
The above matter and the Petition presented by Kihoto Home Owners Self Help Group (hereinafter referred to as the "Petitioners") refer.

The Petitioners, who were residents of the Kihoto Estate area close to the Lake Naivasha, indicate in their Petition that they were unfortunately displaced from their homes by raging floods and rising Lake Naivasha levels. They seek intervention of the National Assembly and pray that the House recommends –

- (a) their resettlement to a suitable location;
- (b) repossession of the affected land and compensation of homeowners with alternative land equivalent in value; and
- (c) erection of a buffer zone to minimize human-wildlife conflict.

We have examined the Petition against the Constitution, Petition to Parliament (Procedure) Act and the National Assembly Standing Orders and find that the Petition complies with the requirements of the Petitions to Parliament (Procedure) Act, 2012 and the National Assembly Standing Orders.

Accordingly, the Petition as presented may be forwarded to the Speaker for tabling in the House.
