EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Report is prepared pursuant to Standing Order 200 (1) and (2) which provides that “unless a more regular interval is prescribed under any written law or these Standing Orders, each select committee shall submit half yearly progress reports to the Liaison Committee. The Liaison Committee shall, within twenty-one days, compile the reports and submit a report to the House.”

The Report details the operations of committees of the National Assembly for the period January to June, 2020. Committees in the National Assembly are categorized into House Keeping, Departmental, Appropriations, Financial audit and other Select Committees of the House.

The report also details the challenges faced by the Committees during the period under review. In executing their respective mandates, the Committees reported the following general challenges: The COVID-19 pandemic that was declared in March, 2020, resulted into a drastic reduction of meeting venues suitable for holding physical meetings while maintaining social distancing; the available Committee rooms lacking audio recording and public address equipment; Lack of suitable and adequate facilities for video conferencing during virtual committee meetings; There were no policy guidelines enumerating the ideal virtual platforms for the conduct of meetings as well as rules governing attendance of such meetings; Lack of basic office equipment like computers, photocopiers, paper shredders, scanners thus adversely affecting the Committees’ work and above all, financial challenges during organization of local and foreign visits which impacted negatively on execution of Committee work plans.

PREFACE

1.0 Committee Mandate

The Liaison Committee is established under the provisions of Standing Order 217 and consists of the Deputy Speaker as Chairperson, a member of the Speaker's Panel who is also the First Chairperson of Committees who is the Vice Chairperson and the Chairpersons of all Committees of the House.

The mandate of the Liaison Committee is to: -

- (i) guide and co-ordinate the operations, policies and mandates of all Committees;
- (ii) deliberate on and apportion the annual operating budget among the Committees;
- (iii) consider the programmes of all Committees, including their need to travel and sit away from the precincts of Parliament;
- (iv) ensure that Committees submit reports as required by these Standing Orders;
- (v) determine, whenever necessary, the committee or committees to deliberate on any matter; and

The Committee is mandated to among others prepare and adjust the Parliamentary Calendar with the approval of the House and to determine the nature of business appearing in the Order Paper. The Committee, whose chairperson is the Speaker of the National Assembly, is appointed within seven days on assembly of a new House.

The Committee on Selection is established pursuant to Standing Order 172 of the National Assembly Standing Orders to nominate Members to serve in Committees, in consultation with parliamentary parties, save for the membership of the House Business Committee and Committee on Appointments. The Chairperson of the Committee is the Leader of the Majority party.

D. Activities undertaken by the Committee during the period under review

- (iii) examine, in the context of the autonomy and efficiency of the public investments, whether the affairs of the public investments, are being managed in accordance with sound financial or business principles and prudent commercial practices.

The Committee is excluded from dealing with the following: -

- i. matters of major Government policy as distinct from business or commercial functions of the public investments;

- ii. matters of day-to-day administration; and,
- iii. matters for the consideration of which machinery is established by any special statute under which a particular public investment is established.

D. Activities undertaken during the period under review

a) Sitings

In the period under review (January to June 2020), the Committee held a total of twenty two (22) Sitings within Parliament Buildings. - a. Progress Report on the Consideration of the Special Report on Procurement of Pre-Export Verification of Conformity (PVOC) to Standard Services for Used Motor Vehicles, Mobile Equipment & Used Spare Parts by Kenya Bureau of Standards. The report was tabled in March 2020
- b. The Twenty Third Report of the Public Investments Committee on Audited Financial Statements of State Corporations, tabled in June, 2020.

E. Committee Challenges

The Committee faced a number of challenges during the period under review among them the following:

- Covid- 19 pandemic that continues to affect the operations – Committee was not able to meet witnesses since March, 2020 due to social distancing measures and precautions to curb spread of the virus. This hindered the operations of the committee greatly.
- Failure by accounting officers to submit documents in time. This makes it hard for the Committee to discharge its mandate seamlessly;
- Inadequate time to effectively consider the Reports of the auditor General on all state corporations.
- Backlog of financial statements occasioned by the absence of an Auditor General.

3.2.2 PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE

A. Establishment and Committee's Mandate

The Public Accounts Committee (PAC) was established on Thursday, December 14, 2017 pursuant to Article 124 of the Constitution and the National Assembly Standing Order 205.

The Committee (PAC) is mandated under Standing Order 205 (2) of the National Assembly Standing Orders to examine of the accounts showing the appropriations of the sum voted by the House to meet the public expenditure and of such other accounts laid before the House as the committee may think fit". The Committee oversees the expenditure of public funds by ministries/departments, to ensure adherence to government financial regulations and procedures. The Committee executes its mandate on the basis of annual and special audit reports prepared by the Office of the Auditor General (OAG).

Guiding Principles

In the execution of its mandate afore-stated, PAC is guided by core constitutional and statutory principles on public finance management, as well as established customs, traditions, practices and usages. These principles include:

Constitutional Principles on Public Finance

Article 201 provides for the fundamental principles that "shall guide all aspects of public finance in the Republic". These principles are, inter alia:

- a) there shall be openness and accountability, including public participation in financial matters;*
- b) public money shall be used in a prudent and responsible way; and*
- c) financial management shall be responsible, and fiscal reporting shall be clear.*

E. Challenges experienced by the Committee in the execution of its mandate

In the process of prosecuting its mandate, certain issues impeded the running of the committee. They included;

Such programmes included digital E-Learning, status of end term and semester examinations for learners in schools, colleges, universities and other institutions in the country, virtual learning, preparations and precaution measures during the end of year examinations for Class Eight and Form Four students during the Covid -19 pandemic.
2. The Committee held meetings with the Teachers Service Commission on mass transfer of teachers from North Eastern Region and interdiction of teachers for allegedly interrupting training on competency based curriculum and violation of trade union rights by the Commission.

3. The Committee further held meetings with various Members of Parliament who sponsored legislative proposals and those who presented Questions and Statements for response before the Committee.

E. Challenges faced by the Committee in execution of its mandate

The Committee was faced by the following challenges: -

1. Following the declaration of the Covid-19 pandemic on 11th March 2020 by the World Health Organisation as a health pandemic, the traditional method of holding Committee meetings at the usual venue to which all Members are invited is either impracticable or impossible for the time being because of the compliance to measures of social distancing and minimising gatherings. The Committee experiences challenges on the criteria of selecting the Members to attend a particular meeting. A few members however attend the meeting virtually. There is reduced attendance of meetings by Members due to the protocols on social distancing.
2. All Committee conferences, field visits and retreats were suspended and meetings confined to the precincts of Parliament. This adversely affected discharge of the oversight mandate of the Committee particularly field inspection visits of the ongoing projects and programmes undertaken by the Ministry.
3. Limited approved venues and furniture for holding Committee meetings occasionally leading to cancellation or delay in starting of meetings.
4. In some instances witnesses/stakeholders have requested to attend the Committee meeting virtually which has reduced the level of effectiveness of the meeting due to lack of adequate technology and devices in Parliament to conduct such meetings. The level of interaction in such meetings is also low.

B. Challenges faced by the Committee in execution of its mandate

The Committee experienced the following challenges during the period under review –

- (ii) **Challenges with implementing virtual meetings:** Owing to the COVID-19 pandemic, the numbers of Members and secretariat recommended for physical meetings was limited for social distancing reasons. As a result, it was necessary to provide a link for Members to attend the meetings virtually. The challenge arising out of this arrangement is the limited facilities in the National Assembly for video conferencing. There is also no clear policy direction on which platform to use and the rules governing such meetings. Some Committee Members have also experienced challenges with video conferencing depending on the internet connectivity in their remote location.
- (iii) **Media Coverage and attendance of witnesses:** Owing to the restrictions in the numbers allowable in the Committee rooms, media coverage and attendance for Committee meetings was greatly hampered.

 - (c) The process of establishing the infrastructure necessary for the proper operation of each county including progress on locating offices and assemblies and establishment and transfers of staff.
 - (d) The devolution of powers and functions to the counties under the legislation contemplated in section 15 of the sixth Schedule;
 - (e) Any impediments to the process of implementing this Constitution.
- ii. Coordinate with the Attorney-General, the Commission on the Implementation of the Constitution and relevant parliamentary committees to ensure the timely introduction and passage of the legislation required by the Constitution; and
- iii. Take appropriate action on the reports including addressing any problems in the implementation of the Constitution.

D. Activities undertaken during the period under review

i) Number of Sitzings

During this period, the Constitutional Implementation Oversight Committee held a total of seventeen (17) sittings both in-house and with various stakeholders to consider the below listed business:

ii) Report on the status of implementation of the Constitution

The Committee recommended that a team of lawyers from the office of the Attorney General, Kenya Law Reform Commission and the legal counsels in the National Assembly be identified to work with the Committee to come up with a report on the status of implementation of the Constitution.

iii) Operations of Constitutional Commissions

The Committee noted that the constitutional commissions and independent offices were established by the Constitution with the purpose of securing the observance by all State organs of democratic values and principles as well as to protect the sovereignty of the people. They are therefore required to be independent, subject only to the Constitution and the law and not subject to the direction or control of any person or authority.

The Committee however observed that the capacity of Constitutional Commissions and independent offices to discharge their mandate independently and without interference continued to

be hampered by among other factors lack of financial independence and Executive control. The Committee noted that the Constitutional Commissions interacted with the National Assembly through different Departmental Committees and in most cases mainly during deliberations on the Budget Estimates and at the end of the financial year when they are required to submit a report to the President and to Parliament.

The Committee resolved to have a proposal that Constitutional Commissions report to a specific Committee of the National Assembly to be part of the Committee's recommendation on the status of implementation of the Constitution. This is in order to realize the benefits of Chapter 15 of the Constitution and to ensure the constitutional commissions perform the functions they were envisaged to perform effectively.

iv) Development of Bills to implement and or amend the Constitution

The Committee developed the following Bills seeking to amend the listed Articles of the Constitution of Kenya or to implement various provisions of the Constitution:-

a) The Referendum Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 11), 2020

The Bill seeks to provide the procedure of the approval of an amendment to the Constitution by a referendum, the conduct of a referendum, referendum petitions and consequential amendments to the Elections Act, No.24 of 2011 which currently provides for the conduct of referendum.

The Bill went through the first reading stage and was undergoing public participation and stakeholder consultations before it is brought back to the National Assembly for the 2nd reading stage.

b) The Kenya National Commission on Human Rights (Amendment) Bill, 2020

The Bill seeks to amend the Kenya National Commission on Human Rights Act (No.14 of 2011) in order to merge the Kenya National Commission on Human Rights and the National Gender and Equality Commission in order to retain the proposed Kenya National Human Rights and Equality Commission as established under the Article 59(1) of the Constitution.

The Bill went through the first reading stage, and was undergoing public participation before being taken back to the National Assembly for the 2nd reading stage.

c) The Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) No.5 Bill, 2019

This Bill seeks to amend Article 90 of the Constitution to allow for nomination to Parliament of the Presidential candidates who participate in a general election and their parties gain the required threshold for nominating of candidates to Parliament.

It also seeks to change the submission of the party list for nomination of candidates to be done after the general election and not before.

This move will ensure inclusivity by giving a platform to the Presidential candidate who did not win but have a substantial following in the country to participate in national discourse.

The Bill went through the first reading stage, underwent public participation and the Committee report tabled in the House awaiting the 2nd reading stage.

d) The Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) No.3 Bill, 2019

The Bill seeks to amend the Constitution of Kenya so as to restrain the Courts from intervening with matters pending consideration or being proceeded with before Parliament, County Assemblies or any of their committees in line with international practice where Courts only intervene after Parliament has executed its mandate.

The Committee after analyzing proposals from the stakeholders noted that the proposed amendments to the Bill can neither be amended nor improved. The Committee therefore resolved that the Bill be withdrawn, redrafted and re-introduced with the improved amendments.

e) The Public Fundraising Appeals Bill, 2019

The Public Fundraising Appeals Bill, 2019 seeks to regulate public collections or *harambees*; to repeal the Public Collections Act and in its place have a more robust legal architecture in addressing pertinent issues in public collections.

It also seeks to provide a framework for transparency and accountability in the conduct of fundraising appeals, avail proper safeguards to curb corruption that arises in voluntary collections and ensuring that organizers of public fundraisings account for the monies raised.

The Committee conducted public participation on the Bill in 17 Counties and tabled its report in the House awaiting the 2nd reading stage.

v) Bills (Pre-Publication Scrutiny& Publication)

The Committee introduced the following legislative proposals dealing with implementation of the constitution which are at various stages of processing in Parliament;

- a) The Covid 19 and other Pandemics Bill, 2020;
- b) The Roads Accident Fund Bill, 2020.

vi) Stakeholder engagements

The Committee held meetings with the following institutions/agencies;

- a. The Registrar of Political Parties to discuss the aspect of the distribution of funds to political parties in the representation of special interest group laws (amendment) Bill, 2020.
- b. The Office of the Attorney General(OAG), Kenya Law Reform Commission(KLRC), Commission on Administrative Justice(CAJ), Registrar of Political Parties(RPP), Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission(IEBC), National Gender and Equality Commission(NGEC) and Kenya National Commission on Human Rights (KNCHR) to discuss their various views on the Referendum Bill, 2020.

vii) Local Visits and Public Hearings

The Committee undertook one (1) retreat and conducted public hearings on the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) (No.5) Bill, 2020 in 4 counties during the period under review as follows:

- a) Retreat to consider the stakeholder views on the Public Fundraising Appeals Bill, 2019 and the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) No.5 Bill, 2019. The activity took place from 5th to 8th March, 2020 in Mombasa.
- b) Public Hearings conducted in 4 Counties namely; Kisumu, Kakamega, Nakuru, and Nyeri Counties from 12th to 15th March, 2020 on the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) No.5 Bill, 2019 and the Public Fundraising Appeals Bill, 2019.

viii) Committee Reports

The Committee tabled two reports on the study visit to the Federal Republic of Nigeria and the Federal Republic of Germany.

ix) Pending business

The Committee is in the process of processing the following Bills and reports:

- a) The Covid 19 and other Pandemics Bill, 2020 seeks to establish a legal framework for the measures to be adopted during the period of the COVID-19 pandemic and other pandemics. It seeks to provide for the measures necessary to be taken to guard against the continuous spread of the COVID-19 disease, as well as the action to be taken during the period of the pandemic so as to secure the social and economic welfare of the people of Kenya.
- b) The Roads Accident Fund Bill, 2020 proposes to establish a Board to administer the Fund with the main purpose of the Fund being to provide funds for compensation to road users for loss, damage or accidents caused by use of roads.
- c) Preparation of a Report on the status of implementation of the Constitution, the gaps identified in the Constitution and recommendations for amendments.

E. Challenges faced by the Committee in executing its mandate

- a) Cancellation of meetings and public participation activities scheduled for various Bills due to the containment measures put in place to combat COVID-19;
- b) Inadequate committee meeting rooms and condemning of others due to the small size and ventilation that could not support social distancing led to postponement of meetings.
- c) Delay of processing of Committee Bills- the Committee is concerned that the Covid 19 and other Pandemics Bill, 2020 and the Roads Accident fund Bill, 2020 have taken an inordinately long period to process before publication.

3.4.4 COMMITTEE ON IMPLEMENTATION

A. Committee mandate

The Committee on Implementation is a select Committee of the House established pursuant to Standing Order 209 of the National Assembly Standing Orders.

1. It is mandated to scrutinize the resolutions of the House (including adopted committee reports), petitions and the undertakings given by the National Executive and examine—
 - a) whether or not such decisions and undertakings have been implemented and where implemented, the extent to which they have been implemented; and whether such implementation has taken place within the minimum time necessary; and
 - b) whether or not legislation passed by the House has been operationalized and where operationalized, the extent to which such operationalization has taken place within the minimum time necessary.
2. The Committee may propose to the House, sanctions against any Cabinet Secretary who fails to report to the relevant select Committee on implementation status without justifiable reasons. This mandate is further enhanced by the provisions of Article 153(4) (b) of the Constitution that requires Cabinet Secretaries to provide Parliament with full and regular reports concerning matters under their control.

B. Oversight

In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees all arms of Government, the Executive, the Legislature and the Judiciary.

F. CHALLENGES FACED BY THE COMMITTEE IN EXECUTING ITS MANDATE

1. Cabinet Secretaries invited to attend Committee meetings would sometimes not show up as requested. This interfered with the Committee's programme of activities and slowed down the Committee's work;
2. Inadequate Committee rooms: This occasionally led to unnecessary delays and cancellation of scheduled meetings.

- (a) Oversee the implementation of the Act and in this respect, shall after every two years submit a report to the National Assembly and where necessary, propose any amendments to this Act with respect to the quantum of funds repayable into the Fund in accordance with section 4 of the Act;
- (b) Oversee the policy framework and legislative matters that may arise in relation to the Fund;
- (c) Continually review the frame set out for the efficient delivery of development programmes financed through the Fund;

- (d) Consider and report to the National Assembly, with recommendations, names of persons required to be approved by the National Assembly under this Act.

B. Activities undertaken during the period under review

The Committee held 8 meetings in to deliberate on the following:-

Engaging the National Treasury on the accrued undisbursed funds to the NG-CDF kitty of Ksh.4.7 billion, since FY the 2012/2013.

Those arrears have affected subsequent annual disbursement to constituencies and is a major concern to NG-CDF Board, which has since appealed for the Committee's intervention. The matter has been before the Committee and consultations are ongoing.

a) Meetings with NG-CDF Board during and after presentations of Quarterly reports

Pursuant to section 51(1) of the National Government Constituency Fund Act, 2015, the National Government Constituency Development Board is obligated to submit a report to the National Assembly Committee detailing a summary of the project proposals received from the constituencies; indicating the approval status of such projects, summary of the status of disbursements of funds to the constituencies and the summary of status of disbursements from the Treasury to the National account.

b) Bills

The Committee received and deliberated on the following Bills:-

1. National Government Constituencies Development Fund, 2018 by Hon. (Dr) David Eseli, MP.
2. The Ward development (Equalization) Fund Bill (Senate Bill), 2018.

c) Vetting

The Committee held meetings during the pre-vetting, vetting and adoption of the Vetting Reports on Prof. Mohamed Hussein Abdille, and Mr. Yusuf Mbuno for the position of CEO of the NG-CDF Board.

C. Challenges experienced by the Committee in execution of its mandate

During the period under review, the Committee did not experience any unique challenge in the execution of its mandate.

- Recommend to and advise the House on matters related to the provision of library, publications and research services in Parliament, including improvement of the library and research services; and

4.0 CHALLENGES FACED BY COMMITTEES

The following are the challenges that affected the Committees generally:

1. The Committees were adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. As a result, there was a drastic reduction of meeting venues suitable for holding physical meetings while maintaining social distancing;
2. Owing to the COVID-19 pandemic, the number of Members and secretariat recommended for physical meetings was limited. As a result, it was necessary to provide a link for Members to attend meetings virtually. As such, there were limited facilities suitable for video conferencing;
3. There were no policy guidelines enumerating the ideal virtual platforms for use by Committees while conducting virtual meetings; as well as rules governing the attendance of such meetings;
4. Media coverage and attendance of witnesses was greatly hampered during the period under review. This was due to the COVID-19 pandemic where physical meetings were minimal, with limited attendees;
5. The virtual platforms available for conducting virtual sittings were prone to hacking, thus lack of confidentiality of information shared during such meetings;
6. Lack of equipment like photocopiers, paper shredders and scanners which make the work of the secretariats difficult and adversely affect the Committees' work;
7. Lack of reliable database and tracking system of legislation and inability to monitor legislative proposals due to lack of a one stop reference point;
8. Lack of adequate number of Office Attendants and/or messengers made the work of the secretariats difficult and impacts negatively on the work of the Committees;
9. During organization of local and foreign visits, there were challenges on provision of funds to undertake such visits causing postponement of scheduled activities. These impacted negatively on execution of the work plans of committees;

10. Lack of enough time to consider Budget estimates before submitting reports to the Budget and Appropriations Committee thus Committees not being able to scrutinize the Estimates satisfactorily.
11. Delayed response from the executive to Committee requests especially comments on Bills impacted negatively on the Committee mandate.
