EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Pursuant to Standing Order 42 (1), the Speaker on Tuesday 13th February, 2018 communicated to the House a message from H.E. the President regarding, among others, the nominee to the positions of Principal Secretary for Water and Sanitation, Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu. The Speaker further informed the House that H.E. the President was seeking the approval of the National Assembly on the said nomination before appointment.

In accordance with Standing Order 42(3) (c) the Speaker having read the Message from the President referred the name of the nominee together with his curriculum vitae to the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources to conduct approval hearings. The Speaker advised the Committee to conduct extensive public participation as provided for under Article 118 of the Constitution as well as the Public Appointment Parliamentary Approval Act (No.33 of 2011) and report to the House within 14 days.

The Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources was assigned the role of conducting the vetting of the aforesaid nominee. The following statutes/provisions guided the Committee as it executed this mandate:

- (i) The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011);
- (ii) Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
- (iii) Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;
- (iv) Article 10 of the Constitution on the national values and principles of governance;
- (v) The Leadership and Integrity Act (Cap. 182);
- (vi) The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015)
- (vii) The Public Officer Ethics Act (Cap. 183)

The Committee having considered the nominee's Curriculum Vitae, other written and oral and submissions during the vetting exercise, made the following observations that the nominee:

1. Had satisfied the requirements of chapter six of the Constitution of Kenya on Leadership and Integrity having been cleared by: The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations, the Kenya Revenue Authority on Tax Compliance, Higher Educations Loans Board (HELB) and the Registrar of Political Parties.
2. Has never been charged with a criminal offence in a court of law and has no potential conflict of interest with regard to the position he had been nominated to.
3. Has never been dismissed from office for contravention of the provisions of article 75 of the constitution which deals with conduct of State Officers that are

- adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any commission of inquiry.
4. Has the necessary qualifications and extensive experience in the public service as seen from the documentation presented to the Committee.
 5. Has the right attitude and commitment to serve in the position for which he had been nominated as observed from the way he responded to the Members' questions on water related issues during the approval hearing.
 6. Does not hold office in any political party hence satisfies the provisions of Article 77(2) of the Constitution;
 7. Exhibited impressive knowledge and understanding of issues relating to the docket he had been nominated for appointment.

Having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee, and pursuant to Article 155(3) of the Constitution and Section 8 (2) of the Schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011 and Standing Order 216 (5) (f) of the National Assembly, the Committee recommends that the National Assembly approves the nomination of Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu for appointment by H.E. the President to the position of Principal Secretary for Water and Sanitation.

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment of the Committee

The Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources is one of the fifteen (15) Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under *Standing Order 216* whose mandates, pursuant to the *Standing Order 216 (5)*, are as follows:

- a) To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
- b) To study the programme and policy objectives of Ministries and departments and the effectiveness of their implementation;
- c) To study and review all the legislation referred to it;
- d) To study, access and analyze the relative success of the Ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- e) To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned Ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
- f) **To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order No.204 (Committee on appointments);**
- (fa) To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
- g) To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
- h) To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
- i) To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

1.2 Mandate of the Committee

In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider matters related to:

- i) Climate Change
- ii) Environment Management and Conservation
- iii) Forestry
- iv) Water Resource Management
- v) Wildlife
- vi) Mining and Natural Resources
- vii) Pollution and Waste Management

In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the following State Departments, namely:

- The State Department for Water Services;
- The State Department of Environment and Climate Change;
- The State Department for Natural Resources Management; and
- The State Department of Wildlife
- The State Department of Mining

1.4 Committee Recommendation

Having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee, and pursuant to Article 155(3) of the Constitution and Section 8 (2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011 and Standing Order 216 (5) (f) of the National Assembly, the Committee recommends that the National Assembly approves the

nomination of Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu for appointment by H.E. the President to the position of Principal Secretary for Water and Sanitation.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

2.1 Message from H. E. the President

Pursuant to Standing Order 42 (1), the Speaker on Tuesday 13th February, 2018 communicated to the House a message from H.E. the President regarding, among others, the nominee to the positions of Principal Secretary for Water and Sanitation.

The Speaker further informed the House that H.E. the President was seeking the approval of the National Assembly on the said nomination before appointment.

In accordance with Standing Order 42(3) (c) the Speaker having read the Message from the President referred the name of the nominee together with his curriculum vitae to the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources to conduct approval hearings. The Speaker advised the Committee to conduct extensive public participation as provided for under Article 118 of the Constitution as well as the Public Appointment Parliamentary Approval Act (No.33 of 2011) and report to the House within 14 days.

2.2 Nomination and appointment process

Article 155 (3) of the Constitution provides for the process of nomination, approval and appointment of the Principal Secretaries. The Constitution provides that the recruitment of officers to public office should be conducted in a competitive, transparent and fair process before nomination for appointment by H.E. the President with the approval of the National Assembly.

The National Assembly having received the name of the nominee was obligated to conduct approval hearings and make a determination of the nominees' suitability or otherwise within fourteen days as provided for in section 8 (1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval Act) (No.33 of 2011).

2.3 Committee Proceedings

During the approval hearings, the Committee held a total of three Sittings to examine and review the nominee's certificates, testimonials, consider public views and hold approval hearing with the nominees (Minutes of the proceedings are attached to the Report as annex 1).

3.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

3.1 Legal framework

1. Article 155 of the Constitution provides as follows—

155. (1) There is established the office of Principal Secretary, which is an office in the public service.

(2) Each State department shall be under the administration of a Principal Secretary.

(3) The President shall—

(a) nominate a person for appointment as Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission; and

(b) with the approval of the National Assembly, appoint Principal Secretaries.

(4) The President may re-assign a Principal Secretary.

(5) A Principal Secretary may resign from office by giving notice, in writing, to the President.

2. In light of this, H.E. the President had nominated Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Water and Sanitation.

The Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources was assigned the role of conducting the vetting of the aforesaid nominee. The following statutes/provisions guided the Committee as it executed this mandate:

- (i) The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011);
- (ii) Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
- (iii) Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;
- (iv) Article 10 of the Constitution on the national values and principles of governance;
- (v) The Leadership and Integrity Act (Cap. 182);
- (vi) The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015)
- (vii) The Public Officer Ethics Act (Cap. 183).

a). The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011)

Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, (PAPAA), provides for issues which the relevant House of Parliament (in this case, the National Assembly) is supposed to consider in relation to any nomination. These issues include:

- a) *the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;*
- b) *any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and*
- c) *the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.*

Although the constitution does not specifically provide for the qualifications for appointment (or nomination) of a Principal Secretary, the schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act provides for the criteria to guide the Committee. These are:

- Education, employment record;
- Public office, political activities and affiliations;
- Deferred income or future benefits;
- Sources of income, tax status, statement of net worth;
- Potential conflicts of interest;
- Pro bono or charity work;
- Whether the nominee has been charged in a court of law or convicted;
- Adverse mention in an investigatory report of a Parliamentary Committee or Commission.

During the approval hearing, section 6 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (PAPAA) provides important points, that is:

- An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background (section 6(7), PAPAA)
- The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate (section 6(8), PAPAA)
- Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated (section 6(9), PAPAA)
- A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall end (section 6(10), PAPAA).

b). Chapter 6 of the Constitution (Leadership and Integrity)

The Committee, in determining the suitability of the nominee, took into consideration the provisions on leadership and integrity as outlined under Chapter Six of the Constitution. In particular, the Committee took cognizance of the following provisions:

- i) Article 73 (2) of the Constitution which provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include –
 - a) selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;
 - b) objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
 - c) selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by —
 - i) honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - ii) the declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;
 - d) accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and (e) discipline and commitment in service to the people.
- ii) Article 75(1) of the Constitution that requires a State Officer, whether in public or private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties and Article 75(3) of the Constitution that prohibits a State Officer who has been removed from office under that Article from holding any other State Office.
- iii) Article 77(1) of the Constitution that prohibits a full time State Officer from participating in any other gainful employment.
- iv) Article 77(2) of the Constitution that prohibits an appointed State officer from holding office in a political party.
- i) Article 78 of the Constitution that disqualifies persons who are not Kenyan Citizens and persons holding dual citizenship from appointment as State Officers.

c). The Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012

The primary purpose of the Leadership and Integrity Act (No. 19 of 2012) is to ensure that State officers respect the values, principles and requirements of the Constitution. According to the Act, a State officer is obligated to respect the values, principles and the requirements of the Constitution, including the national values and principles provided for under Article 10 of the Constitution; the rights and fundamental freedoms provided

for under Chapter Four of the Constitution; the responsibilities of leadership provided for under Article 73 of the Constitution; the principles governing the conduct of State officers provided for under Article 75 of the Constitution; the educational, ethical and moral requirements in accordance with Articles 99(1)(b) and 193(1)(b) of the Constitution; in the case of County governments, the objectives of devolution provided for under Article 174 of the Constitution; and in so far as is relevant, the values and principles of Public Service as provided for under Article 232 of the Constitution.

The Committee, in determining the suitability of the nominee, took into consideration the following provisions of the Leadership and Integrity Act, among others:

- i) Section 8 which provides that a public office is an office of public trust and shall be exercised in the best interests of the people of Kenya;
- ii) Section 10 which requires public officers to carry out duties in an efficient and honest manner; transparency; accurate records and documentation; report truthfully on all matters;
- iii) Section 11 which requires public officers to carry out their duties with utmost professionalism to build public confidence and to exercise courtesy, respect, non-discrimination and high standards of performance;
- iv) Section 12 which provides for financial integrity: officers should not enrich oneself or another person;
- v) Section 14 which provides for the receipt of gifts or benefits; state officers are required to declare gifts of any value to the employer;
- vi) Section 15 which provides that public officers should not use their office wrongfully or unlawfully to influence the acquisition of property;
- vii) Section 16 which requires state officers to declare conflict of interest in the course of discharge of their duties;
- viii) Section 23 calls on public officers to exercise political neutrality;
- ix) Section 24 calls public officers to exercise impartiality in the performance of duties;
- x) Section 26 requires public officers not to engage in any other gainful employment; Provided for in Article 77 of the Constitution in case of State officers; and
- xi) Section 32 requires public officers to conduct their private affairs in a manner that maintains public confidence in the integrity of the office.

d). Article 232 of the Constitution on Values and Principles of Public Service

Article 232 of the Constitution provides for the values and principles of public service which include high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women; the members of all ethnic groups; and persons with disabilities.

e). Article 10(2) of the Constitution on national values and principles of governance

Article 232 of the Constitution provides for the values and principles of public service which include high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women; the members of all ethnic groups; and persons with disabilities.

The Committee also took into consideration the requirements provided under Article 232 of the Constitution while it was conducting the approval hearing.

f). The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act, 2015

The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015) gives effect to Article 232 of the Constitution of Kenya. The Committee took into considerations the provisions of the Act and in particular:

- i) Section 5 which provides that every public officer shall maintain high standards of professional ethics;
- ii) Section 6 which provides that a public officer shall use public resources in an efficient, effective and economic manner;
- iii) Section 7 which provides that the public service shall ensure that public services are provided promptly, effectively, impartially and equitably;

- iv) Section 8 which prohibits a public officer from giving information that the public officer knows or ought to know to be inaccurate; or unduly delays the provision of any information where required to provide that information;
- v) Section 9 which provides that every public officer shall be accountable for his or her administrative acts;
- vi) Section 10 which provides that the public service, a public institution or an authorised officer shall ensure that public officers are appointed and promoted on basis of fair competition and merit.

g). The Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003

The Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 provides for obligations to be carried out by a public officer. These include professionalism, carrying out duties in accordance with the law, prohibition from unjust enrichment, avoiding conflict of interest, not using office as an avenue for soliciting or collecting harambees; not acting for foreigners; care of property; political neutrality, prohibition of nepotism or favouritism, giving impartial advice, conducting private affairs in a way that maintains public confidence, bar from sexual harassment, submission of declaration of income, assets and liabilities once every two years, among other worthy provisions.

The Committee considered the provisions of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 during its approval process.

3.2 Message from H.E the President

H. E the President on Monday, 29th January, 2018 communicated the name of the nominees for the position of Principal Secretary for Water and Sanitation to the Speaker for approval by the National Assembly pursuant to Article 155 (3) (b). The Speaker in his communication from the Chair issued on Tuesday, 13th February, 2018 and pursuant to Standing Order No. 42 referred the name of the nominee to the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources to conduct approval hearings and report within 14 days.

3.3 Notification to the nominees and Clearance requirements

The Clerk of the National Assembly vide a letter Reference Number **REF.NA/DC/ENR/2018** dated 14th February, 2018 (Attached as Annex 2) wrote to the nominee informing him of his nomination by H.E The President and requested him to appear for approval hearing by the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources on Wednesday, 21st February, 2018 in Committee Room on 2nd Floor, Continental House, Parliament Buildings at 11:00 am. The Clerk further requested the nominee to bring with him originals of his National Identity Card, academic and

professional certificates, any other documents and testimonials. Additionally, he was asked to bring letters/certificates of clearance from the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti- Corruption Commission (EACC) and the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI).

The Clerk, through a letter **Reference Number KNA/2/4/2018/ (47)** wrote to the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti - Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), the Registrar of Political Parties (RPP) requesting for tax, loans, integrity and criminal record status of the nominee and affiliation to any political party as an official. The institutions wrote back to the National Assembly and cleared the nominee (the 5 letters are attached as annex 3).

3.3 Request for Memoranda and Notification to the public

Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, provides that “any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated”.

The Clerk of the National Assembly on **Wednesday, 14th February, 2018** placed a notification in the print media informing the general public of the intention of the Committee to conduct approval hearings, as provided for by Article 118 (1) (a) (b) and (2) of the Constitution and Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, (No.33 of 2011), which allow public participation in Committee proceedings. The notification gave provision for the submission of memoranda, on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee, by **Tuesday, 20th February, 2018, at 5.00 pm (annex 4)**.

3.5 Submission of Memoranda

At the close of the business day **Tuesday, 20th February, 2018**, the Office of the Clerk, had received only a letter signed by officials of the *Thirdway Alliance Kenya* officials dated 6th January, 2018. The officials included: Ekuru Aukot, Party Leader; CPA Miruru, National Party Chairman; and Frederick T. Okango, Secretary General.

The Committee found that the letter from the *Thirdway Alliance Kenya* on the vetting of Cabinet Secretaries and Principal Secretaries did not meet the requirements under section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. This section requires that a person submitting a memorandum shall make a written statement on oath.

Further, the said memorandum was not directed at the suitability or otherwise of a specific candidate. No other submission had been received touching on the nominee. The Committee therefore proceeded to conduct the approval hearing of the said nominee.

4.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS

The Committee conducted approval hearings for the nominee to the positions of Principal Secretary for Water and Sanitation on **Wednesday, 21st February, 2018**. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by, among other documents, the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) and the Standing Orders.

The Committee examined the nominee using the guidelines provided for in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011. The Committee also considered the following in vetting the nominee:

4.1 Approval Hearing of Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu, Principal Secretary Nominee for Water and Sanitation.

Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu, appeared before the Committee for approval hearing on **Wednesday, 21st February, 2018**. He was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during the hearing as follows: -

4.1.1 Personal Background

Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu, is a Kenyan citizen of Identity Card Number 7197113 and was born in Murang'a County in 1963. He is a married man.

4.1.2 Educational Background

He held an Executive Masters in Business Administration from the Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology, a Bachelor of Arts Degree, 2nd Class Honor's (Upper Division) from the University of Nairobi and attended Kakamega High School, Kiaguthu Secondary School and Muthiria Primary School for his basic education.

4.1.3 Professional Experience & Affiliations

Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu has the following professional affiliations:

- i) Member of the Kenya Institute of Management (KIM).
- ii) Member of the Kenya Association for Public Administration and Management (KAPAM).

4.1.4 Work Experience

Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu has a wealth of experience especially in Public Service. He has worked in the following positions:

3.1.6 Potential Conflict of interest

On possible conflict of interest through personal or family interests in the water and sanitation sector, he stated that he had no personal interests in the sector and neither did his family.

3.1.7 Integrity

The nominee has no integrity issues having been cleared by the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission. Equally, no member of the public raised an issue about him.

3.1.8 Other Issues Under Consideration

- 1. On resources mobilization to fund projects in the water sector**, he stated that the water sector was severely underfunded and there was need to aggressively bring on board many development partners and other stakeholders to adequately fund infrastructural development in the sector.
- 2. On his motivation to handle water issues and the attendant challenges**, he stated that he was motivated by his experiences while serving in the then provincial administration where he witnessed first-hand the water challenges experienced by citizens at the grassroots in areas like Kieni and Tana River. He equally stays in the capital, Nairobi and has witnessed the challenges of accessing water. Finally, his mandate having involved conflict management while in the provincial administration, he appreciated the impact of lack or inadequacy of water on conflict dynamics among communities struggling for the scarce water resources.
- 3. On water being a shared function and his view on ensuring positive intergovernmental relations**, he stated that he would utilize the intergovernmental relations forum to resolve any disputes on the shared function. He however noted that the law stipulated the role of each level of government where generally the county governments manage the water supply and infrastructure while the national government regulates and sets stands for the sector.
- 4. On the Kenya Water Towers Agency and the role, the Water and Sanitation Ministry would play with regard to the agency**, he stated that although it was not the case, the agency was best domiciled in the Water and Sanitation Ministry since water supply in the country relied a lot on the water towers. He further noted that since the ecosystem impacts the water sector greatly, he would engage the agency in constructive dialogue to ensure the water towers in the country were protected through encouraging the agency to upscale its operations.
- 5. On his strategy to ensure access to more budgetary allocation to the water sector**, he stated that he would engage the national treasury on it since water was a major enabler of the big four priorities of the incumbent government i.e. manufacturing, universal healthcare, affordable housing and food security. He equally anticipated to get the support of the committee in pursuing the budget increase to the water sector.
- 6. On his quick wins for the water sector within five years**, he stated that he would be open to dialogue with members on prioritization of water projects since they best understood the water challenges experienced in their respective grassroots.

7. **On why the country still experienced water challenges 50 years after independence**, he stated that this was due to population growth outstripping the water supply and sanitation infrastructure. He pledged to revisit the national water masterplan to enable adequate planning on water matters to meet the ever rising demand.
8. **On equity in the distribution of water supply and sanitation infrastructure in the country**, he stated that there were scarce resources and that he would adhere to the provisions of the PFM Act in sharing the ever scarce resources equitably across the country.
9. **On the strategy to increase sanitation provision in rural towns**, he stated that that was the responsibility of county governments. The role of the national government was restricted to providing technical knowhow, setting standards and regulations and help in seeking funding when the capital outlay was too huge.

5.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS


The Committee having considered the nominee's Curriculum Vitae, other written and oral and submissions during the approval hearing exercise, made the following observations that the nominee:

8. Had satisfied the requirements of chapter six of the Constitution of Kenya on Leadership and Integrity having been cleared by: The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations, the Kenya Revenue Authority on Tax Compliance, Higher Educations Loans Board (HELB) and the Registrar of Political Parties.
9. Has never been charged with a criminal offence in a court of law and has no potential conflict of interest with regard to the position he had been nominated to.
10. Has never been dismissed from office for contravention of the provisions of article 75 of the constitution which deals with conduct of State Officers that are adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any commission of inquiry.
11. Has the necessary qualifications and extensive experience in the public service as seen from the documentation presented to the Committee.
12. Has the right attitude and commitment to serve in the position for which he had been nominated as observed from the way he responded to the Members' questions on water related issues during the approval hearing.
13. Does not hold office in any political party hence satisfies the provisions of Article 77(2) of the Constitution;
14. Exhibited impressive knowledge and understanding of issues relating to the docket he had been nominated for appointment.

6.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee, and pursuant to Article 155(3) of the Constitution and Section 8 (2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011 and National Assembly Standing Order 216 (5) (f), the Committee recommends that the National Assembly approves the nomination of Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu for appointment by H.E. the President to the position of Principal Secretary for State Department for Water and Sanitation.

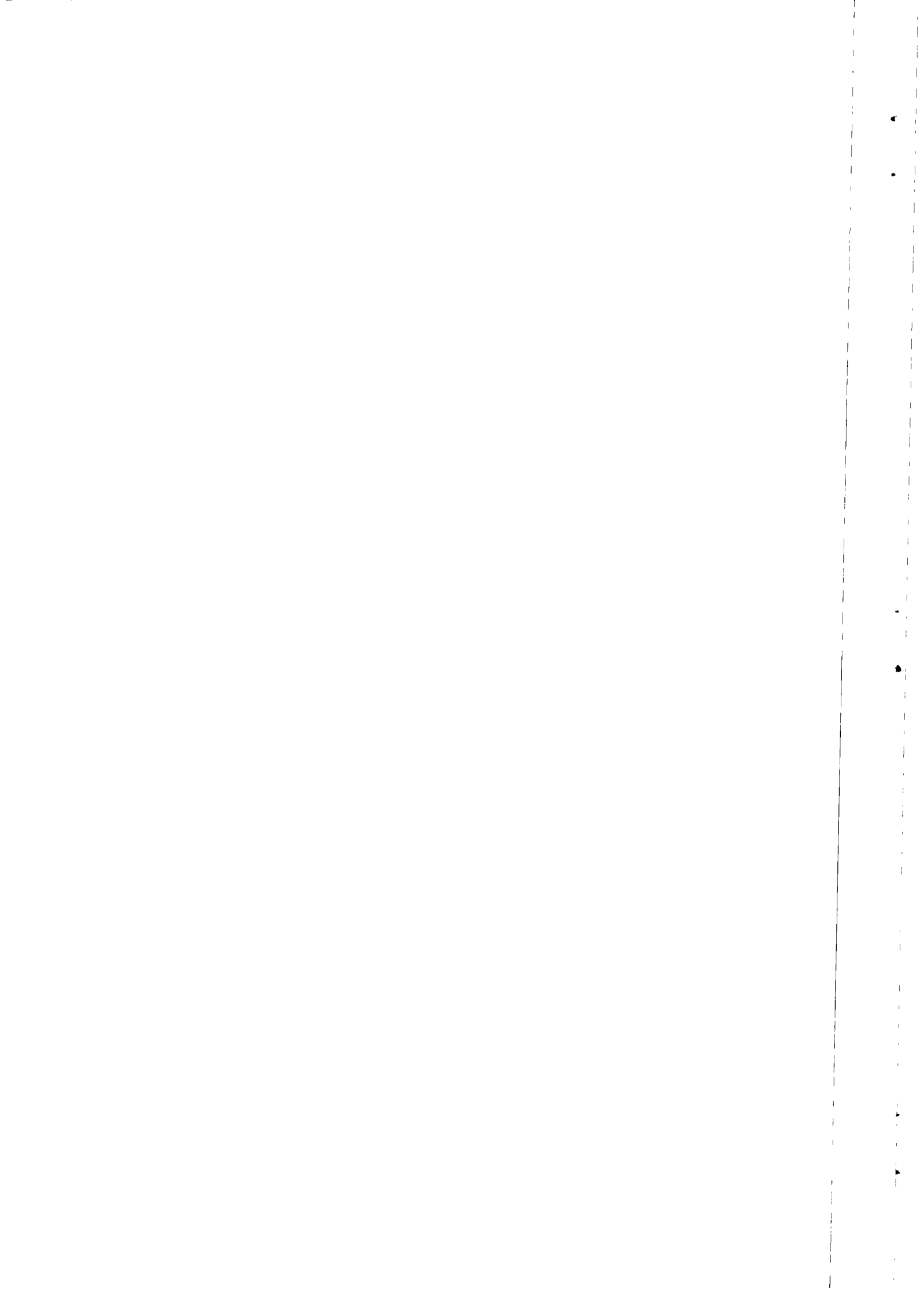

The Chairperson informed Members that:

1. The Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources was in receipt of the notification for appointment by the President of Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu to serve as Principal Secretary, State Department of Water and Sanitation. This was through the Hon. Speaker's communication of Tuesday 13th February, 2018 on the floor of the House. The President acted Pursuant to Article 155 (3) (b) of the Constitution and Section 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011.
2. The National Assembly then invited the public through an advertisement in the local dailies on 15th February, 2018 as per Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap. 136 which provides that "any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".
3. Subsequently, the Committee was in receipt of a memorandum from Mr. Ekuru Aukot the Party Leader, Thirdway Alliance Kenya on the vetting of Cabinet Secretaries and Principal Secretaries. In the letter, he was requesting for audience with the Committee to present their views on the vetting of the Cabinet Secretaries and Principal Secretaries.
4. It was found that letter from the Thirdway Alliance Kenya did not meet the requirements under section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. This



section requires that a person submitting a memorandum shall make a written statement on oath.

5. Further, the said memorandum was not directed at the suitability or otherwise of a specific candidate.
6. No other submission has been received touching on the nominee. The Committee therefore was to proceed to conduct the approval hearing of the said nominee. In doing so, the Committee was to be guided by the procedure outlined in the Act. Which include:

a) Submission of documents

As required, he confirmed that the nominee had submitted the following documents copies of which had been given to members;

- i. His identity card, academic and professional certificates and other relevant testimonials;
- ii. Letters, certificates of clearance or certificates of compliance from the following—
 - (a) Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission;

- iii. A duly filled questionnaire as specified in the Schedule to the Act.

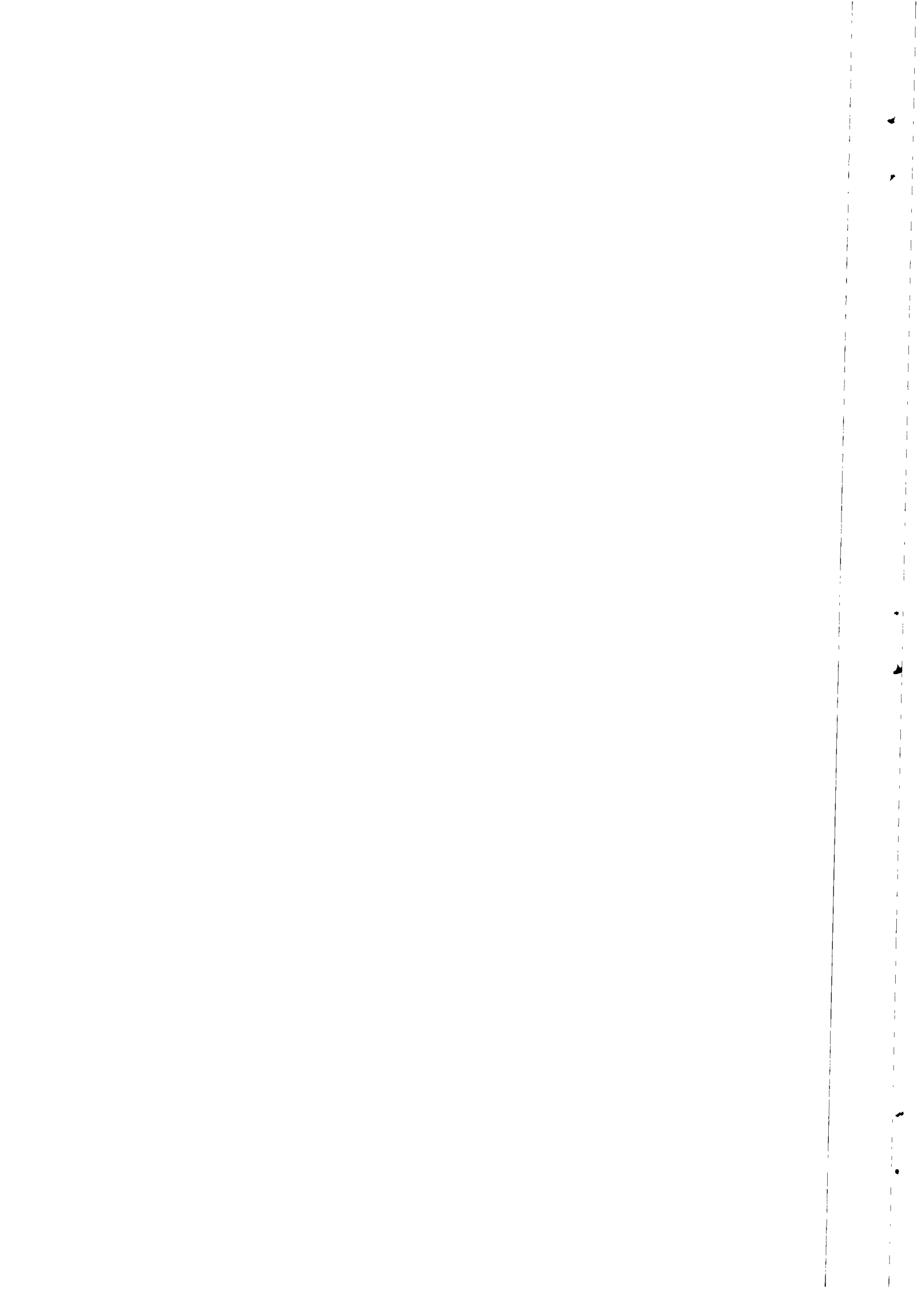

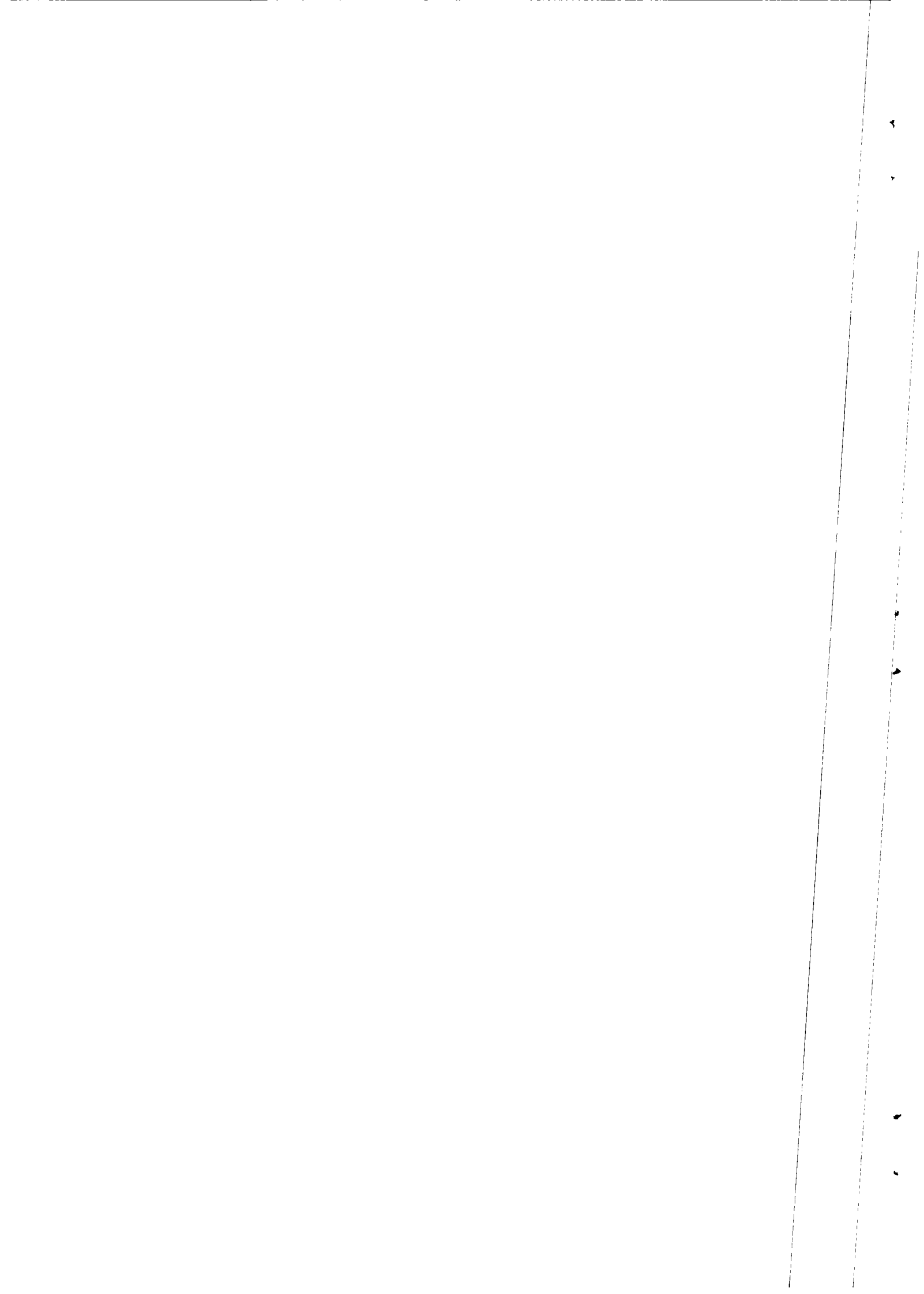

Presentation by The Principal Secretary Nominee for Water and Sanitation, Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu

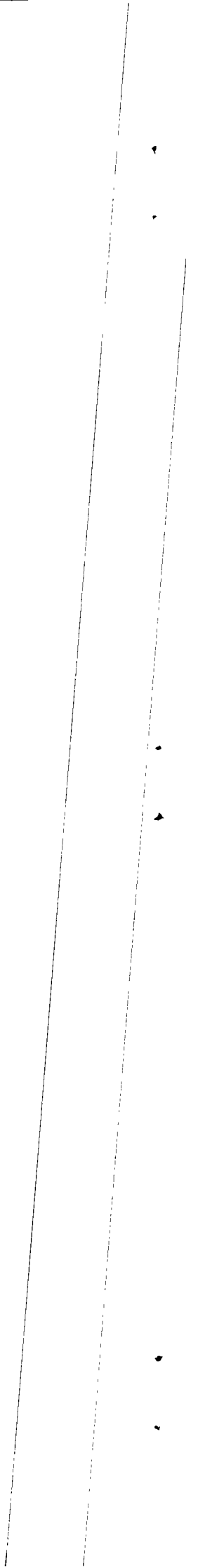
The Principal Secretary Nominee for Water and Sanitation, Mr. Joseph Wairagu Irungu appeared before the Committee and informed it that:

1. He was born in Murang'a County on 19th October, 1963 and was working with Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government. He was a Christian.
2. On his educational background, he held an Executive Masters in Business Administration from the Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology, a Bachelor of Arts Degree, 2nd Class Honor's (Upper Division) from the University of Nairobi and attended Kakamega High School, Kiaguthu Secondary School and Muthiria Primary School for his basic education.
3. On his suitability for the job, he stated that he was an administrative officer who had risen through the ranks to the position of Principal Administrative Secretary, Ministry of Interior & Coordination of National Government. That the only position he had not served in was that of Principal Secretary and he needed the challenge to do so hence his application to the Public Service Commission for the position. He equally stated that he had served under seasoned and celebrated public servants who had mentored him, assessed him and proven his performance capabilities. He further stated that he had undergone trainings locally, regionally and internationally which put him in good stead to serve in the position he had been nominated to.
4. 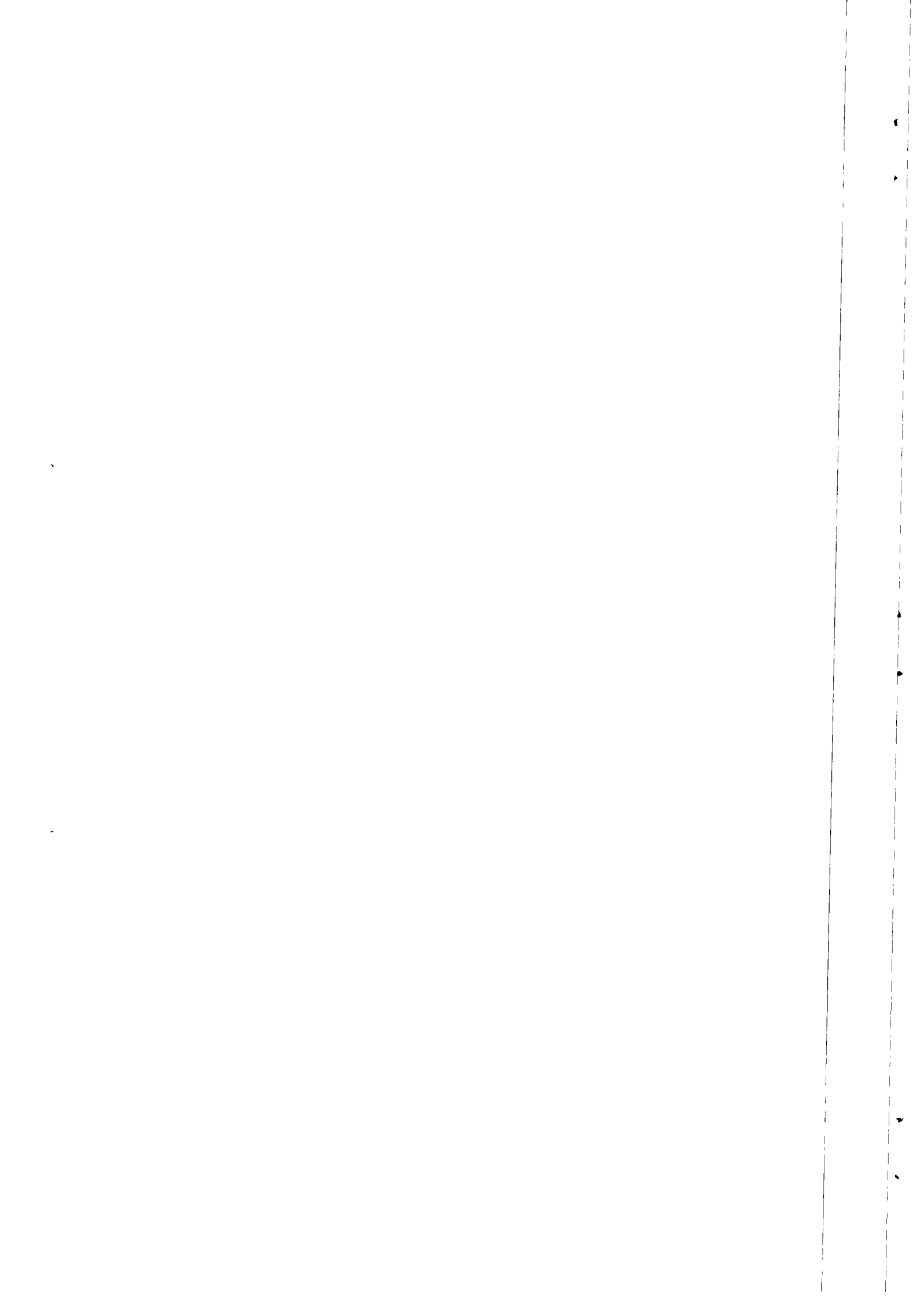
The Committee further recommended the following additional interventions:

State Department for Environment

- a) For NEMA to enforce the plastic ban and any other environmental pollution issue, there is need to empower it through additional enforcement officers to arrest and hand over the offenders to the DPP as well as resources to intensify surveillance especially following news of increased activities by illegal plastic bag manufacturers and importers.
- b) There is need to reconsider the Scrapping of the Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) fees and use the polluter pays approach rather than further burdening the tax payers, and ensuring that companies do not over-exploit our resources/environment at no cost.
- c) The Committee further recommends the streamlining in collection of the EIA fee through digitization of the system to reduce the potential leakages in collection of financial resources.

State Department for Natural Resources

- d) Assessment of temporal and spatial changes in the condition of Water Towers is useful in identifying the causal factors of their degradation, which will assist in the design of relevant conservation strategies. There is need to document the interaction among human and physical features to identify best conservation strategies for the Water Towers.
- e) There is need to review the establishment of KWTA and strengthen its capacity to oversee and manage water towers and other natural assets within them and at all levels. Such capacity include policy, legal, institutional, technical; technological, financial and management for long-term, effective sustainable management of these water towers. The Committee further recommends for the transfer of KWTA from the State Department of Natural Resource to the Presidency for better coordination in overseeing and management of the water towers
- f) Due to the excessive logging, the Committee recommends for a suspension of all permits until an audit is undertaken to clean out the illegal licensing. The Committee further recommends that the audit should be done by an independent body from the Kenya Forest Service since they are the same Agency issuing the licenses.
- g) The Committee recommends that the National Treasury should facilitate the recruitment of 1,000 rangers by KWS.
- h) There was need for the KWS to device ways of utilizing the funds accruing to it through compensation courtesy of the various infrastructural projects undertaken in areas under its jurisdiction. Such utilization should benefit both the communities in the areas and the institution. Such funds should also be transparently accounted for annually.
- i) Following the allocation of **Kshs. 39 million** to finance new projects with an estimated cost of **Kshs. 41 billion**, the Committee recommends the transfer of the **Kshs. 39 million** for the 4 new projects to finance the Presidential initiative of solving boundary disputes



between Kenya Wildlife Service and local communities neighboring Tsavo Conservation area

State Department for Water Services

- j) The National Treasury should finance the gap created by the loss of AIA which used to be collected by various institutions but have been scraped or/ and are being received by other entities as per the various new Acts that have come in to effect.
- k) There is need to invest more in water resources management because without investment in water towers conservation, the mega dams the government is constructing will be worthless.
- l) Additional funding of the State Departments budget by **Kshs. 1 Billion** in the FY 2018/2019 to support the National Water and Sanitation strategic interventions Programme which will result to about 100,000 people having access to water and improved sanitation and thus contributing towards achieving universal access by 2030 as envisioned in SDG goal 6 and Vision 2030 by supporting vulnerable communities in the Country.

Ministry of Mining

- m) Since the survey will be financed through the China EXIM Bank and carried out by Geological Exploration and Technological Institute (GETI) of Jiangsu Province, People's Republic of China, The National Treasury should fund other operational costs that are critical to the implementation of the project and costing **Kshs. 740 Million** for the FY 2018/2019
- n) The National Treasury should provide **Kshs. 205 million** for the pending bill accrued by the government through the payment of legal fees for the Cortec case.

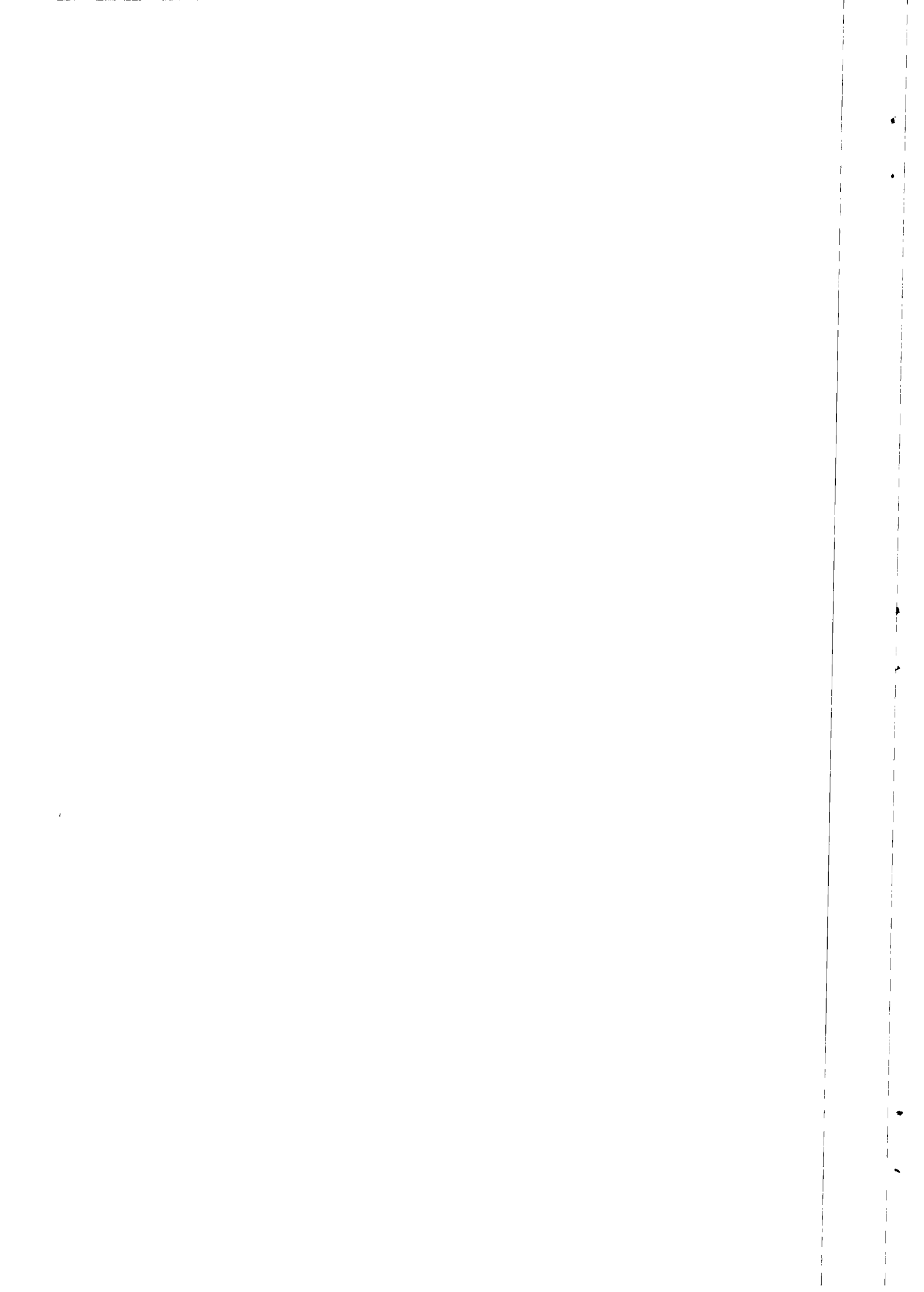




2. Has never been charged with a criminal offence in a court of law and has no potential conflict of interest with regard to the position he had been nominated to.
