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LEGAL NOTICE NO. 142

THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT ACT

(Cap. 412A)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 24 (4) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury and Economic Planning makes the following Regulations—

THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT (GOVERNMENT PRESS FUND) REGULATIONS, 2025

PART I - PRELIMINARY

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Finance Management (Government Press Fund) Regulations, 2025. Citation.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.

“Act” means the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;

“Administration costs” means recurrent expenditures of the Fund referred to in regulation 20;

“Administrator of the Fund” means the Government Printer;

“Cabinet Secretary” has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Act;

“Financial year” means the period of twelve months ending on the 30th June in each year;

“Former Fund” means the Government Press Fund established under the repealed Exchequer and Audit Act;

“Fund” means the Government Press Fund established under regulation 3; and

“Security documents” include currency, ballot papers, examinations, passports, visa stickers, title documents, motor vehicle logbooks, accountable documents, registration of birth, marriage and death certificates, work permits, smartcards.

PART II - ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FUND

3. There is established a fund to be known as the Government Press Fund which shall operate under the budgeting, accounting, reporting and auditing framework of the Act. Establishment of the Fund.

4. The initial capital of the Fund shall be one billion five hundred million shillings appropriated by the National Assembly in the financial year 2025/26. Capital of the Fund.

5. (1) The object and purpose of the Fund shall be to ensure sustainability of the activities of the Government Press. Object and purpose of the Fund.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of sub-regulation (1), the Fund shall—

- (a) finance the purchase of raw materials for printing and publishing works by the Government Press including—
 - (i) artworks.
 - (ii) designs.
 - (iii) printed stationery and documents;
 - (iv) printed and bound publications including the Kenya Gazette, Kenya Gazette Supplements, chapters of the Laws of Kenya and official Government publications.
 - (v) security printing.
 - (vi) exercise books.
 - (vii) security documents; and
 - (viii) any other stationery and publications;
- (b) finance the maintenance, renewal and replacement of plant, machinery and equipment used for printing and publishing works by the Government Press.
- (c) provide resources for the payment of overheads related to printing and publishing works referred to in paragraph (a); and
- (d) support any other activities incidental to the sustainability of the Fund.

(3) The printing and publishing works referred to in this regulation are for sale to state organs, government ministries and departments, state corporations, counties or the public.

6. The following principles shall apply in the administration of the Fund —

- (a) transparency, accountability and integrity.
- (b) prudent use of public funds;
- (c) clear and accurate fiscal reporting;
- (d) social responsibility and concern for the environment;
- (e) sustainability and value for money; and
- (f) continuous improvement, adaptability and responsiveness of systems, processes and procedures.

Guiding Principles.

7. The sources of the Fund shall consist of the following —

- (a) monies appropriated by the National Assembly for the purposes of the Fund.
- (b) income generated from commercial activities of the Government Press.
- (c) grants, donations and other gifts to the fund.
- (d) any earnings, accruals or income generated from monies held by the Fund.

Sources of the Fund.

- (e) income from disposal of assets of the Fund subject to existing laws and regulations.
- (f) income from investment proceeds of the Fund.
- (g) money from any other source approved by the Cabinet Secretary.

8. (1) There shall be paid out of the Fund, monies in respect of any expenses incurred in pursuance of the object and purpose for which the Fund is established. Payments out of the Fund.

(2) The expenditure incurred out of the Fund shall be on the basis of, and limited to, the annual work plan, programmes and cost estimates which shall be prepared by the Administrator of the Fund and approved by the Board at the beginning of the financial year to which they relate.

(3) Any revision of the approved expenditure shall be based on the revised annual work plan, programmes and cost estimates, and approval by the Board.

9. (1) The selling price of printing and publishing works under regulation 5 shall be as provided in the Schedule and shall be reviewed from time to time by the Board in consultation with the National Treasury. Selling price.

(2) The mode and price of disposal of waste material from the operations of the Government Press shall be done in accordance with the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, and proceeds thereof shall be credited to the Fund. Cap. 412C

PART III - ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE FUND

10. (1) There is established a board to be known as the Government Press Fund Oversight Board which shall consist of— Establishment of the Board.

- (a) the Principal Secretary responsible for matters relating to the Government Press or a duly designated representative, who shall be the chairperson of the Board;
- (b) the Principal Secretary responsible for matters relating to finance or a duly designated representative;
- (c) the Principal Secretary responsible for matters relating to internal security or a duly designated representative;
- (d) the Principal Secretary responsible for matters relating to information and communication or duly designated representative;
- (e) the Attorney General or a duly designated representative;
- (f) a person nominated by the Council of Governors; and
- (g) three persons not being public officers appointed by the Cabinet Secretary responsible for matters relating to the Government Press.

(2) A person shall not be appointed under sub-regulation (1) (f) and (g), unless that person—

- (a) holds a university degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
- (b) has over ten years' experience in management, finance, law, security, commerce, engineering, information and communication; and
- (c) meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution.

(3) In making appointments under this regulation, the Cabinet Secretary shall ensure—

- (a) that no more than two thirds of the members of the Board are of the same gender;
- (b) equity of opportunity for persons with disabilities and the youth; and
- (c) that the appointments reflect ethnic and regional diversity of the people of Kenya.

(4) A person appointed under sub-regulation (1)(f) and (g) shall serve for a period of three years, and the appointment may be renewed for a further term of three years.

(5) In the absence of the Chairperson in any meeting of the Board, the members present shall elect one of the members under sub-regulation (1)(a) to (e) to chair the meeting.

(6) The Board may, from time to time, co-opt other members as it may deem necessary, for the proper and efficient discharge of its oversight functions over the Fund.

(7) The quorum for the conduct of meetings of the Board shall be five members.

(8) The Board shall regulate its own procedure.

Vacancy of the Board.

11. (1) The office of a member appointed under regulation 10 (1) (f) and (g), shall become vacant, if that member—

- (a) is absent from three consecutive meetings of the Board without good cause;
- (b) resigns by notice in writing to the Cabinet Secretary;
- (c) is adjudged bankrupt;
- (d) violates any of the provisions of the Constitution or any other law;
- (e) is unable to perform the functions of the office by reason of prolonged physical or mental incapacity; or
- (f) dies.

(2) Where there is a vacancy in the Board, the Cabinet Secretary, subject to the provisions of this Act, shall appoint another person to fill the vacancy for the remaining period of the term of such member.

12. (1) The functions of the Board shall be to —

Functions of the Board.

- (a) advise the Cabinet Secretary on the funding requirements of the Fund;
- (b) provide oversight on the administration and management of the Fund;
- (c) approve estimates of revenue and expenditure of the Fund for each financial year;
- (d) approve the opening of bank accounts of the Fund by the Administrator of the Fund;
- (e) approve and review the investment of surplus funds from the Fund;
- (f) receive, review and approve statutory and management reports of the Fund before submission to third parties; and
- (g) perform such other duties as may be considered necessary by the Cabinet Secretary responsible for the Government Press, for the proper administration and management of the Fund and such duty shall be assigned in writing.

(2) The Oversight Board shall prepare and submit a quarterly report to the Cabinet Secretary responsible for finance on the performance of the Fund with copies to the Cabinet Secretary responsible for matters relating to the Government Press.

13. The Administrator of the Fund shall be the Government Printer who shall be the secretary to the Board.

Administrator of the Fund.

14. (1) The Administrator of the Fund shall be responsible to the Board in the performance of his or her functions under these Regulations.

Responsibilities of the Administrator of the Fund.

(2) Notwithstanding the generality of sub-regulation (1), the Administrator of the Fund shall —

- (a) supervise and control the administration of the Fund;
- (b) set and review, with the approval of the Board, the fees for any service rendered by the Fund; open, operate, and close, as may be necessary, bank accounts of the Fund with the approval of the Board and the National Treasury;
- (c) put in place internal control systems and a risk management framework to secure the resources of the Fund;
- (d) be the custodian of the assets, equipment and property of the Fund;
- (e) prepare annual financial statements for the Fund for each financial year in a form prescribed by the Accounting Standards Board;
- (f) prepare quarterly financial and non- financial statements in a form prescribed by the Accounting Standards Board;
- (g) prepare, sign and transmit to the Auditor-General, with the approval of the Board, in respect of each financial year and within three months after the end thereof, such statement of accounts relating to the Fund, as the Public Sector Accounting Standards Board may prescribe;

- (h) prepare and submit an annual performance report of the affairs of the Fund to the Cabinet Secretary for matters relating to the Government Press Fund, with the approval of the Board;
- (i) cause to be kept proper books of accounts and other books and records in relation to the Fund of all activities and undertakings of the Fund; and
- (j) furnish additional information as he or she may consider to be proper and sufficient for the purpose of examination and audit by the Auditor-General in accordance with the provisions of the Public Audit Act. Cap. 412B
- (3) The Administrator of the Fund may delegate any of his or her functions to an officer of the Fund and the delegation shall be in writing.
15. (1) There shall be a Secretariat of the Fund which shall comprise of the Administrator of the Fund and staff of the Fund. Secretariat of the Fund
- (2) The Board may designate the staff of the Government Press to the Secretariat.
16. The Secretariat shall — Functions of the Secretariat
- (a) be responsible for the day to day management of the Fund;
- (b) develop predictable, transparent and accountable financial internal control systems for the Fund;
- (c) prepare and submit for approval by the Board estimates of revenue and expenditure, annual work plan, programmes costs estimates, annual procurement plans, and annual cash flow plans;
- (d) implement programmes for the realization of the objectives and purpose of the Fund;
- (e) prepare statutory and management reports and submit them to the Board for approval;
- (f) maintain proper records of the Fund;
- (g) develop investment and contingency plans and submit to the Board for approval;
- (h) monitor and evaluate programmes undertaken by the Fund, and provide reports to the Board; and
- (i) Implement the decisions of the Board and Perform any other duties related to the activities of the Fund.
17. (1) The Administrator of the Fund shall cause to be opened and operated in the name of the Fund such bank accounts in a bank or banks approved in accordance with section 28 of the Act, as may be necessary for the purpose for which the Fund is established. Opening, operating and closing of accounts.
- (2) The Administrator of the Fund may recommend to the Board for approval, to close any bank accounts of the Fund.

18. The Administrator of the Fund shall ensure that no bank account of the Fund is overdrawn. Bank Accounts not to be overdrawn.
19. All receipts, savings and accruals of the Fund and the balance of the Fund at the close of each financial year, shall be retained for the purpose for which the Fund is established. Monies to be retained in Fund.
20. The Administrator of the Fund shall establish systems, controls, and procedures necessary to ensure that — Systems, controls, and procedures.
- (a) the Fund's expenditure is controlled and monitored on an annual basis against the Fund's approved revenue, expenditure plan and the annual work plan;
- (b) withdrawals from the Fund are only for the purpose of payment of approved expenditure as provided under these Regulations; and
- (c) records of expenditure relating to the Fund are kept and maintained in accordance with the provisions of the Act and these Regulations.
21. The Administrator of the Fund may use a maximum of three percent of the approved budget of the Fund to cover its administrative costs. Administration costs.
22. (1) At least six months prior to the commencement of each financial year, the Board shall cause to be prepared estimates of the revenue and expenditure of the Fund for that year. Annual estimates of revenue and expenditure.
- (2) The annual estimates shall make provision for all estimated revenues into and expenditures from the Fund for the financial year and in particular, the estimates shall provide for —
- (a) revenues, loans, grants and donations projected to be received by the Fund from the sources of funds provided for under these Regulations;
- (b) expenditure related to commercial activities of the Fund; and
- (c) monies for the administration expenses of the Fund.
- (3) The estimates of the revenue and expenditure of the Fund shall be submitted to the Cabinet Secretary responsible for the Government Press before transmission to the Cabinet Secretary for approval on or before 31st January each year.
23. The Administrator of the Fund may, with the approval of the Board, invest the funds of the Fund not immediately required for its purposes in such Government securities as the National Treasury may, from time to time, approve. Investment of the Fund.
24. (1) The Administrator of the Fund shall ensure proper books of accounts are kept and the annual statements prepared, which shall include — Proper books of accounts.
- (a) an income and expenditure account;
- (b) a statement of financial position;

- (c) a statement of cash flows;
- (d) statement of budget;
- (e) changes in net equity; and
- (f) notes to the financial statement.

(2) The Administrator of the Fund shall ensure that the Fund and the annual financial statements relating to those accounts comply with the prescribed accounting standards.

(3) The Administrator of the Fund shall cause to be prepared—

- (a) quarterly reports to be submitted to the Board for approval before submission to the National Treasury with a copy to the Cabinet secretary responsible for matters related to the Government Press; and
- (b) annual financial statements to be submitted to the Board for approval before submission to the Auditor General and a copy to, the Controller of Budget, the National Treasury and the Commission on Revenue Allocation.

25. The Fund shall be audited in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Finance Management Act and the Public Audit Act.

26. The Administrator of the Fund shall prepare and submit to the Cabinet Secretary responsible for the Government Press, within three months of the start of each financial year, an annual Fund Performance Report relating to the previous financial year, detailing the extent to which the Fund met its regulatory and commercial objectives in the period under review.

27. Subject to the provisions of the Act, and any other existing relevant legislation, government financial regulations and procedures, shall apply in the administration of the Fund.

PART IV—MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

28. A person who misappropriates any funds or assets of the Fund, or assists or causes any person to misappropriate or apply the funds of the Fund otherwise than in the manner provided in these Regulations, commits an offence and shall be liable upon conviction, to the fine prescribed in section 199 of the Act.

Offences and
penalties.

29. (1) The Cabinet Secretary may, subject to the approval of the National Assembly, wind up the Fund where the Cabinet Secretary responsible for the Government Press determines that the Fund has successfully achieved the objectives for which it was created.

Winding Up of
the Fund.

(2) On the winding up of the Fund —

- (a) the Administrator of the Fund shall disclose the assets and liabilities of the Fund;
- (b) subject to paragraph (a), the Administrator of the Fund shall pay any amount remaining in the Fund into the National Exchequer Account for the credit of the national government;

- (c) the Cabinet Secretary shall pay any deficit in the Fund from the funds of the national government in the National Exchequer Account with the approval of the National Assembly;
- (d) assets other than cash of the Fund shall be transferred to the Ministry responsible for the Government Press; and
- (e) the staff of the Fund shall be redeployed in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations.

(3) The Administrator of the Fund shall prepare and submit the report to the Board for approval before submission to the Auditor-General, a final statement of accounts for audit within three months from the date of the decision to wind up the Fund.

(4) The Auditor General shall prepare an audit report and submit it to the Cabinet Secretary for onward transmission to the National Assembly within seven days from the date of receipt of the audit report.

(5) Where the Cabinet Secretary does not transmit the report to the National Assembly within the period referred to in sub-regulation (4), the Auditor General shall submit the report to the National Assembly.

30. The Exchequer and Audit (Government Press Fund) Regulations, 1988 are hereby revoked.

31. (1) Any debt owed by or to the former Fund shall on the commencement of these Regulations, become a debt owed by or to the Government Press Fund and the debtor or creditor as the case may be shall have the same rights and obligations.

Transitional
clauses.

(2) Any assets other than cash of the former Fund shall be vested in the Government Press Fund.

(3) The Administrator of the former Fund shall pay any amount remaining in the former Fund into the National Exchequer Account for the credit of the national government.

THE DRAFT LEGAL NOTICE ON THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT (GOVERNMENT PRESS FUND) REGULATIONS, 2025 BY THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT AND THE NATIONAL TREASURY.

Government Press is the government's primary centralized resource for producing, procuring, authenticating, cataloging, disseminating, and preserving the official information products of the Kenya Government. The objectives of and reasons for the proposed Legal Notice are mainly to provide funds to support the sustainability of the commercial and noncommercial activities of the Government Press which include; printing publishing, publications, consulting and in particular;

- a) finance the purchase of raw materials for printing and publishing works by the Government Press including:-
 - i) artworks;
 - ii) designs;
 - iii) printed stationery and documents;
 - iv) printed and bound publications including the Kenya Gazette, Kenya Gazette Supplements, chapters of the Laws of Kenya and official Government publications;
 - v) security printing;
 - vi) exercise books;
 - vii) security documents; and
 - viii) any other stationery and publications;

- a) finance the maintenance, renewal and replacement of plant, machinery and equipment used for printing and publishing works by the Government Press;

- b) provide resources for the payment of overheads related to printing and publishing works referred to in paragraph (a); and

- c) support any other activities incidental to the sustainability of the Fund.

1) The effect of the proposed gazettelement of the Legal Notice includes the following:

- a. Enhancement of security and production of printed Government documents;
- b. Enhancement of effectiveness and efficiency of Government Press;
- c. Designation of Government Press- as a strategic national resource and allocation of adequate funding from national budget to ensure long term sustainability;

- d. Inclusion of the economic value of the Government Press into national income accounting, planning, and budgeting, thereby improving fiscal planning and resource allocation;
- e. Promotion of retention of benefits generated from the Government Press Fund to support its growth and self-sufficiency while reducing reliance on direct exchequer allocations;
- f. Establishment of a fund to promote replacement, renewal, maintenance of production machines and equipment hence service delivery to the Government of Kenya and the public;
- g. Promotion of access to innovative and sustainable utilization of modern printing as an economic driver, reducing production costs and ensuring government self-sufficiency in printing services;
- h. Mainstreaming Government Press Fund resources into frameworks on eco-friendly printing and environmental sustainability in line with the BETA framework and ISO 14000 standards;
- i. Enhancement of citizen access to information in line with Article 35 of the Constitution of Kenya, thereby promoting transparency and accountability;
- j. Effective contribution to the authentication of government documents, reinforcing the role of the Government Press as the sole printer of critical government documents;
- k. Cataloguing of government information through proper serialization of government documents, improving record-keeping and archiving;
- l. Storage, archival, and retrieval of government documents, ensuring long-term preservation of official records;
- m. Digitization of old and new government documentation (e-publication), aligning with global best practices in digital governance;
- n. House style of the Government Press by introducing standardized fonts and types, improving readability and professionalism;
- o. Standardization of government documents as a key consideration ensuring consistency across all state publications;
- p. Cost reduction as optimized production will lower wastage through efficient resource utilization;
- q. If well anchored, optimized production shall drastically reduce waste and enhance environmental sustainability;
- r. Significant reduction in machine and equipment downtime, ensuring faster service delivery to the public and government agencies;
- s. The introduction of the fund shall also contribute positively to reducing machine and equipment failure rates, improving throughput time, and enhancing revenue generation for sustainability

2) Possible alternatives and practicable means of achieving the foregoing objectives, including other regulatory as well as non-regulatory options:

- a) Development of these Regulations seeks to address the problems and challenges currently being faced by the Government Press in offering optimal printing services to the MDACs and the general public. Modernization of GP need adequate funding to achieve maximum benefit, The effect of not having the fund will lead to critical Government services not being offered and it will make the GP fail in its mandate of being the mouthpiece and handwriting of the Government.
- b) Several alternatives were explored before recommending the opening up of this dedicated Fund including:
 - i) Maintaining the Status Quo: Reliance on periodic exchequer funding has proven inefficient, leading to delays, budget constraints, and reduced service quality. This has affected timely government communication and compromised service delivery, ultimately impacting governance and economic planning.
 - ii) Privatization or Outsourcing: While privatization could attract investment, it poses security risks, such as potential leaks of classified government information. Additionally, outsourcing would


increase dependency on private entities, leading to fluctuating costs and reduced state control over critical government documentation processes.

- iii) Public-Private Partnerships (PPP): While PPPs may help in infrastructure development, they do not guarantee sustained financing for operational expenses, making a dedicated Fund more viable. PPPs also come with contractual complexities and long-term obligations that may not align with the urgent and evolving needs of the Government Press.
 - c) These alternatives point to the establishment of the fund through section 34 of the exchequer and Audit Act of 1988 (Government Press, Regulation of 1988), was to ensure timely, and consistent delivery of production materials for printing urgent Government documents which cannot be offered relying on the normal and limited exchequer processes.
 - d) The establishment of the fund shall contribute to the generation of revenue to other sectors of the economy through employment creation and value chain
 - e) It shall provide a proper legal anchorage and operation framework of the Government Press Fund.
 - f) It shall provide a framework of the Government press as the national organ (State Printer) for the printing of Government security documents.
 - g) Through the regulation, Kenya Gazette shall be classified as the official Newspaper for dissemination of Government notices and general information to the public or legal requirements
- 3) **Assessment of costs and benefits of the proposed Government Press Fund.**

The seed capital for the Fund will be appropriated by the National Assembly. Other revenues include donations, grants, income from commercial activities, and loans.

The following are the costs and benefits of the proposed Government Press Fund

- a) Enhanced revenue collection
 - b) Reduction in over-reliance on the exchequer
 - c) Acquisition of modern machines and equipment
 - d) Timely and efficient repair of machines and equipment
 - e) Competitive prices for the clients who are mostly MDAs
- 4) **Any other matters specified by the guidelines:**
Overall, the net impact of the proposed Legal Notice on Government Press Fund by the Executive Office of the President is positive. It is recommended that the proposed Regulations be adopted.

PART I

- Name of instrument:** Public Finance Management (Government Press Fund) Regulations, 2025.
- Name of Parent Act:** The Public Finance Management Act (*No. 18 of 2012*).

- Name of Ministry:** The National Treasury & Economic Planning/Executive Office of the President.

PART II

1. Purpose of the Statutory Instrument

Government Press is the government's primary centralized resource for producing, procuring, authenticating, cataloging, disseminating, and preserving the official information products of the Kenya Government.

The objectives of and reasons for the proposed Legal Notice are mainly to provide funds to support the sustainability of the commercial and noncommercial activities of the Government Press which include; printing publishing, publications and consulting and in particular;

- a) finance the purchase of raw materials for printing and publishing works by the Government Press including;-
 - i. artworks;
 - ii. designs;

- iii. printed stationery and documents;
 - iv. printed and bound publications including the Kenya Gazette, Kenya Gazette Supplements, chapters of the Laws of Kenya and official Government publications;
 - v. security printing;
 - vi. exercise books;
 - vii. security documents; and
 - viii. any other stationery and publications;
- b) finance the maintenance, renewal and replacement of plant, machinery and equipment used for printing and publishing works by the Government Press;
- c) provide resources for the payment of overheads related to printing and publishing works referred to in paragraph (a); and
- d) support any other activities incidental to the sustainability of the Fund.

2. Legislative Context

The National Assembly delegated the duty to establish national public funds to the Cabinet Secretary responsible for finance with the approval of the National Assembly. This is provided for under Section 24 (4) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and Section 207 of the Public Finance Management Regulations, 2015.

The Regulations are therefore developed within the meaning of Section 24 (4) of the Public Finance Management Act 2012 and the procedure for public participation provided under Statutory Instrument Act, 2013.

3. Policy Background (Government Press)

The Government Press Fund was established under the Exchequer and Audit Regulations (Government Press Fund Regulation, 1988) to support the operations of the Government Press. From its inception, the fund was primarily used to procure production materials necessary for printing and publishing government documents. To address operational challenges and enhance service delivery in line with customer expectations, the Government of Kenya introduced the fund in 1988 with an initial seed capital of Kenya Pounds 1,000,000.

The primary objective of the Government Press Fund was to facilitate the publishing, printing, and dissemination of official government information, state security materials, and educational resources, including exercise books for ministries, departments, and the public. The fund served as a revolving financial resource to ensure a steady supply of production materials, particularly paper and other essential consumables. Additionally, it provided financial flexibility in emergencies requiring urgent procurement of printing materials.

The fund was subject to audit by the Office of the Auditor General. However, despite significant changes in both internal and external operational environments, it was never formally reviewed after its establishment in 1988. Furthermore, the fund was designed to enable the Government Press to sustain the provision of free printed standard government forms and books to various ministries, departments, and agencies, ensuring efficient service delivery across the public sector.

4. Guidance

The National Treasury and Economic Planning and Executive Office of the President shall sensitize the National Assembly, Ministries, Departments, Agencies and County Governments on the objectives of the Government Press Fund.

5. Stakeholder Consultations

The Government Press Fund Task force (Task force) responsible for the preparation and development of the Regulations, will hold consultations with key stakeholders and their input taken into account before finalization of these draft Regulations. The Government Press Fund Taskforce is composed of the National Treasury, Executive Office of the President, Government Press and the Attorney General's office.

The key stakeholders are mainly Ministries, Departments, Agencies and County Governments

In line with the provisions of Section 5 of the Statutory Instruments Act, 2014, the National Treasury together with the Executive Office of the President will undertake public participation before publication of these Regulations.

The mode of public participation includes invitation of key stakeholders via an advertisement which will be posted on the National Treasury website and published in the *My Gov* Newspaper of 10th March, 2024. Written submissions on the Regulations should be sent to psnt@treasury.go.ke and jona.wala@treasury.go.ke.

6. Impact Assessment

An impact assessment has been prepared for this statutory instrument and is appended at **Appendix II**.


7. Review
