THE SOCIAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT

(No. 16 of 2023)

TARIFFS FOR HEALTHCARE SERVICES (AMENDMENT), 2026

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 32(2) of the Social Health Insurance Act, the Cabinet Secretary for Health, in consultation with the Board of the Social Health Authority, amends the Schedule to the Tariffs for Healthcare Services, 2025—

- (a) in the item headed “Primary Healthcare Fund”, by inserting the following new package immediately after the package headed “END OF LIFE SERVICES” —

MATERNITY, NEONATAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES

1. Delivery by ways of normal delivery, assisted delivery and caesarean section as necessitated. 2. Aftercare for the mother together with the newborn. 3. (b) in the item headed "Emergency, Chronic and Critical Illness Fund", under the package headed "CHRONIC ILLNESSES", in the "Tariffs" column, by deleting the expression "KES 150,000" appearing in paragraph 3 and substituting therefor the expression "KES 400,000"; and

(c) by deleting ANNEX 2: headed "HEMATOLOGY & ONCOLOGY SERVICES PACKAGE SUB-LIMITS" and substituting therefor the following new Annex—
