1. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

KBC is the public media organization in Kenya. It broadcasts in both English and Swahili, as well as in most local languages of Kenya. The corporation started in 1928 when Kenya was a British colony. In 1964, when Kenya became an independent country, the corporation's name was changed to Voice of Kenya (VOK). In 1989, it reverted to Kenya Broadcasting Corporation (KBC). The same year KBC signed a contract with Japan Telecommunication Engineering Consultancy Service (JTEC) for improvement and expansion of the national medium wave frequency radio broadcasting network. In 1991, another contract was signed between KBC and Marubeni Corporation of Tokyo Japan for upgrading of medium wave transmitting stations and construction of new ones. In 1993, KBC embarked on a major modernization project to upgrade its transmitting stations, construct new ones and improve on switching and routing network. In 1996, Metro FM was commissioned as a 90% 24 hours entertainment radio channel. However in 2006 it was transformed to a full time reggae channel. In September 2000, KBC commissioned Metro Television as a sports and entertainment channel. December same year Coro FM was launched to transmit in Kikuyu language to Nairobi and Mount Kenya Region. In 2001, Pwani FM was started to cater for the coast region. In 2009 the government licensed KBC to spearhead the migration from analogue to digital. Later same year, President Mwai Kibaki opened the DVB-T centre at Broadcasting House.

The corporation has helped to mould most of Kenya's notable journalists especially before the liberalization of the airwaves in Kenya. Some of the forefront pioneer broadcasters on KBC radio's *Idhaa ya Kiswahili* (Swahili Service) are Leonard Mambo Mbotela, Amina Fakhii and Khadija Ali. In the English service prominent broadcasters who pioneered the service were Hassan Mazoa, Sammy Lui, Peter Njoroge, Abdulhaq and Elizabeth Omolo among others.

All through KBC had laid down procedure of recruiting staff, this procedure is no longer followed. When Engineer Philip Okundi was appointed the managing director of KBC in the early 1990s, he improved the salaries of the staff. However, his successors have done very little to address staff welfare. They instead conspired with the Board of directors to increase the gap between the lowly paid and the highly paid officers in the corporation. The situation is worse now whereby; new managers are recruited contrary to the laid down procedures and many of them are without relevant academic certificates and yet are paid handsomely at the expense of the staff. The board of directors is heavily compromised because of their personal interests with some in direct conflict of interest to the extent of doing business with the corporation. Negative ethnicity and nepotism are majorly at play.

3. MALPRACTICES IN HUMAN RESOURCES CAPACITY CREATION

- 3.1. Lack of Scheme of service leading to stagnation in same job group for years and skewed recruitment exercises
- 3.2. Nepotism in recruitments and promotions

3.2.1. Company Secretary Recruitment

The KBC company secretary Paul Jilani was reportedly retrenched from the Telkom Kenya for non performance and other ills. He was hired by KBC in November 2010 through the alleged assistance of the board chairman Muoki after searching for a job for several years. The board initially declined confirming his appointment in the August 2011 sitting for alleged incompetence. However, Jilani was confirmed in employment last December. We invite the committee to interrogate his suitability because we believe his underperformance has caused the corporation to lose huge sums of money through poorly drawn contracts and court cases against KBC.

Board meetings

It is our submission that the board of directors' calendar has been amended to increase the frequency of its meetings. Sometimes the board holds two meetings in a day and the members who attend the morning session sit in the afternoon session too. Each sitting should have seven members. Each member is paid 22,000 shillings per sitting which translates to 44,000 shillings per head on the days they have two sessions. In addition they are paid 2,000 shillings each as lunch allowance yet they are bought food. The office of the company secretary can furnish your committee with the board calendar, attendance register and payment vouchers.

Court cases –

The case of Elyna Wanyika Sifuna - She was cleared by the court of allegations of sending abusive text messages to former CEO David Waweru and the current CEO Charles Waitheka Waihenya. However, the corporation refused to lift her suspension. She moved to the industrial court and was awarded damages apart from issuing orders to reinstate her. Interestingly, the company secretary belatedly filed an appeal against the ruling. The corporation enlisted the services of Kinyua Muriithi and company advocates. Ms. Sifuna has sued Waihenya in his personal capacity for defamation, but KBC is paying for the legal fee to Kinyua Muriithi. The company secretary's office and that of finance can furnish you with the details.

2. STAFF WELFARE DESCRIPANCIES

SUBMISSIONS

- 2.1. **Skewed and indiscriminate implementation of the Corporation's Code of Regulations with regards to salaries and allowances.**
- 2.2. **Staff employed as casuals for much longer than the stipulated labour laws requirement period of three months. Annex - A**
- 2.3. **Staff pension amounting to KES 700,000,000.00 missing!**
- 2.4. **Managers awarded themselves commuter allowance long before the same was spread to the entire workforce Annex - PB**
- 2.5. **Indiscriminate award of commissions to different cadre of staff involved in the same assignments; case in point - marketers and members of finance departments are awarded commissions for work collectively undertaken by KBC staff**
- 2.6. **Poor and substandard working tools and systems**
- 2.7. **Hazardous mosquito infected working areas especially for shifts on night duty**
- 2.8. **Poor and unhygienic toilet facilities**
- 2.9. **Plea**
 - 2.9.1. **Compel corporation via all line ministries to immediately pay workers the accrued arrears and bonuses as per the COR same as the senior managers who are currently enjoying the benefits of the revised salaries.**
 - 2.9.2. **Ensure the several years of service in KBC by casual workers don't go to waste!**

4. SKEWED PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES AND GRAND CORRUPTION

SUBMISSION

4.1. THERE IS GROSS IMPROPRIETY IN PROCUREMENT THAT URGENTLY DEMANDS A PROBE ON SUSPECT SUPPLIERS WITH SPECIAL FOCUS ON THE FOLLOWING COMPANIES ALLEGEDLY OWNED BY THE SAME PERSON:

- a. YORK INVESTMENTS LTD.
- b. GRAND PHOTOLAB E.A LTD.
- c. ROYAL BUSINESS TECHNOLOGIES
- d. LEON INSURANCE COMPANY.
- e. CENTRAL WORKS COMPANY

4.2. INVESTIGATE PROCUREMENT IRREGULARITIES LISTED BELOW INVOLVING THE OWNER OF THE ABOVE COMPANIES A MR. J.K.MWANGI

- 4.2.1. Tender for TV Virtual Set – Awarded to **Grand PHOTOLAB**-varied (through additional requirements) from Shs 16m to about Shs. 50m without competitive bidding. **Annex - C3**
- 4.2.2. Tender for FM Transmitters (Kuria, Webuye, Kisumu and Kisii) separated into Transmitters and Antennas-Awarded to **Grand PHOTOLAB** and **YORK Investments** for about Shs. 50m.
- 4.2.3. FM Transmitters for Vernacular stations (Luo, Luhya, Kisii, Kalenjin, etc.) awarded to the **same two firms** without competitive tendering. Additional procurement ongoing **Annex - C9**
- 4.2.4. Tender for Analogue TV Transmitters awarded to the **same firms** at a cost of about Shs. 100m **Annex - C4**
- 4.2.5. Tender for Digital TV Transmitters, awarded to **Central Works Company** (also associated to the same MD) at a cost of about Shs. 280m. A down payment of Shs. 88m was paid out during the strike.

4.3. It is important to note that evaluation for most of the above was done with the assistance of two University of Nairobi Lecturers, Prof M.K. Wamang'oli and Dr. Elijah Mwangi yet KBC has the capacity to carry out the evaluation. The teams were appointed directly and unprocedurally by the Procurement Manager. In view of the above, the Source of specifications and evaluation criteria are suspect.

- 3.2.2. **Marketing Manager appointed before expiry of contract** Annex = P2,P3
- 3.2.3. **TV Programmes Manager** Annex = A3
- 3.2.4. **Radio Programmes Manager**
(it is alleged that Mr. Mong'are the radio manager is a nephew to the permanent secretary Dr. Bitange Ndemo please investigate this allegation)
- 3.3. Unfair transfers and retirements that are not based on due process example
 - 3.3.1. **The sacking of senior sports editor Milton Nyakundi**
 - 3.3.2. **Agnes Njambi Migwi transferred arbitrarily** Annex = P5
 - 3.3.3. **Reginah Muriuki, and Philip Obare – Edged out of 11 to pave way for allocation of positions**
 - 3.3.4. **Tony Juma – Artiste unfairly sacked after a plane mishap in Eldoret**
 - 3.3.5. **Praxedes A. Otieno unfairly retired on citation of the 50 year rule**
 - 3.3.6. **Geoffrey Mwakio – Dismissed from service by human resource citing a criminal offence which the officer had however been acquitted of** Annex – P7a, P7b
 - 3.3.7. Unprocedural sacking of a long time serving contracted ICT officer Sylvester Legewa by refusal to sign his document which should have been used to pay him after working for a month. This officer was neither given a termination letter nor notice. In his last month, he worked for a month and when others were paid he was not paid.
 - 3.3.8. Refusal to fill the position of the assistant IT manager and that of the Systems administrator. The officer, who is currently officially left acting when the MICTTS is away, Hydah Muthuri, is 3 grades below the MICCTTs who should advertise for the filling of these positions. There was an attempt to sack this officer in October last year and the harassment charges are in the staff welfare committee discussions.
 - 3.3.9. Communication with the MICTTS and the supervision of ICT personnel is currently done through a proxy, Patrick Museme, who chairs meetings for the ICCTTs and it appears to be the only duty of this officer. Among the officers supervised by this officer are 3 of his senior.
 - 3.3.10. Refusal to give majority of ICT officers job descriptions which has left the officers vulnerable to harassment and malpractice in appraisal target setting where you find duplication of effort. Only selected individuals have been given job descriptions.
 - 3.3.11. **There are major anomalies in procurement of ICT equipment and services. Investigate and establish that such equipment and services have been indeed procedurally procured. IT services and Internet services files from the KBC secret registry could shed light on this.**

Electrical Ltd dated 5th March 2012 - (REF: KAEL/KBC/12/029) (when KBC members were on strike) should be probed.

KINDLY NOTE THAT THE COMPANY IS NOT PREQUALIFIED TO SUPPLY EQUIPMENT OR ANY MATERIAL TO THE KENYA BROADCASTING CORPORATION.

In view of the above,

- a. The conduct of the AMTS Mr. Tom Buluku should be investigated further. The scope of investigations should be expanded to include:
- b. The justification for his imprest and that of one Rigger (a Mr. Murage) on 24th and 25th November 2011 to install a Transmitter for the signal for the Somali Service at the Limuru Transmitter; the service is yet to go on air,
- c. **More importantly - why were the two involved in the said installation and many installations countryide using KBC resources whereas the installations in question were tendered installations to be undertaken on supply, install and commission basis as per tender documents.**

4.4.10. ONE WAY CLEANING SERVICES LTD is not pre-qualified to supply services to KBC on the contrary to a contract signed by the Managing Director of KBC whose details are scanty. The same can however be traced through payments to the company vide Chq. No. 008744. Supplies and Marketing Inspector Samson Ondieki should explain what he knows about all these transactions.

4.4.11. Services that can be undertaken inhouse are contracted and tenders awarded at exorbitant rates for instance Turnkey services was paid colossal amounts of money for a TV programme that could have been produced by highly qualified personnel in KBC.

4.4.12. Contrary to claims by the Acting Finance Manager before the joint Committee of Parliament on 8th March 2012 that the Corporation has been paying the Parliamentary Broadcasting Unit (PBU) staff monthly allowances, investigate and establish who has been benefitting from the allowances since 2008. Take note of some of the beneficiaries from the parliamentary coverage.

4.4.13. Plea

- a. **Compel KBC to pay all the KBC PBU staff all the requisite allowances backdated to the commencement of the parliamentary live proceedings in 2008.**

4.4. **INVESTIGATE**

- 4.4.1. **Receipt and Inspection Committee has not been operational for over two years.**
- 4.4.2. Mr. Fred Akoko is not involved in the Inspection and Acceptance of equipments by suppliers despite a Memo from the CEO appointing him to the membership of the Inspection and Acceptance Committee dated 28th July, 2011(REF: KBC/MD/12/6/C).
- 4.4.3. **A COMPANY OWNED BY A BOARD MEMBER, MR. STEVE AREBA WAS PRE-QUALIFIED TO SUPPLY EQUIPMENT FOR THE 2011-2013! The Company name is Broadcast Solutions International Limited (BSI)**
- 4.4.4. BSI is hosting the second licensed multiplex company at their Gatimu site in Limuru despite the company - Pan Africa Media network having expressed interest to be hosted by KBC at the Limuru Transmission. There is a letter to this effect.
- 4.4.5. Hope FM removed their transmission equipment from KBC Limuru Transmitter station to the BSI site between 4th and 6th August 2011. This was done via verbal instructions to the Engineer-In-Charge Limuru Transmitter by AMTS Mr. Tom Buluku.
- 4.4.6. Ghetto Radio installed its signal on 22nd December, 2007 against the instructions by Parliament that KBC withdraws its partnership with Ghetto Radio.
- 4.4.7. K24 installed its signal on 23rd December, 2007.
- 4.4.8. Another Board member **Mr. Ben Gituku** also sits in the board of the Radio Africa Group which constitutes a conflict of interest. This may have a bearing on the controversial deal between KBC and Radio Africa on the 2010 World Cup saga that is a subject of litigation.(Former MD David Waweru and former Company Secretary Hezekiah Oira have since been sacked and arraigned in court over the matter)
- 4.4.9. **The irregular approval of request by the Kenya Auto Electrical Ltd to the Procurement Manager for extension of the closing date for tenders in its letter dated 5th March 2012.**The letter by Kenya Auto

5. MISMANAGEMENT

- 5.1. Creation of units from the Marketing department that don't add value to the core business of KBC yet headed by personnel on huge salary perks
- 5.2. Merger of the ICT and Technical departments giving rise to an amorphous unit headed by an ICT person with no requisite background in broadcast engineering, **Annex - A5a**
- 5.3. Creation of units in radio department without following due process and with heads of the created units without defined roles.
- 5.4. The workshop intended for preventive maintenance, repair and testing of KBC transmission and production equipment; the workshop that was to be equipped with standard repair tools, repair kits and instruments to undertake the said works in an international standard, has been abandoned and neglected, is recluse and carries out piecemeal works
- 5.5. **Unceremonious closure of Metro FM which at the time of closure had the highest listenership of all the KBC radio stations.**

6. CONCLUSION

There are gross malpractices in KBC which call for immediate action. There is urgent need to stop processes that would interference with investigations. This includes and not limited to

- a. Stepping aside of officers implicated in the dubious deals which have brought the organization into disrepute and
- b. Suspension of all contracts as we reliably informed that more payments continue to be made in favor of suppliers suspected to be involved in procurement malpractices.

b. The said payments should be made immediately from the next remittances from Parliament.

4.5. PROPOSAL:

Since some documents cannot be traced in view of the publicity the matter has generated, it will be of great help if:

- 4.5.1. Payment Voucher S/No.KBC/10-11/000112 can be scanned to the last digit in that Voucher Book.
- 4.5.2. Deputy Procurement Manager David Adalla who was transferred to Mombasa under suspicious circumstances is recalled to shed light into some issues. He may have been a stumbling block to some corrupt individuals to achieve their objectives.
- 4.5.3. Reports that the IT System in KBC is being upgraded should be probed as it may be intended to destroy evidence; the Manager ICT & Technical Services (MICTTS) Mr. Imbira should be made to explain this development.
- 4.5.4. The Assistant Manager Technical Services (AMTS) Mr. Tom Buluku and Procurement Manager Robert Wekesa should be suspended pending investigations and their Bank Accounts frozen to prevent them from interfering with investigations.
- 4.5.5. It is noteworthy that the Procurement Manager Mr. Robert M. Wekesa's social status has changed greatly in the short period he has been in the Department.
In view of this, a probe should be instituted on how he acquired his wealth, especially three motor vehicles and properties in Syokimau and Trans Nzoia, notwithstanding the fact that a loan or loans can always be used to camouflage corrupt deals.**

1. MANAGERS

KBC SCHEME OF SERVICE

PRODUCTION MANAGER – SALARY SCALE BE 3

In the KBC scheme of service, the title Production Manager refers to the head of Radio and Television Departments combined. The two areas have since been elevated to independent departments led by the Radio Service Manager and Television Programmes Managers respectively. However, the records have not been updated to reflect the present status. The salary scales for the managers of these two departments have also been reviewed to Salary Scale BE 2.

2. Duties and Responsibilities

Overall in charge of the production department which consists of the following sections:-

- a. Radio Production and Operations
- b. Television Production and Operations.
- c. Design
- d. Library
- e. Programme Research.

The duties here involve, planning, controlling and directing programmes produced and broadcast, interpreting and implementing National policies through programmes, organizing co-productions with other organizations as may be necessary, formulation of programme policy. The officer will ensure that productions meet government policy. The Production Manager is responsible for all broadcasts within the corporation besides being the adviser of the corporation on all programme matters. He also has an overall responsibility for control of finance, stores and staff management in the department.

Requirements for Appointment

For appointment to the grade of Production Manager, an officer must have the following:-

- a. Must have served in the grade of Assistant Production Manager for at least three years.
- b. Have demonstrated outstanding professional ability in programme production.
- c. Have a relevant degree or diploma and certificate from a recognized university or institution.
- d. Have demonstrated a high degree of integrity and competence required for effective management of production.

6. RECOMMENDATIONS

- a. There should be strict adherence to the KBC recruitment policy and procedures that take into consideration gender mainstreaming.

- b. The last time the Radio Department had an effective manager is about six years ago. There is need for Radio and Television experts on the KBC Board of Directors to effectively assess applicants for Radio and Television jobs. Radio department has fallen victim of incompetent managers because of lack of board members who are well versed on radio matters and favoritism/nepotism (it is alleged that Mr. Mong'are the radio manager is a nephew to the permanent secretary Mr. Bitange Ndemo please investigate this allegation)

- c. KBC should update its scheme of service to be more specific and target the right candidates. For instance point (ii) of "requirements for appointment" which reads applicant should "Have attended approved management courses from a recognized institution/university" is too general. The duties are also too general.

3. IRREGULARITIES IN THE APPOINTMENT OF THE FOLLOWING:-

- i. Radio Services Manager
- ii. Television Services Manager.

Irregularities

- a. There is no proof that any of them had served as assistant managers in their previous jobs.
- b. They have no certificates to prove that they have relevant training in the area of the discipline that they are serving (Journalism, Communication or Broadcasting).
- c. Although Mr. Walter Mong'are is the radio manager the management pays his deputy Mr. Henry Makokha a special duty allowance of Khs. 10,000 to perform the radio manager's administrative duties. If indeed the radio manager was competent would management pay someone else to do some of his duties
- d. The two managers were not hired through a competitive process; they did not go through an interview.

4. Remarks:

It is clear that the two managers were hired in total disregard of the KBC recruitment policy and procedures. Their performance as managers in the two departments reflects incompetence in the radio department for instance decisions made by the manager of closing down Metro FM and starting up of Venus FM is not consistent with professional standards. He has also set up units that are not in the radio establishment and deployed staff in total disregard of their competencies laying emphasis on music transmission and neglected development content which is core to our performance targets.

5. FLAWS IN THE KBC RECRUITMENT PROCESS

- a. Some advertisements are designed to suit certain individuals
- b. Sometimes interviews are carried out as a formality and results withheld, the position ends up being filled by someone who never applied and never attended an interview
- c. Some senior positions such as department heads have been filled quietly without an advertisements, for instance the current Radio Services Manager.
- d. The KBC scheme of service has not been updated to give detailed qualification on specific jobs and in view of current academic trends e.g. a relevant degree should be the minimum academic requirement and not a certificate or diploma.

THE DEPLORABLE STATE OF ARTISTES IN KENYA BROADCASTING CORPORATION

Quoting the Kenya broadcasting corporation code of regulations of 2009

A3 Definitions and interpretations:

A. Definitions

“ ARTISTE” means a public performer or entertainer whose such services are employed by the Corporation.

Section B: Staff appointments and obligations.

1. In order to perform its obligations of broadcasting activities fully, the corporation shall have program and performing artistes who will include actors and presenters with skills to serve in television programs, radio and news departments on terms as set by the board from time to time.
2. The corporation shall develop a talent policy on order to identify program and performing artistes who may be utilized by the relevant programs departments. Where special talent has been identified, the corporation may consider and recruit qualifications notwithstanding, at competitive rates.
3. Terms for artistes shall be spelt out in the artistes policy

(V) Casual Terms

Employees on casual terms shall be engaged strictly in circumstances of relieving and unforeseen work. Such employees shall not be engaged for a continuous period exceeding one month at any given time and they will not be entitled to any leave, gratuity, medical and other benefits.

B. TRUE STATE OF AFFAIRS

Contrary to the above description of artistes in KBC, the term has been used to infringe and discriminate upon these workers; whereas the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation is a state corporation and should not be seen to discriminate against a section of its human resource

C. Employment

Over the years artistes (who are accomplished professionals going by sample documents presented) have served and slaved for the corporation for more than the six month stipulated period, extending to even seven years in temporary state. Thus evidently contravening the constitution in the bill of rights section cap(41)labour relations and also the labour laws .

HOUSING SCHEME

1. Sometime back, a KBC driver was killed by armed bandits as he dropped staff on shift to their residences. Other members of staff have also suffered the same fate but survived as testified by a member of staff before the joint committee on 8th March 2012. This brings to question the issue of KBC Housing scheme which was conceived among other reasons, to cater for staff members particularly those on shift. This would enable the Corporation to pick them from a central place not only for security reasons but also for ease of transportation.
2. KBC's Shauri Moyo Flats along Jogoo Road were bought by funds from the staff Pension Scheme. This means that KBC staffs are stakeholders in the scheme and therefore deserve to participate in any decision regarding the Flats.
3. The staff was not consulted when KBC Management entered into an agreement with Tysons Limited and Interlink on the management of the Housing scheme. The Agents without justification increased the House Rent from KES 7,500 to KES 11,000 in order to make it unaffordable for members of staff. This would then give the management an excuse to rent the 72 Housing units to non staff members.
4. Investigations should establish why KBC entered into an agreement with a private entity to manage the scheme, when it can comfortably recover rent from the staff through the pay roll.
5. An audit should be carried out to establish the safety of money which the firm raises from the scheme. This would put to rest claims that the firm cannot account for thousands of shillings it collects from tenants.
6. The management should explain why the houses are not made affordable to the staff yet their money was used in the construction of the units.
7. The Houses to revert back to members of staff at affordable rates.

F. CORRUPTION

Artistes' monthly wages are taxed as PAYE yet the moneys are not remitted to KRA. Such that when one is employed, they are asked to apply for a KRA pin number so where do the moneys go?

In some departments artistes assign contracts, are even appraised but this is not the standard procedure for all departments.

In addition some artistes for in stance in the IT department and marketing earn a cool 30,000 Kenya shillings and have medical and house allowance yet the same artistes with them same credentials earn as little as 17,00kshs as gross earnings.

G. RECOMMENDATIONS

In view of these facts and irregularities, it is in all fairness to employ artistes on permanent and pensionable terms based on their credentials, work done over the years and their roles played within the corporation.

It is evident that Kenya Broadcasting Corporation has the capacity to employ these artistes either on permanent terms to fill the current vacancies or have them on 3 year contracts with better pay, medical and house allowance

Academic qualifications notwithstanding artistes are underpaid, with the highest earning ksh 21,000 only as a degree holder and low as ksh 16,000 for diploma holders.

Moreover promotions to permanent positions are not carried out in a transparent manner, sighting nepotism and sexual favors for assurances of better working conditions and secured work status.

D. DISCRIMINATION

Artistes within the corporation are discriminated on the basis of being young and versatile, such that all night shift assignments and weekend duties are assigned to artistes and not employees who are deemed more qualified.

In addition to this artistes are often locked out of assignments that generate allowances and commission in favor of the employees and the excuse given is that they are not employees or the fact that they don't have risk allowance. This discriminating behavior is carried on into training camps and scholarships, thus sidelining the artistes.

More so artistes are paid inconsistently i.e. the date of pay vary from the 5th, 10th and even the 18th at the whim of the signatories i.e. the Managing Director and the Finance Manager. Yet, they are expected to meet their needs and still diligent appear and work like the employees, their fellow counterparts.

E. INHUMANE WORKING CONDITIONS

In their service to Kenya Broadcasting Corporation, artistes are not entitled to any form of leave whether annual or even offs; thus subjecting them to long hours in the office with no break or compensation.

More so, the women are not entitled to maternity leave, are if lucky are given two week s off on humanitarian grounds. This is an outright infringement of basic rights, labour relations and the labour laws, resulting to discrimination on basis of gender and pregnancy, and most importantly having no regard to the right to life.

Consequently artistes are denied medical benefits and risk allowance. Several have incurred injuries in their line of duty, only to be abandoned at the accidents sites or hospital to fend for themselves on their meager wages. Such is the case of on Tony Juma a camera person involved in the Eldoret air crash in May 2009, Rebecca Masinde an editor stabbed on her way from work late last year 2011 and Maryanne Wanjiku a producer got into car accident from work.

Artistes working on night shift are locked out form night transport on basis that they don't have risk allowance and even while out on location no water or food is provided for them.

- d. Youtube : Some Channel 1 clips and programs are sold to YouTube; the money is adding up to 320millions. It is suspected that this money has been remitted to some individual in KBC. This also calls for an investigation.
- e. Kivunja Mbavu: The performers are paid at performance venue after the show. They then collude with the producer and TPM and earn another amount paid by KBC despite the fact that KBC equipment and crew are used in the production at the venue.
- f. Good Morning Kenya (GMK); All guests forced to pay to appear on this program. It is a fact that guest are supposed to be paid by KBC or appear for free program.
- g. The producer and the TPM are the beneficiaries of these corrupt dealings.
- h. They should be investigated and punished according with the laws of Kenya.

3. Mismanagement:

- a. Academic qualification and experience: The TPM has a BA (communication) only; she has very little experience in TV production and management. In KBC production there are producers with better qualifications, some with MA (Communication) and/or Postgraduate diplomas and more experience, better track record of performance and international awards. How was she picked for the job?
- b. There is need for investigation and proper vetting for this post done.
- c. She lacks professionalism in her approach to work: The operations are run on a confused inefficient system lacking defined and specific roles. Skills and experience of key personnel goes to waste because the existing set up does not recognize nor tap full potential.
- d. Her appointments are done informally by word of mouth to her in-group. The out-group is usually the subject of humiliation and limited accessibility to her audience. She uses inappropriately disciplinary measures and ignores majority of her employees until there is a problem.
- e. Appointments should be done formally according to the law and the KBC COR. Anything short of this should be invalid.

CORRUPTION IN TV PROGRAMMING

Embezzlement through out - sourced programs: KBC pays millions of shillings for these dubious and substandard programs

1. Outsourced Programmes

- a. Udhalimu.....200,000.00 per episode or 1,825,600/- per month
- b. Rosa.....200,000.00 per episode or 1,825,600/- per month
- c. Nyundo Utosini.....200,000.00 per episode or 1,825,600/- per month
- d. Classmate.....200,000.00 per episode or 1,825,600/- per month
- e. Roiko/Vyakula vyetu.....200,000.00 per episode or 1,825,600/- per month
- f. Chakula Bora.....200,000.00 per episode or 1,825,600/- per month

NOTE: KBC cameras, editing suites and crew are used in production of this programs yet it is paid as if it is purely an out sourced program.

- a. On the Move.....200,000.00 per episode or1, 825,600/- per month
- b. Vijana in action.....200, 000.00 per episode or1, 825,600/- per month
- c. Pasua.....200,000.00 per episode or1, 825,600/- per month
- d. Home Boys.....50,000 per episode
- e. Rumba.....200,000 per episode or1, 825,600/- per month

2. Other Grand Anomalies

- a. Exodus to Stardom: KBC put in millions of shillings as a co production, but the partners were companies where Monica Wacege Ndung'u –the Television Program Manager had some interests. In other words the money was shared amongst those involved. The co-production of KBC Channel 1, Lampstand and Amplified Ltd. The TPM was the senior manager involved for KBC. In this co-production KBC pumped in over Kshs.30million and the returns were zero. This production should be probed and those involved investigated.
- b. The Phone in program 3131 generates millions every week. This money is said to be going into some individuals pocket save the amount awarded to winners. Who gets the money? This MUST also be investigated thoroughly
- c. Scroll 3223 is a sms program again also generating millions per week but the money generated is believed to go into individuals pockets. This also needs probing and investigation.

We blame her because according to COR she was supposed to recommend officers to be promoted.

- b. Designers should be promoted and compensated for the two terms they have been denied promotions. Then an accurate system which does not favor anyone be put in place to ensure proper and fair promotions in the future.
- c. In 2011 the TPM recommended more producers to more promotions. Designers were once more left out.
- d. This is contrary to the labor laws and of to the Code of Regulations.
- e. Promotions should be recommended to all deserving cases without favor or malice towards no one.

- f. She does not respect or understand professionalism - she slights and interferes with professional areas in the department. Scholarships have been directed to specific sections with bias. Design and Programming have always been left out.
- g. The Library is in a horrible state. No improvement up grading or maintenance has ever been applied there since 1962.
- h. KBC Needs an up to date state of the art Library and archive which can facilitate research and production materials readily to the producers and news people.
- i. Preview equipment and room is insufficient in view of demand and the work load. The type of equipment there are obsolete and restricted previewer only. Previewers need protective equipment such as spectacles and anti-radiation screens for the previewers.
- j. The previewers should be modern as the cameras and computers used in production, editing etc. obsolete machines are wasteful and humiliating working on.
- k. Design staff work long hours to see all production operations are successively completed. Some work up to 14 hours seven days a week. This goes beyond the limit of 42 hours input per week required by labor laws. All extra hours put in should be paid for in form of overtime according to the COR and labor laws but this has been frustrated by the TPM.
- l. Overtime must be paid to all designers who work late after working hours.
- m. Design is one of the very versatile and ever-changing professions. It therefore requires constant training and up grading based on new developments in software and styles. No such provisions are available for KBC TV design.
- n. Proper training should be given to all Designers whenever a new machine or software is introduced. The training should be consistent and regularly to keep designers abreast with the fast changing digital world of computers.

4. Promotions:

- a. The TPM office has favored production section more than the other departments namely Design and Programming. In 2005, March all producers were promoted under the recommendation of the TPM. All designers and some Programmers were left out.

- i. **The Synergy System in Radio**
 - ii. **B Gan in the News Room**
 - iii. **ERP in Human Resource Supplies**
 - iv. **Voip and WAN**
 - v. **Orad system**
 - vi. **Virtual set in TV**
8. Laborious cumbersome and sometimes unsuccessful procurement procedures for acquisition of very urgent yet simple and cheap stores and spares leading to lengthy delays in corrective and preventive maintenance. Such stores and spares include Solder wires, Cleaning detergents, Light bulbs, fuses etc
9. There is a glaring lack of ICT and technical maintenance tools in key operation areas coupled with lack of well equipped workshops for equipment testing, preventive and corrective maintenance. Some of these include;
- i. Hardware in terms of computer, printing services, scanners etc which are hardly sufficient
 - ii. Workstations for all staff members
 - iii. Licensed Software for recovery, software tools
 - iv. Proper server rooms with efficient backups

C. Changing Technologies

KBC as the implementing agency of the Task force on Digital migration has not provided leadership nor created capacity for a comprehensive migration plan. It has in total disregard to its national mandate abdicated the responsibility of migration to foreign companies. Some glaring anomalies that create even more confusion include;

- i. Lack of direction and impetus in the formation of a Signal distribution company,
- ii. Purchase of Analogue TV transmitters despite the stipulated analogue switch off date being slated for the 30th of June this year and awarding of tender to a local company to supply Digital TV transmitters that are untested with no local or international reference for proof of Quality of Service.

D. Welfare, Facilitation and Remuneration

1. Officers in some of the units in the department are not remunerated the same way as their counterparts of the same cadre in other departments. Case in point; while the Chief accountant , Chief Security officer, Chief Revenue officer etc are all in SS BE4, the Chief electrician is in SS BA1
2. Staffs on out of station duties and on special assignments are adversely discriminated upon and are actually excluded from allowances statutorily provided for by the corporation.

ICTTS submissions

A. Leadership and Human Resource Capacity creation

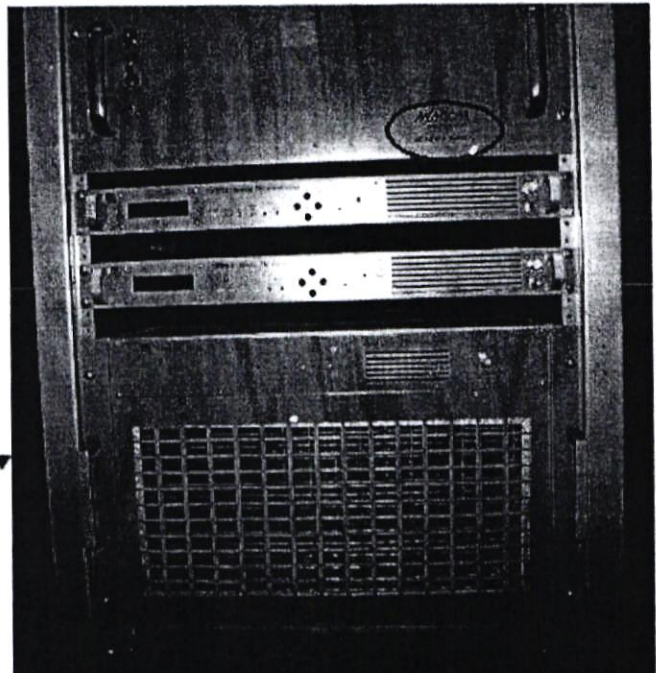
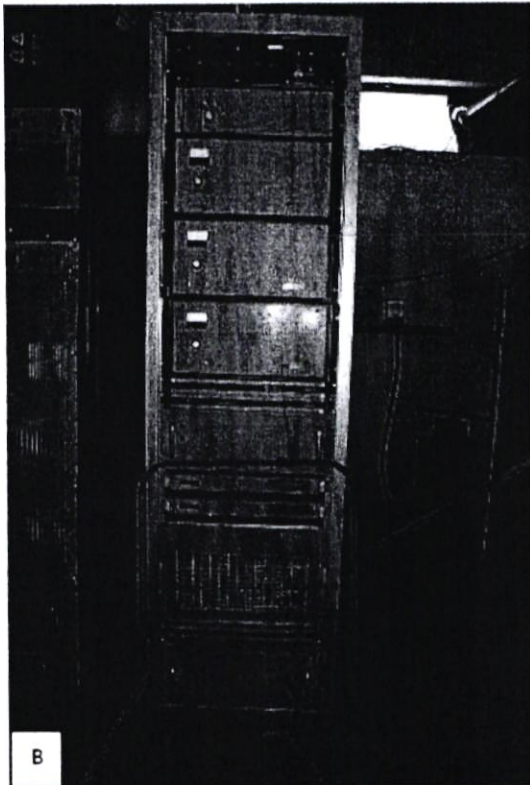
1. Unstructured and uninformed merger of Technical Services and IT departments giving rise to an amorphous unit. Technical services unit is now headed by a non - broadcast engineer who is not versed with emerging broadcast engineering trends.
2. Lack of a comprehensive and workable scheme of service. Many members of the department have stagnated in the same job group for so long yet the department has very many positions not filled. Positions arising from resignations and natural attrition have never been filled either.
3. Quite a number of appointees in the department are yet to be confirmed after a long duration of engagement.
4. There is lack of structured training and follow up on training needs to meet and address the challenges of the ever changing technologies in Broadcasting. This is coupled with erratic and secretive award of local and international scholarships.

B. Acquisitions and disposals

1. Purchase of substandard equipment in disregard to the users specifications and in disregard to best practice where technical evaluation is key in procuring tendered equipment.
2. Alteration within the line departments of provided equipment specifications to favor certain equipment bidders resulting in acquisition of equipment that have no history of success.
3. Unorthodox installation of equipment in disregard to procurement procedures of Supply, Install and Commission. Transmitter units are bought and assembled in used racks. Case in point the Somali FM transmitter (Opera family from Italy) assembled in a Macom Video Systems rack Annex T 1
4. Installation and maintenance of transmitter equipment and accessories is one man affair; a KBC manager who does factory commissioning, Installation and signs acceptance certificate.
5. Arbitrary disposition of corporation land especially at transmitter sites with disregard to due process and to future expansion needs.
6. Tendering and awarding of works which with facilitation can be competently and professionally done in-house. Case in point Electrical works in HR and Accounts offices and cable trunking.
7. Acquired systems and equipment are not supported in order that they may provide optimum performance. This has lead to non-utilization of expensively procured equipment and in some cases a hindrance to transparency and accountability. Some of the culprits are;

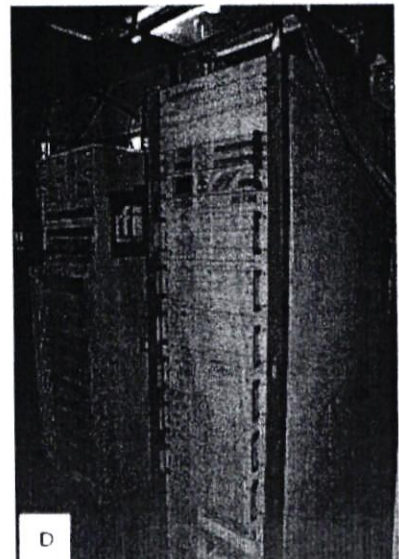
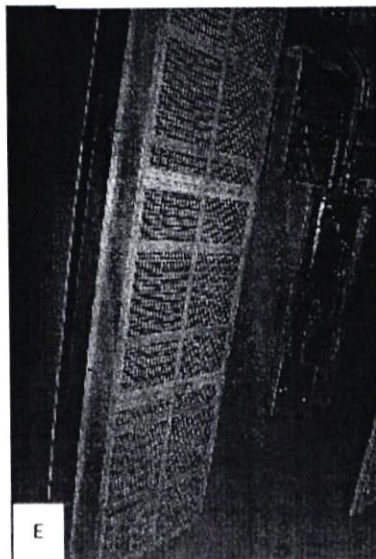
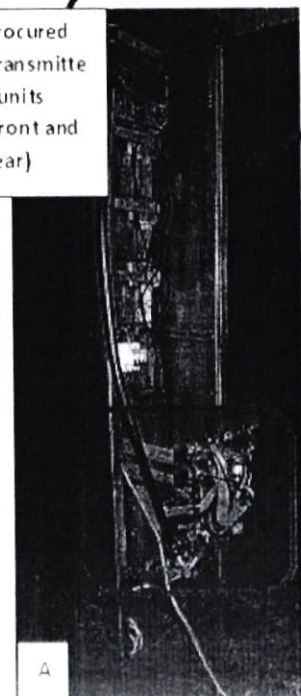

3. Transmitter stations and operation areas are dilapidated and in inhuman working conditions with no regards to health and environmental issues to staff.
4. Staff in hazardous assignments like those in the rigging unit lack protective clothing and rigging gears and while all other allowances of corporation employees have been honored, they are not provided with their requisite "danger" allowance
5. Simple amenities like tea are provided selectively and discriminately and a staff canteen which could be managed to offer meals on subsidized rates is mortgaged to sell foodstuff to staff exorbitantly while staff on night late shift, night shift and early shift have to make laborious arrangements for meals.
6. Whereas the reason for withdrawing transport to staff on nightshift was based on insecurity as a result of the Post election violence, four years down the line after the post poll chaos the service is yet to be re-instated and commuter allowance is based on job group despite cost of travel being the same for the low and high irrespective of the job group cadre.

E. Demands

1. Separation of the ICT and Technical Departments with both departments headed by competent heads on competitive appointment
2. Immediate institution of a scheme of service with priority given on progression of staff that've been on the same job group for years.
3. An audit of all broadcasting and ICT installations in the corporation. The exercise should be carried out by an independent audit firm versed in broadcast engineering collecting and collating information from **End Users**.
4. On the mandate of KBC Being the implementing agent of the Digital task force the following are demanded;
 - i. Operationalization of (Signet) KBC Subsidiary Signal distribution Company within 45 days with the sole mandate of fast tracking Digital migration.
 - ii. Complete halt of procurement of equipment that don't advance Digital migration notably the so called T2 ready analogue TV transmitters and
 - iii. Fresh technical Re-evaluation of tenders awarded for provision of DVB-T2 Transmitters based on History of performance.

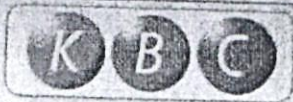

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1. Introduction

The Federation of Kenya Employers was recently commissioned to carry out an Organizational Review and Job Evaluation exercise for the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation. The key objective of the exercise was to examine whether existing work structures and jobs offer a competent institutional capacity in the form of requisite knowledge, skills, competencies to meet the competitive challenge in core mandate. The core business of the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation as a public broadcaster is to educate, entertain and inform the public.

It was expected that the Consultant (FKE) would interrogate the relevance or value added of each functional area/department to the KBC mandate and mission as a public broadcaster. The subsequent job analysis exercise was then to determine the key/benchmark jobs to drive core functions, clarify their roles and establish the minimum qualifications to facilitate placement or subsequent recruitment to various posts.

2. Terms of Reference

The terms of reference were;

- (a) To review current work/organizational structures and determine suitability and adequacy to serve the core mandate of broadcasting;
- (b) To carry out job analysis of all jobs;
- (c) To evaluate all jobs at all levels.

In addition, the Consultant was to establish if the current staff establishment is sufficient, in terms of qualifications and complement, and optimally utilized to deliver service value.

Deliverables

- Results-oriented organogram/functional structures;
- Comprehensive job descriptions for all jobs;
- Job grading;
- Ideal Establishment.

3. Approach of the consultancy

An initial meeting was held between Senior Officers of the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation and the team from the Federation of Kenya Employers under the leadership of the Head, Management Consultancy Group. The purpose of the meeting was to announce the commencement of the exercise and to allocate responsibilities. Subsequently, the KBC furnished the consultants with all relevant documentation including its Strategic Plan, HR Policy, Schemes of Service and other information regarding human resource practices.

Full information regarding key aspects of the Corporation's business, activities and forward plans was necessary to inform the consultants on KBC's strategic thrusts. As part of this initial familiarization on the Corporation's activities, the consultants spent 3 days (23rd, 24th and 31st of May, 2007) touring various departments and sharing with staff on aspects of the exercise. On the week commencing 4th June, 2007, one Consultant and Senior Human Resource staff visited the Mombasa Station at Sauti House to learn local operations and explain how the job evaluation questionnaire was to be filled. Mazeras and Nyali transmission stations were also visited on 5th and 6th June, 2007.

On the 7th and 8th of June, 2007, one Consultant and Senior Human Resource staff visited the Kisumu offices and Yala transmission station.

At some point during the familiarization programme, an internal Job Evaluation Committee, consisting of 28 KBC staff chosen from all departments, was set up and trained on job analysis by the consultants. The Committee was tasked to collect filled job evaluation questionnaires and formulate Job and Task Descriptions under the supervision of the consultants. This was a deliberate strategy to transfer skills to the internal team. The Committee was divided into 5 groups of, on average, 6 members of staff. A smaller team was selected later and after being trained on job evaluation, participated in assessing and weighting all jobs under review. The evaluation process continued to the latter part of July 2007 due to the large number of jobs under review.

Consequent to the conclusion of all the elements of the assignment, FKE consolidated all information, benchmarked results against market practices and compiled a Zero draft report which was presented to the Top Management Team.

FKE incorporated the input and comments of Management into the report and thereafter, KBC organized an Away Board Meeting to receive the draft report.

After consolidating the proceedings and workshop outputs, FKE has put together a second draft report presented here-below.

4. Consultant's findings of the exercise

4.1. Organizational review

In line with the data collection protocols, information availed to the consultants was collated, benchmarked and utilized to:

- Propose opportunities for maximizing internal synergies and to enhance organizational outputs,
- Suggest options for containing variable costs, especially staff payroll.

The thrust of the organizational review was to develop a competent operational structure for the core business of broadcasting and to identify key roles and responsibilities for a team of capable and committed individuals to drive performance. The findings of the organizational review were to provide a basis for future process re-engineering, productivity benchmarking and inculcation of best practice in operations.

The Consultants were to learn that the Corporation broadcasts through:

- Channel 1 Television
- Metro Television
- Kiswahili Radio National Service
- English Radio National Service

- Metro FM Radio
- Coro FM Radio
- Pwani FM Radio

- Regional Services
 - Central
 - Kimeru
 - Kiambu
 - Kimasai
 - Kikamba
 - Eastern
 - Turkana
 - Bulji
 - Rendile
 - Somali
 - Borana
 - Kisumu
 - Suba
 - Kuria
 - Teso
 - Pokot
 - Luhya
 - Kisii
 - Luo
 - Kalenjin

Broadcasting is done at Nairobi head office, Sauti House in Mombasa and Kisumu.

At the commencement of the organizational review, KBC had the following key departments or functional areas i.e

- News
- Directorate
- Administration
- Television Programmes

- Radio Programmes
- Technical Services
- Marketing
- Finance
- Purchasing
- IT (in formation)
- Human Resource
- Audit

In addition, the following were operating as the commercial outfits of the Corporation:

- Coro
- Metro/Pwani Radio FM

These outfits are alternative broadcast channels competing with commercial stations operating in Nairobi and periphery, Mombasa and periphery.

Based on the current set up, KBC has about 1300 employees.

Key findings on functional structures include those cited below.

4.1.1. Duplication of job titles

There are unnecessarily many job titles without clear and distinct responsibilities. It would appear some jobs have been split into small tasks to fit persons. This is a duplication of effort, justified in some cases, by dependence on manual operations especially at the lower cadres. This gives rise to the bloated staff and untenable payroll cited in other KBC reports.

This would require:

- a) merging of tasks and expunging of unnecessary levels in the organizational structure to conform to contemporary practices i.e maintaining fewer layers and lean staffing. Towards this end, the consultants together with the Job Evaluation

Committee evolved appropriate Job Descriptions for key jobs that are multitasked.

- b) automation of processes and investment in information technology is inevitable and worth the cost in the long run. Installation of appropriate hard/software is a must to enhance efficiency and contain staff numbers
- c) staff training to raise computer literacy levels is necessary to raise staff and organizational outputs

There are other salient findings that are specific to departments. These are cited below and reveal key issues to be addressed by the review.

i. FINANCE DEPARTMENT

The Finance department, headed by a Finance Manager, has 2 key functions namely, financial accounting and revenue collection. The heads of these functions are the Chief Accountant and Chief Revenue Officer respectively.

On closer examination, it is evident that the tasks for the Finance Manager's position are very similar to those of the Assistant Finance Manager.

The Revenue arm of finance has as many as 8 levels below the Chief Revenue Officer's position. There was task duplication noted in jobs after the third level of the hierarchy. It thus became necessary for the consultancy team to multitask a number of jobs to provide for sufficient content. A good case is the job of the Revenue Officer in Kisumu performing both the functions of revenue and financial accounting, where due to low volumes the jobholder can cope with both responsibilities.

Due to the multitasking of jobs and the need for KBC to attract and retain quality human resource, the Consultants are of the opinion that the lowest title for the finance department should be the Accounts/Revenue Assistant.

The job content of the other the job titles in finance department are described in the job profiles bound in a separate document.

ii. HUMAN RESOURCE

This department has about 8 levels of management, which are too many. Some positions in the Human Resource department:-

- HRA Clearance
- HCO - Salaries
- Asst HRO
- Snr HR Asst Payroll were all merged so as to give HR Assistant - Payroll a better job.

Among the jobs multitasked are the following;

- Medical and Welfare HR Assistants were merged to form HR Assistant Welfare so as to give the job enough content.

It was also noted that the Higher Clerical Officer in Mombasa performs the duties of a Supplies Assistant. However, it should be noted that after the restructuring exercise in 2006, some staff there were released and duties were distributed to other staff.

Relationship between new duties and current job may not have been taken into consideration.

It is apparent that much duplicity in current jobs will be eliminated through the process of multitasking. This will improve job content, reduce the vertical ladder, thus the need for renaming or eliminating a number of job titles as seen under the Consultant's recommendations.

iii. SALES & MARKETING

The Marketing structure needs to be clearly defined in terms of the strategic thrusts of the Corporation. It appears to have both the Sales and Marketing functions. The

corporation currently has only one Brand Manager, which is overwhelming considering all the brands that one will have to handle.

In terms of job responsibilities, there is a large gap between the Brand Manager and the Brand Marketing Executive, which means that, there is uneven distribution of responsibilities or a missing position.

However, the responsibilities of sales and marketing are clearly defined in the Consultant's recommendations, including renaming the function to enable the Corporation reap the full benefits of these functions.

iv. ADMINISTRATION

Supplies:

The Supplies function is currently in the Administration department, however, the newly created position of Procurement Manager reports to the office of the Managing Director. The rest of the other functions remain under Administration department.

It was also noted that some employees have little duty to be performed throughout a normal day. As such, the Consultants suggested recommendations below.

- The Chief Supplies Officer and the Senior Supplies Officer were merged to give one job since the roles are the same.
- The Assistant Supplies Officer - Inspection was changed to a full Supplies Officer.
- The Senior Supplies Assistant was changed to Supplies Officer in charge of Transport.

v. PROGRAMMES

Design:

The Design section which is quite a critical one falls in this department, while its head, who is the Principal Designer, reports to the Managing Director's office. This does not reflect the real nature of the job as functionally it should report in TV Programming, It supports this function.

It is not clear in terms of reporting relationship for some of the jobs in Design, as some Officers and Assistants report to the Senior Design Officer while others report to the Chief Design Officer.

RADIO

The Chief Programme Officer and the Controller Operations appear to have similar job roles.

Library:

Library falls under the Radio department. The Chief Librarian is only in charge of the Audio aspect. It would also make it more efficient and modern if it were computerized.

vi. TECHNICAL SERVICES

There are 3 Assistant Managers. As is the case with the other departments, there is a lot of task duplication. The difference is indicated using I, II, III or with even slightly different job titles. The first method only indicates length of service and therefore a slightly higher salary for the individual but invariably the jobs' overall purpose is the same. The Senior Inspector and Senior Superintendent are also doing similar jobs but the titles indicate seniority by virtue of service.

vii. FM STATIONS

Coro and Metro stations have different work structures. For example, for Coro FM, the departmental head is called a Chief Producer while at Metro FM it is a Senior Programme Executive. This does not give a clear definition of what is expected of the job. The Chief Producers in turn report to the Controller.

These are some of the few examples of duplicity. Besides these flaws in the functional areas, it appears that the span of control under the purview of the Managing Director is wide. Through process and job redesign recommended below, the reporting lines are reduced to realistic levels even as the core functions are repositioned according to their purpose in fulfilling the mandate of KBC.

5. Consultant's recommendations

Following the series of meetings with Management and the Board mentioned heretofore, FKE has incorporated a number necessary revisions to the first draft report presented in September 2007.

Using the results of the network analysis of existing functional structures for suitability, efficacy and usefulness, the Consultants have evolved;

- The organization structure and key jobs which are the best fit' to drive the business competitively;
- Job descriptions with roles that stretch the human capital at KBC and optimize capabilities. Qualifications i.e knowledge, skills and competencies for each key job have been established.
- Ideal staff numbers to drive efficient operations.

5.1. Core functions

KBC is a public broadcaster of news. In line with its core business of entertaining the public, the Corporation presents various programmes targeting different clientele. Together with support services the following have been recognized as the key functions of KBC:

- News
- Programmes (Television, Radio)
- Directorate
- Marketing
- Technical Services
- Finance

To enhance resource synergy, the Consultants have recommended certain consolidations among the services as will be explained below.

The first area where consolidation has been found to be useful and the Corporation is likely to gain substantial cost economies is in broadcasting and programmes. To enhance editorial content, service quality and efficient resource utilization especially HR, it will make a lot of business sense to twin News and Programmes (TV and Radio) into one focal point. Though there is much complementarity in the skills bank of the two operational areas, there is still considerable duplication of effort in the execution of assignments.

The same case can be argued for the Directorate. The division has been allotted the responsibility of protecting the interests and legal rights of KBC in its dealings with the outside world. It makes sense then to pool tasks that deal with transactions of contractual nature under the same leadership for effective marshalling of legal and logistical support to other service areas.

The Marketing function is destined to become the cash cow for the Corporation as financial support from the central government dwindles. The department has the greatest potential in revenue growth and requires to be strengthened.

It is the recommendation of the Consultants that the core functions should be repositioned in order for KBC to obtain desirable results.

To this extent, the recommendation is to upgrade these core functions to Divisional level and the job titles of their heads to be re-designated according to market practice. Herebelow, the Consultants have progressed the case for structural realignment of the Corporation.

5.1.1. News & Programmes Division

Good news content will obviously attract good listenership across the divide since KBC commands a comparatively wide outreach in both television and radio broadcasts. Though the technology is wanting, KBC news is the main source of information for most Kenyans, especially in the rural areas. The division should be appropriately revamped to collect, process and deliver quality and realtime news that is rich in content and relevant to the point of time.

On the hand, offering credible programs in both TV and Radio will uplift the image of KBC and attract increasing business traffic, especially the lucrative advertising revenues.

Due to the significance of **News and Programmes (TV & Radio)** and complementarity in resource use, the Consultants have recommended a revamping of services **into one bigger KBC division**. By pooling the capacity domiciled among the fairly qualified staff and facilities, KBC will gain through operational synergy and cost savings. Besides, this consolidation will optimize the unexploited potential within the News, TV and Radio Programmes in terms of visibility and business.

a. Recommendation 1

It is recommended that the Head of the News & Programmes Division is to bear the title of General Manager, Editorial & Programmes. This title is in line with market practice for such senior responsibility in similar trades and peer organizations in the country.

Three key departments fall under this division and are shown below with respective heads.

i. News

The sections of the News department are;

- Radio
- Kiswahili
- TV News and Current Affairs
- Sports

The recommended key jobs in each one of these sections and establishment are produced in Table 1 below. Respective job descriptions have been developed and are bound in a separate document. The head of News is to be the Editor -in- Chief

iii. Radio Programmes

Radio programs are diverse and with a wide outreach. The Consultants propose to consolidate all radio programmes (Idha, English, Coro, Metro and Pwani FM Radio) under one Manager i.e Radio Programmes Manager.

The complement is shown in table 3 below and organogram and job descriptions are bound in a separate document.

Coro, Metro and Pwani FM Radio

Coro, Metro and Pwani FM as an alternative commercial broadcasting service is a good idea to optimize on the lucrative business opportunities existing within the nationwide coverage of KBC. However, the enterprise section should be aligned to the Radio Department and be part of the larger suggested division of KBC Programs to gain operational synergies.

5.1.3. Commercial services

Due to potential income gain to the Corporation, it is suggested that the scope of the current Marketing be expanded. The department is poised to become the cash cow for the Corporation as the central government's financial support dwindles.

In an increasingly competitive marketplace, the function ought to be appropriately staffed and resourced to penetrate the market and gain an increasing share of the lucrative advertising business. Besides, there is need for the Corporation to keep an eye on the marketplace to spot new or upcoming opportunities. To this extent, consideration should be given to the importance of business development in the larger department.

c. Recommendation 3

It is recommended that the expanded function be renamed the Commercial Services in line market practice and the Head be the General Manager, Commercial Services. Three key departments stand out and are:-

- i. **Marketing**
- ii. **Advertising**
- iii. **Business Development**

6. CONCLUSIONS

The summary information on the recommended staff strength is presented in table 12 below. The establishment is premised on the need to;

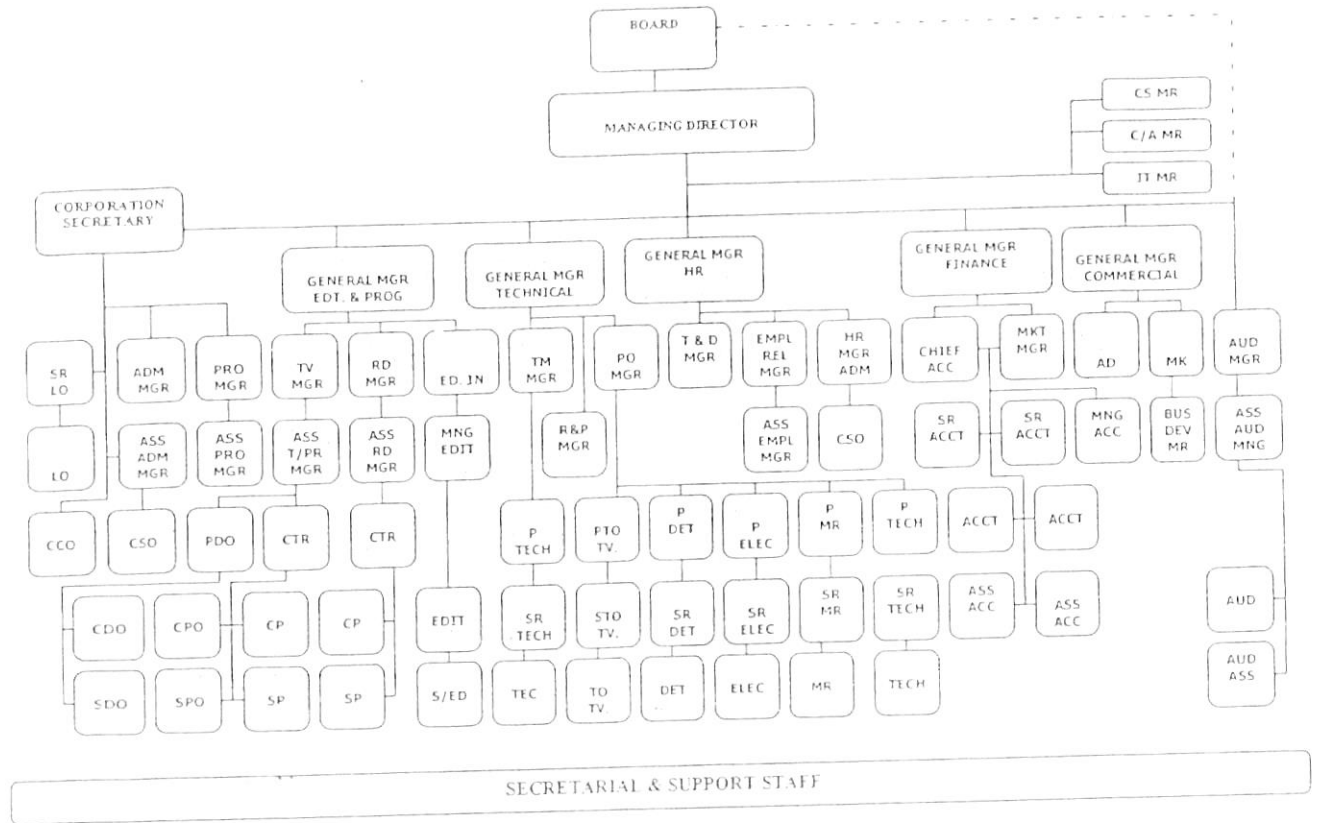
- Optimize on capabilities and advantages,

- Prepare the Corporation for sustainable growth.

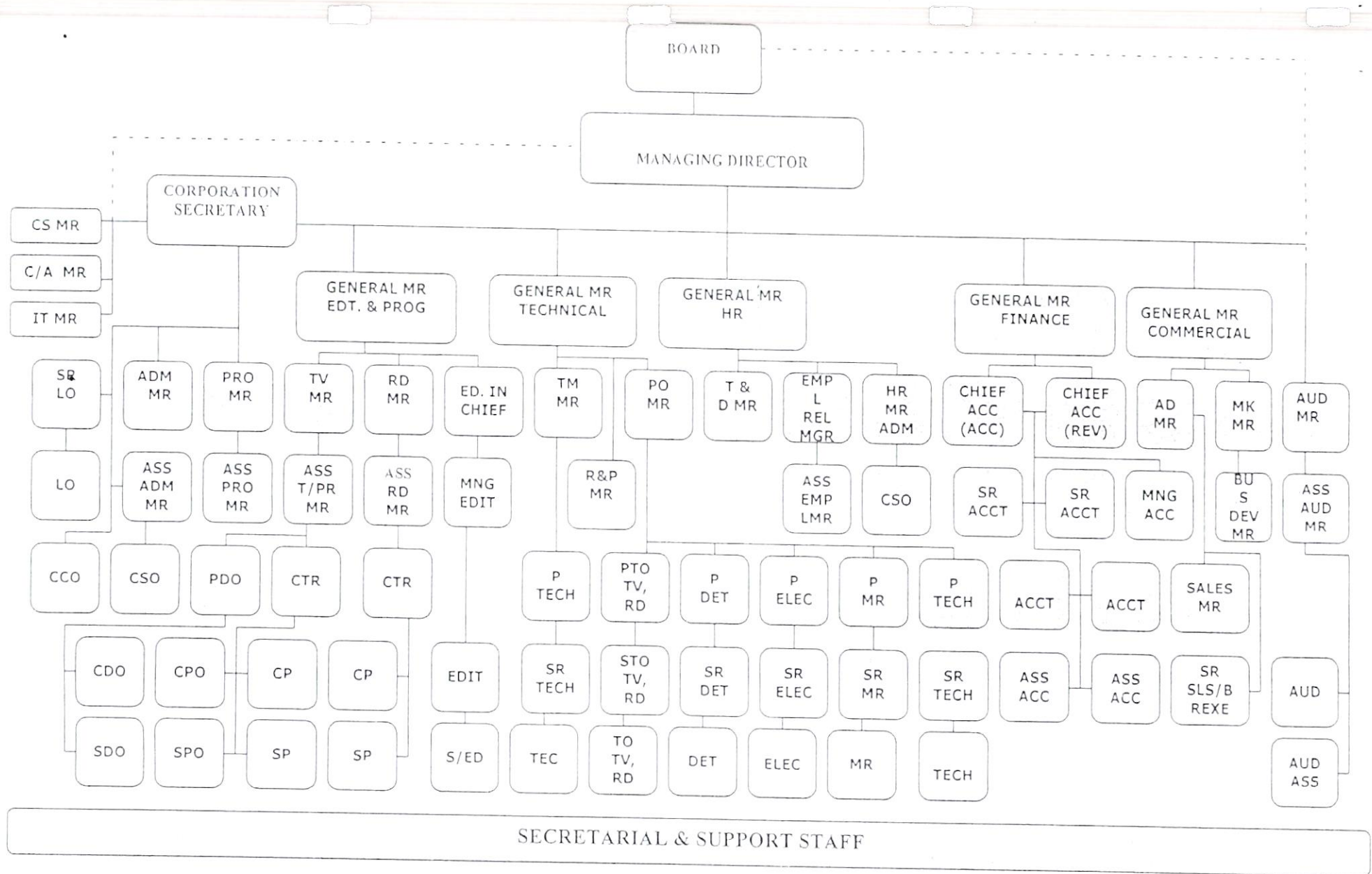

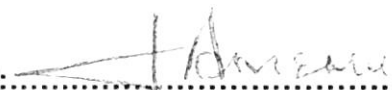

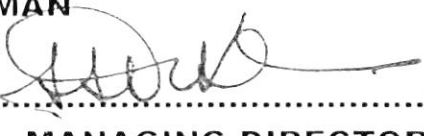

The cameras were procured at a total cost of Kshs.7.8 million as evidenced by copies of payment voucher attached.

Thereafter, National Assembly procured its own cameras that are now being used to cover proceedings. We withdrew our cameras and currently they are being used in our OB Van.

Other than the above capital expenditure, the Kshs.15 million the Corporation receives from parliament is lumped together with the Corporation's other revenues and used in paying our operating expenses.

2. Commission paid to staff on Parliamentary live coverage revenue.

Parliament pays the Corporation Kshs.15 million for live coverage of proceedings per month. Whenever parliament is on recess the Corporation does not get the stated revenue. The paid revenue is receipted as evidenced by the attached copies of receipt numbers 506469 and 506470 and properly accounted for in the Corporation's books of accounts.

In an effort to increase sales and revenue collection, the Corporation employs the strategy of paying sales commission to marketing staff and revenue collection commission to Finance staff doing revenue collection on attaining set targets. The Board of Directors approved the commission structure (copy attached) and assigned marketing department a monthly sales target of Kshs.80m and Finance department a monthly revenue collection target of Kshs.90m. Non-selling staff working in all other departments are also entitled to earn a

sales commission of 1.5% on securing a sale of Kshs.200,000/- and above.

To motivate marketing staff to sell our products aggressively the department is given a bonus of Kshs.160,000/- on attaining total sales worth Kshs.100 million per month.

To motivate Finance staff to collect revenue aggressively the department is given a bonus of Kshs.150,000/- on attaining total revenue collection of Kshs.100 million per month. The bonus is shared among all Finance department staff as evidenced by the attached copy of payment voucher.

The Finance department's Kshs.90 million revenue collection target per month comprises of advertising revenue, cositing revenue and parliament live coverage revenue.

Collecting parliament live coverage revenue starts with the process of ensuring the contract is signed, preparing the daily transmission report, raising an invoice and delivering it in parliament and following up for the payment. It is not automatic that the payment just comes on time. For instance, the invoice for live coverage of the month of October 2011 was paid partly on 25th November 2011 and 20th December 2011 after lengthy follow-up by the Finance Manager.

As depicted in the approved commission structure, Revenue collectors earn commission at the rate of 0.35% on achieving 75% - 100% of their individual targets of Kshs.22.5m each per month and 0.45% on achieving more than 100% of their individual targets. We have four officers' assigned duties of revenue collection.

Senior revenue officer earns commission at the rate of 0.20% on achieving 75% - 100% of Kshs.90m target per month and 0.25% on attaining more than 100% of the same target. The Finance Manager earns commission at the rate of 0.25% on achieving 75% - 100% of Kshs.90m target per month and 0.30% on attaining more than 100% of the same target.

Finally, we have attached herewith a sample of copies of vouchers showing commissions paid to Marketing staff, Revenue collectors and Finance Manager.

3. Payments made to companies associated with KBC Directors:

Broadcasting Solutions International Limited was paid Kshs.373,948.45 by cheque No.535716 on 27th October 2010 for the supply of studio equipments (copy of payment voucher attached).

On 27th May, 2011 the Company was paid Kshs.94,500/- by cheque No. 770127 for the supply of FM tuners (copy of payment voucher attached).
