Pursuant to section 20(1) of the NG-CDF Act No. 30 of 2015 and section 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No. 33 of 2011 the Cabinet Secretary for National Treasury and Planning, Hon (Amb) Ukur Yatani, EGH nominated Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille for the position of the Chief Executive Officer of the Board. The nomination of Prof. Mohamed Hussein was conveyed to the Speaker of the National Assembly through a letter Ref. No. TNTP/SDP/4/52(*Annex 1*), dated 26th February, 2020. The nominee's Curriculum Vitae and other testimonials were attached.

On Tuesday, 3rd March, 2020 and pursuant to section 20 of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015, the Speaker of the National Assembly read the message from Cabinet Secretary, National Treasury & Planning communicating the name of the nominee for approval by the National Assembly pursuant to section 4 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and section 20(1) (d) of the NG-CDF Act, 2015 and Standing Order 45(1) , the name of the nominee was referred to the select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund for the necessary approval hearings vetting and reporting to the House within fourteen (14) days.

In compliance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Thursday, 5th March, 2020, (*Annex 2*) inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (*affidavit*) on the suitability of the nominee in conformity with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The memoranda were to be received by Wednesday 11th March, 2020 at 5.00 pm. By close of the submission deadline, the Clerk of the National Assembly had received a total number of 6 submissions.

Pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution, section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Standing Order 45(3), the Clerk of the National Assembly on Thursday, 5th March, 2020, notified the public in the print media the exercise the select Committee on NG-CDF to undertake the approval hearing of the nominee on Thursday, 12th March 2020 at 10.00am in Continental House room No. 4(*Annex 3*).

The nominee Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille appeared before the committee on Thursday, 12th March 2020 at 10.00am for approval hearing in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 , the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act,2015 and the National Assembly Standing Orders on his suitability or otherwise for appointment to the position of Chief Executive Officer of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board.

I take this opportunity to thank all Members of the Committee for their dedication to duty. I also wish to thank the offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for according the Committee the necessary logistical support during the vetting exercise.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 20 of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015, the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury & Planning nominated Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille for position of the Chief Executive Officer of the of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board and forwarded his name to the National Assembly for approval.

The Speaker subsequently issued a Communication to the House on 3rd March, 2020 on receipt of the name from the Cabinet Secretary, National Treasury and Planning and committed the nominee to the Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund for approval.

The Committee immediately embarked on the approval exercise in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act (No. 30 of 2015) and the National Assembly Standing Orders.

On 5th March, 2020, the Committee, pursuant to section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 invited the public to submit memoranda on the suitability of the nominee. On 5th March, 2020, the general public was notified of the appointment, pursuant to Section 6(4) of Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the date of the approval hearing scheduled for Thursday, 12th March, 2020 in Committee Room, 4th Floor Continental House, starting at 10.00a.m. The members of the public were required to submit their memoranda by close of business at 5 pm on Wednesday, 11th March, 2020.

The nominee was also required to submit clearance certificates from the following agencies: the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Kenya Revenue Authority, the Higher Education Loans Board, and the Directorate of Criminal Investigation.

By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had received a total number of 6 submissions but only 2 of the 6 submissions met the threshold of memoranda for consideration by the committee as required by provisions of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

The Committee undertook the approval hearing on Thursday 12th March, 2020, in compliance with the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, National Governments Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015 and the National Assembly Standing Orders.

Having conducted the approval hearing for the nominee pursuant to section 20(1) of the Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015, sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 the **Committee recommends that this House rejects the nomination of Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille for appointment as the Chief Executive Officer of the Constituencies Development Fund Board, by the Cabinet Secretary for Treasury & Planning, Hon(Amb.) Ukur Yatani.**

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and mandate of the committee

- (i) The Select Committee on National Government Constituency Development Fund is a Statutory Committee established in accordance with the provisions of section 50 of the NG-CDF Act of 2015 and its functions include:
- a) To oversee the implementation of this Act and in this respect, shall after every two years submit a report to the National Assembly and where necessary, propose any amendments to this Act with respect to the quantum of funds repayable into the Fund in accordance with section 4 of the Act;
 - b) To oversee the policy framework and legislative matters that may arise in relation to the Fund;
 - c) To continually review the frame set out for the efficient delivery of development programmes financed through the Fund;
 - d) To consider and report to the National Assembly, with recommendations, names of persons required to be approved by the National Assembly under this Act; and
 - e) To carry out any other functions relevant to the work of the Fund.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

2.1 Establishment of the position of the Chief Executive Officer of the NG-CDF Board

4. Section 20 of the NGCDF Act provides for the following the position of the Chief Executive Officer of the Board. It states as follows-

20.(1) There shall be a Chief Executive Officer of the Board who shall be recruited by the Board through a competitive process and recommendations made to the Cabinet Secretary for appointment, with the approval of the National Assembly.

(2) No person shall be appointed under this section unless such person-

(a) has a degree in finance, accounting, engineering, economics, community development, law or a related field from a recognized university;

(b) has at least ten years' working experience in the relevant field; and

(c) has served in a senior management position for a minimum period of five years.

(3) The chief executive officer shall subject to the directions of the Board be responsible for the day to day management of the affairs and staff of the Board.

(4) The chief executive officer shall serve for a period of three years renewable once.

2.2 Approval and appointment procedure of the Chief Executive Officer, NG-CDF Board

5. The procedure for recruitment of the Chief Executive Officer of the NGC-DF Board is provided for under the Section 20 (1) of the NG-CDF Act. It states-

(1) There shall be a chief executive officer of the Board who shall be recruited by the Board through a competitive process and recommendations made to the Cabinet Secretary for appointment, with the approval of the National Assembly.

2.3 Notification of nomination

6. On Tuesday, 3rd March, 2020 and pursuant to section 20 of the National Government Constituencies Development Act, 2015, the Speaker of the National Assembly read the message from Cabinet Secretary, National Treasury & Planning communicating the name of the nominee for approval by the National Assembly.

2.4 Committal to the Committee

7. Pursuant to section 4 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and section 20(1) (d) of the NG-CDF Act, 2015 the name of the nominee was referred to the select

Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund for the necessary vetting and reporting to the House within fourteen (14) days.

2.5 Notification to the public

8. In compliance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Thursday, 5th March, 2020, (*Annex 1*) inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (*affidavit*) on the suitability of the nominee in conformity with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The advert required members of the public to present their submissions by close of business on Wednesday 11th March, 2020 at 5.00 pm. By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had received a total of 6 submissions but only 2 of 6 submissions met the threshold of memoranda for consideration by the committee as required by provisions of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.
9. Pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution, section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Standing Order 45(3), the Clerk of the National Assembly on Thursday, 5th March, 2020, notified the public in the print media that the select Committee on NG-CDF will undertake the approval hearing of the nominee on Thursday, 12th March, 2020 at 10.00am in the Committee on 4th Floor in Continental House (*Annex 2*).

2.6 Clearance Requirements

10. On 4th of March, 2020, the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) (*Annexure 3*) requesting for reports with respect to the nominee on the following issues:
 - (i) ethics and integrity;
 - (ii) tax compliance;
 - (iii) criminal records;
 - (iv) Higher education loan repayments; and
 - (v) political party affiliations.

11. With regard to the Ethics and Integrity, the Ethics and Ant-corruption Commission *vide* a letter Ref. No. EACC.7/10/5 VOL.XIII (60) and dated 12th March, 2020 (*Annex 4*) confirmed that the Commission has not undertaken any investigations in relation to the nominee on any matter where the nominee has been adversely mentioned.
12. With regards to matters on tax obligation, the KRA confirmed *vide* a letter Ref. No. KRA/5/1002/5/ (2040) and dated 10th March, 2020 (*Annex 5*) that the nominee was tax compliant.
13. The DCI through a letter Ref. No. DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.III/197 and dated 10th March, 2020 (*Annex 6*) issued a clearance certificate to the nominee. (*Annex 7*).
14. The Higher Education Loans Board confirmed *vide* a letter Ref. No. HELB/RR/112009/34 date 10th March, 2020 and dated 17th February, 2020 (*Annex 8*), that the nominee is not a beneficiary of the Go/HELB Loans Scheme.
15. On the issue of party affiliation, the office of the Registrar of political parties *vide* a letter dated 9th March, 2020, REF NO: RPP/ORG/34 Vol. IV (11), Ref. No. (*Annexure 9*) confirmed that the nominee is not an official of a political party.

2.7 Issues for consideration during the approval hearing

16. The Committee took into consideration section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 which provides the issues for consideration by the relevant House in relation to any nomination. These are:
 - a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
 - b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
 - c) the suitability of the nominee for appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.
17. Section 6 (7) of the Act provides further guidance which places focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.

2.7.1 Procedure for Nomination

18. The procedure of nomination of the Chief Executive Officer of the NGC-DF Board is provided for under the Section 20(1) of the NG-CDF Act. It states-
- 20.(1) There shall be a chief executive officer of the Board who shall be recruited by the Board through a competitive process and recommendations made to the Cabinet Secretary for appointment, with the approval of the National Assembly.
19. Section 15 (2) of the NG-CDF Act further provides that in nominating or approving the appointment of a person as a member of the Board under sub-section (1), the Cabinet Secretary and the National Assembly shall take into account gender equity and the regional diversities of the people of Kenya.
20. Further, Regulations 4(2) of the NGCDF Regulations, 2016 requires the NGCDF Board to forward to the Cabinet Secretary three names of selected candidates, from among whom the Cabinet Secretary nominates one and notifies the National Assembly on the same.
21. Regulation 4 of the National Government Constituencies Development Regulations outlines the procedures for appointment of a chief executive officer. It states-
- “4. (1) The Board shall, in recruiting the chief executive officer of the Board under Section 20(1) of the Act, ensure that the recruitment is carried out in a transparent and competitive manner.*
- (2) The Board shall finalise the recruitment of the chief executive officer of the Board within sixty days from date of the close of the application period, and shall forward three names of the selected candidates to the Cabinet Secretary for consideration.*
- (3) The Cabinet Secretary shall, within twenty one days after receiving the names of the selected candidates from the Board, forward the name of one of the selected candidates to the National Assembly for approval.*
- (4) The National Assembly shall, within twenty-one days of receipt of the name of the selected candidate from the Cabinet Secretary, under paragraph (3) consider the nomination, and may approve or reject the nomination.*

- (5) *Where the National Assembly approves the nomination under paragraph (4), the Speaker of the National Assembly shall forward the name of the approved person to the Cabinet Secretary for appointment.*
- (6) *The Cabinet Secretary shall, within fourteen days of the approval by the National Assembly, by notice in the Gazette, appoint the person approved by the National Assembly as the chief executive officer of the Board.*
- (7) *Where the National Assembly rejects the person nominated by the Cabinet Secretary, the Speaker of the National Assembly shall, within three days of the decision, communicate the decision of the National Assembly to the Cabinet Secretary and request the Cabinet Secretary to submit a fresh nomination.*
- (8) *The Cabinet Secretary shall submit to the National Assembly a name from the list initially forwarded by the Board within seven days of receipt of the communication from the Speaker.*
- (9) *Where the National Assembly rejects the names of all the persons nominated by the Cabinet Secretary the provisions of paragraph (2) shall apply."*

2.7.2 Constitutional and other Statutory Requirements

22. The Constitution in addition gives guidelines on how to appoint persons to public office which include -

(a) Two-third Gender Rule

Article 27 (8) of the Constitution provides that the State shall take legislative and other measures to implement the principle that not more than two-thirds of the members of elective or appointive bodies shall be of the same gender

(b) Leadership and Integrity

23. The Committee, in determining the suitability of the nominee, was also guided by the provisions on leadership and integrity as outlined under Chapter Six of the Constitution. In particular, Article 73 (2) provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include

-

- (i) selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;
- (ii) objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
- (iii) selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by —
 - (a) honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - (b) the declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;
 - (c) accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
 - (d) discipline and commitment in service to the people.

24. Article 77(5) requires a State Officer, whether in public or private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties. This Article further prohibits a State Officer who has been removed from office under it from holding any other State Office.

25. Article 77(1) prohibits a full time State Officer from participating in any other gainful employment.

26. Article 77(2) prohibits an appointed State officer from holding office in a political party. Article 78 disqualifies persons who are not Kenyan Citizens from appointment as State Officers. Further, a State Officer is barred from holding dual citizenship.

27. In addition, the Committee considered section 10 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 in particular which provides that –

(viii) A State officer shall, to the best of their ability—

- (i) carry out the duties of the office efficiently and honestly;
- (ii) carry out the duties in a transparent and accountable manner;
- (iii) keep accurate records and documents relating to the functions of the office; and
- (iv) report truthfully on all matters of the organization which they represent.

2.8 Submission of Memoranda

28. By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had received a total number of 6 submissions but only 2 of the 6 submissions met the threshold of a memoranda for consideration by the committee as required by provisions of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The memoranda received were as follows-

2.8.1 Public Memoranda by concerned citizen alliance

29. Mr. Peter Agoro on behalf of concerned citizens in a memorandum dated 11th March, 2020 opposed the appointment of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille based on the following grounds: THAT—

(i) The Nominee barely passed the interview with 63 points way below other candidates. The Cabinet Secretary erred in appointing him while rejecting more qualified candidates that the NGCDF Board submitted to him after a competitive interview. The public demands to know the grounds of rejection of other qualified candidates.

(ii) The nominee does not meet the requisite requirements stipulated in Section 20 of the NGCDF Act, 2015 on the appointment of a CEO. He lacks in experience and professional background to effectively perform the duties of his office. There are glaring inconsistencies on his CV on what he purported to be his work experience and the actual experience needed of the appointee of such office.

(iii) The nominee has a consistent history of incompetence in almost every field he has served. The last state corporation he worked in as the DVC for Administration, Finance and Planning at Maasai Mara University, the university council suspended him on the grounds of gross incompetence, misconduct and corruption and eventually unceremoniously sacked him after the university senate found him guilty of all allegations against him.

2.8.2 Public Memoranda by John Kiptoo

30. Mr. John Kiptoo in his memoranda dated 11th march, 2020 stated that he supports the appointment on the following grounds: THAT—

- (i) Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille meets all requirements set out in the call for applications by the Board as set out in Section 20 of the NGCDF Act, 2015.
- (ii) He is qualified, competent, young, and dynamic and would represent empowerment of youth in line with government policy.
- (iii) That he is an orphan and represents inclusion of marginalized communities in government.
- (iv) His appointment will be a fulfilment of the dream and promise of our constitution of giving every Kenyan child an equal opportunity no matter where they come from.
- (v) Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille is a man with impeccable character.

2.8.3 Public memoranda by Fredrick Ouma Jowi and John Kiptoo

31. The two persons in their memoranda dated 10th March, 2020 opposed the appointment of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille based on the following grounds: THAT—

- (i) Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille does not meet the minimum requirements (job requirements) set out in the call for applications by the Board and as stipulated in Section 20 of the NGCDF Act 2015.
- (ii) The nominee did not meet the minimum university entry requirements as set out by the Kenya National Qualifications Authority.
- (iii) He has a low confidence in our public institutions of learning.
- (iv) That the Commission of University Education needs to confirm whether the Universities attended by Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille are accredited.
- (v) That the nominee was adversely mentioned in the Maasai Mara University Heist and that they do not know whether he was cleared.
- (vi) there is bias of the Cabinet Secretary Ministry of Finance & Planning towards certain communities.
- (vii) The recruiting panel of the Bard flouted standards set out under Article 47 of the Constitution which requires written reasons for any administrative action that adversely affects a person.

(viii) Constitutional values for fair competition, equal opportunity and fair administrative action have been subverted by the recruitment panel of the Board.

(ix) The shortlisting and forwarding of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille for vetting and appointment was a pre-determined exercise and there was no purpose of the recruitment.

2.8.4 Affidavit by Abigael Mengech

32. Ms Abigael Mengech in her affidavit (*Annexure 10*) dated 10th March 2020 opposed the appointment of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille based on the following grounds: THAT—

- (i) From the year 2002 to 2009, he is stated to have been a research scientist for KEMRI while also pursuing his undergraduate, master's degree and later PHD in University of Mysore, India and China Agricultural University respectively. It is doubtful whether he was working for KEMRI during those years, otherwise, how could he be studying in India and China while simultaneously working at KEMRI?
- (ii) The nominee joined Egerton University in 2010 as a lecturer in Human Pathology. The Pathology department of Egerton University was established in September 2012 where he became Chairman. The Department did not offer any degree studies. This cannot qualify as a senior management position and neither is it in a relevant field as required in the NGCDF Act.
- (iii) Prof Abdille's work experience dates from 2010 to date which is below 10 years by the time of closure of the advert on 7th January 2020.
- (iv) The Professor was appointed in 2019 as Deputy Vice Chancellor at Maasai Mara University. This could be the only time he has served in a senior management position. Up to the time of closure of the advert, he will have served for only one year in a senior management position contrary to Section 20 of the NGCDF Act which requires the candidate to have served in a senior management position for a minimum of five years.
- (ix)(v) The nominee does not meet the relevant fields of specialization required under the NGCDF Act. His field of specialization is listed as Molecular parasitology.
- (vi) The professor does not meet the minimum requirements for appointment as CEO of NGCDF Board.

2.8.5 Affidavit of Samson Mosonik

33. Mr. Samson Mosonik in his affidavit (*Annexure 11*) dated 11th March, 2020 opposed the appointment of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille on the following grounds: THAT

- (i) The nominee does not meet the required qualifications clearly stated in the job advert.
- (ii) If he is appointed to the position, it will greatly affect the delivery of his role and the people and institutions that will greatly depend on his expertise and experience which he does not possess.
- (iii) His appointment will be prejudicial to other applicants who meet the job criteria.
- (iv) His appointment will be contrary to the values set out in Article 10 of the Constitution as it will not be based on merit but on other considerations such as favouritism, nepotism etc.
- (v) The appointment of the Professor will be inconsistent with the guiding principles set out under Chapter Six of the Constitution.
- (vi) His appointment will impact negatively on the government's nine point agenda and Vision 2030.
- (vii) The nominee is under suspension from his job.

2.8.6 Memorandum by Samuel Kosgei

36. Mr. Samuel Kosgei in his memorandum objects to the nomination of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille for the following reasons -

- (i) The nominee while serving at Maasai Mara University as the Deputy Vice Chancellor, he irregularly appointed Mr. Mohammed Mahmoud as senior driver Grade 8 and Najma Hasbia Osman as assistant procurement officer without authority of the University Management council, an action amounting to abuse of office privileges and authority.
 - (ii) The nominee demonstrated high level of indiscipline that led to his dismissal from employment at the Maasai Mara University on gross misconduct.
37. It is important to note that the only statements admissible in accordance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointment (Parliamentary Approval) is the affidavit by Mr. Samson Mosonik and

an affidavit by Ms. Abigael Mengech. The other memoranda received by the Committee were not admissible on account of not qualifying as a statement on oath (affidavit).

2.9 Written response by the Nominee to the Memoranda

38. The nominee in his written response (*Annexure 12*) submitted: THAT,

- (x) He is a Kenyan citizen and a holder of Identity Card Number 20450705 and a male adult of sound mind and competent to make the declaration.
- (xi) He met the requisites of the position of Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the National Government's Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF) as he was a holder of the following: A Bachelors Degree in Sciences; A master's degree in Business Administration; A post graduate certificate in strategic leadership and development.
- (xii) The advertisement for the position of Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the National Government's Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF) indicated that the required number of years of public service as 15 years, and he had 17 years of public service.
- (xiii) He had more than 10 years of experience in senior management of public and private institutions which surpasses the requisite number of years stated in the advertisement for the position of Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the National Government's Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF), which is 5 years and his *Curriculum Vitae* supports the same.
- (xiv) He has a strong knowledge of public and private sector management having served as the chairman of a University Department; Director of a University Institute; Director of a Research Council; National Member of ad hoc Educational Committee; Deputy Vice Chancellor in charge of Administration, Finance and Planning of a University; Senior Advisor to the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Education.
- (xv) He was strongly opposed to the allegation that there was nepotism or favouritism by the Board of the National Government's Constituency Development Fund.
- (xvi) He had applied for the position of Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the National Government's Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF) with a positive mind, attitude and merit as he met the requisites and had extensive experience.
- (xvii) He has a strong interpersonal skill which has been instrumental in bringing International Partners for the development of the education and technology sectors of the country.
- (xviii) As a government parastatal such as the National Government's Constituency

Development Fund (NG-CDF) was deserving of his vast experience in lobbying for international donors and agencies that will be valuable in a time when the need to give Kenyans quality Education, Healthcare and Environmental Protection was pressing.

- (xix) He has an irrefutable consistent record exhibiting a high degree of Professionalism in all contexts where he has had the honor to represent his Country and its People, here in Kenya and abroad.
- (xx) He strongly believes that volunteering for the right cause was a noble duty expected of every Citizen in the Republic of Kenya.
- (xxi) He had never been convicted of a crime, neither been implicated in any corruption related matters and that was verifiable by his involvement in the fight against corruption and dangerous cartels at Maasai Mara University that were found to have looted the University's funds meant to assist destitute Kenyans.
- (xxii) His suspension from the Maasai Mara University was orchestrated by the University Council and Acting Vice Chancellor, against whom he shall testify as a State-witness in legal actions brought against them.
- (xxiii) His suspension from the Maasai Mara University was vacated by the High Court in Nakuru on the 4th day of March, 2020 and subsequently revoked by the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Education, Prof George A.O Magoha.
- (xxiv) The Directorate of Criminal Investigations has thoroughly warned the Maasai Mara University Council not to intimidate or harass him as a State-witness. The University Council disrespected the Constitution and blatantly ignored Court Orders from the High Court in Nakuru.
- (xxv) He was a Kenyan who was cleared by all the authorized government agencies and his integrity held firm contrary to what one Abigael Mengech was alluding.

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS

39. Having received the name of the nominee, the Committee embarked on the approval process in accordance with the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval Act) (No.33 of 2011) and Section 15 of the NG-CDF Act of 2015.
40. The Committee held three meetings: A pre-approval hearing meeting on Tuesday 10th March, 2020, the approval hearing on Thursday, 12th March, 2020 and a meeting on 16th March, 2020 to consider the draft report and adopt its report.
41. In carrying out the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act of 2015, and the National Assembly Standing Orders.
42. The Committee also considered the following in vetting the nominee: -
- (i) Academic qualifications;
 - (ii) Employment record and work experience;
 - (iii) Professional association;
 - (iv) Public office, political activities and affiliations;
 - (v) Potential conflict of interest;
 - (vi) Suitability to the position;
 - (vii) Integrity; and
 - (viii) Expectations and Key priorities.

3.1 Vetting of Professor Mohamed Hussein Abdille

43. The nominee, Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille, appeared before the Committee on Thursday, **12th March, 2020 at 10.00 am** and was interviewed pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution, Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the National Government Constituencies Development Act, 2015 and the Standing Orders of the National Assembly. The Committee took note of his submissions-

Citizenship, Date and Place of Birth

44. He is Kenyan, male citizen, identity card Number 20450705, born in 1976 in Wajir County.

Academic and Professional Qualifications

45. He holds a PhD (Molecular Parasitology) from China Agricultural University, Beijing, MBA Masters of Business Administration in Global Strategic Management, Staffordshire University, MSC degree in Biotechnology and Bachelor of Science degree from University of Mysore in India and completed his KCSE in Wajir High School.

Work and Professional Experience

46. He is currently the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration, Finance & Planning) at Maasai Mara University; He also served as the Senior Advisor to the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Education, Director International Chinese Institute, Chairman of two Departments at Egerton University, CEO of Africa Medical Research Council, Africa and China Agricultural University as well as Research Officer at KEMRI.

Honors and Awards

47. Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille stated that he had received various awards among them -
- (i) Awarded an Indian Government Scholarship under the Kenyan Government to undertake undergraduate studies, BSc Medical Microbiology and Clinical Biochemistry [1996–2000]
 - (ii) Awarded University of Mysore Scholarship to undertake MSc in Biotechnology [2000–2002]
 - (iii) Post Doctorate Fellowship, University of Basel, Switzerland [2000–2002]
 - (iv) Drugs for Neglected diseases Initiative fellowship as a Research Fellow to the University of Dundee, Scotland
 - (v) ChongQing University partial scholarships for pursuing fellowship in the John Hopkins Medical University fellowship

Professional Associations

48. The nominee stated that he is a member of the following associations -
- (i) Member of the International Society for parasitologist, 2009-to date
 - (ii) Member of International Society against Cancer, Bangalore, India, 2008-2012
 - (iii) Member of the China Agricultural University think tank, 2008 to date
 - (iv) Member of the welcome Trust Society, 2011-2016
 - (v) Member of the Filarial Encephalopathy Advisory Committee, 2007–2011
 - (vi) Member of the Joint Research Advisory Group on African Sleeping Sickness, 2010–2012

Other Activities and Membership

49. The nominee is a member of Muthaiga Country Club, the Windsor Golf & Country Club, Karen Country Club, Parklands Sports Club and the Nyeri Golf Club.

Published Writing

50. The nominee submitted that he has written several publications among them -

Political Activities and Affiliations

51. The nominee had no record of political activities and affiliations to any political party.

Potential Conflict of Interest

52. He has no immediate associations that are likely to present potential conflict of interest when he assumes the position.

Sources of Income and Net-worth

53. He estimated his financial net worth at Ksh. 11.2 million (eleven Million two hundred thousand only), comprising of a three (3) bedroom house, two motor vehicle (a Toyota Prado and a Toyota Isis) a plot and a salary of Ksh. 1,100,000, net pay of Ksh. 760,000.

Integrity

54. The nominee stated that he had not been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravening the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution. He has also not been adversely associated with practices that depict bias, favouritism or nepotism in the discharge of public duties.

55. He pointed out that he has fully complied with the tax obligations to the State for the financial year immediately preceding his nomination for the appointment.

56. The nominee further submitted that he has not been charged in court of law in the last three years or been adversely been mentioned in an investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry in the last three years.

General Questions and Sector specific questions to the Nominee

57. In order to assess his overall suitability on the position, the Committee examined the nominee on general and specific thematic areas which the nominee responded to as follows: -

Achievements

58. He submitted that as a patriotic Kenyan and in line with his understanding of Article 10 and Article 232 of the Constitution he has immensely contributed to the development of the country in the following ways-

- (i) Acquired 195 scholarships for deserving Kenyans that is now recognised by the President and shared across the 47 counties of Kenya
- (ii) Contributed to the establishment of Sino-China Joint Research centre worth Ksh 3.2 B
- (iii) Facilitated the construction of the Science complex at Egerton University worth Ksh 600m.

(iv) Arranged for equipment worth Ksh 147m for Maasai Mara University.

(v) Acquired a grant worth Ksh 4.2 billion for the establishment of Science Complex at Maasai Mara University.

Relevance of the nominee's academic qualifications

59. The Nominee informed the Committee that the BSC degree was a relevant degree to that of engineering. He asserted that as a field of study, engineering is classified as science. He further asserted that the BSC course entails multi-disciplinary subject matter such as languages, botany, and chemistry among others.

Work experience and relevance to the position

60. The Nominee informed the Committee that he had cumulative work experience of about 17 years. He asserted that he held senior administrative positions that involved budgeting, financial management, strategy development, procurement, and human resource, accounting, administration, accounting and related matters. Some included management of budget running to millions of shillings, for instance one assignment as the CEO of the Research council involved the management of budget of 16 countries, 6500 staff with a budget of Ksh7.2 billion.

Nature and scope of the fund and interaction with stakeholders

61. The nominee stated that he understood the nature and scope of the Fund as social fund that was intended to empower the people especially at the lowest level. He further submitted that Members of Parliament as representatives of the people understood the importance of the Fund. He will strive for a positive engagement with the Members of Parliament in a special way and aspire to create positive relationship between the Committee and the Board.

Relationship between the fund and other devolved funds

62. The nominee submitted that he will work with all stakeholders especially Members of Parliament to address the issues related to the operations of the fund. He submitted that he would recommend that the allocation be increased to 5% of the total revenue. He further stated that he will help constituency level SMEs to access the funds by making procurement process more efficient. He also indicated that he will advocate for timely disbursement of funds. The nominee averred that the Fund preceded other devolved funds and he supports the continuous existence of the NG-CDF Fund. He submitted that the fund's impact had been felt all over the

country and remains a lifeline to many citizens hence an important safeguard to defend its existence.

Misappropriation of funds at Maasai Mara University

63. The nominee submitted that issues of corruption in the Maasai Mara preceded him and he was appointed as the Deputy Vice Chancellor while there was an active investigation by the DCI at the University. He further took a number of steps including freezing of accounts and refusing to sign cheques that were not drawn procedurally. He ensured the financial prudence guidelines were followed and adhered to the provisions of the law such as the PFM Act, the Public Procurement and Assets Disposal Act and other guidelines issued by the government.

64. The nominee while being questioned about the suspension and subsequent dismissal by the Maasai Mara University, submitted that the University Council had attempted to suspend and dismiss him due to his stand against corruption at the institution. This was an effort by the Council to intimidate him since he was a state witness against Council members. The DCI wrote to the CS Education to intervene due to the investigations that were ongoing (*Annexure 13*). The matter is in court and he is still the DVC, Maasai Mara.

Competence to manage such the fund

65. The nominee informed the Committee that he had managed complex assignments in his career and was up to the task. He further informed the Committee that he was committed to meeting the demand of the job and deliver on its objectives. He also stated that even though the Fund involved the management of huge resources as compared to Maasai Mara University, he nonetheless had the energy, experience, charisma and the connection to deliver on the demands of the job as provided by law. He also informed the Committee that he had the experience and the knowledge to raise funds through partnerships and collaborations. He stated that he would explore public private partnerships in consultation with the Board and the National Assembly Select Committee.

66. The Nominee further submitted that he had handled positions that involved 16 countries with different levels of development, political persuasion, inaccessible areas, huge population and nationalities. These had given him the necessary experience required in managing the Fund.

3.2 Submissions by the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board

67. The Committee sought clarification from the Board on the recruitment process. In order to clarify certain issues that arose during the vetting process, the Committee held a meeting with the NGCDF Board on 16th March, 2020. The Chairman of the board submitted as follows:

Job advert

68. The Board submitted that it included a Bachelor of Business Administration in the advert even though this was not provided for in the Act, it however did not affect the shortlisting exercise.

Academic Qualifications

69. The Chairman of the Board submitted that the Board interpreted the provisions of Section 20 of NGCDF Act, 2015 on the academic qualifications to mean any other related field to all the listed degrees.

Shortlisting and interviews

70. All the shortlisted candidates had met the minimum requirements as provided in Section 20 of the Act and as per the advert placed by the Board on 17th December 2019. The Board conducted the interviews of the seven shortlisted candidates on 6th February, 2020 and submitted its recommendations to the Cabinet Secretary on 7th February, 2020.

Job Experience

71. The Board found all the shortlisted Candidates to have had the relevant work experience as per the NG-CDF Act.

External Interference

72. The Board stated that they were under no direction of any person or Authority in arriving at the decision they made and that the interviews were conducted in accordance to the relevant provisions of the NGCDF Act.

Institutional clearance.

73. By the time of interviewing the shortlisted candidates, EACC and DCI had not responded to the Boards' request for clearance certificates. Only Kenya Revenue Authority had submitted a clearance letter by the close of the stipulated period indicating that the candidates were tax compliant. The Board, therefore, submitted names of the three successful candidates to the Cabinet Secretary for appointment without the clearance documents from EACC, ORPP and DCI. However, the clearance was later submitted and there was no adverse report on any of

the names submitted to the CS.

Misappropriations of funds at Maasai Mara University

74. The Board clarified that, during their shortlisting and interview they were not aware of any suspension, interdiction or court cases ongoing for any of the Candidates. Further, the board was not privy to the information that the nominee Prof. Abdille was a state witness.

Gender balance

75. Out of the 29 candidates who applied for the position of CEO of NG-CDF Board, only three were ladies. Two ladies were shortlisted for interviews but did not perform well scoring an aggregate of 37.6 and 44.1 percentage.

Board's recommendation to the Cabinet Secretary

76. Pursuant to Section 20 of the NGCDF Act and after interviewing the seven shortlisted candidates, the Board submitted to the Cabinet Secretary names of the best three candidates with their aggregate scores as follows:

- (1) Mr. Yusuf Mbuno with a score of 93%
- (2) Prof. Mohamed Abdille with a score of 73.3%
- (3) Mr. Jackton Omullo Akelo with a score of 66.35%

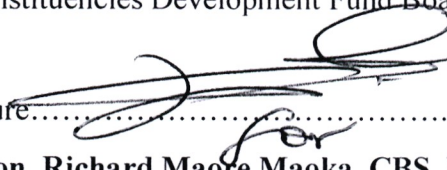
4.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

77. The Committee made the following observations having considered the nominees' curriculum vitae, filled questionnaire pursuant to the Schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011 and the oral submissions during the approval hearings:

- (1) The nominee is a Kenyan citizen born in 1976 in Wajir County;
- (2) The nominee—
 - a) appeared for the interview by the NGCDF Board on 6th February, 2020 while on suspension and did not disclose his status to the interviewing panel;
 - b) has an active employment case in court between himself and the Maasai Mara University Council.
- (3) He has 11 years' experience, holding various management positions including senior advisor to the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Education, CEO Medical Research Council, Africa, Director, International Chinese Institute, Egerton University, Chairman of Department, Egerton University;
- (4) He holds PhD (Molecular Parasitology) from China Agricultural University, Beijing, MSC degree in Biotechnology, Master of Business Administration degree from Staffordshire University, Bachelor of Science (Microbiology and clinical biochemistry) degree from University of Mysore in India which are not related degrees for the purposes of section 20 (2)(a) of NGCDF Act 2015;
- (5) The EACC, KRA, DCI, ORPP, and HELB had sent clearance letters with respect to the nominee;
- (6) The nominee has not been charged in a court of law in the last three years;
- (7) The nominee is a state witness in the matter of Maasai Mara University investigation being undertaken by the Director of Criminal Investigations;
- (8) As stipulated in Article 75(1) of the Constitution, he has not shown the possibility of potential conflict of interest.
- (9) He satisfies the requirements of Article 77(1) of the Constitution in that, he does not intend to participate in any other gainful employment if appointed as the Chief Executive Officer of the National Government Constituencies Development Board;
- (10) The nominee does not hold office in any political party and therefore meets the requirements of Article 77(2) of the Constitution;
- (11) The nominee has been dismissed by the University Council of Maasai Mara University as Deputy Vice Chancellor in accordance to Section 44 of the Employment Act;
- (12) The nominee exhibited knowledge in the world academia.

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

78. The Committee having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee following the vetting process, and taking into account its observations, and pursuant to Section 8(2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the National Government Constituency Development Act 2015, the Committee hereby recommends that the National Assembly **REJECTS** the nomination of Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille for appointment to the position of the Chief Executive Officer of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board.

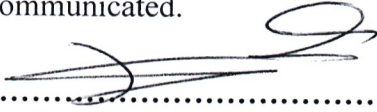

MIN. NA/DCS/NG-CDF /2020/021: MEETING WITH THE NG-CDF BOARD REGARDING THE VETTING OF THE NOMINEE FOR THE CEO OF THE NG-CDF BOARD.

The Committee met the NG-C Board to clarify on the process of interview of the shortlisted candidates for the position of the CEO of the NG-CDF Board. The Chairman of the board submitted as follows:

- (1) That, there were a total of 29 applicant for the position out of which seven most responsive candidates were shortlisted for the interview two being women.
- (2) The board carried out interviews for all the shortlisted candidates and thereafter the Board tallied the results and the report therefrom was signed by 10 of the 11 board members one of the board members was held up in official duties and could not make it.
- (3) During the preparatory meetings the board incorporate the services of Ms. Sally J. Tanui, Deputy Director/ Recruitment and selection, seconded by the public service Commission (PSC). The state Corporation. Additionally, the state Corporation Advisory Committee(SCAC) offered technical advice during the process.

Job advert

- (4) The Board submitted that it included a Bachelor of Business Administration although this did not affect the shortlisting exercise.

Academic Qualifications

- (5) The Chairman submitted that the Board interpreted the provisions of Section 20 of NGCDF Act, 2015 on the academic qualifications to mean any other related field to all the listed degrees.

Shortlisting and interviews

- (6) the shortlisted candidates had met the minimum requirements as provided in Section 20 of the Act and as per the advert placed by the board on 17th December 2019. The Board conducted the interviews of the seven shortlisted candidates on 6th February, 2020 and submitted its recommendations to the Cabinet Secretary on 7th February, 2020.

Job Experience

- (7) The board found all the shortlisted Candidates had the relevant work experience as per the Act.

Possibility of External Interference in the recruitment process

- (8) The Board stated that they were under no direction of any person or Authority in arriving at the decision they made and that the interviews were conducted in accordance to the NGCDF Act.

Institutional clearance.

- (9) the time of interviewing the shortlisted candidates, EACC and DCI had not responded to the Boards' request for clearance certificates. Only Kenya Revenue Authority had submitted clearance letters by the close of the stipulated period. The Board, therefore, submitted names of the three successful candidates to the Cabinet Secretary for appointment without the clearance documents. However, the clearance was later submitted and there was no adverse report on any of the shortlisted candidates.

Misappropriations of funds at Maasai Mara University

- (10) The board clarified that, during their shortlisting and interview they were not aware of any suspension, interdiction or court cases ongoing for any of the Candidates. Further, the board was not privy to the information that the nominee Prof. Abdille was a state witness.

Gender balance

- (11) of the 29 candidates who applied for the position of CEO of NGCDF Board, only three were ladies. Two ladies were shortlisted for interviews but did not perform well scoring an aggregate of 37.6 and 44.1 percentages.

Board's recommendation to the Cabinet Secretary

- (12) Pursuant to Section 20 of the NGCDF Act and after interviewing the seven shortlisted candidates, the Board submitted to the Cabinet Secretary names of the best three candidates with their aggregate scores as follows:
- (i) Mr. Yusuf Mbuno with a score of 93%
 - (ii). Prof. Mohamed Abdille with a score of 73.3%
 - (iii). Mr. Jackton Omullo Akelo with a score of 66.35%

MIN. NA/DCS/NG-CDF /2020/022: CONSIDERATION OF COMMITTEE REPORT

The Committee considered its report and made the following observations on the suitability of the nominee having considered the nominee's curriculum vitae, filled questionnaire pursuant to the Schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011 and the oral submissions during the approval hearings -

- (1) The nominee is a Kenyan citizen born in 1976 in Wajir County;
- (2) The nominee—
 - a) appeared for the interview on 6th February, 2020 while on suspension and did not disclose his status to the interviewing panel;
 - b) has an active employment case in court between himself and the Maasai Mara University Council;
- (3) He has 11 years' experience, holding various management positions including senior advisor to the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Education, CEO Medical Research Council, Africa, Director, International Chinese Institute, Egerton University, Chairman of Department, Egerton University;
- (4) He holds PHD (Molecular Parasitology) from China Agricultural University, Beijing, MSC degree in Biotechnology, Master of Business Administration from Staffordshire University, Bachelor of Science (Microbiology and Clinical Biochemistry) degree from University of Mysore in India which are not related degrees for the purposes of section 20 (2)(a) of NGCDF Act 2015;
- (5) The EACC, KRA, DCI, ORPP, and HELB had sent clearance letters with respect to the nominee;
- (6) The nominee has not been charged in a court of law in the last three years;
- (7) The nominee is a state witness in the matter of Maasai Mara University investigation being undertaken by the Director of Criminal Investigations;
- (8) As stipulated in Article 75(1) of the Constitution, he has not shown the possibility of potential conflict of interest.
- (9) He satisfies the requirements of Article 77(1) of the Constitution in that; he does not intend to participate in any other gainful employment if appointed as the Chief Executive Officer of the National Government Constituencies Development Board;
- (10) The nominee does not hold office in any political party and therefore meets the requirements of Article 77(2) of the Constitution;
- (11) He has been dismissed by the University Council of Maasai Mara University as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration, Finance and Planning) in accordance to Section 44 of the Employment Act;
- (12) The nominee exhibited knowledge in the world of academia.

MIN. NA/DCS/NG-CDF /2020/017: BRIEF BY THE LEGAL COUNSEL ON THE PUBLIC MEMORANDA

The Legal Counsel briefed the Members on the memoranda submitted to the Clerk of the National Assembly and said that, it is important to note that the only memoranda that are admissible in accordance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointment (Parliamentary Approval) were the affidavit by Mr. Samson Mosonik and an affidavit by Ms. Abigael Mengech. The other memoranda received by the Committee were not admissible on account of not qualifying as a statement on oath.

A summary of the public memoranda was as follows: -

(a) Affidavit by Abigael Mengech - 10th March 2020

She opposes the appointment of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille based on the following grounds: THAT—

1. From the year 2002 to 2009, he is stated to have been a research scientist for KEMRI while also pursuing his undergraduate, master's degree and later PHD in University of Mysore, India and China Agricultural University respectively. It is doubtful whether he was working for KEMRI during those years, otherwise, how could he be studying in India and China while simultaneously working at KEMRI?
2. The nominee joined Egerton University in 2010 as a lecturer in Human Pathology. The Pathology department of Egerton University was established in September 2012 where he became Chairman. The Department did not offer any degree studies. This cannot qualify as a senior management position and neither is it in a relevant field as required in the NGCDF Act.
3. Prof Abdille's work experience dates from 2010 to date which is below 10 years by the time of closure of the advert on 7th January 2020.

4. The Professor was appointed in 2019 as Deputy Vice Chancellor at Maasai Mara University. This could be the only time he has served in a senior management position. Up to the time of closure of the advert, he will have served for only one year in a senior management position contrary to Section 20 of the NGCDF Act which requires the candidate to have served in a senior management position for a minimum of five years.
5. The nominee does not meet the relevant fields of specialization required under the NGCDF Act. His field of specialization is listed as Molecular parasitology.
6. The professor does not meet the minimum requirements for appointment as CEO of NGCDF Board.

(b) Affidavit of Samson Mosonik - 11th March 2020

He opposes the appointment of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille on the following grounds:
THAT

1. The nominee does not meet the required qualifications clearly stated in the job advert.
2. If he is appointed to the position, it will greatly affect the delivery of his role and the people and institutions that will greatly depend on his expertise and experience which he does not possess.
3. His appointment will be prejudicial to other applicants who meet the job criteria.
4. His appointment will be contrary to the values set out in Article 10 of the Constitution as it will not be based on merit but on other considerations such as favoritism, nepotism etc.
5. The appointment of the Professor will be inconsistent with the guiding principles set out under Chapter Six of the Constitution.
6. His appointment will impact negatively on the government's nine-point agenda and Vision 2030.
7. The nominee is under suspension from his job.

Public Memoranda by Concerned Citizen Alliance (signed by peter agoro) 11th march 2020

He opposes the appointment of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille based on the following grounds: THAT—

1. the Nominee barely passed the interview with 63 points way below other candidates. The Cabinet Secretary erred in appointing him while rejecting more qualified candidates that the NGCDF Board submitted to him after a competitive interview. The public demands to know the grounds of rejection of other qualified candidates.
2. The nominee does not meet the requisite requirements stipulated in Section 20 of the NGCDF Act, 2016 on the appointment of a CEO. He lacks in experience and professional background to effectively perform the duties of his office. There are glaring inconsistencies on his CV on what he purported to be his work experience and the actual experience needed of the appointee of such office.

3. The nominee has a consistent history of incompetence in almost every field he has served. The last state corporation he worked in as the DVC for Administration, Finance and Planning at Maasai Mara University, the university council suspended him on the grounds of gross incompetence, misconduct and corruption and eventually unceremoniously sacked him after the university senate found him guilty of all allegations against him.

Public Memoranda by John Kiptoo-11th march 2020

He supports the appointment on the following grounds: THAT—

1. Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille meets all requirements set out in the call for applications by the Board as set out in Section 20 of the NGCDF Act, 2015.
2. He is qualified, competent, young, and dynamic and would represent empowerment of youth in line with government policy.
3. That he is an orphan and represents inclusion of marginalized communities in government.
4. His appointment will be a fulfillment of the dream and promise of our constitution of giving every Kenyan child an equal opportunity no matter where they come from.
5. Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille is a man with impeccable character.

Public Memoranda by Fredrick Ouma Jowi and John Kiptoo-10th march 2020

They oppose the appointment of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille based on the following grounds: THAT—

1. Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille does not meet the minimum requirements (job requirements) set out in the call for applications by the Board and as stipulated in Section 20 of the NGCDF Act 2015.
2. The nominee did not meet the minimum university entry requirements as set out by the Kenya National Qualifications Authority.
3. He has a low confidence in our public institutions of learning.
4. That the Commission of University Education needs to confirm whether the Universities attended by Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille are accredited.
5. That the nominee was adversely mentioned in the Mara University Heist and that they do not know whether he was cleared.
6. Bias of the Cabinet Secretary Ministry of Finance & Planning towards certain communities.
7. The recruiting panel of the Board flouted standards set out under Article 47 of the Constitution which requires written reasons for any administrative action that adversely affects a person.
8. Constitutional values for fair competition, equal opportunity and fair administrative action have been subverted by the recruitment panel of the Board.
9. The shortlisting and forwarding of Prof Mohamed Hussein Abdille for vetting and appointment was predetermined exercise and there was no purpose of the recruitment.

Memorandum by Samuel Kosgei

Mr. Samuel Kosgei makes the memorandum of objection of the nominee as a concerned citizen.

He states that:

1. The nominee while serving at Maasai Mara University as the Deputy Vice Chancellor, he irregularly appointed Mr. Mohammed Mahmoud as senior driver Grade 8 and Najma hasbia Osman as assistant procurement officer without authority of the University Management council an action amounting to abuse of office privileges and authority.
2. The nominee demonstrated high level of indiscipline that led to his dismissal from employment at the Maasai Mara University on gross misconduct.

He is currently the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration, Finance & Planning) at Maasai Mara University, He also served as the Senior Advisor to the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Education, Director International Chinese Institute, Chairman of two Departments at Egerton University, CEO of Africa Medical Research Council, Africa and China Agricultural University as well as Research Officer at KEMRI.

Political Activities and Affiliations

9. The nominee had no record of political activities and affiliations to any political party.

Potential Conflict of Interest

10. He has no immediate associations that are likely to present potential conflict of interest when he assumes the position.

Integrity

11. The nominee has not been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravening the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution. He has also not been adversely associated with practices that depict bias, favoritism or nepotism in the discharge of public duties. He has fully complied with the tax obligations to the State for the financial year immediately preceding his nomination for the appointment. He has not been charged in court of law in the last three years or been adversely been mentioned in an investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry in the last three years.

Whether the degree of BSC was a relevant degree for the purposes of section 20 of the NG-CDF Act, 2015

12. The Nominee informed the Committee that the BSC degree was a relevant degree to that of engineering. He asserted that as a field of study engineering is classified as science. He further asserted that the BSC course entails multi-disciplinary subject matter such as languages, botany, chemistry among others.

Work experience and relevance to the position

13. The Nominee informed the committee that he had cumulative work experience of about 17 years. He asserted that he held senior administrative positions that involved budgeting, financial management, strategy development, procurement, and human resource, accounting, administration, accounting and related matters. Some included management of budget running to millions of shillings, for instance one assignment as the CEO of the Research council involved the management of budget of 16 countries, 6500 staff with a budget of 7.2 billion.

His understanding of the demands of the position, the scope of interaction and relationships with stakeholders

14. The nominee clarified that he understood the nature and scope of the fund as social fund that was intended to empower the people especially at the lowest level. He further submitted that members of parliament as representatives of the people understood the importance of the fund. He will strive for a positive engagement with the members of parliament in a special way and aspire to create positive relationship between the Committee and the Board.

Reforming the fund and the relationship between the fund and other devolved funds

15. The nominee indicated that he will work with all stakeholders especially Members of Parliament to address the related to the operations of the fund. He submitted that he would recommend the allocation be increased to 5% of the total revenue. He will further be stated that he will help constituency level SMEs to access the funds by making procurement process more efficient. He also indicated that he will advocate for timely disbursement of funds. The nominee averred that the fund preceded devolved funds and he support the continuous existence of the NG-CDF fund. He submitted that the fund's impact had been felt all over the country and remains a lifeline to many citizens hence an important safeguard to defend its existence.

Sources of income and net worth

16. The Nominee informed the members that his net worth stood at 11.2 million Kenya shillings. He owned a three-bed house, two cars (A Toyota prado and Toyota Isis) and a piece of land. He earns a gross salary of 1,100,000 with a net of 760,000 Kenya shillings.

Misappropriation of funds at Maasai Mara University

17. The nominee submitted that issues of corruption in the Maasai Mara preceded him and he was appointed as the Deputy Vice Chancellor while there was an active investigation by the DCI at the University. He further took a number of steps including freezing of accounts and refusing to sign cheques that were not drawn procedurally. He ensured the financial prudence guidelines were followed and adhered to the provisions of the law such as the PFM Act, the Public Procurement and Assets Disposal Act and other guidelines issued by the government.
18. The nominee while being questioned about the suspension and subsequent dismissal by the Maasai Mara University, submitted that the University Council had attempted to suspend and dismiss him due to his stand against corruption at the institution. This was an

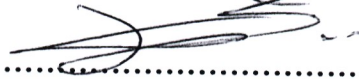
effort by the Council to intimidate him since he was a state witness against Council members. The DCI wrote to the CS Education to intervene due to the investigations that were ongoing (*Annexure 12*). The matter is in court and he is still the DVC, Maasai Mara.

CDF is a social fund and his competence to manage such a fund

- 19. The nominee indicated that he had managed complex assignment in his career and was up to the task. He further indicated that as a social fund he was committed to meeting the demand of the job and deliver on its objectives. He stated that even though the fund involved the management of bigger sum of money than that of Maasai mara, he nonetheless had the energy, experience, charisma and the connection to delivery on the demands of the job as provided by law. He also informed the members that he had the experience and the knowledge to raise funds through partnerships and collaboration. He indicated that would explore government to government partnership with the consultation of the Board and the select Committee.
- 20. The Nominee further submitted that had handled a position that involved 16 countries with different levels of development, political persuasion, inaccessible areas, so many people and nationalities which have given him the necessary experience to meet the objectives of the fund and deliver results.
- 21. He further stated that he had two streams of experience: At the academic level he rose from the position of lecturer, to senior lecturer and eventually to associate professor becoming a full professor in his academic career. At the administrative level, he rose from the position of a chairman of a department, to Director, Acting DVC to a DVC in Maasai Mara University. Kenya national qualification authority.

We, Mr. Fredrick Ouma Jowi; Fredrickjowi@gmail.com an adult citizen of Kenya ID.NO: 24551186 and Mr. Kiptoo John; jkorii79@gmail.com an adult citizen of Kenya ID.NO: 21770390, individually and collectively with others as activists and bloggers under Community Media Association, hereby seek to raise serious and salient concerns touching on the recruitment and forwarding of Prof. Mohammed Hussein Abdille.

Following the recent advertisements in leading dailies for public submission of memoranda for the vetting by parliament on the intended appointment of Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille, to the position of Chief Executive Officer (C.E.O) National Government Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF), we hereby submit as **FOLLOWS:**

1. **THAT** the Board advertised for the filling of the position of Chief Executive Officer (C.E.O) on 17th December, 2019.
2. **THAT**, after consideration of the applications by the Board seven (7) candidates were shortlisted for interviews on 6th February, 2020.
3. **THAT** the recruiting panel of the NG-CDF Board forwarded three (3) names of successful candidates to the Cabinet Secretary Finance & National Planning Hon. Ukur Yattani for consideration for appointment to position of Chief Executive Officer (C.E.O) National Government Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF).
4. **THAT** Cabinet Secretary Finance & National Planning Hon. Ukur Yattani after consideration forwarded the names of Prof. Mohammed Hussein Abdille to National Assembly for vetting by the Committee on Appointment on 3rd March, 2020.
5. **THAT** Parliament through the office of the clerk national assembly through an advertisement in leading local dailies called for submission of public memoranda on vetting of Prof. Mohammed Hussein Abdille on 6th March, 2020.



OUR RESERVATIONS

We seek to draw the attention of the Committee on Appointments to the following reservations against Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille appointment;

1. **THAT** Prof. Mohammed Hussein Abdille does not meet the minimum requirements (job requirements (iii & IV) set out in the call for applications by the Board and as stipulated in Section 20 of the NGCDF Act, 2015, 2(C).
2. **THAT** Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille did not meet the minimum university entry requirements as set out by Kenya National Qualifications Authority.
3. **THAT** Prof. Mohammed Hussein Abdille has a low confidence in our public institutions of learning.
4. **THAT** Commission for University Education (CUE) needs to confirm whether the Universities attended by Prof. Mohammed Hussein Abdille are accredited.
5. **THAT** Prof. Mohammed Hussein Abdille was adversely mentioned in the Maasai Mara University Heist and we don't know if he was cleared.
6. **THAT** it is worth noting and once more we bring to the attention of parliament that there has been public outcry on the appointments made by Cabinet Secretary Ministry of Finance & Planning currently and during his tenure at Labour Ministry. There is a general feeling that he has a bias towards certain communities.

Sir, the bar on public sector accountability is already set by the constitution of Kenya 2010 and no individual public officer or public institution is exempted from the accountability demands of the law.

We take great exception at the irregular and illegal decision arrived at, by recruitment panel of NG-CDF Board in recruiting, shortlisting and forwarding for vetting by National Assembly the name of Prof. Mohammed Hussein Abdille for the position of Chief Executive Officer (C.E.O) National Government Constituency Development Fund (NG-CDF).

The recruiting panel of the Board flouted standards set out under Article 47 of the Constitution which requires that written reasons must be given for any administrative decision that adversely affects a person must be given. The recruitment panel must in itself act legally & constitutionally.

They must conduct short-listing in a documented, accountable way amenable to external scrutiny; give failing applicants written reasons detailing why their applications fell by the wayside; inform the public the reasons why those who were not shortlisted fell short of the requirements for the position, either fully or in an abridged way; conduct interviews in a manner that meets the Constitutional standards set out in Article 10, 232 and elsewhere in the Constitution; and ensure that the process is beyond reproach.

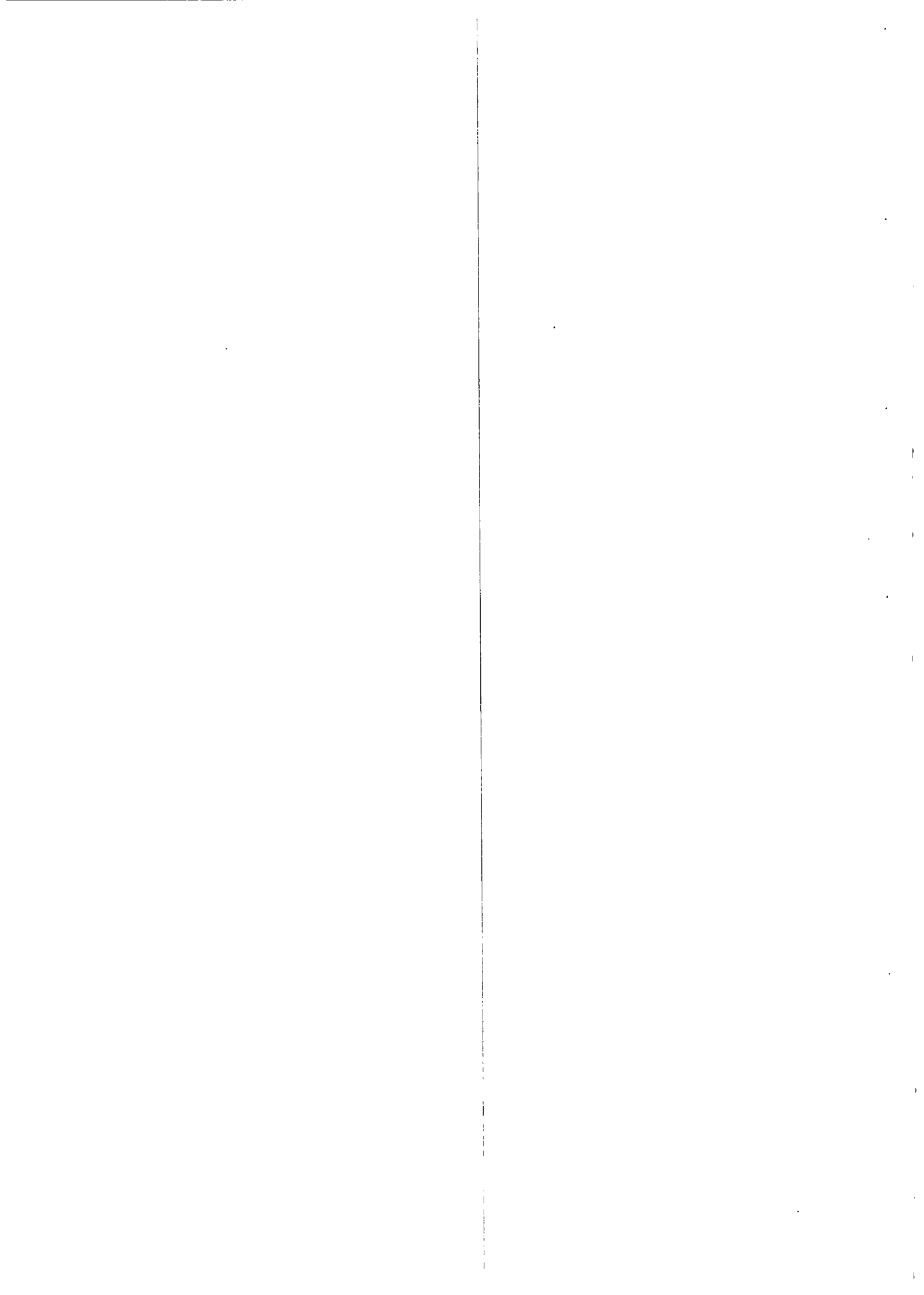
Take caution that constitutional values for fair competition, equal opportunity and fair administrative action have been subverted by the recruitment panel of the Board.

AFFIDAVIT

I, **Abigael J. Mengech**, a citizen of the Republic of Kenya, with a keen eye for Public Interest and good do hereby take oath and state as follows;

1. THAT I have brought this Memoranda in recognition of my obligation to defend the interests of the public, moreso on the running of the affairs of the Constituency Development Fund and ensuring that the Sovereignty and dignity of the people of Kenya is upheld.
2. THAT the nomination of **PROF. MOHAMED HUSSEIN ABDILLE** as the Chief Executive Officer of the NGCDF Board raises pertinent issues which require a sober and candid approach. The NGCDF is a crucial docket that should be administered by the right person and such person to be deemed as properly merited and meets the precise requirements as set out in the National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NGCDF) Act, 2015 so as to avoid future ridicule and shame to such

an important office. There is a legitimate expectation that such a position should be held by an individual of impeccable character and standing.

3. **THAT** my attention was drawn to an advert by the National Assembly in the dailies calling for submission of memoranda to the Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund on nomination of Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille for appointment as the Chief Executive Officer to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board.
4. **THAT** a quick search in the internet and other sources led me back to the advert Ref No NGCDFB/01/2019 advertising the vacancy of Chief Executive Officer of NG-CDF Board dated 17th December, 2019 whose deadline for application was 7th January, 2020.
5. **THAT** among other requirements for the appointment to this position, the advert required the candidate to be a Kenyan Citizen and must have:
 - a. Bachelor's degree in Business Administration, Finance, Accounting, Engineering, Economics, Community Development, Law, or any relevant field from a recognized university
 - b. Master's degree in any of the following fields: Business Administration, Finance, Accounting, Engineering, Economics, Community Development, Law, or any relevant field from a recognized university
 - c. At least ten (15) years' work experience in relevant field
 - d. Have served in a senior management position for a minimum period of 5 years
 - e. Have certificate in strategic leadership course undertaken for minimum of 4 weeks from recognized institution
 - f. Certificate in project management
6. **THAT** from his Curriculum Vitae (CV) extracted online, the Prof finished his certificate of Secondary education in the year 1995, in the year 1999, he proceeded to pursue a BSc in medical Microbiology in the University of Mysore, India, he later in the year 2002, did an MSc in Biotechnology (Molecular Biology) and Genetical Engineering. In

2004, he did a MSc in tropical medicine & Infectious diseases and in the year 2008 a PhD in preventive medicine (molecular parasitology).

7. THAT his field of specialization is listed as Molecular parasitology, infectious diseases, molecular biology and genetical engineering. (We are not sure whether it is genetical or genetic engineering?)
8. THAT the CV indicates that he worked as a Research scientist – KEMRI from the year 2002 to 2009. From 2010 onwards he was a Senior lecturer and chairman, human pathology at the Egerton University while at the same time from 2013 onwards he became an associate professor, department of Human Parasitology, Beijing. (*annexed is a copy of the said CV*)
9. THAT from the foregoing we can deduce the following;
 - i. From the year 2002 to 2009 where he stated to have been a research scientist for KEMRI, we can note that during those stated years he was also pursuing his undergraduate, master's degree and later PHD in University of Mysore, India and China Agricultural University respectively. It is therefore doubtful whether he was working in KEMRI during those years. Otherwise how could he be studying in India and China while simultaneously working at KEMRI? Available information elsewhere shows that he was actually in India and China undertaking his studies during the years in question.
 - ii. He joined Egerton University in 2010 as a lecturer in human pathology.
 - iii. It is also evident that the pathology department of Egerton University was established in September, 2012 where he became Chairman. The pathology department had only 4 faculty members and 2 technologists that undertake the day to day running of the pathological and microbiological needs. It is noteworthy that the department did not offer any degree studies. In essence it was a shell department. In an article dated 31st May, 2013 by Boniface Ongeri of Standard Media , the Prof emphasizes that as the head researcher of

parasitology at Egerton University, he seeks preventive measures against parasitic diseases in particular trypanosomiasis, leishmaniasis that cause kala-azar and malaria. This cannot qualify as a senior management position and neither is it in a relevant field as required in the NGCDF Act. (*Annexed is a copy of the article*).

- iv. Prof. Abdille's work experience therefore dates from 2010 to date which was below 10 years by the time of closure of the advert on 7th Jan 2020
- v. According to a Daily Nation article dated 28th January, 2019 by Ouma Wanzala, the then CS for education Ms. Amina Mohamed made several appointments in the universities including that of Prof. Mohammed Abdille as the Deputy Vice Chancellor(Administration, Finance and Planning) at Maasai Mara University. This could be the only time that the good Prof. served in a senior management position. Upto the time of closing the advert the professor will have served for only one year in a senior management position. (*Annexed is a copy of the article*) For emphasis the NGCDF Act requires that in *...(20)(2)(c) no person shall be appointed as a Chief Executive officer unless such a person....has served in a senior management position for a minimum period of five years ...*
- vi. His field of specialization as obtained from Egerton University website is listed as Molecular parasitology, infectious diseases, molecular biology and genetical engineering which does not conform with the requirements of the NGCDF Act for appointment as chief executive officer (CEO) which requirements are having a degree in finance, accounting, engineering, economics, community development, law or a related field from a recognized university.
- vii. From the available information I got and the research conducted I could not find that the professor had the other following requirements;
 - a. Certificate in Strategic Leadership Course
 - b. Certificate in Project Management

10. THAT the provisions of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Act, 2015 with regards to appointment of a CEO provides as follows;

Section 20. (1) There shall be a chief executive officer of the Board who shall be recruited by the Board through a competitive process and recommendations made to the Cabinet Secretary for appointment, with the approval of the National Assembly.

(2) No person shall be appointed under this section unless such person-

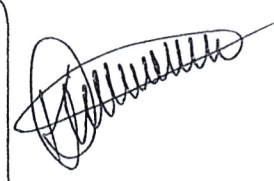

Orphaned at an early age, DR MOHAMMED ABDILLE, 36, was forced to learn survival tactics as a child. He has risen above many odds, and is now a molecular parasitologist and one of the few lecturers from North Eastern at Egerton University. He spoke to BONIFACE ONGERI

What does your work as a molecular parasitologist entail?

As the head researcher of molecular parasitology at Egerton University, I seek preventive measures against parasitic diseases in particular trypanosomiasis and leishmaniasis that cause kala-azar and malaria. The information gained in the study is useful in finding essential drugs or vaccines. The two parasites and their diseases are in the category of neglected diseases, which affects millions of people in the sub-Saharan Africa. Parasitology is the study of parasites, their hosts, and the relationship between them.

Soon you will be appointed an associate professor, you have risen the ranks at a young age. Tell us more.

Through sheer hard work and focus, I have fulfilled all requirements for the post, which is accumulating at least three years as a senior lecturer, widely published in peer review international journals and supervising post graduate, masters and PhD students. I have also produced conference papers.

Besides lecturing, what other role do you have?

I am the chairman of the department of human pathology at the university where I oversee human resource management and non-administrative issues necessary for the university council and senate where I am also a member.

I was also a research scientist at the Central Food Technological Research Institute in India, and a lead supervisor for masters and bachelors students in school of Medicine at the China Agricultural University. I am also an honorary lecturer at China Agricultural University.

Tell us about your experience growing up.

I had a difficult childhood because I was orphaned at an early age. My father, who was the sole breadwinner, died when I was only six years old, and my mother passed on shortly after. From

then on, life became unbearable for my siblings and I. My elder sister Kuresha and elder brother Hussein took the responsibility of looking after us by working in people's farms and shops.

That must have been difficult, how did you manage your schooling?

It was a life of struggle. I owe my success to one Father Joseph. In 1984, when I was a young boy of primary school age, there was a deadly famine that hit Mandera and we had no food for days in our house. One day, I walked for so long in search of food and I found myself at Mandera Boys Town Primary School for orphans and handicapped. I was hungry, in tatters and desperate. Father Joseph, who was in charge of the school met me at the gate in my deplorable state and was moved by my plight. He took me in and I was enrolled at the school. From then on, he became my guardian and ensured I completed my studies up to university.

Tell us about your educational background.

I went to India in 1996 after landing an Indian Government scholarship for my exemplary work. There, I did a Bachelor of Science degree in Clinical and Medical Tropical disease and an MSc in Biotechnology at the Mysore University.

I also have an MSc in Tropical Medicine from University of Edinburg, Scotland and a PhD in preventive medicine, molecular parasitic diseases, from China Agricultural University.

I also have a post-graduate studies in public health management from the India Institute of Sciences and a post-doctorate studies in research of tropical diseases, University of Basel, Switzerland.

While studying for my PhD, I was appointed lecturer and a researcher at Beijing Medical School and China Agricultural University.

In January, I was appointed associate professor by the Chinese Academy of Sciences.

Why did you avoid Kenyan universities?

I did because the Kenyan government was forcing anyone from North Eastern who attained the university entrance marks to only take a Bachelor of Education course, yet I was interested in the sciences.

How come there are not many university lecturers from your native North Eastern?

Education in North Eastern has, for long, been placed bottom in the list of priorities, and that often plays against us because not many expect a Somali to be a lecturer. As one of the youngest faculty member and the youngest foreign faculty, students and staff often mistake me for one of them.

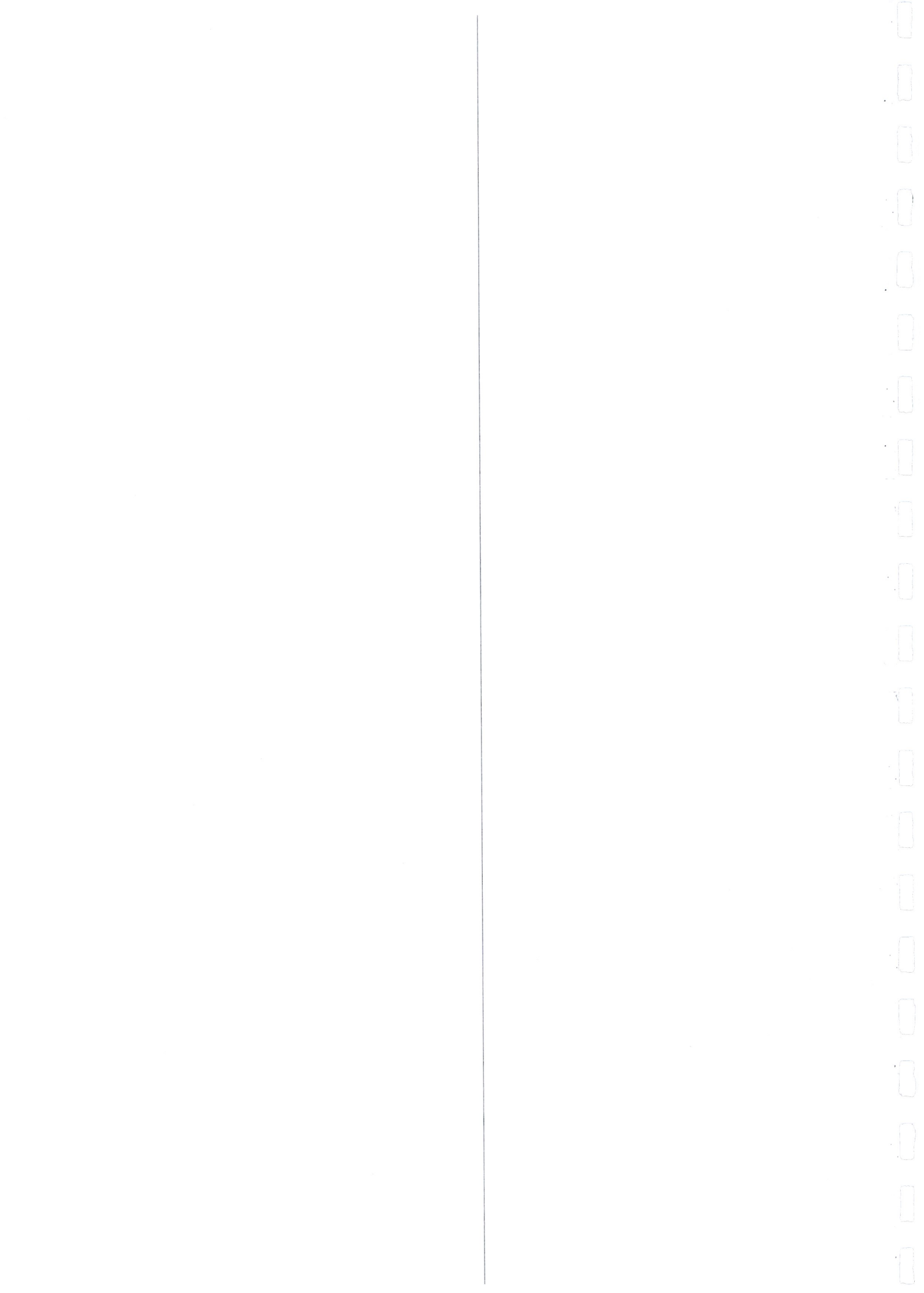
What are you doing to promote education in the region?

I strive to inspire hundreds in Wajir, Mandera and Garissa counties where I am a mentor in many of the schools. My mission is to change the attitude of the locals towards education. My mantra is hard work and commitment will pay no matter how long it takes. North Eastern has so much potential, yet to be tapped.

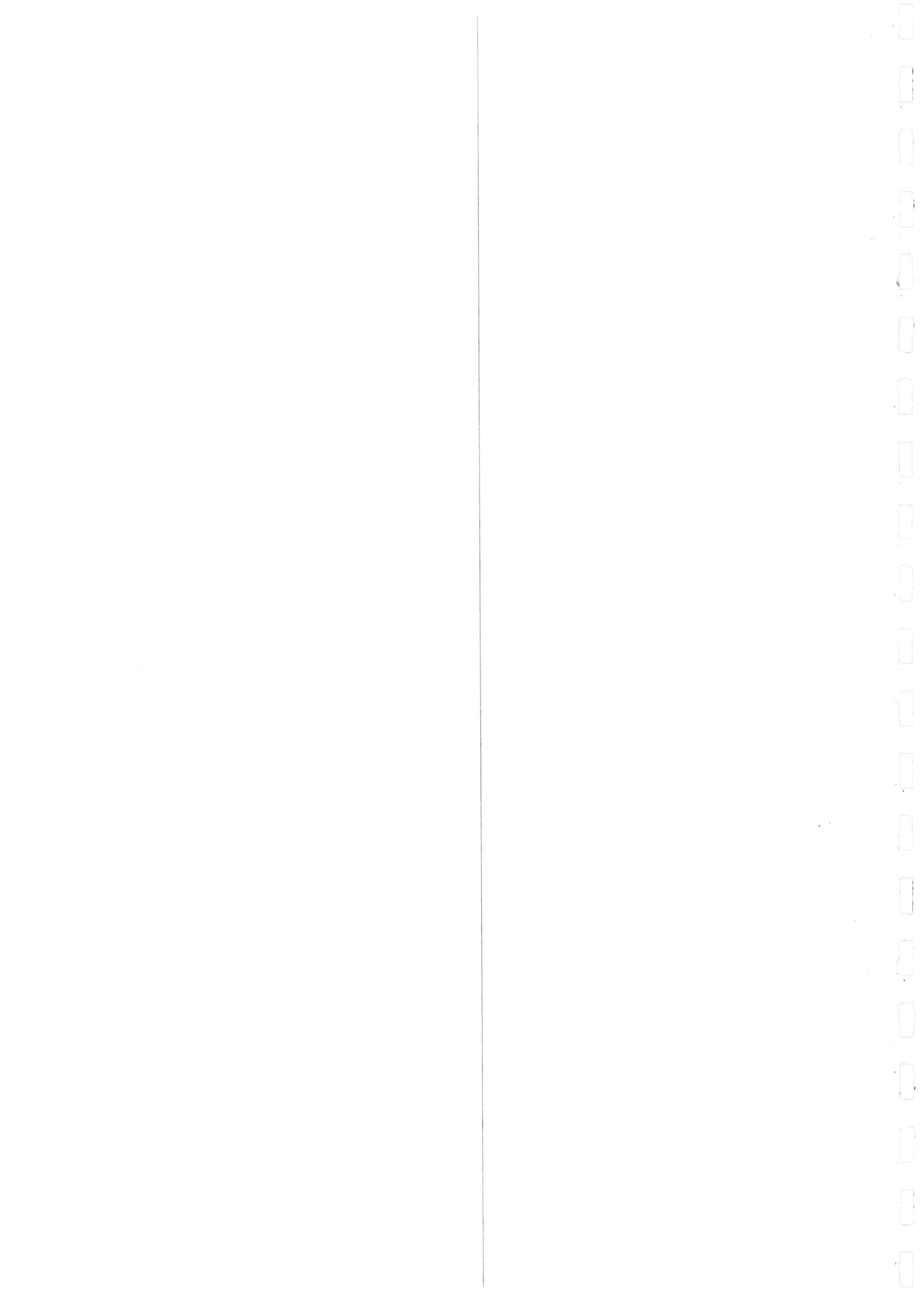


an important office. There is a legitimate expectation that such a position should be held by an individual of impeccable character and standing.

3. **THAT** my attention was drawn to an advert by the National Assembly in the dailies calling for submission of memoranda to the Select Committee on National Government Constituencies Development Fund on nomination of Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille for appointment as the Chief Executive Officer to the National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board.
4. **THAT** a quick search in the internet and other sources led me back to the advert Ref No NGCDFB/01/2019 advertising the vacancy of Chief Executive Officer of NG-CDF Board dated 17th December, 2019 whose deadline for application was 7th January, 2020.
5. **THAT** among other requirements for the appointment to this position, the advert required the candidate to be a Kenyan Citizen and must have:
 - a. Bachelor's degree in Business Administration, Finance, Accounting, Engineering, Economics, Community Development, Law, or any relevant field from a recognized university
 - b. Master's degree in any of the following fields: Business Administration, Finance, Accounting, Engineering, Economics, Community Development, Law, or any relevant field from a recognized university
 - c. At least ten (15) years' work experience in relevant field
 - d. Have served in a senior management position for a minimum period of 5 years
 - e. Have certificate in strategic leadership course undertaken for minimum of 4 weeks from recognized institution
 - f. Certificate in project management
6. **THAT** from his Curriculum Vitae (CV) extracted online, the Prof finished his certificate of Secondary education in the year 1995, in the year 1999, he proceeded to pursue a BSc in medical Microbiology in the University of Mysore, India, he later in the year 2002, did an MSc in Biotechnology (Molecular Biology) and Genetical Engineering. In

2004, he did a MSc in tropical medicine & Infectious diseases and in the year 2008 a PhD in preventive medicine (molecular parasitology).

7. **THAT** his field of specialization is listed as Molecular parasitology, infectious diseases, molecular biology and genetical engineering. (We are not sure whether it is genetical or genetic engineering?)
8. **THAT** the CV indicates that he worked as a Research scientist – KEMRI from the year 2002 to 2009. From 2010 onwards he was a Senior lecturer and chairman, human pathology at the Egerton University while at the same time from 2013 onwards he became an associate professor, department of Human Parasitology, Beijing. (*annexed is a copy of the said CV*)
9. **THAT** from the foregoing we can deduce the following;
 - i. From the year 2002 to 2009 where he stated to have been a research scientist for KEMRI, we can note that during those stated years he was also pursuing his undergraduate, master's degree and later PHD in University of Mysore, India and China Agricultural University respectively. It is therefore doubtful whether he was working in KEMRI during those years. Otherwise how could he be studying in India and China while simultaneously working at KEMRI? Available information elsewhere shows that he was actually in India and China undertaking his studies during the years in question.
 - ii. He joined Egerton University in 2010 as a lecturer in human pathology.
 - iii. It is also evident that the pathology department of Egerton University was established in September, 2012 where he became Chairman. The pathology department had only 4 faculty members and 2 technologists that undertake the day to day running of the pathological and microbiological needs. It is noteworthy that the department did not offer any degree studies. In essence it was a shell department. In an article dated 31st May, 2013 by Boniface Ongeri of Standard Media, the Prof emphasizes that as the head researcher of



parasitology at Egerton University, he seeks preventive measures against parasitic diseases in particular trypanosomiasis, leishmaniasis that cause kala-azar and malaria. This cannot qualify as a senior management position and neither is it in a relevant field as required in the NGCDF Act. (*Annexed is a copy of the article*).

- iv. Prof. Abdille's work experience therefore dates from 2010 to date which was below 10 years by the time of closure of the advert on 7th Jan 2020
- v. According to a Daily Nation article dated 28th January, 2019 by Ouma Wanzala, the then CS for education Ms. Amina Mohamed made several appointments in the universities including that of Prof. Mohammed Abdille as the Deputy Vice Chancellor(Administration, Finance and Planning) at Maasai Mara University. This could be the only time that the good Prof. served in a senior management position. Upto the time of closing the advert the professor will have served for only one year in a senior management position. (*Annexed is a copy of the article*) For emphasis the NGCDF Act requires that in *...(20)(2)(c) no person shall be appointed as a Chief Executive officer unless such a person....has served in a senior management position for a minimum period of five years ...*
- vi. His field of specialization as obtained from Egerton University website is listed as Molecular parasitology, infectious diseases, molecular biology and genetical engineering which does not conform with the requirements of the NGCDF Act for appointment as chief executive officer (CEO) which requirements are having a degree in finance, accounting, engineering, economics, community development, law or a related field from a recognized university.
- vii. From the available information I got and the research conducted I could not find that the professor had the other following requirements;
 - a. Certificate in Strategic Leadership Course
 - b. Certificate in Project Management

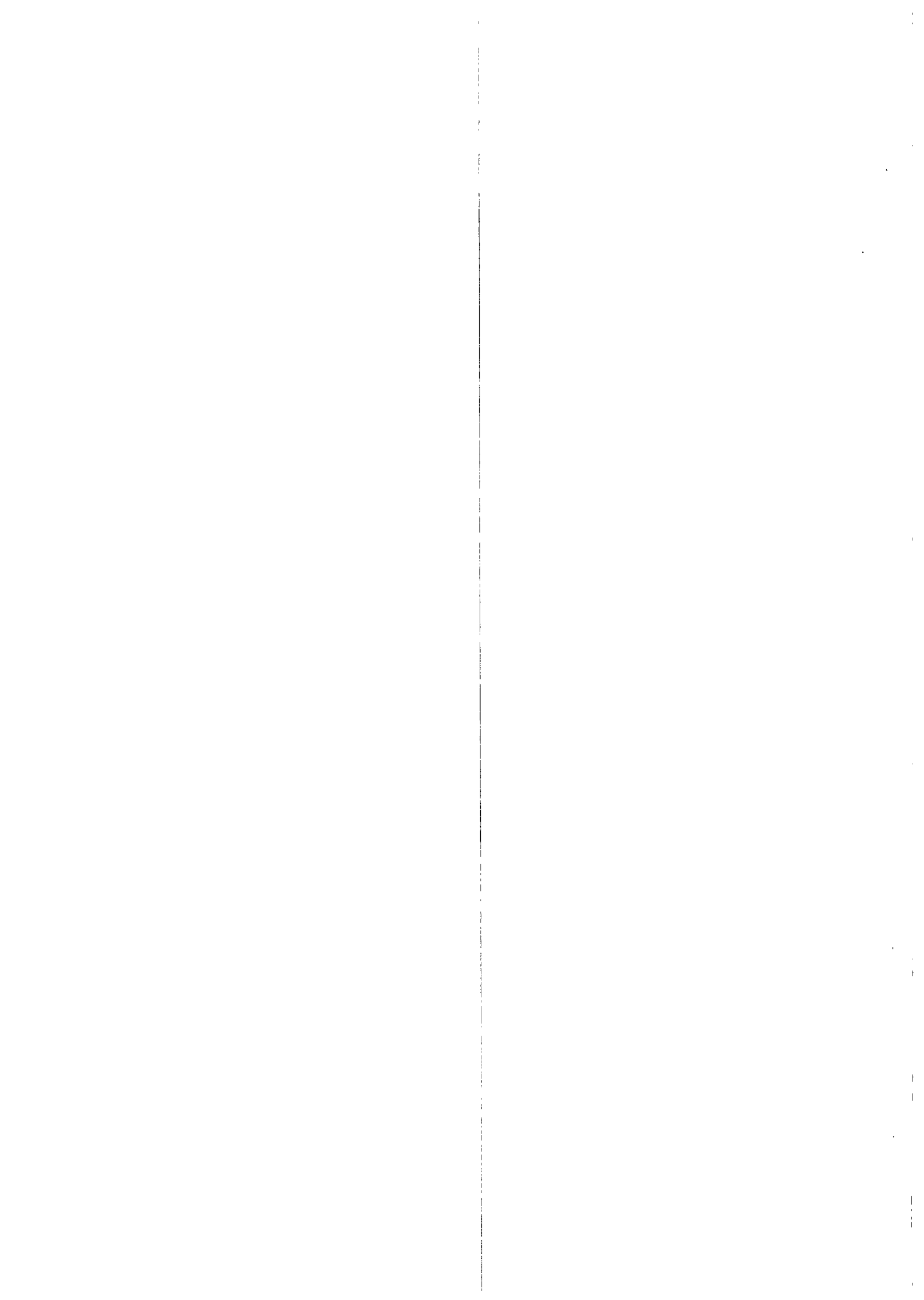
Pathology department was established September, 2012 and is one of the new additions to the already existing 13 departments of the faculty of health sciences

Orphaned at an early age, DR MOHAMMED ABDILLE, 36, was forced to learn survival tactics as a child. He has risen above many odds, and is now a molecular parasitologist and one of the few lecturers from North Eastern at Egerton University. He spoke to BONIFACE ONGERI

What does your work as a molecular parasitologist entail?

As the head researcher of molecular parasitology at Egerton University, I seek preventive measures against parasitic diseases in particular trypanosomiasis and leishmaniasis that cause kala-azar and malaria. The information gained in the study is useful in finding essential drugs or vaccines. The two parasites and their diseases are in the category of neglected diseases, which affects millions of people in the sub-Saharan Africa. Parasitology is the study of parasites, their hosts, and the relationship between them.

Soon you will be appointed an associate professor, you have risen the ranks at a young age. Tell us more.

Through sheer hard work and focus, I have fulfilled all requirements for the post, which is accumulating at least three years as a senior lecturer, widely published in peer review international journals and supervising post graduate, masters and PhD students. I have also produced conference papers.

Besides lecturing, what other role do you have?

I am the chairman of the department of human pathology at the university where I oversee human resource management and non-administrative issues necessary for the university council and senate where I am also a member.

I was also a research scientist at the Central Food Technological Research Institute in India, and a lead supervisor for masters and bachelors students in school of Medicine at the China Agricultural University. I am also an honorary lecturer at China Agricultural University.

Tell us about your experience growing up.

I had a difficult childhood because I was orphaned at an early age. My father, who was the sole breadwinner, died when I was only six years old, and my mother passed on shortly after. From

then on, life became unbearable for my siblings and I. My elder sister Kuresha and elder brother Hussein took the responsibility of looking after us by working in people's farms and shops.

That must have been difficult, how did you manage your schooling?

It was a life of struggle. I owe my success to one Father Joseph. In 1984, when I was a young boy of primary school age, there was a deadly famine that hit Mandera and we had no food for days in our house. One day, I walked for so long in search of food and I found myself at Mandera Boys Town Primary School for orphans and handicapped. I was hungry, in tatters and desperate. Father Joseph, who was in charge of the school met me at the gate in my deplorable state and was moved by my plight. He took me in and I was enrolled at the school. From then on, he became my guardian and ensured I completed my studies up to university.

Tell us about your educational background.

I went to India in 1996 after landing an Indian Government scholarship for my exemplary work. There, I did a Bachelor of Science degree in Clinical and Medical Tropical disease and an MSc in Biotechnology at the Mysore University.

I also have an MSc in Tropical Medicine from University of Edinburg, Scotland and a PhD in preventive medicine, molecular parasitic diseases, from China Agricultural University.

I also have a post-graduate studies in public health management from the India Institute of Sciences and a post-doctorate studies in research of tropical diseases, University of Basel, Switzerland.

While studying for my PhD, I was appointed lecturer and a researcher at Beijing Medical School and China Agricultural University.

In January, I was appointed associate professor by the Chinese Academy of Sciences.

Why did you avoid Kenyan universities?

I did because the Kenyan government was forcing anyone from North Eastern who attained the university entrance marks to only take a Bachelor of Education course, yet I was interested in the sciences.

How come there are not many university lecturers from your native North Eastern?

Education in North Eastern has, for long, been placed bottom in the list of priorities, and that often plays against us because not many expect a Somali to be a lecturer. As one of the youngest faculty member and the youngest foreign faculty, students and staff often mistake me for one of them.

What are you doing to promote education in the region?

I strive to inspire hundreds in Wajir, Mandera and Garissa counties where I am a mentor in many of the schools. My mission is to change the attitude of the locals towards education. My mantra is hard work and commitment will pay no matter how long it takes. North Eastern has so much potential, yet to be tapped.

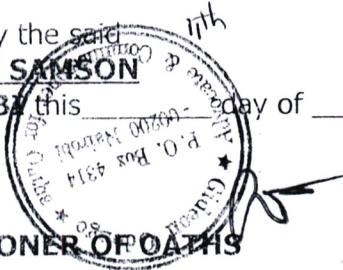

Yatani's CDF choice serving suspension from university

LUKE AWICH/ Treasury CS Ukur Yatani's pick for the National Government Constituency Development Fund CEO is serving a disciplinary suspension from a local university.

Records show that Prof Mohammed Abdille was suspended on November 15, 2019, for, among other allegations, taking away university property. Yatani nominated Abdille, who was Masaai Mara University's Deputy Vice-Chancellor for Administration, Finance and Planning, to replace acting CEO Yusuf Mbuno.

Mbuno has been in charge of CDF for the last eight years. The suspension letter signed by MMU Council chairman Samuel Ochola painted Abdille as a man of questionable integrity, something that might come haunt him during Thursday's vetting. Parliament has invited the public to submit their memorandum on the nominee ahead of the vetting. Ochola said in the letter seen by Star that Abdille was suspended for gross misconduct, incitement of both students and staff and travelling overseas without clearance from the university as is required

by government regulations.

The nominee is also accused of abuse of office with university council saying he presided over irregular employment of staff, usurping council powers and insubordination of acting Vice-Chancellor Kitche Magak. The council also accused Abdille of taking away a portion of a carpet used for renovation of the university's conference hall.

"Following deliberations made by council on the matters touching on your conduct and in the best interest of the university, it has been resolved that you be suspended from duty with immediate effect as per the guidelines of the Discipline Manual for the Public Service," Ochola's letter dated November 15 said.

"You will have an opportunity to respond to the following allegations which have been considered in reaching this decision."

When contacted, Abdille poured cold water on the claims terming them "cartels fighting back" in reference to his stand on siphoning off of public funds that was the order of the day at MMU.

He said he was innocent, citing a November 20 letter from DCI George Kinoti to Education Cabinet Secretary George Magoha recommending his reinstatement. The letter, signed by John Kariuki for Kinoti, also stated that Abdille is a key witness in the multi-million-shilling graft investigation at the university. The letter continued: "We are requesting your good office to intervene for status quo to be restored so as not to frustrate and punish the witness(es)."

It is a legal requirement that the CEO be recruited competitively. Three names are forwarded to the Cabinet Secretary for appointment after the National Assembly's approval.

In order to carry out this role, Section 69 of the Basic Education Act empowers the Cabinet Secretary, in consultation with relevant departments, agencies and stakeholders to take measures necessary to review, evaluate, and monitor standards and relevance to assure standards and quality in education.

In this regard, and to guarantee quality of books approved by KICD in collaboration with the Ministry for curriculum delivery, an Ad-hoc Orange Book Review Taskforce has been established to carry out an immediate assessment of the contents of the curriculum material within the Orange Book in the wake of public outcry regarding the appropriateness of various subjects for Kenya's young learners for a period of 30 days with effect from 1st November, 2018.

The Terms of Reference for this Taskforce include:

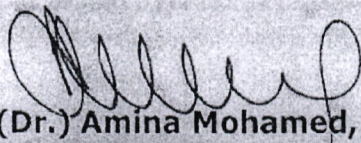
- i) Gain a perspective on the context of the Competence Based Curriculum.
