**Mr. Speaker,**

The Parliamentary Service Commission is established under Article 127 of the Constitution and is responsible for, among other functions, providing services and facilities to ensure the efficient and effective functioning of Parliament. Article 127(2) of the Constitution provides that the Commission shall consist of, among others, one man and one woman appointed by Parliament from among persons who are experienced in public affairs, but are not members of Parliament.

At the sitting of the Senate held on Tuesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2020 at 2:30 pm, the Senate Majority Leader tabled the report of the Parliamentary Service Commission on the nomination of Hon. Rachel Ameso Amollo for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

Thereafter, the Honourable Speaker of the Senate committed the matter to the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights to vet and consider the suitability of the nominee for appointment, and to submit its report to the Senate within fourteen days.

**Mr. Speaker,**

The Committee has undertaken the vetting process pursuant to provisions of the Constitution of Kenya (2010), the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019), and standing order 71 of the Senate Standing Orders.

This included notifying the public of the nomination of Hon. Rachel Ameso Amollo for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, and inviting the public to submit written memoranda on the nominee's suitability for appointment to the position. The Committee thereafter held the approval hearing, in public, on Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2020.

In conducting this exercise, the Committee considered, among others: -

- a) the nominee's academic credentials, professional training and experience;
- b) the nominee's personal integrity, tax compliance, and potential conflicts of interest;
- c) the procedure used by the Parliamentary Service Commission to arrive at the nominee;
- d) the constitutional and statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- e) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed, having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of Commission.



Having considered these requirements, the Committee found the nominee not suitable for appointment to the position, and therefore **recommends** that this House **does not approve** the appointment of Hon. Rachel Ameso Amollo to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

The Committee has further made findings and observations on the nomination process for appointment of non-MP members to the Parliamentary Service Commission, and these are contained at Chapter Four of the Report.

### ESTABLISHMENT AND MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

## CHAPTER TWO

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

#### 2.1 Notification of Nomination

In accordance with the provisions of section 9 of the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019) and section 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Secretary to the Parliamentary Service Commission forwarded to the Senate, vide a letter Ref. No. PSC/SEC/CORR/GEN/VOL.VI(1232) dated 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2020: -

- a) the notification of nomination, by the Parliamentary Service Commission (PSC), of Hon. Rachel Ameso Amollo for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution; and
- b) the Report of the Parliamentary Service Commission (PSC) on the recruitment of the PSC Commissioner who is not a Member of Parliament, containing the curriculum vitae and testimonials of the nominee (*Annex 1*).

#### 2.2 Committal to the Committee

At the sitting of the Senate held on Tuesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2020 at 2:30 pm, the Senate Majority Leader tabled the report of the Parliamentary Service Commission on the nomination of Hon. Rachel Ameso Amollo for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

The Honourable Speaker of the Senate conveyed to the Senate the notification from the Parliamentary Service Commission and, pursuant to standing order 71(1) of the Senate Standing Orders, committed the matter to the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights to vet and consider the suitability of the nominee for appointment, and to submit its report to the Senate within fourteen days (*Annex 2*).

#### 2.3 Notification to the Nominee

The Clerk of the Senate, through a letter Ref. No. SEN./12/4/JLAHRC/2020(45) dated 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 invited the nominee for the approval hearing (*Annex 3*). This was done in compliance with the requirement of section 6(3) of the Public

Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), and standing order 71(2) of the Senate Standing Orders.

#### **2.4 Clearance Requirements**

On 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2020, the Clerk of the Senate wrote to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Director of Public Prosecutions requesting for reports with respect to the suitability of the nominee for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission (*Annex 4 a - e*).

Responding to the request: -

- a) The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), vide a letter Ref No. EACC.7/10/5 VOL.XIV (81) dated 10<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 confirmed that the Commission had not undertaken any investigations where the nominee was found culpable (*Annex 5*).
- b) The Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), vide a letter Ref. No. KRA/5/1002/5(3064) dated 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 confirmed that the nominee, PIN No. A001663893H was tax compliant and up to date with filing returns and making payments (*Annex 6*).
- c) The Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), vide a letter Ref. No. HELB/RR/112009/V/42 dated 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 confirmed that the nominee was not a beneficiary of the HELB Loans Scheme (*Annex 7*).

By the time of conducting the approval hearing, the Committee had not received responses from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations and the Director of Public Prosecutions.

#### **2.5 Notification to the Public**

In compliance with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Clerk of the Senate placed an advertisement in the print media on Sunday, 7<sup>th</sup> June, 2020, inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or

otherwise of the nominee. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 at 9.00 am (*Annex 8*).

The Clerk of the Senate further notified the public of the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights intention to conduct the approval hearing of the nominee on Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 at 10.00, in the Mini Chamber, First Floor, County Hall, Parliament Buildings (*Annex 9*). This was done in accordance with the provisions of Article 118 of the Constitution, section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), and standing order 71(2) of the Senate Standing Orders.

By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any submission against the nomination and approval for appointment of the nominee to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission.

## **2.6 Issues for Consideration during the Approval Hearing**

In determining the suitability of the nominee for appointment, the Committee was guided by section 6 (7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), which places focus on a nominee's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.

In addition, the Committee is required to take into consideration the following issues in accordance with section 7 of the Act: -

- (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
- (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- (c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

### **(a) Procedure for Nomination**

The position of the non-MP member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) became vacant following the expiry of the term of the immediate former holder of the position, Dr. Lonah Mumelo, whose term expired on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2020.

The procedure for appointment of a member to the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution is provided for under section 9 of the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019). The First Schedule to the Act requires the Parliamentary Service Commission to advertise the vacancy calling for applications for the position, shortlist and interview the applicants. The Commission is thereafter required to recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate for appointment one candidate qualified for the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission.

In this case, the vacancy in the Commission being that of a female, non-MP member of the Commission, the PSC was required to recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate a female candidate for approval for appointment.

The Senate Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights considered the procedure followed by the Parliamentary Service Commission in nominating Hon. Rachel Ameso Amolo for appointment to the position of member of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) and noted as follows: -

- i) on Tuesday, 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2020, the Parliamentary Service Commission declared a vacancy in the position of a female Non-Member Commissioner, by placing a notice in the Kenya Gazette, an advertisement in two daily newspapers of national circulation, and on the Parliament website inviting interested qualified persons to apply for appointment as member of the Commission under Art. 127(2)(d) of the Constitution;
- ii) the Commission received a total of seventy (70) applications, out of which eight (8) qualified applicants were short-listed as meeting the requirements set out in the Constitution and the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019);
- iii) the Commission published the list of shortlisted applicants on 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 in two daily newspapers and invited the shortlisted applicants for oral interviews, which were held on 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2020;
- iv) the Commission thereupon resolved to forward to the National Assembly and the Senate the name of Hon. Rachel Ameso Amolo, as the candidate who ranked highest in the oral interviews for the position of member of the

Parliamentary Service Commission under Art. 127 (2)(d) of the Constitution.

***(b) Constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question***

A person is qualified to be appointed a member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Art. 127(2)(d) of the Constitution, and sections 8 and 9 of the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019) if: -

- i) the person is not a Member of Parliament;
- ii) holds a degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
- iii) has at least ten years' experience in public affairs;
- iv) meets the requirements of leadership and integrity set out in chapter 6 of the Constitution;
- v) the person has experience or interest in consolidating and advancing the ideals and objectives of Parliamentary democracy;
- vi) their appointment reflects the national values and principles set out in Article 10 of the Constitution; and
- vii) their appointment represents the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.

***(c) Suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed***

The Committee was required to assess the suitability of the nominee for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

## CHAPTER THREE

### APPROVAL HEARING OF THE NOMINEE

#### 3.1 Preparatory Meeting

The Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights held a sitting on Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 at 9.30 a.m. to deliberate on the approval hearing and noted the following –

- i) That, at as at the time of that meeting, the Clerk of the Senate had not received any memoranda from the public contesting suitability of the nominee for appointment;
- ii) That, the nominee had also not notified the Clerk of the Senate of her intention to withdraw from the approval process as outlined under section 6(10) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approvals) Act (No. 33 of 2011);
- iii) That, the clearance certificates had been received, in respect of the nominee, from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, the Kenya Revenue Authority and the Higher Education Loans Board. Further, that no adverse reports on the nominee had been received from the Director of Public Prosecutions and the Director of Criminal Investigations; and
- iv) That, the nominee had submitted the duly filled Questionnaire in compliance with section 6 (8) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) for consideration by the Committee (*Annex 10*).

The Committee therefore resolved to undertake the approval hearing on Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 at 10.00 a.m. as advertised by the Clerk of the Senate and communicated to the members of the public and the nominee.

In conducting the approval hearing, the nominee would be examined against the criteria and requirements set out at sections 8 and 9 of the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019) and section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).

### **3.2 The Approval Hearing**

The nominee, Hon. Rachel Ameso Amolo, appeared before the Committee on Monday, 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 at 10.00 a.m. and was interviewed pursuant to provisions of the Constitution, Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the Standing Orders of the Senate.

#### *Citizenship Status*

The nominee is a Kenyan citizen and holds Identity Card Number 7868363.

#### *Academic and Professional Qualifications*

The nominee holds a Masters in Business Administration degree from Daystar University, a Bachelor of Business Administration Degree from Kenya Methodist University, and a Higher Diploma in Business Administration from the Kenya Institute of Management.

#### *Work and Professional Experience*

She has worked as a human resource practitioner (1985 – 2002), as Managing Director at Fast-Track Management Consultants Limited (2002 – 2013), as Member of Parliament for Kakamega County (2013 – 2017), and as a human resource and strategic planning consultant (2018 – 2020).

#### *Public Office, Political Activities and Affiliations*

The nominee has held office as County Member of Parliament (Woman Representative) for Kakamega County, during the 11<sup>th</sup> Parliament (2013 – 2017). She served as member of the Committee on Delegated Legislation; Committee on Energy, Information and Communications; and as member of the Kenya Parliamentary Human Rights Association, and the Kenya Women Parliamentary Association (KEWOPA). The nominee is a member of the Orange Democratic Movement (ODM) party.

She is also a member of the Institute of Human Resource Management (IHRM) and the Kenya Institute of Management (KIM).

### *Potential Conflict of Interest*

The nominee has no immediate associations that are likely to present potential conflict of interest when she assumes the position.

### *Sources of Income and Net-worth*

The nominee's sources of income include professional consultancy work in human resource management; event management and planning; real estate; farming; and dividends from SACCOs. She estimated her financial net worth at Kenya shillings one hundred and twenty million (Kshs.120 million).

### *Integrity*

The nominee has not been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravening the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution. She has also not been adversely associated with practices that depict bias, favoritism, or nepotism in the discharge of public duties. She has fully complied with the tax obligations to the State for the financial year immediately preceding her nomination for the appointment. She has not been charged in a court of law in the past three years or been adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry in the last three years.

While the Committee had not received a response from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations and the Director of Public Prosecutions by the date of undertaking the approval hearing, the nominee submitted to the Committee a copy of Police Clearance Certificate Ref. No. PCC-AAOJZ6 dated 25<sup>th</sup> February, 2020 (**Annex 11**).

The nominee further submitted a Credit Reference Bureau Certificate CRN. No. 1112437 dated 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2020 and issued by TransUnion CRB, confirming that the nominee had no adverse listing (**Annex 12**). The Committee noted that TransUnion CRB is one of the credit reference bureaus licensed by the Central Bank of Kenya to provide credit reference services.

*Suitability for the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission*

On her suitability for appointment to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, the nominee affirmed that she has the necessary qualifications, experience, and skills to discharge the mandate of the office.

Further, that having served as a Member of Parliament during the 11<sup>th</sup> Parliament, and as a human resource and management practitioner for over 20 years, she understood the needs of the Commission as well as the institution of Parliament, and would work with other members of the Commission to ensure that services and facilities were provided to Members and staff of Parliament.

She further undertook to pursue strategic relationship building with other entities involved in determination or provision of facilities to Parliament, including the Salaries and Remuneration Commission. In particular, the nominee stated that she would, with other members of the Commission, seek to address the issue of job evaluation and ranking for Members of Parliament vis-à-vis the other two arms of government, to ensure that Members were accorded the services, facilities and welfare due to their offices.

Additionally, the nominee stated that having interacted with staff during her term as a Member of Parliament, and with her experience in human resource management, she would work to enhance provision of relevant training for officers serving in Parliament, to match the needs of Members, and ensure the efficient discharge of services.

In concluding, the nominee stated that during her term as a Member of Parliament she worked to ensure that County Members of Parliament were facilitated in discharging their mandate and, if appointed to the position of member of the Commission, that she would work to ensure that Senators were also facilitated to effectively discharge their oversight mandate over county governments.

*Other matters*

In response to the question whether she met the requirement of having at least ten years' experience in public affairs, the nominee stated that in addition to

having served as a Member of Parliament for five years, she had over 20 years' experience in human resource and strategic planning for organizations, which entailed interaction with diverse sections of the public. She had also been involved in charitable work in Kakamega county.

In response to a question on whether her nomination was influenced by her having come from the same region as the immediate former female non-MP member of the Commission, the nominee stated that she was applied for the position like other candidates and was competitively selected on merit.

In response to the question whether her having served as a former Member of Parliament meant that she was favoured over other applicants, the nominee stated that this was not the case, and that having so served gave her the benefit of bringing to the Commission both the perspective of an outsider, while understanding the needs of Members and staff of Parliament.

## CHAPTER FOUR

### COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND OBSERVATIONS

Having considered the nominee's curriculum vitae, filled questionnaire pursuant to the Schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), and the oral submissions during the approval hearing, the Committee made the following **findings**:

- a) That, in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship.
- b) That, she is a human resource and strategic planning consultant with more than twenty-five (25) years' experience in the private sector and has also served as a Member of Parliament for five (5) years.
- c) That, her academic credentials, professional training, and experience comply with section 6 (7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).
- d) That, she demonstrated knowledge on the mandate and working of the Parliamentary Service Commission and the institution of Parliament.
- e) That, she meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity, having been issued with clearance certificates by various government agencies such as EACC, KRA, DCI and HELB.
- f) That, as stipulated in Article 75(1) of the Constitution, she has no potential conflict of interest.
- g) That, she has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), Article 76 (financial probity), Article 77 (restriction on activities of State Officers) and Article 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution.
- h) That, no memoranda were presented to the Committee contesting the suitability or otherwise of the nominee for appointment as a member of the Parliamentary Service Commission.

The Committee further made the following **observations** regarding the appointment of Non-MP members of the Parliamentary Service Commission:-

- a) That, in the considered view of the Committee, the two positions reserved under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution for non-sitting Members of Parliament to serve in the Parliamentary Service Commission, were intended to bring to the Commission an outsider view, not clouded or influenced by having served as a Member of Parliament. The Committee views the emerging practice of appointing immediate former Members of Parliament to the Commission, under Article 127(2)(d), as running counter to what the Constitution intended.
- b) The Committee noted that, in the present case, the nominee by the Parliamentary Service Commission comes from the same region as the outgoing Commissioner, and from a County neighbouring the county of a serving Commissioner. This, in the view of the Committee, runs counter to Article 250(4) of the Constitution, which requires that *'appointments to commissions and independent offices shall take into account the national values referred to in Article 10, and the principle that the composition of the commissions and offices, taken as a whole, shall reflect the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.'*
- c) The Committee observed that, while the nominee has served as a Member of Parliament for a single term of five (5) years, and has experience of over twenty-five (25) years in the private sector, the nominee failed to satisfy the Committee that she met the requirements of section 9(1)(c), which requires that, for one to be qualified for appointment as a member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, one must possess *'at least ten years' experience in public affairs.'*

## CHAPTER FIVE

### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Having conducted the approval hearing for the nominee, pursuant to provisions of the Constitution of Kenya (2010), the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Parliamentary Service Act (No. 22 of 2019), and standing order 71 of the Senate Standing Orders, the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights **recommends** that the Senate **does not approve** the appointment of Hon. Rachel Ameso Amolo to the position of member of the Parliamentary Service Commission, under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.

The First Schedule to the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 requires the Parliamentary Service Commission to advertise the vacancy calling for applications for the position, shortlist and interview the applicants. The Commission is thereafter required to recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate for appointment one female applicant qualified for the position of Commissioner in the Parliamentary Service Commission.

The Parliamentary Service Commission has now undertaken the processes of advertisement, shortlisting and interview as required by law. The name of the person recommended for appointment is hereby submitted to the National Assembly and the



## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Article 127 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 establishes the Parliamentary Service Commission with functions and responsibilities as are set out in Article 127(6)(a) to (e) and the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019. These include the following-

- (a) providing services and facilities to ensure the efficient and effective functioning of Parliament;
- (b) constituting offices in the parliamentary service and appointing and supervising office holders;
- (c) preparing annual estimates of expenditure of the parliamentary service and submitting them to the National Assembly for approval and basically exercising budgetary control over the service;
- (d) undertaking programmes to promote the ideals of parliamentary democracy;
- (e) performing other functions –
  - (i) necessary for the wellbeing of the members and staff of Parliament; or
  - (ii) prescribed by national legislation.

1.2 Article 127(2) & (3) of the Constitution provides that the Parliamentary Service Commission shall consist of the following Members -

- (2) (a) the Speaker of the National Assembly, as chairperson;
  - (b) a vice-chairperson elected by the commission from among its members
- 
- (c) seven members appointed by Parliament from among its members as follows -

(i) four shall be nominated equally from both Houses by the party or coalition of parties forming the national government, of who at least two shall be women; and

(ii) three shall be nominated by the Parties not forming the national government, at least one of whom shall be nominated from each House and at least one shall be a woman; and

*(d) one man and one woman appointed by Parliament from among persons who are experienced in public affairs but are not members of Parliament.*

(3) The Clerk of the Senate shall be the Secretary of the Commission.

## 2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 The position of the female non-MP member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) became vacant following the expiry of the term of the immediate former holder of the position, Dr. Lonah Mumelo, whose term expired on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2020 and who was not eligible for reappointment to the Commission in line with Article 250(6)(a) of the Constitution. The position therefore fell vacant on the 18<sup>th</sup> March 2020.

2.2 The expiry of the term of Dr. Lonah Mumelo coincided with the declaration of the Corona disease as a global pandemic. The Government of Kenya subsequently declared a number of social distancing measures which included requirements for all but essential personnel to work from home. It was therefore not appropriate to immediately declare the vacancy for the position of Commissioner and call for applications at this particular point in time.

2.3 At its meeting held on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2020, the Parliamentary Service Commission considered the retirement of Dr. Lonah Mumelo as a non-member Commissioner (a Commissioner appointed under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution) and the vacancy arising following her retirement and resolved that the vacancy be advertised on Tuesday, 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 in accordance with the Constitution and the provisions of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019.

**3.0 APPLICABLE PROCEDURE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY SERVICE COMMISSIONER WHO IS NOT A MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT**

3.1 The applicable procedure for the appointment of a Member of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution is provided for in the First Schedule to the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 as follows -

*"1. Upon the convening of the first sitting of Parliament pursuant to Article 126(2) of the Constitution, or whenever a vacancy arises in the membership of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution, the Secretary of the Commission shall, within fourteen days of that first sitting or the occurrence of the vacancy or within such time as would be reasonable, by notice in the Gazette and in at least two daily newspapers of national circulation, declare a vacancy and invite interested qualified persons to apply for appointment as members of the Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution.*

*2. Any person qualified in accordance with the Constitution may make an application to the Secretary within fourteen days of the publication of the notice.*

*3. The Parliamentary Service Commission shall, within fourteen days after the last date of submission of applications under paragraph 2, consider the applications, shortlist, conduct interviews and recommend — (a) in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a woman, one female applicant qualified*

for the position; and (b) in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a man, one male applicant qualified for the position.

4. The name of a person recommended under paragraph 3 shall be submitted to the National Assembly and the Senate for approval and appointment in accordance with the Standing Orders of the respective Houses.

5. If both Houses of Parliament approve a person recommended under paragraph 3, the Secretary shall, within seven days after the approval, publish the name of the person in the Gazette.

6. Where one or both Houses of Parliament reject the persons recommended under paragraph 3, the Speaker of the relevant House shall communicate the decision of that House to the other House and shall request for a fresh nomination by the Commission.

7. On receipt of a request by a House under paragraph 6, the Commission shall, within seven days, submit to the National Assembly and the Senate a fresh nomination from amongst the persons shortlisted by the Commission under paragraph 3.

8. If either or both of the Houses of Parliament reject any or all of the subsequent nominees submitted by the Commission for approval under paragraph 7, the provisions of paragraphs 1 to 6 shall apply.”

#### 4.0 RECRUITMENT PROCESS WITH RESPECT TO THE PARLIAMENTARY SERVICE COMMISSIONER WHO IS NOT A MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT

4.1 On Tuesday, 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2020, the Parliamentary Service Commission declared a vacancy in the position of a female Non-Member Commissioner by placing a notice in the Kenya Gazette, an advertisement in the two daily newspapers of national circulation and on the Parliament Website inviting interested qualified persons to apply for appointment as members of the Commission under Article 127(2) (d) of the Constitution. Copies of the

*Gazette Notice and the Advertisement are attached as Annex I and Annex II respectively.*

4.2 Considering the COVID-19 situation and the attendant safety protocols, interested applicants were required to email their applications to the email address provided in the advertisement within fourteen days from the date of the advertisement with Tuesday, 19<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 as the closing day for receiving applications.

4.3 At the close of the receiving applications on Tuesday, 19<sup>th</sup> May, 2020, seventy (70) applications were received and long-listed as set out in *Annex III*.

4.4 A person is qualified to be appointed a member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya and sections 8 and 9 of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 if -

- (i) the person is not a Member of Parliament;
  - (ii) holds a degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
  - (iii) has at least ten years' experience in public affairs;
  - (iv) meets the requirements of leadership and integrity set out in chapter 6 of the Constitution;
  - (v) the person has experience or interest in consolidating and advancing the ideals and objectives of Parliamentary democracy;
  - (vi) their appointment reflects the national values and principles set out in Article 10 of the Constitution; and
- 
- (vii) their appointment represents the regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.

4.5 Out of the seventy (70) applications long-listed, eight (8) qualified applicants were short-listed as meeting the requirements set out in the Constitution and the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019. The following are the eight (8) applicants shortlisted for interview:

1. Rachel Ameso Amolo (Hon.)
2. Lilian Bokeeye Mahiri- Zaja
3. Regina Changorok Cherop (Hon.)
4. Catherine Muyeka Mumma
5. Mwanamaka Amani Mabruki, CBS
6. Lucia Muindi Ngumbau Mulwa
7. Susan Waiyego Mwangi-Owino (Dr.)
8. Daisy Kanainza Nyongesa (Hon.)

*A detailed Short-Listing Report is hereby annexed as Annex IV.*

4.6 The Parliamentary Service Commission published a list of the short-listed applicants on 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 in two local daily newspapers and invited the short-listed applicants for oral interviews that were set for 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2020.

*A copy of the advertisement inviting short-listed applicants for interview is attached as Annex V.*

4.7 It was noted that by a Notice published by the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) on 9<sup>th</sup> April, 2020, the EACC suspended the submission of hard copy Self-Declaration Forms due to safety protocols observed during the Covid-19 pandemic and further advised the public that candidates required to have Self-Declaration Forms should not be prejudiced by omitting to produce the said forms. *A copy of this Public Notice is attached as Annex VI.*

- 4.8 Accordingly, vide a letter dated 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2020, the Parliamentary Service Commission requested for an advisory from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission as to the short-listed applicants' suitability with regards to the requirements of leadership and integrity as set out under Chapter Six (6) of the Constitution. *A copy of the letter to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission dated 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 is attached as Annex VII.*
- 4.9 Through a letter dated 28<sup>th</sup> May, 2020, the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission advised the Parliamentary Service Commission that they had not undertaken any investigations where the short-listed candidates had been found culpable. *A copy of the letter from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission dated 28<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 is attached as Annex VIII.*
- 4.10 The oral interviews for the short-listed candidates were conducted on 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2020.
- 4.11 The Commission considered the curriculum vitae of each applicant and further scrutinized their original academic certificates and testimonials. The Commission then carried out interviews on the basis of the following areas:
- (i) academic qualifications;
  - (ii) experience and interest in consolidating and advancing the ideals and objectives of a parliamentary democracy;
  - (iii) ten years' experience in public affairs;
  - (iv) relevant work experience in either Finance and Administration, Public Administration, Human Resource Management or Labour laws;
  - (v) understanding of the Constitution and powers and functions of Parliament and the Parliamentary Service Commission;

- (vi) understanding of the composition, functions and powers of Constitutional Commissions;
- (vii) ability to identify both state and non-state key stakeholders for structural engagements with the Commission;
- (viii) leadership and management skills;
- (ix) the extent to which the candidates meet the requirements of Chapter six of the Constitution on values, leadership and integrity; and
- (x) presentation skills.

Following the interviews, the candidates scored as follows -



**5.0 RECOMMENDATION OF THE SUCCESSFUL APPLICANT TO THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY AND THE SENATE**

- 5.1 Paragraph 3 of the First Schedule of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 requires the Parliamentary Service Commission to, within fourteen days after the last date of submission of applications, consider the applications, shortlist the applications, conduct interviews and recommend to the National Assembly and the Senate, in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a woman, one female applicant qualified for the position and in respect of a vacancy of a member who is a man, one male applicant qualified for the position for their consideration and approval.
- 5.2 At its Special Meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2020, the Parliamentary Service Commission resolved to recommend the candidate who ranked highest in the oral interviews to the National Assembly and the Senate for their consideration and approval.
- 5.3 Accordingly, the Parliamentary Service Commission resolved to forward to the National Assembly and the Senate the name of **Ms. Rachel Ameso Amolo (Hon.)** as the candidate who ranked highest in the oral interviews for the position of the member of the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya for their consideration and appointment as a Commissioner in the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010. Her *curriculum vitae and testimonials are attached hereto as Annex IX.*

## 7.0 RESOLUTION SOUGHT

The National Assembly and the Senate of the Republic of Kenya are requested to consider the contents of this report and resolve to appoint Ms. Rachel Ameso Amolo (Hon.) as a Commissioner in the Parliamentary Service Commission under Article 127(2)(d) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 for a term of six (6) years from the date of her swearing in.
