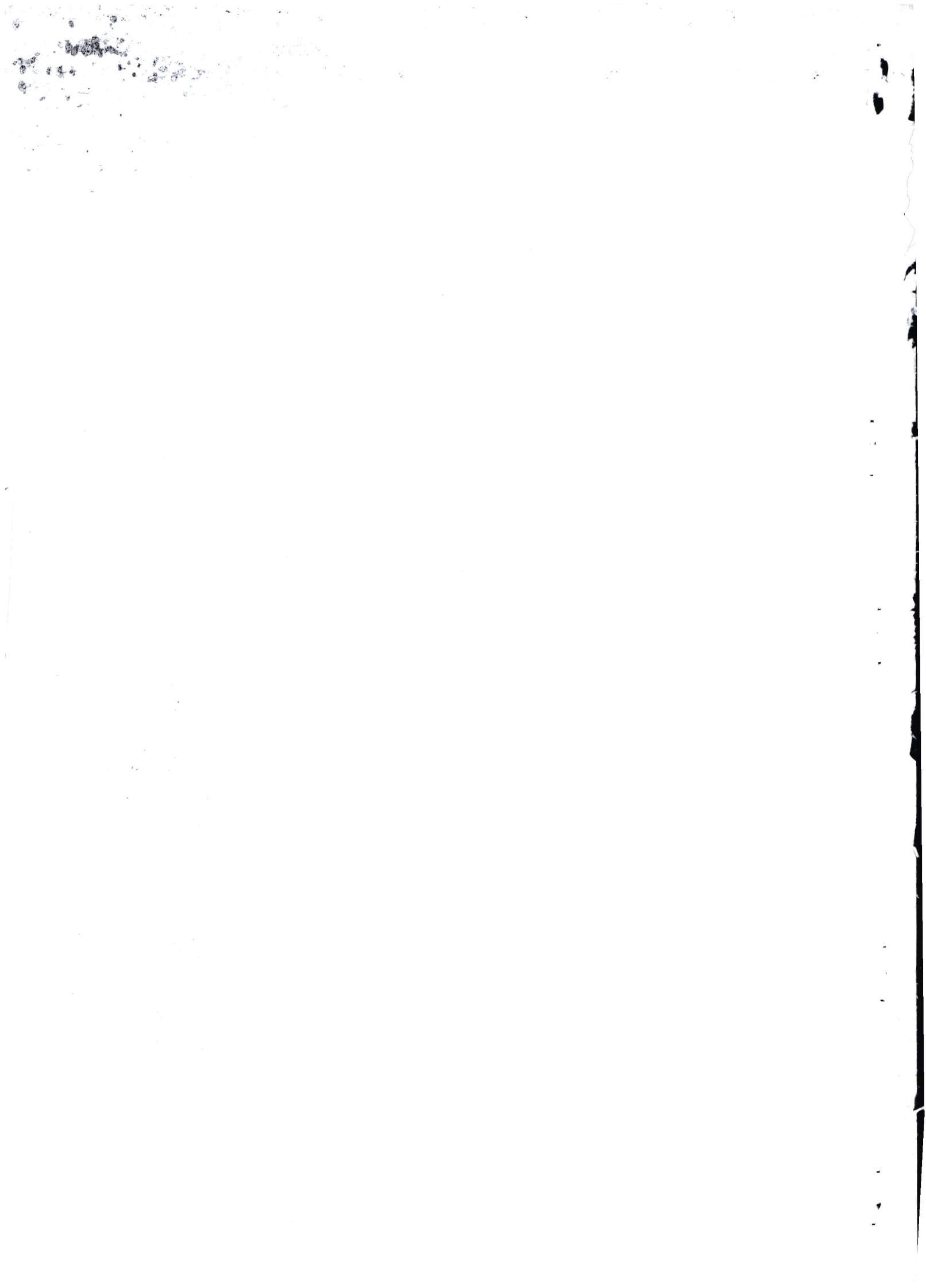


Dear Sir,

Re: Community Presidential Project Petition Request for immediate project operation, investigations and prosecutions regarding Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP) sabotage and compromise & design change.

Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP) is a multi-million state funded public benefitting project by the State Ministry of Water & Sanitation in May 2016, through Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as the project client, and whose Project Committee is Misemwa Community Water Users Association (MWUA), a rural Water Service Provider (WSP), registered with the Registrar of Societies, and which is the Community Based Organization of the year 2015/2016 under LVNWSB jurisdiction of 8 counties, based in Misemwa Sub-location of Ndivisi Division. The project area of coverage has a target population of over 38,742 people currently, being within but not limited to; Misemwa, Wabukhonyi, Nabikoto and Musembe sub-locations of Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations in Bungoma East and Kimilili Sub-counties respectively, being in respect of the formal project advertised 12.5km distribution lines dated 5th August 2016.

The said community project is currently facing conspired sabotage of the highest order by two state administrators serving under the Executive office of the president: one David Wanyonyi, Deputy County Commissioner (DCC) of Molo Sub County and one Lorna Wanyonyi, formerly the Assistant chief of Nabikoto sub location and the yet-to-be inaugurated chief appointee of Kamukuywa Location, being jointly with their immediate family members and others. Moreso, there's conspired project compromise & design change by Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB), as respectively indicated above and as per the attached hereto committee/community petitions' request letter (previously forwarded to the DPP and others including the Head of Public Service, Executive Office of the President), dated 23rd Sept 2019, (i.e. annex B), complete with

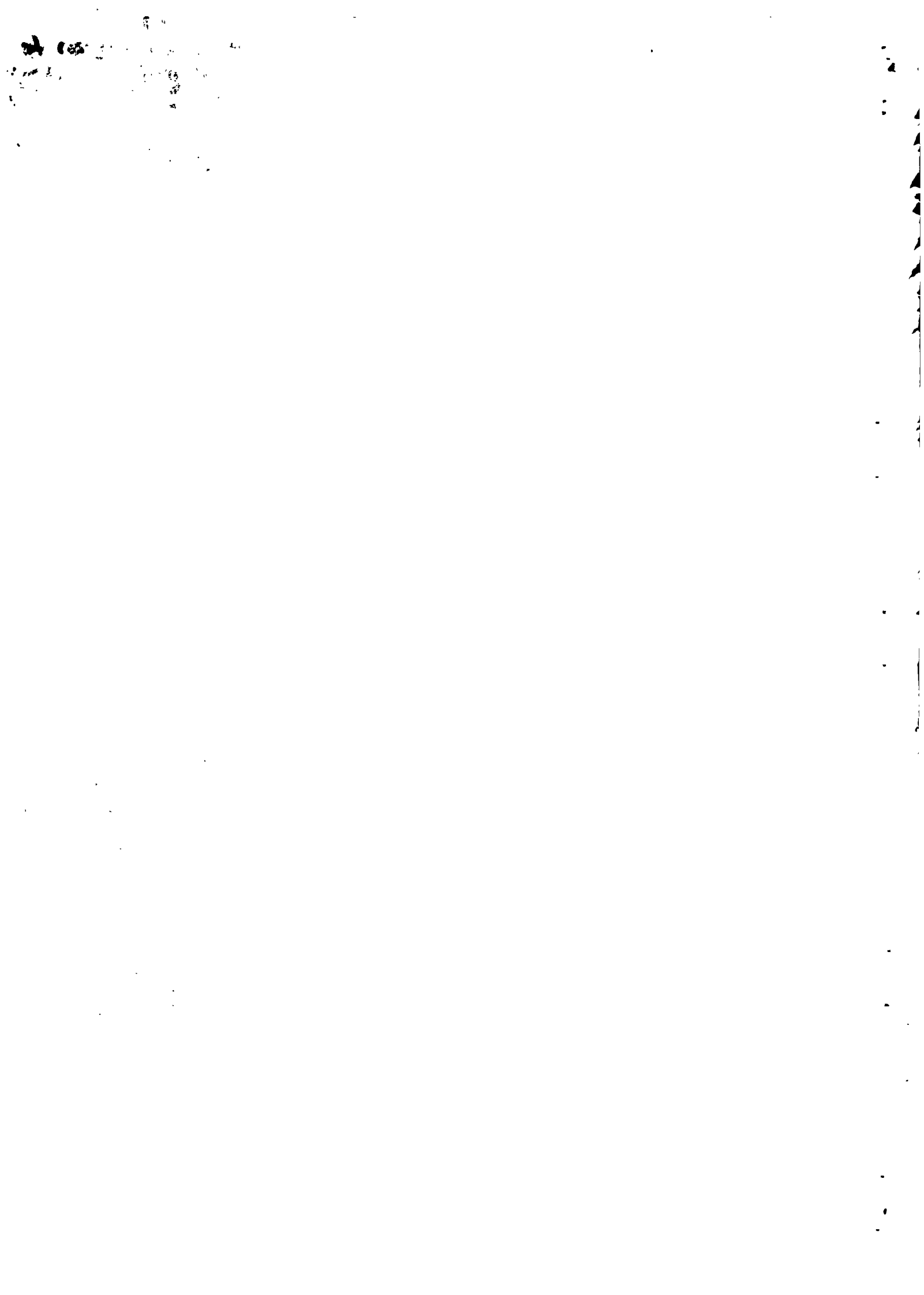


comprehensive committee/community project petition reports dated 17th June 2019 and 24th August 2018, annexed with introductory project documents.

Thus following the project committee's resolutions dated 13th Nov 2019 and 23rd Dec 2019 (i.e. annex A2) being in respect of the project beneficiary community stakeholders resolutions dated 4th Oct 2019 and 16th Oct 2019 (i.e. annex A3 & A4) respectively, complete with the said project community beneficiary petitioners lists dated 13th Nov 2019 (i.e. annex A1). Hence your urgent attention and action is hereby humbly drawn to your Honourable Executive Office as above petitioned, inline with your constitutional mandate of being the Chief *Executive Custodian of Government funds and resources*, as below categorically stated and further comprehensively concluded without *fear or favour*:

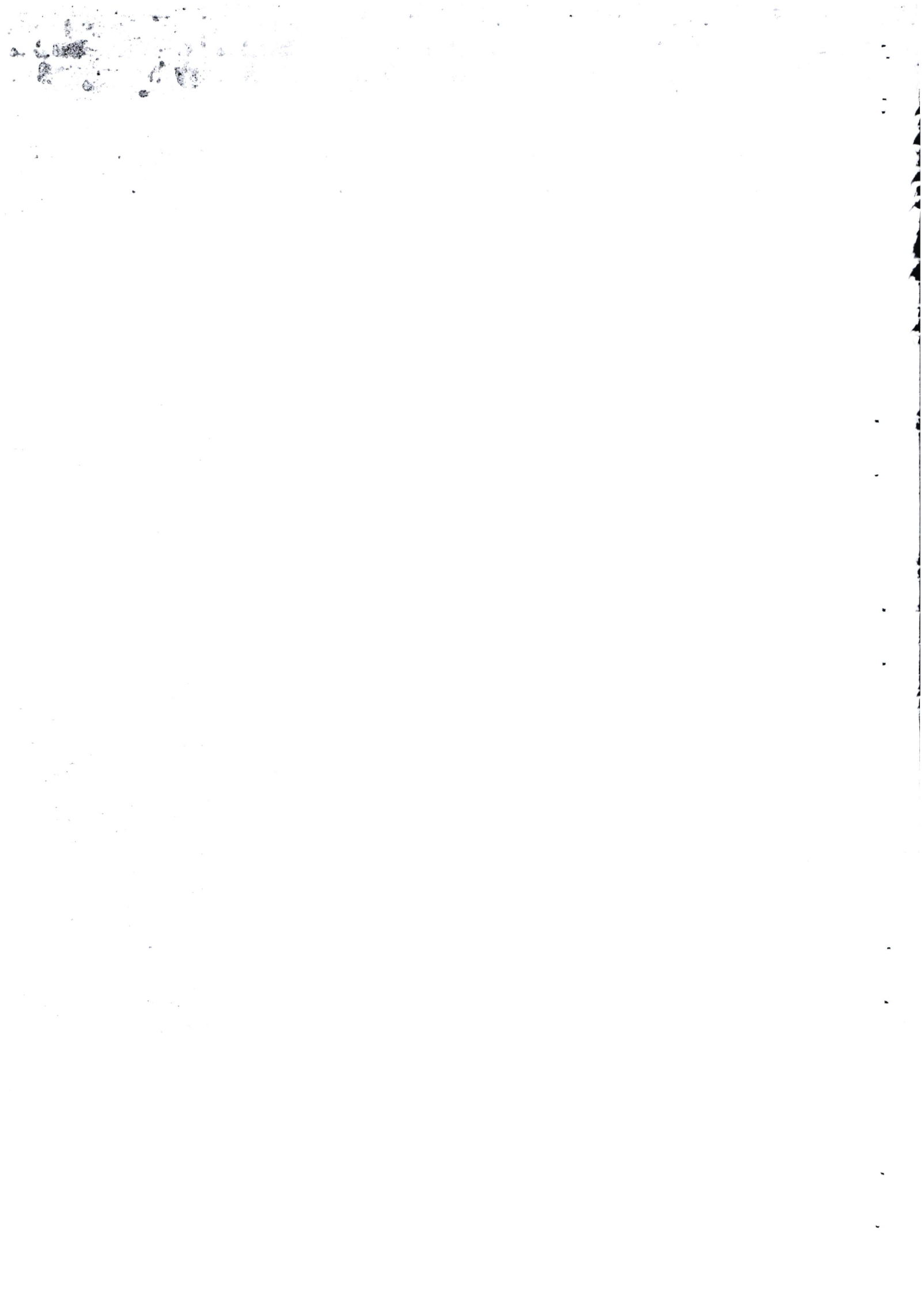
Firstly, that Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi, (as the project case-plaintiffs) and other immediate family members including; Deputy County Commissioner (DCC) of Molo Sub County David Wanyonyi, former Assistant chief of Nabikoto sub location Lorna Wanyonyi, Kennedy Wanyonyi, Advocate Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi, among others, jointly with Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde (i.e. project whole land parcel owner), Land Registrar of Bungoma County, being jointly with others, conspired to sabotage Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP) through malicious secret project two acre land ownership change on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, being long after government project completion, only awaiting power transformer installation by Kenya Power & Lighting Company (KPLC), Eldoret Office.

- ✓ **Your Excellency sir**, take note that the project land ownership fraud was secretly executed despite the fact that the immediate project area Ass. Chief for Misemwa sub-location, one Stuart Wafula, had in April 2018, literally advised and cautioned Nancy Wanyonyi's sons, one DCC David Wanyonyi and another Kennedy Wanyonyi of the existing and concluded government funded water supply project facilities, complete with a binding legally witnessed project two acre land sale agreement, as having been occasioned and facilitated by the very Ass. Chief's office jointly with Ass. County Commissioner's (ACC) office of Ndivisi Division. Hence the petitioners' request for objective project sabotage investigations and prosecution of the said state administrator jointly with others for further conspiracy to undermine the aforementioned Assistant chief's advance caution and/or office as such.



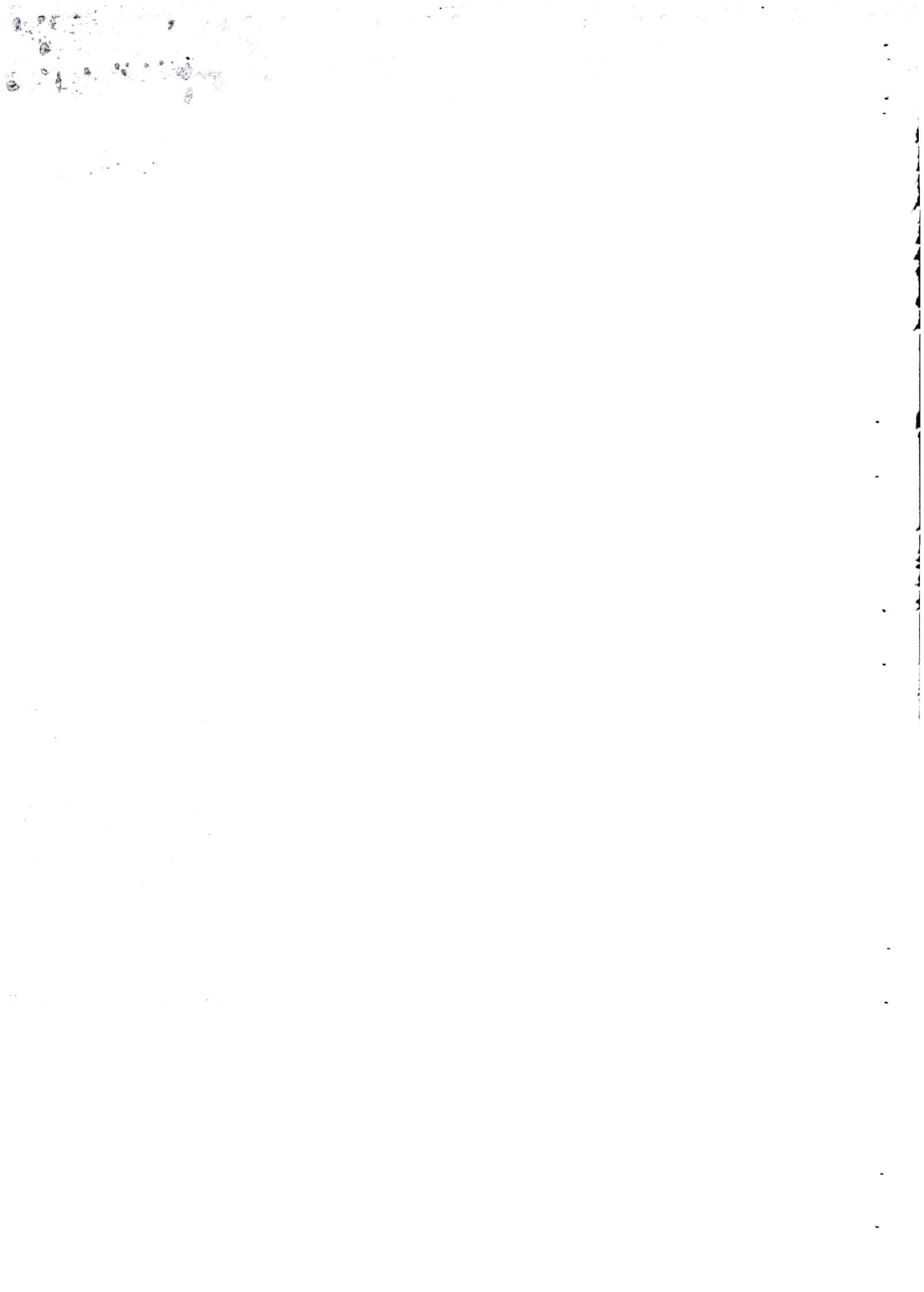
- ✓ It's hereby candidly indicated that family members-DCC David Wanyonyi and Kennedy Wanyonyi jointly with others unlawfully obstructed Namarambi Community Water Supply Project on 25th Nov 2018, shortly after the installation of the delayed power transformer and incited their senior family members Nancy Wanyonyi & Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi through a family conspiracy meeting on the same date (as reflected in the committee petition report dated 17th June 2019- Bulletin 9 upto 22), who later on filed a malicious court dispute dated 18th Dec 2018, by misleading the Environment & Land senior Principal Magistrates' court-Kimilili, alluding project trespass on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 contrary to prevailing project documents/records complete with the land owner's consent via binding legally witnessed project two acre land sale agreement as such.

- ✓ **Your Excellency sir**, be further informed that the said public project was procedually implemented upto its conclusion in December 2017, devoid of any such objection, as hereunder quoted from the project committee's presidential multi state agencies petition report dated 17th June 2019 (i.e. report recommendation xiii on page 21): "That ironically, the said malicious and unlawful project obstruction dated 25th Nov 2018 was interestingly executed shortly after installation of the delayed project power transformer on 21st Nov 2018, thus previously there wasn't any such allegation of project trespass before, during and after project implementation phases, of which project **pre-implementation** period factored: seven key sensitization forums dated between 3rd June to 5th August 2016, formal project survey dated 15th June 2016, official project advertisement (i.e. East African Standard Newspaper on page 35) dated 5th August 2016, and complete with one major project stakeholders meeting hosted by Kamukuywa Division-Assistant County Commissioner dated 18th August 2016; **project implementation period** further factored several crucial project forums being: Public Project contractor availing ceremony dated 28th Oct 2016, Public Project land sale meeting dated 7th April 2017, Public Project participation for Environmental Impact Assessment meeting dated 31st May 2017, Honourable John Musakali public community connectivity meeting dated 31st July 2017, Institutions water pipeline expansion meeting dated 30th Nov 2017, 26 months project stakeholders public briefing petition meeting dated 24th August 2018, among others, hence all these public forums being without any objection and of which all project coverage local state



administrators were aware of the project, being; both Ndivisi and Kamukuywa Divisions ACCs –Monica Muli and Francis Karuri respectively; chiefs; Patrick Khisa and Eliud Kisiangani for both Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations respectively, and Assistant chiefs; Stuart Wafula, Wilson Mumaina, Lorna Wanyonyi and Francis Tawai, being for Misemwa, Wabukhonyi, Nabikoto and Musembe sub locations respectively, hence the malicious secret project land ownership change; malicious unlawful project obstruction; malicious unlawful project court case among others, are acts being highly suspicious and questionable, thus the recommendation for all inclusive investigations and prosecutions of persons involved for purposes of serving as a public example and future reference inline with the security and value for public funds as such.”

Secondly, its worth to note that the petitioners do hereby strongly question and contest the validity of the project court dispute, terming it as being **Project justice on trial** and as **a predetermined conspiracy** to sabotage a valid tax payers public project, being in respect of project community stakeholders resolutions dated 4th October 2019 and 16th October 2019 respectively. Ironically, the project case was filed under certificate of urgency but it dragged on for a record six months before ruling to determine its validity on 16th May 2019, thus its candidly revealed that the former Senior Principal Magistrate, Land & Environment Kimilili Law courts, one Honourable Onyango, technically and maliciously declined to admit submissions by counsel to the 1st Respondent prior to the said determination, and to the least of expectations, the aforementioned judicial officer proceeded to tactically and suspiciously declare the case as being valid under unclear circumstances, based on flimsy grounds and allegations of contradicting defense dates, among others, without any such reference and/or confirmation to the attached prevailing supporting project defense documents and records, thus occasioning project delayed and/or denied justice process by abusing the court to sabotage the fight against impunity and/or corruption, at the expense of the suffering petitioning community beneficiaries, being a violation of their constitutional right to clean, safe & affordable water by the state, hence the abuse of said justice corridor to safeguard private selfish interests at the expense of the desired overwhelming project public gain/interests and value for public funds.

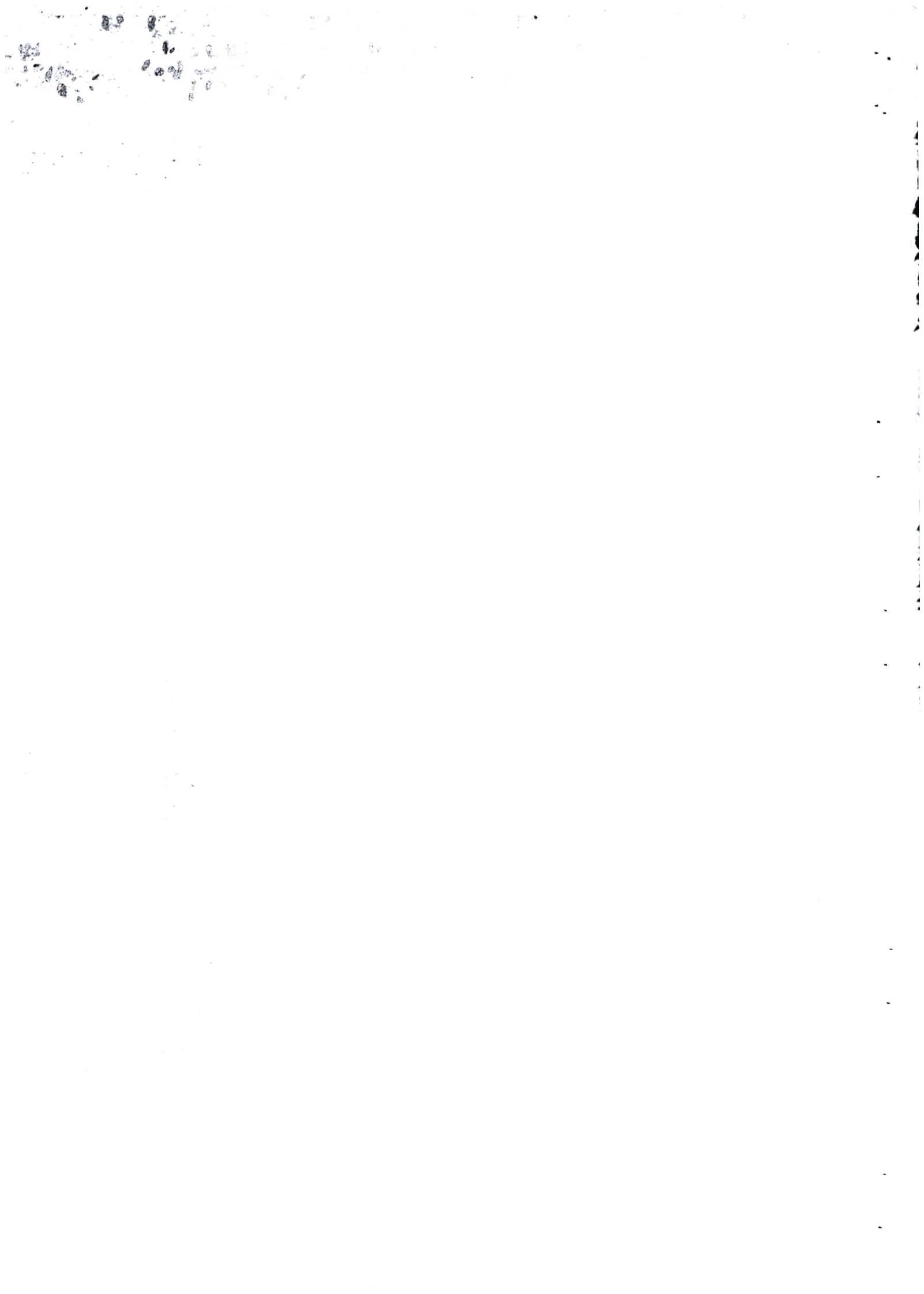


Thirdly, Kenya Power & Lighting Company (KPLC), Webuye office jointly with others, conspired to sabotage the said public project by withdrawing the already installed project power transformer on 5th Feb 2019, suspiciously under unclear circumstances, without any such formal or otherwise communication to the project client, contractor, the committee and the local state administration as per the rules of procedure. Hence adding salt to injury in consideration of the affected beneficiary many public institutions and lots of households, in respect of the previous prolonged 2018/2019 severe drought and the current community high water demand that has already cost heavily on time and money.

Fourthly, Your Excellency, the petitioners further highlight Namarambi Community Water Supply Project compromise and/or design change by the project client, being Lake Victoria North Water Services Board jointly with others, contrary to the advertised 12.5 km distribution lines, courtesy of the said board's compromised 7km project sketch map including the project 2km Rising Main(i.e. annex A5), contrary to the surveyed and formally advertised 12.5km original project sketch map as was annexed to the previous request letter to the DPP & others. To date, only 9km distribution lines incomplete with substandard works and materials was undertaken despite successive formal communication to the project client by the project committee regarding waterline deficit. Ironically, the board's Technical Manager-Community Development, indicates in the board's defense documents of the ongoing project court dispute, that as at project works completion in December 2017, the project contractor had already demanded for payment of 13.4km distribution lines and 2km Rising Main, among others, thus projecting an alarming waterline deficit of 4.4km on the ground among others.

Fifth, It is of great concern to likewise note that the project committee has been denied project monitoring funds all along the whole project implementation period, despite various formal requests and consultations, only resulting into verbal unfulfilled promises by the board as the project client over the same. The petitioners therefore demand for justice as such, relating to the project committee's project implementation obligations jointly with the project coverage local state administrators and crucial stakeholders, as was unanimously resolved by the project community stakeholders meetings dated 24th August 2018 and 16th October 2019 respectively.

Lastly, Your Excellency, the petitioners finally pray for your Executive and/or



personal input towards Namarambi Community Water Supply project (NCWSP) ambitious expansion programme, following various project expansion forums, as was tabulated in the community petition report dated 24th August 2018 as annexed, which culminated in an ambitious community project expansion proposal (to the then Ministry of Water & Irrigation) dated December 2017, tabulating funding request to a tune of over kshs 244 million. Hence the community's/committee's ambition for a well conserved and managed public natural safe water source to cater for the ever-ballooning community water demand, esteemed to be a lasting solution for generations. Hence the petitioners humble request for your personal input and involvement wholesome or otherwise as such.

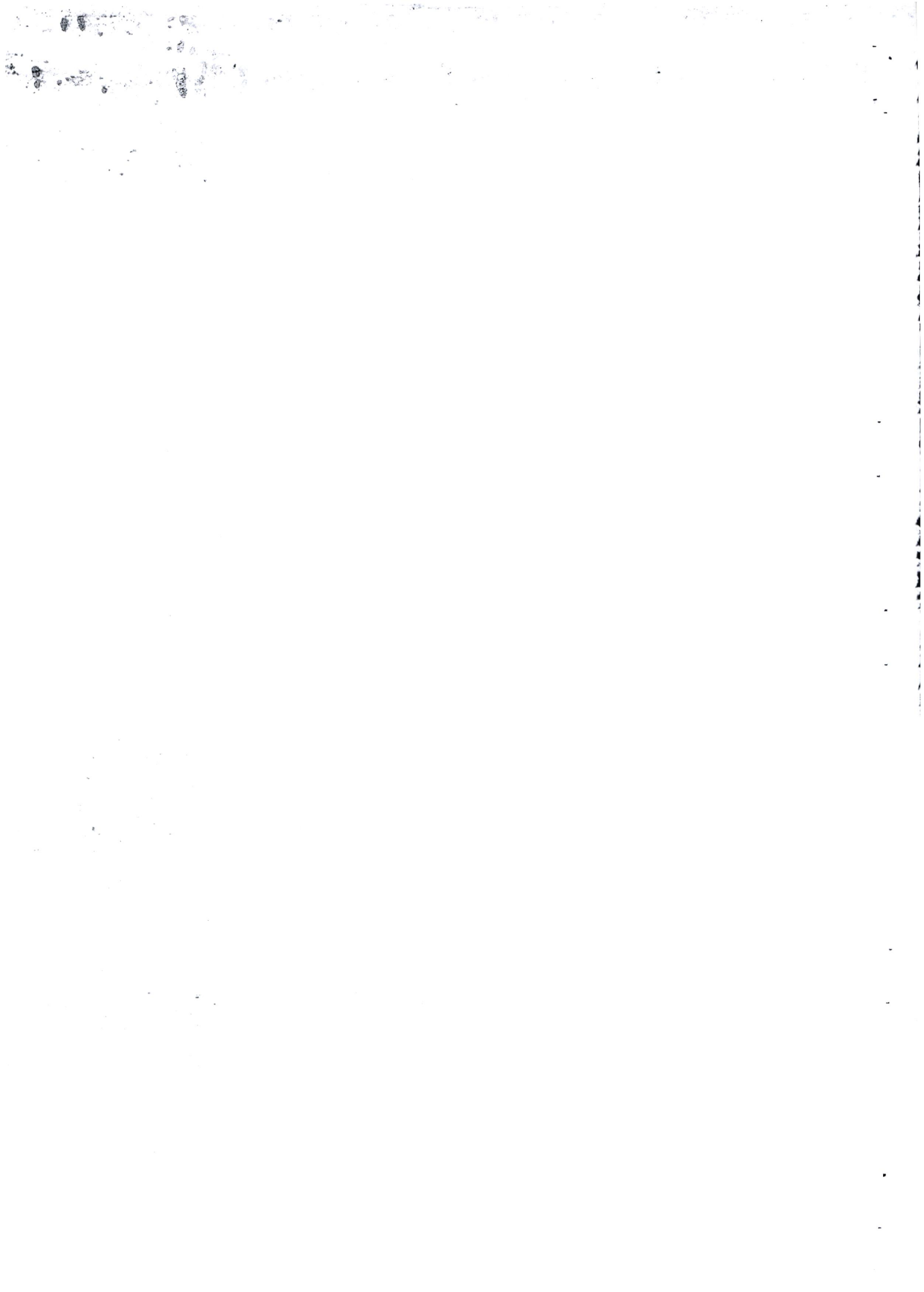
In conclusion, Your Excellency, based on the above and being inline with the previously forwarded project petition documents, it is comprehensively concluded as follows:

- i. That state administrators DCC David Wanyonyi (Molo sub county) and former Ass. Chief Lorna Wanyonyi (Nabikoto sub location), jointly with their immediate family members and others, have openly and knowingly sabotaged the very government they serve, subject to petitioners humble demand for immediate project complete justice. Take note that the said DCC Wanyonyi arrogantly and unlawfully obstructed the state government funded project using his official work station government vehicle (double cabin GK 271J) to the shock of unbelieving adjacent project intake community members, complete with phone call veiled security threats to the project chairman and contractor as indicated in the committee petition report to the DPP & others dated 17th June 2019 and interestingly, the Head of Public Service is yet to act as was petitioned! Your Excellency, is there selective application of the law in government? And do private malicious interests override public benefitting interests?
- ii. That relevant respective independent state institutions and officers have seriously failed in their mandate as was previously petitioned, by technically and tactically choosing to pretend that the project referenced matter is before a court of law, of which nobody is above the law to defeat justice by maliciously exploiting the corridors of justice. Thus petitioners kindly pray

for immediate project operation due to the prevailing uncalled for suffering to project beneficiaries, including the suspicious project vandalism so far witnessed and in line with value for public funds. Honestly, the burg stops at the suspicious declaration of the validity of the project court case dispute by the former senior principal magistrate, Kimilili Law Courts, one Hon. Onyango. Hence the project beneficiary communities of Misemwa, Wabukhonyi, Nabikoto and Musembe sub locations can't bear the project operation delay any longer, relating to community stakeholders meetings resolutions dated 4th Oct 2019 and 16th Oct 2019. In any case, project land ownership change secretly took place long after project works completion.

- ✓ Note that DCC Wanyonyi and the immediate family, held a project conspiracy meeting some few hours after the said unlawful project obstruction undertaken by the adversely mentioned DCC Wanyonyi jointly with his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi. This can be attested to the fact that DCC Wanyonyi's elder son, one Malcolm Wabwile Simiyu maliciously deposited kshs 10 to the project chairman's M-pesa account at 1:58pm on the said 25/11/2018., being to establish the said Project Chairman's official identity for malicious intentions. Your Excellency, petitioners have laid project facts bare, let's be true and honest to the spirit of transparency and accountability. Why the unethical pretence from independent state institutions and/or officers when dealing with the poor ordinary citizens infringed constitutional rights?! Candidly, petitioners opine that it's an open secret that the ongoing project court dispute is invalid from the word go, period.

- iii. That project court dispute plaintiffs jointly with others have conspired to technically and tactically delay the said project justice process. Thus petitioners hereby candidly reveal that the project contractor destined as the 3rd Respondent, formally complained (during a court mention session dated 6th June 2019) of not having been served any court orders by the plaintiffs for a record 6 ½ months! surprisingly, the senior principal magistrate in turn indicated that the very project contractor (i.e. 3rd Respondent) hadn't filed his defense, being contrary to the prevailing formally admitted/filed 3rd

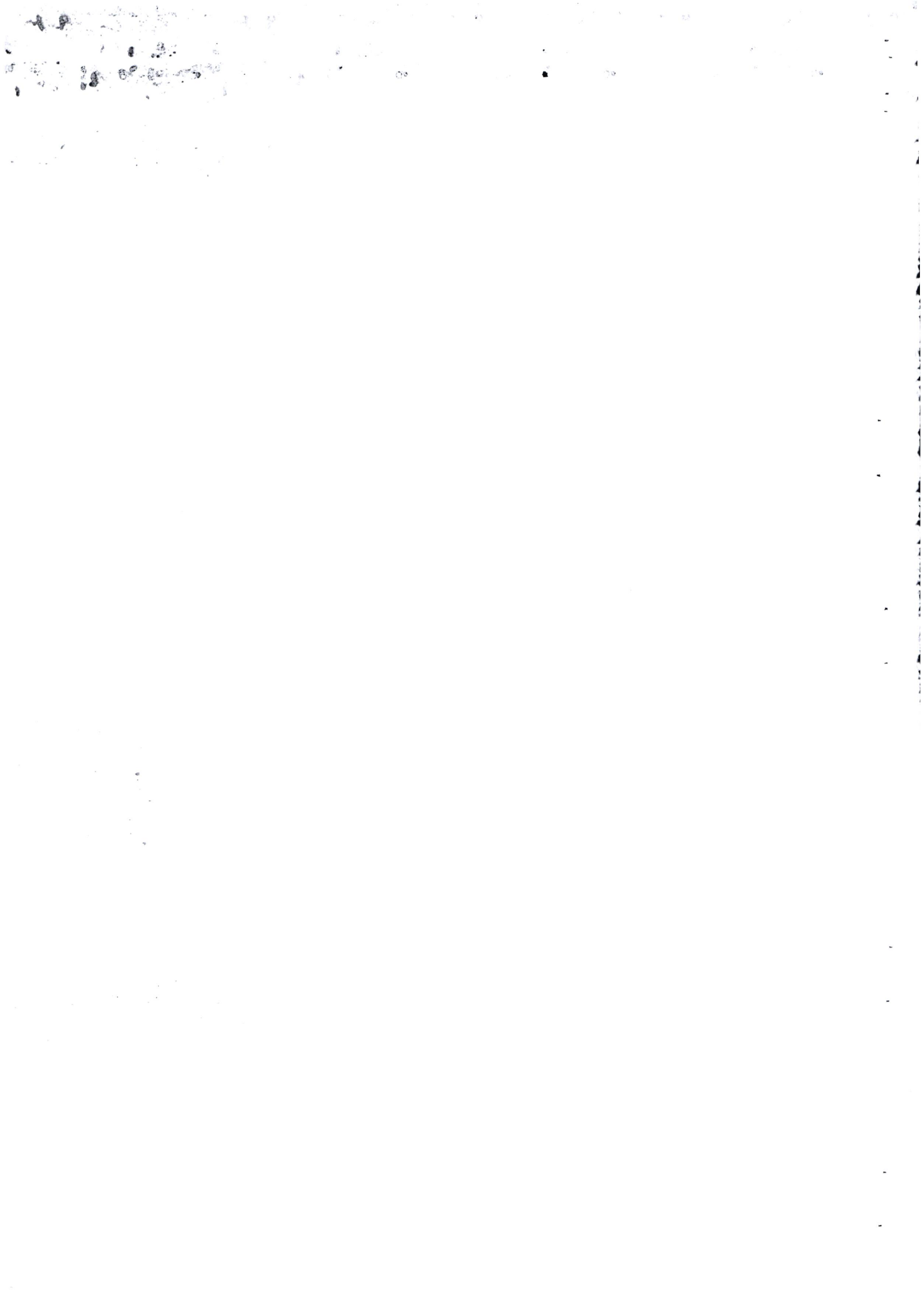
Respondent defense documents dated 6th Feb 2019, even being within the domain of the community project committee. The said contractors defense issue was hence consensually resolved during the said court session, where the project contractor (i.e. 3rd Respondent) was then directed to immediately serve the plaintiffs. Shockingly, Advocate Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi, holding brief for the counsel to the plaintiffs, who doubles as the plaintiffs immediate family member, arrogantly refused to sign and admit the 3rd Respondent defense, prompting the said project contractor to resort to registered mail service!

- ✓ Further, following counsel to the 3rd Respondent having been granted permission and filed a motion of notice requiring the former known project land owner (Japheth Wehuyi Masinde) jointly with the land Registrar (Bungoma County) to appear in court, relating to the aforementioned malicious secret project land ownership change, the plaintiffs (on 21st Nov 2019) in turn requested to amend their defense and were granted upto 6th Feb 2020. Technically, the said plaintiffs filed their amended defense prior to expiry of the allowed time, but maliciously choose not to immediately serve the Respondents, as it shockingly arose on the said court mention dated 6th Feb 2020, and further, the situation remained the same at the subsequent mention date on 5th March 2020.
 - ✓ Note that this was a malicious tactic by the plaintiffs intentionally to buy more time, delay and frustrate the project court dispute process, hence, knowingly that upon later on serving the Respondents, they were too in turn, automatically to respond over the same and thus technically occasioning further project justice process delay and project operation delay as such. To this end, who is fooling who? Technically, Your Excellency sir, the ongoing project court dispute process is wanting and flawed.
- iv. That the petitioners strongly contest the aforementioned project obstruction by the adversely mentioned DCC David Wanyonyi jointly with his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi on 25th Nov 2018, shortly after installation of the

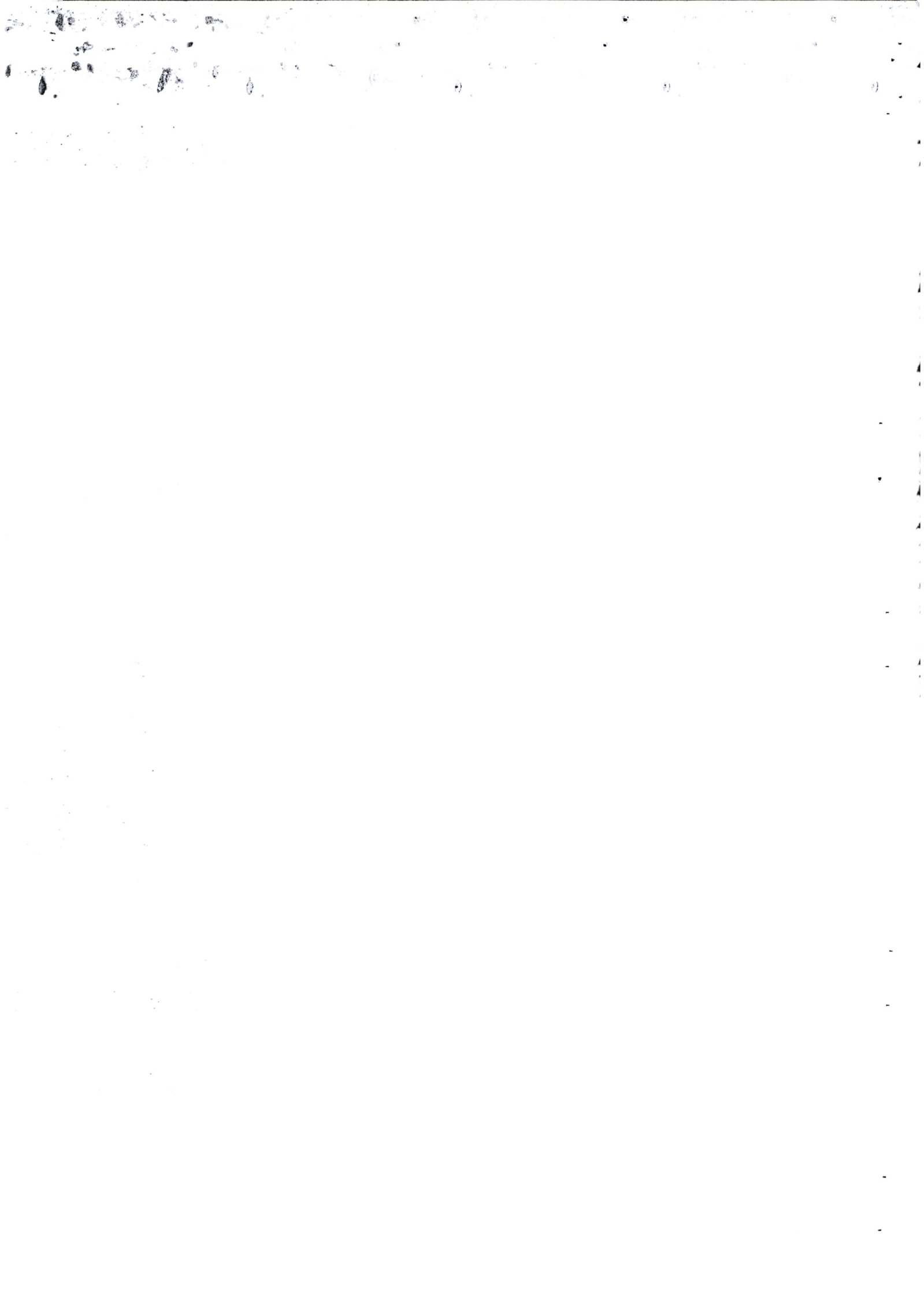


delayed power transformer on 21st Nov 2018, as being malicious, unlawful and unprocedural, hence actionable in law. It's hereby revealed that the said plaintiffs/DCC Wanyonyi's family had knowledge of the project all along, was already connected to Budalangi Market waterline and had willingly participated in various project crucial forums, among them; project stakeholders meeting for siting water kiosks at Kamukuywa market dated 18th August 2016, hosted by Kamukuywa Division ACC and among others, was attended by the said DCC Wanyonyi's immediate family member, one Lorna Wanyonyi-former Ass. Chief of Nabikoto sub location, within the project coverage and who was severally represented in other forums. Further, Hon John Musakhali public community connectivity meeting dated 31st July 2017, was attended by DCC Wanyonyi's mother among others, one Nancy Wanyonyi, being the 1st plaintiff to the project court dispute, who was one of the community speakers representative and a willing beneficiary of kshs 500/= client project registration fee.

- ✓ Note that there's evidence of public utility land on the aforementioned contested project land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, whose registered land title deed acreage is 3.54 hectares. While the said whole land parcel acreage amounts to 9.50 acres, it thus reflects 0.65 acres as being government and/or public utility land. Ironically, the obstructed public community water facilities are situated on the same!
- v. That there's evidence of consistence conspiracy to totally sabotage and crumble the said public utility project and/or community/ government development programmes being by the aforementioned DCC Wanyonyi and the immediate family, jointly with others, through; undermining, demeaning and frustrating the immediate project Area Ass. Chief of Misemwa sub location, (One Stuart Wafula) jointly with the project committee (i.e. MWUA), the project beneficiary communities, among other project stakeholders due to the said project stakeholders firm stand, regarding project true documents and hence illegitimately upholding and/or advancing the said family's undeserving selfish status quo within the communities as below observed:



- (a) DCC Wanyonyi's immediate family members jointly with others, undermined Assistant Chief-Stuart Wafula's advance caution and advice in April 2018, of the prevailing completed public government funded project water facilities, complete with the former land owner's consent dated 7th April 2017 by; maliciously and secretly changing project land ownership, maliciously and unlawfully obstructing the said project, and maliciously misleading the senior principal magistrate of project trespass on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328. Hence selfishly undermining and frustrating the said Assistant chief's community development record, jointly with the committee, project beneficiary communities and stakeholders, and thus the said family's selfish desire to undeservedly maintain their status quo within the project coverage communities, seriously reflecting the said family's community inferiority complex syndrome development-wise as such.
- (b) There exists a suspicious case of trespass in witnessing land sale agreements by DCC Wanyonyi's immediate sister, one Lorna Wanyonyi, former Assistant chief of Nabikoto sub location, who is suspected by the public to have trespassed within the jurisdiction of Misemwa sub location as such. A case in point was when sons to one John Mumilo Watibini launched a complain at Ass. Chief's office, Misemwa sub location of their father having secretly sold off part of the family land parcel (to DCC Wanyonyi's family kinsman), being without their knowledge and consent, bearing in mind that the said Mumilo's wife (and immediate next of kin) was deceased. It thus emerged, the land sale agreement between parties was at large due to its confidentiality, regarding the said state administrator's abuse of office in witnessing the same. Moreso, one Martin Nyongesa Cherwenyi of Misemwa sub location is further understood to have sold an acre of land to a kinsman of DCC Wanyonyi's family, where its confidentially indicated that witnessing of land sale agreement was undertaken at Kamukuywa Market or otherwise, the custodian of the process being suspected to be the aforementioned former Assistant Chief Lorna Wanyonyi.



✓ Ironically, the project two acre land parcel ownership change was secretly executed without any such knowledge and involvement of the immediate project source Assistant chief-Stuart Wafula. Hence project beneficiary communities/ petitioners' suspicion of the aforementioned local state administrator's jointly with the immediate family's direct involvement, bearing in mind that the said adversely mentioned family brags in confidentiality of being complete with relevant government departments to undertake any mission independently. Hence need for urgent investigations to unravel this racket of abuse of office.

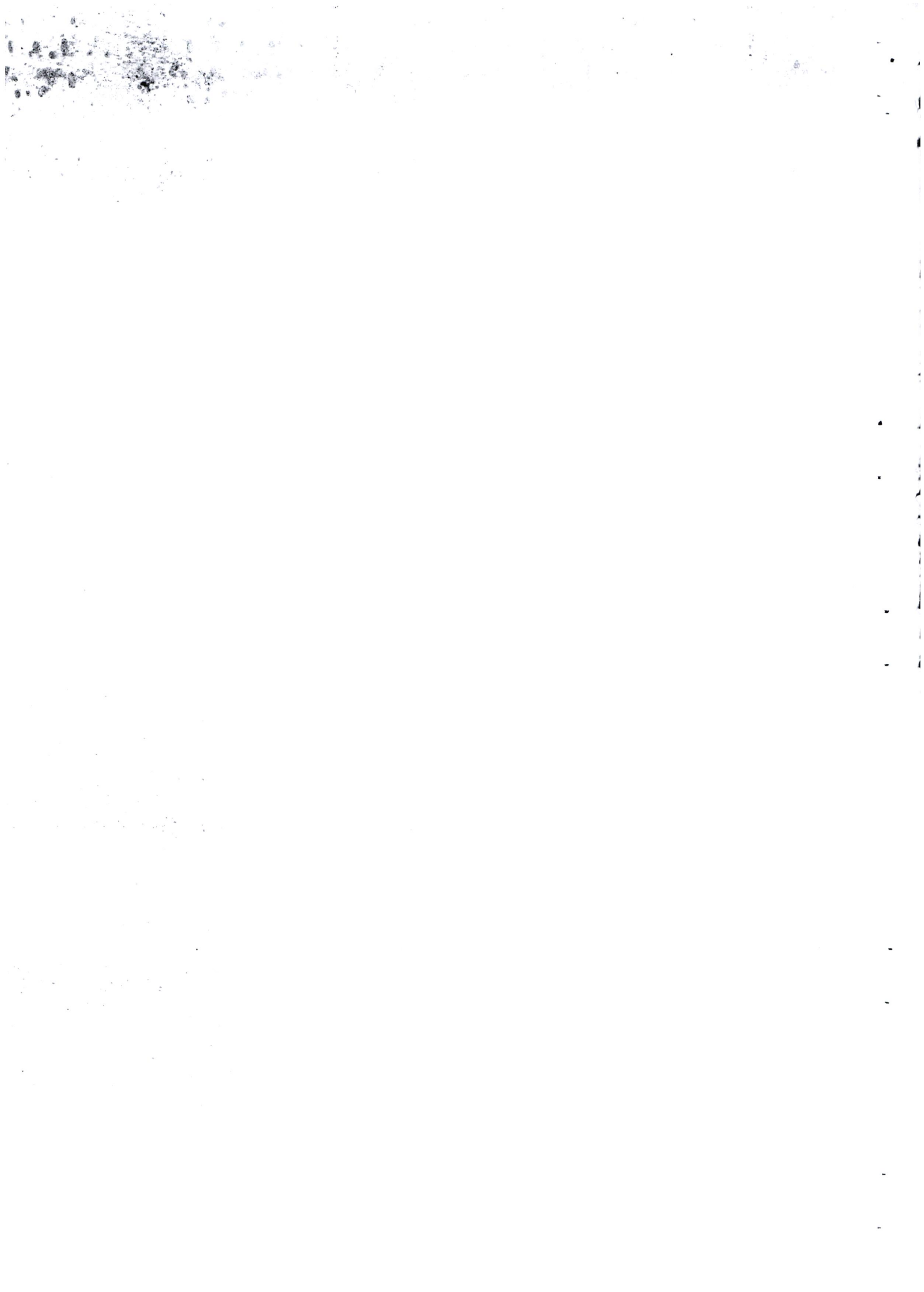
(c) There's evidence of conspiracy by DCC Wanyonyi jointly with his immediate family members and accomplices to undermine and demean Ass. Chief Stuart Wafula's ability and mandate. This is due to the Ass. Chief's firm stand regarding the prevailing truth about the disputed state funded water supply project, contrary to the selfish wish of DCC Wanyonyi jointly with his immediate family. It is revealed that shortly after the final interviews of the shortlisted candidates, for the then vacant Namarambi Location chief's post, where Ass. Chief Stuart Wafula was among the five shortlisted contestants, one Wycliffe Musiambo, an accomplice of DCC Wanyonyi and immediate family, sarcastically demeaned and undermined Ass. Chief Stuart Wafula as being academically unfit and not shortlisted as a candidate as such, indicating the same to the shocked project chairman, one Robert Lupaoh at Kamukuywa Market.

✓ The said Musiambo further, later on repeated the same sentiments to the project chairman still at Kamukuywa market, luckily in the presence of a project committee member, one Benson Wafula (i.e. Assistant Secretary) on 18th Feb 2020, being on the inauguration day of the newly appointed chief, Namarambi Location. Hence petitioners demand for state recognition, protection, reward, promotion and support of the said Ass. Chief Stuart Wafula and likewise institute legal action against those hell-bend on frustrating his mandate and

ability in respect of his selfless support for community development programmes or otherwise.

(d) Petitioners keenly observe and suspect that DCC Wanyonyi could be abusing his mandate by maliciously inciting his counterpart and purported friend, one Deputy County Commissioner (DCC) of Bungoma East Sub County, against the development cautious Ass. Chief Stuart Wafula, the project committee, the beneficiary communities, crucial stakeholders, among others, being due to the said project stakeholders' firm stand against project sabotage. Despite DCC Wanyonyi and immediate family's tainted public/community image in respect of the maliciously and unlawfully obstructed public benefiting community water supply project, the adversely mentioned DCC Wanyonyi maliciously/suspiciously hosted the aforementioned Bungoma East sub county DCC (one Chaka Nyamawi for two days consecutively.)

- ✓ It's hereby candidly revealed that shortly after the inauguration ceremony of the newly appointed Assistant chief for Wabukhonyi sub location, (neighbouring Misemwa sub location) within Bungoma East Sub County, the then Ass. Chief Lorna Wanyonyi-(Nabikoto Sub Location within Kimilili sub County), was secretly commissioned to pick the said Bungoma East DCC to her brother's (i.e. DCC Wanyonyi) home, being on 27th Dec 2019 after the aforementioned inauguration ceremony. Surprisingly, the said invited Bungoma East Sub county DCC left DCC Wanyonyi's home at night and was back visiting the following day, departing late in the evening!
- ✓ Notwithstanding, DCC Wanyonyi has abused his position courtesy of this incidence, being maliciously to instill fear among the project beneficiary communities in order to selfishly advance his immediate family's malicious public project sabotage scheme and status quo. Hence tactically suppressing any such project sabotage reports from reaching any such senior government offices and/or officers, as they have apparently moved in, cultivated and maliciously planted non-water friendly Eucalyptus trees within the fenced off immediate

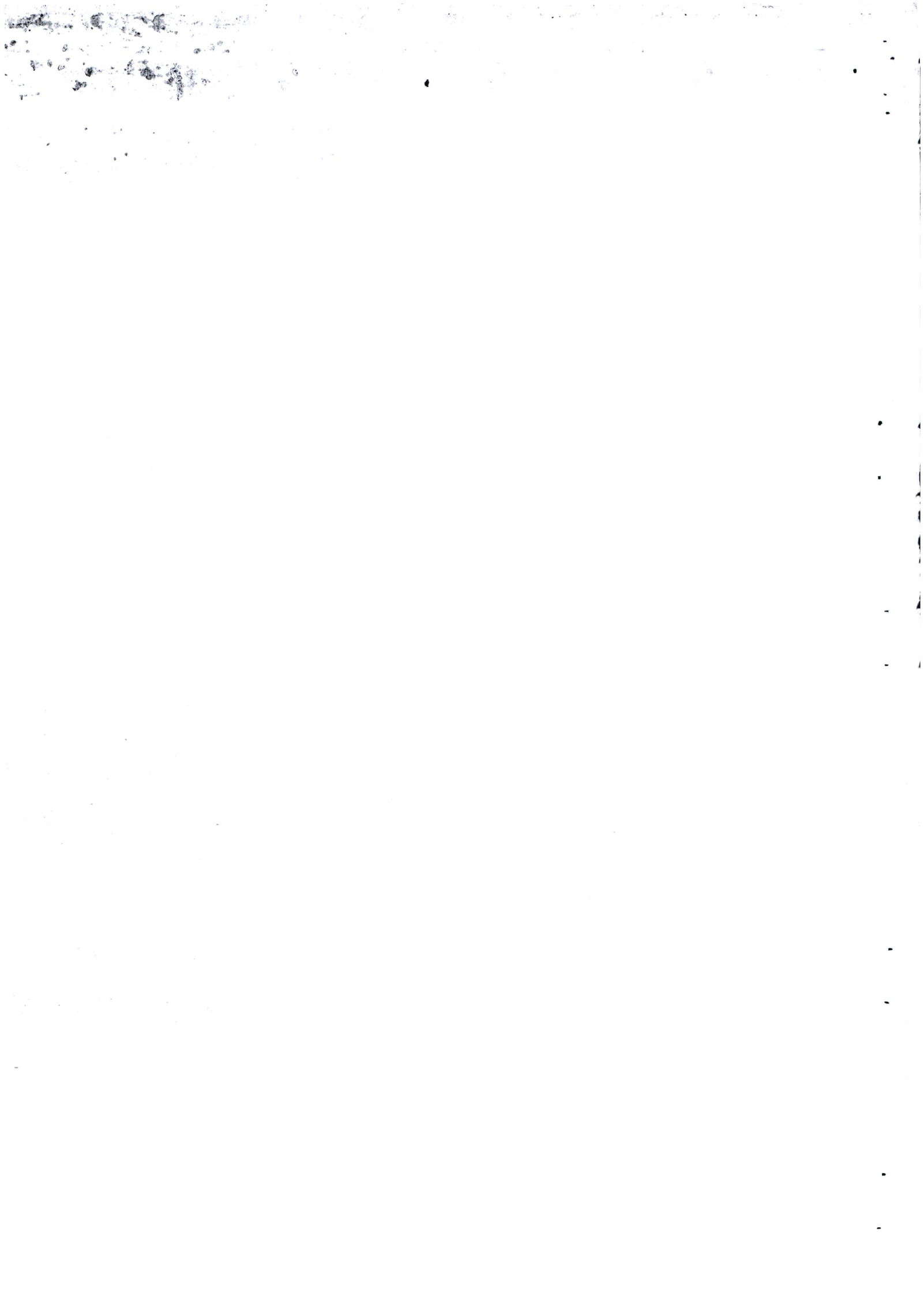


project intake catchment including the intake spring's reservoir as such.

- ✓ Further, considering that DCC Wanyonyi's senior sister one Lorna Wanyonyi (the then Ass. Chief of Nabikoto sub-location) was a keen contestant of the then vacant Kamukuywa Location Chief's position, this act of hosting his counterpart DCC to some extent, was to technically marshal for her support from the said friendly sub county administrator, purportedly to commend her well to all such senior county state administrators or otherwise for her eventual appointment as such. Ironically, the said DCC Wanyonyi's sister has suspiciously landed the aforementioned vacant Kamukuywa Location's chief's position whose inauguration was slated for early this April 2020 save for the corona virus pandemic, being despite project sabotage petition documents having been submitted to all such relevant independent state institutions including the Head of Public Service at the Executive office of the President. Thus any such existing friendship between DCC Wanyonyi and his Bungoma East Sub County counterpart could further be reason enough to fuel the aforementioned project sabotage conspiracy or otherwise as comprehensively argued above.

(e) It should be noted that DCC Wanyonyi literally or otherwise resorted to veiled security threats against the project committee chairman (One Robert Lupaoh) and by extension to the project contractor (one Patrick Kuloba), in order to accomplish his immediate family's conspired selfish interest of project sabotage. Thus being in consideration of the said project committee and project stakeholders prevailing true records in contrast with the aforementioned malicious secret project land ownership fraud/ change, malicious unlawful project obstruction and the malicious delayed project court dispute as such.

- ✓ Petitioners hereby contest of DCC Wanyonyi being on record to have threatened the project committee chairman with eminent police arrest and/or facing unspecified court charges, as



comprehensively indicated in the project committee's presidential multi-state agencies project petition report dated 17th June 2019, complete with all such veiled security threats report directed at the project committee chairman dated 1st July 2019, as was forwarded to the Director of Public Prosecution (DPP) and others.

(f) Notwithstanding, Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi the 2nd Plaintiff to the aforementioned delayed malicious project court dispute, has off late cleared natural vegetation on the project intake spring reservoir and the river-line catchment, is currently cultivating conservation land and has maliciously planted non-water friendly Eucalyptus trees among others, within the fenced off project immediate catchment and is selfishly practicing crop farming along the adjacent river-line catchment. Thus, these acts being with conspired knowledge and support of his immediate family members, including the adversely mentioned DCC Wanyonyi jointly with others. Hence purposely to malicious, selfishly provoke and/or find fault with the said DCC wanyonyi's immediate family earmarked key project stakeholders, in particular; the project committee chairman, project contractor, project immediate area Ass. Chief, among others, relating to any such complain of project current damage/vandalism, courtesy of their prevailing conspired selfish and misleading court orders as such.

✓ Petitioners therefore strongly contest the aforementioned malicious act by the said DCC Wanyonyi's senior brother jointly with his immediate family members and others, as conspiracy to demean, undermine and frustrate the project committee, beneficiary communities, project contractor, project immediate area Ass. chief, project client, tax payers citizens of Kenya, among others. Hence the conspired eventual extinction of the public project-intake source and the project in general through malicious planting of non-water friendly Eucalyptus trees and depletion of vegetation on the intake spring reservoir and the immediate fenced off catchment, being against natural water conservation guidelines and value for public funds. Hence need for urgent



conservation intervention measures by the government in order to save the public project.

- vi. That there's an alarming waterline deficit of 4.4 km, being in respect of the prevailing incomplete project distribution lines of only 9km against the formal advertised 12.5km distribution lines, including the additional 0.9km from the aforementioned 12.5km to 13.4km as per the final payment demand notice by the project contractor (i.e. Namwaya Enterprises Limited), as reflected in the project court dispute defense documents by the project client's Community Development Manager (CDM). In any case, petitioners do hereby demand for manual verification of the already done waterlines, of which any such established waterline deficit is to be factored as previously advertised and as per the project beneficiary communities resolutions dated; 24th August 2018, 4th October 2019 and 16th October 2019, being; Webuye/Kimilili Boundary waterline -1.2 km, Kamukuywa region surveyed schools/institutions and the sub urban market -2.4km and complete with the new project intake road from Ondoti primary road junction running upto 0.8km, among others.

Consequently, being in consideration of the Public Officers' or otherwise constitutional compliance with Chapter Six and the Leadership and Integrity Act, the Bill of Rights, among others, petitioners strongly observe that an **economic crime** has been committed by all such aforementioned parties jointly with others. Thus relating to the aforementioned project sabotage and compromise & design change, which is consistent with both local and international legal parameters. Hence project crimes committed amounts to; impunity, office abuse, violation of fundamental rights, falsehoods, incitement, among others. This directly affects the economic wellbeing and seriously violates the fundamental rights of over 38,742 project beneficiary communities, equivalent to any such war crimes of displacement of communities and violation of the fundamental rights, rape, deaths, child labour/soldiers, among others.

- ✓ Petitioners do hereby recommend for a presidential Executive Order on; urgent preliminary intelligence project information



gathering within the aforementioned project coverage four sub locations, immediate project detailed briefing session by the project committee (including Ass. Chief Stuart Wafula of Misemwa sub location jointly with crucial project stakeholders) complete with their security arrangement and project coverage beneficiary communities public opinion forum/meeting, in order to preliminarily confirm and/or establish the tabulated project true facts as reflected in this petition request and/or the attached previously forwarded petition documents as such.

- ✓ Finally, ***project immediate operation, project justice complete with compensation and project expansion***, is the ball apparently in your court sir. Kindly take note that its within the knowledge of the affected project petitioners and/or beneficiaries that some of the adversely mentioned persons are well connected and highly linked to senior kinsmen and/or crony state officers within the government or otherwise. Notwithstanding, the law must unconditionally apply in respect of your 2nd term inauguration speech (as was directly quoted in the previous petition request letter to the DPP & others dated 23rd Sept 2019). This being consistent with your Executive Order to fight corruption. Hence the Big Four Agenda and vision 2030 flagship programmes. To this end, the project beneficiary community has ethically played its part, what now remains is your Executive Authority through the relevant respective multi-state institutions to act urgently and decisively. In any case, the affected project tax payers' beneficiaries, including all tax payers' citizens of the Republic of Kenya, will stop at nothing except the desired transparent legal project justice value process, even if it means to the attention of the international community as is the case apparently. Your Excellency, the fight against corruption is unstoppable and should be prioritized as such. Thus, this humble petition request is just but a reminder after a record six months since late Sept 2019 and a brief summary of the previous forwarded project petition



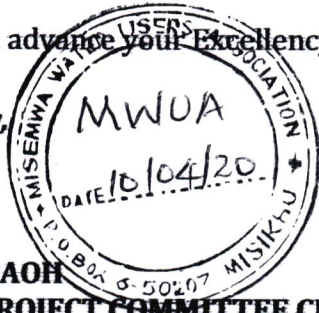

MIN-01/11/2019: Preliminaries:

- ❖ The Chairperson called the committee meeting to order at 10.36am and invited Branden Wangila to say the opening prayer.
- ❖ The meeting observed apologies from committee members Wycliffe Muhuyi who was at school in the capacity of acting Deputy Principal in charge of the ongoing

KCSE examinations, and likewise Benson Wafula who was to attend a crucial family related function.

MIN-02/11/2019: Confirmation of committee previous minutes dated 30th Sept 2019 and matters arising:

- ❖ The previous Committee Minutes were read and confirmed as a true record, as was proposed by Gertrude Juma and seconded by Branden Wangila respectively.
- ❖ It arose that there wasn't any official correspondence regarding the forwarded project presidential multi-state agencies petition reports, apart from the board (LVNWSB) lawyer's comment during LVNWSB/government project land survey and valuation exercise on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 dated 23rd October 2019, that serious project investigations were in the offing in respect of the unlawful project obstruction, indicating that the Principal Secretary (PS) for Water & Sanitation had revealed the same during a meeting with the Governors (Who were slated to visit the project site). Thus the said board lawyer had observed as such to the Project Committee Chairperson and Treasurer during the earlier aforementioned land survey and valuation exercise.
- ❖ It was reported that the project petition documents for highlighting and monitoring of the project justice process to the proposed mainstream media houses (i.e. Nation Media Group, Standard Group and Royal Media Services), had been forwarded on 8th October 2019 and whose delivery had already been confirmed by G4S.
- ❖ It was further indicated that delivery of the earlier project petition documents to the proposed twelve multi-state agencies had been likewise confirmed on the very 8th October 2019 at G4S portal, Webuye office and whose G4S registration receipts were available.
- ❖ It arose that signing of project documents by the Management/Executive Committee had become a challenge in the event of any such absence of the Secretary, having been occasioned by the non-performance of the former Ass. Secretary (i.e. Clare Wafula), of which the meeting deliberated upon the matter and unanimously confirmed Benson Wafula to fill the vacancy in absentia and who was commissioned as the principal assistant to the secretary, thus tasked to sign project documents including any such pending ones.
- ❖ It finally arose that the one third committee female gender rule issue was apparently wanting, being in respect of the long unexplained absence of active

members Irine Tupa and Rael Muliro, thus members present deliberated at length and were in agreement that all such willing former committee members be recalled and offered a second chance to prove/commit themselves as new members, of which benefits relating to the current NCWSP and the directorship of the proposed "**Misemwa Water Supply & Sanitation Company**" (MIWASSCO) shall initially be a preserve of the ten selfless and committed active members who had all along sacrificed for the current challenging project, being inline with the previous committee resolutions over the matter, among others. Hence an appropriate committee meeting shall be undertaken to formally incorporate the said willing former members and/or as shall be further deliberated upon as such.

MIN-03/11/2019: Project brief progress report dated 30th September 2019 to date:

❖ The Chairperson tabulated the below project brief progress report:

- (a) Joint MWUA/Kamukuywa crucial stakeholders meeting dated 4th October 2019, at Kamukuywa Market;
- (b) Forwarding/registration of mainstream media houses petition documents via G4S at Webuye office and likewise reporting of project land ownership fraud at Webuye police station (under OB/26/08/10/019 AT 1036 HRS) respectively, both dated 8th October 2019;
- (c) Joint project crucial stakeholders meeting dated 16th October 2019 at Misemwa Market;
- (d) LVNWSB/government project land survey and valuation exercise complete with a briefing meeting with the Ass. chief at his office, dated 23rd September 2019;
- (e) MWUA Chairperson invited and represented the committee at NZOWASCO Annual General Meeting (AGM) dated 25th October 2019, at Bungoma town (i.e. Green valle Hotel);

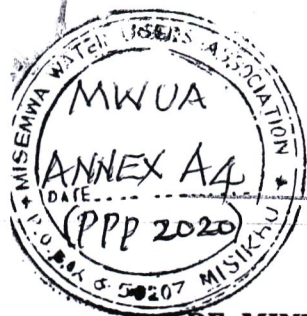

MIN-01/10/2019: Preliminaries:

- ❖ Edmond Wangila jointly with pastor Benard Wafula, as the masters of ceremony/meeting, called the meeting to order at 11.45 am with an opening prayer from Michael Khaemba, finally led stakeholders through self-introduction.
- ❖ MC Edmond Wangila welcomed MWUA Chairperson, who in turn invited Senior Village Elder-Moses Malibisi, being in the capacity of the project Area Ass. Chief who was committed elsewhere, and who officially invited all stakeholders present to feel at home and make their contributions freely towards the success of the government funded public water supply project.

NCWSP Joint crucial stakeholders meeting.

- ❖ Thereafter, MWUA Chairperson-Robert Lupaoh noted apologies from various project community stakeholders, including MCA -Ndivisi Ward Hon Martin Wanyonyi Investor, among others as above tabulated.

MIN-02/10/2019: NCWSP –Status Report Briefing Session.

- ❖ MWUA Chairperson who was once again invited by MC Edmond Wangila in respect of the meeting's main agenda, observed that the day's meeting was occasioned by the project committee's resolution dated 23rd September 2019, indicating that due to time limitations, he was to condense the project status report as such.
- ❖ The said Project Committee Chairperson began by drawing the attention of stakeholders to the last community/stakeholders petition meeting dated 24th August 2018, revealing that as they were aware, the community water supply project was currently undergoing a malicious court dispute filed by community residents Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi, claiming project trespass on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, indicating that the said project court dispute was almost a year now dating from 18th Dec 2018, following the unlawful malicious project obstruction dated 25th November 2018 by the said aforementioned family.
- ❖ The Project Chairperson took stakeholders through a chronology of events since the said aforementioned 24th August 2018 stakeholders' petition meeting, noting that the local administration; the committee and individual community members had previously engaged the said Nancy Wanyonyi's family for a homegrown solution to no avail and at which stakeholders present wanted to comment, but the chairperson requested for patience and tolerance as the meetings joint masters of ceremony would lead them to air their views during the open session as such.
- ❖ In the same vein, the chairperson observed that the proposed inter-parties meeting with the said family member-Deputy County Commissioner, Molo sub county one David Wanyonyi, initiated by the Ass, Chief's office immediately after project obstruction dated 25th November 2018, absconded due to malice on the part of the said DCC Wanyonyi, further observing that Nancy Wanyonyi's assurance to him of a lasting project court dispute solution on 18th January 2019 likewise turned out to be malicious, of which one of the said family member's (i.e. Kennedy Wanyonyi) candid indication to the committee secretary in mid -August 2019, that his family had

opined for a court determination over the project dispute, indeed confirmed the said aforementioned family's malice in filing the project court dispute.

- ❖ MWUA Chairperson revealed that following the said plaintiff's family malice from the word go, the project committee had unanimously resolved and compiled a comprehensive presidential multi-state agencies project petition report for action as from late May 2019, which was later adopted; formalized and enjoined with the 24th August 2018 community/stakeholders petition report and which further underwent committee confirmation and/or authority for forwarding dated 23/9/2019 to ^{the} said multi-state agencies, being after the said Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi's candid appearance in court jointly with a land valuer on 19th Sept 2019, ready to testify of project trespass on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, contrary to the prevailing project documents and records, that the project two acre land ownership change only took place when all water project facilities were already in place, being within the domain and/or knowledge of beneficiary communities across the project area coverage and beyond.
- ❖ The Chairperson indicated that the already forwarded project petition documents for multi-state agencies investigations, projected committee/community request for investigations regarding project sabotage and to some extent, project compromised works/materials and design change, as reflected in the joint project petition(s), of which stakeholders were to deliberate over the issues raised in the said project petition, being in their domain as the affected beneficiaries and later on moot the way forward over the same, being in readiness for the unfolding of events by the said multi-states agencies relating to project crimes committed as such.
- ❖ Further he observed that a joint meeting with crucial Nabikoto/Kamukuywa region stakeholders dated 4th October 2019, and who were likewise represented to the day's deliberations, had unanimously resolved to testify against project trespass, being that the Community; Administrators/Leaders and all Stakeholders were aware and participated in project forums, had likewise, finally resolved to demand for their compromised waterline, among others, being their constitutional tax payers right and value for public funds as a matter of essence as such.
- ❖ Finally, the chairperson revealed that in her sworn affidavit relating to the project court dispute, Lake Victoria North Water Services Board-Community Development Manager, one Madam Nelly Mukoko indicates that the project contractor had

already demanded for his final payment as at December 2017, having accomplished 2km of the Rising main and 13.4km of distribution lines among others, contrary to the prevailing 9km distribution lines undertaken on the ground as such, hence stakeholders were likewise to chat the way forward over the same, being inline with the forwarded enjoined community/stakeholders petition report dated 24th August 2018.

MIN-03/10/2019 Open Session/Stakeholder Brief Remarks:

➤ ***Andrew W. Simiyu –Ass. Chief's Rep-Nabikoto sub location:***

- ✓ Indicated project legality following the known land owner's consent (i.e. Japheth W. Masinde) via the legally witnessed project land sale agreement dated 7th April 2017.
- ✓ Further observed that he being a land control board member in Kimilili Sub County, a River/Natural water resource reserve is mandatory in government land survey procedure, hence public utility and/or conservation land available for the project intake source as such.
- ✓ He blamed the former land owner, Japheth W. Masinde as having occasioned the prevailing court dispute, finally revealing that the plaintiff's family were fully aware of the project and not otherwise, hence stakeholders to stand for justice throughout any such justice process, thus himself including crucial Kamukuywa Stakeholders were for the same.

➤ ***Michael J. Khaemba –Mulembe/Misemwa sub location Community Rep:***

- ✓ Observed that the said plaintiffs are strangers within the community and likewise project land ownership, confirming that the project land sale agreement was binding, finally revealing that he's well versed with intake/source land parcel, thus government utility/conservation land was available.

➤ ***Benson Chisala –Village elder-Mupeli/Misemwa sub location:***

- ✓ Confirmed that the community water supply project was legal and long overdue, hence the former land owner should bear liability for not informing project stakeholders regarding project land ownership change.

➤ ***Alfred Bwami –Village elder-Lutaso/Misemwa sub location:***

- ✓ Tabled his long history of the intake project indicating that the said spring was previously rehabilitated by one Wambilianga in 1980s, later Europeans

visited and demarcated it, earmarking the same for water supply to Frodrig falls (i.e. Webuye Town) and others.

- ✓ He revealed that previously the spring water fell from the higher ground and to which it was later named as Lutaso spring in 1994 and was likewise rehabilitated by AMREF in the same year after naming.
- ✓ He finally confirmed that the land owner, Mr. Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde gave consent for the project via the public attended land sale agreement, likewise indicating availability of government utility land.

➤ ***Wilfare W. Khaemba –Former MCA Ndivisi Ward –Hon John Musakali Rep:***

- ✓ Observed being alive to a European visit to the said Lutaso spring intake in 1986 who tested/measured the huge resource of the spring using sophisticated machines, confirming it as being sustainable for generations.
- ✓ He revealed that ***Hon John Musakali*** had previously invested county funds in the said intake rehabilitation, moreso, had already invested his funds in community connectivity programme via public meeting dated 31st July 2017, hence the legality of the project and/or source, thus urged the community to stand firm in defending the project during investigations, finally confirming that Hon. Musakali will stand with the community and/or the project as such.

➤ ***Jamin Kawele –Village elder, Mulembe/project Intake /source:***

- ✓ Confirmed having represented the local state administration office in previous and current project intake rehabilitation and the project in general, finally blaming the land owner-Mr. Wekhuyi, as being the cause of the project dispute.

➤ ***Edmond Wangila –MWUA Vice Chairperson and Nabikoto sub location:***

- ✓ Observed on behalf of the project committee (i.e. MWUA), that the project is community benefitting for future generations, hence the said project legality and/or viability.

➤ ***Jescar Wakhungu –Village elder, Mutua/Misemwa sub location:***

- ✓ Seriously questioned the legality and/or sanity of the said project land transfer including the validity of the procedure, lamenting that the existence of public utility water facilities and the binding community land sale agreement is all telling, and to which stakeholders were unanimously in

support, interrupting every now and then in support of the same, of which community and stakeholders demand for investigations was deemed as such.

➤ **Antony Kibasali –Nyumba Kumi Chairman, -Kamukuywa Ward**

- ✓ Confirmed that any natural water source is a government resource hence the community project source.

MIN-04/10/2019: Way Forward:

- 1) Stakeholders were unanimously in agreement of the public project validity, confirming that knowledge of the project by the beneficiary communities including the plaintiffs was above board, hence allegations of project trespass was malicious and actionable in respect of the prevailing valid and legal project documents as such, thus the community was ready to defend the project.
- 2) The meeting unanimously agreed for establishment of the availability of public utility land on the contested land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 by the government, being that the land survey registered title acreage is 3.54 hectares, while total land parcel acreage is 9.50 acres, hence the evidence of public utility land and being where water facilities are located, thus prosecutions demanded relating to the unlawful project obstruction dated 25th November 2018 and the eventual delayed malicious project court dispute occasioned by the plaintiffs.
- 3) The meeting was further in agreement that investigations and prosecutions should commence in respect of the suspicious withdrawal of the project transformer, by Kenya Power and Lighting Company-Webuye office, being without any formal notification to project stakeholders, being regarded as conspiracy to sabotage the public project and likewise the governments last mile power connectivity programme, hence conspiracy to commit crimes to defeat the government's vision 2030 and Big Four Agenda programme as such.
- 4) Stakeholders unanimously questioned the legality of the project's legally witnessed inter-parties two-acre land sale agreement ownership change, including the public/government water facilities already in place, and/or the sanity of all such parties involved as such, being the known land owner one Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde; plaintiffs Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi; the land Registrar-Bungoma county and jointly with others, of which it was consensually demanded that the said matter be treated as a fraud case, thus further relating to the

project committee's report at Webuye police station under "OB 26/08/10/019 AT 1036 HRS" over the same.

- 5) Stakeholders were further unanimously in agreement that project compromised works/materials and design change by Lake Victoria North Water Services Board, be investigated and prosecutions be undertaken, of which it was demanded that the already laid waterlines be manually verified and the compromised waterlines be reinstated, being Kimilili/Webuye boundary; Budalangi market; Lubokha primary-Kamukuywa sub urban-Wamalwa Kijana High School, among others. Thus the intake source rehabilitated road from Ondoti road junction, likewise be factored to benefit the project source households left out during project survey, being to enhance project ownership as such.
- 6) It was finally unanimously agreed that the beneficiary communities shall be the supreme authority regarding issues raised in the committee/community project petition reports dated 17th June 2019 and 24th August 2018 respectively or otherwise. For any such project delay or otherwise, there shall be urgent need for a community beneficiaries presidential project petition request reminder(Complete with petitioners lists), relating to the public project sabotage and compromised works/materials & design change, of which any such government officers and/or agencies visiting the ground/project site or otherwise, should seek mandatory public opinion via project beneficiary communities public forums/meetings, being to establish true facts relating to the said raised issues in order to make informed decisions as such.

MIN-05 /10/2019: Administrators/Leaders brief closing remarks:

- **Wilfare W. Khaemba –Former MCA Ndivisi Ward –Hon John Musakali Rep:**
 - ✓ Thanked all stakeholders for the constructive contributions and firm stand in support of the public water supply project, thus being the wish of the immediate former MCA.
- **Andrew W. Simiyu –Ass. Chief's Rep-Nabikoto sub location:**
 - ✓ Cordially thanked the state administration/leadership of Misemwa sub-location, praising village elders for their attendance and support/contribution as being encouraging and commendable, finally indicating that his experience on land control board projected land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 of title deed 3.54 hectares equivalent to 8.6 acres, reflecting 0.93 acres as government utility land mathematically.
- **Antony Kubasali –Nyumba Kumi Chairman, Kamukuywa Ward:**

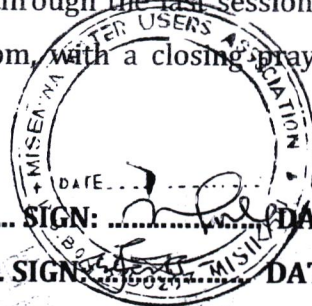
- ✓ Observed that leadership is all about sacrifice, hence all project stakeholders including the project committee should stand firm for project success, biblically summing up that "water is life".
- **Moses Malibisi –Senior Village elder, Misemwa sub location Ass. Chief's Rep-:**
 - ✓ Insisted that the project committee should stand firm despite any such threats, indicating that the plaintiffs are intruders to community development, finally observing that the beneficiary communities of Misemwa, Wabukhonyi and Nabikoto/Kamukuywa are in solidarity with the team.
- **John Masabule –CDF Rep Misemwa sub-location-:**
 - ✓ He candidly sort to enlist his support and firm stand for the success of the public project as earlier indicated in his remarks during the 24th August 2018 stakeholders petition meeting, accusing the plaintiffs as intruders manipulating the community, lamenting that wealth should not be used to frustrate and/or sabotage community development, hence the said family should bear any such liability.

- ❖ After successfully leading stakeholders through the last session, Pastor Benard Wafula adjourned the meeting at 1:11pm, with a closing prayer from Esther Wanyama.

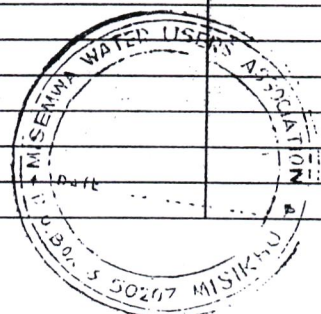

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issue was timely arbitrated by the local state administration, being the project area Ass. Chief jointly with the Assistant County Commissioner's office, via official project interparty meetings that eventually paved way for a two-acre project land sale agreement, being between then known valid land owner- Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde and the Project Committee - Misemwa Community Water Users Association (MWUA) being through a public meeting dated 7th April 2017, officially presided over and legally witnessed by the Project Area Assistant Chief and being without any objection as such;

4. That the said land sale agreement was formally forwarded to Lake Victoria North Water Services Board being the project client, on 18th April 2017, by Misemwa Community Water Users Association being the Project Committee, of which the committee was directed by the community development manager (CDM) of the said board, at around 26th April 2017 that the valid land owner was the one to claim project intake land compensation, hence the Project Area Assistant Chief of Misemwa sub location jointly with the Project Committee, initiated consultations with the land owner culminating in a formal land owner's project intake catchment "Land Compensation Request letter dated 17th May 2017, with copies of the same to the Project Area Assistant Chief-Stuart Wafula and Misemwa Water Users Association (MWUA) complete with copies of the said land sale agreement and a valid land title deed;
5. That on a later date, in line with the aforementioned submitted land compensation demand request letter, the elder son to Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde one Ronald Wakasiaka Masinde contacted the project chairman(i.e. Robert S. Lupaoh), indicating that the board had indeed contacted his father informing him of its intention to purchase project catchment land of between one to one and half of an acre, at the prevailing government rates, against kshs 1.8 million tabulated in the said land sale agreement, hence the said land owner's son strongly observed his family's disappointment, of which his statement raised the project chairman's suspicion as such;
6. That it should be noted that Land Parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 was originally registered in the name of the late Zebedayo Khang'asi in 1963 following government land survey of 1962 and further underwent change of names to

Zebedayo Simiyu Khang'asi, in 1967, of which ownership later changed in favour of the said Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde in May 21st 1976 due to settlement of the accrued Agricultural Finance Corporation (AFC) loan interest, previously advanced to the said Zebedayo Simiyu Khang'asi around 1972, but interestingly the late Zebedayo Simiyu Khang'asi's family refused to vacate the said land parcel leading to life-time protracted court battles, until the year 2015 when a court determination ruled in favour of Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde, prompting the late Zebedayo Simiyu Khang'asi family to vacate the said land parcel in December 2015 by demolishing all existing family structures, including felling of all existing trees apart from one indigenous tree, being on the water reservoir of the current project "Lutaso Intake Spring/Source". Thus the said current project source was previously rehabilitated by the project committee (i.e. MWUA) in 2010/2011-"Namarambi Water & Sanitation Project (NWSP)" funded by Water Services Trust Fund (WSTF), subject to land easement consent from Norah Nanyama Simiyu, being a wife to the said late Zebedayo Simiyu Khang'asi and who was apparently residing on the same parcel of land, hence the current malicious project delayed/intentional court process is an irony of previous events that qualify urgent government intervention, being a long-term safety measure to the said public natural huge-reservoir water source, through its conservation, thus sustainability of the project, hence value for public funds.

Malicious Secret Project Land Ownership Change:

7. That on 8th July 2018, the project committee (i.e. MWUA), through the chairman coincidentally learnt of malicious secret project land ownership change by the family of Nancy Wanyonyi residing in Misemwa sub location within the project area of coverage, hence the project chairman being on normal project monitoring mission, coincidentally learnt of the land ownership change from Nancy Wanyonyi's sons, one Kennedy Wanyonyi and David Wanyonyi -Deputy County Commissioner based in Molo sub county, who casually indicated that land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 had changed ownership including project facilities, thus they supervised planting of non-water friendly exotic trees being Cyprus; Groovilia and Pinus within the fenced-off immediate catchment and around the project sump, hence the said project chairman immediately notified and consulted with the project intake area ass. chief, and who indicated that he had previously cautioned DCC Wanyonyi regarding the existing government funded water facilities, including the

two acre land sale agreement between parties, as having been procedurally witnessed by him, further observing that the said secret land ownership change was undertaken intentionally, being without his knowledge;

8. That the project committee (i.e. MWUA), further held consultations over the same and later informed the office of the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as the project client, being among other project issues through a committee board visit on 11th August 2018 and further convened a successful project stakeholders meeting (over the said malicious secret project land ownership change) dated 24th August 2018, with the said meeting unanimously recommending for fact-finding of the said malicious and unprocedural act, being by the aforementioned family among other issues by independent government institutions;

Malicious Unprocedural Project Obstructions:

9. That on 25th November 2018 at around 9.40 am, the project chairman on his way to but a little distance from the project intake source, being on the normal project monitoring mission, was alerted by a community member neighbouring the project source, one Wilyfare Wanjala Kani of an attempted project obstruction of the then ongoing cleaning of the intake sump, undertaken by the project contractor's workforce. Thus revealing that the aforementioned Kennedy Wanyonyi was behind the said act claiming project land compensation, of which the said beneficiary community member humbly requested the chairman jointly with administration to protect the long awaited community benefiting water project from any further operation delay, following the installation of a power transformer on 21st November 2018, having been the cause of the said long delay and being the completion of electricity power installation, further indicating that project intake households were strongly against any such obstruction attempt, finally observing that project works had been previously procedurally undertaken and concluded without any arising objection as a matter of fact and being within the domain of the public as such;
10. That on reaching the intake site, the project chairman indeed confirmed the said attempted work obstruction and shortly left for the Area Ass. Chief's home (it being Sunday), via an alternative route, only to see the said Kennedy Wanyonyi arriving

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back at the site, via the direct project intake access road at around 10.00 am. Thus on going back, the project chairman was alarmed that the said Kennedy Wanyonyi was already forcing the contractor's workers to terminate their mission, hence prompting the chairman to intervene by informing him that his act was unlawful obstruction of someone else's work, further reminding him that his family's act of planting non water friendly exotic trees within and around the project sump had been reported to relevant government offices and stakeholders as such;

11. That the said Kennedy Wanyonyi there and then insulted the project chairman terming him as a fool and being nothing before him (i.e. Kennedy Wanyonyi), hence arrogantly bragging that he was at the right place, thus dared the chairman to alert the area police officers or project officers as such, of which the project chairman observed to the said Kennedy Wanyonyi that it would be shameful for both of them being community residents to involve the police as such, further observing to Mr. Wanyonyi that he was at liberty to accomplish his unlawful mission, hence the government being the project client would handle the matter, thus the project chairman left the site for stakeholder consultation;
12. That on his way back, the project chairman who was to briefly meet Mr. Japheth Simiyu Njakusi (whose home neighbours the intake site), over school matters, both being Board of Management members of Friends Secondary School - Misemwa, was shortly thereafter contacted by DCC David Wanyonyi, being a follower brother to the said Kennedy Wanyonyi, through his mobile 0721725608-DCC Wanyonyi to 0712492300-chairman, emotionally alluding that he the project chairman had threatened his position as a DCC, hence his call being at 10.06 am and lasting a record of 6 minutes, 29 seconds;
13. That the project chairman strongly cautioned DCC Wanyonyi against reported speech, informing him that he had only warned his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi against obstructing the project contractor's work, with DCC Wanyonyi further emotionally observing to the chairman that he was for the first time commenting on the said project, thus alluding that he had witnesses regarding what the project committee alleges about him, hence the chairman observed to him that he was at liberty to produce the said witnesses, being that the committee only limits itself to

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project issues within its mandate and being on behalf of the beneficiary communities as such;

14. That the said DCC Wanyonyi strongly indicated to the project chairman that he was in full support of his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi in obstructing the project, further bragging that the said committee had never sought to meet him, thus finally alleging that the land owner Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde had accorded him (i.e. DCC Wanyonyi) full ownership authority as such, of which the project chairman cautioned and reminded DCC Wanyonyi that the intake land compensation was the mandate of the government as the project client, further indicating to the said DCC that long before the said land ownership change, he DCC Wanyonyi was fully aware of the existing public water facilities, thus project in general, hence it were him (i.e. DCC Wanyonyi) to have notified the project committee of project land ownership change, however he might have undermined the committee with the chairman observing to DCC Wanyonyi of the committee not being opposed to his authority regarding the said whole parcel of land, but the fate of taxpayers government funded water project facilities, being in respect of the legally witnessed project two-acre land sale Agreement that was in place between parties as such;
15. That thereafter, while the project chairman was being escorted by the aforementioned PTA chairman of Friends sec school -Misemwa after brief consultations on school matters, DCC Wanyonyi who must have been just hanging around, passed by them in a yellow-double cabin government vehicle bearing registration number GKB 271J, threateningly pointing his finger at the project chairman as he joined his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi in obstructing project works, being indeed true to his words that he fully supported the said unlawful act as demonstrated by him;
16. That the said PTA chairman advised the project chairman to immediately go home for security reasons, of which he the project chairman opted to notify the Project Area Ass. Chief at his home, with the said local state administrator indicating to the chairman that DCC Wanyonyi had contacted him shortly alleging that his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi has had some disagreements at the project site, hence creating an impression of himself being away, thus the chairman's revelations of DCC's presence really shocked the said Ass. Chief. Thus after brief consultations over the

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project unlawful obstruction incidence, it was agreed that the committee jointly with the Ass. Chief were to meet on the 27th November 2018 at his office during morning hours to chart the way forward over the same;

17. That while at his home on that very day of project obstruction, the project chairman received a suspicious Mpesa deposit of kshs 10 at 1:58pm, from one Malcolm Wabwile Simiyu that read ("MKP54BCR01 confirmed. You have received kshs 10.00 from Malcolm Wabwile Simiyu 0701226479 on 25/11/2018 at 1:58 pm. New Mpesa balance is kshs 13.20. Pay bills via Mpesa."). Thus on fact-finding, the sender later shockingly turned out to be the elder son to the said DCC Wanyonyi, being an indication that the said Nancy Wanyonyi's family were up to some mischievous mission either against the project chairman and/or the state funded community water project;
18. That this turn of events prompted the project chairman to visit Webuye Police Station at the officer commanding station (OCS) office, with a four-page official MWUA Project Committee write-up report titled "Namarambi Community Water Supply Project chairperson's (Robert S. Lupaoh) project report to Webuye Police Station on 26th Nov 2018," thus briefing and consulting the said officer commanding station (OCS) one John Nyangaresi over the aforementioned unprocedural project obstruction report, after which both the project chairman and the OCS exchanged their mobile phone numbers at around 2:14 pm;
19. That on 27th November 2018, the project committee met with the Ass. Chief in his office as had earlier been agreed upon, of which the project chairman briefed the said consultation meeting about the said project obstruction incidence; the said police station consultation visit and notification report to Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as the project client. Thus it was briefly deliberated and agreed that a meeting with the said DCC Wanyonyi be undertaken in respect of the Ass. Chief's administrative advice for further consultations and tolerance, likewise to learn more about the DCC's comment to the chairman of the committee not having sort to meet him, thus the Ass. Chief via a phone call notified DCC Wanyonyi of the said proposed consultation meeting and to which he consented to, but on a later date DCC Wanyonyi shifted goal posts over the same, hence indicating to the Ass. Chief that he and the committee were to meet his (i.e. DCC Wanyonyi's)

mother-Nancy Wanyonyi instead, of which the earlier aforementioned parties read mischief on the part of the said DCC, hence the proposed consultation meeting between parties aborted as such;

20. That on 28th November 2018, the earlier aforementioned PTA Chairman of Friends Sec School – Misemwa (i.e. Japheth Simiyu Njakusi), revealed to the project chairman that DCC Wanyonyi had on the evening of 25th Nov 2018 at around 5pm, contacted him (i.e. PTA Chairman) via his mobile number 0715196394 advising the said PTA Chairman to accordingly instruct the project chairman never to dare visit the project intake site, thus indicating that he (i.e. DCC) had ordered the police for the project chairman's arrest should he dare not comply with same. Thus DCC Wanyonyi further observed that the project chairman being a friend of the said PTA chairman, should be made to understand that the earlier aforementioned whole of land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 was DCC Wanyonyi's property purchased by him, and finally observing to said PTA chairman that were he to dare to visit the project chairman, then he was at liberty to transfer the said water project to his (i.e. PTA chairman) own parcel of land;
21. That it was later confidentially established by the project chairman that even the project Area Village elder for Mulembe village, being the main village within Misemwa sub location where the project intake spring (i.e. Lutaso spring) is located, one Jamin Kawele whose mobile no. 0715539417, had on the very day and time of the said project obstruction, contacted DCC Wanyonyi with a view of convincing him against the said project obstruction at around some minutes past 10.00am, but the said DCC Wanyonyi is said to have remained adamant that the project was locked/stopped;
22. That it further emerged and later on confirmed that on DCC Wanyonyi joining his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi, both brothers threatened one David Wafula Muloma of being locked inside the sump (i.e. underground intake water tank), but the said project contractor's unskilled labourers requested to notify the project contractor before he and two others vacated the site, of which DCC Wanyonyi personally contacted the said project contractor (i.e. Patrick Kuloba-0720925543/0780589974) using the said David Wafula Muloma mobile phone - 0728699480, thus accordingly warning the said project contractor that his works

had been stopped henceforth, of which DCC Wanyonyi being in person and jointly with his brother, locked up the said project sump using a china made brown tri circle 265 padlock, including the project contractor's black-hard circle padlock, in the presence of the said contractor's workforce. Hence the said David Wafula Muloma has since sworn an affidavit dated 3rd June 2019 as the project contractor's witness in respect of the earlier aforementioned malicious unlawful project obstruction, in respect of the malicious project court case filed by the said and severally mentioned family of Nancy Wanyonyi;

Baseless Malicious Letter:

23. That on 1st December 2018, through the office of the Ass. chief Misemwa sub location, the project committee received a copy of the surprise letter (being in the name of the chairman-Robert Simiyu, contrary to procedure), addressed to Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as the project client and likewise copied to Kenya Power and Lighting Company -Western region and Namway Enterprises Ltd, being from Nancy Wanyonyi jointly with Joseph Wanyonyi dated 27th November 2018, (both mother and a brother respectively to the said severally mentioned DCC David Wanyonyi and Kennedy Wanyonyi), hence the said letter being through Mwinamo Lugonzo & company advocates based in Eldoret, thus the said letter being with baseless malicious claims indicating/alleging of project trespass on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, being through: erection of permanent features; destruction of trees worth millions of shillings; no consent for way leave; creation of an illegal 9 meter wide access road-among others, and to which the project committee (i.e. MWUA) undertook to notify the beneficiary communities via a committee public statement, being complete with the said letter as follows and ^{as} was observed:

- i. That there wasn't any official record or document within the domain of MWUA; Administration and Lake Victoria North Water Services Board being in respect of land ownership as alleged in line with project compensation guidelines, hence the fact being that the known land owner was Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde;
- ii. That project trespass was a lie, being that the alleged secret land ownership change only took place long after all the existing community water facilities

were already in place, being as per ^{the} official prevailing documents, hence claimants being a third party. Moreso, Kenya Power & Lighting Company followed the due process, hence all land owners appended their signatures including for land parcel 328;

- iii. That the alleged destruction of trees worthy millions of shillings indicated direct greed for money, hence the beneficiary community was fully aware of no single tree existed as Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde took over land ownership in 2015, being after prolonged court battles, of which the few sprouted Eucalyptus trees on intake site land access road that were felled during powerline installation, were indeed carried away by Ronald Wakasiaka Masinde, an elder son to the known land owner;
- iv. That the alleged illegal 9m wide access road was interesting, being that the said land parcel Ndivisi/Makuseiwa/328 has a 6m wide access road running 249m down the farm, being inline with the 1962 government land survey map, hence the project power line to the intake source;
- v. That the alleged erection of a wire-line in the middle of the land was seriously childish, hence observation would just dismiss the same, of which the framing, wording and content of the said letter was wanting as such;
- vi. That the claimants jointly with others, choose to ignore and undermine the project committee and administration, being subject to lack of access to crucial project information as per the above 1-5, being due to arrogance and pride in respect of the prevailing documented project records dated 08/07/2018 and 25/11/2018 respectively, being both verbal and phone call conversations/statements being by them;
- vii. That MWUA being the official project committee, thereby appealed for tolerance by the community, being whose long awaited water supply project works were obstructed by the claimants forcibly on 25th Nov 2018, being that both LVNWSB and KPLC were undertaking to respond to claimants in respect of official project records and documents in order to pave way for compensation negotiations as per the legal framework;

viii. That alternatively, were the claimants to exhibit continued arrogance and pride to further stall taxpayers' community benefiting water project, the project committee strongly indicted drafting of "a community project petition" to his Excellency the President, being the chief custodian of government funds and resources, being in consideration of the fight against impunity, being in respect of the timing and nature of the said secret land ownership change, being at the expense of multimillion government water project facilities in place.

Surprise Malicious Project Court Case:

24. That around 22nd Dec 2018, the project committee was alerted by LVNWSB of a surprise malicious project court case dated 18th Dec 2018, as having been filed by Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi as the 1st & 2nd plaintiffs respectively, being versus Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB); Kenya Power & Lighting co. Ltd and Namwaya Enterprises Ltd as the 1st, 2nd & 3rd respondents respectively, whose application by the said plaintiff was grounded on total lies, being allegations of the earlier aforementioned community water project trespass on the said land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, being in the senior Principal Magistrates court at Kimilili Environment and land case No. 47 of 2018, hence filed under "certificate of urgency", being by H.A.A. Chanzu of Z.K. Yego Law offices based in Eldoret, of which Lake Victoria North Water Services Board jointly with the project committee (i.e. MWUA) later filed the said case defense against the plaintiffs' lies in respect of prevailing project records and documents, thus in readiness for the 1st coming up of the said case on 2nd January 2019.

25. That on the said 2nd January 2019, the said project case was temporarily transferred to Webuye Law Courts sitting the absence of relevant judicial officer, of which counsel to the plaintiff (i.e. Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi), aroused suspicion by rushing ahead of other parties to Webuye court together with a court officer and lied to the said Webuye Court of the absence of Respondents, being fully aware that the said Respondents were indeed destined to the said court, thus on arrival the said Respondents being ⁱⁿ the company of project committee members were shocked that the counsel, being a son and brother to the 1st & 2nd plaintiff respectively, had independently taken a new date for the case contrary to the rules of procedure, of

which when requested in court for interparty favourable date, he arrogantly declined by staying at the court entrance/gate, hence prompting counsel to the 1st Respondent to later file a protest letter to the court as at 8th January 2019;

26. That the said project case having been filed under certificate of urgency, it ironically dragged on for a record of six months before ruling to determine its validity was undertaken on 16th May 2019, of which it's hereby candidly revealed that the Senior Principal Magistrate for Land and Environment had previously, maliciously declined and adamantly refused to admit submissions by counsel to the 1st Respondent, and to the least of expectations, the said Honourable court suspiciously declared the case as being valid under unclear circumstances and on flimsy grounds, contrary to the prevailing defense documents and records, being at the expense of the suffering of beneficiary communities against the constitutional right to clean, safe and affordable water, hence the Honourable court determination was indeed wanting;
27. That on 6th June 2019, the Honourable court aroused suspicion by indicating that the 3rd Respondent (being the contractor) hadn't filed his defense, being contrary to the available defense copies of the same, having been filed at the said court on 6th Feb 2019 bearing the court official rubber stamp, being in the domain of parties including the project committee. Thus the said court's allegation surrounding the project contractor defense documents was indeed malicious (though later admitted), bearing in mind that the said 3rd Respondents defense was very crucial in consideration of the unlawful malicious project obstruction by the said plaintiff, being a reality that the said project contractor's work force were to later testify over the same, hence the project committee's suspicion of the said court jointly with others technically conspiring to delay and/or deny justice, being subject to this comprehensive project report in search of the said denied or delayed justice for the affected beneficiary communities of Misemwa; Wabukhonyi and Nabikoto sub locations, being in respect of the aforementioned special project committee resolution dated 26th May 2019, being in protest of the surprise court ruling of the said validity of the project court case dated 16th May 2019, hence this document shall be valid for action despite whatever outcome of the said court case, being before or after full hearing and ruling as such;
28. That following the said uncalled for project court case by the plaintiff, the already installed project power transformer was surprisingly taken away by Kenya Power & Lighting Company-Webuye office on 5th Feb 2019 suspiciously under unclear

circumstances, of which KPLC later indicated the project court dispute as being the cause, when the project contractor visited their Webuye office on 18th Feb 2019, further adding salt to injury in respect of the affected beneficiary institutions and households, being due to prolonged severe drought that had already cost heavily on time and money, of which conspiracy came into play;

29. That due to the high cost of security being in respect of prolonged court case; the said malicious withdrawal of the project transformer by KPLC and the eventual surprise malicious ruling of the validity of the project court case dated 16th May 2019, further prompted the project contractor to likewise withdraw the previously installed Electrical motor from the project powerhouse on the 15th May 2019, hence siting security reasons and being in consultations with project Area Ass. Chief jointly with the committee, thus further complicating the project status;

30. That despite the earlier aforementioned selfish acts of malicious secret project land ownership change, malicious unprocedural project obstruction and lies to the honourable court of project trespass by the plaintiff, the said Nancy Wanyonyi has on two separate occasions interestingly tried to verbally absolve herself of any wrongdoing, thus indicating the former land owner Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde tricked and misled her regarding the prevailing project land sale agreement, being to the project chairman on 18th Jan 2019 at Misemwa Sec. School's form three parents meeting and again on 4th June 2019 through William Namanda whom she sent to the project chairman siting Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde's mistake as such; thus she faulted the chairman of being disrespectful of her following his remarks about the said court case, during Misemwa Sec. School's AGM dated 31st May 2019, of which the said plaintiff revealed that community members Wycliffe Musiambo and Dickson Muyoti, among others had informed her over the same, thus the project chairman observed to the said William Namanda that it was within his mandate as the committee chairman, further being in respect of the resolution dated 26th May 2019 to inform the beneficiary communities of the project status including the said project court case involving the said Nancy Wanyonyi's family, likewise having been due to sustained stakeholder lamentations regarding water crisis in the said school during the said AGM, hence he the project chairman likewise being an Executive Board of Management member, was highly expected to comment on the said water crisis in the school, being in his capacity as the project chairman, hence his timely

statement being valid without fear or favour as such and thus wondered why the said Nancy Wanyonyi was being nervous over an issue that was already in the public domain, having herself intentionally initiated the said project court process, thus further being subject to this project committee's candid report in search of justice as such;

31. That on 14th June 2019, at around 2.30pm, Dickson Muyoti who had earlier been implicated by Nancy Wanyonyi as her informer alongside Wycliffe Musiambo, ironically paid a courtesy call to the project chairman at Kamukuywa market, observing that he personally wanted to indicate to the project chairman concerning Wycliffe Musiambo's incitement and falsehood to the said Nancy Wanyonyi during a burial ceremony at Metrine Wafula Dishoni on 1st June 2019, being that the chairman disrespected Nancy Wanyonyi in his remarks during Misemwa Sec. School's AGM. Thus the said Muyoti further strongly distanced himself as being an informer, alleging that it was coincidentally in his presence when Musiambo made the statement, hence the assumption by the said Nancy Wanyonyi of him Muvoti being an ally of the said Musiambo, thus having been on the said chairman's assertion that Nancy Wanyonyi had implicated him as her informer as such, of which the said Dickson Muyoti apparently indicated his willingness to testify as a witness regarding the said Musiambo's malicious acts of being an informer, witch hunting and conspiring against the project chairman and the committee, being against the committee's mandate in respect of the said public water project community awareness as such.

Report Recommendations:

Based on the above and being in particular of the said severally mentioned malicious secret project land ownership change; malicious community project obstruction and malicious project court case, the project committee (being Misemwa Community Water Users Association), being on behalf of the beneficiary communities of Misemwa; Wabukhonyi and Nabikoto sub-locations, hereby candidly and being without fear or favour, accordingly petition His Excellency the President of the Republic of Kenya, being the chief custodian of public funds and resources, on behalf of the project taxpayers beneficiary communities and including all taxpayer citizens of Kenya, of which the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP); Director of Criminal Investigations (DCI) and Ethics and Anticorruption Commission

(EACC); being jointly with: both National Assembly's Public Investment Committee (PIC) and Land, Environment & Natural Resources Committee; Executive Office of the President jointly with Presidential Delivery Unit (PDU), State Ministry of Water and Sanitation; State Ministry of Environment & Natural Resources; State Ministry of Interior & Co-ordination of Government services jointly with National Development Implementation and Communication, Cabinet Committee (NDICCC); National Land Commission (NLC); National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA); Water Resources Management Authority (WARMA); Water Services Regulatory Board (WASREB); the Media, among others, are jointly tasked with urgent; speedy; comprehensive and objective investigations & fact-finding, being complete with any such appropriate legal action for prosecution relating to project crimes committed and/or implementation relating to project conservation, being in respect of (but not limited to) the following committee recommendations:

- i. That both Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi, being jointly with other family members and former land owner Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde & family, knowingly and maliciously conspired to sabotage Namaramabi Community Water Supply project through secret project land ownership change of land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328; unlawful project obstruction; rushing and lying to the Honourable court of project trespass; among others, being contrary to the prevailing legally witnessed project land sale agreement and project documents & records, being actionable in law, hence investigations and prosecutions highly recommended;
- ii. That the 1st Plaintiff in the said project court case, being the owner of the said contested project land parcel and who doubles as the said family Head -Nancy Wanyonyi, is accordingly recommended for investigation and prosecution for negligence to appropriately advice her family of the project validity, having been aware and knowingly participated in the said project public community connectivity meeting dated 31st July 2017, being as one of the beneficiary speakers and kshs 500/= registration from former MCA-John Musakali, likewise the fact that the said Nancy Wanyonyi's family was already connected to the project waterline, being Budalangi market waterline as such. Further Nancy Wanyonyi has on two occasions knowingly indicated of having been tricked or misled by the former land owner Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde into buying the project two-acre land parcel, being on 18th Jan 2019 to the project chairman and again 4th June 2019 through

William Namanda to the project chairman, hence she is further accused of but not limited to falsehoods and material non-disclosure in her sworn affidavit as such;

- iii. That Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi , being the 2nd Plaintiff in the said project court case, co- owner of the contested project land parcel and the second in command of the said family, is accordingly recommended for investigation and prosecution for negligence to appropriately advice the family against the earlier aforementioned malicious acts, likewise he's accused of falsehoods and material non-disclosure regarding all the facts about the background of the said project court dispute, hence occasioning the case delay, thus denying beneficiary communities of their constitutional right to clean, safe and affordable water by the state;
- iv. That Kennedy Wanyonyi who is the 2nd born male family member, is severally accused of character assassination and undermining the project committee and the local state administration, hence the presidency and the project beneficiary communities, he's further accused of incitement and conspiracy to sabotage the said public benefitting water project, being through the planting of non-water friendly exotic trees within the immediate project catchment knowingly and without any form of notification on 8th July 2018, likewise his malicious act of project obstruction dated 25th Nov 2018, where he sarcastically insulted the project chairman as being a fool and nothing before him and thereafter incited his follower brother DCC David Wanyonyi of his position having been threatened by the chairman, thus emotionally charging/catalyzing the said DCC who immediately contacted the said project chairman alleging the same, hence investigation and prosecution desired;
- v. That DCC David Wanyonyi who is the 3rd born male family member and a senior state administrator in the State Ministry of Interior & Co-ordination of government services, is severally accused of negligence to accordingly advice his family regarding state funding projects³ guidelines, and likewise is accused of undermining/abuse of office and conspiracy among others, being in respect of his unlawful acts of planting non-water friendly exotic trees within the immediate project catchment knowingly and without any form of notification on 8th July 2018, likewise his malicious unlawful project obstruction where he jointly with his brother Kennedy locked the project sump, further using a government vehicle (i.e.

yellow double-cabin GKB 271J) to the project obstruction site, more-so his indication to the project chairman during his phone call of the committee having not sought to meet him, further his warning of the project chairman's imminent arrest were he to dare visit the project obstructed site-through a phone call to earlier aforementioned Japheth Simiyu Njakusi (i.e. PTA Chairman and a fellow board member to the project chairman at Friends Sec. School -Misemwa), being among other allegations, being contrary to the already existing public water facilities, being long before the said malicious secret project land ownership change, which is directly perceived as disrespect and abuse to the project committee and the state administration that he ironically serves, hence demeaning the presidency, the beneficiary communities including himself and all taxpayer citizens of the Republic of Kenya, among other project stakeholders, hence the consequential recommendation for his investigation and prosecution, being in respect of chapter six and the Bill of rights of the affected citizens as is reflected in the Kenya Supreme Law, thus being a similar case that previously befell former Deputy Chief Justice of Supreme Court of Kenya- one Nancy Barasa;

- vi. That Lorna Wanyonyi who is the 3rd born female and apparently the eldest female sibling and a neighbor to his brother Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi in Kamukuywa suburban, is the Ass. Chief of Nabikoto sub-location within the project area of coverage, is thus severally accused of negligence to appropriately advise her family, likewise abuse of office, falsehoods and conspiracy regarding the said family's allegation of project trespass, being in her capacity as a local state administrator, having participated in person during Kamukuywa stakeholders meeting dated 18th August 2016, shortly after project advertisement dated 5th August 2016, likewise having been severally represented at various project sensitization and crucial stakeholders meetings, being before and after the said August 18th meeting, of which Andrew Wanyonyi was a full-time representative of the said Ass. Chief Lorna Wanyonyi being jointly with Anthony Kubasali -Nyumba Kumi Chairman and a full representative of Kamukuywa Location Chief Eliud Kisiang'ani, Martin Wasike-fulltime community representative and opinion leader, Dennis Musamali-PTA chairman of Wamalwa Kijana High School, Kamukuywa, a full-time institutions representative and NCKK chairman Kamukuywa Location, among other key stakeholders from Kamukuywa Location who have strongly

indicated their willingness to testify as witnesses regarding the full knowledge and involvement of Ass. Chief Lorna Wanyonyi in the said public water project, of which her family's otherwise denial being jointly with her knowledge and support is indeed actionable in law, hence recommendation for her investigation and prosecution, being in respect of her hypocrisy in knowingly sabotaging state development programme being among the presidential Big Four Agenda;

vii. That Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi being a family member, an advocate of the high court and counsel to the 1st & 2nd plaintiff in the said malicious project court case, is severally accused of negligence to professional advice; profession abuse; conspiracy; falsehoods; among others, being in respect of the said family's malicious project land ownership change; malicious unlawful project obstruction; malicious project court case; among others and being with his full knowledge, his earlier aforementioned profession misconduct dated 2nd January 2019 (i.e. refer to counsel to the 1st Respondent's letter dated 8th January 2019), likewise the aforementioned profession misconduct that arose on the 6th June 2019 during the said project case proceedings where it emerged that the said Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi had all along the court process never served the project contractor and who is the 3rd respondent, being knowing and tactically by the said Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi to lock out the 3rd respondent's crucial project obstruction defense evidence, likewise the said counsel to the plaintiff behaving unprofessionally arrogant and temperamental, thus completely refusing to sign the said 3rd respondent's defense on the 6th June 2019 in the presence of the project committee members and counsel to the 1st Respondent, thus prompting the said 3rd Respondent to resort to registered mail service in order to serve his defense to the plaintiff, being due to the earlier aforementioned arrogance and profession misconduct by the said Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi, being contrary to the prevailing profession rules of procedure, hence the recommendation for his investigation and prosecution among other profession repercussions as such;

viii. Malcolm Wabwile Simiyu who is the elder son of the said DCC David Wanyonyi and a grandson to Nancy Wanyonyi and who is alleged to have fully participated in said unlawful project obstruction after the project chairman had left the site, is severally accused of witch-hunt; conspiracy; falsehoods; among others, being jointly with the said family members, being in respect of his malicious mpesa deposit of

kshs 10.00 to the project chairman mpesa account on 25th November 2018 after the said unlawful project obstruction incident, being in an effort to get the true identity of the said project chairman, leading to submission of the earlier aforementioned baseless letter copied to the project chairman and being in the name of the said project chairman instead of the committee and contrary to rules of procedure, eventually culminating to the aforementioned malicious project court case, being at the expense of the beneficiary seriously affected schools/institutions and households, hence the recommendation for his investigation and prosecution;

- ix. That Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi jointly with other family members, including their secret agents/informers and the former land owner & family, are jointly and severally accused of conspiracy of the highest order, being to sabotage state development programme and which constitutionally constitute to an economic crime against humanity and being to the directly affected beneficiary communities, being in respect of the said malicious secret project land ownership change; the unlawful malicious project obstruction; the eventual malicious project court case; among others, having occasioned severe water shortage due to prolonged severe drought that has dearly cost a fortune of time and money to beneficiary schools/institutions and households to date, being subject to the said family and partners selfish gain(s) against the state intended public project gain, hence investigations and prosecutions accordingly recommended;
- x. That earlier the aforementioned Wycliffe Musiambo who is the confirmed malicious informer/mole of the said Nancy Wanyonyi's family, is independently or otherwise accused of witch-hunt; falsehoods; incitement; character assassination; conspiracy and sabotage; among others, being for his selfish gain or otherwise, being against the well-intended state funded public benefitting community water supply project, of which his investigation is highly recommended in respect of the earlier aforementioned Dickson Muyoti's willingness to testify regarding the said aforementioned Musiambo's 1st June 2019 incitement mission to Nancy Wanyonyi during burial ceremony at Metine Wafula Dishoni's home (within the project coverage area), hence his prosecution further accordingly recommended as such;

xi. That there exists evidence of the project target beneficiary communities having strongly contested the said malicious secret project land ownership change, following the coincidental surprise revelation of the said project land ownership change by the earlier aforementioned DCC David Wanyonyi and his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi on 8th July 2018, being during project stakeholders meeting dated 24th August 2018, following the said forum's unanimous endorsement of the project committee's detailed project report complete with recommendations, among them being the "compulsory acquisition and fact-finding of the earlier aforementioned malicious secret project land ownership change", having been contrary to the legally witnessed binding project land sale Agreement between parties and having been effected (i.e. ownership change) when all project facilities were already in place, hence the recommendation for all the petitioned multi-state agencies to jointly and diligently fact-find and recommend most appropriately in line with project conservation, sustainability and value for public funds;

xii. That further, there exists evidence of public utility land from the said contested land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, whose total acreage is 9.50 acres as confirmed during the said land sale agreement meeting between parties dated 7th April 2017, of which the former land owner Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde technically chose to hide the land title deed and only alleged of his land acreage being 9.50 acres. Thus the actual title deed acreage reflected on both the previous Wekhuyi's and the current Wanyonyi's is 3.54 hectares, hence an hectare being equivalent to 2.471 acres, indicates title deed acreage as being equivalent to 8.74734 acres, thus projecting an estimated 0.75266 acres as being project and/or public utility land meant for intake spring immediate catchment, of which it's strongly recommended that the said earlier aforementioned petitioned multi-state agencies should therefore investigate and fact-find the matter with a view of hiving off the said public utility land(if any), being before the demarcation of the said project two acre land sale agreement and finally recommend accordingly for any such prosecutions relevant with the said malicious ownership change and project obstruction;

xiii. That ironically, the said malicious and unlawful project obstruction dated 25th Nov 2018 was interestingly executed shortly after installation of the delayed project transformer on 21st Nov 2018, thus previously there wasn't any such allegation of project trespass being before, during and after project implementation phases, of

which **project pre-implementation period factored**: Seven key community sensitization forums dated between 3rd June 2016 to 5th August 2016, formal project survey dated 15th June 2016, official project advertisement (i.e. East African Standard Newspaper on page 35) dated 5th Aug 2016, and complete with one major project stakeholders meeting hosted by Kamukuywa Division-Assistant County Commissioner dated 18th August 2016; **project implementation period** further factored several crucial project forums being: Public Project Contractor availing ceremony dated 28th Oct 2016, public project land sale meeting dated 7th April 2017, project public participation for Environmental Impact Assessment meeting dated 31st May 2017, Honourable John Musakali public community connectivity meeting dated 31st July 2017, Institutions water pipeline expansion public meeting dated 30th Nov 2017, 26 months project stakeholders public briefing meeting dated 24th August 2018; among others, hence all these public forums being without any objection and of which all project coverage local state administrators were aware of the project, being:-both Ndivisi & Kamukuywa Divisions Accs-Monica Muli and Francis Karuri respectively; chiefs Patrick Khisa & Eluid Kisiang'ani for both Namarambi and Kamukuywa Locations respectively, and Assistant chiefs Stuart Wafula, Wilson Mumaina, Lorna Wanyonyi and Francis Tawai being for Misemwa, Wabukhonyi, Nabikoto and Musembe sub-locations respectively, hence the malicious secret project land ownership change; malicious unlawful project obstruction; malicious project court case; among others, are acts being highly suspect and questionable, thus the recommendation for all inclusive investigations and prosecutions of persons involved, for purposes of serving as a public example and future reference in line with the security and value for public funds as such;

xiv. That consequently, the project committee being on behalf of the taxpayers beneficiary communities and including all taxpayers citizens of the Republic of Kenya, further pray to the said Multi-state agencies action as follows:

- a) That the said legally witnessed project two-acre Land sale agreement between parties was binding, hence the mandatory subdivision of the said land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 between the said public utility water project and the current land owner OR compulsory state acquisition of the said whole parcel in favour of the project for compensation, being in line with

the 24th August 2018 project stakeholders meeting affirmative recommendation for project conservation and sustainability;

- b) That the earlier aforementioned Nancy Wanyonyi's family suspicious acts of malicious secret project land ownership change; malicious unlawful project obstruction; malicious project court case; being among others, legally constitute to economic crimes against humanity, hence the said family being constitutionally unfit to hold any public office, being due to their tainted integrity public image and violation of the right to clean, safe affordable water for all, hence investigations and prosecutions as such. Over the same state intelligence agencies are further petitioned to diligently initiate an investigation regarding a rumour doing rounds within the project coverage area for almost two years now, being an open secret in public domain that the said Nancy Wanyonyi 's family has already positioned itself for the chief's positions in both Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations, being in respect of the retiring or retired chiefs Patrick Khisa and Eliud Kisiang'ani for Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations respectively. Thus the said rumour can be easily and at randomly be established from the said bitterly and publicly complaining affected community beneficiary communities of Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations, being that the said family confidentially and at times openly brags of being the government of the day, being due to their senior state positions they hold; their financial muscle and their deep-rooted connections within the previous and current governments as being their game-changer as such, of which the earlier aforementioned arrogant Kennedy Wanyonyi and the Assistant Chief Lorna Wanyonyi are the rumoured presumed yet to be imposed chiefs for Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations respectively in-waiting, hence the essence of this report's arisen matter over the issue and which should be treated as a whistle blower(i.e. MWUA) not witness as such, being in respect of the said complaining project beneficiary communities regarding the repercussion of state imposed officers, whose painful result is automatically the non-delivery of intended government services, being due non-deserving office holders as such, hence further recommendation for investigations;

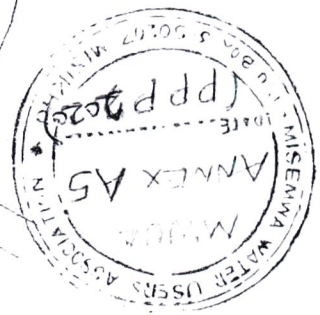
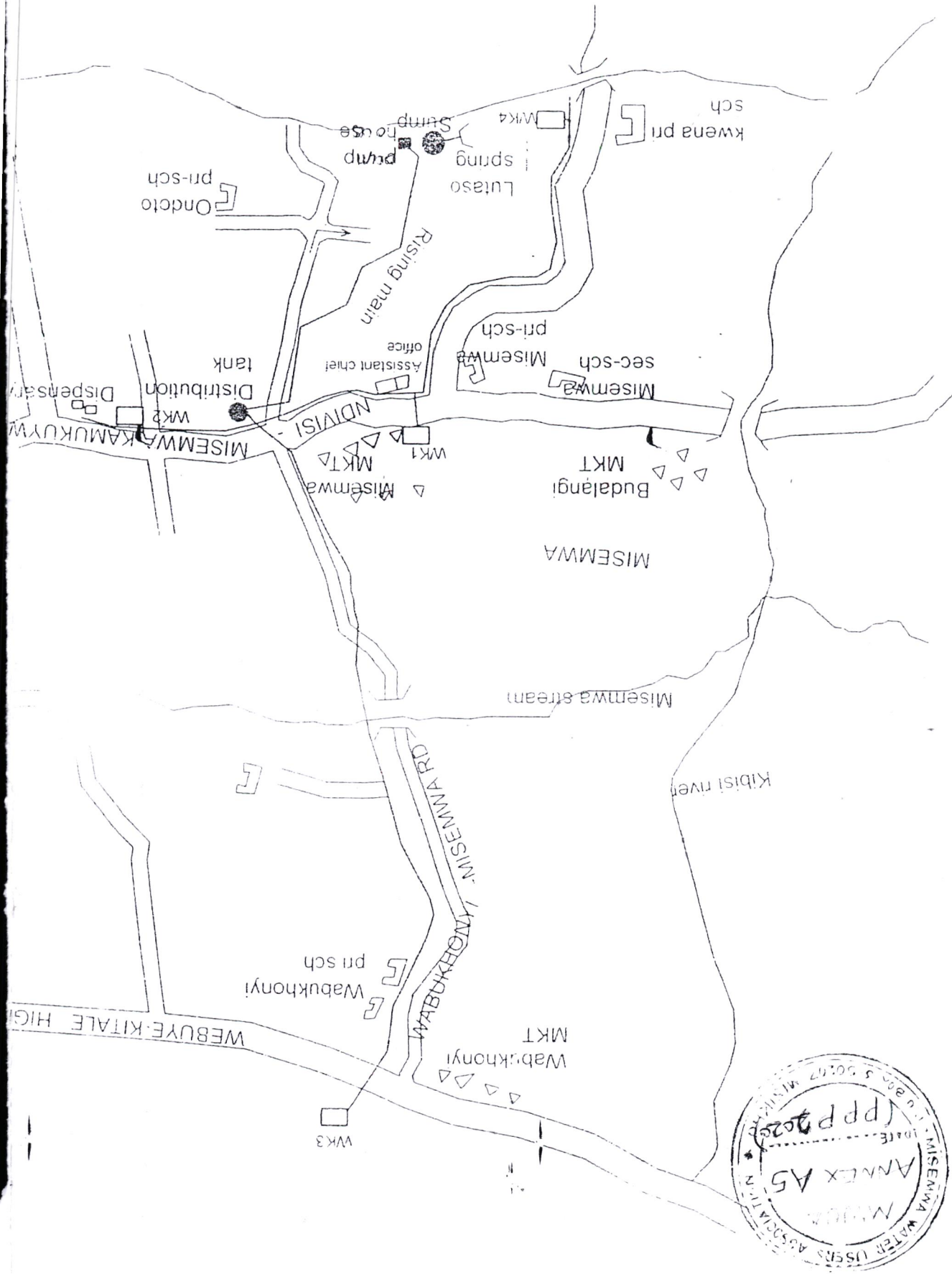

- e) That summarily, this candid document seeks and/or recommends for retrieval of all but not limited to the earlier aforementioned mobile phone call conservations, being as further evidence for informed decisions, being by or between but not limited to the said Nancy Wanyonyi's family jointly with their informers; former land owner jointly with family; project committee; local state administration, project contractor & workers; beneficiary community members; among others being before; during and after the said

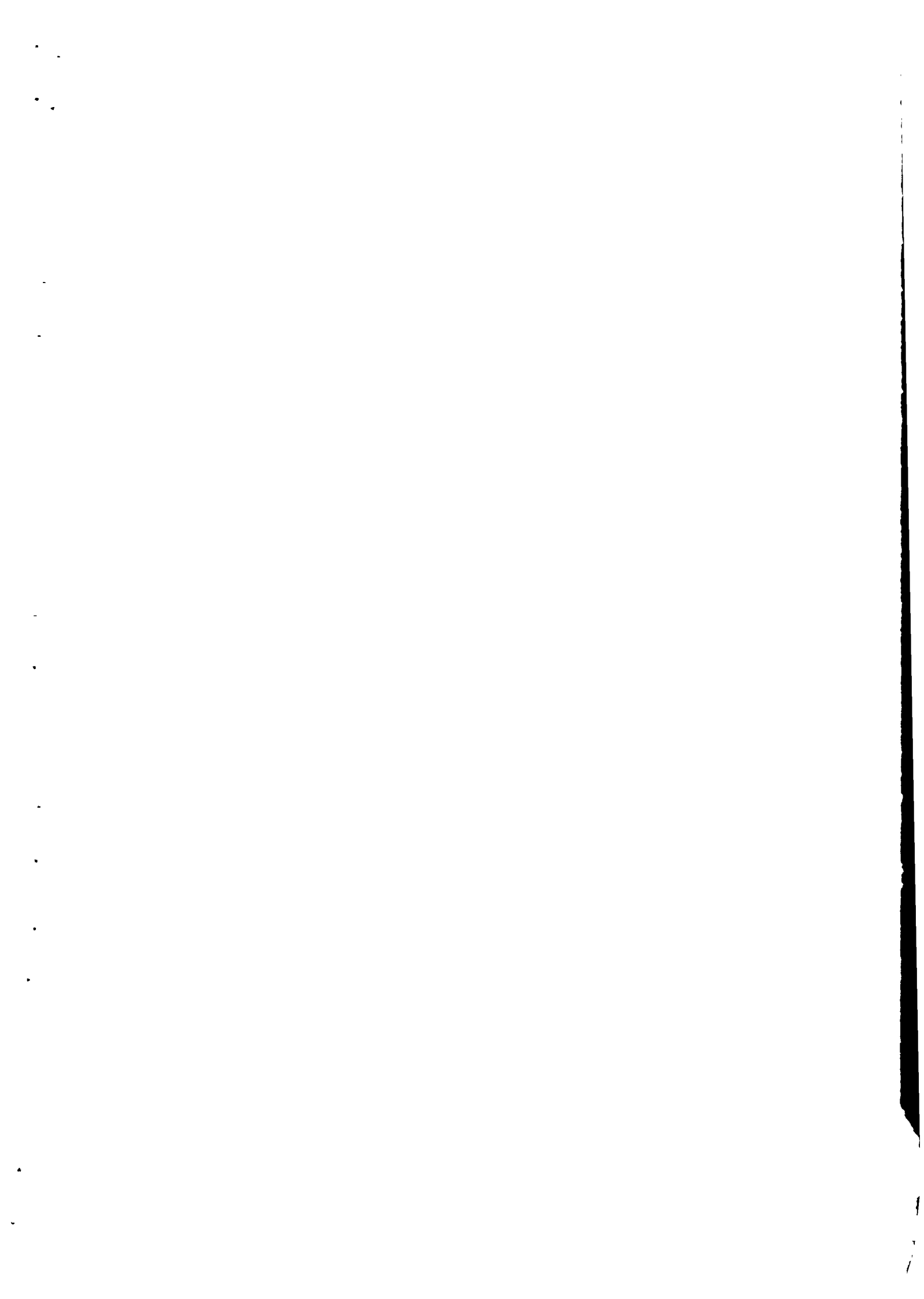

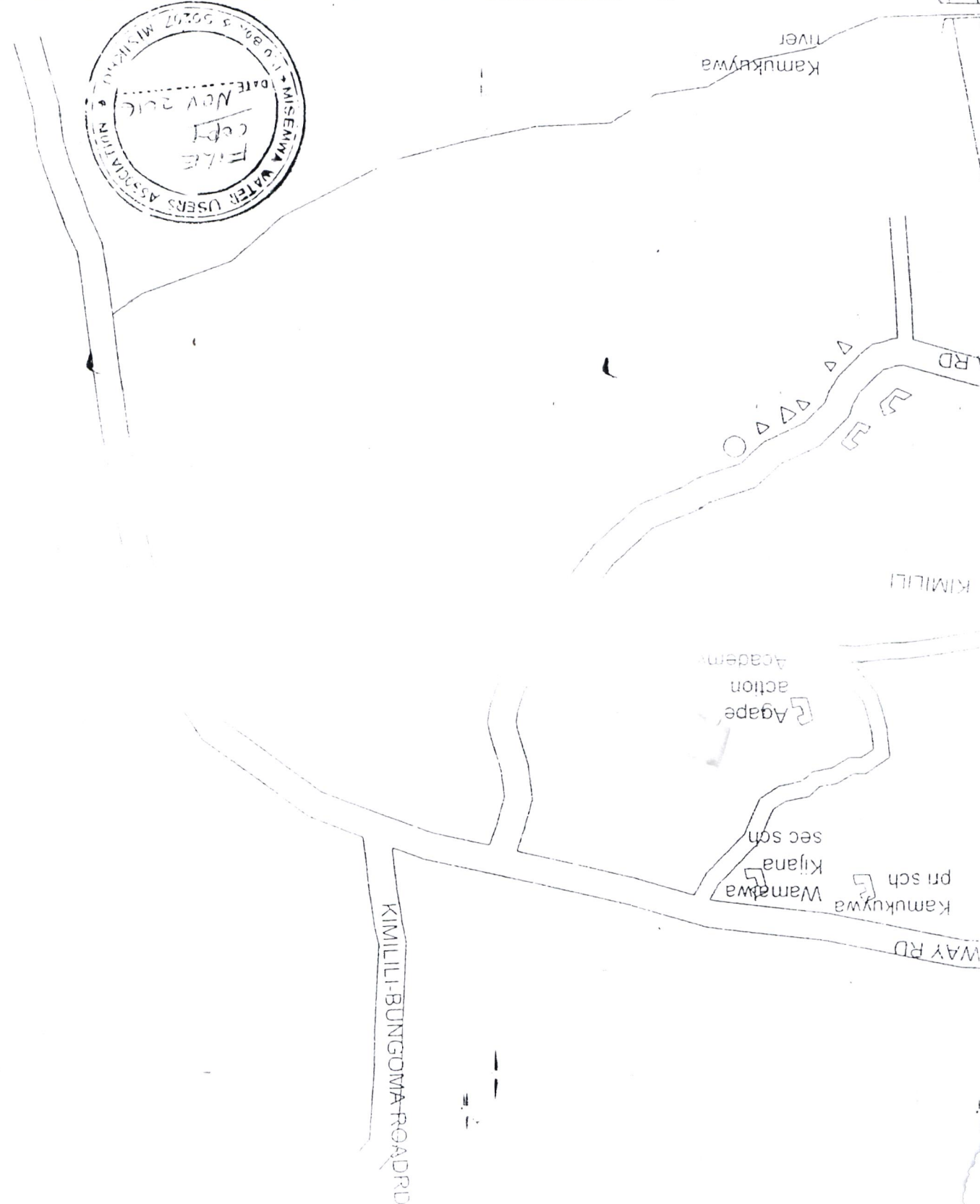

Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP) is a multi-million state funded public project by the State Ministry of Water & Sanitation in May 2016, through Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as the project client and whose Project Committee is Misemwa Community Water Users Association (MWUA), which is a Water Service Provider (WSP) registered with the Registrar of Societies and is the Community Based Organization of the year 2015/2016 under LVNWSB jurisdiction of 8 counties, based in Misemwa sub-location of Ndivisi Division. The said project area of coverage has a target population of 38,742 people, being within but not limited to Misemwa, Wabukhonyi and Nabikoto sub-locations of Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations of Bungoma East and Kimilili Sub-counties respectively. Thus the project is facing sabotage of the highest order by a high ranking state administrator jointly with the family as above indicated and as per the attached hereto comprehensive project petition report complete with introductory annexed documents.

Thus following the above project committee's bold landmark resolutions dated 26th May 2019 and 15th June 2019 respectively, including petitions formalization resolutions dated 14th Aug 2019 and 24th Aug 2018 as per the attached committee/community petitioners separate lists, being complete with both petitions forwarding authority resolution dated 23rd Sept 2019, your good office is hereby kindly petitioned as above jointly with others, in respect of the project committee's comprehensive presidential multi-state

agencies petition report for action dated 17th June 2019, including the project community /stakeholders detailed petition report dated 24th Aug 2018, being the subject matter of malicious secret project land ownership change; malicious unlawful project obstruction and malicious delayed project court case, including profiled veiled security threats directed at the project chairman, hence project sabotage as such.

Accordingly, based on the public officers' or otherwise constitutional compliance with Chapter six and the Leadership and Integrity Act, being in consideration of the project beneficiaries infringed rights and value for public funds, the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) in conjunction with the Director of Criminal Investigations (DCI) and Ethics and Anti-corruption Commission (EACC), being jointly with other mentioned multi-state agencies, are humbly petitioned to urgently take over and handle the said malicious project court dispute by legally recalling the said project court case file (i.e. SPM ELC 47 of 2018 at Kimilili law courts) or otherwise, in order to avert further beneficiary communities suffering, being Schools; Health Centres; Households; Business Enterprises; among others, thus allowing for immediate project operation and conservation, hence project sustainability and value for public funds, among others.

In the same vein, the said aforementioned multi-state agencies including the Executive Office of the President, are reminded and further petitioned in respect of three critical governance issues observed by His Excellency President Uhuru Kenyatta during his 2017 second term inaugural speech and as was likewise reflected during the international Anti-Corruption day dated 9th Dec 2017, whose theme being "United Against Corruption" (i.e. from the standard newspaper on page 22 of 9th Dec 2017), as quoted in part hereunder:-

On your part, as their employer, it is your responsibility to demand accountability from all public officials**.


- Corruption represses people, communities and nations at large. It first attacks the value system of any society. My fellow countrymen and women, this must be where we direct the fiercest of our efforts.

MIN-01/05/2019: Preliminaries:

- ❖ The meeting was called to order at 3.45pm with an opening prayer from Joseph Wekesa, a member's apology was noted.

MIN-02/05/2019: Chairman's Opening Remarks:

- ❖ The Chairman observed that following the surprise malicious project court case dated 18th Dec 2018, the committee has had several informal consultation meetings over the same with the local administration, the board (i.e. LVNWSB), Institutions among others, thus only one committee meeting having been held on 27th January 2019.
- ❖ He revealed that the committee had forwarded all crucial sensitive documents linking Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi's family of having been aware of the project following the committee resolution dated 27/01/2019 hence allegation of project trespass on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 was null and void, likewise suspect and malicious.
- ❖ The meeting was informed that project transformer earlier installed on 21st November, 2018, had been on 5th Feb 2019 taken away by Kenya Power & Lighting Company –Webuye office, being under unclear circumstances and without any formal notice to project stakeholders, being Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as the project client, project contractor-Namwaya Enterprises Limited and Misemwa Water Users Association as the project committee, including the local state administrators as such.
- ❖ That KPLC Webuye office later alleged the prevailing project dispute as being the cause, when the project contractor followed up the matter on 18th Feb 2019.
- ❖ It was further reported that on 15th May 2019, the project contractor had removed the previously installed project electric mortar from the power-house, siting insecurity issues and being in consultation with the project area assistant chief and the committee, of which the said mortar was kept at Mzee John Kiberenge's home. Hence the project contractor alleged the prolonged court case and lack of security light due to removal of the power transformer as having occasioned the same.
- ❖ The meeting was likewise informed of a section of the project waterline having been vandalized, being on Kwena Primary School main-line at Mzee Alfayo Wanyonyi road crossing, thus part of the GI pipe stolen by a known Kwena resident one Mr. Barasa. Hence the same information being from area assistant chief's office, the meeting was in agreement that the project contractor be notified to launch an

official complain at the area police post/camp for investigation into the matter, being in consultation with the said assistant chief's office.

MIN-03/05/2019- Deliberation on Project Way forward following the delayed project case (i.e. SPM ELC 47 of 2018 -Kimilili) dated 18/12/2018:

i. Project Court Case brief/status;

- ❖ The meeting learnt with shock that project court case on 16th May 2019 had been determined as being valid despite the prevailing project documents and records that indicate otherwise.
- ❖ It was observed that the senior principal magistrate's ruling of the validity of the said case was suspect and in bad faith, thus occasioning further delay and being against the intended project public gain as such.
- ❖ It was further shockingly revealed that the said honourable court's determination was suspiciously based on flimsy grounds being the erroneous defense dates among others and being without the said court's confirmation from the said defense supporting documents annexed for the same purpose.
- ❖ The meeting was informed that mention of the said case was slated for 6th June 2019 and was set for full hearing on a later date, being further delay and suffering to project beneficiary communities.
- ❖ It was indicated that the project chairperson, the project area assistant chief, among others were to swear affidavits or statements at the board headquarters on 3rd June 2019, being in preparation for the full hearing of the said case.
- ❖ The meeting was in agreement that in preparation for the said full hearing, the contractor's unskilled labourer present on site during project obstruction and other beneficiary community members bearing the history of land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 should be factored as key witness of the contractor in order for truth to be established in respect of the malicious project obstruction, hence the prevailing malicious project case.

- ❖ The meeting urged that the contractor add to his witnesses Mr. Michael Juma Khaemba, who has a long history of the said land parcel and a keen beneficiary community member from the word go.

ii. Way forward

- ❖ Following the earlier aforementioned court ruling of the validity of the said case occasioning further delay of the project case, hence project operation delay, the committee deliberated at length and expressed concern over the issue as being project sabotage.
- ❖ The meeting unanimously agreed to compile a comprehensive presidential multi-state agencies project report for action, being in respect of the said suspicious court ruling dated 16th May 2019, hence occasioning further project operation delay, being delayed and/or denied justice to beneficiary communities, hence the suffering school children/students, households, business enterprises, among others.
- ❖ The committee noted with concern that the said project case initially filed under certificate of urgency, suspiciously took a record of six months culminating in the earlier aforementioned suspicious determination of its validity hence the compromised project public interest and value for public funds as such.
- ❖ Committee members unanimously agreed that justice can only be achieved through the committee's brain-child presidential multi-state agencies petition project report, being a land-mark decision by the said selfless project committee members, being in respect of the eluding justice to project beneficiary communities. Thus ^{the} following state independent institutions were proposed for onward forwarding of the said project report to facilitate prosecution and project conservation, hence sustainability:
 - (i) Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP)
 - (ii) Director of Criminal Investigations (DCI)
 - (iii) Ethics and Anti-corruption Commission (EACC)
 - (iv) National Assembly's Public Investment Committee (PIC) and Land, Environment & Natural Resources Committee,
 - (v) Office of the President jointly with Presidential Delivery Unit (PDU)
 - (vi) State Ministry for Water & Sanitation

NCWSP Extra-Ordinary Committee meeting.

- (vii) State Ministry ^{of} Environment & Natural Resources,
- (viii) State Ministry ~~for~~ Interior & Coordination of Government services jointly with National Development Implementation and Communications Cabinet Committee (NDICCC),
- (ix) National Land Commission (NLC),
- (x) Water Resource Management Authority (WARMA)
- (xi) National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA),
- (xii) Water Services Regulatory Board (WASREB).

- ❖ Members agreed to inform the beneficiary communities about the project status through public forums, the media, elected leaders and local administrators, following the prevailing discontented ~~report~~ regarding the project delayed court case, being within the project area of coverage and beyond.
- ❖ The meeting unanimously agreed to co-operate fully with any such individuals and/or agencies with interest in the quest for justice, either being locally or internationally and who may need any such project information concerning the said project obstruction, malicious delayed project case among others, and being on formal requested as per the rules of procedure.
- ❖ The meeting was further in agreement that on confirmation of the delivery of the said project petition report to the said earlier aforementioned multi-state agencies, mainstream media houses would be forwarded with copies of the same documents for highlighting and monitoring the matter locally and internationally for the sake of justice as such.
- ❖ A time frame of 3-4 weeks was allowed to accomplish the agreed upon project presidential multi-state agencies petition report for committee adoption on a later date, based on its significance and the intended purpose overall.
- ❖ It was finally agreed that the project committee monitoring funds be followed up with the project client (i.e. Lake Victoria North Water Services Board -LVNWSB), thus members alluded that the board had displayed dishonesty over the issue since late October 2016 to-date by not being mindful of the said project committee members project monitoring commitment for the said period.
- ❖ Over the same, the committee was to further seek financial assistance from the said project client towards settling of typing and printing accrued debt related to project court documents, among others, occasioned by the board's dragging its feet

regarding project catchment land issue, despite the committee's previous timely alert and communication, thus leading to the prevailing delayed project operation as earlier expressed and explained.

MIN-04/05/2019: Any Other Business: (A.O.B)

- ❖ The meeting was informed that PA Kizito Temba had promised to make a follow-up to enhance project expansion through further project funding.
- ❖ Two committee members, assistant chief and project contractor were scheduled to meet the board's lawyer on 3rd June 2019 at the board offices at Kakamega.
- ❖ It arose that there was need introduce project malicious and unlawful obstruction report in the ongoing project court case, being in consideration of enabling or alerting the said court to make an informed decision contrary to what transpired on the said validity ruling of the project case by the said court dated 16th May 2019.
- ❖ On conclusion of catchment land purchase later on, access road would be demarcated to join the project intake catchment to adjacent farms to further enhance adjacent beneficiary community project ownership, hence project sustainability as such.
- ❖ The committee proposed partnering with NZOWASCO in water service provision within adjacent sub-urban areas of Misikhu, Lugulu, Kamukuywa, Mukuyuni, among others, and being in line with the previously intended project expansion programme.
- ❖ Thus the County Government, Lake Victoria North Water Services Board – LVNWSB, National Government, among others were to be petitioned over the said/intended project expansion programme as such.

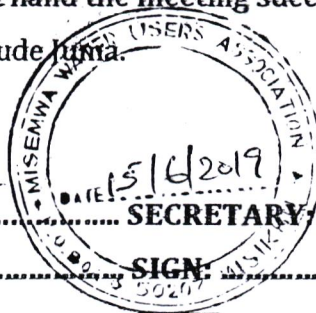

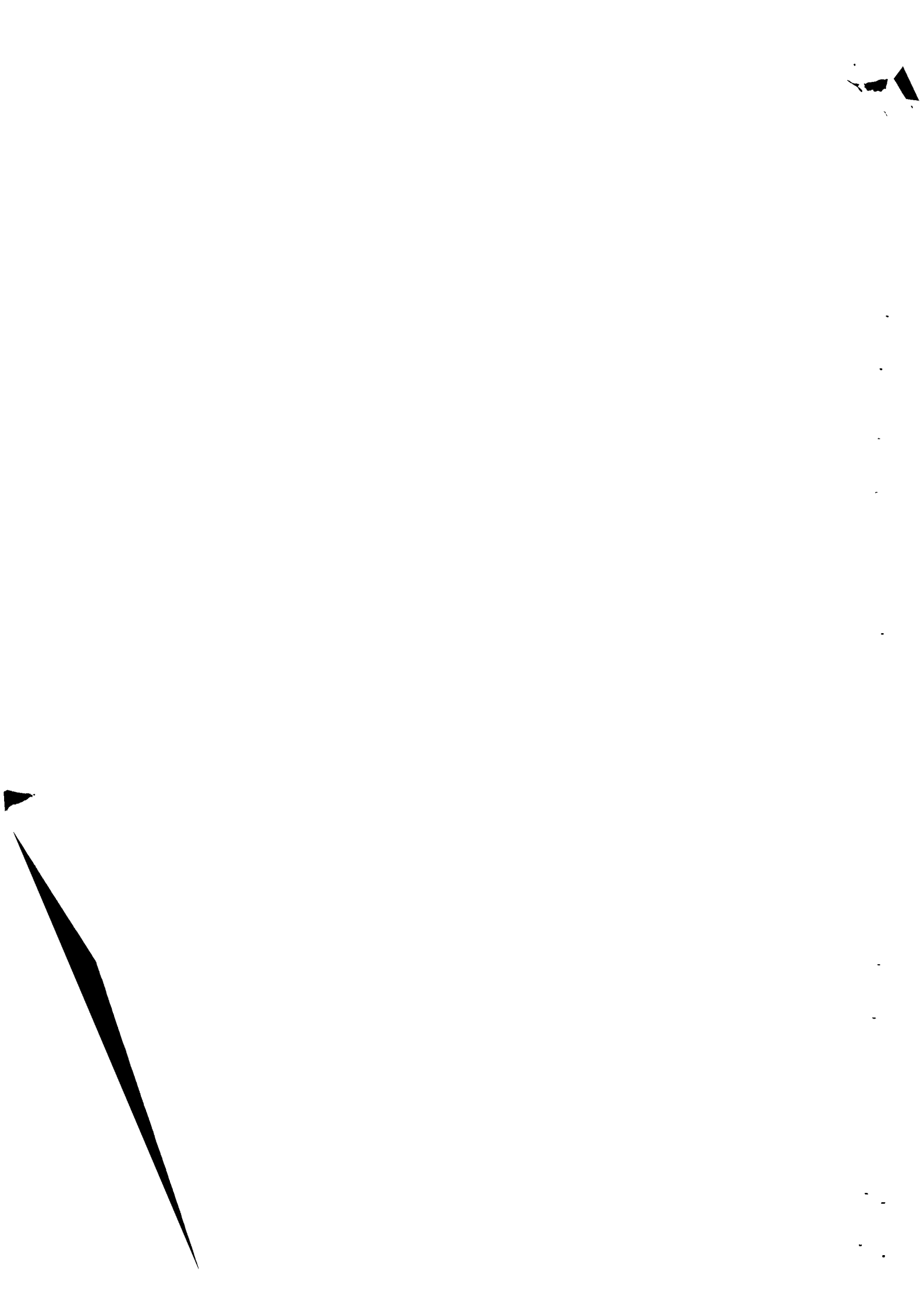

- ❖ The meeting was informed that a Community beneficiary member Michael Juma Khaemba was included as a contractor's witness, being jointly with David Wafula Muloma who was at works on the day of Malicious Project obstruction dated 25/11/2018 of which the aforementioned Michael Juma Khaemba attended crucial project meetings complete with being very conversant with the long history of land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, hence the two being relevant witnesses to the project malicious case as such;
- ❖ It was further indicated that project chairman Robert Lupaoh and Lake Victoria North Water Services Board CDM-Nelly Mkokko are key witnesses of the said project case, of which the committee observed with concern that the plaintiff jointly with the family were not comfortable with project chairman and committee members firm stand regarding the prevailing committee project documents, hence the said family's consistence witch-hunting of the said project chairman, which was apparently alarming, hence action desired.
- ❖ Members were informed of the last project court case session having been on 6th June 2019, where it suspiciously arose that the project contractor hadn't filed his defense contrary to the prevailing filed documents dated 6th Feb 2019, of which the said project contractor on the other hand claimed that counsel to the plaintiff- Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi hadn't served the project contractor (as the 3rd Respondent) with any court documents or orders during the whole prevailing court process, revealing some foul play to down-play crucial unlawful project obstruction evidence directly linking a senior state administrator family member as such.
- ❖ The meeting further observed with shock that Nancy Wanyonyi, being the 1st Plaintiff of project case had assassinated the project chairman's character by alleging that the said chairman had disrespected her by informing the beneficiary community that the said Nancy Wanyonyi's family had filed a case against the public water project, during Friend's Secondary School-Misemwa Annual General Meeting dated 31st May 2019, of which William Namanada reported the same ^{to} the project chairman on 4th June 2019 indicating that the aforementioned Nancy Wanyonyi had



tasked him with the mission, further alluding that the said Nancy Wanyonyi had confided to him that the former land owner Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde misled ^{her} into buying the project two acre land sale agreement land, thus having previously confided the same to the project chairman during Friend's Secondary School-Misemwa form three parents meeting dated 18th January 2019.

- ❖ Committee members were made aware that the next project court case session was scheduled for 4th July 2019, whereby counsel to the 1st Respondent (LVNWSB) had insisted to project chairman that due to the prevailing project documents, the board legal team shall seek the high court intervention in the event the lower court denies justice to project beneficiary communities, being in line with value for public funds.
- ❖ The meeting was finally informed that the project committee, Misemwa Water Users Association (MWUA) was officially invited and represented by the chairman during Nzoia Water Supply Company (NZOWASCO) stakeholders meeting held at Green Velle Hotel -Bungoma, being the initial company directors appointment process as such, of which a detailed report shall be availed in the next committee meeting due to the pending overwhelming committee report adoption, being ^{the} main agenda of the day.

MIN-03/06/2019: Adoption of the proposed committee Presidential Multi-State Agencies Petition report for action:

- ❖ The meeting was in agreement that the proposed multi-state agencies petition report be tabled for procedural adoption purposes, in order to enhance fast-tracking of the project commencement through the earlier aforementioned petitioned multi-state agencies on behalf of His Excellency the President of the Republic of Kenya, as earlier tabulated during the Extra-Ordinary project committee meeting dated 26th May 2019, regarding the state funded Namarambi Community Water Supply Project malicious secret project land ownership change, malicious project obstruction and malicious project delayed court case, being in respect of the suffering intended beneficiary communities.
- ❖ The meeting noted with a lot of concern that the fast eluding project justice was to be urgently attained through the said committee's brain-child petition report, of which members were taken through, the said report at length, with the said

committee members making various observations in support of the document until the exercise was successfully concluded and to the satisfaction of all present as such.

- ❖ It was unanimously agreed that the committee adopts the project report for onward forwarding to the said petitioned multi-state agencies, of which members hailed the said adopted revelation document as being what the public project deserves in respect of justice through its candid alert to the Executive arm of the state government of how economic crimes are conceived and executed unabated by state officers and being against the code of Ethics as such,
- ❖ The meeting was further in agreement that typing and printing of the adopted comprehensive petition report be private and confidential including minutes of both committee meetings dated 26th May 2019 and 15th June 2019 respectively and after which the project management was to write a committee official request letter for action jointly addressed to: The Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP), Director of Criminal Investigations (DCI) and Ethics and Anti corruption Commission (EACC), and copied to: National Assembly's Public Investment Committee (PIC) and Land, Environment & Natural Resources Committee, Office of the President jointly with Presidential Delivery Unit (PDU), State Ministry of Water & Sanitation, the State Ministry of Environment & Natural Resources, State Ministry of Interior & Coordination of Government services jointly with National Development Implementation and Communications Cabinet Committee (NDICCC), National Land Commission (NLC), Water Resources Management Authority (WARMA), National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA), Water Services Regulatory Board (WASREB), the media, among others.
- ❖ Committee Members unanimously agreed that the said project request letter "Petitions the DPP, DCI and EACC to take over the project court case" (likewise if concluded) by recalling the project court file for thorough review and/or fresh investigations being jointly with the earlier aforementioned other state agencies, with a view of establishing true facts about the state funded public project dispute and diligently recommending for both prosecutions against project crimes committed and likewise conservation for project sustainability and value for public funds.

- ❖ It was observed that the said project request letter is further to petition His Excellency the President to formally and officially initiate the process of project dispute investigations among others by inviting and chairing the aforementioned multi-state agencies joint meeting to facilitate the project committee indepth petition briefing session and further occasion timely project operation, justice and security to the said committee members including partners as a matter of priority and urgency.
- ❖ The meeting finally indicated that the said project request letter shall factor any other crucial emerging sensitive project issues not contained in the adopted report as further reference material(s) in search for project compromised justice; hence the said letter is to be attached with the project petition report complete with its annexes, among others:

Project Brief:

Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP) is a public benefitting community project through state taxpayers funds worthy millions of money, being by the State Ministry of Water & Sanitation, being through Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as the project client, being in May 2016 and whose Project Committee is Misemwa Community Water Users Association (MWUA) which is registered with the Registrar of Societies, of which the project area of coverage is within but not limited to Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations of Webuye East and Kimilili Sub-counties respectively, being with a target population of 38,742 people. Thus the said project committee is the Community Based Organization of the year 2015/2016 of the aforementioned project client's jurisdiction of 8 counties.

Following the said project committee's bold landmark resolution dated 26th May 2019 being in respect of a comprehensive presidential multi-state agencies petition report, being for but not limited to multi-state independent institutions/agencies' action, being both investigatory complete with recommendations for prosecution in respect of relevant project crimes committed and likewise being fact-finding complete with recommendations for implementation inline with project conservation and sustainability, hence the same being the main theme of this candid document and of which the presidency, being the chief custodian highest office in the land in respect of public funds and resources, is hereby petitioned through: the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP), the Director of Criminal Investigations (DCI) and Ethics and Anti-corruption Commission (EACC); being jointly with both the National Assembly's investigatory/Oversight Public Investment Committee (PIC)

and Land, Environment & Natural Resources Committee; Office of the President jointly with Presidential Delivery Unit (PDU); State Ministry of Water and Sanitation; State Ministry of Environment & Natural Resources; State Ministry of Interior & Co-ordination of Government services jointly with National Development Implementation and Communication, Cabinet Committee (NDICCC); National Land Commission (NLC); National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA); Water Resources Management Authority (WARMA); Water Services Regulatory Board (WASREB); the Media; among others, being as (but not limited) as above indicated and below comprehensively stated and later recommended:

1. That the said Public Water Supply Project was maliciously & unlawfully obstructed (on 25/11/2018) and preceded with surprise malicious delayed court case dated 18th December 2018, following a malicious secret project land ownership change in favour of Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi jointly with the known land owner Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde, being despite the prevailing legally witnessed two acre land sale agreement between parties, being without any form of notification whatsoever, being at the time when the said project's multi-million water facilities were already in place (i.e. Rehabilitated intake spring; powerhouse complete with installations; the sump; pipelines; power-line; immediate catchment chainlink fence, etc), being at the expense of desired public gain in respect of the said selfish malicious private gain, being interpreted as state development sabotage of the highest order, being by a high ranking state administrator jointly with the family, hence the relevance of this presidential multi-state agencies action petition as such;

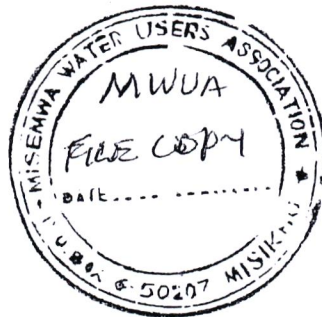

- The main theme of this community project detailed petition report is in essence the delayed project completion by LVNWSB that has indeed led to many community desired explanations, relating to but not limited to: **compromised project design /works against project established demand; non purchase and /or secret ownership change of intake catchment land including facilities and the delayed project completion/power installation in respect of the elapsed six month project contract (ie sixteen months ago).**
- **In any case this project community petition report inclusive its recommendations, being on behalf of the beneficiary communities, evidently demands for a collective and affirmative stakeholders endorsement for immediate and/ or future multi-state agencies for action in respect of but not limited: to accountability and transparency; value for public funds; the desired community homegrown water solution and the desired anticipated project self-sustainability.**
- Finally, the petition report specifically highlights on project status as at notification and of **availability of project funds to date and the real project implementation challenges, of which MWUA as the project committee hereby only limits itself to a few relevant project reference documents, being in a sequence of selected events, hence no reference document is annexed to this report, subject to any such demands and /or requests as project events unfold, apart from**

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minutes of this stakeholders detailed petition report briefing meeting and the subsequent deliberations of the way forward mooted during the meeting, if any.

2 PROJECT MAJOR/REAL CHALLENGES (IE 3 No)

2.1 Compromise project design and works and delayed project completion/power installation.

- 3rd November 2016, MWUA learnt of the project change of design from the project contractor (i.e. Namwaya enterprise limited) via LVNWSB compromised implementation project sketch map, a few days after the contractor public availing ceremony.
- ✓ LVNWSB compromised implementation project sketch map only reflected Misemwa market/Kwena, Wabukhonyi and Misemwa dispensary waterlines.
- ✓ Ondoti, Budalangi, Sinoko PCU, Webuye/Kimilili boundary and St. Peters Nakalira/Kamukuywa waterlines not factored, contrary to the documented NCWSP survey and advertised project distribution lines, which to date can still be verified for confirmation.
- ✓ LVNWSP/MWUA board meeting dated 09/11/2016 and the 1st and only project site meeting dated 03/02/2017, resolved the a normally but to date, Webuye/Kimilili boundary line (i.e. 1 km) and Nakalira market/Kamukuywa line (i.e. 2.5km) are still at large.
- ✓ Though non-factoring Kamukuywa water line is coined in the name of water levels, LVNWSB should have sited the raised pressed steel tank at St. Peters' Nakalira, unlike the near project completion suggestion of by-passing of rising main to the same by the project supervisor.

N/B, MWUA hereby strongly believe that the project supervisor (i.e. khaemba nyongesa) is a key player over the compromised /non-factored waterlines, of which the board has likewise failed to offer an official interpretation of the project advertisement, as requested by MWUA via a registered letter to the CEO dated 25th October 2018.

- 30th October 2016, commencement of project work by the project contractor (i.e. Namwaya enterprises ltd), technically working for a limited timeframe on project site and obviously being away for longer periods.

✓ Thus MWUA as the project committee, severally raised the issue of the contractor's incompetence being in respect of but not limited to, project compromised works/materials and the delayed project completion as below stated;

(i) Sump:- underground & sides water infiltration to date;

✓ Impossible to be floored, materials/works questionable.

✓ 21/09/17 CDM/MWUA/ contractor way forward yet to be undertaken as agreed to date.

(ii) Rehabilitated intake spring:- ✓ water seepage from the main reservoir and sides to date.

✓ Short wing walls, non-capturing of all the desired water sources in respect of the spring's huge reservoir

✓ Project contractors and supervisors negligence of the project committee's prior advice/input in respect of intake spring's reservoir potential.

(iii) Powerhouse ✓ future stability at stake due to the untapped spring reservoir water, always seeping at the sides all the year round;

✓ Lack of wash out valve chamber for cleansing the rising main during any rising breakdown.

✓ Poor quality sand used for flooring (i.e. silted)

(iv) Rising Main ✓ use of heavy and light gauge 4" PVC pipes, without class labels.

✓ Some parts shallowly laid and hanging, even below 400mm depth against the BQ ceiling of 900mm (i.e. 3 ft)

✓ Use of PVC pipes to cross some roads.

(v) Distribution lines: ✓ almost all lines shallowly laid & hanging against BQ, with some parts already exposed and damaged as at 23/08/18.

✓ Use/laying of consumer PVC/GT pipes – 1 ½", 1", ¾" & ½";

- ✓ Use/laying of 6'' PVC/GI on Wabukhonyi line against 3'' outlet pipes from distribution tank in respect of **pressure concentration; thus questionable;**
- ✓ Pipe class not labeled or clarified;
- ✓ Water lines not marked, prone to damages
- ✓ **Installation of plastic air valves unlike the recommended GI valves in line with the BQ.**
- ✓ Substandard chamber cover slabs incomplete with R-6 handles, with some chambers lacking cover slap to date
- ✓ Some main roads crossed with PVC pipes
- ✓ **The advertised 12.5km distribution lines not attained to date;**

Kwena line	= 2.3km
Budalang'i line	= 1.2km
Misemwa dispensary/St. Peters Nakalira	= 1.6km
Wabukhonyi line	= 2.4km

¾ bag of cement used for pillar casting

- (ix) Power installation/project completion delay:- currently installation of project power line has stalled since April 2018

- ✓ Contractor/LVNWSB blame game in respect of delayed power installation/project completion is a reflection of LVNWSB incompetence I consideration of the 28th October 2016 six month project implementation contract, currently at 21 months plus!

2.2 Project expansion programme/over helming water demand within and across project coverage.

- Following the compromised project design and works, MWUA has had to content with challenge of overwhelming water demand within and across project area of coverage, of which a number of expansion initiatives have been undertaken, thus stakeholders collective effort must be further enhanced in order to petition both levels of governments over the same.

- Project expansion initiatives so far undertaken are as follows:
- (a) 21/10/2016, submission of a 5 months project progress/demand profile to LVNWSB – CEO dated 20th October 2016;
 - ✓ Highlighted on the intake spring high water yield potential for the current and future project expansion.
 - ✓ Alert on overwhelming water demand from Kamukuywa region, hence project sustainability.
 - ✓ Submitted the institutional Water Demand Request letter as a caution against any intended project design change, having emerged during 18th August 2016 bidders mandatory site visit.
- (b) 18th November 2016, MWUA/Kamukuywa region institutions/stakeholders water project consultation meeting held at Lela children's home.
 - ✓ Leaders were requested to petition LVNWSB over Kamukuywa water line or mobilize resources for connecting the affected institution to NCWSP as per demand request indication.
 - ✓ Stakeholders unanimously suspected foul play (i.e. politics) in NCWSP design change, alleging that the community was to be revenge during the 2017 general elections.

- (e) 30th NOV. 2017, MWUA/institutional water pipeline expansion programme for Ndivisi and Kamukuywa ward;

- ✓ Endorsement of MWUA project expansion initiatives being but not limited to NG-CDF and both levels of governments.
- ✓ Bills of quantities for either wards and specific institution requests to be prepared by MWUA.
- ✓ Stakeholders petitioned leaders to join project expansion bandwagon in respect of the prevailing high water demand.
- ✓ Stakeholders requested for timely project expansion progress briefings; hence there input towards the same.

(f) 1st January 2018, MWUA submission of Namarambi/Kamukuywa community project proposal to State Ministry of Water & Sanitation dated December 2017.

RE/Project title:- Namarambi community water supply expansion project > Ksh 144,590,769.

- ✓ Cost of pipeline expansion complete with a raised pressed steel tank, water kiosk and water meters > Ksh 75,248,750, thus comprising;

Kamukuywa urban – Ksh 48,178,750.

Namarambi/Ndivisi rural – Ksh 27,070,000.

2-3 Lack of /Non – purchase/secret ownership change of intake catchment land

- The project intake source (i.e. Lutaso spring) has the potential of a constant water yield of over sixteen litres per single second, enough to meet the overwhelming water demand within but not limited to Ndivisi, Kamukuywa and Bilibili wards, unfortunately it lacks catchment land for its conservation for increased and stabilized water yield.
 - Furthermore, Lutaso intake spring has been experiencing a dedicated- long conservation problem/menace relating to its water yield changing color during deep tractor land cultivation in dry period, being some 300m upfarm on parcel land Ndivisi/Makuselwa 328 that it exists, likewise during prolonged heavy downpour.
 - ✓ This menace therefore translates to urgent multi-state agencies initiative and priority in respect of its conservation, being a lifetime pure natural water resource for future generations and project sustainability.
 - In the same vain, the project intake source is currently facing another problem of malicious change of intake land ownership, evidently planted with non-water friendly exotic trees (i.e. Cyprus, groovilia & pinus) within the immediate catchment and around the project sump.
 - ✓ This intrusion further compounds the well – intended conservation program me, hence need for further multi-state agencies factfinding of the said ownership change, being in consideration of the overwhelming benefits of the water project to the community and both levels of the governments.
 - Due the urgent need for NCWSP intake catchment land purchase and conservation, MWUA as the project committee has under taken the following initiatives:
- (a) 21st October 2016, submission of a 5 month project progress/demand profile to LVNWSB – CEO dated 20th October 2016;
- ✓ CEO alerted and notified of the danger of imminent intake pollution due to lack of intake catchment land, (i.e. page 2)

(b) MWUA 2nd official letter to LVNWSB – community development manager (CDM) dated 27th march 2017;

RE:- protesting against the continued/intentional postponement of crucial project site meetings.

✓ CDM alerted of the a rising intake catchment land compensation demand by the land owner.

(c) MWUA 1st official letter to LVNWSB chief executive officer (CEO) dated 12th April 2017, (i.e. letter 1);

RE:- Seeking for your assistance towards purchase of intake catchment land for Namarambi community water supply project.

✓ CEO officially requested for intake catchment land purchase as the Chief Executive Officer of the project on behalf of the government of the Republic of Kenya.

NOTE: Other MWUA official request to LVNWSB;

✓ Official two letters (i.e. 2nd & 4th) to LVNWSB – CEO dated 9th September 2017 and 2nd march 2018

✓ CEO alerted of the delayed purchase of project intake catchment land in respect of LVNWSB service charter.

(d) 7th April 2017, MWUA/land owner/Ass. Chief signing of a land sale agreement (i.e. 2 acres) as the immediate intake catchment land of land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa 328;

NOTE: The 2 acre land sale agreement meeting was initially preceded by three crucial project stakeholders meeting as below:

✓ MWUA/land owner/Ass. Chief, project consultation meeting dated 15th march 2017

✓ MWUA/former Ndivisi ward MCA Hon John Musakali, project meeting dated 1st April 2017

✓ MWUA/land owner/Ndivisi division Acc, project meeting dated 4th April 2017

(e) Intake land owner's (i.e. land parcel Ndivisi / Makuselwa 328 – Japheth Wekhuyi) official 'demand request letter' for land compensation, following LVNWSB – CDM's directive via a phone call to MWUA chairperson on 26th April 2017.

RE: Request for Namarambi community water supply project intake land compensation, dated 17th may 2017 ;

✓ Copies of 2 acre land sale agreement and land title deeds for Ndivisi/Makuselwa 328, attached to the letter

✓ Land owners alert on willingness to sale off the whole land parcel (i.e. 3.54Ha) as intake catchment in consideration of the intake pollution challenge.

✓ Copies of the said letter forwarded to both MWUA and project area Ass. Chief for Misemwa sublocation.

- ✓ Request for purchase of one acre of land as immediate intake catchment land.

2.31 Secret Intake Catchment Land Ownership Change

- 8th July 2018, revelation of the secret intake catchment land ownership change, without official notice/communication from the land owner and/or the buyer in respect of the prevailing land sale agreement dated 7th April 2017, likewise community/government benefiting investment/facilities;

Attention:- coincidental surprise revelation to MWUA chairperson (i.e. Mr.

Robert Lupaoh) while on normal project monitoring mission, by two community residents of Misemwa sub location and being:-

Mr. David Wanyonyi – Deputy County Commissioner, based in Molo Sub County,

Mr. Kennedy Wanyonyi – an employee of an auction firm, based in Bungoma town.

- ✓ The two jointly and verbally alleged that ownership of the intake source land parcel had changed after land search mission by them, further claiming of the expiry of the land sale agreement that was in place.
- ✓ On the same date and time, the two gentlemen commissioned hired casual laborers who planted exotic non-water friendly trees (ie Cyprus, groovilia & pinus) within the immediate intake catchment and around the project sump.
- MWUA as the project committee therefore, immediately initiated and engaged in a wide range of stakeholder consultations in respect of the coincidental alleged revelation of intake land parcel ownership change and the new owner's arrogant act of planting non-water friendly exotic trees, as directly undermining but not limited to the project committee; the local administration, the beneficiary communities, both levels of government, among others and being in consideration of the taxpayers money invested in the project by the nation government of the republic of Kenya.
- MWUA on behalf of the beneficiary communities, further interpreted the same as being intentional project sabotage of the highest order, being by a high ranking state government administrator to state

development agenda and the presidency in respect of the state ministry for water and sanitation funding of Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP)

- MWUA likewise assumed the same action and conduct as being a direct insult to but not limited to: the project committee, (MWUA) ; the beneficiary communities (ie Misemwa, Wabukhonyi & Nabikoto sub locations); the county government of Bungoma (i.e. the beneficiary county), the project client (LVNWSB); the Executive government of the Republic of Kenya (ie the project financing agency), among others.

REPORT RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as project the client for Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP), should be compelled to;- secure/purchase the immediate intake catchment land of at least two acres, being in consideration of the prevailing intake huge water reservoir, **the prevailing project intake land sale agreement and security of government water facilities already in place**; correct all project anomalies /defects either on community consensus mutual agreement or otherwise , in respect of accountability and transparency, value for public funds and the esteemed project self sustainability by the project committee (i.e. MWUA)
 - ✓ In the arising event that LVNWSB acts contrary to these well deserving recommendation either wholly or in part as above, the project committee (i.e. MWUA) being on behalf of the beneficiary communities, shall petition the Executive government of the Republic of Kenya as the funding agency as such, through the National Assembly's joint Public Accounts Committee (PAC) and Public Investments Committee (PIC) to undertake the matter and further recommend most appropriately for action by the relevant independent state institutions, being the essence of LVNWSB presumed project negligence and supervision incompetence and in line with MWUA's 18/04/2018 and 23/06/2018 affirmative action plan.
2. Its accordingly recommended for fact-finding of the earlier a forementioned malicious secret project two acre land ownership change on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328 contrary to the prevailing legally witnessed land sale agreement between parties, being in respect of the timing and motive of the said unlawful and malicious project catchment land ownership change, being at the expense of the well-intended long term project public gain and value for public funds as such.
 - ✓ Hence investigatory multi-state agencies including the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP), Director of Criminal Investigations (DCI) and Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), being jointly with the state Ministry of Water and Sanitation, National Assembly's Public Investment Committee (PIC) and Land, Environment and Natural Resources; National Land Commission; among others, are here by tasked with investigations and prosecutions related to the said malicious secret project land ownership change, being long after all the public water facilities were already in place.
3. Its further recommended for compulsory acquisition of the remaining acreage of land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, including other immediate adjacent land parcels for compensation by the government, in enabling and/or realizing a wider project intake catchment conservation land to caution against the rapid trend of diminishing natural water resources, being in consideration of the project intake spring's huge water reservoir's high water yield potential and the delicate aspect of the said intake pollution and/or water color change during deep land cultivation, being 300metres upfarm and likewise in consideration of the real danger of intake pollution in the event of any such subdivision of the said land parcel for private gain.
 - ✓ The state line Ministry of Water and Sanitation is to initiate the process compensation being in line with the recommendations of the National Assembly's relevant joint committees of Public Investment Committee (PIC) and Land, Environment and Natural Resources Committee jointly and severally with

the State Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources; National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA); Water Resources Management Authority (WARMA); National Land Commission (NLC); County Government of Bungoma; Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB), among others, in respect of the National Land Act of Kenya; the Water Act, the Environmental Act and the obvious importance of Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP) to beneficiary communities/institutions, being a reflection of the national development agenda of Kenya's vision 2030 and likewise the government's big four agenda as such.


4. **In consideration of the constitutional right to clean, safe and affordable water, this community petition report finally recommends that the state line Ministry of Water and Sanitation and/or Water Services Trust Fund (WSTF), through Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB), and jointly with the County Government of Bungoma, be compelled to/or consensually agree to undertake Namarambi Community Water Supply Project Expansion Programme, as per the prevailing but not limited to established demand projections by the project committee (i.e. MWUA), being jointly with relevant project stakeholders.**
- ✓ Thus this report hereby petitions the said institutions either through the relevant Assemblies' oversight committees at both levels of government or otherwise, as being accorded the aforementioned expansion lobbying/fact-finding assignment on behalf of the beneficiary communities' constitutional rights, being but not limited to esteemed expansion to Ndivisi, Kamukuywa and BiliBili wards, among others and being in respect of the project committee's vision for community homegrown water solution and empowerment, project self-sustainability and value for the public funds.

REPORT CONCLUSION

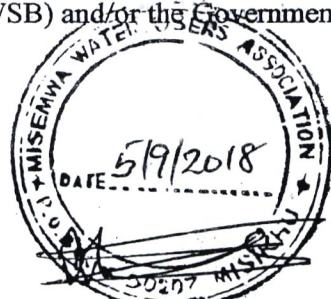
- **The NCWSP 26 months community detailed petition report, shall be deemed as a binding reference project document in respect of but not limited to its key recommendation, once successfully endorsed as such, or otherwise. Hence the project committee being on behalf of but not limited to the beneficiary communities, shall independently or jointly request/petition for relevant desired action in respect of but not limited to the said petition report recommendation; its deliberations and/or way forward (if any), being benefitting to beneficiary communities; the county government of Bungoma and the Republic of Kenya.**
- **While undertaking any such noble mission as recommended; deliberated upon and/or consensually agreed upon, the project committee either independently or jointly, shall clearly indicate as per the said recommendations inclusive its deliberations, whether there was progress; negligence; sabotage; blackmail; resistance; obstruction or otherwise, hence shall be specific on the desired course of action(s) in respect but not limited to the prevailing project status.**
- **Any such government institutions or agencies forwarded with requests /petition for any such relevant action by the project committee being in respect of but not limited to the community petition report recommendations, among others, shall be presumed/deemed to be mindful of the beneficial interests of the said communities and/or both levels of governments, with keen consideration of taxpayer's invested funds and its value; transparency and accountability; the esteemed project sustainability programme; the rapid diminishing of the natural water sources; the established project demand projections, among others.**
- **Further, any such independent investigatory state institutions/organs shall ethically and firmly communicate their findings and decisions boldly, clearly indicating to all and sundry of the presumed importance of public/community benefitting project against the presumed selfish individual/personal, private or otherwise interests, in line with project protection; conservation; expansion; sustainability; among others.**

- Finally MWUA as the project committee for Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP), hereby candidly observes that these complete project community petition report inclusive stakeholders deliberations, is timely and convenient for project sustainability and benefitting to but not limited to the factored communities. Basically, the report is devoid of malice; witch-hunting; vested interests or otherwise, being solely the brainchild of the project committee's resolution dated 11th August 2018; following the committee's LVNWSB – CEO's official board visit's outcome and being in respect of the 18th April 2018 and 23rd June 2018 committee's 'Affirmative Project Action Plan'. In conclusion therefore, the document here by identifies but is not limited to three aspired key objectives, relating to project established and documented demand, hence project sustainability:
- (i) Securing of the project intake source by way of conservation through purchase of atleast two (2) acres of land as immediate catchment, plus a larger acreage as a wider intake catchment conservation and mootng a lasting solution on compromised project design/works; project expansion programme inline with established demand and finally speeding up project completion in respect of the stalled power installation to date.
- (ii) Safeguarding and maintaining the status quo of community project committees, MWUA being among them, being inline with the community project funding and/or implementation guidelines and contracts, hence the unwarranted self-imposed and short-lived project ownership status, by project contractors, jointly with supervisors, due to greed/vested interests at the expense of project sustainability. Thus MWUA hereby courtesy of this community detailed petition project complete report; stand tall in exerting its rightful place as the project owners on behalf of the beneficiary communities, being in respect of project sustainability and value for public funds;
- (iii) Instituting of a community project benchmarking platform/committee in respect of project committees' monitoring mandate, being the essence of project committees' training/capacity building, hence project ownership; sustainability; and value for public funds, being within the jurisdiction of Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) and/or the Government of the Republic of Kenya.

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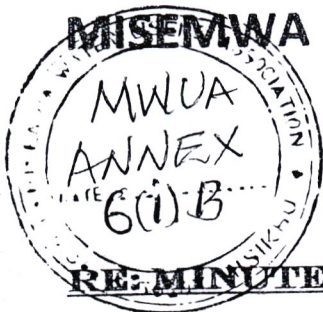

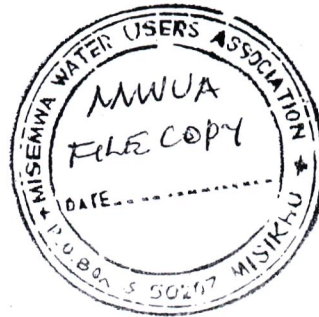

(B) PROJECT CHALLENGES IN BRIEF;

(i) Project compromised work and delay:

- Intake sump is build by concrete blocks, Simba cement; limited water proof cement thus allows water infiltration/leakage
- Spring has water leakage from sides and even on top of the storage reservoir.
- Powerhouse complete but standing in a water logged area
- Raising main has some areas shallowly laid, PVC pipes used instead of GI pipes and Heavy and light gauge pipes mixed.
- Distribution lines, almost all lines are shallowly laid and use of consumer pipes on main lines
- ✓ Most pipes generally not labeled for class specification
- ✓ Gate valves are plastic instead of GI
- ✓ Cover slaps have R – 6 handled and are substandard
- ✓ Some gate valves chambers still don't have cover slaps
- ✓ Most roads crossed by plastic pipes instead of GI
- ✓ Distribution line coverage 9.00KM, thus when including /considering the rising main coverage, it leaves a deficit of 1.7KM.
- ✓ Pressed steel tank – stability to be clarify by the board
- ✓ **Power installation not complete**

(ii) Expansion:

- ✓ Notified LVNWSB of over helming project water demand via a 5 month project report/demand profile dated 20th October 2016
- ✓ Undertaking of various project stakeholders expansion initiatives/meetings by MWUA
- ✓ Initiating county project expansion programme that is on course
- ✓ **Submission of expansion project proposal to state Ministry of Water and Sanitation through PA Kizito Temba**

(iii) Catchment land:

- The meeting was informed that the project intake land had currently a new owner. This implied that the project had no catchment land. All possible efforts had been done to purchase catchment land which had yielded in a project two – acre land sale agreement for compensation.
 - ✓ The land owner Mr. Japheth Wekhuyi had send a letter demanding for compensation to the board CEO (17/5/17).
 - ✓ Proposals had been send to the NG – CDF and county government for assistance but not yet considered.
 - ✓ Currently the catchment land had been planted with exotic trees by the new owner (8/7/18)

N/B surprise revelation of project intake land ownership change to MWUA chairperson while on normal project monitoring mission dated 8/7/2018, by two community residents of misemwa sub – location and who were planting exotic trees (i.e. Cyprus, groovilia and pinus) within the immediate intake catchment, being:

1. Mr David wanyonyi – Deputy County Commission, based in molo subcounty,
2. Mr Kennedy wanyonyi – an employee of an aution firm based in Bungoma

REPORT RECOMMENDATION IN BRIEF:

1. Fact-finding about the secret project intake 2acre land ownership change.
2. Compulsory acquisition of the ndivisi/makuselwa/ 328 parcel of land as project catchment land for compensation to the rightful land owner.
3. Expansion of the water project to meet the high demand for water, within ^{the CDF coverage} ~~zero coverage~~ area.
4. LVNWSB to be compelled to secure the water project facilities in place (ie immediate catchment)

OPEN SESSION

- LVNWSB - Community Development Manager, (Madam Nelly Mukoko)

- ✓ Acknowledged that the board was aware of the intake land sale and that the board was **about to engage the land owner through its competent legal team.**
- ✓ Confirmed that MWUA committee was not liable for the project works defects during construction but the board, until completion and handover.
- ✓ She addressed the issue of 12.5 km distribution lines, promising for a **fresh coverage measurement by an engineer from the board. She committed that should there be a deficit, then it was to be done to ensure the 12.5km is achieved.**
- ✓ Madam Nelly Mukoko assured the meeting of the stability of the pressed steel tank, **more so after testing.**
- ✓ Concerning suitability of pipes used she reassured that this can only be confirmed after pressure testing. That the project will be only handed over after testing and confirming **that it is running.**
- ✓ **The CDM instructed the contractor who was present to re-do the areas that were obviously demanding for correction especially the shallowly laid pipes.**
- ✓ The CDM was equally surprised since the board had earlier instructed that the water be **pumped out of the sump which was not done. She pledged that this will be done in presence of the board and MWUA/community.**
- ✓ She promised that maji markers and road crossing be corrected, thus GI pipes be used.
- ✓ **About overflow of the spring, madam pledged to have a technical team visiting the spring /intake site.**
- ✓ On expansion to kamukuywa the CDM was firm that the said region will be served from the chwele project and not Namarambi.
- ✓ **Due to the water demand from Makuselwa and Makemo region, she asked for a proposal from MWUA to source water from sitabicha dam, since these region could not be served by the Namarambi's project.**
- ✓ She appreciated MWUA's effort in the project and commended members present for **their participation.**
- ✓ She confirmed delays to completion of the project being power installation but promised to make follow-up.
- ✓ The CDM suggested for an immediate site meeting to address the issues raised.
- ✓ She finally requested for earlier departure due to another project pressing meeting.

● Project contractor – Engineer Patrick kuloba;

✓ Insisted that his company had undertaken good work, pointing out that the sump had no leakages likewise the spring being intact and pipe laying was in order.

✓ The contractors unjustified explanation were cut short and unanimously disapproved by stakeholders, who demanded that he be specific, pointing out that the community had monitored his work from the word go, in particular the intake sump.

✓ Specific individual stakeholders sentiments towards the contractor's incompetence forced the Community Development Manager - Madam Nelly Mukoko, to take charge accepting all liabilities on behalf of the board until project handover to the committee/community.

● Ndivisi ward MCA representative – Madam Emily;

✓ Appreciated the community and requested that the contractor be given ample time to explain himself and correct the defects.

✓ Apologized for the MCA and pledged his support for intake catchment land purchase.

● Aggrey Barasa – Presiding clerk, Misemwa Monthly Meeting – Quakers church;

✓ Thanked the project committee (i.e. MWUA) for their commitment.

✓ Advocated for project work completion.

✓ Passionately pledged for total support of project success on behalf of the churches/community.

● Denis Musamali – PTA chairperson, kamukuywa secondary school and NCCCK chairman
Kamukuywa location;

✓ Thanked MWUA for the good work, insisted that he's a project major community stakeholders despite kamukuywa waterline having been compromised and apologised for his lateness.

● John Masabule – CDF, Misemwa sub location representative;

✓ Commended MWUA for the bold move and termed it as history in the making which many institutions/organizations yearn for, at the same time fall short of capacity to achieve such feat.

- ✓ Strongly warned that should the land issue not be resolved amicably, then all community members will be rallied to publicly complain against the unjust /malicious intake land ownership change, hence MWUA's community detailed petition report recommendations were valid for relevant action as comprehensively recommended.
- Chief, Namarambi Location – Patrick Khisa;
 - ✓ Had initially advised stakeholders about the approach in raising complains, and requested for a project brief from MWUA chairperson, having arrived when the meeting was already in session.
 - ✓ Later he informed stakeholders that he's part and parcel of MWUA community development agenda, thus wished the committee all the best, plus his full support.
 - ✓ Finally tasked MWUA to write a complain/notification letter to both levels of government administrators and leaders in respect of intake land ownership change, and pledged to attend the proposed project site meeting.
- Overall, stakeholder after stakeholder strongly lamented the secret/malicious project intake land ownership change, thus petitioning LVNWSB and both levels of government to act accordingly and save the potential water intake source in respect of community benefit and value for the public funds, or else the whole community shall arise against the act, hence the project committee to act on behalf of the beneficiary communities as such.
- They further pledged support for MWUA'S successive demand for project good work/materials and the expansion programme as per the committee's self – explanatory detailed project petition report, tabled to stakeholders including the board as the project client (on behalf of national government of Kenya) and the project contractor.
- Moreso, the meeting expressed its displeasure with the project contractor's unfounded response/sentiments pertaining his obvious incompetence/underperformance, lamenting that the community was being taken for granted by his statements and actions, of which the board was to be notified as such.
- Finally, a stakeholder (ie John Masabule) shocked the meeting by revealing that the project contractor had confided in him during the meeting that he had offered the project committee

twenty thousand (ie 20,000) Kenya shillings, of which it had refused, demanding for more! Thus **stakeholders were in agreement (in respect of MWUA`S openness of the issue) that the committee was entitled to project monitoring funds from LVNWSB, being inline with the public/private project implementation guidelines, hence the same be factored during the proposed project site meeting in the presence of administration, of which a feedback was desired thereafter.**

MIN. 03/08/18 – WAY FORWARD:

- 1. Stakeholders unanimously endorsed the community project detailed petition report with recommendations, (after exhaustive deliberations) for immediate/future multi-state agencies action inline with, but not limited to the said recommendations, and in particular the well intended fact-finding of the secret project 2acre land ownership change and compulsory acquisition of the said project intake catchment land, (in order to stabilize/increase water yield and caution against intake pollution); Project expansion programme (in respect of overwhelming water demand/increasing future population, sustainability and value for the public funds); among other well deserving recommendations. Thus the document endorsement proposer being Michael Juma and seconded by Metrine Wafula.**
- 2. The meeting was in agreement regarding Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) shouldering all project liabilities (ie as per the CDM`S pledge) in respect of the purchase of immediate intake catchment land to secure project facilities and correcting all project anomalies/defects before project commissioning and handover.**
 - Thus the CDM`S proposal for an immediate project site meeting to deliberate on, but not limited to the same, was unanimously supported.
- 3. The project committee (ie MWUA) was further tasked to continue engaging both levels of governments on project expansion programme in consideration of, but not limited to the project expansion report recommendation. Hence MWUA was to immediately actualize the Community Development Manager`s (CDM) expansion proposal for Sitabicha/Makemo Dam as intake source for, but not limited to Sitabicha, Makuselwa and Marinda sub locations, being in respect of Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP) expansion programme.**


- On the same note, the project committee was to table the same (for adoption) during the proposed project site meeting, immediately prepare and submit the said project proposal for funding, thus insisting that the CDM's expansion pledge to the affected communities/stakeholders was binding and petition able as such.
- 4. The community through the project committee (i.e. MWUA) was to formerly notify (in writing), both levels of governments' administration and leadership of the malicious intake land ownership change, being in respect of the community interest, government project facilities/funds, project sustainability, value for the public funds, accountability, transparency, and as reference and/or supporting document inline with community/stakeholders project petition report recommendations for multi-state agencies implementation.
- 5. Further, the community/stakeholders pledged to fully support the project committee's (ie MWUA) selfless community development agenda, promising to rally the whole community in this endeavor (even to the attention of the whole nation) in the event of any presumed sabotage, warning that currently the writing was /is on the wall for any such selfish interests in the country at large.
- 6. Finally, the project committee (i.e. MWUA) was lastly petitioned to seek for the project monitoring funds as an entitlement in any project implementation guidelines as such.

MIN 01/09/2018: PRELIMINARIES

The meeting was called to order by MWUA Chairperson (Robert Lupaoh) at 10.30 a.m with a word of prayer from Branden Wangila. Thus members present did self introduction plus brief opening remarks in line with the project stakeholder representation as at then.

MWUA chairperson welcomed all stakeholders present, revealing that the day's meeting was occasioned by the deliberations of the most recent stakeholder detailed petition briefing meeting dated 24th August 2018.

The chairperson further informed the meeting that the project area Ass. Chief, who had been petitioned by the project stakeholders/community to attend the site meeting in respect of community interests/concerns, was unavailable as he was holed in a pressing report-writing meeting in his office at then.

MIN 02/09/2018 : CONFIRMATION IN BRIEF OF THE DELIBERATIONS/WAYFORWARD OF PROJECT STAKEHOLDER PETITION MEETING DATED 24TH AUGUST 2018

MWUA chairperson read in-part the minutes of NCWSP community stakeholders detailed petition briefing meeting dated 24th August 2018, indicating observations/remarks by: Project Area Ass. Chief, Lake Victoria North water services Board (LVNWSB)-Community Development manager (CDM), Project contractor, project Area chief, Project area M.C.A'S Representative, individual collective stakeholder's project concerns and finally the meeting's general way forward.

Minutes of NCWSP 2nd Project site Meeting

The project committee chairperson before reading the said minutes in-part, had earlier indicated that **the said immediate meeting's deliberations and way forward were guidelines of the site meeting.**

Pertaining LVNWSB-CDM'S pledge for immediate intake catchment land purchase, 500m extension of Budalangi waterline and Sitabicha/Makemo dam intake project expansion, LVNWSB team indicated that intake catchment land purchase was to be undertaken by the Board's competent legal team but fell short of committing the board regarding Budalangi waterline extension and Sitabicha/Makemo dam-intake project expansion, only promising to refer **the same to the CDM. Thus MWUA insisted that stakeholders way forward over the same was conclusive.**

LVNWSB team further observed that the CDM's pledge for the board to shoulder project liabilities, among others, was perfectly in order as the project was still under implementation hence the supervision mandate of the institution.

The project contractor (i.e Patrick Kuloba) expressed concern that the committee was rushing issues and at the same time too judgemental, but MWUA team reminded him that reference project issues dated back to the year late 2016 to date, hence the committee's initiative of undertaking 'project community stakeholders detailed petition briefing meeting' meant to **absolve MWUA from the prevailing/future project blame and/or liability.**

MWUA team expressed concern in the manner in which the project contractor had confided in one stakeholder during the 24th August 2018 meeting of having offered the committee kshs. 20,000/=, thus demanding an explanation over the same. The committee noted that **project documentations only reflect requests for project monitoring funds from the board and never otherwise of which the same was to be referred back to the board for a lasting solution as the project client.**

Thus the project contractor side-stepped the issue terming it as a liar but the committee reminded him that it was part of the 24th August meeting documentation, having been intentional blackmailing of the committee in respect of his incompetence as expressed by project stakeholders during the said meeting.

Minutes of NCWSP 2nd Project site Meeting

LVNWSB team was non-committal over project monitoring funds alleging that it might/may be part of community contribution package, advising that the project bill of quantities was the reference document, hence they were not conversant with the same, thus it was therefore to be referred to the CDM.

MIN 03/09/2018 : DELIBERATIONS/WAYFORWARD ON NCWSP STATUS & WORKS

The project committee (i.e MWUA), ~~the chairperson~~ through the chairperson outlined key issues that were contentious in respect of various project documentations and correspondence to the board (i.e project client), insisting that project sustainability could be at stake if not addressed :

1. Deficit in the advertised 12.5 km project distribution lines;

✓ Non-factoring of Webuye/Kimilili boundary line -1.5 km.

✓ Current deficit of between 1.4-1.7 km, inclusive the Rising Main.

N/B : Established deficit to be factored on Webuye/Kimilili Boundary line as per the original survey map.

2. Re-doing of the shallowly laid/hanging waterlines;

✓ 6" Wabukhonyi line up to Misemwa stream/river as per the 21/09/2017 CDM's site visit directive.

✓ Previously established parts of the Rising Main dated February 2017 and 21/09/2017 CDM directive.

✓ Parts of Kwena line especially but not limited to Jotham Makokha's farm.

✓ All, but not limited to waterline road crossings.

3. Water line road crossing with PVC pipes;

(a) Rising main

✓ Road crossing at mzee Muloma/Nalianya farms.

Minutes of NCWSP 2nd Project site Meeting

- ✓ Road crossing adjacent to Ondoti-Lutaso road junction.
- ✓ Storm drain crossing at the intake source.

N/B : Pipe laying at the lower intake farm done/laid on catchment access road.

(b) Distribution lines;

- ✓ Kwena line road crossings at Kwena Friends Church and adjacent to Alfayo Wanyonyi's farm.
- ✓ Budalangi line road crossings at Misemwa-Lukhuna road, Hassan Wanyonyi (Bengi) corner, near Festus Khaemba's gate and Limanya access road.
- ✓ Ondoti line road crossing at Mzee Wambani road junction.
- ✓ Wabukhonyi line road crossings at Sinoko P.C.U Primary road junction, Fred Kokonya corner, Mzee Mutoko Nalwakho corner and Mzee Mukoyani corner.
- ✓ Nakalira line road crossings at Webuye-Kimilili boundary road junction, Nakhosi corner, Nakalira market road and culvert storm-drain crossing adjacent to Nakalira market water kiosk.

4. Pipeline breakages/damages;

- ✓ Jotham Mukhwana/Misemwa – Ondoti road junction, 6".
- ✓ Nakalira market culvert storm-drain crossing, 1" PVC-pipe, among others.

5. Intake sump;

- ✓ Underground/sides water infiltration.

N/B : 21/09/2017 – LVNWSB/MWUA/Project contractor way forward to be undertaken.

6. Intake spring;

- ✓ Water seepage from within the main reservoir and sides due to substandard rehabilitation works.

N/B : LVNWSB intake spring design should be re-visited in order to accommodate the project committee's previous input or real concerns.

7. Immediate intake catchment chainlink fence;

✓ Substandard materials/works.

✓ Incomplete catchment fencing off and already falling over/down.

8. Water kiosks (i.e BQ 4 No.);

✓ Only 2 No. constructed contrary to project design as per 21/09/2017 CDM directive.

✓ Project committee current proposal for construction of 1 No. water kiosk at Wabukhonyi market inline with original survey map, unlike LVNWSB compromised re-siting at Misemwa Dispensary and/or Kwena market, against project established demand.

✓ Project committee's pressing need for conversion of 1 No. water kiosk (i.e fourth one) into intake site office/operators/security house.

9. Gate valves;

✓ Installation of plastic gate valves among others, contrary to the project BQ, being in line with 21/09/2017 CDM's directive for replacement with GI gate valves.

10. Chamber cover slabs;

✓ Use of sub-standard ballast of 2" being susceptible to easy breakages, incomplete with R-6 handles.

✓ A number of chambers lacking cover slabs to date.

11. Use of consumer pipes on all distribution lines – 1 ½", 1", ¾", & ½";

✓ Being contrary to standard pipe laying/water laws.

✓ Limiting any intended/future project expansion.

N/B : Interpretation of project BQ and/or design desired

12. Water lines marking;

✓ Not undertaken in respect of 21/09/2017 CDM's directive.

N/B: Maji markers to be installed as per 24/08/2018 stakeholders deliberations.

13. Water meters (ie consumers – 30No. and master – unknown);

- ✓ 25 No. (ie 20mm) consumer meters availed by the CDM during project stakeholders petition meeting dated 24/08/2018.
- ✓ Thus a balance of 5 No. consumer meters.

N/B. project BQ reference to establish the actual number of master meters.

Mr Patrick kuloba, the project contractor observed that the committee was dwelling on petty issues, an indication of him not wanting LVNWSB team to learn of Namwaya Enterprises incompetence. Thus pointing out that the committee hadn't commended him for any good works all a long.

In a rejoinder, the project committee lamented that the raised issues were a long overdue, relating to the various reference documents, hence the contractor's incompetence that was at present being contested by the beneficiary communities.

LVNWSB team present, indicated that they were not aware of the project burning issues, hence insisted on tabling of the same by the committee as being in order.

This revelation prompted MWUA team to exchange glances of shock and disbelief, in consideration of the relevance of the site meeting, being expected to solve all project burning issues as per the stakeholders meeting's deliberations.

All along, it was noted that the project contractor was uneasy as MWUA chairperson tabled the report, even raising tension between the two parties, but LVNWSB team was firm that the committee's report was necessary for the site meeting, hence the team's feedback to the board.

The project committee finally observed with caution, that LVNWSB had been/was too economical with project information regarding the project bill of quantities, especially the 12.5km distribution lines, sizes/class of pipes on main lines, general project design, project ceiling funds; among others and only offering scanty details when pushed to the walls; to the detriment of project sustainability.

Thus the committee noted with keen interest that LVNWSB/contractor had been shifting goal post in respect of the project ceiling funds, projecting a number of versions:- 14 million during July 4th 2016 board meeting; 9 million during November 9th 2016 board meeting; 10 million during August 24th 2018 stakeholders meeting, while the contractor projected :- 12.5 million during November 2016 project meeting and apparently 11 million during the September 5th 2018 2nd project site meeting.

Minutes of NCWSP 2nd Project site Meeting

Hence, the project committee (i.e. MWUA) revealed that engineer Antony Kisaka had officially confirmed to the committee that the project funding ceiling was ksh 15 million, via a phone call response to Hon Kizito Temba, during a joint project meeting with the said personal Assistant to the then Cabinet Secretary for water and irrigation (i.e. Hon Eugene Wamalwa) on 1st January 2018.

LVNWSB team requested not to be dragged into the matter as they were not authorized to speak over the same, only commenting that implementation funds cater for project design as well and among others.

● As a way forward and being in respect of the meeting's deliberations, stakeholders present unanimously agreed as below indicated:-

1. A joint LVNWSB/MWUA/project contractor measurement verification of project done/laid waterlines to establish the actual distribution lines deficit, with further reference to 25th September 2017 verification exercise. Pertaining the Rising Main, the project contractor confirmed of it being part of the 12.5km advertised distribution lines, hence to bear liability over the same, independently or jointly with the LVNWSB.

✓ Thus Mr. Patrick Kuloba, for Namwaya Enterprises was to communicate a convenient date the following week, as MWUA and LVNWSB teams indicated compliance with any date. MWUA insisted that the board as the project client was to take charge of the exercise, not the contractor, of which any established distribution lines deficit was to be factored on the remaining Webuye – Kimilili boundary line as per the original 15th June 2016 project survey and advertised sketch map.

2. Project 2 No water kiosks to be converted into a reasonable intake site office/operators/security house, of which further reverence over the same was the committee meeting resolution dated 27th September 2017.

✓ Thus the committee insisted that it hadn't traded the two water kiosks for Nakalira waterline (as alleged by the CDM on 24/08/2018), revealing that the said waterline is/was part of the advertisement accordingly, hence the project committee was technically arm-twisted during the 9th November 2016 board meeting, of which the board has since then failed to interpret the project advertised distribution lines inline with the project committee's official and registered request letter to LVNWSB-CEO dated 25th October 2017.

3. All the project contentious issues to be undertaken/rectified by the contractor as had been previously directed and agreed upon, including line marking, though LVNWSB team was silent on use of consumer pipes on distribution lines.

✓ Thus the project committee felt technically short-changed by the CDM for availing a team with no knowledge of the project details, reminding the meeting that all the project documents shall act as reference materials, especially the most recent, 'MWUA community stakeholders project detailed petition report' dated 24/08/2018; 'minutes of community stakeholders project detailed briefing

meeting' dated 24/08/2018 and 'minutes of the 2nd project site meeting ' dated 05/09/2018, among others.

4. A copy of the 2nd site meeting minutes including the committee's tabled/defects report, be availed to the board for action/reference, of which the project committee indicated that even the stakeholders meeting's deliberations shall be forwarded for the same purpose once they are ready.

Finally in their brief stakeholder closing remarks, all parties hailed the deliberation as such; with the project contractor promising a job well done; LVNWSB team commented the project committee for a rare show of teamwork and documentation, urging it to keep up; and MWUA observed that due to the importance of the project to the community/public, it had no ill motive in its course, hence project sustainability was the underlying priority, concluding that any intended project compromise and/or sabotage is null and void

Lastly and on behalf of the project Area Ass. Chief, MWUA chairperson greatly appreciated all stakeholders for the site meeting's success, indicating that all were most welcome back at their time of convenience.

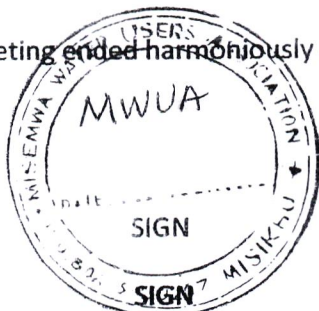

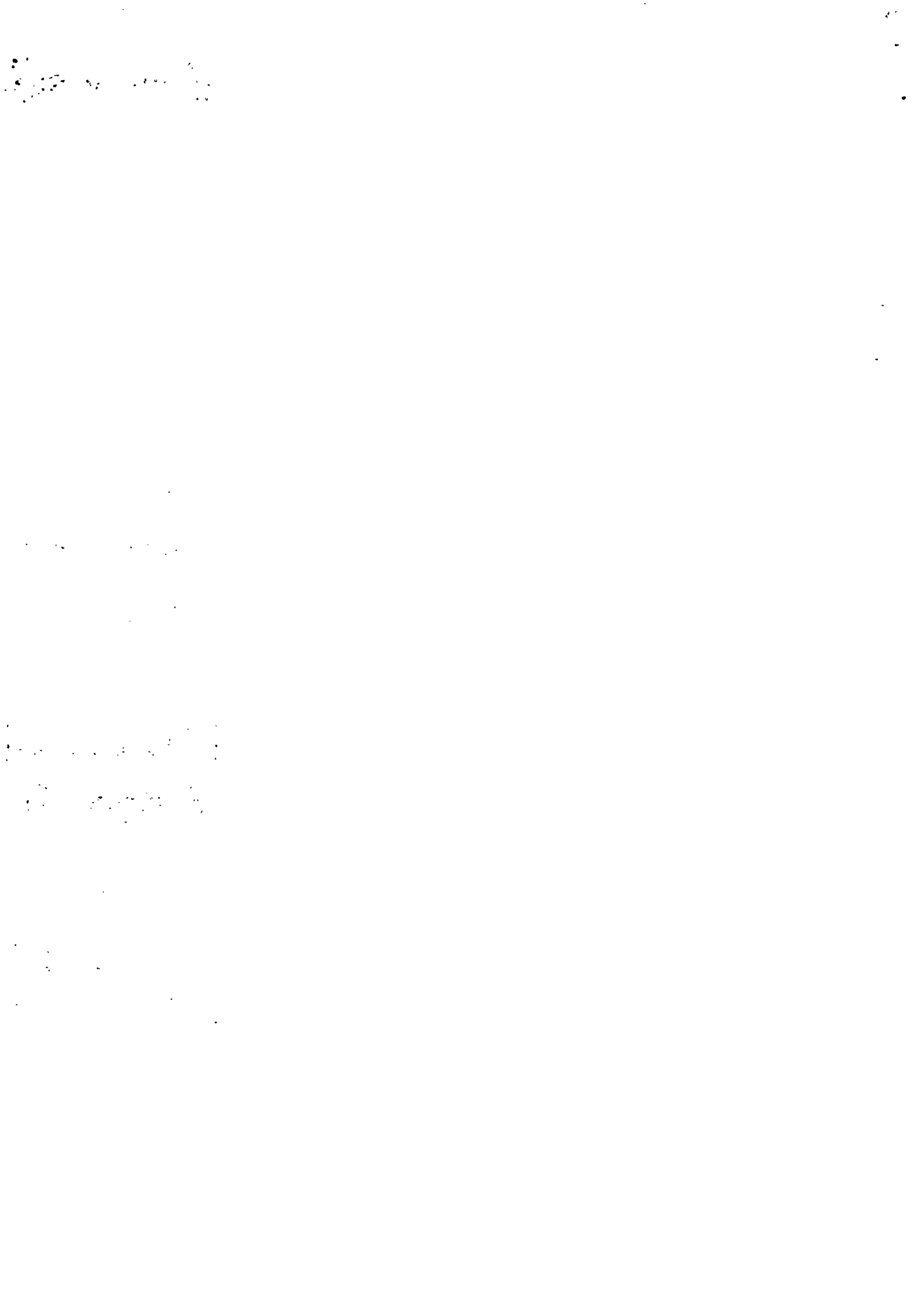
Project Brief:

Namarambi Community Water Supply Project (NCWSP) is a multi-million state funded public project by the State Ministry of Water & Sanitation in May 2016 through Lake Victoria North Water Services Board (LVNWSB) as the project client and whose Project Committee is Misemwa Community Water Users Association (MWUA), being within Namarambi and Kamukuywa locations of Bungoma East and Kimilili Sub-counties, with a target population of 38,742 people and of which the said community project is facing delayed malicious court case following malicious secret project land ownership preceded with malicious unlawful project obstruction.

Thus following Nancy Wanyonyi and Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi's said malicious secret project two-acre land sale agreement ownership change on land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, malicious unlawful project obstruction dated 25/11/2018, delayed malicious court case dated 18/12/2018, among others, the project committee (i.e. MWUA) wishes to draw the attention of but not limited to state security agencies in respect of committee resolutions dated 15th June 2019, as above and as below indicated:

Profiled Veiled Security Threats:

1. That during the aforementioned malicious unlawful project obstruction dated 25/11/2018 (at around 9.50am) by the above mentioned family members Kennedy Wanyonyi jointly with David Wanyonyi-Deputy County Commissioner, Molo sub county, the project chairman -Robert Lupoah, had cautioned the said Kennedy Wanyonyi against the unlawful obstruction of project contractor's works, of which he insulted the chairman as being a fool, arrogantly threatening him as being



nothing before him(i.e. Kennedy) and sarcastically provoking the said chairman to dare call the Area police officers among others, thus fearing for his security and being diplomatic, the project chairman left the project intake source indicating to the said arrogant Kennedy Wanyonyi that he was at liberty to proceed with his unlawful act and being that the law would take its course as such;

2. That shortly after leaving the project intake works site, DCC David Wanyonyi made a phone call to the project chairman at 10.06am threateningly and emotionally charging that the project chairman had threatened his position as a DCC, that he had witnesses of what the committee alleges about him, that he was in full support of his brother Kennedy in the said unlawful project obstruction until after negotiations, that the project committee had never sought to meet him over the issue, that he had been accorded full land ownership authority by the previous land owner Japheth Wekhuyi Masinde, among others with the said call lasting a record of 6 minutes and 29 seconds (i.e. DCC Wanyonyi -0721725208 to Chairman Lupaoh-0712492300), hence the said DCC's call posed a security threat to the project chairman as such;
3. That thereafter, while the project chairman was being escorted by one Japheth Simiyu Njakusi from his home neighbouring the project intake site, both being board members of Friends sec school -Misemwa, DCC Wanyonyi passed by them in a yellow-double cabin government vehicle bearing registration number GKB 271J, threateningly pointing his finger at the project chairman as he joined his brother Kennedy Wanyonyi at the adjacent project land parcel Ndivisi/Makuselwa/328, in the said unlawful project obstruction mission, of which the said Japheth Simiyu Njakusi advised the project chairman to go home fearing for the said chairman's safety;
4. That while at his home on that very day of the said unlawful project obstruction, the project chairman received a suspicious Mpesa deposit of kshs 10 at 1:58pm, from one Malcolm Wabwile Simiyu that read ("MKP54BCR01 confirmed. You have received kshs 10.00 from Malcolm Wabwile Simiyu 0701226479 on 25/11/2018 at 1:58 pm. New Mpesa balance is kshs 13.20. Pay bills via Mpesa."). Thus the said Malcolm Wabwile Simiyu interestingly turned out to be the said DCC Wanyonyi's elder son, being an indication that the said family was indeed up to some mischief against

the project chairman, hence his security being at stake, which prompted him to visit Webuye Police station on 26/11/2018 being out of his wisdom and consulted the OCS with a four-page committee official write up, being at around 2:14pm;

5. That around 5pm on the said day of unlawful project obstruction, DCC David Wanyonyi contacted the earlier aforementioned Japheth Simiyu Njakusi whom he had tried to contact earlier on but his phone was off and who doubles as the PTA Chairman of Friends Sec School –Misemwa, thus emotionally directing him to advise his friend the project chairman never to dare visit the project obstructed site as he DCC Wanyonyi had instructed the police for his arrest, among other allegations and being further security threats to the innocent project chairman (i.e. DCC Wanyonyi - 0721725208 to Japheth Simiyu Njakusi-0715196394) as such;
6. That 4th June 2019, Nancy Wanyonyi who is the 1st Plaintiff to the said project court case and a mother to the said DCC Wanyonyi sent one William Namanda to the project chairman alleging that the said chairman had disrespected her by remarking that she and her family had filed a case in court against the community water project during the 31st May 2019 Annual General Meeting (AGM) at Friends Sec School –Misemwa, thus further projecting the said family as bell-bend on witch-hunting the project chairman, hence amounting to further security veiled threats as such;
7. That on 29th June 2019, the project chairman being in company of his cousins Geoffrey Makhanu and Bramwel Wanyonyi among others, being at Makuti Social Joint at Kamukuywa sub urban market from a burial function, the aforementioned DCC David Wanyonyi and Kennedy Wanyonyi in the company of their younger brother Daniel Wanyonyi and last born sister Mourine Wanyonyi entered the said social place at around 6pm and half-heartedly greeted the project chairman and company seated outside at an open space, being the first meeting with the project chairman since the said unlawful project obstruction incident dated 25/11/2018, of which they settled at a nearby tent/shade and were later on joined by their elder brother Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi (i.e. 2nd plaintiff to project court case) and their sister Lorna Wanyonyi-Assistance chief Nabikoto sub location (i.e. one of the beneficiary project target area of coverage). At around 10pm, the project chairman's 1st cousin Geoffrey Makhanu sought to leave for home, of which the

project chairman jointly with Bramwel wanyonyi assured him that they were comfortable and would likewise leave after some time later.

- Two hours later, Bramwel Wanyonyi who had apparently gone for a short call came back announcing to the project chairman that the aforementioned Kennedy Wanyonyi and DCC David Wanyonyi were to offer them a lift in their vehicles back home, but the project chairman turned down the said offer by observing to Bramwel that the unfolding project events since the unlawful project obstruction by the said family had presented security concerns to project committee members who had thus come up with tough resolutions as such. But to the surprise of the said project chairman, the said Kennedy Wanyonyi had stealthily followed Bramwel and stood at a short distance from where the project chairman and others were seated inside the social joint, of which the said Kennedy Wanyonyi tried thrice to convince the project chairman to join him for consultations, but the said project chairman politely refused and adamantly indicated to him that at such time and hour, he wasn't moving from his seat as such and thus the said Kennedy wanyonyi angrily joined his family in the shade outside;
- Shortly thereafter, the project chairman who had gone for a short call before leaving for home, was shocked when DCC Wanyonyi followed him in urinal/toilet and accordingly warned the said project chairman that he was to later shoulder the whole burden of the project individually, indicating that he DCC Wanyonyi had all the information and witnesses regarding what the chairman alleges about him/his mother-Nancy Wanyonyi, of which the project chairman politely observed to him that at no time had he made any such allegations to him (i.e. DCC Wanyonyi) one-on-one and kindly requested him to proceed as planned, being that him the chairman only limits himself to project issues contrary to his (i.e. DCC Wanyonyi's) perception as such;
- Thus DCC Wanyonyi heard none of the chairman's pleas, arrogantly and provokingly pointing to the chairman that he was to answer or face court charges as a result, prompting the said project chairman to leave the scene/urinal and on joining Bramwel & others inside, he hesitantly briefed them of

the sad unfolding event and hurriedly left the place alone for home, thus fearing for his security as such;

- The following day being a Sunday, the project chairman in the company of the project committee vice chairman one Edmond Wangila visited and informed the project area assistant Chief Stuart Wafula at his home, of which in the course of the day the chairman informed & consulted with available project committee members on individual level and which later culminated in his filing of an official complain at Webuye police station, being under OB 23/01/07/2019 at 1055 hrs dated Monday 1st July 2019 as such.
- Based on this profiled veiled security threats to the project committee chairman as indicated above and being in respect of the said project committee's firm stand regarding the prevailing project documents and records in respect of committee resolutions dated 26/05/2019 and 15/06/2019 respectively, being in contrast to the aforementioned malicious secret project land ownership change; malicious unlawful project obstruction and malicious delayed project court case, its hereby finally observed as follows:
 - (i) That DCC David Wanyonyi jointly with his family members actions directly amounts to constitutional rights & freedom of violation of the project committee chairman including members, being against the said project committee's mandate on behalf of the beneficiary communities and the government of Kenya, of which the said profiled veiled security threats constitutes to serious security crimes against humanity, thus need for urgent investigations and prosecutions, likewise protection of the affected project committee members;
 - (ii) That DCC David Wanyonyi's brother Kennedy Wanyonyi is a key contributory factor regarding the said profiled veiled security threats to the project committee chairman, being through his indecent acts of pride; arrogance; incitement; character assassination; conspiracy; among others, hence his in-depth investigation as hereby below observed;-

- (a) While the project chairman undertook to honestly caution him against the unlawful obstruction of the project contractor's works, he arrogantly told off the said chairman with pride and immediately incited his brother DCC David Wanyonyi who threateningly contacted the chairman instantly and later again through Japheth Simiyu Njakusi as such;
- (b) While the project chairman turned down both DCC Wanyonyi and Kennedy Wanyonyi's drive in their vehicles home and likewise Kennedy's request for consultations at the said odd hours on the night of 29/06/2019, the said Kennedy Wanyonyi further incited DCC David Wanyonyi who threatened the said project committee chairman with shouldering project consequences as such.
- (iii) That DCC David Wanyonyi jointly with his family members should be compelled to name their alleged witnesses including the already confirmed and aforementioned Wycliffe Musiambo, who should be investigated jointly with the said family members for conspiracy and incitement, thus jointly threatening the security of the project chairman including committee members, hence community project sabotage for selfish gains;
- (iv) That both DCC David Wanyonyi and Kennedy Wanyonyi are jointly liable for the genesis of the aforementioned public project dispute due to their indecent pride; arrogance; incitement; threats; among others; which ironically trapped and further propelled senior family members Nancy Wanyonyi jointly with Joseph Mulalu Wanyonyi and others, to set up the said family against the project beneficiary community through their malicious project court case, thus the said irony of rising against the community project which is meant to likewise benefit them as residents, hence their apparent suspicious nature towards the project chairman including committee members, local administration and beneficiary communities at large.
- (v) It should be noted that both DCC David Wanyonyi and Kennedy Wanyonyi jointly planted non water friendly exotic trees within the immediate intake catchment without any form of notice whatsoever on 08/07/2018, later on unlawfully obstructed the said project on

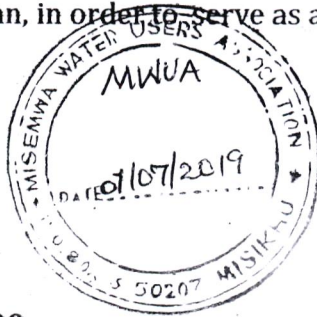

The above subject matter refers.

The above matter had been scheduled for inter-parties hearing before the Senior Principal Magistrate's Court in Kimilili on 2nd January, 2018 when it was transferred to Webuye Law Courts on the even date due to the issue of jurisdiction, extending of interim orders and to take a convenient date by consent for inters- parte hearing.

That to the least of our expectations and in total disparage of practice rules and professional conduct, **Mr. Martin Mulalu Wanyonyi**, the counsel appearing on behalf of Mr. Chanzu for the applicants conducted himself in a manner that was least expected of him as an advocate of the High Court of Kenya.

That as parties set-off separately for Webuye Law Courts, the Counsel picked up the court assistant, lied that the Respondents were not to attend court; drove off speedily to Webuye Law Courts and without any justifiable reason misled the Honorable Court that there was no appearance for 2nd and 3rd Respondents, while the 1st Respondent was absent despite having been duly served with necessary court papers. The truth is that while at Kimilili Law Court, the 1st and 2nd Respondents were present in court and all proceeded to Webuye Law Courts alongside Community Water Project Officials.

That when the Counsel for 1st Respondent and others mentioned above arrived in Webuye Law Courts, they met the counsel for the Applicants and court assistant at the court room's entrance who informed that the Applicant' Counsel had just proceeded and taken an ex-partē hearing date. The counsel proceeded without bothering to find out the whereabouts of the Respondents and whether the proposed dates for the hearing were convenient to all parties.




Consequently we raised a complain through the duty Resident Magistrate **Hon. N. Barasa**, retrieved the court file and requested the applicant's counsel to attend court to schedule a suitable hearing date by consent but he declined and/or refused to heed the request despite being within the Court's premises as he waited to drop back the court assistant.

Based on the above and particularly that the ex-parte date taken by the applicants' counsel in court which is not convenient, the manner in which the counsel conducted himself in court intending to portray the Respondents as lazy and defiant to court orders and for fixing the matter on 10/01/2019, the date counsel had knowledge was inconvenient to the 1st Respondent, we would like to highlight the following issues to the court:

We write to express concern on the completion and launch of the Misemwa water project, which we anticipated to have been done before end of 2018.

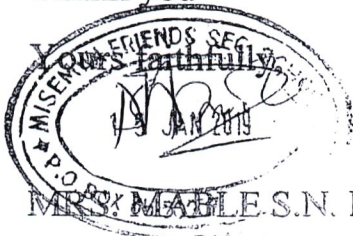
As a school we are in dire need of constant supply of clean water because the school has no water point on the compound and relied on buying from a supplier who uses an ox-cart that is too expensive.

We wish to ask the concerned to hasten the launch to save the school from lack of this important commodity 'WATER' for water is life in a human life.

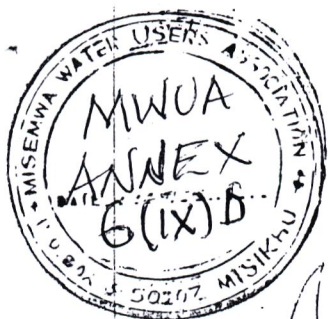

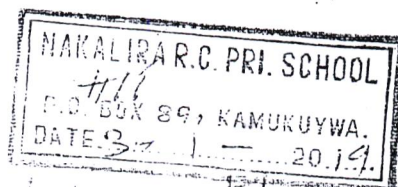

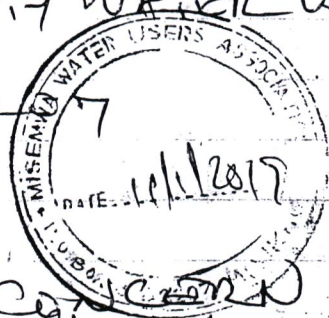
