PHM.KENYA POSITION PAPER ON S.H.I.F

The constitution further obligates the State and every State organ to observe, respect, protect, promote, and fulfil the rights in the Constitution and to take “legislative, policy and other measures, including setting of standards to achieve the progressive realization of the rights guaranteed in Article 43.” The State organs and public officers also have a constitutional obligation to address the needs of the vulnerable groups in society and to domesticate the provisions of any relevant international treaty and convention that Kenya has ratified. The State has a further constitutional obligation under Article 46 of the Constitution to protect consumer rights, including the protection of health, safety, and economic interests. The Constitution outlines the values and principles which all state organs and officers are expected to employ in the delivery of services Kenya has prioritized the attainment of universal health coverage (UHC) through the expansion of health insurance coverage by the Social Health Insurance Fund (SHIF).

On this note, People’s Health Movement-Kenya (PHM-K) embarked on unpacking and reviewing the effectiveness of the new SHIF ACT, by discussing the implications and impact of the SHIF ACT, evaluating the policies and laws underpinning the SHIF ACT and analyzing the recent court ruling on the same.

PHM POSITION ON THE SHIF ACT 2023

The right to health is a universal human right that necessarily entails the following:

1. Equal access to all medical and social services without any discrimination or distinction such as having access to vaccines, mental health support, medicines etc. No one should be denied healthcare simply because they do not have the capacity to afford it.
2. Health outcomes must necessarily be measured to ascertain the attainment of universal health coverage against goals such as life expectancy, mortality and morbidity rates, cost- benefit analysis and alignment with national values.
3. The right to health is closely connected to other human rights such as access to safe and clean drinking water, a clean and healthy environment, access to education, access to information, adequate housing and safe working conditions. Hence the social determinants of health must be addressed as well to guarantee health rights.

In view of the above, we take note that the new SHIF Act was well intended to provide the means for attaining universal health coverage for Kenya in keeping with article 43 of the constitution on the right to health. We also appreciate that the objectives of the legislation were to:

- To improve health outcomes and financial protection
- To realign healthcare systems for responsiveness and sustainability
- To enhance resource pooling based on solidarity, equity, and efficiency
- To promote strategic purchasing of healthcare services

Whereas we appreciate the need for reform to address the structural, normative and systemic challenges inherent in the now Defunct National Health insurance Fund (NHIF), we find that the proposed SHIF reforms were characterized by weak purchasing actions: Firstly, the new premium contribution rates were inadequately communicated and unaffordable for certain citizen groups especially due to tax burden that would be implied. Secondly, while the new benefits packages were reported to be based on service needs, preferences and values of the population, they were inadequately communicated and unequally distributed across different citizen groups. We appreciate that some of these concerns were addressed in the amendments made during the life of the bill, though some are still lingering and are addressed specifically in this memorandum.

We also appreciate that while it is the prerogative of parliament (National Assembly and senate) to debate and pass legislation in exercise of delegated power from the people, the people through established institutions as well as through the sovereign powers they wield under the Constitution still retain a say in the laws that govern the land. One such institution that checks on the powers of the legislature is the judiciary who on the SHIF Act exercised their role superbly by interpreting what the constitution requires to rule that the legislation and the process involved in the creation thereof were fatally flawed. In this regard, parliament was given an opportunity to address the concerns raised in reference to the high court ruling of Petition No E473 of 2023. We concur and take note of the following areas of interventions made by the court:

- That parliament conducts adequate, inclusive and reasonable public participation in accordance with the constitution.

Implementation arrangements

- **Scenario 1**
 1. Tier 1 Facilities: All Public Hospitals, and willing FBOs/Mid-level
 - Should not co-pay except for conditions not covered in the package such as supplements
 2. Tier 2 Facilities: Mid-level private hospitals, and faith-based hospitals.
 - Should be allowed to co-pay, but the tariffs be 25% less than tier 1. Regulated co-pay to be introduced.
 3. Tier 3 Facilities: High-level private facilities and faith-based
 - Should be allowed to co-pay, but tariffs be 80% less than Tier 1 facilities.
- **Scenario 2**
 1. Tier 1 Facilities: All Public Hospitals
 - Should not co-pay except for conditions not covered in the package such as supplements
 2. Tier 2 Facilities: All other facilities not under Tier 1
 - Should be allowed to co-pay, but tariffs be 50% less than Tier 1 facilities

Challenges

- Increased scope of cover means – more regulators, Lab, Pharmacies and Health facilities. These other facilities are not always regulated.
- Laboratory Board regulates laboratory technicians and technologists, including the practice. Pathologists are regulated by KMPDC. Need for alignment.
- Resources for the Funds are not yet guaranteed.
