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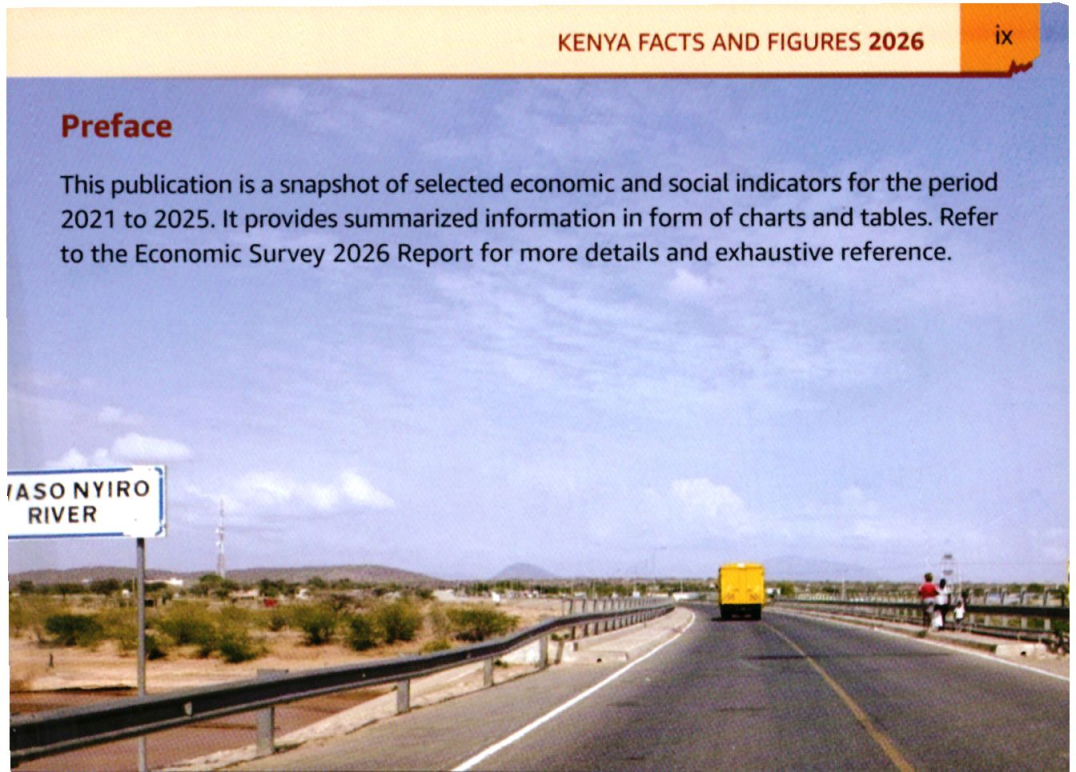
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Preface

The Bureau is committed to upholding values of Professionalism, Integrity, Confidentiality, Customer focus, Innovation and Team work (PICCIT) as the guiding principles in production of statistics.



MISSION

Provide, manage and promote quality statistics through utilization of best practices for public use.

Mandate

To collect, analyze and disseminate statistical information. The Bureau is also the custodian of official statistical information, and coordinator of the National Statistical System.

The Organization of KNBS

The management of the Bureau is vested in The Board of Directors. The Director General is the Chief Executive Officer of KNBS and Secretary to the Board.

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics further organized into five Directorates namely:

- **Corporate Services**
- **Macroeconomic Statistics**
- **Population and Social Statistics**
- **Production Statistics**
- **Statistical Coordination and Methods**

1. National Executive

- i. The National Executive comprises of the President, the Deputy President, and the Cabinet. The President is the Head of State and Government, the Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, the chairperson of the National Security Council and a symbol of National Unity.
- ii. The President exercises Executive Authority of the Republic with the assistance of The Deputy President and Cabinet Secretaries.
- iii. The Constitution of Kenya provides that the Cabinet comprises of the President, the Deputy President, the Attorney General, and a minimum of 14 to a maximum of 22 Cabinet secretaries.

2. The Parliament

Parliament consists of the National Assembly and the Senate.

a). The National Assembly

The National Assembly comprises of:

- i. Elected members from each of the 290 constituencies
- ii. Women Representatives elected from each of the 47 counties

- iii. Twelve Nominated members representing the special groups
- iv. The Speaker who is an Ex-officio member.

b). The Senate

The Senate comprises of:

- i. Elected members from each of the 47 counties
- ii. Sixteen Nominated women representatives
- iii. Two Nominated members, a man and a woman, representing the youth
- iv. Two Nominated members representing persons with disability
- v. The Speaker who is an Ex-officio member.

3. The Judiciary

The Judiciary consists of:

a). Superior Courts

- i. Supreme Court: It consists of the Chief Justice, The Deputy Chief Justice and five other judges and it's headed by the Chief Justice.
- ii. Court of Appeal: It consists of at least 12 judges headed by the President of the Court of Appeal.

- iii. High Court: The High Court has unlimited original jurisdiction in criminal and civil matters. It also has supervisory powers over the subordinate courts.

b). Subordinate Courts

The Subordinate courts include:

- i. The Magistrates' Courts
- ii. The Kadhis Courts
- iii. The Courts Martial
- iv. Any other court or local Tribunal as may be established by an Act of Parliament.

4. The County Governments

The County Government of each County consist of a County Executive and a County Assembly.

a). County Assembly

The County Assembly consists of:

- i. Elected members from wards

- ii. Special Seat Members to ensure no more than two-thirds of the Membership of the assembly are of the same gender
- iii. Nominated Members of Marginalized groups including people living with disability and the Youth
- iv. Speaker who is EX-officio member.

b). County Executive

The executive authority of the county is vested in, and exercised by, a county executive committee. The County Executive committee consists of:

- i. The County Governor and The Deputy Governor
- ii. Other Members of the County Executive Committee appointed by the County Governor.

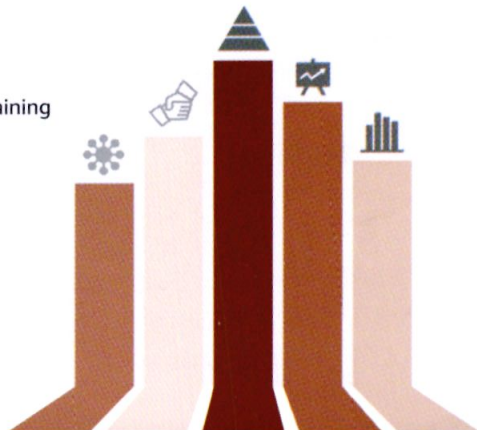

Figure 1: GDP at Current Market Prices, 2025

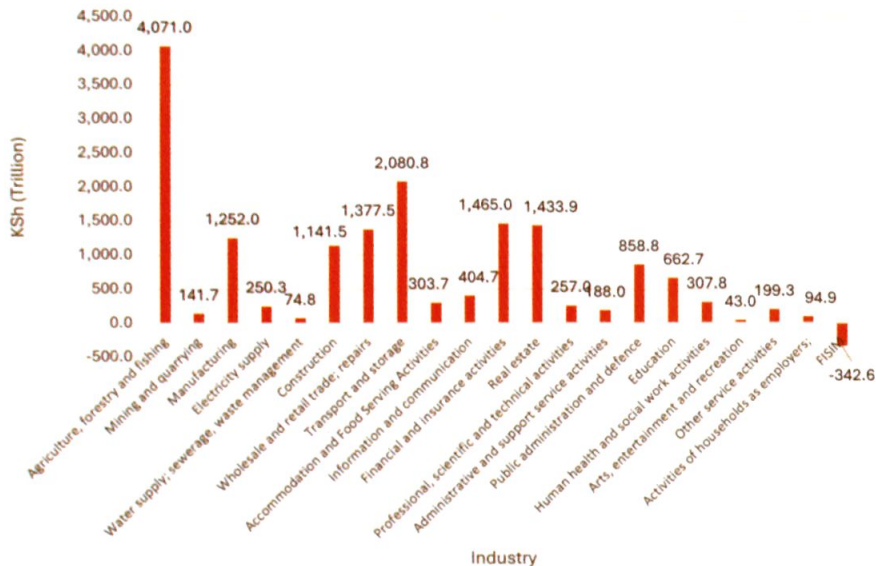

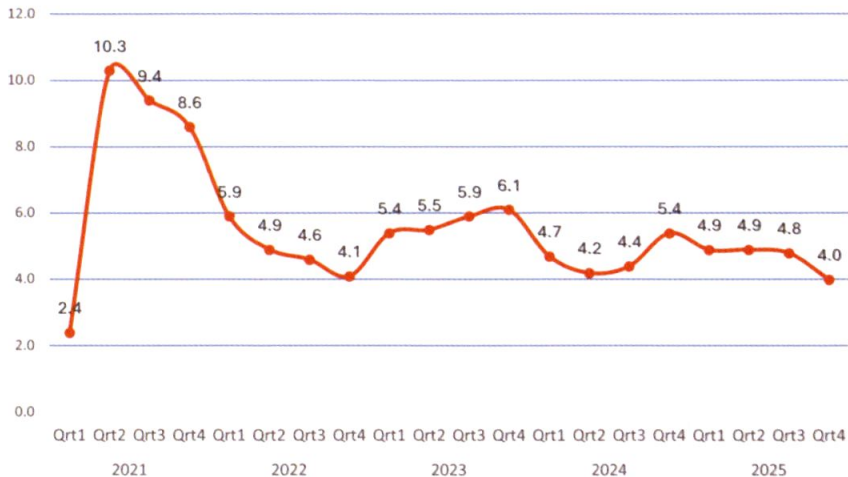

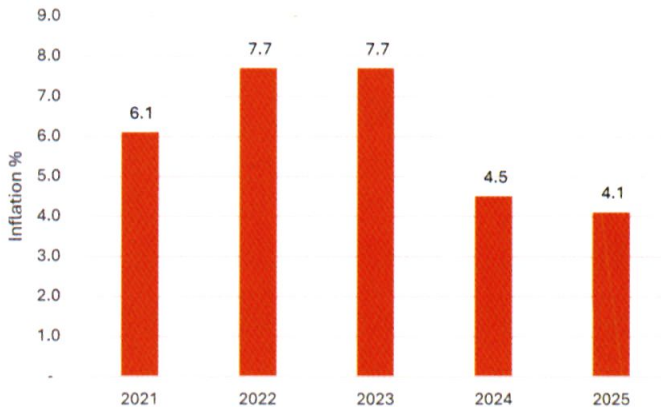
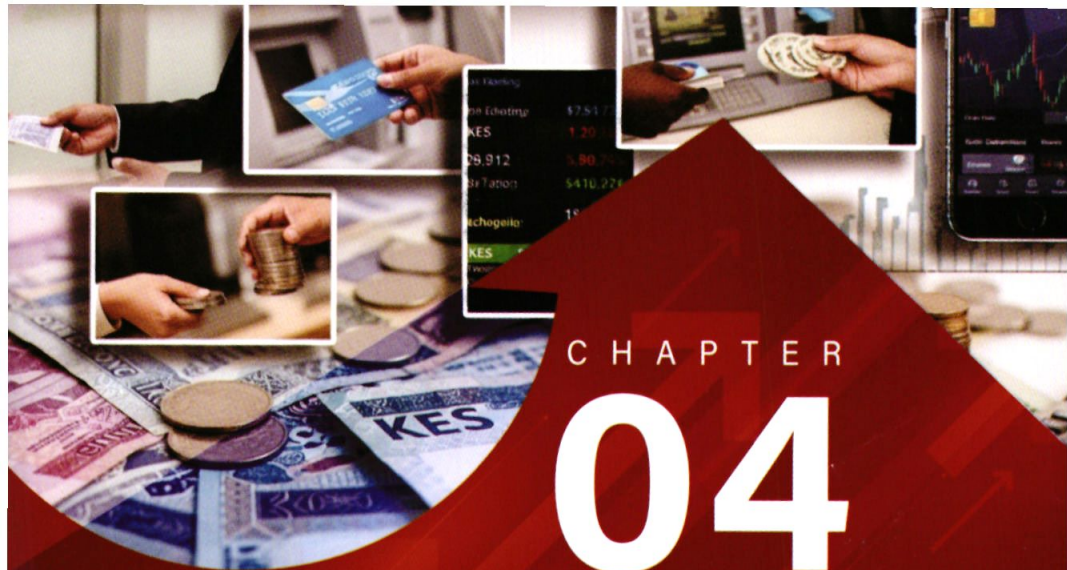
Figure 3: Trends in Annual Inflation, 2021 – 2025

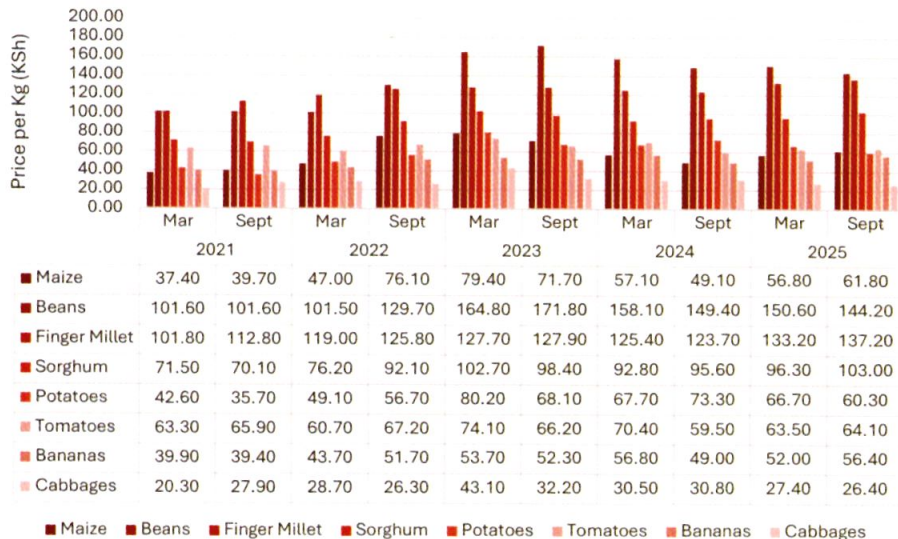

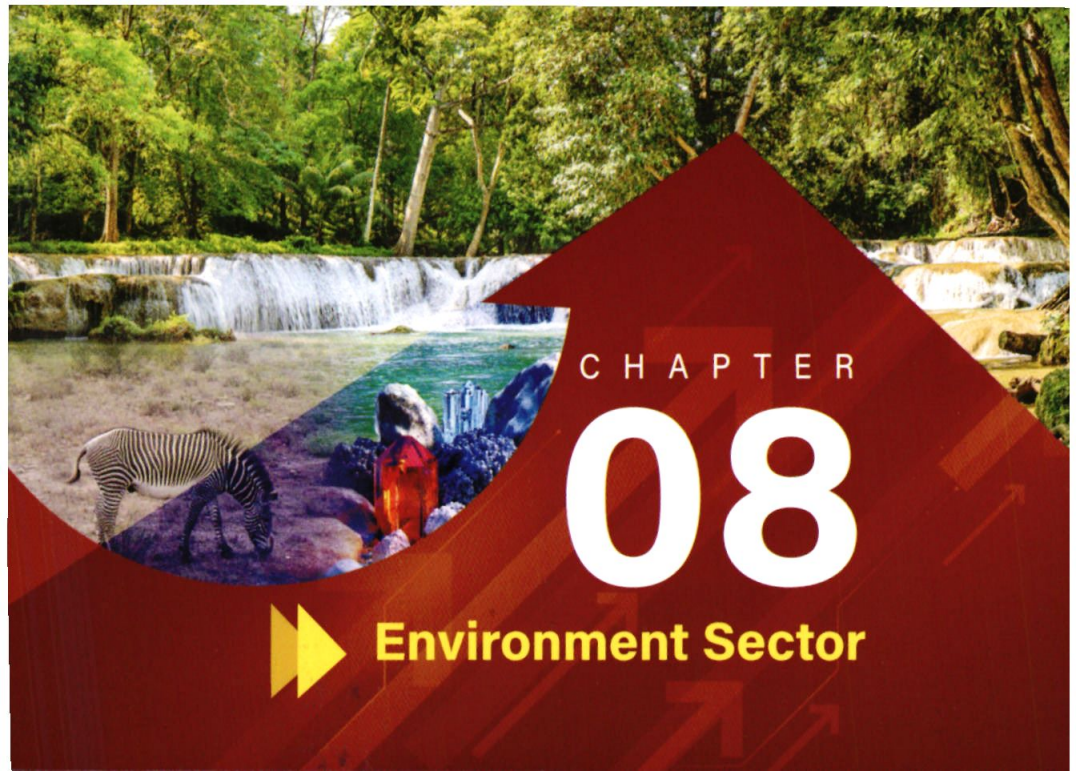

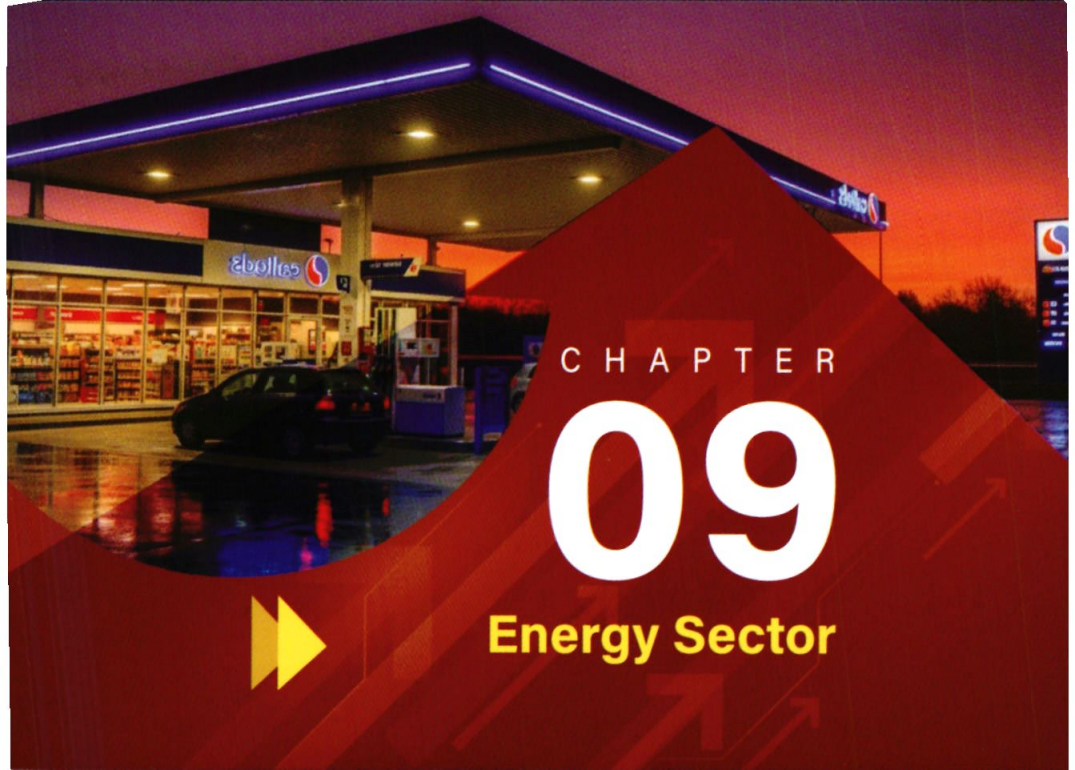

Figure 7: Total Supply and Domestic Demand for Electricity, 2021 – 2025

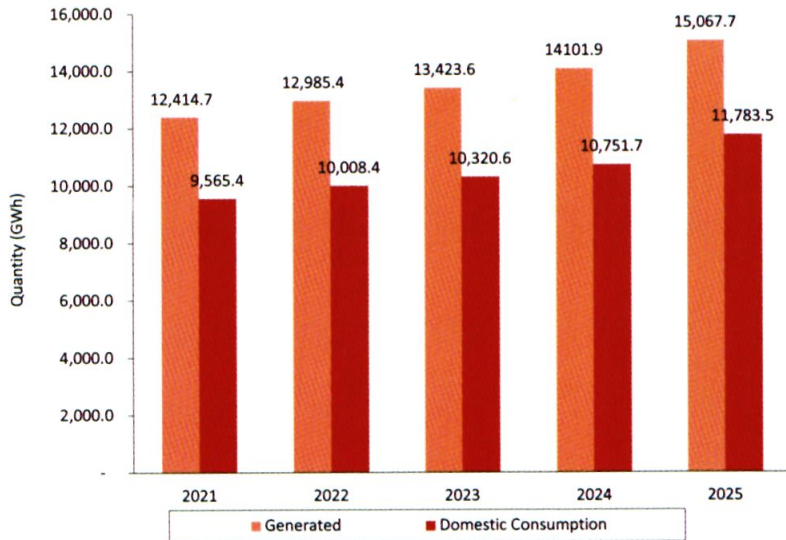

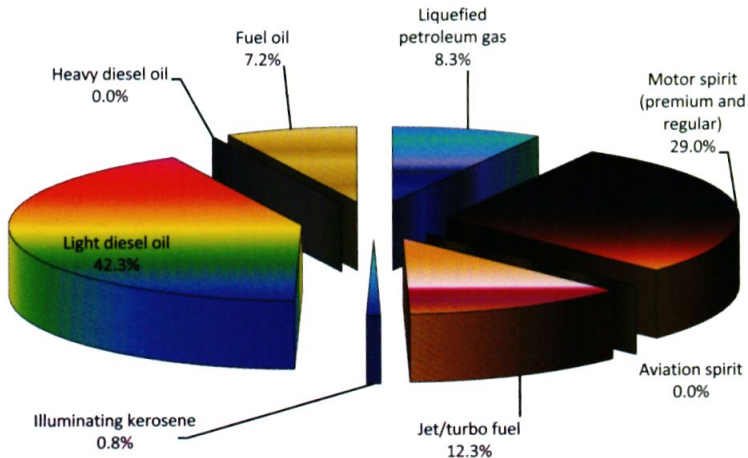
Figure 8: Share of Petroleum Demand by Fuel Category, 2025

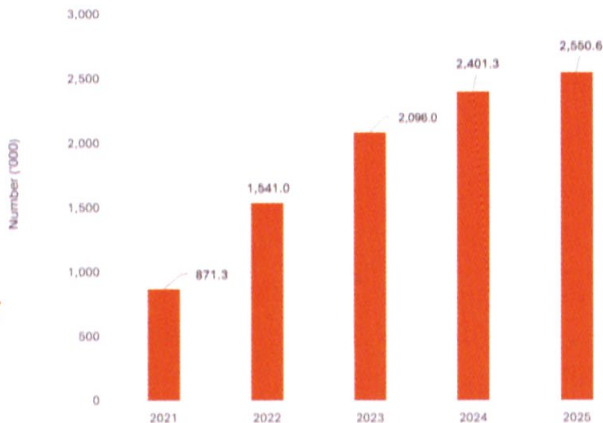

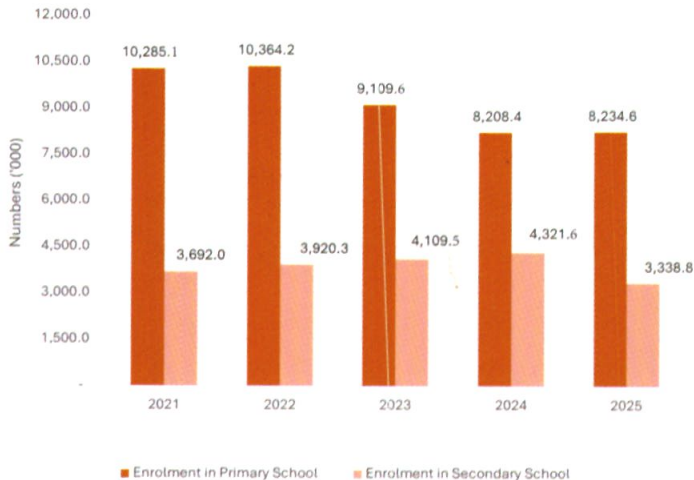

Figure 12: Education Budget as a percentage of Total Government Budget, 2021/22 - 2025/26

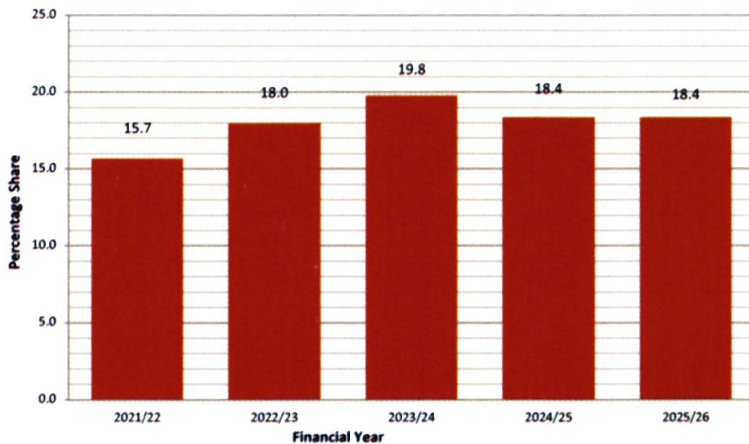

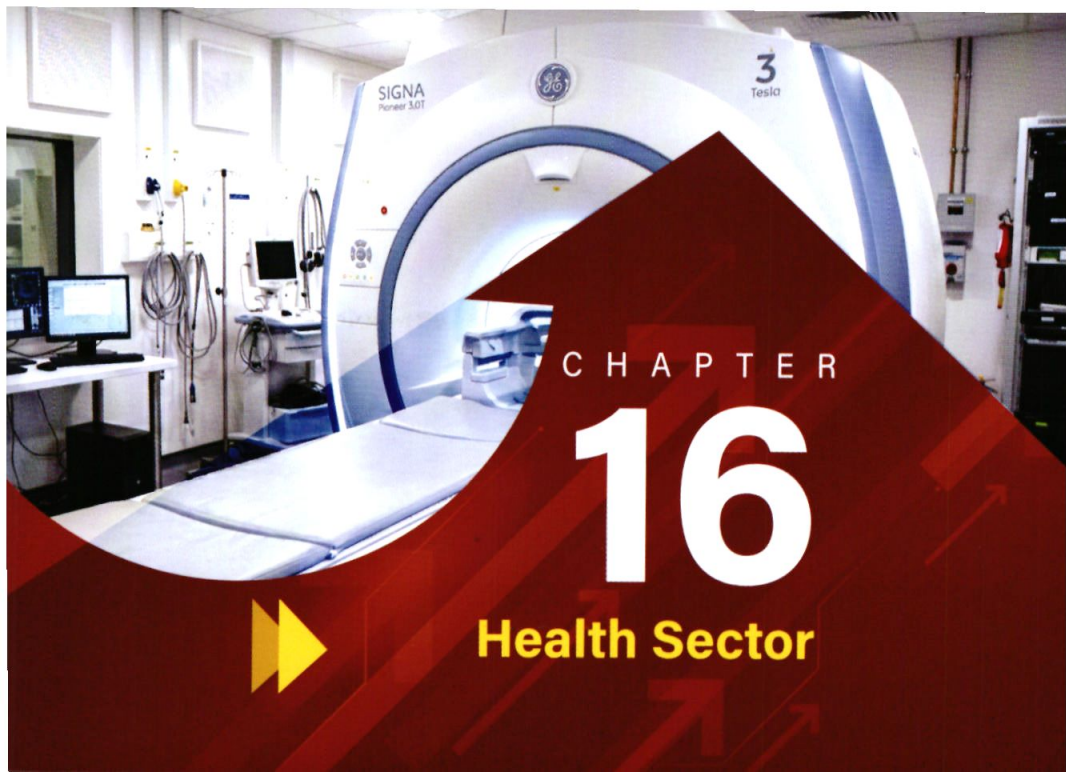

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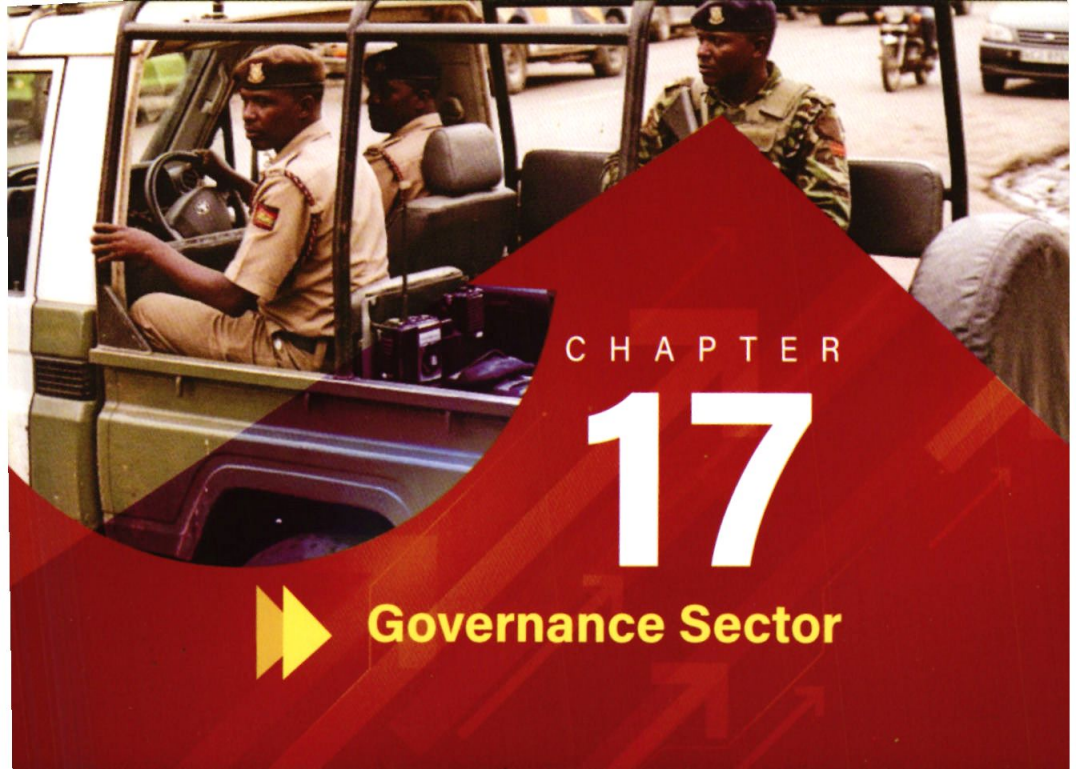
