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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Health on its consideration of the Senate Amendment to the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022).

The National Assembly considered the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022) and passed it with amendments on Wednesday, 20th March 2024 and forwarded the same to the Senate for concurrence pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 144. The Senate subsequently considered the Bill and passed it with amendments on Tuesday, 19th November, 2024. The Senate amendments to the Bill were then referred to the Departmental Committee on Health for consideration, and reporting back to the House.

In considering the amendments, the Committee held a meeting on Tuesday, 25th March, 2025 during which it observed that, the Senate had proposed one amendment to clause 2. The amendment proposed to insert the words "including telemedicine" immediately after the words "and information technology" in the proposed new definition of the word "e-health".

The Committee considered this amendment and recommends that the House approves the amendment to Clause 2 as proposed by the Senate.

The Committee is grateful to the Offices of the Speaker and Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during its sittings on the consideration of the Bill.

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Health and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199(6), it is my pleasant privilege to present to this House the report of the Committee on its consideration of the Senate Amendment to the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022).

It is further my pleasure to report that the Committee has considered the Senate amendment to the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022) and has the honour of reporting back to the National Assembly with the recommendation that **the House agrees with the Senate Amendment as proposed, pursuant to Article 112(2) (b) of the Constitution.**

PART ONE

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

1. The Departmental Committee on Health is established pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 216 of the National Assembly Standing Orders and in line with Article 124 of the Constitution which provides for the establishment of the Committees by Parliament.
2. The mandate and functions of the Committee include:
 - a) *To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;*
 - b) *To study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;*
 - ba) *on a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;*
 - c) *To study and review all legislation referred to it;*
 - d) *To study, assess and analyse the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;*
 - e) *To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;*
 - f) *Vet and report on all appointments where the constitution or any other law requires the national Assembly to approve, except those understanding Order 204 (Committee on appointments);*
 - g) *To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;*
 - h) *To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;*
 - i) *To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and*
 - j) *To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.*

1.2 Mandate of the Committee

3. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider all matters relating to the health sector. The Committee oversees the Ministry of Health with its two State Departments i.e., the State Department for Medical Services and the State Department for Public Health and Professional Standards.

2.1 OVERVIEW OF THE SENATE AMENDMENT TO THE CANCER PREVENTION AND CONTROL (AMENDMENT) (NO.2) BILL, 2022 (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 45 OF 2022)

2.2 Introduction

6. The Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill, 2022 was sponsored by Hon. Rahim Dawood.
7. Pursuant to Standing Order 126, the Bill was read a first time on 15th February, 2023 and thereafter committed to the Departmental Committee on Health for its consideration.
8. The principal object of the Bill is to amend the Cancer Prevention and Control Act, No. 15 of 2012, to provide for training of health cadres in the specialized medical field of oncology, to include cancer treatment as part of the provision of primary healthcare and to incorporate the use of e-health and telemedicine in the prevention and management of cancer.
9. The Bill was passed by the House on Wednesday, 20th March 2024 and was forwarded to the Senate pursuant to Article 110(4) of the Constitution and Standing Order 144 of the National Assembly Standing Orders. The Senate considered the Bill and passed it with amendments on Tuesday, 19th November, 2024.
10. The Bill was referred back to the National Assembly in accordance with Article 112(1) (b) of the Constitution.

2.3 . Analysis of the Senate Amendments to the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No.2) Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 45 Of 2022)

11. **Clause 2**, in the proposed new definition of the word “e-health”, the Senate proposes to insert the words “including telemedicine” immediately after the words “and information technology”.

3.1 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

13. The Committee observed that the principal object of the Bill was to amend the provisions of the Cancer Prevention and Control Act, No. 15 of 2012, to provide for training of health cadres in the specialized medical field of oncology, to include cancer treatment as part of the provision of primary healthcare and to incorporate the use of e-health and telemedicine in the prevention and management of cancer.
14. In considering the proposed Senate amendment, the Committee observed that the amendment proposed by the Senate seeks to include telemedicine in the definition of the term "e-health" as used in the Bill.

3.2 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

15. The Committee having considered the Senate Amendment to the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 45 of 2022) recommends that the House agrees with the Senate Amendment as proposed, pursuant to Article 112(2) (b) of the Constitution.

The objective of this meeting is to assess the current level of categorization and the readiness of hospitals to offer level 6 services, in preparation for the elevation of Jaramogi Oginga Odinga Teaching & Referral Hospital. Key discussion points for the meeting should include an evaluation of the current hospital categorization, an Assessment of readiness to deliver level 6 services, and a Timeline and required actions for achieving the necessary standards.
2. The Committee has tasked the Secretariat with organizing a joint meeting in two weeks with the following stakeholders: KEMSA, Standing Senate Committee on Health, Council of Governors, Controller of Budget, National Treasury, and Ministry of Health to discuss the pending bills owed to KEMSA.
3. Finally, the chairperson of the committee informed the members that in summary, a country can build a health system that moves closer to universal health coverage by ensuring that all these elements work efficiently. A well-managed Human resource (including interns), an effective governing body overseeing health policies and regulations the Social Health Authority (SHA), an efficient supply chain (KEMSA), and a robust primary health care system together create a resilient health system. This being the general view of what is before the committee there is a need to focus on these elements and the committee is urged to adopt an overall strategy that ensures an approach that can effectively drive the country closer to achieving UHC.

MESSAGE TO THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

No. 46 of 2024

SUBJECT: PASSAGE OF THE CANCER PREVENTION AND CONTROL (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILLS NO. 45 OF 2022)

PURSUANT to Article 112(1)(b) of the Constitution and the provisions of Standing Order 46(1) of the Senate, I hereby convey the following Message from the Senate –

“WHEREAS the Cancer Prevention and Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 45 of 2022) was published *vide* Kenya Gazette Supplement No. 170 of 20th October, 2022 as a Bill for an Act of Parliament to amend the Cancer Prevention and Control Act;
