A REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENTAL COMMITTEE ON JUSTICE AND LEGAL AFFAIRS ON THE INSOLVENCY BILL, 2015

1. PREFACE

Hon Speaker,

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs, and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199(6), it is my pleasant privilege and honour to present to this House a report of the Committee on the Insolvency Bill, 2015.

The Committee derives its mandate from Standing Order No. 216(5) which provides as follows:-

- a) *To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;*
- b) *To study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of their implementation;*
- c) **To study and review all legislation referred to it;**
- d) *To study, assess and analyze the relative success of the ministries and departments measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;*
- e) *To investigate and enquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as may be deemed necessary, and as may be referred to it by the House or a minister; and*
- f) *To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendations of proposed legislation.*

The Second Schedule of the Standing Orders on Departmental Committees further states the subjects which the Committee is supposed to deal with while discharging its mandate. The subjects are as follows:-

- (a) Constitutional affairs;
- (b) The administration of law and Justice, including the Judiciary, public prosecutions, elections, ethics, integrity and anti-corruption; and
- (c) Human rights.

1.3. First Reading of the Insolvency Bill, 2015

The Insolvency Bill, 2015 was read for the first time on 3rd June, 2015 and immediately committed to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for scrutiny as required by Standing Order 127 (1) which states as follows:-

“A Bill having been read a First Time shall stand committed to the relevant Departmental Committee without question being put to it”

It is worth noting that the Bill had previously been read for the first time on 30th April, 2014 and committed to the Committee for scrutiny where several stakeholders made representations and close to 200 amendments agreed on. It would have been cumbersome for the Committee to move 200 amendments on the floor of the House and it is for this reason, the Majority Leader on 18th February, 2015 based on a report of the Committee withdrew the Bill for the purposes of incorporating proposed amendments and reintroducing it. This

was to enable the House conveniently deal with the Bill during Committee stage.

1.4. Public participation in the consideration of the Bill

Standing Order 127(3) states as follows:-

“The Departmental Committee to which a Bill is committed shall facilitate public participation and shall take into account the views and recommendations of the public when the Committee makes its recommendations to the House”

Pursuant to this Standing Order, the Committee invited the public through the Daily Nation and Standard newspapers of 9th June, 2015 as evidenced by appendix 3 of this report to make representations on the Bill. The Committee received representations from the Capital Markets Authority which have been considered before making recommendations.

1.5 Sittings of the Committee and adoption of report

The Committee considered the Bill together with the one of Companies on 26th and 27th of June, 2015 at retreat at Serena Hotel in Mombasa. The Committee considered and adopted its report on 4th August, 2015 at Parliament Buildings. The adoption of the report was proposed by Hon. Moses Cheboi and seconded by Hon. Neto Agostinho. There was no dissenting voice to the adoption of the report. Minutes of the Committee’s sitting adopting the report are annexed hereto as appendix 1. A list of Members who attended the sitting is also annexed as appendix 2.

1.6. Acknowledgement

The Chairperson wishes to commend Committee Members for their devotion and commitment to duty which made the consideration of this Bill a reality. The Committee further wishes to thank the Offices of the Speaker and Clerk of the National Assembly for providing guidance and technical support without which its work would not have been possible.

2.0. BACKGROUND

The Bill is dated 8th April, 2015 and is sponsored by Hon. Aden Duale, Leader of Majority Party on behalf of the Government.

The principle objective of the Bill is to repeal and replace the Bankruptcy Act, Cap 53 of the Laws of Kenya and to simplify insolvency proceedings. The Bill also seeks to encourage the dissolution of non-viable and inefficient businesses and the survival of the efficient ones and to maximize the value of liquidated assets. The Bill also:-

- (i) Provides for independent administrators to take control of businesses at the point of insolvency;
- (ii) Provides for the equitable distribution of liquidation assets among creditors; and
- (iii) Provides for effective mechanisms for identifying and prosecuting managers or directors whose illegal actions contribute to the insolvency of a firm.

The enactment of the Bill shall occasion additional expenditure of public funds which it is expected shall be provided for in the budget.

3.0. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL

Standing Order 127(3) provides as follows:-

“The Departmental Committee to which a Bill is committed shall facilitate public participation and shall take into account the views and recommendations of the public when the Committee makes its recommendations to the House”

As required by this Standing Order, the Committee invited the public through the Daily Nation and Standard newspapers of 9th June, 2015 as evidenced by appendix 3 of this report to make representations on the Bill. The Committee received representations from the Capital Markets Authority which have been considered.

4.0. CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL

The Committee considered the Bill together with the Companies Bill, 2015 on 26th and 27th June, 2015 at the Serena Hotel in Mombasa. Upon consideration of the only memorandum submitted by the Capital Markets Authority, the Committee observed that the Authority’s representations were mere comments on streamlining the Insolvency and Companies Bills, 2015

with the Capital Markets Act and did not propose amendments on any clause on the Bill.

5.0. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee recommends that the House passes the Bill in its published form.
