## CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

The Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill 2019 (National Assembly Bill No.19) on amendment of Article 90 of the Constitution underwent First Reading on 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 2019. Thereafter, the Bill was committed to the Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs to review and report to the House pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 216(5) (c).

During its Sitting held on 4<sup>th</sup> July, 2019, the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs resolved to undertake public hearings on the Bill. Subsequently, the Committee through local daily newspapers of Monday 26<sup>th</sup> August and Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October, 2019 invited members of the public and organizations to attend public hearings and submit their views or make oral presentations regarding the Bill.

The Public hearings took place in the Counties of Nairobi, Machakos, Mombasa, Kisumu, Kakamega, Eldoret, Nakuru, Nyeri, Meru, Turkana and Wajir during which members of the public either individually or representing institutions and organizations made presentations and submitted memoranda which the Committee took into account while considering the Bill.

May I take this opportunity to express gratitude to Committee Members for their resilience and devotion to duty which made the consideration of the Bill successful. May I also appreciate the Speaker and Clerk of National Assembly for always providing guidance and direction to Committees in the discharge of their mandate. Finally, I commend the secretariat for exemplary performance in providing technical and logistical support to the Committee.

## CHAPTER 1

### 1.0 PREFACE

#### 1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

1. The Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs derives its mandate from Standing Order No. 216(5) which provides for the functions of Departmental Committees as follows-

  - (j) Examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

## 2.0 BACKGROUND

### 2.1 Memorandum of objects and reasons

6. The principal object of the Bill Seeks to amend Article 90 of the Constitution to align it with the proposed amendment to Section 35 of the Election Act No. 24 of 2011 which seeks to change the timing for submission of party lists by Political Parties for persons elected under Article 90 of the Constitution from at least forty-five (45) days from the date of General Election to within twenty-one (21) days after the date of general election.

7. Article 90 of the Constitution which is proposed to be amended states that;

*“Elections for the seats in Parliament provided for under Articles 97 (1) (c) and 98 (1) (b), (c) and (d), and for the Members of County Assemblies under 177 (1) (b) and (c) shall be on the basis of proportional representation by use of part lists.*

1. *The Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission shall be responsible for the conduct and supervision of elections for seats provided for under clause (1) and shall ensure that-*

- a. *Each political party participating in a general election nominates and submits a list of all the persons who would stand elected if the party were to be entitled to all the seats provided for under clause (1), within the time prescribed by national legislation;*
- b. *Except the case of the seats provided under Article 98 (1) (b), each party list comprises the appropriate number of qualified candidates and alternates between male and female candidates in the priority in which they are listed; and*
- c. *Except in the case of county assembly seats, each party list reflects the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.*

2. *The seats referred to clause (1) shall be allocated to political parties in proportion to the total number of seats won by candidates of the political party at the general election”*

8. Section 35 of the Election Act No. 24 of 2011 on submission of party lists states that;

*“A political party shall submit its party list to the Commission on the same day as the day designated for submission to the Commission by political parties of nominations of candidates for an election before the nomination of candidates under Article 97 (1) (a) and (b), 98 (1) (a) and 177 (1) (a) of the Constitution”*

9. The Bill concerns county governments within the meaning of Article 110 of the Constitution. The enactment of this Bill will occasion additional expenditure of public funds.
10. The Bill does don't delegate legislative powers nor does it limit fundamental rights and freedoms.

### 3.0 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE REVIEW OF THE BILL

11. The Committee undertook public participation on the Bill in line with the provision of Article 118 (1) (b) of the Constitution read together with Standing Order 127 (3). Adverts inviting the public to make any submission regarding the proposed amendment were put on local daily newspapers of Monday 26<sup>th</sup> August and Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October, 2019 as attached to the report as Annexure 3.
12. In addition the Committee resolved to undertake public hearings for the bill in a number of counties where members of the public either individually or representing institutions and organizations made presentations and submitted memoranda which the Committee took into account while considering the Bill.
13. The Committee conducted public hearings in the following counties;
  - (i) Nairobi County to seek views from the capital city and its environs;
  - (ii) Machakos County to seek views from the lower Eastern region and environs;
  - (iii) Mombasa County to seek views from the Coastal region;
  - (iv) Kisumu County to seek views from the Nyanza region;
  - (v) Kakamega County to seek views from the Western region;
  - (vi) Meru County to seek views from the Eastern region;
  - (vii) Uasin Gishu County to seek views from the Central Rift Valley region;
  - (viii) Nakuru County to seek views from the Rift Valley region;
  - (ix) Nyeri County to seek views from the Central Kenya region
  - (x) Turkana County to seek views from the Rift Valley
  - (xi) Wajir County to seek views from North Eastern region

19. The public hearing took place in County ICT Hall (Wajir County) on 1st November, 2019.
20. In compiling this report, the committee considered submissions by members of the public on the subject matter.
21. Several members of the public either individually or representing institutions and organizations submitted their views to the Committee by way of written and oral submissions.
22. A comprehensive list of members of the public who attended the public hearings in the various counties is attached to this report as annexure 4.
23. The matrixes noting the general comments in support or against the amendments are attached to the report as annexure 5.
24. The matrix also documents various proposed amendments to the Bills by members of the public and institutions.
25. 32 percent of the participants across the counties supported the amendment Bill. Highlights of supporting views were captured as follows;
  - (a) Mr. Benard Musyoki of Machakos County submitted that nomination lists should be submitted after elections.
  - (b) In Mombasa, Godfrey Mae, Joseph Mutue Nyamu, Village Elder, Mwasiri Sinangoa, Deputy County Registrar of Persons stated that nomination lists should be submitted before elections
  - (c) In Wajir, Mr. Abdullahi Mohamed and Mr. Abdi Gillow supported the amendments but proposed that those who contest and lose elections should not be considered for nomination and proposed that nomination positions to be reserved for minority groups.
  - (d) Moses Kendagor from Uasin Ngishu County supported the amendment as it will enable political parties to know the exact numbers of person they'll be entitled to nominate based on party strength after the election.
  - (e) Paul Lemiso from Soy sub-county supported the Bill as it will protect persons who had campaigned for a political party but lost at election as they will be able to be nominated.
  - (f) James Sirma from Uasin Ngishu County supported the Bill as all persons are entitled to be nominated including election losers.

- (g) Charles Koisir, a village leader from Ainabkoi sub-county supported the Bill so that nomination lists are submitted after the election.
26. 68 percent of the participants across the counties opposed approval of the amendment Bill. Highlights of opposing views were captured as follows;
- (a) Political parties will misuse the opportunity and use it as a reward mechanism for undeserving persons and if passed the proposal would be subject to abuse.
  - (b) The current provision of the Constitution was framed as it is to avoid political mischief and if passed the amendment would allow election losers to be nominated and to the exclusion of other deserving persons.
  - (c) There was a good reason why the framers of the Constitution provided for party lists before elections.
  - (d) There is no legitimate reason why nomination slots should be there in the first place as they are used as employment opportunities for a select group in the society.
  - (e) **Jeff Abido from Nakuru** opposed the proposed amendments on grounds that nomination lists should be submitted before and not after election because political parties have been abusing chapter six of the Constitution through nomination lists.
  - (f) The proposed amendment will undermine transparency and accountability in determining deserving cases on the party list for nominations.
  - (g) **Daniel Wachira from Nyeri** opposed the amendment and proposed that the provision on nominated members should be done away with.
  - (h) **Magaret Nanyoko** from Meru opposed the amendments because party loyalists are often deceived into putting all efforts in campaigning for the party with no assurance of getting nominated.
  - (i) **Vincent Kihunju from Meru** opposed the amendment because it will give elected members an opportunity to influence the list.
  - (j) **Ms. Fatuma Yusuf from Wajir** opposed the amendment stating that both the provision in force and the proposed law does not address current bedevilling the nomination process. An amendment to change time for submission of party lists will not address the prevailing challenges.
  - (k) **Mr. Adan Salat from Wajir** opposed the amendment stating that that party secretaries are far away from the grassroots and are corrupt to the extent that change of time is not the panacea to the bigger problem on nominations. He further stated that all counties should concur for such an amendment Bill to be passed by Parliament.
  - (l) **Mr. Khalif Omar from Wajir** opposed the amendment and proposed that there should be political parties' reforms to enhance transparency and accountability in their activities such as nominations and involvement of their party grassroots.

#### 4.0 CONSIDERATION OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS BY THE COMMITTEE

##### 4.1 Proposed amendment to Article 90 of the Constitution

Article 90 of the Constitution is amended in clause (2) (a) by deleting the words “*who would stand elected if the party were to be entitled to all seats provided for*”

27. The amendment seeks to align Article 90 with the proposed amendment to section 35 of the Elections Act to change the timing for submission of party lists by political parties for persons elected under Article 90 of the Constitution from at least forty – five days from the date of the general election to within twenty one days after the date of the general election.

##### Article constitution which is proposed to be amended provides for

##### On Allocation of party list seats;

28. Elections for the seats in Parliament provided for under Articles 97(1)(c) and 98(1)(b), (c) and (d), and for the members of county assemblies under article 177(1)(b) and (c), shall be on the basis of proportional representation by use of party lists.
29. The Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission shall be responsible for the conduct and supervision of elections for seats provided for under clause (1) and shall ensure that;
  - (a) each political party participating in a general election nominates and submits a list of all the persons who would stand elected if the party were to be entitled to all the seats provided for under clause (1), within the time prescribed by national legislation;
  - (b) Except in the case of th seats provided for under Article 98(1)(b), each party list comprises the appropriate number of qualified candidates and alternates between male and female candidates in the priority in which they are listed; and;
  - (c) Except in the case of county assembly seats, each party list reflects the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.
30. The seats referred to in clause (1) shall be allocated to political parties in proportion to the total number of seats won by candidates of the political party at the general election.

##### 4.2 Committee observations

31. The Committee observed as follows;

- (a) The proposed amendment may lead to abuse of the process by parties and act as a reward to political cronies.
- (b) The amendment will enhance intra party competition at the electioneering period. The current position makes aspirants on the party list complacent and do not do much for the party in campaigns. Those who miss out on the party list tend to avoid engagement in party activities.
- (c) Based on presentations by members of the public it appears that the proposed amendment is not popular with a large portion of the electorate.


**Committee Recommendation**

32. The Committee recommended that the amendment should not be approved on grounds that during the drafting and public participation phase of the Constitution the matter on election was not a contentious and majority of Kenyans opposed the proposed amendment during the public hearings.

CHAPTER 5

5.0 RECOMMENDATION

The Committee having facilitated public participation and considered the proposed amendment to Article 90 of the Constitution recommends to the House that the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill, 2019 (National Assembly Bill No.19 should not be proceeded with.

# Speaker Muturi to rule on legality of CASs

National Assembly Speaker Justin Muturi will this week make a ruling on the legality of the Chief Administrative Secretaries (CASs) and whether they have executive powers to appear before Parliament to answer questions addressed to their Cabinet secretaries.

If Muturi goes by demands by MPs to declare CASs unfit to address parliamentary committees, he will automatically reduce them to administrative work in the ministries.

The move is likely to trigger a fresh row between the legislature and the Executive. The matter was triggered by Kimillili MP Didmus Baraza who rejected an answer by Health CAS Rashid Aman insisting that he does not have the authority to give the ministry's official position.

Muturi will largely rely on Article 153 (3) of the Constitution that obligates Cabinet Secretaries to appear before committees of the National Assembly or the Senate to answer questions on matters that fall within their dockets.

In the recent past, CASs have been appearing before relevant House

committees to answer to matters regarding their ministries on behalf of the Cabinet Secretaries.

This move has seemingly angered MPs who claim functions of a Cabinet Secretary are solely held by the appointed individual.

### Appear in person

"This is not a function that a CS can delegate. The requirement is for the minister to appear before the committee," said David Ochieng (Uguyua).

Majority Leader Aden Duale reiterated that members' questions must strictly be answered by Cab-

net secretaries

"I think the Constitution is very clear that it is the CSs. We need the Speaker to give direction because we agreed last week that if the CS is not available, he can pick another date," said Duale.

However, Duale defended the creation of the positions by President Kenyatta, saying the CASs were doing "a very good work" in helping ministries.

But Minority Leader John Mbadi faulted President Uhuru Kenyatta of creating positions which should have been created by the Constitution.

# President: State will get killers of GSU officers

President says Kenyans will not succumb to cowardly acts of misguided elements out to compromise citizens safety

President Uhuru Kenyatta yesterday said the government will pursue and bring to justice killers of 11 officers from the elite Recce Squad Unit of the General Service Unit (GSU).

In a message of condolence to the families of the officers, who died when their vehicle ran over an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) at Degow in Garissa county on Saturday evening, the President, through State House Spokesperson Kanze Dena-Mararo, said Kenyans will not succumb to the "cowardly acts of misguided elements out to compromise the safety and security of the citizens".

Interior CS Fred Matiang'i and Inspector General of Police Hillary Mutiyambai said reinforcement had been sent to the area to pursue the attackers as investigations were launched into the attack.

### Terror fight

"I extend my deepest sympathies and profound solidarity with the families of our gallant officers who lost their lives in Garissa last night. Their selfless patriotic sacrifice to serve Kenya renews our resolve in the fight against terror," said Matiang'i.

The officers from the Harhar GSU camp were on routine security patrol in a Toyota Land Cruiser on the road between Liboi and Damajale near the Kenya-Somalia border when the vehicle ran over an IED. They all died on the spot.

It is suspected the attackers left the scene after planting the explosives unlike in the past where they have stolen officers' weapons.

The police headquarters yesterday said the response team recovered 15 hand grenades, an M16 rifle, six damaged G3 rifles, three Ak47 rifles, nine body armours, four ballistic helmets, a grenade launcher and two Fragmented Rifle Grenades (FRGs).

The bodies of the 11 were yesterday airlifted to Nairobi and received by Matiang'i and Mutiyambai before being transferred to the Kenyatta University mortuary at around noon.

The Saturday attack brings to more than 30 of Kenya's lives since the 2011 separate attacks.

killed when their Armoured Personnel Carrier was hit by a Rocket Propelled Grenade in Elwak area, Mandera county.


The attack came barely a fortnight after anti-terrorism police thwarted what would have been the worst terror attack in the Coastal region during the Mashujaa Day celebrations and other major installations.

Yesterday, leaders condemned the attack and mourned the officers with the Garissa Governor Ali Korane saying: "We are saddened by the news of the death of 11 police officers killed in an IED attack along Liboi-Damajale road, Garissa County. I extend my condolences to their family, relatives, and colleagues."

The latest attack which claimed elite officers has raised questions why they were not using the Armoured Personnel Carriers (APCs) that were brought to ensure safety of security officers in the volatile area.

But even then, the reliability of APCs have been questioned after some of them were extensively damaged in the previous attacks. For instance, in the Garissa attack, the eight officers

Inside the KQ flight cancellations sinkhole

The airline has already cancelled 52 flights in 18 days of August alone

Kenya Airways has cancelled more than 52 flights in the first 18 days of August and delayed 40 per cent of its successful trips this year at an astronomical cost to the taxpayer.

According to a confidential memo, which opens a window into what ails the loss-making carrier, frequent cancellations load the airlines with huge accommodation costs that stood at Sh118 million in the last seven months of 2019.

The troubled airline, known by its international code, KQ, posted a Sh7.55 billion net loss for the year ending December 2018 as higher costs offset a jump in revenue.

The company's rising revenue hit Sh114.18 billion, largely driven by passenger bookings.

In the last two months, the airline has faced a barrage of complaints from customers over frequent cancellations and delays of flights. This has seen the government come in seeking an explanation from the airline.

Sources say the trigger of the hard questions that have put the top airline management on the spot was a flight cancellation involving a member of the First Family in Paris early this month.

A confidential internal analysis of the airline's 2019 on time performance (OTP) for this year shows that 182 of the cancelled flights were caused by crew shortage occasioned by pilots and crew failing to turn up for work.

Under the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) now in place, pilots can be absent from work for up to 48 hours without providing any medical evidence, something sources say is now being misused, leading to the increasing cases of crew shortage-driven flight cancellations.

"During flight delayed or cancelled, Kenya Airways is expected to provide essential services such as accommodation, meals, ground transportation as the situation requires. With an increasing number of

these incidents the costs of hotel accommodation and meals have been above budget by 250 per cent," the memo says.

The KQ Chief Executive Officer Sebastian Mikosz told staff on Thursday in an internal newsletter that since the beginning of summer schedule, "our OTP (on time performance) performance has deteriorated significantly due to crew constraints."

The total number of guests who have been provided with accommodation on account of delays stood at 19,345 for the seven months, or an average of 2,764 per month, haemorrhaging a carrier that has been struggling to stay afloat for many years.

The state of affairs has triggered a blame game between the airline management and unionisable staff.

In what is now emerging as a silent go-slow among the staff, which includes its pilots, the carrier is on the spot as its delayed and cancelled flights rise through the month of August.

The airline's average on time performance at 15 minutes in the seven months of this year, stood at 77 per cent, having dropped from 82 per cent over similar period last year.

"The main factors that have affected OTP include technical issues, crew constraint, ATC (air traffic congestion) in European destinations and radar failure in Nairobi," Mr Mikosz says in the Thursday newsletter.

According to the analysis, KQ has so far cancelled more than 52 flights in the 18 days of August alone, its highest so far this year, as pilots' unavailability becomes a sticking issue, with insiders saying that the CBA it signed with the Kenya Airlines Pilots Association (Kalpa) biting hard.

The agreement reached two years ago after a protracted strike, allows the airline to seek only seek Embraer-rated pilots, leaving the other fleet un-

der-piloted. The data shows that out of the airline's 35,035 successful departures this year, only 22,426 (or 60 per cent) were on time, with 2,814 having been delayed by more than an hour. More than 9,600 departures having suffered delays of up to one hour.

FlightStats, the OTP (arrived July 2019 report for Middle East and African airlines ranks KQ position seven, with the worst average delay of 61.1 per cent of the 13 airlines polled.

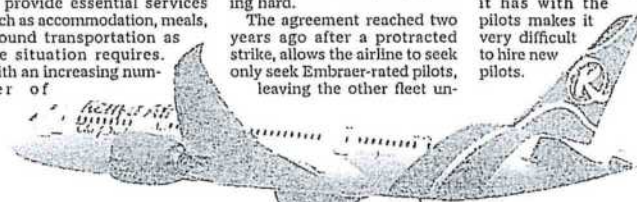
Contacted, KQ defended its position, saying that pilots were to blame for the rise in the flight disruptions under the crew shortage reasons, mostly because of the "restrictive CBA the airline has with pilots."

"Since last year, we have been seeking to recruit contractors across the fleet (those trained and authorised to fly the different models (Boeing, Embraers like all other airlines do. However, due to the very restriction by pilots, we are only allowed to recruit pilots on the Embraer fleet. You will appreciate that in this part of the world, Embraer is a relatively new aircraft so there are very few trained pilots capable of flying this type of aircraft," KQ's head of corporate affairs Dennis Kashero said in a response to our email enquiries.

Nation has learnt that a board committee meeting that took place on Thursday last week is expected to brief Transport Cabinet Secretary James Macharia on the steps the airline is taking to address the problem.

"It is true that they met last week and I am awaiting the report. At the same time, we have given the management full support as they renegotiate the CBA with the pilots. Our position is clear that we will not allow any sabotage of such a national asset from any quarters as we try to seek the best for the airline," Mr Macharia told Nation yesterday. Kalpa CEO Captain Muriithi Nyaga said that it is inaccurate to place the blame on pilots for the increasing cases of Kenya Airways flights cancellations.

Sources in government say that the airline is now stuck in a rut, as the current CBA it has with the pilots makes it very difficult to hire new pilots.

# Japan, EU put on the spot over ivory trade

Kenya has a population of 35,000 elephants

Japan and the EU were criticised on Wednesday for failing to close their ivory markets as recommended at the 2016 high-level wildlife summit.

The two countries have not honoured the commitment made by parties during the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, Conference, in Johannesburg, South Africa. Elephants are declining significantly throughout Africa and Asia. Kenya has 35,000 elephants.

Tourism CAS Joseph Bolnnet and acting Director Biodiversity, Research and Planning at KWS are in the Kenyan delegation at this year's CITES conference in Geneva, Switzerland. Kenya's position is that all legal ivory markets, whether in Asia or Europe or anywhere else in the world, fuels illegal trade, poaching and killing of elephants.

Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ethiopia, Gabon, Liberia, the Niger, Nigeria and the Syrian Arab Republic

also the trade closed.

The parties to CITES took issue with countries that still host domestic ivory markets, urging them to shut them. Further, they insisted that compliance measures for countries with stockpiles need to be strengthened.

On April 30, 2016, Kenya set ablaze 105 tonnes of elephant ivory and 1.35 tonnes of rhino horn to smouldering ash. President Uhuru Kenyatta led world leaders and conservationists in burning the remains of some 6,500 elephants and 450 rhinos killed for their tusks.

"For us, Ivory is worthless unless it is on our elephants," Uhuru said.

The move was meant to send a message to the world that Ivory has no value and that its trade should be banned. Every year, at least 20,000 African elephants are killed illegally for their Ivory.

Parties to CITES such as Kenya feel that only bold action will help save this iconic animal from becoming extinct in many parts of its range within the decade. Some countries, however, still prefer keeping their stockpiles.

## SFR allocating maize illegally, miller claims

AGATHA NGOTHO/ A maize miller has complained of illegal allocation of the 2 million bags to be released by the Strategic Food Reserve board.

The miller, who did not want to be named, said some of the maize has been allocated to traders and some MCAs disguised as independent millers. "Apart from millers from the Cereal Millers Association (largescale millers) and the United Grain Millers Association (smallscale millers),

the culprits hide under independent millers, he said.

The Strategic Food Reserve chairman Noah Wekesa said the board is selling the last consignment of maize stock at the National Cereals and Produce Board. Wekesa said they are yet to release the maize to millers. "We've made the allocations and we are waiting to open an account possibly by today (Friday) where the last sales will be paid."

# Governors to appeal ruling on office exit

CoG chair Oparanya says reactive barring charged county chiefs from office is causing confusion

The Council of Governors (CoG) has said it will appeal Justice Mumbi Ngugi's ruling that governors charged with economic crimes vacate office during the duration of their trial.

They said the ruling violated the rights of accused persons and has triggered paralysis and confusion in counties.

Addressing a press conference yesterday at the Council headquarters at Delta House, Nairobi, CoG chair Wycliffe Oparanya said the ruling infringed on the rule of natural justice that accused persons are innocent until proven guilty. "Arraigning a governor and denying him access to his offices will emotionally charge the public."

Oparanya said the court decision essentially nullified the out of office Kiambu Governor Ferdinand Waititu and his Samburu counterpart Moina Moina.

After July 24, ruling, Justice Ngugi said governors, just like other civil servants should stay away from the office until their cases are heard and determined. Justice Ngugi declared section 62 (6) of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, which State officers have been citing to remain in office as unconstitutional.

## Strayed public

The judge held that a governor cannot remain in office to serve his constituents yet he had betrayed the public trust donated to him.

Oparanya said Justice Ngugi's ruling has thrown the affected county governments into confusion and mayhem as deputy governors struggle for powers to fill the devoid vacancy.

Case in point is Kiambu Deputy Governor James Nyoro who took over operations of the county in an acting capacity, in accordance with article 175 (5) of the Constitution, which states that when the county governor is absent, the deputy county governor shall act as the county governor.

"You can see what is happening in Kiambu. Now, the Deputy Governor is pretending to have taken over and wants to sack and transfer others. The Law, County Governments Act is clear on what a deputy governor can do and what he

cannot do," he said.

For years, an argument has thrived that as long as accused persons are treated as innocent until proven guilty, then they continue to serve to enjoy the trappings that come with power.

However, governors and other State officers were relying on Section 62 Subsection 6 of the same Act that provides: "This section does not apply with respect to an office, if the Constitution limits or provides for the grounds upon which a holder of the office may be removed or the circumstances in which the office must be vacated."

Nevertheless, it will not be walk in the park for the governors' lobby to overturn the ruling given that the appeals by Lenolkulal and Waititu have both flopped.

Before Justice Ngugi's ruling, county governors would plead not guilty to a case, as it was for Busia Governor Sospeter Ojiamong, who secured release by paying cash bail and return to his official duties. But any other public officer, including Cabinet secretaries, would be suspended as soon as they were charged based on Section 62 of the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act of 2003.

# Atwoli defends Knut move to join Cotu, says decision ratified

The Central Organisation of Trade Unions (Cotu) yesterday defended the move by Kenya National Union of Teachers (Knut) to join it as an affiliate saying the decision was legally ratified.

Cotu-K dismissed claims that Knut's secretary general Nelson Sossion single-handedly dragged Knut as its affiliate and maintained the move was fully sanctioned by the teachers' top decision-making body.

The workers umbrella body also distanced itself from the ongoing internal wrangles in the teachers union and urged all the parties to sort out the mess through dialogue.

In a statement, Cotu-K secretary general Francis Atwoli said as an umbrella body for workers, it does not involve itself in coups and will never engage or be party to attempts aimed at removing any duly-elected official.

## Petty politics

Cotu-K has since urged Knut officials to keep off the workers' umbrella body saying it "cannot entertain such petty

trade unions politics in our operation."

"Cotu-K is shocked at claims going round that Sossion single-handedly dragged Knut into affiliating with Cotu-K. This is a blunted lie and Cotu-K is not ready to engage in such rumours being peddled by some Knut officials keen to drag the name of Cotu-K into internal affairs of Knut," said Atwoli.

He added that Sossion, pursuant to the decision made at 61st Annual Delegates Conference (ADC), officially wrote to Cotu-K informing them of teachers decision.
