## **Preamble**

This follows your invitation to the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Public Service and Gender for a meeting on 30<sup>th</sup> July, 2020 through letter NA/DCS/LSW/2020 (39) to respond to Hon. Chachu Ganya, MP for North Horr Constituency, question on **'Implementation and Operationalization of Uwezo Fund Program in all the Constituencies in Marsabit County'**

The Ministry acknowledges the powers of the Departmental Committee on Labour and Social Welfare.

Given the above **Hon. Chairman**, I am deeply honored to appear before this House and submit the response of my Ministry as follows: -

### **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

**Hon. Chairman,**

Uwezo Fund Oversight Board is a component of the Gender Empowerment programme of the Ministry of Public Service and Gender. The strategic objectives of the Ministry include to: spearhead women empowerment in all aspects of national development, and Promote gender equity and equality.

The Ministry has two state departments: State Department for Public Service and the State Department for Gender.

UWEZO Fund is a Government affirmative intervention administered at the State Department for Gender aimed towards achieving empowerment of Youth, Women and Persons with Disabilities. The Fund provides affordable, accessible and interest free credit to groups of women, youth and persons with disabilities (PWDs) to promote their businesses and thereby enhancing their economic wellbeing.

Uwezo Fund plays an instrumental role in realizing the provisions of the Constitution of Kenya and delivering the mandate of the Ministry of Public Service and Gender, particularly in addressing the needs of vulnerable groups, increasing public participation in development, promoting inclusivity, equality and equity, empowering women, youth

and persons with disabilities, and enhancing non-discrimination and protection of marginalized groups.

Under MTP III, the programme further supports promotion of gender equality and empowerment of women, youth, children and the vulnerable members of society. This is essential in realization of human rights and sustainable development.

The Government has made concerted effort to strengthen equity and gender equality, including ratification and domestication of several international and regional instruments by establishing a clear vision in delivery of its services. The Kenya Vision 2030 recognizes poverty eradication, women empowerment as the primary means of upward social mobility, national cohesion and socio-economic development.

The Fund supports implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and Kenya Vision 2030 especially ending poverty and hunger, gender equality, empowerment of youth, women and persons with disabilities.

Goal 8 of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) advocates for decent work and economic growth which encourages sustained economic growth by achieving higher levels of productivity. With these in mind, the goal of the Funds are to achieve full and productive employment, and decent work, for all women, youth and PWDs.

### **1.1 BACKGROUND OF THE FUND**

Uwezo Fund is a State Agency established under the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and operationalized through The Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund), Regulations, 2014. The Uwezo Fund program is administered by the State Department for Gender under the Ministry of Public Service and Gender, with an aim 'to enhance the socio-economic empowerment of women, youth and persons with disabilities through entrepreneurial training and provision of affordable credit'.

The programme is implemented at the Constituency level as a revolving Fund that provides accessible and affordable credit, capacity building and market linkages to women, youth and persons with disability for their socio-economic development.

Notably, Uwezo Fund has been actively involved in sensitizing the public on access to finances, access to Government Procurement Opportunities (AGPO), value addition, table banking, loan repayment through business clinics and Huduma Mashinani programmes.

## **1.2 MANDATE OF UWEZO FUND**

The Fund derives its mandate from the Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund), Regulations, 2014 to achieve the following objectives: -

- i. To expand access to loans for the promotion of youth and women businesses and enterprises at the constituency level and thereby enhance economic growth towards the realization of the goals of Vision 2030;
- ii. To generate gainful self-employment for the youth and women; and
- iii. To model an alternative framework in funding community driven development.

## **3.0 THE FUND'S DEVELOPMENT ROLE**

In keeping with the current Government's "Big Four" Agenda, the Fund aims at ensuring that women, youth and persons with disabilities participate in productive socio-economic and political activities to realize their potential.

This has been exhibited by the Fund expanding access to loans for the promotion of businesses and enterprises for youth, women and PWDs towards gainful self-employment. Such efforts have ensured the active participation of beneficiaries in achievement of Big four Agenda through funding groups that are engaging in Agribusiness to enhance food security, manufacturing and affordable housing. In addition, the Fund has supported registration of beneficiaries to the National Hospital Insurance Fund (NHIF), to achieve universal health amongst its beneficiaries.

Nationally, a total of **Kshs. 6.22 Billion** has been disbursed to 67,241 groups comprising of; **22,993** Youth, **42,307** Women and **1,941** Persons with Disabilities groups. This totals to **1,024,306** individual beneficiaries by end of March 2020.

At this juncture **Hon Members**, allow me to respond to the specific questions raised as per your invitation.

**I. Could the Cabinet Secretary provide a report on the implementation and operationalization status of Uwezo Fund program in all the Constituencies of Marsabit County since inception in 2013.**

At inception, Marsabit County constituted Constituencies Uwezo Fund Management Committees (CUFMCs) and were gazetted as shown below:

The County has cumulatively received **Kshs. 89,319,169** to all the four constituencies for loaning to groups. Out of this amount Kshs. 47,590,000 has been loaned to **526 groups** (263 Youth, 255 Women and 8 PWDs groups) reaching a total of 18,712 individuals. The committee have also trained all the 526 groups on entrepreneurship, business development services, value addition, table banking and Access to Government Procurement Opportunities (AGPO). This training enhances business acumen of the beneficiaries as well as prepare them to take up government opportunities provided through AGPO.

The County has so far repaid **Kshs. 3,209,038** representing **6.74%** repayment rate. **(See Annex I)**

The operations of the Fund are implemented by Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees (CUFMCs) at the constituency level. The National Government Constituency Development Fund Manager, Sub-county Youth Development Officer, who is the secretary to the committee and the Sub-county Development Officers provide secretariat services to the constituency committees.

The Fund guided all CUFMCs secretaries on the implementation of Fund activities at the constituency level which includes guidelines for the induction of CUFMCs and loan recovery strategies **(See Annex II)**.

The term of the first Committees expired on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2017, and the Constituency and County Patrons nominated new committee members as provided in the regulations which were gazetted by the Cabinet Secretary as indicated below;

The performance of the Fund in the region has been low with challenges noted on repayment. This resulted to the Boards guidance as provided for by the Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund) Regulations, 2014 Section 6(j) which provides that the Board shall put in place necessary mechanisms for sanctions and their enforcements in case of loan repayment default. The Board during its 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2017 vide **Min. UWZ/BRD/092/022/11/2017** resolved to peg loaning approvals for constituencies to a minimum of 50% on loan repayment rate and adopted Constituencies loan grading guidelines. The sanctions were expected to improve repayment efforts in constituencies, and eventually the overall repayment of the Fund.

Significant improvement was noted in the loan's performance across constituencies during the implementation period of the directive. However, the following concerns have been noted in the course of the implementation;

- Groups that have successfully repaid their initial loans in constituencies below 50% repayment threshold continue to bear the burden of the defaulting groups.
- New groups whose repayment/default history with the Fund has not been established have not been able to benefit from the Fund.

The Board in its meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2019 vide **Min. UWZ/BRD/21/02/12/19** resolved to review the resolution for restrictive approval to constituencies to allow gradual opening of lending even in constituencies with low repayment rates.

Under this review, the Board approved;

- Kshs. 2 Million to 19 groups in Laisamis Constituency and
- Kshs. 3 Million to 23 groups in North Horr (**See Annex III**)

**II. How much money has since been allocated and how much has been disbursed from the Fund for the benefit of each of the four Constituencies of Marsabit County?**

Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund) Regulations, 2014 section 18 (1) (c) provides a criteria for disbursement of funds to constituencies. The regulations states that 75% is shared equally across constituencies and 25% on the basis of Kenya National Bureau of Statistics poverty index for equalization purposes.

In the last six years of its existence, the Fund has disbursed a total of Kshs. 89,319,160 to the County as indicated in Table II below. Out of the disbursed amounts, Kshs. 47,590,000 was issued to 526 groups (263 Youth groups, 255 Women groups and 8 PWDs groups) reaching a total of 18,712 beneficiaries (see Table III). The current repayment by groups across the county is Kshs. 3,208,038 which represents 6.74% repayment rate.

**III. Why are members of Uwezo Fund Committees in the said Constituencies who were gazette in 2019 yet to undergo the mandatory induction programme and when is the exercise expected to take place with respect to the said members?**


The Board since inception has been inducting the Constituency Secretariat who in-turn induct the constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees. Capacity building of beneficiary groups was contracted to Capacity Building Service providers whose term came to an end in 2015/2016 financial year. The Board guided that capacity building of groups be done by the Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees. The Committees are inducted on; The mandate of the fund, Fund beneficiaries, Eligibility criteria for applicants, Eligible amount, Loan repayment, Funding and capacity building of the groups, Roles and responsibilities of the key stakeholders

The induction of the Committees in the four constituencies were carried out as tabulated below;

The delay of the induction of Saku Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee was occasioned by delay in gazettment of the Committee. However, the operations of the constituency continued as constituency secretariat - comprises of Government officials - continued to guide the operations of the Fund. The management sought authority to induct the committee and in observance to the protocol set by the Ministry of Health, the committee was inducted in June, 2020.

At inception, all Constituencies in Marsabit County, constituted Uwezo Fund Management Committees (CUFMCs) and were gazetted as shown below:

It is a constituency based revolving Fund implemented by Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees (CUFMCs) and supported by the constituency secretariat which comprises of the National Government Constituency Development Fund Manager, Sub-county Youth Development Officer, who is the secretary to the committee and the Sub-county Development Officers.

Each constituency in the county opened and manages three accounts;

- Uwezo Fund Main Account – loan fund
- Administration Account – administration funds
- Loan Repayment Account – loan repayment by beneficiary groups

The Fund allocated and disbursed a total of **Kshs. 89,319,169** as loan Fund to all the four constituencies in the County for loaning to groups in accordance with the criteria stipulated in the Fund's regulations as follows: -

- Seventy five percent (75%) is shared equally across constituencies
- Twenty five percent (25%) is shared on the basis of Kenya National Bureau of Statistics poverty index for equalization purposes

Out of the allocations received, the committees disbursed a total of **Kshs. 47,590,000** to **526 beneficiary groups** (263 Youth, 255 Women and 8 PWDs groups) reaching a total of **18,712 individuals**. This translates to an absorption rate of Fifty three percent (53%) for the County with Saku Constituency leading with 82%, followed by Moyale at 72%, Laisamis at 43% and North Horr at 18%. **(See Annex I)**.

The Fund through its capacity building programme has trained all the 526 beneficiary groups on entrepreneurship, business development services, value addition, table banking and Access to Government Procurement Opportunities (AGPO). This training enhanced business acumen of the beneficiaries as well as prepared them to take up government opportunities provided through AGPO.

The Constituencies recorded a cumulative repayment of **Kshs. 3,209,038** representing **6.74%** repayment rate as tabulated below;

The Fund trained committee members and constituency secretariat on; General information on the Fund, loans management, training of groups, reporting/documentation, revolving, repayment and roles of key stakeholders. The Fund also enlisted the support of the National Government Administrative Officers (Deputy County Commissioners, Assistant County Commissioners and Chiefs) to support the committees in sensitizing the community about the fund and follow-up of the loan fund from the beneficiary groups. The Fund has continued guiding the constituencies secretariat on the implementation of Fund activities. **(See Annex II)**.

Sustainability of the Fund depended on repayment and revolving of the loan fund. The Board noted this as a major concern and in 2017 and as guided by the Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund) Regulations, 2014 Section 6(j) which provides that the Board shall put in place necessary mechanisms for sanctions and their enforcements in case of loan repayment default, resolved to peg loaning approvals for constituencies to a minimum of 50% on loan repayment rate and adopted Constituencies loan grading guidelines. The sanctions were expected to improve repayment efforts in constituencies, and eventually the overall repayment of the Fund.

Significant improvement was noted in some constituencies, but the operations of the Fund has been slow in the county as all the constituencies are below the threshold. The Board noted this challenge and in the year 2019, reviewed the directive restricting approval to constituencies to allow gradual opening of lending even in constituencies with low repayment rates.

Under this review, the Board approved disbursement of loans to groups in the following constituencies;

- Kshs. 2 Million to 19 groups in Laisamis Constituency and
- Kshs. 3 Million to 23 groups in North Horr **(See Annex III)**

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## FOREWORD

These guidelines are for the induction of the Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee (CUFMC). The members of Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee perform a valuable service to the local community, and to the wider Kenyan community. This guidance note sets out the roles of the committee members, resources which the Fund offers to assist the committee to comply with its obligations and with good governance practice and the expectations of the Board from the Committees. The Board supports and oversees over 290 Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees on behalf of the Ministry.

The work of the constituency committees is essential to community work.

As a public Institution, we are willing to take risks. Therefore, committee members are encouraged to be bold: be open to proposals that have the potential to be transformative and help us identify groups at all group stages who have the drive, originality and vision to join the 21st century's successful groups and entrepreneurs.

Uwezo Fund is open to ideas about how to develop and improve – and we value the knowledge, expertise and experience of all the committee members. We look forward to sharing ideas and advice, and in developing what will become a mutually rewarding working relationship.

This guide introduces how Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee Works, what is expected from the Fund, and what the Fund expects in return from our committee members.

## **1.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Uwezo Fund is a National Government Affirmative Action Programme in the Ministry of Public Service, Youth and Gender Affairs established in 2014 through Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund) Regulations. The Fund is administered by the State Department of Gender Affairs and contributes towards transforming Kenya into a medium-income economy and the attainment of the Sustainable Development Goals. The major objective of the Fund is to enhance economic empowerment for women, youth and People with Disability through provision of affordable and accessible finances to groups of Youth, Women and People with Disability to promote their businesses and enterprises at grass root level.

The Fund is operated at two levels; the National level, which constitutes of Uwezo Fund Oversight Board assisted by secretariat staff and the Constituency Level where the Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees (CUFMCs) oversees the implementation of the Fund at their respective Constituencies.

## **2.0 THE RATIONALE OF INDUCTION OF COMMITTEES**

The Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund) regulations, 2014 Section 15 provide for the appointment of the CUFMCs whose term of office is three years. Consequently, the Fund foresees a new crop of CUFMCs every three years and thus the need for inducting the new committees to prepare them for the effective delivery of their mandate in the constituencies. In the context of Uwezo Fund, induction refers to the process of receiving and orientating/familiarizing new committee members to the Fund's work procedures and environment. The committee members are drawn from diverse professions, experiences and backgrounds. To ensure harmonized approach to the implementation and management of the Fund, it is imperative that induction is conducted.

The induction specific objectives are: -

- To introduce and orient the CUFMCs to the general operations of the Fund as well as the constituency- specific operations of the Fund.
- To train the CUFMC members on their roles, responsibilities and obligations in dispensing the Fund's mandate.
- To foster the team building spirit amongst the CUFMC members

### **3.0 THE MANDATE OF THE FUND**

The Mandate of the Fund is drawn from its objectives. These are: -

- i. To expand access to finances in promotion of women, youth and persons with disability businesses and enterprises at the constituency level for economic growth towards the realization of the goals of vision 2030.
- ii. To generate gainful self-employment for the youth and women; and
- iii. To model an alternative framework in funding community drives development

### **3.2 FUND BENEFICIARIES**

Our main beneficiaries are groups of Women, Youth and Persons living with Disability. However, men can benefit from the Fund by joining groups of Youth, Women and Persons with Disabilities.

#### **3.2.1 Eligibility criteria for applicants**

Applicants shall qualify for Fund loan application if: -

##### **(a) For a group: -**

- Is registered with the department of social services, Cooperatives or the Registrar of Societies;
- Has members aged between 18 and 35 years whereas the women's groups and people with disabilities (PWD) shall be made up of women and PWD aged eighteen years and above respectively;
- Is based and operational at the constituency it seeks to make an application for consideration;
- Operates a table banking structure or any other group fund structure where members make monthly contributions according to the groups' internal guidelines (evidence of monthly contributions shall be a requirement);
- Hold a bank account in the name of the group.

##### **(b) For an institution: -**

- Is a registered entity
- Has listed youth and women groups within it

#### **3.2.2 Eligible amount- New Groups/ applicants**

In determining the total amount, a group is eligible to receive, the following criteria shall be applied: -

- The length of time the group has been in existence;
- The total amount contributed by the group;
- The current status of contribution; and
- The proposed business plan for the loan applied.

Access by eligible groups shall be on a first come first serve basis, subject to approval of the loan, provided that the committee shall ensure equitable distribution of the funds in the wards.

### **3.2.3 Eligibility criteria- Refinancing groups**

Groups that successfully repay their initial loan shall be eligible for subsequent funding according to the provisions of the refinancing strategy. The following criteria shall be used while recommending a group for refinancing

- **Complete Repayment**

A group/institution will be considered to have completed repayment after full repayment of the loaned amount within the stipulated period i.e. 24 months.

- **Proper Utilization of the Funds**

A group/institution will be considered to have utilized the funds properly if it has effectively implemented its proposed business plan. The group/institution will be expected to produce appropriate records supporting the way funds have been utilized.

- **Promotion of the Table Banking Concept-**

Table banking has been a key concept upon which Uwezo fund is centered. A group/institution should be able to provide credible evidence of table banking e.g. Pass books, ledger books, bank statements in support of growth of their total revolving funds.

- **Potential for Growth and Employment Creation: No of Businesses Established and supported:**

The group/institution must clearly indicate the businesses supported by Uwezo funds through their groups (numbers and sizes). In addition, the groups must indicate whether their ventures have created employment and report on the number of such employments created as well as indicate their potential for employment creation. The group/institutions must clearly specify their sustainability strategy.

Upon satisfying conditions stipulated in the refinancing strategy, the group/institution will be eligible for refinancing. Subsequent funding will be between 150-200% of the initial loan subject to a maximum of five hundred thousand shillings (500,000/=) as stipulated by the Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund) Regulations, 2014.

#### **Agreement Form**

- On behalf of the Government, the committee enters into an agreement with the identified beneficiary groups on the terms of the loan repayment prior to release of funds through signing of a prescribed form
- The agreement form must be signed by all members of the group and witnessed by the area chief/assistant chief before a group is issued with the Loan

### **3.2.3 Loan Repayment**

- Uwezo loan attracts no interest/interest free/zero interest
- All groups shall be allowed a six months grace period before commencement of repayment of the loan element, but all loans shall be payable within two years from the expiry of the grace period.

- **Repayment procedure**

Uwezo Fund is a revolving fund and its sustainability is dependent on the repayment of loans for onward lending to other qualified groups. the following is the procedure for loan repayment

- Loan recipient's deposits by cash or cheque their monthly repayments for loan proceeds into the Uwezo Fund Repayment Account for their respective constituency (This account is displayed in public notices and Banking halls)
- The group **must** pay in the name of the group and submit a copy of the deposit slip to the Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee (CUFMCs) who issues and acknowledge receipt to the recipient group.
- Upon verifiable proof of loan repayment of all loan proceeds, the Committee issues a discharge certificate to the recipient group with respect to the loan repayment.

### **3.3 FUNDING AND CAPACITY BUILDING OF THE GROUPS**

The core mandate of the fund is to provide accessible credit to groups of Youth, Women and Persons living Disability. However, the Fund Offers training to the beneficiary groups before they receive their cheques.

#### **3.3.1 Loans**

The Fund gives loans to groups ranging from Fifty Thousand to Five Hundred Thousand (**Ksh 50,000 to 500,000**). However, the initial maximum loan amount is 100,000 and groups can graduate to a maximum of Kshs. 500,000 through refinancing.

#### **3.3.2 Capacity Building of groups**

Before the beneficiary's groups receive their cheques, they undergo training on General Information about Uwezo Fund, Concept of Table Banking, Record keeping, and Identification of business opportunities, Mentorship and networking, Sources of business finance, Access to Government Procurement Opportunity, Value chain and Loan repayment. The training is conducted by the Constituency Uwezo Fund Committee and supported by the Uwezo Fund Oversight Board. Beneficiary groups are invited for training by the Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees

In return, we expect our funded groups to repay their loans in full and timely within stipulated period of Twenty-Four months after expiry of six months grace period.

### **4.0 ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

The roles and responsibilities of the key stake holders are prescribed in the PFM Uwezo Fund Regulations, 2014.

#### **4.1.0 The National Champion and patron.**

The President is the National champion and overall Patron of the Fund and provides leadership, overall policy direction and enhances the Fund's prestige and profile.

In pursuance to his role the President shall: -

- Receive annual report on the performance of the Fund and review the implementation progress
- Set the overall agenda for the Fund, by ensuring commitment at the highest level of government and
- Recognize the Fund's success stories through an annual awards ceremony.

#### **4.1.1 The County and Constituency**

The County Woman Representative of the National Assembly is the patron of the Fund at the County level and the constituency Member of Parliament is the patron of the Fund at the Constituency level.

The patrons shall have the following responsibilities: -

- Provide linkage between the Fund and the public at the county and constituency level respectively
- Mobilize target beneficiaries to participate in the Fund
- Appoint constituency and ward representatives to the membership of the Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee
- Publicize and raise awareness on the Fund.

#### **4.1.2 The Funds Administrator**

The accounting officer of the state Department of Gender Affairs is designated as the administrator of the Fund.

The administrator of the Fund has the following roles: -

- Opening and operating a bank account at the Central Bank of Kenya or a bank to be approved by the National Treasury
- Supervise and control the administration of the Fund
- Consult with the Cabinet Secretary and the Board on matters relating to the administration of the Fund
- Cause to be kept proper books of accounts and other books and records in relation to the Fund, of all activities and undertakings financed from the Fund
- Prepare, sign and transmit to the Auditor-General, in respect of each financial year and within three months after the end thereof, a statement of accounts relating to the Fund and submit a copy to the National Treasury and the statements should be prepared in such a manner as the Public-Sector Accounting Standards Board shall prescribe
- Furnish additional information which is proper and sufficient for the purpose of examination and audit by the Auditor-General in accordance with the provisions of the Public Audit Act; and No.12 of 2003.
- Prepare a quarterly report on the receipts into and issues out of the Fund and submit it to the Cabinet Secretary for gazettelement by the 21st of every fourth month.

Every statement of account should include details of the balance between the assets and liabilities of the Fund and should indicate the financial status of the Fund as at the end of the financial year concerned.

#### **4.1.3 Nomination and Gazettement of Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees**

The process of nomination of the community representatives to the Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committees (CUFMCs) is initiated by the County and Constituency Patrons as outlined in the regulations. The nominated members are forwarded to the Board for onward gazettement by the Cabinet Secretary. The committee members are then gazetted in the Kenya Gazette. (The *Kenya Gazette* is an official publication of the Government of the Republic of Kenya. The Kenya Gazette publishes the following: -

- Notices of new legislation
- Notices required to be published by law or policy
- Announcements for general public information

Once the Committee Members are gazetted they become gazette officers. A gazetted officer's name, address and qualification is entered in a public register which is updated regularly by state agencies through the Kenya Gazette. The effect of being gazetted is that one remains a public officer irrespective of whether they draw a salary from the exchequer or not and all have equal rights and responsibilities in their respective vocation.

A public officer is guided by chapter six of constitution of Kenya 2010 which stipulates how the public/state officers' conduct the public affairs.

The Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides, under Chapter 6, for leadership and integrity of all public officers. The Chapter is predicated upon the assumption that State officers are the nerve Centre of the Republic and carry the highest level of responsibility in the management of State affairs and, therefore, their conduct should be beyond reproach. This means that under the Constitution Kenyans decreed that those whose conduct does not bring honor, public confidence and integrity have no place in the management of public affairs. This is to ensure that those entrusted with the management of public affairs and resources are persons of good character, probity and uprightness.

Chapter Six provides that power exercised by leaders is a public trust that is to be exercised to serve the people. In exercising this power, state officers are required to demonstrate respect for the people of Kenya, make decisions objectively and impartially, refuse to be influenced by favoritism or corruption, serve selflessly and be accountable for their actions. The requirement for integrity in Leadership is as a result of the realization by Kenyans that only those with unquestionable track records can be trusted to bring this country forward.

The Constitution further demands that State officers behave, whether in public and official life, in private life, or in association with other persons, in a manner that avoids any conflict between personal interests and public or official duties, compromising any

public or official interest in favor of a personal interest. Persons who breach this chapter six will be subject to disciplinary procedures and where they are dismissed from office, they are barred from holding state offices again.

#### **4.1.4 Membership of Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee**

The Committee consists of: -

- The Deputy County Commissioner or his/her representative;
- The sub-county development officer or his/her representative;
- A sub-county accountant responsible for national government operations within that constituency
- The sub-county representative of the national government Ministry responsible for youth and women affairs, who shall be an ex-officio member and the secretary to the Committee;
- A representative from each ward in the constituency nominated by the constituency member of Parliament;
- Two representatives from the constituency, one of whom shall be a male youth, nominated by the county women representative; and
- One person with disability per constituency appointed by the county women representative.
- The Constituency Development Fund Committee shall provide administrative support to the Committee in each constituency.

*NB: The total number of ward representatives shall have equal number of either gender with the women quota providing for at least one female youth.*

- The Cabinet Secretary gazettes the names of persons constituting the Committee
- On the first meeting of the Committee, they ward representatives will elect the chairperson.

The National Government Constituency Development Fund Manager, one officer from the Ministry and the sub-county development officers provides the necessary secretariat services to the Committee. The secretariat is primarily responsible for ensuring compliance of the set guidelines on managing the Fund, facilitate the disbursement of the funds and recovery of the same.

#### **4.1.5 Functions of Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee**

The Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee is charged with the implementation of the Fund at Constituency. The specific functions of the committee members are stipulate in the regulations as follows: -

- Identify the groups within the Constituency using guidelines provided by the Board
- Receive applications from the groups
- Evaluate applications based on the guidelines for evaluation of applications
- Receive project proposals from institutions and consider the same for funding
- Make a decision on the groups that will receive funds
- Recommend disbursement of funds to qualified groups and institutions
- Undertake monitoring of the activities including making official impromptu visits to the beneficiary groups and institutions

- Manage and oversee the implementation of the Fund at the constituency level
- Compile, update and forward progress reports to the Board on a quarterly basis;
- Provide oversight to the disbursements in their respective constituencies.

**In return, we expect the committee members to be guided by Public Ethics and Integrity Act and Chapter Six of Kenya Constitution of 2010**

**The Leadership and Integrity Act, No. 19 of 2012** The fulcrum of anti-corruption and public integrity reform is Chapter Six of the Constitution and the Leadership and Integrity Act. The law operationalizes Chapter Six of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity. The law is predicated upon the belief that State officers are the nerve centre of the Republic and carry the highest level of responsibility in the management of state affairs and, therefore, their conduct should be beyond reproach.

This Act of Parliament was meant to establish procedures and mechanisms for the effective administration of Chapter Six of the Constitution; to promote ethics, integrity and servant leadership among State officers; to provide for the extension of the application of certain provisions of chapter six of the Constitution and for connected purposes. The Act includes provisions on enforcing Chapter Six as well as prescribing penalties for violators. The Act also provides a general Leadership and Integrity Code for State officers, which covers such issues as citizenship, public trust, and financial integrity.

#### **4.1.6 Committee meetings and Allowances**

The Committee meets not less than twice a month to deliberate on applications, plan for monitoring and follow up of the fund beneficiaries and they are paid an allowance of Two Thousand Shillings per sitting.

#### **4.1.7 Responsibilities of CUFMC members during vetting of applications**

##### **Chair**

- Reads all applications in detail
- Guides discussion and questioning
- Ensures clear outcomes from the meeting
- Ensures high-quality discussion and appropriate behaviour
- With the Committee Secretary, keeps the meeting to time

##### **Committee Secretary (Sub County Youth Development Officer)**

- Liaises with Chair and members;
- provides papers and communicates dates;
- Is point of contact for queries and problems
- Briefs new members on expectations, roles and responsibilities
- Manages conflicts of interest and associated restrictions
- Reviews applications and briefs Chair about important issues

- Manages the agenda and, with the Chair, keeps the meeting to time Records and disseminates decisions
- Does not contribute to scoring/rating of the groups
- Compiles and sends the Proposal to the Board
- Contact person to the Board

#### **Committee Member**

- Participates in discussion and interviews for all applications (unless conflict of interest)
- Rates all applications (unless conflict of interest)

#### **4.2.0 FORMATION OF CONSTITUENCY SUB COMMITTEES**

In addition to the constituency Secretariat the Constituency Uwezo Fund Management Committee shall form two Sub Committees to assist in operations of the Fund. The committees are: -

- Sub Vetting Committee and
- Sub Monitoring Committee

##### **4.2.1 Sub Vetting Committee**

The Sub Vetting Committee consists of Six (6) members including the CUFMC secretariat, Chairperson and two other members nominated by the CUFMC. The Sub Vetting Committee shall undertake the following roles: -

- Maintain a register of application forms
- Develop vetting criteria in line with the provisions of the Public Finance Management (Uwezo Fund) Regulations, 2014
- Ensure unqualified groups meet the required criteria for subsequent funding
- Ensure safe custody of vetted documents
- Ensure that the vetted groups are not repeated for subsequent funding unless they have repaid the outstanding loans
- Maintain a schedule of vetted groups
- Recommend to the CUFMC the successful groups for funding

##### **4.2.2 Monitoring and Evaluation Committee**

The Sub Monitoring Committee consists of Five (5) members including the CUFMC secretariat, Chairperson and One other member nominated by the CUFMC. The Sub Monitoring Committee shall undertake the following roles: -

- Undertaking monitoring of the activities including making official impromptu visits to the beneficiary groups and Institutions
- Ensure the data collection and reporting to the CUFMC
- Handling of Complaints at the Constituency level

### 4.3.0 STAKEHOLDERS ANALYSIS

The Fund has two stakeholder's namely Internal stakeholders and external stakeholders.

Internal stakeholders are those who are directly involved in running the affairs of the Fund while external stakeholders are those institutions that indirectly relate with Fund, affect and are likely to be affected by the operations of Fund. ## 5.1L ESSONS LEARNT IN PHASE ONE OF THE CONSTITUENCY UWEZO FUND MANAGEMENT COMMITTEES

In the process of implementing the Fund in the last four years since inception has resulted in various lessons learnt as pointed out below;

- a) The Fund at the constituency is better managed by a committee that meets a basic level of education. This lesson was factored in the new committees constituted in the FY 2017/18 to run for the next three (3) years.
- b) The smooth implementation of the fund requires committee members to be inducted and their roles explicitly highlighted.
