elderly shareholders died on the queue. Surveyors left many plots unnumbered in Bahati farms. Ballots were in individual pockets before the balloting day.

The Kenya constitution guarantees the protection of my investment and properties. This I was denied by being dumped to ballot for none surveyed land in Ngarua. The over 25,000 shareholders are like me who are holding a ballot without land. In ct Kinamba D.O office had brokers for advocates to pursue those land cases. 34 years have gone by but I believe the new nstitution is my savior through your Honorable House.

I am requesting your Hon. House to give attention to the 25,000 members of Mutukanio Gwataniro Company so that each member can get his/her rightful share of whatever the company bought. I know you will require institutional memory from the two surviving directors and a staff in lands office Nakuru who is holding all the Company's documents.

I may not give all details because of my personal security like what has been witnessed by Kihiu Mwiri and Embakasi land ranching company where the Kenya Government is working to restore order and every shareholder get his parcel of land. The government officers involved knew the 82,000 acres not enough for over 50,000 shareholders but went ahead to issue title deeds.

There was fraud then as it is now and those title deeds cannot stand. Every shareholder occupying land is only entitled to $\frac{1}{2}$ of that land and majority knows.
