MIN. NO. JS/01/2024 PRELIMINARIES

The Chairperson called the meeting to order at twenty-nine minutes past eleven O'clock and opened with a word of prayer. This was followed by a self-introduction session by Members of the two Committees and the Secretariat.

MIN. NO. JS/02/2024 ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The agenda of the meeting was adopted having been proposed by Sen. Wakili Hillary Sigei, MP and seconded by Hon. Mutuse Eckomas Mwengi, OGW, MP.

MIN.NO. JS/03/2024 REMARKS BY THE CO-CHAIRPERSONS

The Co-Chairperson (NA JLAC) recalled that the National Dialogue Committee (NADCO) was established by concurrent resolutions of the two Houses of Parliament and, upon completion of its work, had submitted its Report which was debated and adopted by the two Houses.

Subsequently, by concurrent Communications issued by the Honourable Speakers of the two Houses, the consideration of the proposals contained in the Report relating to proposed amendments to the Constitution had been referred jointly to the National Assembly Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs and the Senate Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights for consideration. The Committees were given a timeline of forty-five (45) days to table their Report in the two Houses.

The Co-Chairperson (Senate JLAHRC) noted that the two Committees were well placed to consider the matter and render advice to the two Houses on how best to actualise the recommendations contained in the NADCO Report on amendments to the Constitution.

The Members were taken through the Meeting Brief and, during deliberations, observed that -

- a) the National Dialogue Committee had submitted nine (9) Bills to Parliament, being one (1) Bill to amend the Constitution, and eight (8) Bills to amend existing statutes or enact new ones;
- b) of the eight (8) Bills, four (4) Bills each were to be introduced in either House of Parliament;
- c) in the case of the National Assembly, the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (Amendment) Bill, 2024 and the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (Amendment) Bill, 2024 had since been published and read a First Time, while the Leader of Opposition Bill, 2024 and the National Government Coordination (Amendment) Bill, 2024 would await enactment of the proposed amendments to the Constitution;
- d) in the case of the Senate, the four Bills were in the process of publication, namely, the Elections Offences (Amendment) Bill, 2024, the Elections (Amendment) Bill, 2024, the Statutory Instruments (Amendment) Bill, 2024 and the Political Parties (Amendment) Bill, 2024; and
- e) the concurrent Communications from the Speakers of the two Houses had directed the Committees to deliberate on the framework for actualization of the recommendations of the National Dialogue Committee for amendment to the Constitution and to submit a Report to the Houses within forty-five (45) days.

The Committees further observed that –

- a) while the framework for implementation of the two-thirds gender principle in Parliament was one of the issues that the National Dialogue Committee (NADCO) had been tasked to address, the Committee recommended that the Multi-Sectoral Working Group (MSWG) on the Implementation of the Two-Thirds Gender Principle to recommend to Parliament a framework for the implementation of the two-thirds gender Principle; and
- b) the MSWG had since submitted its Report to Parliament, together with three legislative proposals: the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill, 2024, the Elections (Amendment) Bill, 2024, and the Political Parties (Amendment) Bill, 2024.

Following deliberations, the Committees resolved –

- i) to consider the Report of the MSWG and the legislative proposals therein alongside the NADCO Report and the legislative proposals therein;
- ii) to hold sittings every Wednesday at 10.00 am to 1.00 pm and any additional sittings and retreats as may be required to enable them to complete the assignment within timelines. The meetings would be held in hybrid format; and
- iii) to defer substantive deliberations on the proposed Bills until the next meeting, including the question whether there would be need to invite or engage external experts.

The Committees further directed the Secretariat to –

- a) prepare a detailed brief on the issues as framed, including –
 - i) whether the proposed amendments to the Constitution could be processed as one Bill or as multiple Bills;
 - ii) whether the amendments could be processed through Parliamentary Initiative and whether there were matters that required a referendum;
 - iii) the nature and extent of public participation to be undertaken;
 - iv) the procedure to be followed in consideration of the Constitutional amendment Bill(s) by the two Houses; and
 - v) limitations of time as set out in the Constitution, statutes, or the Standing Orders on the processing of Constitutional amendment Bills, and whether these could be varied or waived by resolutions of the Houses.
- b) avail to all Members bound volumes of the complete NADCO Report and the MSWG Report, including the legislative proposals therein; and
- c) prepare a draft work plan for consideration at the next meeting.

The Co-Chairperson (Senate JLAHRC) noted that he needed to consult his Members further to discuss their availability for the proposed report writing retreat.





The Chairperson called the meeting to order at twenty-nine minutes past ten O'clock and opened with a word of prayer. This was followed by a self-introduction session by Members of the two Committees and the Secretariat.

MIN. NO. JS/12/2024 ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The agenda of the meeting was adopted having been proposed by Hon. Francis Kajwang' Tom Joseph, MP and seconded by Sen. Fatuma Adan Dullo, CBS, MP.

MIN.NO. JS/13/2024 FRAMEWORK FOR ACTUALIZATION OF THE PROPOSALS TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION AS CONTAINED IN THE REPORTS OF THE NATIONAL DIALOGUE COMMITTEE AND THE MULTI-SECTORAL WORKING GROUP ON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE TWO-THIRDS GENDER PRINCIPLE

The two Committees re-convened to harmonize their positions on the proposed framework for actualization of the recommendations for amendment to the Constitution as contained in the Reports of the National Dialogue Committee (NADCO) and the Multi-Sectoral Working Group on the Implementation of the Two-Thirds Gender Principle (MSWG). In this regard, the joint sitting was taken through a matrix indicating the positions of the two Committees on the proposed constitutional amendments.

During deliberations-

- i) the Committees agreed that the proposal to oblige State and public offers to obey court orders as provided in Clause 2 of the NADCO recommendations was already addressed sufficiently in the Contempt of Court Act, Cap 8F and there

- was therefore no need to include it as a constitutional amendment;
- ii) Members concurred with the provisions of clauses 3 to 6 as recommended by NADCO;
 - iii) Members noted that the proposal to include the deregistration of a Member of Parliament as contained in clauses 9 and 25 was too draconian with far reaching implications and there was need to retain the provisions on deeming as contained in Article 103(1)(e)(i) of the Constitution. The Committees thus agreed to strengthen the provisions on deeming, including providing sufficient safeguards during conduct of disciplinary proceedings by political parties;
 - iv) it was observed that the proposal in Clause 10 of the NADCO recommendation was not feasible as Kenyan representatives in international legislative bodies were catered for under the respective treaties;
 - v) on the proposal to entrench special funds in the Constitution, the Committees concurred with the proposal, and further resolved that the proposed Senate Oversight Fund be renamed the Parliamentary Oversight Fund, to be administered by the Parliamentary Service Commission; and
 - vi) on the proposals by the Multi-Sectoral Working Group on the implementation of the two-thirds gender principle, Members agreed that the amendments be merged into one Bill with those proposed by NADCO. The Committees further resolved to delete Clause 5 of the Bill which proposed immediate implementation of the principle and proposed that the same be implemented after the next general elections.

Thereafter, it was resolved that the Secretariat finalizes on the harmonized draft report for consideration by the Committees at the next meeting to be held on Wednesday, 4th December, 2024 at 10.00 am.


