**REPRIMAND OF MEMBERS IN BREACH OF PRIVILEGE**

**Honourable Members,** this communication relates to the decision that the House has just taken on the business appearing under Order Number **8**. Consequent to that decision, the Honourable Charles Kanyi Njagua, MP and Hon. Paul Owino Ongili, MP are now considered strangers until they have been reprimanded and tendered a suitable apology to the House and Members in accordance with section 17(3)(b) and (c) of the Parliamentary Powers and Privileges Act, 2017.

**Honourable Members,** section 4 of the Third Schedule to the Parliamentary Powers and Privileges Act, 2017, vests in the Speaker the authority to administer disciplinary action recommended by the Committee of Powers and Privileges and adopted by the House. For avoidance of doubt, section 4 provides that –

*“4. Where the House adopts any recommendation of the Report for disciplinary action, with or without amendment, the Speaker shall forthwith take action accordingly.”*

**Honourable Members**, I therefore order, the Chief Serjeant-at-Arms to escort the two strangers, Mr. Paul Owino Ongili and Mr. Charles Kanyi Njagua, (if they are in the Chamber) and ensure that they withdraw from the Chamber and take seats at a suitable a place designated for strangers at the Bar of the House. Thereafter, I will call each one of them to the Bar for disciplinary action to be duly meted.
