

1.0 GENERAL

Kenya's Road Network is estimated at 150,600 Km and consists of about 63,000 Km of the classified road system and 87,600 Km of unclassified road system.

The Ministry of Roads, Public Works and Housing is responsible for all policy matters relating to all the roads in the country (the 150,600 Km) and for the management (development, operation, maintenance and rehabilitation) of the classified road system (the 63,000 Km). Further details of the classified road network are given in the table below.

The Roads Department is headed by a Chief Engineer (Roads) who reports to the Permanent Secretary through the Engineer in Chief. The department is responsible for planning, design, construction, improvement, operation and maintenance of all classified roads in the country. The department has 7 branches; each headed by a Chief Superintending Engineer. The branches are: -

1. Planning Branch
2. Design Branch
3. Bridges Branch
4. Construction Branch
5. Roads Maintenance Branch
6. Technical Administration Branch
7. Technical Compliance

The main objectives of the Department are briefly described herebelow: -

- To provide or facilitate provision of basic access to all production, marketing and consumption centres through cost-effective, efficient and sustainable road construction and maintenance;
- To minimise vehicle operating costs (hence transport costs) on major transport corridors and heavily trafficked feeder roads by upgrading them to bitumen standards where necessary and through the rehabilitation and reconstruction of the existing and deteriorated road sections;
- To open and upgrade to bitumen or gravel standards roads to areas with potential for increased socio-economic development.; and
- To promote road safety in the use of roads through design and installation of road signs, furniture and markings.

2.0 FUNCTIONS

Following the establishment of the Kenya Roads Board, the functions of the Roads Department cover the management of classes A, B and C of the classified road network. These functions include the development, (planning, design, construction) operation and maintenance of the classified road network. The functions are described briefly herebelow.

2.1 Planning.

- Overall planning and programming of long and short term road projects
- Monitoring on-going projects/programmes and preparing appropriate reports
- Review and analysis of national road policy for efficient utilisation of existing infrastructure
- Liaison with Government Ministries, organisations and Development partners on planning and implementation of road projects
- Providing policy and planning guidance on roads
- Ensuring that environmental and social concerns are integrated in roadwork's
- Ensuring routine maintenance of roads is carried out in a manner benign to road development
- Formulation and preparation of environmental manuals, standards and guidelines for the road sector
- Providing policy and planning guidelines for road safety
- Co-ordination of extra-ordinary activities such as emergency road repairs and disaster response; and liaison with other gook departments, NGO's and other agencies on environmental/social programmes

2.2 Design

- Survey, design and tender documentation for road projects
- Formulation and preparation of standards and design manuals

- Dealing with matters related to road reserves and control of access to all classified roads
- Management of drawing office and survey and photogrammetry unit
- Maintaining the register of road engineering consultants and contractors
- Liaison with the road design consultants, Materials Branch and other organisations and agencies on matters related to road design

2.3 Bridges

- The design of bridges; updating of bridge design manuals and specifications; preparation and sustenance of bridge inventory and condition survey
- Supervision of construction and maintenance of bridges
- Preparation of bridges programmes, Budget and progress reports

2.4 Construction.

- Administration of roadwork's contracts both major improvements and rehabilitation of roads
- Preparation of estimates and contract documents for resealing and recarpeting of classified bitumen roads
- Preparation of monthly and quarterly reports
- Preparation of final construction reports
- Liaison with donors on all donor funded Construction projects

- Liaison with Government Departments for smooth running of projects
- Processing of contractor's and consultants payments

2.5 Maintenance

- Maintenance of all class A, B, & C roads (Paved & Unpaved)
- Overall planning, budgeting and co-ordination of the activities of the maintenance (A, B, C Roads)
- Setting objectives & monitoring the performance class on the maintenance of A, B & C roads
- Preparation of estimates and contract documents for small scale maintenance contracts
- Co-ordinating Donor/GOK funding allocation for roads 2000 Programme
- Promoting strategic objectives of the roads 2000 programme
- Liaison with GOK Ministries and departments, other organizations and agencies of feeder roads

2.6 Technical administration

- General Administration and Supervision of cleanliness in the department
- Co-ordination of Accident Reports and briefs
- Liaison with the relevant Government Ministries, departments, organizations and agencies (including donors) for professional and Technical training for officers in the department
- Overall co-ordination of Parliamentary Questions

- Co-ordination of Axle Load Enforcement
- Co-ordination of Personnel (including staff disciplinary) and Supplies Matters in the department
- Co-ordination of the Management Information System
- Attending Ministerial Advisory and Surcharge Committees among others.

2.7 Technical Compliance

- Ensure that all projects are being implemented as per signed contracts.
- Check evaluation of claims by Chief Project Engineers before they are forwarded to Chief Supt./ Engineer (Construction).
- Check Tender Documents to ensure they are complete in all aspects.
- Check the quality and quantity of work done by Direct Labour Units to ensure there is value for money.
- Ensure that programmes approved by District Roads Committees are followed and that there is value for money for the works that are executed by District Roads Engineers.

3.0 CONDITION OF THE CLASSIFIED ROADS

The last detailed and networked road condition survey was done way back in 1986 and its results cannot be valid today. However in 1995, it was estimated that 57% of the classified road network was in a good condition and was therefore maintainable. The balance (43%) was in a poor condition and required rehabilitation before it could be put in the maintenance regime.

Since then, some effort has been made to improve the situation but the effects of the El Nino induced rains diminished the impact of the efforts. It is therefore estimated that the condition of the classified road network is not very different from what it was in 1995 i.e. 57% good, 43% poor.

A detailed and networked road condition survey is being done now with funding from the World Bank. The survey will on completion provides a better picture of the condition of the network.

The poor condition of the classified road network is as a result of many constraints. Key among these constraints is inadequate funding, inappropriate institutional framework for road maintenance and overloading by Heavy Commercial Vehicles.

4.0 CONSTRAINTS TO IMPROVED ROAD MAINTENACE

As implied in section 3.0 above, the major constraints to improved road maintenance can be grouped into two main areas viz. inadequate funding and inappropriate institutional framework.

4.1 Funding Constraint

The GOK with the assistance of the World Bank undertook a study of Expenditure and Funding Needs in the Roads Sector (October 1994) which indicated as follows: -

- i) The total maintenance expenditure required annually for 57% of the classified road network, which was in a maintainable condition, based on the most economically attractive practice, was about Ksh. 6.16 billion. (1994 prices)
- ii) A further Kshs. 35 billion (1994 prices) was required for the reconstruction and rehabilitation of roads, which were no longer in maintainable condition, (the 43%). Assuming that the rehabilitation could be done in 5 years, about Kshs. 7 billion was required annually for the next 5 years.

The actual expenditure on road maintenance has been well below the required amount. As a result, the Department has not been able to deliver road maintenance at the required level. The Department has also not been able to reduce significantly the portion of the network that is in poor condition.

4.2 Institutional Constraints

The constraints that are related to the current institutional framework include overloading by Heavy Goods Vehicles, inappropriate utilisation of staff, inadequate staff motivation/training and inappropriate delivery methods.

i) Overloading

The damage caused by overloaded goods vehicles to our relatively flexible roads has been a cause of great concern to government for many years. The weighbridge stations established in the 1970s accomplished little towards diminishing the problem. New mobile weighbridge units were acquired and the Traffic Act was amended in the early 1980s in order to make the axle load control function more effective. However, when enforcement under the new Act started in 1986, it was soon suspended due to administrative problems and pressure from external governments. The enforcement was re-started in 1989 but on a reduced scale and transporters were able to easily avoid the mobile weighbridge units. Full time enforcement was re-started in 1994 but the effect on overloading was minimal until about two years ago.

ii) Staff Utilisation/Motivation

For many years prior to 1984, the government had, in its permanent establishment, a workforce ranging in number between 1,000 and 2,000 for road maintenance. This consisted of professionals and sub-professional staff, technical and administrative personnel as well as some higher grades of the artisan cadres. However, there was also a cadre of works-paid staff who were temporary employees to be taken on from time to time to undertake specific tasks. The works-paid

staff did not enjoy benefits designated to permanent staff such as pensions. The advantage of the system was that the Roads Department remained in full control of employment and discipline of the workforce through its provincial set up.

The works-paid establishment remained steady at 9,000 to 10,000 people in the whole country. While there may have been pockets of overstaffing, the staffing levels were generally appropriate to the funding levels available. In 1984 the works-paid staff were absorbed into the permanent establishment of the Road Department. The department therefore lost its control in terms of employment, dismissal and discipline while its ability to manage its workforce was seriously impaired.

The Department's ability to remunerate and motivate the larger permanent staff adequately was also affected by the increase in numbers since the staff emolument allocations did not increase proportionately.

iii) Delivery Methods

For many years, most of the routine maintenance on our roads was done in-house by force account units. By 1992 conventional in-house (force account) units had become extremely expensive and inefficient as resource support supplies dried up, leaving substantial units and quantities of personnel idle when fuel, materials and spare parts became unavailable. Opportunities then existed for expanding the use of contractors into areas that hitherto had been the preserve of the in-house organisations.

As regards periodic maintenance, most of the work was done through contracts and was therefore not affected in the same way as the routine maintenance. However the diminishing funds available for roadwork's meant that the department could not perform the periodic maintenance at the level required to sustain the road network.

In the recent past, the government's inability to pay contractors promptly for work done has resulted into huge unpaid bills and in

some cases into contractual claims. The unpaid bills have in turn served to reduce the budget available for road works for subsequent years even further.

5.0 INSTITUTIONAL REFORM

To address the institutional framework constraint, the Government with the assistance of the European Union, undertook the Road Sector Institutional Study (1995-1998). The objective of the Study was to propose an institutional framework within which the management of Kenya's road network will most effectively be undertaken. The study report proposed the following key aspects of the institutional framework.

- ◆ Separation of policy formulation from service delivery
- ◆ Promotion of transparency and accountability in all activities
- ◆ Promotion of businesslike management in delivery of roadwork's

To achieve these attributes, the study also proposed the formation of a Roads Board and the transformation of the current Roads Department into an autonomous Road Agency.

As a result, the Kenya Roads Board (KRB) was established by an Act of Parliament in December 1999 and the Board was launched in July 2000.

Other reform measures geared towards improved road management include: -

- ◆ Improved Prioritisation of road maintenance works
- ◆ More use of contractors in the delivery of maintenance works
- ◆ Staff rationalisation within the government wide Public Service Reform exercise.

To redress the overloading problem, the following measures have been taken

- (i) Axle Load Controls are being undertaken on a 24 hour basis
- (ii) The Axle Load Enforcement Unit impounds overloaded vehicles. The vehicle owners and drivers are then charged in a court of law where fines are imposed. Excess cargo is then off-loaded before the vehicles are allowed to proceed on their journeys
- (iii) An Axle Load Monitoring Unit has been established to monitor the state of overloading and to increase effectiveness of weigh-bridge stations
- (iv) Co-ordination of weighbridge operations between Kenya and Uganda has commenced
- (v) The cabinet approved the privatization of the Axle Load control function in principle and the Ministry in consultation with the Attorney General is in the process of amending the Traffic Act to provide the legal framework.

5.0 ONGOING ROAD PROJECTS

NORTHERN CORRIDOR ROAD TRANSPORT IMPROVEMENT PROJECT (NCTIP)

STATUS OF PROJECTS PREPARATION AS ON 19TH APRIL 2004

The Northern Corridor Transport Improvement Project is to be financed through a Development Credit from the International Development Association (IDA).

The project comprises the Improvement of some 368 km of key sections of Kenya's intentional trade routes as follows: -

- (a) Maji ya Chumvi – Miritini (A109) - 35 km
- (b) Sultan Hamud - Machakos Turnoff (A109) - 55 km
- (c) Machakos Turnoff – Athi River – Embakasi (A109/A104) - 29 km
- (d) Lanet - Nakuru – Njoro Turnoff (A104) - 14 km
- (e) Njoro Turnoff – Mau Summit – Timbora (A104) - 83 km
- (f) Mau Summit – Kericho – Kisumu (B1) - 145 km
- (g) Airport North Road (dual carriageway) - 7.0 km

Studies and design of Mau Summit – Kericho – Kisumu (B1) are being undertaken in-house by the Roads Department while the rest of the workload is by consultants Gibb E.A. and Norconsult AS (with the exception of the Airport North road that is to be undertaken as a 'Design and Build Project').

Existing study contracts for Messrs Gibb EA and Norconsult AS financed under the Credit for the Rehabilitation of Nairobi – Mombasa road were modified to include the additional services in (c) and (d) above (as well as the Muthaiga roundabout – Gigiri – Kuaka (C62) being undertaken by Norconsult AS) so as to expedite project preparatory activities and formal project appraisal expected in February 2004.

Project preparation status

The Project was appraised by World Bank between 9th – 25th February, 2004 and the Credit to finance successfully negotiated by the Government and World Bank team in Washington on 19th March, 2004.

The Credit is in the tune of US\$207 with Nordic Development Fund providing US\$15. The project is expected to be presented to the World Bank on 30th April, 2004. Effectiveness of the Credit is expected to be in June 2004.

Procurement of some sections of the project has already started and Contractors are expected to be on ground by March 2005.

BRIEF ON THE ROAD CONCESSION STUDY

The BKS Group (Pty.) Ltd. was awarded the study “Road Concessions in Kenya” by the World Bank. The Study consists of two phases, namely an Assessment of Concessioning Potential and the Design of a Concessioning Framework.

Phase 1 of the study looked at the viability of road concessions in Kenya from a macroeconomic, microeconomic as well as a financial perspective. The study concentrated on the classified road network and addressed various types of road concessions from comprehensive build-operate-transfer (BOT) management (BOT) arrangements to comprehensive toll road operations management (CTROM). The study further compared the concessioning agreements i.e. private sector road supply to the public sector road supply by means of force account and contract management by investigating the classified road network given that higher traffic volumes are generally desirable for concessioning. The study concluded that road concessioning in Kenya is viable. The potential for concessioning is however limited to the Northern Corridor for conventional road tolling and the classified road network with ADTs>500vpd excluding the Northern Corridor for Shadow tolling.

Issues that were paramount to the outcome of this study are the current state of the road network, historical expenditure by government, higher costs of private sector funding, the potential higher efficiencies of private sector in road maintenance and construction, the current state of the fiscus and potential for increased public expenditure on roads, the available funding from development partners and their conditions and the current level of taxation of road users.

PHASE 1 STUDY FINDINGS

Key highlights of the study findings are as follows:-

- The extent of the potential shadow toll network is 3,792km.
- The fuel levy income for the potential shadow toll network i.e. US\$22,494 million is sufficient to cover the maintenance expenses of the network i.e. US\$22,108.
- The estimated backlog of the shadow toll network is US\$360,545 million.

- The extent of the potential conventional concession:- The Northern Corridor from Mombasa to Malaba – is 922km (excluding the planned bypasses for Mombasa, Nairobi and Nakuru).
- Fuel levy income for the Northern Corridor is US\$13,076 million, which can be used to subsidize other roads – classified roads with ADTs<500vpd and unclassified roads.
- The estimated backlog for the Northern Corridor is US\$335,700 million, which excludes the cost of planned bypasses for Mombasa, Nairobi and Nakuru.
- The extent of the classified road network with ADTs<500vpd – suitable for public sector management through force account and/or contract management – is about 58,949km. The fuel levy income for this network is only US\$11,545 million compared to a maintenance requirement of US\$82,023 million and a backlog of US\$472,939 million.

PHASE II STUDY FINDINGS

Phase II of the Study details the design of a concessioning framework for Kenya based on more detailed investigations which includes:-

- A concession framework
- A finding framework for roads based on an equitable road user charging system and appropriate taxation levels for road users.
- A contractual framework
- A legislative and regulatory framework.

A draft final report of the study was presented in June 2003. The study recommends an introduction of conventional tolling in the Northern Corridor – over a distance of 1,208km. Notably, the study identified three viable road concessions i.e.

- Mombasa-Machakos
- Machakos-Rironi
- Rironi to Malaba via Eldoret and to Busia via Kisumu.

The study recommends nine different toll plazas namely Mackinnon, Kibwezi, Athi River, Kikuyu, Gilgil, Eldoret, Webuye, Kericho, Kisumu.

The required toll rates for a 25 – year concession period and an after tax real return of 20% on an equity investment of US\$205 million of profit costs are as follows:-

Class I	2.50 US cents per km
Class II	6.25 US cents per km
Class III	7.50 US cents per km
Class IV	10.00 US cents per km.

The recommended toll rates are both affordable (equal to only 10% of the vehicle operating costs) and will result in savings in vehicle operating cost.

The contractual framework is discussed in the report by looking at the roles of and relationships between the parties to a BOT arrangement. This includes the relationships between the principal parties namely the Government of Kenya, the concession company, sponsors, equity investors, lenders, development partners, contractors, operator, specialist advisors, export credit agencies etc. As regards the legislative and regulatory framework, the study finds that the current road sector legislation does not empower the conclusion of a concession agreement with the private sector allowing the latter to toll a public road and retain a portion or all the income from tolls. The Public Roads Toll Act of 1984 serves as the best anchor for amendment to mandate concessioning.

BENEFITS OF CONCESSIONING

Although the financial cost of concessioning is expensive, the economic benefits of private sector involvement in the road sector outweigh these disadvantages by far. These benefits are not only in terms of economic growth estimated at 1% of GDP during construction period but also strengthening the economy of Kenya in terms of balance of Payments, Price Stability, Employment, Income distribution and transfer of skills of technology.

In summary, the following matrix gives a Timeline of what has been achieved so far as regards concessioning of the management and maintenance of the Northern Corridor.

It is however important to note that the Ministry has received No Objection from World Bank to select BKS Global Ltd. to proceed with the preparation of Bidding Document for Concessioning of Machakos-Turnoff-Rironi including Nairobi Southern Bypass and the contract is now being procured. Once we have the Cabinet Memo approved (Action 3), then we shall be able to proceed with Action Numbers 4, 5, and 6 effectively.

BRIEF ON THE DEMOLITION OF ILLEGAL STRUCTURES ON THE NAIROBI BYPASSES, LINK ROADS AND WITHIN THE ROAD RESERVES COUNTRY WIDE

Objective

The objective of reserving the road corridors for these bypasses was to develop roads on the fringes of Nairobi City to enable through traffic to avoid the congested areas of the city and other obstructions to movement of traffic.

There are three proposed bypasses in Nairobi. When constructed these bypasses will ease traffic congestion in the central business district. The three bypasses are Nairobi Southern, Northern and Eastern bypasses. These corridors are 60m wide which have been reserved for the development of roads. There is also a proposed link between the Southern and Northern bypass.

Over time and due to the fact that the roads have remained undeveloped, substantial encroachment has occurred on the corridors, thereby contravening the Traffic Act, Cap. 403, section 91 of the Laws of Kenya. The encroachment mainly involves illegal allocation of land and construction of structures, mainly Residential and commercial buildings.

The following is a brief description of each bypass.

Nairobi Southern Bypass

This proposed bypass is approximately 30km in length. The survey for this corridor was carried out in 1990, subsequent to which a detailed design, funded by the Japanese International Corporation Agency (JICA) was completed in 1991. The detailed design documents are in the custody of the Roads Department.

It starts on Mombasa road between St. James hospital and Kencell building. At the Mombasa road interchange it connects to Likoni road.

After the interchange, the road passes through a small section of the former American Embassy, through a section of the Nairobi National Park. After the park the road passes near the Carnivore restaurant and above Uhuru Gardens. It then passes through a section of the 7th Kenya Rifles Langata , onto Langata road. After Langata road, the road passes below Uhuru, Southlands, Ngei and Otiende estates but above Motoine river. After Ngei estate the road

runs below the Langata Women prison and Police Dog section but above Motoine river. The road then crosses into Ngong forest and crosses Ngong road below Lenana school near Motoine river, crosses into the forest and then into Motoine sub location. The road then crosses Langata road (C63) below the railway bridge at Dagarretti into Dagarretti forest.

After Dagarretti forest the road passes through Thogoto sub location onto the C411 (Thogoto –Gikambura road), passes below Thogoto Teachers college but above Alliance girls and Alliance boys schools. The road then crosses the Ondiri swamp to Kikuyu town where it joins the C63 at the railway bridge and ends at Gitaru on the Nairobi-Nakuru highway (A104).

Encroachment

The following areas are encroached upon on the Southern by pass.

- Traffic interchange on Mombasa Road next to the former American Embassy building.
- Between Nairobi South C and the Nairobi National Park
- Next to the Carnivore Restaurant
- Between Southlands Estate and the Langata Women prison.

Demolition

The section between the proposed Mombasa road interchange through carnivore restaurant, Southlands, Otiende and Langata Women prison is complete. All this section was Government land and therefore no compensation claims can be lodged.

Nairobi Northern Bypass

The Nairobi Northern bypass starts after Ruaka trading center on Limuru road (C62), crosses the road to Banana (C63) onto Koinange Farm, LR No.22 (formerly Closeburn farm) and passes through to Runda area, through Githogoro Village and crosses Kiambu road above Ridgeways. The road then passes through Marurui, Thome, and through LR No. 30/2, 5987, 1012/6, 11478, 4927 and crosses Kamiti road at Githurai 44. The road then crosses Riara river, through Kamuthi farmers, crosses Kiu river to Kahawa west, Kamae, Kiwanja and then crosses Kamiti river. After Kamiti river the road goes to Ruiru after crossing the Eastern bypass.

The approximate length of the Nairobi Northern bypass is 25km. However, only 7 km of this road was compulsorily acquired in 1970. This is section between Ruaka and Kiambu road . A feasibility Report on the possible

extension of Ruaka-Kiambu road to Thika Road" was submitted to the Government on the 17th of January ,1973.

However, the section between Kiambu road and Thika road was never compulsorily acquired. The Nairobi City Council invoked the already repealed Town planning act Cap. 302, for owners of property to surrender 60m road corridor whenever they sought approval for subdivision of their farms.

Encroachment

The following areas are encroached upon on the Nairobi Northern bypass.

- Runda area
- Githogoro Village
- Mabati structures at Githurai 44
- Kamuthi Farmers
- Kahawa West
- Kamae Slums
- Kiwanja

Demolition

Illegal structures in the following areas are yet to be demolished: -

- Githogoro village
- Githurai 44
- Kahawa West
- Kamae Slums

Owners of illegal structures in the following areas have demolished them. They include: -

- Kamuthi farmers
- Kiwanja to Kamiti river

Link Roads

The Nairobi Southern and Northern bypasses are proposed to be linked by two link roads. The first link commences on Langata Road next to Langata Police Station , through Southlands estate, crosses the Nairobi Southern bypass, past Motoine river through Kibera Slums. After the slums the road crosses Ngong road through Yaya center parking area, past Argwings Kodhek road. The road then runs past Dennis Prit road through Kirichwa

Kubwa river. After the river, one arm runs through Kileleshwa to Westlands round about, while the other ends up at James Gichuru road.

The Waiyaki way to Redhill road is the other link. This link was designed in 1973 and subsequently acquired in 1975. This section is about 4km. This link is supposed to be extended to join the Nairobi Northern bypass at Runda.

Encroachment

The following areas are encroached upon on the Link roads.

- Kibera slums
- Ring road Kilimani
- Ring road Kileleshwa
- Between Waiyaki Way and lower Kabete road
- Spring Valley road
- Kitsuru road

Demolition

- (i) The section starting from Langata road next to Langata Police station through Southlands up to Motoine river is completely cleared of any illegal structures. As for the section between Yaya Centre , past Dennis Pritt road to Kirichwa Kubwa river, the demolition is about 80% complete through our efforts. The owners of these temporary garages and eating places are doing self demolition, so that they can salvage their property. As for the section between Yaya center through DO's office Kibera up to Motoine river the demolitions have not started.
- (ii) On the Waiyaki Way to Redhill road the demolitions are complete.

Nairobi Eastern bypass

The length of this road is approximately 30km and is not designed. This 60m road corridor starts on the Ruiru-Kiambu road (C63), opposite the Ruiru prison college's farm. It then crosses the Nairobi Northern bypass on a more or less easterly course, crosses the railway line onto Thika road. This section is approximately 5 km. After crossing Thika road, again on a more or less easterly course, the road runs for about 7km before it turns and crosses Gatharani river, crosses Nairobi river into Ruai. The corridor then crosses the road to Kangundo and traverses about10km to Mombasa road through North airport road.

This road corridor is not compulsorily acquired, but the provisions of the repealed Town Planning Act Cap. 302 was applied by the Nairobi City Council Planning Department for owners to surrender 60m road corridor before approval of their subdivision schemes.

Encroachment

The following areas are encroached upon on the Nairobi Eastern bypass.

- Between C63 (Ruiru-Kiambu road) and Thika road
- 2km after Thika road
- Embakasi Village

Demolition

The programme for demolition of illegal structures on the Eastern bypass is being prepared.

Processional Way

This road is approximately 2km and runs from Statehouse road to Haile Sellassie Avenue. All illegal structures on this road have been cleared.

Demolition of outstanding illegal structures

Four weeks will be required to demolish the outstanding illegal structures on the Nairobi bypasses.

Link Road

One week will be required to clear the section between DO's Kibera to Motoine river. In this same period demolitions will continue on the remaining shanties on around Dennis Pratt road. In the second week the section between Kileleshwa to Westlands roundabout will be cleared including the Kileleshwa James Gichuru road section.

Northern bypass

In the third week demolitions will shift to the Nairobi Northern bypass. Illegal structures between Kiu river and Kahawa West will be demolished. This will be followed by Kamae slums. Three days will be required to clear Githogoro Village in Runda.

Nairobi Eastern bypass

Five days will be required to clear Embakasi village to Kangundo road on the Eastern by pass.

Kisii Bypass

The Kisii By-pass is located in Kisii town in Kisii Central District with a total length of 6.5km and a proposed width of 40m. The bypass commences off the Kericho - Kisii road (B3) at Daraja Moja bridge as one approaches Kisii town from Keroka. Through a more or less northerly direction, the bypass covers a distance of about 3km to a proposed traffic interchange. At this point the road branches into two arms. One arm takes a more or less south - westerly direction and joins the B3 at Daraja Mbili bridge in Kisii town. The length of this arm is 0.5km.

The other arm continues on a more or less north – westerly direction to end at Nyamataro junction on the Isabenia – Kisii – Kisumu road (A1). The length of this stretch is 3.0km. The section between Daraja Moja junction and the proposed interchange, for the first stretch of 3km falls under trust land, while the remaining section of 3km falls under freehold land.

There is an existing earth road 4.5m wide within the section of the freehold land. The required corridor will need to be acquired by compensating the land owners.

Encroachment

The following area is encroached upon on the Kisii by pass.

- At the junction of the bypass and B3 road, a story business premise is erected within the proposed bypass

Mombasa, Kisumu, Nakuru bypasses

The information regarding these bypasses is being compiled.

Country wide Demolitions

The Minister for Roads, Public Works and Housing Hon. Raila A. Odinga issued a notice contained in gazette notice no. 3532 of 6th June 2003 that all illegal structures already existing on the road reserves should be removed within 30 (days) of the said notice. Failure to comply would result in the demolition of such illegal structures. Another notice was issued on the 6th of August, 2003 reminding the general public that the deadline set in the gazette

notice of 6th June 2003 had expired and all illegal structures on road reserves will be demolished.

With the expiry of this notice the demolitions are going on countrywide according to reports received from the districts and the provinces. The details regarding the road reserve widths are available together with the drawings/plans showing the roads.

ROAD MAINTENANCE BRANCH

I. GENERAL

Road Maintenance Branch has two sections, namely:-

1. Trunk Roads consisting of classes A,B and C.
2. Feeder Roads consisting of DRC roads and R2000.

The total classified road network is 63,300km made up 54,700km of unpaved roads and 8600km of paved roads. About 43% of the classified network is in maintainable condition and the balance (about 57%) need to be rehabilitated to be brought to maintainable condition.

Maintenance activities include periodic (resealing/regravelling), routine (grading, patching, vegetation control, drainage works) and emergencies such as washouts.

The Branch has endeavoured to enhance maintenance by trying to eliminate potholes and spot sealing on tarmac roads, grading, bush clearing, drainage works and spot improvement all geared towards improvement of road safety, reduction on travel time and vehicle operating costs.

Enumerated below are some of the actions taken towards realizing the intended goals.

II. PROCUREMENT OF VEHICLES/EQUIPMENT:-

During the PREs' meeting held on 8th May, 2003 in the office of the PSE(M), it was recommended that road maintenance fleet be strengthened by purchasing supervisory vehicles, tippers, graders, dozers, loaders etc so that by the end of three years districts and provinces will be having optimum fleet holding.

The progress achieved towards this end is as follows:

- i) The following were bought and issued out on a priority basis to districts/provinces on 22nd September, 2003. The Minister officiated at the flagging off ceremony.

V) OTHER ACTIVITIES

Some other activities have been/are being carried out such as:-

- Clearing/Installation of culverts
- Cleaning of side/mitre drains
- Protection works
- Heavy Grading Of Isiolo – Moyale Road (A2)

Because of the very bad condition of this 514- km road, especially between Moyale and Marsabit, Nairobi-bound vehicles from Moyale have been using the Moyale-Wajir-Garissa-Nairobi route, making the journey longer by about 200Km.

Towards improving this road, the PWO was issued with money (KSh.12.8m) to carry out heavy grading on this road instead of the money being given to the districts which the road traverses namely Isiolo, Samburu, Marsabit and Moyale.

The PWO hired three graders from CM&TE. These together with two more from the province are already working on the road. One of the graders is working from Moyale, whereas the other is working between Merille and Marsabit. The three from CM&TE are working from Isiolo. So far over 130 km has been graded from Isiolo and the vehicles from Marsabit/Moyale no longer go through Garissa.
