FOREWORD BY THE CHAIRPERSON

Hon. Speaker,

The Parliamentary Service Commission is established under Article 127 of the Constitution and is responsible for, among other functions, providing services and facilities to ensure the efficient and effective functioning of Parliament. Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution provides that the Commission shall consist of, among others, one man and one woman appointed by Parliament from among persons who are experienced in public affairs, but are not members of Parliament.

At the sitting of the Senate held on Tuesday, 14th February, 2023, the Senate Majority Leader tabled the Report of the Parliamentary Service Commission on the nomination of Hon. Johnson Muthama for appointment to the position of Member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

Thereafter, the Honourable Speaker of the Senate committed the matter to the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights to vet and consider the suitability of the nominee for appointment, and to submit its report to the Senate within fourteen days.

Hon. Speaker,

The Committee has undertaken the vetting process pursuant to provisions of the Constitution of Kenya (2010), the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) and standing order 77 of the Senate Standing Orders.

This included notifying the public of the nomination of Hon. Johnson Muthama for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission and inviting the public to submit written memoranda on the nominee's suitability for appointment to the position; and further notifying the public of the date, time and venue for the approval hearing. The Committee thereafter held the approval hearing, in public, on Tuesday, 28th February, 2023.

In conducting this exercise, the Committee considered, among others: -

- a) the nominee's academic credentials, professional training and experience;
- b) the nominee's personal integrity, tax compliance, and potential conflicts of interest;

- c) the procedure used by the Parliamentary Service Commission to arrive at the nominee;
- d) the constitutional and statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- e) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed, having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the Parliamentary Service Commission.

Having considered these requirements, the Committee found the nominee suitable for appointment to the position, and therefore **recommends** that the Senate **approves** the appointment of Hon. Johnson Muthama to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

Hon. Speaker,

I take this opportunity to thank the Members of the Committee for their input and valuable contributions during the approval hearing and deliberations during the writing of this report. The Committee further thanks the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the Senate for the support accorded to it during the vetting exercise.

On behalf of the Committee, it is my pleasant duty to table the Report of the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights on the proposed appointment of Hon. Johnson Muthama as a member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.










CHAPTER ONE: BACKGROUND

1.0 Notification of Nomination and Committal to the Committee

1. At the sitting of the Senate held on Tuesday, 14th February, 2023, the Senate Majority Leader tabled the Report of the Parliamentary Service Commission on the nomination of Hon. Johnson Muthama for appointment to the position of Member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution. A copy of the Report is annexed to this Report as *Appendix 2*.
2. Thereafter, the Honourable Speaker of the Senate committed the matter to the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights to vet and consider the suitability of the nominee for appointment, and to submit its report to the Senate within fourteen days. An extract of the Hansard for the Sitting of the Senate held on Tuesday, 14th February, 2023 is annexed to this Report as *Appendix 3*.

1.1 Notification to the Public

3. In compliance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Clerk of the Senate placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 17th February, 2023, inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Friday, 24th February, 2023 at 5.00 p.m. (*Appendix 4*).
4. The Clerk of the Senate further notified the public of the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights intention to conduct the approval hearing of the nominee on Tuesday, 28th February, 2023 at 9.00 a.m. in the Senate Chamber, Parliament Buildings (*Appendix 5*). This was done in accordance with the provisions of Article 118 of the Constitution, section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) and standing order 77(2) of the Senate Standing Orders.
5. By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any submissions from the public on the suitability for appointment of the nominee to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission.

1.2 Notification to the Nominee

6. The Clerk of the Senate, *vide* a letter Ref. No. SEN/DGAC/DGC/JLAHRC/2023/(54) dated 22nd February, 2023, the Committee invited the nominee to complete a PSC Questionnaire on information required by the Committee in undertaking the vetting exercise, and invited him for the approval hearing (*Appendix 6*). This was done in compliance with the requirements of section 6(3) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) and standing order 77(2) of the Senate Standing Orders.

1.3 Clearance Requirements

7. The Committee noted the following Clearances which were submitted to the Senate as annexes to the Report from the Parliamentary Service Commission –
 - a) The Commission for University Education (CUE), *vide* a letter Ref. No. CUE/10/9/1/Vol.586 dated 18th May, 2022 confirmed the academic qualifications of the nominee, namely a Bachelor of Arts with Honours in Social Science from Arden University in Germany (*Appendix 7*).
 - b) The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), *vide* a letter Ref No. EACC.7/10/5 VOL.XXI (234) dated 13th January, 2023 confirmed that the Commission had not undertaken any investigations where the nominee was found culpable (*Appendix 8*).
 - c) The Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), *vide* a letter Ref. No. KRA/5/1002/5(8356) dated 5th January, 2023 confirmed that the nominee, PIN No. A000161773F was tax compliant and up to date with filing returns and making payments (*Appendix 9*).
 - d) The National Intelligence Service (NIS), *vide* a letter Ref. No. CI/NIS/SF.17/1 VOL.70 (101) dated 3rd February, 2023 revealed no adverse findings on the nominee (*Appendix 10*).
 - e) The Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), *vide* a letter Ref. No. DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.XII/24 dated 6th January, 2023 confirmed that the nominees' results were negative from both their nominal index and criminal database (*Appendix 11*).

8. The nominee had further submitted the following clearances –
- i) Compliance Certificate Ref. No. HLB-3ZF26YR dated 24th February, 2022 from the Higher Education Loans Board (*Appendix 12*); and
 - ii) Clearance Certificate Ref. No. 2018801593 dated 25th February, 2022 from CreditInfo, a licensed Credit Reference Bureau (*Appendix 13*).

1.4 Issues for Consideration during the Approval Hearing

10. In determining the suitability of the nominee for appointment, the Committee was guided by section 6 (7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), which places focus on a nominee’s academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.
11. In addition, the Committee is required to take into consideration the following issues in accordance with section 7 of the Act: -
- (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
 - (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
 - (c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee’s abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

(a) Procedure for Nomination

12. The position of the non-MP member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) became vacant following the resignation of the immediate former holder of the position, Hon. Samuel Kiprono Chepkonga, in March 2022.
13. The procedure for appointment of a member to the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution is not provided for under statute, as the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019) which provided for the nomination procedure was one the laws that the Senate challenged at the High Court in Constitutional Petition no. 284 of 2019 *Senate of the Republic of Kenya & 4 others v Speaker of the National Assembly & another; Attorney General & 7 others (Interested Parties) [2020] eKLR*. The Court of Appeal in Nairobi Civil Appeal E084/2021, *National Assembly Another versus Senate of Kenya and others* affirmed the High Court’s position that Parliamentary Service Bill ought to have been referred to the Senate to consider and pass the Bill since the Bill affected the workings of both Houses.

14. In this case, the vacancy in the Commission being that of a male, non-MP member of the Commission, the PSC was required to recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate a male candidate for approval for appointment.
15. The Senate Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights considered the procedure followed by the Parliamentary Service Commission in nominating Hon. Johnson Muthama for appointment to the position of member of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) and noted as follows: -
 - i) on Friday, 21st October, 2022, the Parliamentary Service Commission declared a vacancy in the position of a male Non-Member Commissioner, by placing a notice in the Kenya Gazette, an advertisement in two daily newspapers of national circulation, and on the Parliament website inviting interested qualified persons to apply for appointment as member of the Commission under Art. 127(2)(d) of the Constitution;
 - ii) the Commission received a total of one hundred and seventy-one (171) applications, out of which eight (8) qualified applicants were short-listed as meeting the requirements set out in the Constitution and the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019);
 - iii) the Commission published the list of shortlisted applicants on Friday, 23rd December, 2022 in two daily newspapers and invited the shortlisted applicants for oral interviews, which were held on Friday, 30th December, 2022; and
 - iv) the Commission thereupon resolved to forward to the National Assembly and the Senate the name of Hon. Johnson Muthama, as the candidate who ranked highest in the oral interviews for the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Art.127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

(b) Constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question

16. In nominating or appointing any person as a member of the Commission, the Parliamentary party or parties concerned and the National Assembly respectively shall have regard to the person's experience or interest in consolidating and advancing the ideals and objectives of Parliamentary democracy.

(c) Suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed

17. The Committee was required to assess the suitability of the nominee for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

CHAPTER TWO: APPROVAL HEARING OF THE NOMINEE

2.1 Preparatory Meeting

18. The Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights held a sitting on Tuesday, 28th February, 2023 at 8.30 a.m. to deliberate on the approval hearing and noted the following –
- i) That, at as at the time of that meeting, the Clerk of the Senate had not received any memoranda from the public contesting suitability of the nominee for appointment;
 - ii) That, the nominee had also not notified the Clerk of the Senate of his intention to withdraw from the approval process as outlined under section 6(10) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approvals) Act (No. 33 of 2011);
 - iii) That, the clearance certificates had been received, in respect of the nominee, from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Kenya Revenue Authority and the Higher Education Loans Board and a licensed Credit Reference Bureau. Further, that no adverse reports on the nominee had been received from the Director of Public Prosecutions, the Director of Criminal Investigations and the National Intelligence Service; and
 - iv) That, the nominee had submitted the duly filled Questionnaire in compliance with section 6 (8) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) for consideration by the Committee (*Annex 14*).
19. The Committee therefore resolved to undertake the approval hearing on Tuesday, 28th February, 2023 at 9.30 a.m. as advertised by the Clerk of the Senate and communicated to the members of the public and the nominee.
20. In conducting the approval hearing, the nominee would be examined against the criteria and requirements set out at section 8(1) of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2000 and section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).

2.2 The Approval Hearing

21. The nominee, Hon. Johnson Muthama, appeared before the Committee on Tuesday, 28th February, 2023 at 9.35 a.m. and was interviewed pursuant to provisions of the Constitution, Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the Standing Orders of the Senate.

22. *Citizenship Status*

The nominee is a Kenyan citizen by birth and holds Identity Card Number 1464160.

23. *Academic and Professional Qualifications*

The nominee is currently pursuing a Master's Degree in Public Administration at the University of Birmingham in the United Kingdom and holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Sciences from Arden University, Germany.

24. *Work and Professional Experience*

He has worked as the Vice Chairman of Kenya African National Union (KANU) for Machakos District, Ambassador to Kenya at International Coloured Gemstone Ass. (1989 - 1997), Director at International Coloured Gemstone Ass. (1998 - 2001), Member of Parliament for Kangundo (2008 - 2013), Director and Executive Chairman at Muthama Gemstones (K) Limited (1990 - present), Director and Executive Chairman at Rockland Kenya Limited (1991 - present), Director and Executive Chairman at Johnson Nduya Muthama Holdings Ltd (2010 - present), Deputy Government Chief Whip for The National Assembly (2008 - 2010), Government Chief Whip for The National Assembly (2010 - 2013), Co-Chair of CORD and NASA Coalition (2013 - 2017), Senate Minority Whip (2013 - 2017), Senator for Machakos County (2013 - 2017) and lastly as the Chairman of the United Democratic Alliance (UDA) (2020 - 2nd January, 2023).

25. *Public Office, Political Activities and Affiliations*

The nominee has held office as a Member of Parliament for Kangundo Constituency, during the 10th Parliament (2007 - 2013) and Senator for Machakos County during the 11th Parliament (2013 - 2017). He served in several regional and national positions of leadership in Kenya including as former ruling party KANU Vice Chairman in Machakos. He was the Government Chief Whip in the 10th Parliament in the National Assembly of Kenya (2007 - 2013) and he also served as the first Senate Minority Whip under the Kenya Constitution 2010 from (2013 - 2017). Hon. Johnson Muthama also co-chaired the Opposition outfit Coalition for Reforms and Democracy (CORD) and was co-chair of the national opposition management under the National Super Alliance (NASA).

He is also a member of the Geological Society of Kenya, International Coloured Association, East Africa Association, Kenya Private Sector Alliance, The Kenya America Chamber of Commerce, Kenya Chamber of Mines and Kenya Gemstone Dealers Association.

26. *Potential Conflict of Interest*

The nominee has no immediate associations that are likely to present potential conflict of interest when he assumes the position.

27. *Sources of Income and Net-worth*

The nominee's sources of income include employment income from Rockland Kenya Limited and Johnson Nduya Muthama Holdings Limited, rental income from properties in Nairobi, and prospecting, mining and export of gemstones. He estimated his financial net worth to be Kenya Shillings two billion (Kshs.2 billion).

28. *Integrity*

The nominee has not been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravening the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution. He has also not been adversely associated with practices that depict bias, favoritism, or nepotism in the discharge of public duties. He has fully complied with the tax obligations to the State for the financial year immediately preceding his nomination for the appointment. He has not been charged in a court of law in the past three years or adversely been mentioned in an investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry in the last three years.

29. *Suitability for the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission*

On his suitability for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, the nominee affirmed that he has the necessary qualifications, experience, and skills to discharge the mandate of the office.

The nominee confirmed that he has over 15 years of experience in Public Service as an elected Member of both Parliament having served as a Member of Parliament during the 10th Parliament (Kangundo Constituency, 2007 – 2013) and Senator (Machakos County, 2013 – 2017) in the 11th Parliament.

He also served as the Chief Government Whip (National Assembly) and the Senate Minority Whip during the 10th Parliament and the 11th Parliament respectively. Hon. Johnson Muthama served in several regional and national positions of leadership in Kenya including a former ruling party KANU Vice Chairman in Machakos, he understood the needs of the Commission as well as the institution of Parliament, and would work with other members of the Commission to ensure that services and facilities were provided to Members and staff of Parliament.

CHAPTER THREE: COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

3.1 Committee Findings

30. Having considered the nominee's curriculum vitae, filled questionnaire pursuant to the Schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), and the oral submissions during the approval hearing, the Committee made the following **findings**:
- a) That, in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
 - b) That, he has been the chairman and director of several private companies and international business associations for more than thirty (30) years, has also served as a Member of Parliament for ten (10) years where he held various House leadership positions.
 - c) That, his academic credentials, professional training, and experience comply with section 6 (7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).
 - d) That, he demonstrated knowledge on the mandate and working of the Parliamentary Service Commission and the institution of Parliament.
 - e) That, he meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity, having been issued with clearance certificates by various government agencies such as EACC, KRA, DCI and HELB.
 - f) That, as stipulated in Article 75(1) of the Constitution, he has no potential conflict of interest.
 - g) That, he has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), Article 76 (financial probity), Article 77 (restriction on activities of State Officers) and Article 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution.
 - h) That, no memoranda were presented to the Committee contesting the suitability or otherwise of the nominee for appointment as a member of the Parliamentary Service Commission.

3.2 Committee Recommendation

31. Having conducted the approval hearing for the nominee, pursuant to provisions of the Constitution of Kenya (2010), the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) and standing order 77 of the Senate Standing Orders, the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights **recommends** that the Senate **approves** the appointment of Hon. Johnson Nduya Muthama to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.



APPLICABLE PROCEDURE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF NON-MEMBER COMMISSIONER

- (4) The applicable procedure for the appointment of a Member of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution is provided for in the First Schedule to the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 as follows -

- “1. Upon the convening of the first sitting of Parliament pursuant to Article 126(2) of the Constitution, or whenever a vacancy arises in the membership of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution, the Secretary of the Commission shall, within fourteen days of that first sitting or the occurrence of the vacancy or within such time as would be reasonable, by notice in the Gazette and in at least two daily newspapers of national circulation, declare a vacancy and invite interested qualified persons to apply for appointment as members of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.*
- 2. Any person qualified in accordance with the Constitution may make an application to the Secretary within fourteen days of the publication of the notice.*
- 3. The Parliamentary Service Commission shall, within fourteen days after the last date of submission of applications under paragraph 2, consider the applications, shortlist, conduct interviews and recommend — (a) in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a woman, one female applicant qualified for the position; and (b) in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a man, one male applicant qualified for the position.*
- 4. The name of a person recommended under paragraph 3 shall be submitted to the National Assembly and the Senate for approval and appointment in accordance with the Standing Orders of the respective Houses.*
- 5. If both Houses of Parliament approve a person recommended under paragraph 3, the Secretary shall, within seven days after the approval, publish the name of the person in the Gazette.*
- 6. Where one or both Houses of Parliament reject the persons recommended under paragraph 3, the Speaker of the relevant House shall communicate the decision of that House to the other House and shall request for a fresh nomination by the Commission.*
- 7. On receipt of a request by a House under paragraph 6, the Commission shall, within seven days, submit to the National Assembly and the Senate a fresh nomination from amongst the persons shortlisted by the Commission under paragraph 3.*

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE POSITION OF NON-MEMBER COMMISSIONER

- (9) A person is qualified to be appointed a member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya and sections 8 and 9 of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 if -
- (a) the person is not a Member of Parliament;
 - (b) holds a degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
 - (c) has at least ten years' experience in public affairs;
 - (d) meets the requirements of leadership and integrity set out in chapter 6 of the Constitution;
 - (e) the person has experience or interest in consolidating and advancing the ideals and objectives of Parliamentary democracy;
 - (f) their appointment reflects the national values and principles set out in Article 10 of the Constitution; and
 - (g) their appointment represents the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.
- (10) Paragraph 3 of the First Schedule of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 requires the Commission to, within fourteen days after the last date of submission of applications, consider the applications, shortlist the applications, conduct interviews and recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate, in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a woman, one female applicant qualified for the position and in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a man, one male applicant qualified for the position for their consideration and approval.
- (11) The Commission is therefore required to submit the name of the recommended candidate to the National Assembly and the Senate for approval and appointment in accordance with the Standing Orders of the respective Houses.

Article 127(2) of the Constitution provides that the Commission shall consist of, among others, one man and one woman appointed by Parliament from among persons who are experienced in public affairs, but are not members of Parliament.

The Parliamentary Service Commission has nominated you for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

Following receipt by the Senate of the nomination from the Parliamentary Service Commission, at the sitting of the Senate held on Wednesday, 15th February, 2023, the Honourable Speaker of the Senate committed the matter to the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights to vet and consider your suitability for appointment and to submit its report to the Senate.
