1.0 PREFACE

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199 (6), it is my pleasant privilege and honour to present to this House the Report on the Petition on Inclusion of project costs on the project sign board for all public funded project.

The petition was tabled before the House pursuant to Standing Order 225 (2) (b) by Mr. Boniface Mwai Gachunga of ID no. 22377410

Pursuant to Standing Order 227 (1), the petition was referred to the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing for consideration and preparation of a report within 60 days.

1.1 Mandate of the Committee and Membership

a) Mandate

- 1. The Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing is established under Standing Order 216(1) whose mandate, pursuant to the Standing Order 216 (5), is as follows:

 - j. consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - k. examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.
- 2. Further, the Second Schedule to the Standing Orders mandates the Committee to consider matters relating to the following subjects:
 - a) Transport;
 - b) Roads;
 - c) Public works;
 - d) Construction and maintenance of roads, rails and buildings;
 - e) Air and seaports; and

1.4 Committal and Consideration of the Petition

- 5. Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Orders 227 (1), the petition was referred to the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing for consideration and preparation of a report within 60 days. The Committee proceeded with the consideration of the petition by holding meetings to set up terms of reference and scheduling meetings.
- 6. In considering the petition, the Committee invited and held meetings with the officials from the State Department for Public Works, The National Construction Authority as well as the Petitioner, Mr. Boniface Mwai Gachunga. The meetings were aimed at responding to issues raised by the petitioner.

1.5 Committee Observations

- 7. Having held meetings and considered the submissions presented on the petitions, the Committee observed that the petitioners had prayed that the National Assembly through the Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing:
 - i. considers and amend the NCA act and any other applicable laws to make it a statutory requirement for the total cost of a public-funded project to be **included and displayed** in the project sign-board; and that
 - ii. in his humble opinion, this will go a long way into capturing the aspirations and the spirit of the provisions of article 10 of the constitution of Kenya 2010.

In response to the above prayers, the Committee recommends that: -

8. The Committee observed that it may have to request for views from the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) before making its determination because the issue of costing and accountability may be beyond the scope of the National Construction Authority. The Committee however was of the opinion that procurement laws are more comprehensive in terms of ensuring accountability and thus there is no need to amend the NCA Act.

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 9. The Petition on proposal to amend the National Construction Authority Act to provide for inclusion of the Cost of Public Funded Projects on Project Sign Boards was conveyed to the House by the Hon. Speaker of the National Assembly on 28th September, 2021 pursuant to Standing Order 225 (2)(b).
- 10. Pursuant to House rules, the petition was referred to the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing for consideration and preparation of a report within 60 days. The Committee considered the petition pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 227.

The petitioners wished to draw the attention of the National Assembly to the following: -

- i. THAT: Article 10 of the constitution of Kenya requires all stage organs, state officers, public officers and all persons whenever any of them:
 - 1.1 Applies or interprets the constitution
 - 1.2 Enacts, applies and interprets any law or
 - 1.3 Makes or implements public policy

To strictly observe and be guided by our national values and principles always in the course of executing their mandate.

- ii. THAT the National Construction Authority Regulations (2014) enumerate the items to be included in the project sign board but conspicuously missing in the list of requirements is the PROJECT COST FORPUBLIC FUNDED PROJECTS.
- iii. THAT, I have made the best efforts to have this matter addressed by the relevant authorities- in this case National Construction Authority which have failed to give a satisfactory response.
- iv. THAT, none of this issue raised in the petition is pending in any court of law, constitutional or any other legal body.

THEREFORE, your humble petitioner prays that the National Assembly –

- v. considers and amend the NCA act and any other applicable laws to make it a statutory requirement for the total cost of a public-funded projects to be **included and displayed** in the project sign-board
- vi. That this in his humble opinion will go a long way into capturing the aspirations and the spirit of the provisions of article 10 of the constitution of Kenya 2010.

3.0 SUBMISSIONS AND EVIDENCE

11. Having been seized of the Petition, the Committee commenced its consideration by inviting Mr. Boniface Mwai and the officials from the State Department for Public Works as well as officials from the National Construction Authority. During the meeting, written and oral evidence was adduced as recorded hereunder.

3.1 SUBMISSION FROM THE PETITIONER

12. The Petitioner, Mr. Boniface Mwai, took Member through the petition. He explained that disclosure of cost is an important aspect both from an accounting perspective and it terms of good governance. He explained that whereas the information on cost is not a secret, he was praying that the National Assembly makes it easier to access, thereby the need for the amendment to the law to provide for the same on sign boards.

3.2 SUBMISSION FROM THE NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION AUTHORITY

13. In his presentation to the Committee, The National Construction Authority, through the Principal Secretary for Public Works and the Executive Director NCA, submitted that the costs are available in all government agency websites in line with a Presidential Directive issued some years ago. They further submitted that including the cost of projects in sign boards may enhance the use of the board to include accountability for resources. However, for the board to be used for this purpose, there may be need to add other information as accountability may not be judged by cost alone. They submitted that the cost is not included in the board because the guidelines are mainly intended to enhance quality assurance and to confirm compliance.

The NCA Act No. 41of 2011does not have any express provision under the Act that requires a developer whether public or private to have a site sign Board. This is a requirement under the Physical Land Use and Planning Act.

The site sign Board is a requirement at the point of approval of the project by the respective county. In furtherance of section 5(1) (n), of the NCA Act, the National Construction Authority has developed guidelines for a standard Construction Site Sign Board for projects being undertaken by private developers, Ministries, Departments and Agencies to capture standard details for display. However, the cost of the project is not included.

As per the guidelines, the project site sign board is required to have the following information on it;

- A. Project- Name of location (Land no.) to be constructed;
- B. Ownership details-client/developer
- C. Supervising consultants namely;
 - i. Architect
 - ii. Electrical engineer
 - iii. Quantity surveyor
 - iv. Civil/ structural engineer
 - v. Mechanical engineer
 - vi. Other (consultants involved in the project not outlined in 3
- D. Contractor
 - i. Main contractor
 - ii. Subcontractor(s)
- E. Statutory approvals
 - i. County construction permit as per PLUPA2019;
 - ii. NEMA license
 - iii. NCA Compliance certificate
 - iv. Others (approval for the project not outlined in 5)

As regards the cost, it is disclosed in the certificate of compliance issued to the applicant.

Including the cost may enhance the use of the board to include accountability for resources. However, for the board to be used for this purpose, there may be need to add other information as accountability may not be judged by cost alone.

The cost is not included in the board because the guidelines are mainly intended to enhance quality assurance and to confirm compliance

4 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

4.1 OBSERVATIONS

14. The Committee observed that it may request the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) to provide any additional information on the issues raised in the Petition because the issue of costing and accountability may be beyond the scope of the National Construction Authority.

4.2 RECOMMENDATIONS

15. The Committee having heard from the officials makes the following recommendation, that: - The Committee was satisfied with the Ministry's response and was of the opinion that procurement laws are more comprehensive in ensuring accountability and thus there is no need to amend the NCA Act.

They further submitted that including the cost of projects in sign boards may enhance the use of the board to include accountability for resources. However, for the board to be used for this purpose there may be need to add other information as accountability may not be judged by cost alone. They submitted that the cost is not included in the board because the guidelines are mainly intended to enhance quality assurance and to confirm compliance.

The Committee observed that it may have to consult the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) before making its determination because the issue of costing and accountability may be beyond the scope of the National Construction Authority.

MEMORANDUM REGARDING A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION AUTHORITY ACT TO PROVIDE FOR INCLUSION OF THE COST OF PUBLIC FUNDED PROJECTS ON PROJECT SIGN BOARDS

1.0 BACKGROUND

The National Construction Authority (NCA) is established under the National Construction Authority Act No. 41 of 2011 (hereinafter referred to as the 'Act') which came into effect on the 8th of June 2011. In exercise of the Cabinet Secretary's powers conferred under Section 42 of the Act, the National Construction Authority Regulations were adopted by the National Assembly and took effect on the 6th June 2014 by Notice in the Kenya Gazette.

The object for which the Authority is established is to oversee the construction industry and coordinate its development. Pursuant to Section 5(2)(g) of the Act, the Authority's function in terms of compliance is to promote and ensure quality assurance in the construction industry and under Section 5(2) (ga) to enforce the prescribed Building Code in the construction industry.

2.0 AMENDMENT TO THE NATIONAL CONSTRUCTION AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FOR THE INCLUSION OF THE COST OF PUBLIC FUNDED PROJECTS ON PROJECT SIGN BOARD

The NCA Act No. 41 of 2011 does not have any express provision under the Act that requires a developer whether public or private to have a site sign Board. This is a requirement under the Physical Land Use and Planning Act.

The site sign Board is a requirement at the point of approval of the project by the respective County.

In furtherance of section 5 (1) (n), of the NCA Act, the National Construction Authority has developed guidelines for a standard Construction Site Sign Board (Annex1) for projects being undertaken by private developers, Ministries, Departments and Agencies to capture standard details for display. However, the cost of the project is not included.

As per the guidelines, the project Site Sign Board is required to have the following information on it;

- 1. Project -Name of location (Land No.) to be constructed;
- 2. Ownership details -Client/ Developer
- 3. Supervising consultants namely;
 - i. Architect;
 - ii. Electrical Engineer;
 - iii. Quantity Surveyor;
 - iv. Civil/Structural Engineer;
 - v. Mechanical Engineer
 - vi. Other (consultants involved in the project not outlined in 3)
- 4. Contractor
 - i. Main Contractor;

- ii. Subcontractor(s);
- 5. Statutory approvals
 - i. County Construction permit as per PLUPA 2019;
 - ii. NEMA license
 - iii. NCA Compliance certificate
 - iv. Others (approvals for the project not outlined in 5)

As regards the cost, it is disclosed in the certificate of compliance issued to the applicant.

Including the cost may enhance the use of the board to include accountability for resources. However, for the board to be used for this purpose, there may be need to add other information as accountability may not be judged by cost alone.

The cost is not included in the board because the guidelines are mainly intended to enhance quality assurance and to confirm compliance.


