REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1960

Review of the Year

The upward trend in the volume of work passing through the Department, which has been a notable feature of the last decade, continued during the year 1960. Unfortunately a great deal of the increased activity was in the bankruptcy section where the number of new bankruptcy cases was in excess of the 1959 figure; on the credit side of the picture, however, there was an increased volume of new company, trade mark and trade union registrations.

2. The chief points of interest connected with the multifarious activities of the Department are given in the succeeding paragraphs. At the end of the Report are set out Appendices which give statistics covering the more important subjects and provide comparative figures over the last decade.

Companies Section

3. The section comprises the registries of Companies, Business Names, Limited Partnership, Trade Marks, Patents and Chattels Transfers.

COMPANIES

- 4. During the year 300 new companies were incorporated reflecting an increase of 30 over the preceding year. The nominal capital of these new companies together with increases in nominal capital of existing registered companies was £8,157,196 compared with £14,057,414 in the previous year.
- 5. There were 4,079 locally incorporated companies on the Register at 31st December, 1960, of which 277 were public and 3,802 were private. The number of foreign companies on the Register in Kenya rose by 18 and stood at 588 at the end of the year.
- 6. Of the companies incorporated during the year 50 per cent were formed and controlled by members of the European community, 42 per cent by members of the Asian community and eight per cent by members of the African community. While the proportion of companies controlled by Europeans remained the same, the number of African controlled companies rose by one per cent over the preceding year with a corresponding decrease in Asian controlled companies.
- 7. The volume of borrowing by companies during the year showed a marked decrease of £5,057,830 compared with the previous year's figure of £13,345,865. The actual amount of £8,288,035 is the net amount still outstanding at 31st December, 1960, exclusive of borrowing on current account in respect of which no figures are available. The year 1959 was, however, an exceptional year and the figure for the year under review loses some of its significance when compared with the year 1958 when the volume of borrowing was approximately half of that for the year 1960.

BUSINESS NAMES

8. The total of 1,222 new business names registered showed little change over the previous year's figure of 1,225. Of these new registrations 53 per cent were accounted for by the Asian community, 37 per cent by the African community and 10 per cent by the European community. In the previous year the comparative percentages were 63 per cent, 26 per cent and 11 per cent respectively. At 31st December, 1960, there were 18,584 business names on the Register compared with 17,528 in 1959.

CHATTELS TRANSFER

9. The total number of instruments, renewals and satisfactions registered under the Chattels Transfer Ordinance during the year was 2,670 which is 400 less than in the previous year. Again, the majority of the registrations related to agricultural assistance under the Agriculture Ordinance, 1955, and the European Agricultural Settlement Ordinance, 1955. The amount borrowed as disclosed by the instruments increased by £157,000 from the previous year's figure to £1,916,400.

PATENTS

10. The total of 62 new registrations for the year shows a slight decrease compared with the previous year's figure of 72. At the end of the year there were 638 live patents on the Register. A patent normally lapses at the expiration of a period of 16 years unless any extension is granted.

TRADE MARKS

- 11. There was an appreciable increase in new applications for trade marks during the year with 777 compared with 621 in 1959 and 637 registrations were completed during the period compared with 480 in the previous year.
- 12. As the number of trade marks on the Register increases so the number of cases of refusals of applications on the grounds of similarity with existing registrations also increases as may be seen from the figure of 65 refusals during the year. In only one case did an applicant elect to appear before the Registrar for a hearing and in that case the refusal was confirmed. There were six opposition cases decided by the Registrar during the period.
- 13. Statistics relating to the general work of the Trade Marks and Patent registries with comparative figures for the last decade are shown in Appendix VII and Appendix VII (a).

BOOKS AND NEWSPAPERS

- 14. On 19th July, 1960 the Books and Newspapers Ordinance, 1960, came into force and introduced important changes in the laws relating to the registration of books and newspapers. Publishers and printers of books and newspapers are now required to execute and deliver to the Registrar a bond for the sum of £500 together with an approved surety bond as security for payment of any monetary penalty which may be imposed against them for various offences.
- 15. At the end of the year there were 21 newspapers and 14 books registered under the new Ordinance. Of the former, 11 were in English, three in English and a vernacular and seven in the vernacular; of the latter six were in English and eight in the vernacular.

Births, Deaths, Marriages and Naturalization Registration Section

16. This section carries out the work connected with the Registrar-General's duties as Registrar General of births and deaths and of marriages (including his duties as such under the Adoption and Legitimacy Ordinances). It also carries out registration work in connexion with naturalization.

VITAL STATISTICS

- 17. Current registrations of non-African births during the year showed a slight increase at 9,029 over the previous year. Late registrations dropped to 1,837. With an approximate non-African population of 286,700 at mid-1960 the birth rate level is approximately 31.4 per 1,000.
- 18. The total of non-African deaths registered in the Colony, excluding eight late registrations, was 1,592 giving a crude death rate based on mid-1960 population estimates of 5.5 per 1,000. It is considered that this figure is rather lower than is likely to be the case which suggests that, if the non-African population estimate is reasonably accurate, all non-African deaths are still not being registered.

- 19. Although it is compulsory to register deaths of Africans occurring in townships, with very few exceptions, no such deaths were registered by next of kin during the year. In districts other than Nairobi, District Registrars have registered particulars of African deaths from medical certificates received from local hospitals. A total of 4,333 African deaths has, therefore, been included in the statistics of death. Little benefit can be derived from the figures of African deaths in urban areas, however, until it proves possible for the District Registrar in Nairobi also to register such deaths.
- 20. The duty to register a death remains with the next of kin and other persons as provided under the Ordinance. It would seem, however, that until there is a general need amongst the African community for proof of death for evidential purposes there is not likely to be compliance with this requirement unless it is possible for the authority issuing burial permits also to register the death at the same time.
- 21. The analysis of deaths registered during the year was based on the intermediate list of the International Classification of Diseases, Injuries and Causes of Deaths. Most deaths—1,041—were, as in the previous year, under the class "ill defined and unknown causes of morbidity and mortality", followed by bronchopneumonia (524) and gastric-enteritis and colitis (360).

MARRIAGES

22. The number of marriages celebrated under the Marriage Ordinance and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Ordinance respectively amounted to 8,734, which represents a decrease of 4,555 compared with the previous year.

The Public Trustee Section

- 23. This section carries out the administration of deceased estates under the Public Trustee Ordinance and the management of trusts accepted under the same Ordinance. The Public Trustee is also from time to time appointed manager of persons of unsound mind under the Mental Treatment Ordinance, 1949, and has to make an annual report on accounts submitted by other managers during the course of each year.
- 24. The number of estates accepted for administration during the year fell from 511 in the previous year to 430 and the number of estates finalized and distributed was 439 compared with 526 in 1959. Despite the fall in numbers of estates accepted and finalized, the value of the estates administered and distributed rose considerably. Details of payments to creditors and beneficiaries may be found at Appendix XV and details of assets held by the Public Trustee as at 31st December, 1960 may be found at Appendix XXX.

The Bankruptcy and Companies Liquidation Section

25. This section deals with bankruptcies, the compulsory winding-up of companies and the registration of Deeds of Arrangement.

BANKRUPTCIES

- 26. There was an unprecedented increase in the number of new bankruptcies during the year with 125 Receiving Orders made, of which three were subsequently rescinded and 156 Adjudication Orders. Although shopkeepers and other traders again provide the highest percentage of new bankruptcies, the largest increase occurred in the building trade with 30 new cases compared with 10 in the previous year, followed by persons in general employment with 22 new cases compared with six in the year 1959. Twenty Receiving Orders were made at Mombasa, two at Kisumu and 103 at Nairobi. Of the 154 debtors concerned, 133 were Asians, 18 were Europeans and three were Africans.
- 27. The total value of the assets owned by debtors as estimated in their statements of affairs was £866,297 with liabilities totalling £1,437,616, the latter figure representing an increase of almost £1,000,000 over the total liabilities for the preceding year. The total estimated deficiency for the year under review was £589,439. Dividends paid to creditors during the period totalled £106,662, which is almost double the amount distributed in the previous year.

28. A total of 73 prosecutions against debtors and bankrupts for miscellaneous offences under the Bankruptcy Ordinance was recorded for the year compared with 11 in the previous year. Sentences ranged from fines up to Sh. 2,000 to imprisonment up to three years. Most prosecutions related to failure to file quarterly returns, trading while insolvent, failing to keep proper books of account, contracting debts without reasonable expectation of being able to pay for them and fraudulently disposing of property obtained on credit without having paid for it.

COMPANY LIQUIDATIONS

29. There were 16 Winding-up Orders made during the period—four fewer than in 1959—and in every case but one the Official Receiver was appointed as Liquidator in the winding-up. The total of assets and liabilities of these companies was approximately one quarter of the total for the preceding year, although the amount distributed as dividend to creditors was four times greater than in 1959.

DEEDS OF ARRANGEMENT

30. There were 17 new Deeds of Arrangement registered, in which the total assets were shown as slightly over £100,000, liabilities at £283,000 and a total deficiency of £182,400, all of these figures being well in excess of those for 1959.

GENERAL

31. The general increase in the insolvency work of the Department imposed a severe strain on the available staff particularly as many of the new bankruptcy cases involved complicated financial transactions which required detailed and lengthy investigation. While it was possible to dispose of a large proportion of the arrears in the public examination of debtors there were still 109 debtors awaiting conclusion of their examinations at the end of the year.

BANKRUPTCY CONTINGENT FUND

32. The Income and Expenditure account for the year 1960 and a Balance Sheet as at 31st December, 1960, are set out at Appendix XX and Appendix XXI respectively.

Estate Duty

- 33. Although the Estate Duty Ordinance was repealed in July, 1959 there were still several estates of persons who had died prior to the date of repeal in respect of which assessments on duty had not been made. During the year 143 affidavits and accounts were submitted, of which 33 were assessed for duty to the value of £32,802. No liability for duty arose in the remaining 110 estates, each being under the value of £5,000 and, therefore, exempt from duty. Corrective accounts were submitted in 164 cases and additional duty to the value of £13,974 was assessed. Appendix XXV gives a summary of the duty assessed and collected during the year.
- 34. The amount of £29,797 was outstanding as uncollected at the end of the year. Most of this was either in respect of assessments made late in the year, the 30 days' grace which is allowed for payment not having elapsed, or was payable by instalments, with the approval of the Board of Estate Duty Commissioners, under section 14 or 23 respectively of the Estate Duty Ordinance.

Trade Unions

35. At the end of the year there were 62 trade unions on the Register comprising 46 employees' and 16 employers' unions. The employees' trade unions consisted of 27 African, seven Asian, seven European and five unions with mixed membership, whilst the employers' unions comprised 12 with European and Asian members, two with European members and two with Asian members. During the course of the year 11 new unions were registered, six being employers' unions and five employees' unions. One European trade union was dissolved and its registration was cancelled and one trade union catering for African employees changed its name from the Typographical Union of Kenya to the Printing and Kindred Trades Workers' Union of Kenya.

- 36. Details of the book and voting membership of the various trade unions on the Register, with particulars of their income and expenditure as shown by annual returns, are set out in Appendix XXVI hereto. The totals of the book and voting members of employees' trade unions were 108,552 and 74,458 respectively whilst employers' trade unions had a total of 680 book members and voting members. The figures in respect of employees' trade unions were considerably in excess of the 1959 membership totals.
- 37. During the year several break-away unions applied for registration on the grounds that the unions concerned did not fully represent the interests of the break-away factions, but in the event only one break-away union was accepted for registration. In almost all other cases the break-away groups were organized and led by former officials of the unions who had, for various reasons, been removed from office.
- 38. Although there was a slight improvement in the standard of accounting and book keeping of the unions, this did not in general apply to many African unions where it was found that the union office bearers had an elementary and incomplete knowledge of how to keep records and books of account. In other cases it was found that union funds were being unlawfully expended and appropriate warnings were given.
- 39. The primary considerations for electing union officials one could have expected would be whether or not the person nominated possessed the qualities and capabilities required of him for carrying out the responsible functions of the office to which he was seeking election, but all too often these considerations appeared to have been lost sight of in the acrimonious disputes and rivalries which divided the members among themselves.
- 40. During the year serious dissension arose within the ranks of the Railway African Union and attempts were made by officers of the Department to bring the dissident groups together to resolve their differences, but at the end of the year the rift within the union had not been healed.
- 41. Complaints were again received that several unions were continuing to poach members of other unions and the Department was obliged to caution the unions concerned that they were only entitled to recruit or represent workers in industries which came within the scope of their registered constitutions.
- 42. In order to cope with the considerable increase in the volume of work required to be handled by the section, approval was given in the latter part of the year for additional staff to be engaged and it is hoped that, with the additional guidance and assistance which the department will then be in a position to offer to trade union officials, the poor standard of administration of many unions will improve.

Societies

- 43. At the end of the year there were 1,625 registered societies and 956 societies which were exempted from registration.
- 44. The number of applications for registration increased over that of the preceding year, 285 new registrations being effected as against 231 in 1959. Eighty societies were granted exemption from registration, 18 were refused registration and the registrations of 52 societies were cancelled on the grounds that they had ceased to exist. The racial breakdown of the 285 societies registered by reference to the community of the office bearers or actual membership was African 245; Asian 15; European 13; Arab and Sudanese three; multiracial five and Somali four. Thirty-one political associations were registered during the year, these comprising 19 African plus 34 branches; four Asian; four European; two multiracial and two Somali plus two branches.
- 45. A start was made in setting up a Kardex Index designed to show the type of society, racial composition of members and geographical location, but this will take some time to complete. When this work is carried out the task of ascertaining whether societies have filed annual returns and other documents will be greatly simplified and it has been found from the present limited operation of the system that many registered societies are defunct and suitable action has been taken to cancel their registrations.

46. Frequently the constitutions of societies submitted for approval of the Registrar are of such a poor standard of draftsmanship that a great deal of amendment is necessary in order to make the constitutions intelligible and workable, all of which adds to the already considerable pressure of work on the section.

Banks and Building Societies

BANKS

- 47. Four new banking institutions were licensed during the year, namely, the Ismailia Corporation of Kisumu Limited, Overseas Finance Limited, National Industrial Credit (East Africa) Limited and the Standard Bank Finance and Development Corporation Limited.
- 48. Statistics relating to banking institutions are published by the East African Statistical Department in the Quarterly Economic and Statistical Bulletin and it is not considered necessary to reproduce them here.

BUILDING SOCIETIES

49. No new societies were registered during the year. Statistics as to the business transacted by local and foreign building societies are set out in Appendix XXVII. Part I of this Appendix relates to the business transacted by local building societies, Part II to local business transacted by foreign societies and Part III to the overall business transacted by foreign societies registered under the Ordinance. It is not possible to evaluate the financial status of a foreign building society by reference to its local transactions. In order to arrive at such evaluation the whole of the society's transactions must be considered in all of the territories in which it is operating.

Accounts and Establishment Section

REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE

- 50. Fees collected by the Department in respect of its various services totalled £47,774. A further £12,412 was collected as estate duty and miscellaneous revenue produced £2,643, thus giving a total departmental revenue of £62,829. The total expenditure of the Department on personal emoluments and other charges (exclusive of a sum of £3,601 paid from Emergency Funds) was £46,036.
- 51. A statement showing the various investments, deposits and cash balances held by the Registrar-General in his various capacities as at the beginning and end of the year will be found at Appendix XXX. Immovable property and personal effects of estates under administration in the Department are excluded from the statement. The latter shows that there was an overall increase in investments and cash balances of £46,071 at 31st December, 1960, when the value of assets held amounted to £519,606.

ESTABLISHMENT

- 52. At the beginning of the year Mr. H. F. Hamel, formerly a Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court, joined the Department as Deputy Registrar-General following the transfer of the previous Deputy, Mr. R. H. Munro, to Hong Kong and Mr. D. D. Charters, formerly Crown Counsel in the Attorney-General's Chambers, joined the Department as an Assistant Registrar-General. The establishment of professional officers in addition to the Registrar and Deputy Registrar-General is five Assistant Registrars-General and two Legal Assistants, each of the Assistant Registrars being responsible for the administration of particular sections of the Department under the direction of the Registrar-General.
- 53. With the continual expansion in the volume of work passing through the Department further increases in the Establishment had been approved at the end of the year particularly in the bankruptcy section and every effort was being made to fill these new posts with suitably qualified officers.
