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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains the proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Housing, Urban Planning and Public Works on its consideration of the Senate Amendments to the National Construction Authority (Amendment) Bill (*National Assembly Bill No. 59 of 2022*) by Hon. David Gikaria, MP which was passed by the National Assembly on 26th October, 2023 and submitted to the Senate pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 142 of the National Assembly Standing Orders. The Senate considered and passed the Bill with an amendment on Tuesday 19th November, 2024.

The Senate amendment to the Bill was referred to the Departmental Committee on Housing, Urban Planning and Public Works on Tuesday 25th November, 2024 for consideration.

The Committee held a total of two (2) Sittings to consider the Senate Amendments to the Bill and adopted its report.

The Committee is grateful to the Offices of the Speaker and Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during its consideration of the Bill. The Committee also thanks the Senate for their input into the Bill.

Finally, I wish to express my appreciation to the Honourable Members of the Committee for their useful contributions towards the preparation and production of this report and the Committee Secretariat for providing technical and logistical support.

CHAPTER ONE

1.0 Mandate and establishment of the Committee

- 1) The Departmental Committee on Housing, Urban Planning and Public Works is one of the twenty (20) Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under Standing Order 216 whose mandate pursuant to the Standing Order 216 (5) is as follows: -
 - i) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
 - ii) study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;

 - v) study, assess and analyze the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
 - vi) vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointment)
 - vii) examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - viii) consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - ix) Examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 Introduction

- 6) The National Construction Authority (Amendment) Bill, 2022 (National Assembly Bill No. 59 of 2022) by Hon. David Gikaria, MP, seeks to amend the National Construction Authority Act (Cap.118) to provide that women, youth and persons living with disabilities who own start-up businesses and who apply for registration as contractors under category six, seven and eight shall be exempt from payment of prescribed registration fee. In addition, the amendment seeks to provide for the recognition of women, youth and persons living with disabilities as marginalized groups and cushion them from the burden of paying registration fees.
- 7) Clause 1: provides for the short title.
- 8) Clause 2: proposes an amendment to Section 17 of the National Construction Authority Act (Cap 118) by inserting a new subsection immediately after subsection (2) as follows—
 - (2A) *Despite subsection (2), women, youth and persons with disabilities who apply to be registered by the Board as contractors shall be exempted from paying the prescribed registration fee where—*
 - (a) *the business is a startup business venture; and*
 - (b) *the fee does not exceed fifteen thousand shillings.*
- 9) The Bill does not delegate legislative powers and it does not limit any fundamental rights or freedoms.
- 10) Pursuant to Article 110 (1)(a) of the Constitution, the Bill concerns county governments.
- 11) The National Assembly considered and passed the Bill on 26th October 2023 without amendment. Pursuant to Article 110(4) of the Constitution, the Bill was referred to the Senate for consideration.

2.1 Senate amendment

- 12) The Senate considered the Bill and passed with the following amendment to Section 2 of the National Construction Authority Act (Cap.118);

“National Construction Authority Act is amended in section 2 by inserting the following new definition immediately after the definition “Registrar”—
“Startup” means an entity seeking to be registered under section 17 in the category NCA 6, NCA 7 or NCA 8;”
- 13) It's worthy to note that the Departmental Committee on Housing, Urban Planning and Public Works in its report to the House recommended the rejection of the Bill in its entirety with the following justifications; that
 - (i) The exemption sought through the Bill is within the existing powers of the relevant Cabinet Secretary and the National Construction Authority (NCA) Board in line with section 42 (1) of NCA, Act, 2011 (Cap 118) and Regulation 27 of the NCA Regulations, 2014;

- (ii) The Bill is well-intentioned however the benefits can be achieved without amending the NCA Act, 2011 (Cap 118) as the Authority in consultation with the Cabinet Secretary by approving waivers from time to time;
- (iii) Section 157 (10) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 already provides that 30% of contracts shall be reserved for these special groups and therefore there already exist legislation to uplift them;
- (iv) The contracts involve huge sum of money for example, a contractor under category 8 who pays a registration fee of Kshs. 5,000 is expected to undertake contracts worth Kshs. 10,000,000 (building), Kshs. 5,000,000 (specialist) and Kshs.20,000,000 (roads and civil). Such a company ought to have the capacity to pay the registration fees; and
- (v) The registration fee is a major source of revenue for the National Construction Authority which already had its income reduced by the removal of the construction levy and therefore, the Bill if enacted would further constrain the struggling Authority

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 Committee observations

14) The Committee having considered the Senate amendment to the Bill observed as follows;
THAT;

- (i) The Senate was in agreement with the National Assembly with regards to the amendment of Section 17 of the National Construction Authority Act (Cap 118)
- (ii) The Senate considered the Bill and proposed an amendment to Section 2 of the National Construction Authority Act (Cap.118) as follows;

“National Construction Authority Act is amended in section 2 by inserting the following new definition immediately after the definition “Registrar”—

“Startup” means an entity seeking to be registered under section 17 in the category NCA 6, NCA 7 or NCA 8;”

- (iii) The Committee noted the proposed amendment by the Senate can easily be subjected to abuse by unscrupulous contractors
- (iv) The Committee also noted that as per the Access to Government Procurement Opportunities and Section 157 (10) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act (Cap 412C), there exists a framework that requires every procuring entity to set aside at least thirty percent (30%) of procurement value to women, youth and persons living with disabilities

CHAPTER FOUR

4.0 Committee recommendations

- 15) Having considered the Senate amendment to the National Construction Authority (Amendment) Bill (*National Assembly Bill No. 59 of 2022*) by Hon. David Gikaria, MP, the Committee recommends that the House rejects the Senate proposed amendment to Section 2 of the National Construction Authority Act, (Cap 118) and substitute with the following new definition of a “start-up”;

“Start-up “means an entity seeking to be registered under section 17 in the category NCA 8;”


Justifications

- (i) That the proposed amendment by the Senate can easily be subjected to abuse by unscrupulous contractors.
- (ii) That as per the Access to Government Procurement Opportunities and Section 157 (10) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act (Cap 412C), there exists a framework that requires every procuring entity to set aside at least thirty percent (30%) of procurement value to women, youth and persons living with disabilities.



Insertion of a New Clause 1A

The National Construction Authority Act is amended in Section 2 by inserting the following new definition immediately after the definition "Registrar" -

"start up" means an entity seeking to be registered under section 17 in the category NCA 6, NCA 7 or NCA 8;
