## THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT ACT

(Cap. 376)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 116 (2) (b) of the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act, the Cabinet Secretary for Tourism and Wildlife on the recommendation of the Kenya Wildlife Service, makes the following Regulations —

THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT  
(ACCESS, ENTRY AND CONSERVATION) (FEES)  
REGULATIONS, 2025

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation and Management (Access, Entry and Conservation) (Fees) Regulations 2025. Citation.
2. These Regulations shall apply to conservation of national parks, national reserves and sanctuaries. Application.
3. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.
  - “Act” means the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act; Cap. 376.
  - “African citizen” means a national of other African Countries other than East Africa;
  - “child” has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Children Act; Cap. 141.
  - “corporate pass” means access rights issued to eligible utility providers having installations within national parks, national reserves and sanctuaries;
  - “daily fee” means the fee payable for a single access to a national park, national reserve or sanctuary and which shall be valid for a period not exceeding twenty-four hours;
  - “disability” has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Persons with Disabilities Act, 2025; No. 4 of 2025.
  - “East African citizen” means a citizen of the Community established under the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community Act; Cap. 4C.
  - “excursion boat” means glass bottomed boats, dhows and catamarans with a carrying capacity of a maximum of two crew members and a maximum carrying capacity of forty passengers, that undertake various expedition activities within the Marine Protected Areas including snorkeling, diving, bird watching, sunset cruises and mangrove visits;
  - “licence” means a licence issued under section 98 of the Tourism Act; Cap. 381
  - “non-excursion boats” means commercial and sport fishing boats;
  - “non-resident” means a national of any country other than an East African citizen or African citizen;
  - “resident” means a person, other than a Kenyan citizen or an East African citizen, residing in Kenya with valid resident permit;

“student” means an individual of not older than twenty-three years from a recognized secondary school, college or university who is visiting a national park, national reserve, marine park, marine reserve or sanctuary for educational purposes under a documented and organized arrangement with that educational institution;

“water sport” means jet skiing, windsurfing, wakeboarding, sailing, canoeing or kayaking, paddle boarding, water skiing, parasailing, banana boat rides, powerboating and jet boat rides;

4. (1) A person who wishes to enter, access or undertake an activity in a national park, national reserve or sanctuary shall provide the relevant identification documents as specified under these Regulations.

Identification of users.

(2) Identification documents under sub-regulation (1) include—

- (a) a national identity card for a Kenyan citizen;
- (b) a valid passport for an East African citizen;
- (c) a valid passport for an African citizen;
- (d) a valid residence permit for a resident;
- (e) a valid passport for a non-resident;
- (f) a valid disability identification card for a person with disability; or
- (g) a valid student identification card for a student, where applicable.

5. (1) The Service shall charge an access, entry or conservation fee in the Schedule to a person who wishes to access a national parks, national reserves, sanctuaries.

Access, Entry or Conservation fees.

6. (1) The following persons shall be exempt from paying conservation fees specified in regulation 5—

Exemptions.

- (a) a Kenyan citizen aged seventy years and older;
- (b) a person with disability;
- (c) a child aged five years and younger; and
- (d) a tour driver, a guide, boat crew and a porter who is registered by the Tourism Regulatory Authority and is a member of a registered Association.

(2) Beach Management Units fishing boats shall be exempt from paying boat anchoring fees.
