CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Social Protection for the approval hearing of Dr. Margaret Karungaru, nominee for appointment as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission.

Pursuant to Article 250(2) of the Constitution as read with section 11 of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011, H.E. the President, notified the National Assembly of the nomination of Dr. Margaret Karungaru for approval by the House as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission. The Hon. Speaker vide a communication issued on 10th March 2023 conveyed to the House the Message from H.E. the President and subsequently referred the nominee to the Committee to conduct the approval hearing. While referring the nominee to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-one days (21) in line with section 11 of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011. The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominee and the public by placing advertisements in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearing by the Committee.

In compliance with Article 118 (b) of the Constitution and section 6 (4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Committee placed an advertisement in the print media on 20th March 2023, informing the public of the nomination, date, time and place of the approval hearing. The Committee also invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (*affidavit*) on the suitability of the nominee to hold office as required by section 6 (9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The memoranda were to be received on or before Monday, 27th March 2023 by 5.00 p.m. (East African Time). At the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum contesting the nominee's suitability.

The Committee also conducted background checks with KRA, EACC, DCI, HELB and ORPP on the nominee's suitability for appointment to office.

The nominee appeared before the Committee on Wednesday 29th March 2023 for vetting. The Committee examined her suitability based on the criteria set out in section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011 and sections 10 and 11 of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act No. 15 of 2011. In addition, the Committee examined her academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of sector issues and on leadership and integrity. The Committee paid due regard to the procedure used to arrive at the nominee; constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question and suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the National Gender and Equality Commission.

Committee Recommendations

The Committee having held approval hearing of the nominee regarding her suitability, observed that due process was followed on the recruitment process as provided for under Article 250 of the Constitution, sections 10 and 11 of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act No. 15 of 2011 and the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval Act) No. 33 of 2011. The Committee therefore recommends that the National Assembly **APPROVES** the nomination of **Dr. Margaret Karungaru, nominee for appointment as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission.**

Acknowledgements

The Committee registers its appreciation to the Speaker of the National Assembly, Clerk of the National Assembly for providing overall guidance and direction, the Office of the Director, Departmental Committees and the Committee Secretariat for the technical and logistical support extended during the vetting process.

In addition, the Committee thanks the nominee for her cooperation during the vetting process. Finally, the Committee is grateful to KRA, EACC, DCI, HELB and ORPP for providing references and background checks on the nominee's suitability to hold office.

Finally, I take this opportunity to acknowledge and appreciate the Committee Members for their patience, sacrifice and commitment, which enabled the Committee to complete the vetting within the set timelines.

CHAPTER ONE

1 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

1. The Departmental Committee on Social Protection is one of the twenty Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under **Standing Order 216** whose mandates pursuant to the **Standing Order 216 (5)** are as follows:
 - i. *To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned Ministries and departments;*
 - ii. *To study the programme and policy objectives of Ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;*
 - iii. *on a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;*
 - iv. *To study and review all legislation referred to it;*
 - v. *To study, assess and analyse the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;*
 - vi. *To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned Ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;*
 - vii. *To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments);*
 - viii. *To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;*
 - ix. *To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;*
 - x. *To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and*
 - xi. *To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.*

1.2 Committee's subjects

2. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider social welfare and security, pension matters, gender affairs, equality and affirmative action, affairs of children, youth, persons with disability and senior citizens.
3. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection, Ministry of Youth, Sports and the Arts and Ministry of Public Service, Gender and Affirmative Action.

CHAPTER TWO

2 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Legal Framework

6. The Departmental Committee on Social Protection has been assigned the role of conducting the vetting of Dr. Margaret Karungaru as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission.
7. Article 59 of the Constitution as read with section 3 of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011 provides for the establishment of the National Gender and Equality Commission, which is a successor commission of the Kenya National Human Rights and Equality Commission.
8. Article 250 of the Constitution provides for the composition, appointment and terms of office of constitutional commissions. In particular, Article 250(2), (3) and (4) of the Constitution provides as follows;

250. (2) *The chairperson and each member of a commission, and the holder of an independent office, shall be—*

(a) identified and recommended for appointment in a manner prescribed by national legislation;

(b) approved by the National Assembly; and

(c) appointed by the President.

(3) To be appointed, a person shall have the specific qualifications required by the Constitution or national legislation.

(4) Appointments to commissions and independent offices shall take into account the national values referred to in Article 10, and the principle that the composition of the commissions and offices, taken as a whole, shall reflect the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.

Qualifications for appointment as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission

9. Section 10 of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011 provides as follows;

10(2) A person shall be qualified for appointment as a member of the Commission if the person—

(a) holds a degree from a university recognized in Kenya;

(b) has knowledge and at least ten years' experience in matters relating to any of the following fields—

(i) law;

(ii) public administration;

(iii) economics;

(iv) gender and social development;

- (v) human rights;
- (vi) management; or
- (vii) social sciences;
- (c) has had a distinguished career in their respective fields; and
- (d) meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution.

(3) A person shall not be qualified for appointment as the chairperson or a member if such person—

- (a) is a member of Parliament or a County Assembly;
- (b) is a member of the governing body of a political party;
- (c) is a member of a local authority;
- (d) is an undischarged bankrupt; or
- (e) has been removed from office for contravening the provisions of the Constitution or any other law.

10. Further, the following provisions of the Constitution and statutes shall also guide the Committee as it executes this mandate:

- i. The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011);
- ii. The National Gender and Equality Commission Act (No. 15. of 2011);
- iii. Article 10 of the Constitution on national values and principles of governance;
- iv. Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
- v. Article 75 of the Constitution on the conduct of state officers;
- vi. Article 77 of the Constitution on restriction on activities of State Officers;
- vii. Article 118 of the Constitution on public participation;
- viii. Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;
- ix. The Leadership and Integrity Act No. 19 of 2012;
- x. The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015); and
- xi. The Public Officer Ethics Act No. 4 of 2003.

The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011)

11. Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), provides for issues which the relevant House of Parliament (in this case, the National Assembly) is supposed to consider in relation to any nomination. These issues include:

- i. the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
- ii. any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- iii. the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

12. , Section 6 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) provides as follows-

- i. An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background (section 6(7), PAPAA);
- ii. The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate (section 6(8), PAPAA);
- iii. Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated (section 6(9), PAPAA); and
- iv. A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall end (section 6(10), PAPAA).

Article 10(2) of the Constitution on national values and governance

13. Article 10(2) of the Constitution provides for the national values and principles of governance which include patriotism, national unity, sharing and devolution of power, the rule of law, democracy and participation of the people; human dignity, equity, social justice, inclusiveness, equality, human rights, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalized, good governance, integrity, transparency and accountability; and sustainable development.

Chapter 6 of the Constitution (Leadership and Integrity)

14. There are important provisions in Chapter 6 of the Constitution worth pointing out. Article 73 of the Constitution provides that the authority assigned to a State officer (a Principal Secretary being a state officer under Article 260 of the Constitution) is a public trust to be exercised in accordance to the Constitution, demonstrate respect for the people, bring honour to the nation and dignity to the office and promote public confidence in the integrity of the office. Also, the State officer shall have the responsibility to serve the people rather than the power to rule them.
15. The guiding principles of leadership and integrity are listed as selection based on personal integrity, competence and suitability, objectivity and impartiality in decision-making, selfless service based solely on the public interest, accountability and discipline and commitment in service to the people.

Article 75 of the Constitution on conduct of state officers;

16. A state officer shall behave, whether in public and official life, in private life or in association with other persons, in a manner that avoids among other things any conflict between personal interests and public or official duties.

Article 77 of the Constitution (Restriction on activities of State Officers)

17. Article 77 of the Constitution provides that a full-time State Officer shall not participate in any other gainful employment and that any appointed State Officer shall not hold office in a political party.

Article 118 of the Constitution on public access and participation

18. Article 118 of the Constitution provides that: Parliament shall conduct its business in an open manner, and its sittings and those of its committees shall be in public; and facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of Parliament and its Committees. Parliament may not exclude the public, or any media, from any sitting unless in

exceptional circumstances the relevant Speaker has determined that there are justifiable reasons for the exclusion.

Article 232 of the Constitution on Values and Principles of Public Service

19. Article 232 of the Constitution provides for the values and principles of public service which include high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women; the members of all ethnic groups; and persons with disabilities.

The Leadership and Integrity Act No. 19 of 2012

20. The Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 provides a number of obligations to a State officer. These are, among others: to respect and abide by the Constitution and the law, public trust, performance of duties in an honest and accountable manner, professionalism, financial integrity, not to engage in activities that amount to abuse of office, not misuse public resources, accepting gifts that may compromise the officer's duties, wrongful or unlawful acquisition of property, conflict of interest e.t.c.

The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act No. 1A of 2015

21. Section 5 of the Public Service (Values and Principles) Act, 2015 provides that a public officer shall maintain high standards of professional ethics, including, being honest; displaying high standards of integrity, transparency, accountability, respect to others, objectivity, patriotism, observance of rule of law. (Applies in future upon appointment)

The Public Officer Ethics Act No. 4 of 2003

22. The Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 provides for obligations to be carried out by a public officer. These include professionalism, carrying out duties in accordance with the law, prohibition from unjust enrichment, avoiding conflict of interest, not using office as a venue for soliciting or collecting harambees; not acting for foreigners; care of property; political neutrality, not practicing nepotism or favouritism, giving impartial advice, conducting private affairs in a way that maintains public confidence, bar from sexual harassment, submission of declaration of income, assets and liabilities once every two years (section 26). (Applies in future after appointment)

2.2 Message from H.E. the President

23. H.E. the President on 5th March 2023 communicated the nominee's name for appointment as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission pursuant to Article 250 of the Constitution as read with section 11 of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011.

2.3 Speaker's Communication and Committal to the Committee

24. Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 42, the Speaker of the National Assembly on 10th March 2023 communicated to the House the message from H.E. the President regarding the nominee for appointment as Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission. The Speaker informed the House that H.E. the President was seeking approval of the National Assembly on the said nomination before appointment to office.
25. In accordance with Standing Order 45(1), the Speaker read the Message from H.E. the President and referred the name of the nominee, her curriculum vitae and report of the Selection Panel on the recruitment process to the Departmental Committee on Social Protection to conduct an approval hearing.
26. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-one (21) days as provided by Section 11 of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011. The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominee and the public by placing advertisements in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearing.
27. In addition, the Speaker directed that the report of the approval hearing be tabled in the House not later than 12th April, 2023 to enable the House to consider the report within the statutory timelines.

2.4 Notification to the Public

28. Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), provides that *"any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated"*.
29. The Clerk of the National Assembly on 20th March, 2023 placed a notification in the print media informing the general public of the intention of the Committee to conduct approval hearings, as provided for by Article 118(1)(a)(b) and (2) of the Constitution and section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), which allows public participation in committee proceedings. The notification gave provision for the submission of memoranda, by way of written statements on oath (*affidavit*) contesting the suitability of the nominee, by 27th March, 2023 at 5.00 p.m. (East African Time). At the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum contesting the suitability of the nominee.

2.6 Notification to the Nominee

30. The Committee vide an advertisement in the print media on 27th March, 2023 and vide letter Ref. NA/DDC/SP/VETT/2023/006 informed the nominee of the nomination by H.E. the President and requested her to appear for vetting by the Departmental Committee on Social Protection on 29th March, 2023. The Committee further requested the nominee to appear for vetting with her clearance certificates from KRA, HELB, EACC, DCI and ORPP.

2.7 Clearance Requirements

31. The Committee conducted background checks with KRA, HELB, EACC, DCI and ORPP on the nominee's suitability for appointment to office. The following institutions wrote back to the National Assembly clearing the nominee, KRA Ref: KRA/5/1002/5(8745); DCI Ref: CI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.XII/90; EACC Ref: EACC.7/10/5VOL.XXII (183).

2.8 Report of the Selection Panel for selection of nominees for appointment as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission

32. Pursuant to the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011, the Selection Panel for selection of nominees for appointment as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission invited applications from suitably qualified persons for the position of a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission. The advertisement was published in the local dailies on 27th January, 2023.

33. The vacancy attracted one hundred and twenty (120) applicants comprising fifty-seven (57) male applicants and sixty-three (63) female applicants drawn from all the regions in the country. Among the applicants, there were four (4) persons with disabilities.

34. In accordance with the Constitution and the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011, the Selection Panel shortlisted fifteen persons, two of which were persons with disabilities. The names of all the applicants, shortlisted persons and the interview schedule were published in the local dailies on 17th February 2023 and the Kenya Gazette No. 2300 on 24th February 2023.

35. The Selection Panel subsequently interviewed fourteen out of the fifteen persons and recommended three candidates for consideration by H.E The President for nomination as a Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission.

36. In its report, the Selection Panel avers that it conducted the selection process in accordance with the Constitution and the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011.

2.9 Committee proceedings

37. The Committee having received the name of the nominee was obligated to conduct an approval hearing and make determination of the nominee's suitability or otherwise within twenty-one (21) days as provided for in section 11(7) of the National Gender and Equality Commission Act (No. 15 of 2011).

38. The Committee held two sittings during which it examined and reviewed the nominee's certificates, testimonials as well as conducted approval hearings.

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 APPROVAL HEARING

39. The Committee conducted approval hearing for the nominee on **Wednesday, 29th March, 2023**. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by the Constitution, the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011, Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the Standing Orders.
40. The Committee examined the nominee using the guidelines in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Committee also considered the following in vetting the nominee:
- a. Academic qualifications
 - b. Employment record and work experience
 - c. Professional association
 - d. Public office, political activities and affiliations
 - e. Potential conflict of interest
 - f. Suitability to the position
 - g. Tax compliance
 - h. Vision and leadership
 - i. Integrity

3.1 Dr. Margaret Karungaru

41. Dr. Margaret Karungaru, the nominee to the position of the Member of the National Gender and Equality Commission appeared before the Departmental Committee on Social Protection at 10.00 a.m. and was vetted under oath pursuant to Article 250 of the Constitution, the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary approvals) Act, 2011 and the Standing Orders of the National Assembly. The nominee was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during vetting. The Committee noted the following:

In 2022, Dr. Margaret Karungaru contested for the women representative position on an independent ticket but lost. She also served as a Presidential Agent in Mathira Constituency in 2002.

3.1.7 Clearance Requirements

49. The Committee confirmed that the nominee had been cleared by KRA, ORPP, DCI, EACC and HELB, having obtained clearance certificates to that effect.

3.1.8 Pro-bono/Charity Work/donation to charity

50. The nominee provided foodstuff, masks and sanitisers to over 3,000 homes within Nyeri County during the COVID -19 period. In 2012 to 2019, she donated sanitary pads to schools in Nyeri.

3.1.9 Other issues under consideration

51. To examine suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the Committee posed questions to the nominee on her knowledge on matters relating to Gender and Affirmative Action. The nominee responded as follows: -

3.2.0 On financial net worth

52. The nominee informed the Committee that she was worth Kshs. 500 million which comprised of marital home in Karen, Nyeri home as Governors' spouse, inherited home (parents' home) and KCB Bank loan of over 8 million.

3.2.1 On suitability of the nominee to hold office

53. The nominee gave her history to demonstrate the experience she has in community service and handling the marginalized in the society. She informed the committee that her previous experience as a First Lady for Nyeri County and role as a head-teacher and teacher in various girls and boys secondary schools equipped her with knowledge on vulnerable persons in society and gender.

3.2.2 On conflict of interest

54. The nominee stated that despite the fact that she had previously contested as a Woman Representative in Nyeri County, there existed no conflict of interest and if approved for appointment, she would exercise her roles in full observance of the requirements of the law.

3.2.3 On the role of the Commission

55. The nominee told the committee that the role of the National Gender and Equality Commission is that of oversight of public and private institutions on gender affairs. The nominee further averred that the Commission also plays a critical role in advising public bodies on matters relating to gender equality and freedom from discrimination as provided for in the National Gender and Equality Commission Act, 2011.

3.2.4 On how to deal with the marginalised

56. The nominee pointed out that the ongoing drought in the country was a result of climate change and that it had aggravated the condition of the vulnerable persons in the society. The nominee stated that if appointed, she will address the effects of climate change with a goal to reaching out to the relevant parties to find a long term solution and secure the dignity of the vulnerable persons.

3.2.5 On issues affecting widows

57. The nominee stated that she is a member of the widows4widows group and therefore understands the challenges faced by widows. The nominee stated that if appointed, she will advocate for formulation of policies to address issues affecting widows in Kenya including matters relating to inheritance.

3.2.6 On issues affecting People with Disabilities

58. The nominee noted that the Persons with Disabilities Act No. 14 of 2003 is not fully implemented. She noted that there have been efforts in the past to implement section 21 of the Act, which provides for the right to free and disability friendly environment for persons with disabilities. The nominee however observed that persons with disabilities continue to experience accessibility challenges due to non-implementation of the Act.

59. The nominee undertook to champion the rights for persons with disabilities in particular access to assistive devices to curb accessibility barriers and ensure compliance in all public offices. The nominee further stated that, she will champion for allocation of resources for implementation of policies relating to the right to free and disability friendly environment for persons with disabilities.

3.2.7 On the prevalence of Gender Based Violence

60. The nominee stated that both men and women are victims of gender-based violence. She noted the rising cases of domestic violence affecting both men and women as highlighted in the media and observed that there was need for social interventions including working closely with the media to enhance public education on matters relating to gender based violence.

3.2.8 On the role of NGENC and National Commission on Human Rights and Equality Commission

61. The nominee stated that the National Gender and Equality Commission and the Kenya National Human Rights and Equality Commission were established by different Acts and play different roles. The nominee stated that whereas the National Gender and Equality Commission plays the role of promoting gender equality and freedom from discrimination, the Kenya National Human Rights and Equality Commission is responsible for promoting human rights and hence the roles of the two Commissions are distinct.

3.2.9 On visibility of the Commission

62. The nominee said she will make use of the media, make visits to constituencies and marginalized areas to ensure that the presence and the impact of the commission is felt by the common *mwananchi*.

3.3.0 On Gender inclusivity

63. On gender being perceived as a 'woman issue', the nominee stated that, if appointed, she will sensitize the public on matters relating to gender equality.

64. The nominee also observed that she will co-ordinate, facilitate mainstreaming of issues of gender in public institutions, and ensure the establishment of specific offices in the institutions for dealing with matters relating to gender.
65. Further, the nominee stated that there was need for reporting requirements by all public institutions to ensure that all reports on matters relating to gender in public institutions are submitted to Parliament for consideration.

3.3.1 On issues affecting the 'boychild'

66. The nominee stated that the main challenges for the boy child in society is unemployment and lack of mentorship and empowerment. She noted that there was need to come up with empowerment programs that target boys and men.
67. The nominee further observed the society positions men as providers and therefore, lack of employment remained a big challenge as it not only affects the individuals, it also disrupts the traditional family setup. To this end, the nominee observed that there was need for government to deal with issues of unemployment among the youth.

3.3.2 On hiring employees

68. The nominee stated that if appointed, she will ensure that the hiring of employees by the Commission reflects the requirements of Article 232 of the Constitution on the values and principles of public service including regional balance.

3.3.3 On creating synergy between Parliament and the Commission

69. The nominee stated that she will work with the Committee and the Members of Parliament to achieve the mandate of the Commission including by advocating for adequate resource allocation to the Commission to enable it to execute its mandate effectively. She further stated that she will seek to have reports on the achievements of Commission done and presented to the Committee to enhance accountability and bring change to the Commission's visibility and effectiveness.



OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

70.
