## **REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1966**

### **REVIEW OF THE YEAR**

The volume of work dealt with by the Department once more showed a substantial overall increase.

Registrations of new companies during the year continued at the same high level as in the previous year although it was disappointing that the proportion of African participation in new company formation showed a slight decrease compared with 1965. This was more than offset, however, by the increased number of new African firms registered under the Registration of Business Names Act.

One aspect of the increased volume of registration work with which the Department now has to deal is that as a result of the expansion of the compulsory registration scheme, the number of births registered during the year was more than 17 per cent higher than that of the comparative figure for the previous year.

Unfortunately the downward trend in new bankruptcies which was a feature of the previous year was reversed in 1966 and although there were only three more receiving orders made than in the previous year, the total deficiency estimated by debtors rose alarmingly and was almost 20 times greater than in 1965. It should be added, however, that almost the whole of the increase is accounted for in one large bankruptcy at Mombasa and should not, therefore, be taken as an indication of any possible repetition of the discouraging position obtained in 1960.

### **COMPANIES SECTION**

The section comprises the registries of Companies, Business Names, Limited Partnerships, Trade Marks, Patents and Chattels Transfers.

The number of new companies, both public and private, incorporated during the year was 458 compared with 427 in the previous year. The amount of nominal capital of new companies, together with increases in capital of existing companies, again showed a reduction with a total of £12,959,210 as compared with £14,759,659 in 1965 and £17,029,495 in 1964.

There were 42 foreign companies registered and 19 such companies removed from the register during the year.

A total of 5,910 locally incorporated companies were on the register at 31st December 1966, of which 326 were public and 5,584 were private. The number of foreign companies on the register stood at 676 at the end of the year, showing an increase of 23 compared with the previous year.

Of the new companies incorporated in the year, 39 per cent were formed by members of the Asian community, 26 per cent by the European community, 12 per cent by the African community and 23 per cent by persons of two or more communal groups. The corresponding figures for the previous year were European 28 per cent, Asian 34 per cent, African 24 per cent and European, Asian and African 14 per cent.

## **BUSINESS NAMES**

The registration of new businesses was the highest ever recorded with 2,082 firms registered, compared with 1,620 in 1965, but the number of changes registered in particulars of existing businesses was 1,036 compared with 818 in the previous year. Two hundred and thirty-nine business names were removed from the register during the year, leaving a total of 31,756 on the register at the end of the year.

## **CHATELS TRANSFERS**

The volume of borrowing on security by way of chattels transfers showed a marked increase of £2,482,224, the total amount borrowed being £6,506,406. A total of 37,404 instruments and 906 satisfactions were registered.

## **PATENTS AND TRADE MARKS REGISTRY**

There was a slight increase in the number of patent registrations whilst the increase in initial trade mark applications and related incidental matters was continued. There was, however, a further decrease in the number of trade marks actually registered and it is to be hoped that in 1967 it will be possible for the present arrears of work in this section to be considerably reduced.

Of the 13 applications which were the subject of opposition proceedings at the beginning of the year, nine were withdrawn after opposition proceedings had commenced, two were registered after the specification of goods had been altered and two reached the hearing stage and were formally argued before the Registrar. There were no appeals against the decisions. In addition a judgment was delivered by the Registrar in the matter of rectification proceedings, the actual hearing having been argued in the previous year and one trade mark which was the subject of rectification proceedings at the option of the applicant before the High Court was expunged from the Register.

### **Trade Marks**

Statistics relating to the general work of the Trade Marks and Patents Registry, with comparative figures for the last decade, are shown in Appendix VI. Statistics of applications and registrations still continue to show the same lively interest in most sections of the patent medicine and chemical trades. The number of live trade marks on the Register as at 31st December 1966, was 11,066.

### **Patents**

There is as yet no machinery for the original registration of patents in Kenya; only for re-registration of patents previously granted in the United Kingdom. This registration has the effect of extending the patentee's rights to the patent in Kenya. In respect of these patents 93 were registered during the year, making a total of 1,539 as at the 31st December 1966. The number of live patents for the same period was 905.

## **BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES SECTION**

This section carries out the work connected with the Registrar-General's duties as Registrar-General of Births and Deaths and of Marriages under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, the Legitimacy Act, the Adoption Act, the Marriage Act and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Act.

## Vital Statistics

Although it proved possible to extend compulsory registration to only one additional area during the year, every effort was made to consolidate the registration arrangements introduced in 1965 in four fresh areas. The new area brought into the scheme on 1st October 1966 was Nakuru District (excluding the municipality, which was already a compulsory area). In this area the Clerk to the County Council of the Central Rift was good enough to undertake the functions of Registrar whilst members of the staff of the council, medical officers in charge of hospitals and schoolmasters were appointed deputy registrars. The arrangements for registration in Kwale continued to prove unsatisfactory and as a result the function of Registrar was transferred to the Mombasa office of the Department on 1st October 1966, and it is hoped that with the active co-operation given in the field by the County Education Officer, Kwale, the registration machinery in the area will soon become fully effective.

Registration arrangements in other areas worked satisfactorily and there was an overall increase in birth registration of 6,378 since the total of births for the year (excluding late registrations) was 39,127 as compared with 32,749 in the previous year. This increase in registrations was in part due to a "follow up and feed back" exercise undertaken by a member of the Headquarters' Staff. Tabulations which analyse births registered throughout the country by district, race and time of registration and those which analyse deaths registered on a similar basis by district, race, cause and age at death are included as Appendices VII to XI.

It will be seen that the three most frequent causes of death as reported were broncho-pneumonia, then gastro-enteritis and colitis, followed by ill-defined and unknown causes of morbidity and mortality. In this respect death registrations followed the same pattern as in 1965.

There was a considerable increase in the number of late registrations effected throughout the country during the year, the total being 7,156 as against 5,672 in the previous year. A total of 18,100 certified copies of entries of births and deaths was issued.

From the data recorded in respect of compulsory registration in the six areas affected and making use of the Government computer service, a number of new tabulations have been prepared. The first, a table of vital rates, at Appendix XII, was shown in the Annual Report for 1965 in abridged form. This tabulation excludes figures from Kwale as the total of registrations effected up to the date of taking over from the local authority are insufficient to justify their inclusion for statistical purposes.

With regard to the other figures one must, of course, treat the population projection with caution bearing in mind the period that has elapsed since the last census occurred. Similarly one must bear in mind the considerable under-registration which still applies in Bungoma and Nyeri Districts, whilst in Nakuru and possibly in Mombasa and Nairobi Municipalities one must appreciate that many of the births should be excluded from the totals of registrations because they occur to persons who are non-residents but who have not disclosed the fact. Similarly the total registrations of deaths, e.g. in Nakuru Municipality, would suggest that they include those of persons who were not residents of the area. In the case of Nakuru this difficulty will be obviated in future by the making of the surrounding area of Nakuru District a compulsory registration area, whilst in other areas it is hoped that greater attention to the entry of details of the normal place of residence on registration forms will enable occurrences which relate to non-residents to be excluded from these particular statistics.

At Appendix XIII a tabulation has been prepared giving the breakdown as between institutional births and home deliveries and the sex of the child. The respective proportions in Nyeri of approximately 6 per cent home deliveries to 94 per cent occurring at hospitals, maternity homes and other institutions would suggest that there is still substantial under-registration of births which occur in the home and even the overall figure of 73 per cent for institutional births throughout the compulsory registration areas can only be explained by the fact that whereas practically all such births are registered, a large number of home births are still not reported. The ratio as between male and female children born in these areas is shown to be about 105 males to 100 females which is comparable to rates in other countries. A tabulation showing the number of births in compulsory areas by birth order is at Appendix XIV, whilst the following Appendix gives details of still births registered in each of such areas.

In regard to mortality in the compulsory registration areas, an analysis of deaths by district, race, sex and whether institutional or in the home is at Appendix XVI and again the figures for Nyeri suggest that a considerable number of home deaths are not being reported. As with births, the figures for Kwale deaths have no real significance since only a small proportion of the actual total has been registered.

In Appendix XVII and XVIII infant mortality in the compulsory areas has been analysed, in the first of the two appendices by district, race, sex and district and in the latter by cause, race and sex. The classification of cause of deaths is in this case according to the Abbreviated List instead of the Intermediate List which has been used for the country-wide classification in Appendix XI. Both listings are taken from the International Statistical Classification of Diseases, Injuries and Causes of Death, 1957 Revision.

There were 3,505 infant deaths registered during 1966, of which 2,633 occurred in compulsory areas. Infant mortality rates are shown in Appendix XII. The main causes of fatal disease amongst children were pneumonia, followed by gastritis, duodenitis, arteritis and colitis.

Anything which affects the denominator or numerator of the relative occurrences described above will necessarily affect the rate resulting from the computation. Some of the limiting factors are (i) errors in residence determination, as for Nakuru, can affect the counts of births and deaths allocated to the district as a whole, (ii) under-registration results in under-counts of vital events, (iii) errors in population estimation and enumeration will affect any rate requiring a population base for computation, (iv) the efficiency of the cause of death coding and the clarity and accuracy of cause of death certification by laymen (deputy registrars) affect the counts of deaths allocated to specific causes of death. Therefore, care must be taken in comparing a change in rate where frequency of the event is small. A change in one or two events may result in a large percentage in the relative statistic. Any relative index should be evaluated on the basis of quality and validity and size of both the numerator and denominator used to derive the rate or ratio.

### **Marriages**

During the year the Marriages (Amendment) Act 1966, came into force under which members of Kenya's foreign service and other consular officers may be appointed registrars of marriages for the countries to which they are appointed. Where there are no local objections, such officers may perform marriages of Kenya citizens in our embassies abroad and marriages of citizens which are solemnized according to the laws of the countries in which such embassies are situate may be registered by such officers in accordance with the Marriage Act.

The amending legislation also empowers the Registrar-General to issue a certificate when required by a foreign authority that there is no impediment under Kenya law to the marriage of a Kenya citizen who wishes to marry under the law of that country.

In the course of the year 26 of these certificates of no impediment were issued after the necessary inquiries had been made.

A total of 537 marriages were celebrated under the Marriage Act and at Appendix XIX and XX will be found an analysis of these events by age of participant, the former appendix giving the age of bride and the latter that of the bridegroom.

At Appendix XXI will be found a break-down of marriages according to the marital status of participants.

Under the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Act, 9,383 marriages were celebrated giving a total of marriage registrations during the year of 9,920.

### **PUBLIC TRUSTEE SECTION**

This section carries out the administration of estates of deceased persons under the Public Trustee Act and the management of trusts accepted under such Act. In the majority of cases the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of those estates where the assets are unadministered either because there is no heir who is prepared or is available to apply for Letters of Administration or because the executor or administrator previously appointed has died or cannot be traced. In some cases the Public Trustee is specifically appointed to be an executor by a testator but in such cases the consent of the Public Trustee is required at the time of making the will. The advantages of appointing the Public Trustee to be an executor are, first, that there is guaranteed continuity of office by virtue of the Public Trustee's status as a corporation sole, and secondly, the fees charged by the Public Trustee for undertaking and completing the administration of estates are strictly regulated by statute and are not, therefore, subject to rapid change.

In addition, the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of trust estates. In many cases where a minor is entitled to a legacy or share of the assets of a deceased person and not infrequently, where an award is made by a court to a person not of full age, the executor or administrator, with the consent of the Public Trustee or the court, as the case may be, transfers such legacy, share or award to the Public Trustee, who establishes a trust with it. This is administered by the Public Trustee until the whole trust fund is paid over to the former minor upon his or her attaining the age of majority.

The Public Trustee also administers trust estates which contain no provision for their maturing after the expiration of a stipulated period and for the trust funds then being paid over to particular beneficiaries. Common examples of such trusts are those which are set up for purposes such as the furtherance of education, charity, recreation, etc. The duration of such trusts is by their nature frequently extremely lengthy. In such cases the fact that the Public Trustee is a corporation sole is particularly useful as the trust funds vest in the holder of the office and not in individual trustees. Consequently, the delay and expense involved in the transfer of the funds from individual trustees to their successors in office are obviated.

The Public Trustee is also from time to time appointed manager of the estates of persons of unsound mind under the Mental Treatment Act, and is required to make an annual report on accounts submitted by other managers during the course of each year.

Eight hundred and fifty-eight estates of deceased persons were accepted during the year, reflecting an increase of 157 in relation to the comparative figure for the previous year. Twenty-nine trusts were accepted, reflecting an increase of five over the previous year. The number of estates finalized and distributed was 688 as against 521 in 1965. Details of payments to creditors and beneficiaries may be found at Appendix XXIV and details of assets held by the Public Trustee as at 31st December 1966 may be found at Appendix XLIV.

## **BANKRUPTCY AND COMPANIES LIQUIDATION SECTION**

This section deals with bankruptcies, the compulsory winding up of companies and the registration of Deeds of Arrangement.

### **Bankruptcies**

During the year 26 Receiving Orders were made of which five were made at Mombasa, three at Kisumu and 18 at Nairobi. This shows a slight increase compared with 1965. The total amount of deficiency as estimated by the debtors concerned was £1,912,895 but as has already been stated this was due to one exceedingly large bankruptcy in Mombasa. Of the 26 debtors concerned, 20 were Asian, 5 European and one African. The classification of their respective occupations is shown at Appendix XXVIII. The assets realized during the year from debtors' estates and the debtors' contribution from their after-acquired income amounted to £74,205. From these moneys a sum of £54,021 was distributed in dividends to proved creditors. Thirteen debtors were prosecuted for various bankruptcy offences and in seven cases convictions were obtained.

Thirty-five discharge applications were made by debtors and of these two were granted unconditional discharge, 32 were suspended and/or conditionally discharged and one was refused.

### **Company Liquidation**

Five winding-up orders were made by the court during the year, two at Mombasa and three at Nairobi. Companies in Liquidation comprised three in the motor trade, one in general merchandise and one in tourism.

### **Deeds of Arrangement**

No Deed of Arrangement was registered during the year.

### **Bankruptcy Contingency Fund and Companies Contingency Fund**

The Income and Expenditure Accounts for these funds for the year 1966 and the Balance Sheets as at 31st December 1966 are set out at Appendix XXIX, XXX, XXXIII and XXXIV respectively.

## **BANKS, BUILDINGS SOCIETIES AND INSURANCE COMPANIES SECTION**

### **Banks**

During the year Savings and Loan Society Ltd. and the Diamond Jubilee Investment Trust Ltd., which were incorporated in Tanzania, ceased operations. They were then registered in Kenya as Savings and Loan Kenya Ltd. and the Diamond Jubilee Investment Trust (Kenya) Ltd. and a licence to carry on banking business was issued to each of them under the provisions of the Banking Act.

A schedule of the banks, hire finance companies and other companies which have been granted banking licences under the provisions of the Banking Act is set out in Appendix XXXIX. It may be noted that the following companies are licensed to conduct banking business, although they are not in fact accepting deposits from the public:—

- (1) United Dominions Corporation (E.A.) Ltd.
- (2) Standard Bank Finance and Development Corporation Ltd.
- (3) Bank of Tokyo Ltd.
- (4) Overseas Finance Ltd.
- (5) African Banking Corporation (East Africa) Ltd.

Statistics covering the operations of commercial banks are published in the Kenya Statistical Abstract and the Statistical Supplement of the Kenya Trade and Supplies Bulletin. It is, therefore, considered unnecessary to reproduce such data in this Report.

### **Building Societies**

No new building societies were registered during the year.

There is only one building society known as the East African Building Society operating in Kenya; statistics relating to this society are set out in Appendix XL. The Kentanda Mutual Building Society was wound up during the year 1965 and out of the total sum of Sh. 19,572/75 transferred to Government account a total of Sh. 3,026/80 was paid out to the depositors up to the end of 1966.

### **Insurance Companies**

At 31st December 1966, 90 insurers were licensed to conduct insurance business in Kenya. During the year five companies ceased writing business.

Statistics showing the countries of origin of insurers and the class of insurance business which they conduct may be found at Appendix XLI.

## **ESTATE DUTY SECTION**

As in 1965 this section has had during the year to deal with assessment under two classes; those on estates which passed before the suspension of the application of the former Estate Duty Ordinance in 1959 and which have not been finalized, and those on estates which have passed since 12th June 1963 when the Estate Duty Act was reintroduced. The data given in Appendix XXXVI has been so arranged as to indicate under which of the two statutes assessments have been raised.

During the year 484 assessments were raised under the Act and the duty assessed amounted to £279,931. Six assessments were raised under the Ordinance but the net value in each of these cases being under the exemption limit no duty was payable.

Of the total number of estates passing and assessed under the Act, no liability for duty arose in 321 estates, i.e. 66.3 per cent, as the net value in each case did not exceed £5,000. The remaining 163 estates (comprising 33.7 per cent) attracted duty at percentages varying from two to 23.

Corrective accounts were received in 170 estates. Of these, in 111 estates additional assets were brought to account and in 59 estates a refund of duty was claimed.

Of the 111 corrective accounts mentioned above, 103 were subject to the provisions of the Act and eight to the provisions of the Ordinance. They attracted additional duty to the value of £56,830 and £3,853 respectively.

Of the 59 estates in which refunds were made 54 were subject to the provisions of the Act and five to the provisions of the Ordinance. The duty refunded amounted to £27,031 and £5,321 respectively.

The net amount of duty collected during the year amounted to £297,840.

### TRADE UNIONS SECTION

There were 57 unions on the register at the end of the year, comprising 42 employees' and 15 employers' unions. A break-down of these unions consisted of: Employees—two African, two Asian, one European and 37 mixed membership. Employers—all 15 unions with mixed membership.

During the year five new trade unions were registered, namely: Federation of Kenya Employers, Association of Local Government Employers, Central Organization of Trade Unions and the E.A. Cargo Handling Services Ltd., Management and Supervisory Overseas Staff Association (registered as a probationary trade union on 25th August 1965). Registration of branches dropped to 43.

The registration of the Union of Commercial, Food and Allied Workers as a result of the amalgamation of the Kenya Distributive and Commercial Allied Workers' Union, Tobacco, Brewing and Bottling Workers' Union and Tobacco Workers' Union was challenged as having been carried out improperly and invalidly by one of the participant unions, namely the Kenya Distributive and Commercial Workers' Union. The matter remained unresolved by the end of the year.

The dissolution of five trade unions, namely the Electricity Supply Personnel Staff Association, Nairobi City Council Senior Staff Association, Nairobi Master Tailors Association and Brewing and Bottling Association of Kenya was registered during the year. Also registered was the dissolution of six trade union branches.

The registrations of four trade unions were cancelled during the year, namely Kenya Federation of Labour, Kenya African Workers' Congress, Kenya African Master Cobblers Association and East African Railways Designated Officers Association.

Applications for registration from the following four trade unions were refused: Kenya Casual Labourers Workers Union, Musicians Union of Kenya, Nairobi Local Government Senior Staff Association and Tobacco Senior and Supervisory Employees Association (registered as a probationary trade union on 21st July 1965). Three of these unions were refused registration on the grounds that there were trade unions already registered which sufficiently represented the whole or a substantial proportion of the interests in respect of which the applicants sought registration. The probationary trade union was refused registration on the grounds that it failed to comply with certain provisions of the Trade Unions Act.

One employers' trade union registered a change of name, the Kenya National Farmers' (Employers) Union becoming the Agricultural Employers' Association.

Amendments to the rules of 11 trade unions were registered during the year.

During the year approval was given to 64 trade union officials to act in a full-time capacity and approval was withdrawn in 13 cases and one application for approval was refused.

The secretaries of four trade unions were prosecuted for failing to submit their unions' annual returns for 1965 and each of these prosecutions resulted in convictions with fines being imposed upon three of the secretaries. The secretary of one trade union, a persistent defaulter in this respect, was given a deterrent fine of Sh. 700.

Ten notices of change of names or titles of officers of trade unions submitted for registration were referred to the Trade Unions Tribunal on the grounds that the Registrar was not satisfied as to the validity or propriety of the purported appointments and appropriate directions were given to the Registrar in all cases.

During the course of the year officers of the Trade Unions Section carried out inspections of 206 sets of trade union books of account, comprising accounts of 50 head offices and 156 branches. In addition to inspections carried out in Nairobi, inspections were also carried out in Mombasa, Nakuru, Kisumu, Kisii, Homa Bay, Eldoret, Kitale, Bungoma and Kakamega.

Details of the book and voting membership of the trade unions on the register, with particulars of their income and expenditure as shown by their annual returns, are set out in Appendices XXXVII and XXXVIII hereto. The totals of the book and voting members of employee trade unions were 362,093 and 345,533 respectively, whilst the employer trade unions had a total of 2,143 book members and 2,143 voting members respectively.

## **SOCIETIES, BOOKS AND NEWSPAPERS SECTION**

### **Societies**

At the end of the year there were 2,661 registered societies and 1,164 societies which were exempted from registration.

New registrations during the year totalled 240 and in the same period 67 societies were granted exemption from registration. Comparative figures for 1965 were 383 registrations and 116 exemptions.

A total of 48 societies were refused registration whilst one society had its exemption rescinded. Registration of 42 societies was cancelled—mainly for failure to comply with orders served under the provisions of the Societies Act and 243 societies had their registration/exemption cancelled on the ground that they no longer existed.

The exercise to check up on societies which were overdue with returns, etc., was continued and showed that more societies had in fact dissolved without notifying the Department. These societies were asked to prove their existence in the normal way and, having failed to do so, they were cancelled.

The inability of the office bearers to complete satisfactory applications for registrations and the consequent need for repetitive instructions were still encountered to the same degree despite the fact that detailed instructions on the correct procedure are issued to all prospective societies.

Winding-up orders in respect of two societies were made during the year.

### **Books and Newspapers**

A total of 67 newspapers were registered at the end of the year but this figure does not accurately represent the number of newspapers actively in existence as some of those still registered did not publish during the year. Seven new

registrations were effected and four newspapers ceased publication. The total number of books registered now stands at 586, the majority being religious and/or educational and of this total 124 were registered during the year under review. Of the new registration, 104 were printed in English and 20 were in vernacular.

## ACCOUNTS SECTION

### **Revenue and Expenditure**

Fees collected by the department in respect of its various services totalled £80,818 and miscellaneous revenue amounted to £404. A further £330,192 was collected in respect of Estate Duty, but a total sum of £32,352 was paid out by way of duty refunded or remitted. The total expenditure of the department or personal emoluments and other charges was £69,524, an increase of £2,829 on the total of the previous year.

### **Establishment**

Although there were numerous changes amongst the junior executive and clerical staff of the department the composition of the professional and senior executives remained the same during the year except for the welcome addition of Mr. Z. R. Chesoni, B.A. (U.S.A.), LL.B. (E.A.), who was the first law graduate from the University of East Africa to join the department and now holds the post of Legal Assistant. The fifth in-service training course was completed successfully during the year, a total of ten members of the clerical staff receiving training.
