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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

On Thursday 15th March, 2018 the Speaker of the National Assembly conveyed a message from H.E. the President to the House regarding nomination of Principal Secretaries and of High Commissioners/Ambassadors in his Government. Further, he informed the House that pursuant to Article 152(2) and Article 155(3) of the Constitution, the National Assembly should expedite the approval hearings of the nominees. The Speaker therefore referred the names of the nominees to the relevant Committees to conduct approval hearings.

Mr. Harry Kimtai has been nominated by H.E the President. Pursuant to Article 155 (3) of the Constitution, the President is required to nominate a person for appointment as a Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission; and with approval of the National Assembly. Having been forwarded to the National Assembly, the House is obligated to conduct approval hearings and make a determination of the nominee' suitability or otherwise within fourteen days as provided for in section 8(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The Speaker referred the name of the nominee and his curriculum vitae to the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock for vetting.

The Speaker further directed the Committees to conduct extensive public participation as provided for under Article 118 of the Constitution as well as the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. He further advised the Committees to conclude their reports and submit them to the House on or before **Wednesday 28th March**, 2018 to enable the House to consider and finalize on the nominees within the stipulated timelines.

The nominee was vetted on **Monday 26th March, 2018** based on the criteria set out in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 as well as the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and other relevant provisions of the law.

After the vetting, Mr. Harry Kimtai the Committee found him to be qualified and suitable to serve as the Principal Secretary, State Department for Livestock in the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation.

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The Committee appreciates the assistance provided by the Office of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly that enabled it to discharge its mandate during the approval hearing. I further wish to express my appreciation to the Honourable Members of the Committee who dedicated their time to participate in the activities of the Committee and preparation of this Report.

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199(6), it is my pleasant privilege and honour to present to this House the Report of the Committee on the vetting of **Mr. Harry Kimtai**, nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary in the **State Departments for Livestock**.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report contains the Committee's proceedings of the approval hearing of **Mr. Harry Kimtai** for appointment as the Principal Secretary, State Department for Livestock in the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation. Mr. Harry Kimtai had been nominated by H.E the President Pursuant to Article 155 (3) of the Constitution, the President is required to nominate a person for appointment as a Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission; and with approval of the National Assembly, appoint Principal Secretaries. Having been forwarded to the National Assembly, the House is obligated to conduct approval hearings and make a determination of the nominees' suitability or otherwise within fourteen days as provided for in section 8(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The Speaker referred the name of the nominee and his curriculum vitae to the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock for vetting.

On Monday 26th March, 2018 the Committee vetted the nominee under the criteria set out in: Article 155(3) of the Constitution; the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No.33 of 2011and Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No.33 of 2011

During vetting, the Committee observed that the nominee had been cleared for appointment by the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Registrar of Political Parties. The Committee further noted that due process was followed in the recruitment.

On his suitability for appointment, the Committee found Mr. Harry Kimati was eligible and qualified to serve as the Principal Secretary, State Department for Livestock

1.4 Message from H.E. the President on the Nominees for Appointment as the Principal Secretaries and High Commissioners/ Ambassadors

On Thursday 15th March, 2018 and pursuant to Standing Order 42(2), the Speaker of the National Assembly notified Members of the National Assembly of his receipt of the message from H.E. the President to the House regarding nominees for appointment to the positions of Principal Secretaries and of High Commissioners/ Ambassadors in his Government. Further, he informed the House that pursuant to Article 152(2) and Article 155(3) of the Constitution, the National Assembly should expedite the approval hearings of the nominees. The Speaker therefore referred the names of the nominees to the respective Committees to conduct approval hearings.

The Speaker further directed the Committees to conduct extensive public participation as provided for under Article 118 of the Constitution as well as the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. He further advised the Committees to conclude their reports and submit them to the House on or before Wednesday 28th March, 2018 to enable the House to consider and finalize on the nominees within the stipulated timelines.

1.5 Nomination and Appointment Process of Principal Secretaries

Pursuant to Article 155 (3) of the Constitution, the President is required to nominate a person for appointment as a Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission; and with approval of the National Assembly, appoint Principal Secretaries. Having been forwarded to the National Assembly, the House is obligated to conduct approval hearings and make a determination of the nominees' suitability or otherwise within fourteen days as provided for in section 8(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

1.6 Committee Proceedings

Based on its mandate, the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock was required to vet Mr. Harry Kimtai.

During the approval hearings, the Committee held a total of two sittings. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by the Constitution of Kenya, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No.33 of 2011 and the Standing Orders. The vetting process entailed meeting with the nominee, examining correspondence from the Ethics and Anti Corruption Commission, the Higher Education Loans Board, the Kenya Revenue Authority, Criminal Investigation Department and Registrar of Political Parties.

1.7 Committee Observations and Recommendations

1.7.1 Observations

- a) The Committee noted that due process was followed on the recruitment process as provided for by the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.
- b) The Committee noted that the nominee exhibited impressive knowledge of topical issues touching on Livestock and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as the Principal Secretary, State Department for Livestock in the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation.
- c) The Committee noted that the nominee had extensive public career having risen through the ranks from a Management Trainee at Kenya Revenue Authority to a Director at Capital Markets Authority. This is prove enough that the nominee has the experience of running public institutions.

1.7.2 Recommendation

The Committee's findings, as outlined in this report, enabled it to conclude that **Mr Harry Kimtai**, was suitable to serve as Principal Secretary in State Department for Livestock as nominated and accordingly approved the nominee for appointment.

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2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Legal Provisions

The criteria used in nomination and appointment of Principal Secretaries are set out in Article 155(3) of the Constitution and the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No.33 of 2011. Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No.33 of 2011 requires that the vetting Committee and indeed the House shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.

Standing Orders 42 and 45 provide for the manner in which messages from the President are communicated to the House and the procedure to be followed during approval hearings respectively.

2.2 Message from H.E. the President on the Nominees

On 14th March, 2018, H. E. the President communicated the names of the nominees for the positions of Principal Secretaries and Ambassadors/ High Commissioners to the Speaker for approval by the National Assembly pursuant to Articles 152(2) and 155(3) and Standing Order 45. In his Communication on 15th March, 2018 and Pursuant to Standing Order 42 regarding messages from President, the Speaker read H.E. the President's message and referred the names for the Principal Secretaries and the Ambassadors / High Commission to the relevant Departmental Committees to conduct approval hearings. Based on its mandate, the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock was asked to conduct approval hearings of the nominee to the State Departments for Livestock.

2.3 Clearance requirements

On Wednesday 16th March , 2018, the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the nominee informing him of the nomination by H.E. the President and he was requested to appear for vetting by the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock on Monday 26th March , 2018. He further requested the nominee to bring with him clearance certificate from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and Criminal Investigation Department (CID).

On the same date (16th March, 2018), the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the KRA, HELB, EACC, Registrar of Political Parties and CID, requesting for tax, university loans, integrity and criminal record status respectively of the nominee.

2.4 Notification to the Public

Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No.33 of 2011) provides that "any person may, prior to the approval hearing and by a written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".

On Wednesday 16th March, 2018, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statement on oath (**sworn affidavit**) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act 2011. The submissions were to be received latest by **Friday 23rd March, 2018**.

Pursuant to provisions of Article 118 of the Constitution, Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No.33 0f 2011) and Standing Order 45(3), the general public was also notified in the print media by the Clerk of the National Assembly on 16th March, 2018 of the intention of the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock to conduct the vetting and approval hearings of the nominee on **Monday 26th March, 2018**.

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS

The Committee met with the nominee on **Monday 26th March, 2018** and conducted approval hearings. During the process, the Committee was guided by the Constitution; Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011; Standing Orders and other relevant statutes. Specifically, the nominee was examined on the following criteria as set out in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011:-

(i) Academic qualifications
(ii) Employment record
(iii)Professional affiliations
(iv)Potential conflict of interest
(v) Knowledge of the relevant subject
(vi)Integrity

3.1 MR. HARRY KIMTAI - NOMINEE FOR APPOINTMENT AS THE PRINCIPAL SECTRETARY, STATE DEPARTMENT FOR LIVESTOCK

On Monday 26th March, 2018, Mr. Harry Kimtai appeared before the Committee for vetting. He was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during the vetting as follows:-

a. Self-introduction and Educational background

He is a Kenyan citizen born on 13th December, 1968 in Mt. Elgon, Bungoma County. He graduated in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree and Masters in Philosophy Economics(Regional Planning and Economics Development) from University of Bhopal University, India. **Work Experience**

The nominee informed the Committee that:-

He served in the following positions:-

- Director at Capital Markets Authority between 2016 -2017. His core responsibility was to provide strategic and policy guidance to the management of the Authority in accordance to the Capital Market Act.
- General Manager at Branded Fine Foods from 2008- 2014. His core responsibility was to manage imports and exports of the firm, operations, fleet management and logistics.
- Principal Revenue Officer at Kenya Revenue Officer from 2003- 2006
- Senior Revenue Officer at Kenya Revenue Authority from 2000-2002
- Revenue Officer II at Kenya Revenue Authority from 1998- 1999
- Management Trainee at Kenya Revenue Authority from 1996- 1999
- Director capital Market Authority from May 2016- May 2017
- Director Saharry Ltd from 2008 to date

b. Relationship with Oversight institutions

He submitted that if appointed, he will inculcate the spirit of cooperation and constructive engagement between all the oversight institutions such as Parliament, EACC and Office of the Auditor General with a view of ensuring enhanced oversight. He stated that he will honor court summons by providing clarification on matters that may require his attention.

He informed the Committee that livestock production should be viewed as an economic activity that should benefit farmers. He continued to state that due to his economic background that involves forecasting on market trends the livestock will be transformed to be beneficial to the Country. He will as well engage team work to ensure prosperity of the sector.

c. What impact will he bring in relation to this position

The nominee informed the Committee that the Department of Livestock had many Acts of Parliament that are not in line with the Constitution and if appointed he will propose the necessary amendments to these specific Acts of Parliament.

d. Legislation and policies in line with vision 2030 and the Big Four Agenda

He informed Members that livestock sector plays a vital role in promoting manufacturing under vision 2030 and the big four agenda specifically through supply of raw materials such as hide to the leather industry.

He noted that due to climatic change, pastoralist's communities are the hardest hit, however with measures such as livestock insurance policy which has helped in compensating farmers and innovative long term programmes will mitigate on vagaries of weather. He will also ensure prioritization in investment in water pans and solar bore holes.

e. Exportation of Beef Products to Middle East

The nominee noted that about 80% of economic activity in the Arid and Semi-Arid areas is dependent on livestock. He stated that under his leadership, Kenya meat commission will be revamped, he will also ensure more "disease free zones" are created and tap into private sector for investment into the livestock sector. He informed members that he will explore both export of live animals and promotion of manufacturing through provision of raw materials to the leather industries.

f. Intergovernmental Relations/ Capacity Building

He submitted that the National and County Government are independent and it is important for them to cooperate and consult for the purpose of enhancing relations. If appointed he will enhance relations between the two level of government. However, agriculture has been devolved and the State Department of Livestock is only left with formulation of policies and implementation of the same. He further stated that he will work closely with the county governments to implement the policies formulated by the National Government.

He specifically noted that some animal diseases affect several Counties and therefore there is need for cooperation and consultation in addressing such matters. He stated that he will make sure that livestock policy is developed, the policy will provide good working relations with the Counties.

He noted that capacity building of County employees is an important function of the National Government since all training institutions in the sector are managed by the National Government.

g. Integrity Issues

The nominee had no integrity issues before him and he has never been dismissed from any service. He has served all the public institutions with transparency and accountability and committed to continue in the same spirit. He stated that recommendations of reports from both the internal audit and Auditor General will be implemented.

h. Potential Conflict of Interest

He is among the three directors of a private firm Saharry limited which deals with clearing and forwarding, transport and cargo handling and bonded warehouse. However, he indicated that if his nomination is approved by the National Assembly he will resign from being a director which is a common practice. He further informed the Committee that he will declare conflict interest if it appears.

i. Political Activities and Affiliations

He stated that he had contested for the Mt. Elgon Constituency seat in 2017 as an independent candidate. He further submitted that he is currently not a member of any political party.

j. Management of Public Funds

He has been a civil servant who understands the Public Finance Management Act. He will ensure that policy guidelines are followed at all times to avoid misuse of public funds. The reports by the Auditor General and his recommendations will be fully implemented.

k. Net worthy

The nominee's net worth is 150 Million arising from his rental income and farming.

l. Honours and Awards

The nominee was awarded corporate governance training for director's certificate due to his outstanding performance.

m. Pro Bono/ Charity work

He has never participated in any pro- bono activity or made contributions to any charitable organization.

4.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

The Committee having considered his curriculum vitae and heard his oral submission during the vetting exercise/interview made the following observations: -

- (i) He is a Kenyan citizen born on 13th December, 1968 in Mt. Elgon, Bungoma County.
- (ii) He graduated in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree and Masters in Philosophy Economics (Regional Planning and Economics Development) in 1995 from University of Bhopal University, India.
- (iii) His experience in both the public and private sector would add value in the State Department for Livestock if appointed.
- (iv) There was no Memorandum received contesting his nomination and suitability for appointment
- (v) The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission confirmed that he had satisfied the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya on leadership and integrity.

- (vi) He had been cleared by the Criminal Investigation Department (CID), Kenya Revenue Authority on tax compliance, Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Credit Reference Bureau.
- (vii) He has never been charged in a Court of Law and has no potential conflict of interest.
- (viii) He has never been dismissed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution which deals with conduct of state officers and has never been adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any Commission of Inquiry.
- (ix) He is not a member of any political party neither does he hold any political office.
- (x) He exhibited knowledge and understanding of the mandate and other pertinent issues related to livestock.

The Committee noted that the nominee exhibited impressive knowledge of topical issues touching on Livestock and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as the Principal Secretary, State Department for Livestock in the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation.

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Having conducted approval hearings for the nominee and pursuant to Article 155(3) of the Constitution and Section 8(2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011; the Committee recommends that this House approves Mr. Harry Kimtai for appointment by H.E. the President as Principal Secretary, State Department for Livestock in the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation.

The Chairperson called the meeting to order at 10.00 am followed by a prayer from the Hon. Gabriel Kago Mukuha, M.P. He further requested all present to make self-introduction. The

Chairperson Vice- Chairperson agenda of the day was unanimously adopted as "vetting of the nominee for appointment as the Principal Secretary State Department for Livestock, Mr. Harry Kimtai"

MIN.NO.DC/ALF/071/2018: APPROVAL HEARING FOR THE NOMINEE FOR APPOINTMENT AS THE PRINCIPAL SECRETARY STATE DEPARTMENT FOR LIVESTOCK, MR HARRY KIMTAI

Mr. Harry Kimtai appeared before the Committee for vetting where he was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during the vetting as follows:-

a. Self-introduction and Educational background

He is a Kenyan citizen born on 13th December, 1968 in Mt. Elgon, Bungoma County. He is married and has three children the oldest is at the University and the rest are in secondary school. He graduated in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree and Masters in Philosophy Economics(Regional Planning and Economics Development) from Bhopal University, India.

b. Work Experience

The nominee informed the Committee that:-

- He has been a director at Capital Markets Authority between 2016 -2017. His core responsibility was to provide strategic and policy guidance to the management of the Authority in accordance to the Capital Market Act.
- General Manager at Branded Fine Foods from 2008- 2014. His core responsibility was to manage imports and exports of the firm, operations, fleet management and logistics.
- Principal Revenue Officer at Kenya Revenue Officer from 2003- 2006
- Senior Revenue Officer at Kenya Revenue Authority from 2000- 2002
- Revenue Officer II at Kenya Revenue Authority from 1998- 1999
- Management Trainee at Kenya Revenue Authority from 1996- 1999
- Director capital Market Authority from May 2016- May 2017
- Director Saharry Ltd from 2008 to date
- c. Relationship with Oversight institutions

He submitted that if appointed, he will inculcate the spirit of cooperation and constructive engagement between all the oversight institutions such as Parliament, EACC and Office of the Auditor General with a view of ensuring enhanced oversight. He stated that he will honor court

summons by providing clarification on matters that may require his attention. Mismatch in career from an economist to Principal Secretary Livestock

He informed the committee that livestock production should be viewed as an economic activity that should benefit farmers. He continued to state that due to his economic background that involves forecasting on market trends the livestock will be transformed to be beneficial to the Country. He will as well engage team work to ensure prosperity of the sector.

d. What impact will he bring in relation to this position?

The nominee informed the Committee that the Department of Livestock had many Acts of Parliament that are not in line with the Constitution and if appointed he will propose the necessary amendments to these specific Acts of Parliament.

e. Legislation and policies in line with vision 2030 and the Big Four Agenda

He informed members that livestock sector plays a vital role in promoting manufacturing under vision 2030 and the big four agenda specifically through supply of raw materials such as hide to the leather industry.

He noted that due to climatic change, pastoralist's communities are the hardest hit however with measures such as insurance policy which has helped in compensating farmers and the need of long term programmes to mitigate on vagaries of weather. He will also ensure investment in water pans and solar bore holes are some of the measures he will institute.

f. Exportation of Beef Products to Middle East

The nominee noted that about 80% of economic activity in the Arid and Semi-Arid areas is dependent on livestock. He stated that under his leadership, Kenya meat commission will be revamped, he will also ensure more "disease free zones" are created and tap into private sector for investment into the livestock sector. He informed members that he will explore both export of live animals and promotion of manufacturing through the leather industries.

g. Intergovernmental Relations/ Capacity Building

He submitted that the National and County Government are independent and it is important for them to cooperate and consult for the purpose of enhancing relations. If appointed he will enhance relations between the two level of government. However agriculture has been devolved and the State Department of Livestock is only left with formulation of policies and implementation of the same. He further stated that he will work closely with the county governments to implement the policies formulated by the National Government.

He specifically noted that some animal diseases affect several Counties and therefore there is need for cooperation and consultation in addressing such matters. He stated that he will make sure that livestock policy is developed, the policy will provide good working relations with the Counties. He noted that capacity building of County employees is an important function of the National Government since all training institutions in the sector are managed by the National Government.

h. Integrity Issues

The nominee had no integrity issues before him and he has never been dismissed from any service. He has served all the public institutions with transparency and accountability and committed to continue in the same spirit. He stated that recommendations of reports from both the internal audit and Auditor General will be implemented.

i. Potential Conflict of Interest

He is among the three directors of a private firm Saharry limited which deals with clearing and forwarding, transport and cargo handling and bonded warehouse. However he indicated that if his nomination is approved by the National Assembly he will resign from being a director which is a common practice. He further informed the Committee that he will declare conflict interest if it appears.

j. Political Activities and Affiliations

He stated that he had contested for the Mt. Elgon Constituency seat in 2017 as an independent candidate. He further submitted that he is currently not a member of any political party. k. Management of Public Funds

He has been a civil servant who understands the Public Finance Management Act. He will ensure that policy guidelines are followed at all times to avoid misuse of public funds. The reports by the Auditor General and his recommendations will be fully implemented.

I. Net worthy

The nominee's net worth is 150 Million arising from his rental income and farming.

m. Honours and Awards

The nominee was awarded corporate governance training for director's certificate due to his outstanding performance.

n. Pro Bono/ Charity work

He has never participated in any pro- bono activity or made contributions to any charitable organization.

Committee Observations

The Committee having considered his curriculum vitae and heard his oral submission during the vetting exercise/interview made the following observations:-

- (i) He is a Kenyan citizen born on 13th December, 1968 in Mt. Elgon, Bungoma County.
- (ii) He graduated in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree and Masters in Philosophy Economics (Regional Planning and Economics Development) in 1995 from University of Bhopal University, India.
- (iii) His experience in both the public and private sector would add value in the State Department for Livestock if appointed.
- (iv) There was no Memorandum received contesting his nomination and suitability for appointment
- (v) The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission confirmed that he had satisfied the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya on leadership and integrity.
- (vi) He had been cleared by the Criminal Investigation Department (CID), Kenya Revenue Authority on tax compliance, Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Credit Reference Bureau.
- (vii) He has never been charged in a Court of Law and has no potential conflict of interest.
- (viii) He has never been dismissed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution which deals with conduct of state officers and has never been adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any Commission of Inquiry.
- (ix) He is not a member of any political party neither does he hold any political office.
- (x) He exhibited knowledge and understanding of the mandate and other pertinent issues related to livestock.

The Committee noted that the nominee exhibited impressive knowledge of topical issues touching on Livestock and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as the Principal Secretary, State Department for Livestock in the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation.


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
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

PUBLIC APPOINTMENTS (PARLIAMENTARY APPROVAL) ACT

[Date of assent: 11th November, 2011.]

[Date of commencement: 14th November, 2011.]

An Act of the Parliament to provide for procedures for parliamentary approval of constitutional and statutory appointments and for connected purposes

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

2. Interpretation

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires-

"appointing authority" means any person who, under the Constitution or any other law, is required to make an appointment for which the approval of Parliament is required;

"appointment" includes any re-appointment to the same body, whether or not in the same capacity;

"candidate" means a person who has been proposed or nominated for appointment to a public office;

"Clerk" means the Clerk of the relevant House of Parliament; and

"**Committee**" means the relevant committee of Parliament or such other Committee as the Speaker may, for good reasons, direct.

3. Exercise of powers of appointment

An appointment under the Constitution or any other law for which the approval of Parliament is required shall not be made unless the appointment is approved or deemed to have been approved by Parliament in accordance with this Act.

4. Notification of vetting requirements

Any advertisement inviting applications for nomination for appointment to an office to which this Act applies shall indicate that candidates so nominated shall be required to appear before a committee of Parliament for vetting.

5. Notification of nomination

(1) An appointing authority shall, upon nominating a person for an appointment to which this Act applies, notify the relevant House of Parliament accordingly.

Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval)

(2) A notification under subsection (1) shall be-

(a) in writing;

(b) be lodged with the Clerk of the relevant House of Parliament.

(3) A notification of appointment shall be accompanied by information concerning the nominee, having regard to the issues mentioned in section 7.

(4) For purposes of this Act, a notification of nomination shall be deemed to be duly given on the day on which it complies fully with subsections (2) and (3).

6. Approval hearing

(1) Upon receipt of a notification of appointment, the Clerk shall invite the Committee to hold an approval hearing.

(2) The Committee shall determine the time and place for the holding of the approval hearing and shall inform the Clerk.

(3) The Clerk shall notify a candidate of the time and place for the holding of an approval hearing.

(4) The Committee shall notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days prior to the hearing.

(5) Subject to this Act, all Committee proceedings on public appointments shall be open and transparent.

(6) Despite subsection (5), a Committee may, on its own motion or on the application of a candidate or any other concerned person, determine that the whole or part of its sittings shall be held in camera.

(7) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.

(8) The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate.

(9) Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated.

(10) A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall thereupon lapse.

7. Issues for consideration

The issues for consideration by the relevant House of Parliament in relation to any nomination shall be—

- (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
- (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- (c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

8. Period for consideration and report

(1) Unless otherwise provided in any law, a Committee shall consider a nomination and table its report in the relevant House for debate and decision within fourteen days from the date on which the notification of nomination was given in accordance with section 5.

(2) At the conclusion of an approval hearing, the Committee shall prepare its report on the suitability of the candidate to be appointed to the office to which the candidate has been nominated, and shall include in the report, such recommendations as the Committee may consider necessary.

9. Failure of Parliament to act on nomination

If, after expiry of the period for consideration specified in section 8, Parliament has neither approved nor rejected a nomination of a candidate, the candidate shall be deemed to have been approved.

10. Rejection of nomination

Where the nomination of a candidate is rejected by Parliament, the appointing authority may submit to the relevant House the name of another candidate, and the procedure for approval specified in this Act shall apply accordingly.

11. Notification of decision

The Clerk shall notify the appointing authority of the decision of the relevant House of Parliament within seven days of the decision.

12. Powers of the committee

(1) The committee shall have power to summon any person to appear before it for the purpose of giving evidence or providing information during approval hearing.

(2) For purposes of subsection (1), the committee shall have the same powers as the High Court to—

- (a) enforce the attendance of witnesses and examine them on oath, affirmation or otherwise;
- (b) compel the production of documents; and
- (c) issue a commission or request to examine witnesses abroad.

(3) Any person who-

- (a) disobeys any order made by a committee for attendance or for production of papers, books, documents or records; or
- (b) refuses to be examined before, or to answer any lawful and relevant question put by, a committee,

commits an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or to both.
